GOSSIP OF THE WEEK

Naturally the interest this week centres in the S.C.C.C. Show, a critique of which appears in another place. The Misses Fairbrother and Wilson were quite pleased with Mr. Ambrose's placing of their white Australian cats. The first-named lady, by the way, is the ever popular comedy actress, Miss Sydney Farebrother, whom we first saw in Bernard Shaw's delightful comedy "You Never can Tell," and later as "Miss Prossie" in *Candida*. Many will perhaps remember her better in *Chu-Chin-Chow*. It was a pleasant surprise to meet her here and find her interested in these Australian cats, about whose climbing exploits she had much to relate. It seems that if a room-door be left open the probability is that one of these cats will be found roosting on the top of it, whilst to shin up an aerial pole is a mere trifle to them. They never have more than three kits and only rear two. Another exotic which attracted a good deal of attention was a big black and white cat "from the burning sands of Africa" as the notice on his pen announced. His owner, Mrs. Richardson, has written his history for *CAT GOSSIP*. The *Smoke Report* has not come to hand.

Mrs. Allen-Maturin purchased the Siamese kitten *Myosotis of Petaling* from Mrs. Harvey. This kitten took a first on this occasion, and at Leicester was first also and took the special for best eyes. She is a daughter of *Ch. Bonzo*. A really beautiful type is Mrs. Maturin's recent purchase, *Southampton Su-Jitsu*, son of her *Ju-Jitsu*. Mrs. Duncan Hindley was rejoicing that her *Prestwick Perak* had at last won her full Championship, though still mourning the mysterious disappearance of her *Para*. Miss Sydney Farebrother was smilingly recalling how Mr. Cyril Maude and his wife had a very elaborate cradle made for their Siamese to kitten in, but to their disappointment she went outside and kitted in the laurels.

Miss Busted is sending Siamese to Montreal, Florida, and British Columbia. Miss J. M. Fisher is exporting two L.H. blues to Russia. Mrs. Campbell-Fraser, who has just bought from Mrs. Britton a couple of grand-daughters of the late Mrs. Esdaile's *Barry Blue John*, was glad to hear that her *Blue L.H. Hendon Dame Carruthers*, sent only last week to *Madame Pereyrol*, took second at Paris directly after her arrival at the *Ville Lumiere*, where Mrs. Basnett seemed to have enjoyed herself greatly as judge at the show held by the *Cat Club de France*. Miss Cochrane, being now more settled down, has again acquired from Miss Hill-Shaw her old favourite *Blue, Ch. Chelsea Twilight*.

In the Blue Long-hair adult classes the competition was very strong. I was very sorry not to see my friend, Herd Lassie, higher up in the stud class. He has the most wonderful coat I have seen, but he has plenty of time before him to mature, and come into his own.

Please forgive the many errors and omissions in my report. The awards were late in getting on the board, and I could not wait for them all. I was very tired, having been at the Hall the night previous to the Show, to help Miss Lea, and I could not get round all the pens.

The Siamese Classes.

Will those interested in this report kindly overlook any errors or omissions please, as, failing to find many awards on the award board, I had to get the best possible from cards on the pens, and on one pen I found a 2nd prize card given to the cat of that pen and number, who was not even entered in the class, from which the prize was awarded—and leaving the Show just after 5 p.m., I was still without the complete list of awards. When walking round the pens of the Siamese I was very impressed with the good quality of the exhibits, especially the typical wedge-shaped head and faces which most of them possessed.

CLASS 65. SIAMESE ADULT, MALE (open). Judge, Mr. Norris. 1st & Ch.—Miss Dixon. Simzo. 2nd—Mrs. Harvey. Padi of Petaling. 3rd—Mr. Lloyd Lewis. Ch. Bonzo. Res.—Mrs. Allen Maturin. Southampton Bashi Bazouk (No. in class 4). Simzo was an easy first in this class, with his very beautiful head, coat, and eyes. I have always admired his sire, Bonzo, but in his son Simzo we have a better cat still. Padi of Petaling is also a very beautiful, young male with good coat, and deep blue eyes and very nice wedge-shaped head. Ch. Bonzo was in excellent condition and seemed quite content to take a back seat and watch his son take all the honours proving the excellent quality of his sire as a stud. Bashi Bazouk was also shown in very good condition, but I prefer Mrs. Maturin's

Bonzette is a true daughter of her sire (Bonzo), whereas Simzo is a true son of his mother (Ch. Simple) from whom he inherits all his daintiness of type and head. Southampton Ju-Jit-Su is a very pleasing typical little queen. Miss Harrison's Suvadana did not get a mention in this class—this cat has a very blunt nose and round head, but there are several good studs at public service now, and as Suvadana came direct from Spain, Miss Harrison has much in her favour to help her and the breed.
