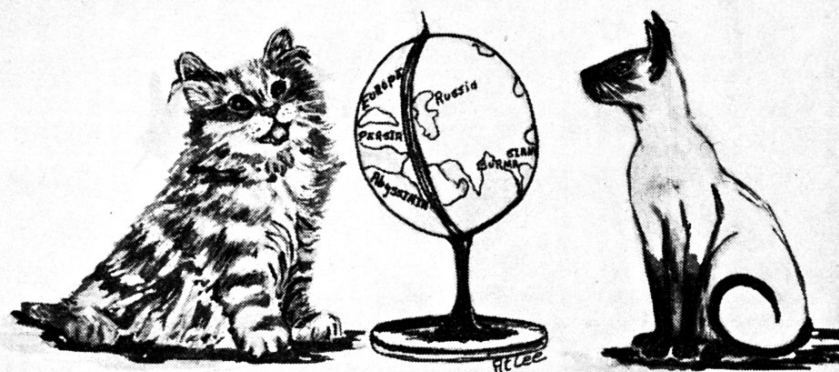
IMPORTING AND EXPORTING CATS

Several American readers, noting the advertisements in CAT WORLD from overseas breeders, have asked us how difficult it is to import a cat into the United States.

The answer is that in these days of reliable scheduled flight by jet-liner, it is really not much more complicated than buying a cat from a distant breeder in one's own country.

There is no quarantine for healthy cats coming into the continental U.S.A. However, there is a quarantine period for cats entering Hawaii.

A small amount of duty must be paid when a cat is imported. The present rate collected by U.S. Customs is 3½%.



Breeders interested in importing a cat should first write to the advertiser to enquire if a suitable cat is available. One should give complete requirements, offer some information about one's cattery, and tell of the daily routine the new cat or kitten would follow in its new home. British breeders, in particular, are interested in such details as once a cat has left the U.K. it cannot return without the considerable expense of six months in quarantine.

Once a cat has been selected, arrangements for its transportation can be made by contacting the air freight department of an international airline. We ourselves have had excellent service from Pan American Airways both when importing and when exporting cats. Miss Jeanne Brafford of Pan-Am's Denver office, who arranges shipping for us, is a Siamese fancier and takes a personal interest in the welfare of cats in transit.

When one considers the long distance the cat is travelling to the U.S. from overseas, the freight costs are quite reasonable. From London to Denver, for example, an approximate distance of 3,500 miles, the cost averages about \$35 depending on size and weight of kennel.

Overseas breeders are sometimes interested in exchanging cats with breeders in the U.S. and Canada. This is an interesting avenue to explore as it reduces the cost and offers each of the parties a chance for good outcrosses.

A word of caution in choosing your import. Be sure that the pedigree meets the breed requirements of the association(s) in which you intend to register your new cat.

SHIPPING KENNELS

We recently purchased one of the Vari-Kennels advertised on the back cover of this issue and were very pleased with it.

The carrier is carefully constructed, sturdy and attractive. It's just right for shipping by air or when travelling by car and the cats seem to like it. The Vari-Kennel is bolted together in two sections which can be unbolted and used as cat beds.

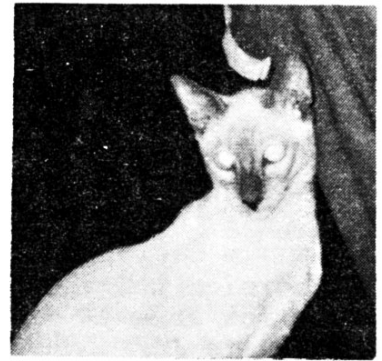

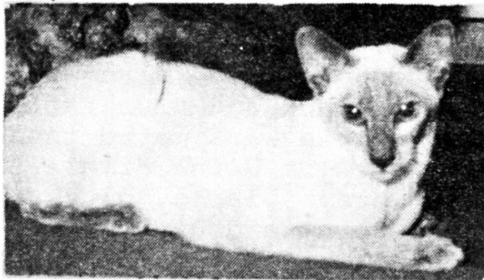

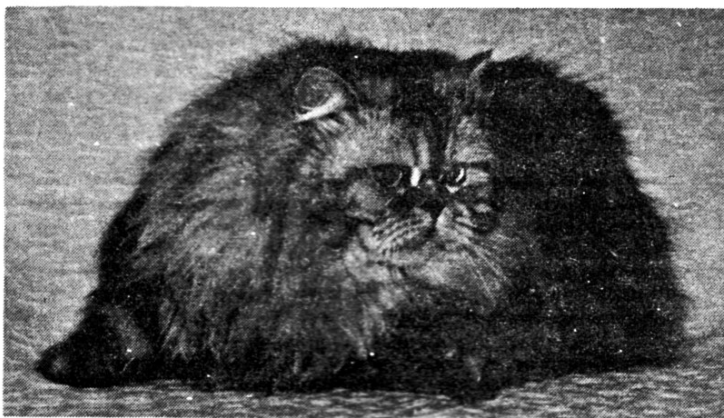

The Blue-Eyed White

Who Is A Himalayan

BY MEVR. H. PROSÉ-IMBERT

The foreign white Shorthairs are well-known, but few know of the existence of a blue-eyed white Longhair which is bred in a similar way as the foreign white. The Himalayan is used as an outcross about the same way as the Siamese bred with the white Shorthair.

For us in Holland, this cat is not from a particular breed. It is a blue-eyed white Longhair and competes on the show bench with the other blue-eyed whites. In Europe a cat is judged on his phenotype (outerly appearance), never on his genotype (pedigree).

This nice variety began with the breeding of the first Himalayans in Holland. In Europe the Himalayan is not a separate breed but is one of the colors of the Longhairs or Persians just as Mr. Stirling-Webb, founder of the breed, wished that it would be: a Persian with the coloring of the Siamese. At this time, the beginning of the 'sixties, the Himalayans were few and did not have the type we were striving for so we had to outcross with the best Persians we could find. It was then that we got the idea of outcrossing with blue-eyed white Persians, hoping that this eye color would be less prejudicial for the eyes of the Himalayans than the usual outcross with a blue or black Persian with their copper eyes.

As there were very few blue-eyed whites at this time in Europe, and, moreover, they were deaf, two blue-eyed males were imported from America: first, *GALLAHAD'S WHITE SILK*,

and, some years later, *GALLAHAD'S TRADITION* both splendid, strong males with good blue eyes and sound hearing.

1. As the Gallahad males had the blue factor, the first matings with Seal Point or Blue Point Himalayans gave, as expected, the following kittens: blacks, blues, whites. The whites were copper-eyed, blue-eyed and odd-eyed with black and blue factor.
2. These blue-eyed whites were mated then with Seal Point or Blue Point Himalayans and the kittens were: blacks, blues, Himalayans (Seal Point and Blue Point), and whites. These whites were of two kinds:
 - (a) the ones born with a headspot* between the ears (blue or black spot) were the whites with blue or black factor, and the "points" factor in addition. They were copper-eyed or odd-eyed.
 - (b) the ones born without headspot. They were the true Himalayans under a white coat and their eyes were blue.
3. These last blue-eyed whites were mated together and the kittens were: only Himalayans and blue-eyed whites without headspot

(*Most whites are born with a colored spot or some colored hairs on the top of the head which disappear before the kitten attains adulthood. It is only the colored factor of the white cat

showing through the white coat.)

The advantage of these white kittens is that they were true Himalayans in genotype and, therefore, of sound hearing. Besides, we got a higher percentage of blue eyed whites than in the classic outcross with blues.

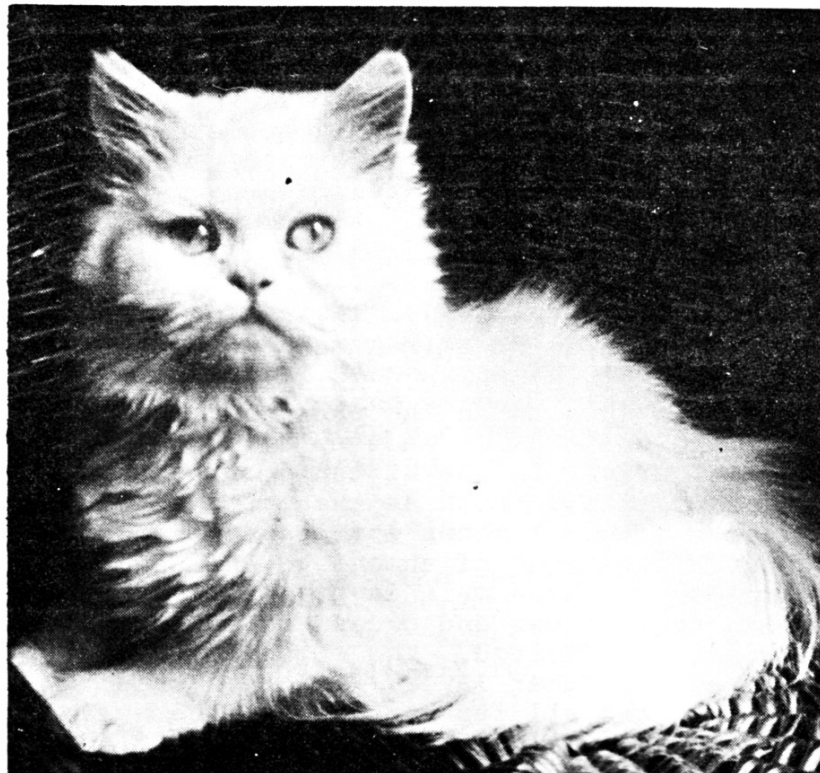

It is possible that the purists will raise their hands in horror about these blue-eyed whites who are not breeding true. You see in the chart that their littermates are sometimes pure, then breeding true, but such cat is irrevocably deaf. It is why, from the first days, this last sport in the chart: BE white + BE white has been converted in: BE white + Himalayan = BE white + Himalayan (ad infinitum).

Some breeders are very proud of their pure blue-eyed whites. After generations of breeding blue-eyed whites with blue-eyed whites, they got indeed pure whites. If mated with a colored cat they get only white kittens ... who are deaf. Thank you for me! All my breeding time I have been careful



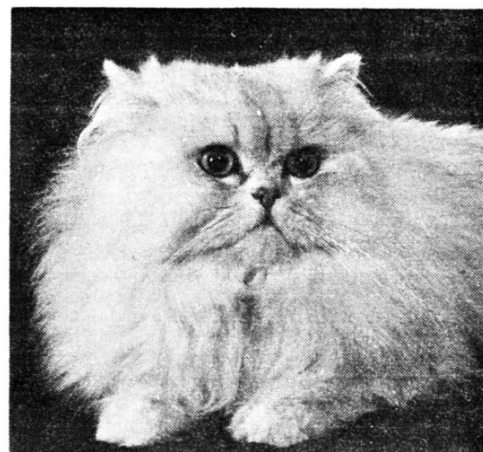

never to mate white with white to avoid deafness. It is, on the whole, so difficult to be sure that our kittens are sold to a good home and, for the deaf ones, it is almost impossible. How can one be sure that people will give them all the care and devotion they need all their life?

As we have different Himalayan lines, there are outcrosses enough, but the white is coming from the first Gallahad imports. Considering that a white cat is a colored cat with a white suit concealing his true color, there are at the moment in Holland blue-eyed whites carrying the factor for Seal Point, Blue Point, Chocolate Point, Lilac Point, Tortie Point and Red Point.

The type of these whites is generally good, body and coat, too. The eyes are not always the deep blue that we would wish for as the Himalayans do not yet have the deep blue eyes of the Siamese, but we are steadily working toward this goal.

FRIMOUSSE, being still a kitten, has not yet been mated to test her factors. As she was, of course, born without headspot we can, at the moment, only guess as to her exact genotype. Most probably she is a Seal Point with dilutions, but she can be a Blue Point with lilac dilution, too. She is not a Chocolate Point nor a Lilac Point as her father does not carry it

We are not intending to breed pure whites, only a blue-eyed white according to the standard of the blue-eyed white Persian with the possibility of breeding from it Himalayans according to the Himalayan standard.

And, please, don't call our blue-eyed white a "White" Himalayan. A Himalayan cannot be white by definition as the "points" are its trademark. Our little blue-eyed white is just another white Persian, but with another factor than what the Fancy, until now was used to. ###

THE PURRING CREATURE THAT WALKS ON ITS TOES

PART III - THE SKIN

The cat is a carnivore with a capital C --in fact he is the most carnivorous of all the carnivores, equipped for stabbing, biting, slicing and tearing his prey. He is a complete individualist, agile, able to run over long distances, adept at stalking, a great climber and able to make sudden jumps on creatures he fancies for dinner.

In common with all living things the cat is made up of millions of cells and, in fact, the cells can be described as units of life. The cells making up the cat's body are so small that they cannot be seen with the naked eye but they can be seen under the microscope. Although it takes millions of cells to make up the cat's body and the work of the cells is co-ordinated, each cell is really a self-sufficient unit, and as experiments in tissue culture have demonstrated, the independence of individual cells can always be regained. Cat is made up of many cells specialised to perform its various functions and it is clear that if there are enough cells in the cat's body for groups of cells to have a special function then the structure of the cells can be adapted to perform particular functions more efficiently.

As a general rule a growing cell either stops growing or divides into two immediately it reaches a certain size. Although in the simpler forms of life the two daughter cells then separate to form new individuals, the two daughter cells remain as two cells within the SAME animal body in multi-cellular animals such as the cat. It is generally agreed that the multi-cellular state of organisation is linked with the increase in size and complexity of animals above a particular level of development.

In a highly differentiated animal such as the cat, cells are specialised to carry out a restricted range of the total activities. The muscle cells are contractile units but do not conduct electrical impulses, the nerve cells conduct electrical impulses but do not contract and so on. Increased differentiation of cells in the cat's body has led to greater efficiency and cells which are similarly differentiated for a function are grouped together into "communities" called tissues. There are four main types of tissue:

(a) Epithelial tissues in which the cells are generally arranged in sheets for covering the surfaces of the body. Glands are derived from epithelial tissue.

(b) Muscular tissue in which the cells are of three main varieties but are all specialized for contraction.

(c) Nervous tissue in which the cells specialize in conduction of impulses.

(d) Connective tissue in which there are several types of cell plus an intercellular substance. This tissue includes blood cells, cartilage, bone cells and the true connective tissue cells and their products.

Structures like the cat's heart, liver and kidney are called "organs" and are complicated structures made up of several tissues combined so that they can co-operatively perform the duties essential for the life and well being of the cat. An earlier paragraph has described the fact that the cat's body is split into millions of cells each specialized to carry out a particular function and it has been explained that the cells are grouped into functional units called tissues. One of the organs of the cat is its skin. The skin is an extremely active organ and consists of several different tissues integrated to carry out the skin's functions. Cat's skin is made up of two fundamental layers of tissue with the outer layer known as the epidermis and the lower layer known as the dermis layer. The epidermis is a thick layer of cells able to counteract stresses and in parts of the body which are subjected to much trauma (or damage) the epidermis is thicker and harder than in others. A hard horny substance called keratin is produced. This thicker, harder epidermis is seen on the pads of the feet.

The cat's skin, made up of epidermis and dermis, arises in the kitten embryo from a layer of tissue known as the ectoderm. The diagram (fig. 1) shows a transverse section through the trunk of an embryo and demonstrates the three main layers of tissue from which the tissues and organs of the kitten and cat are derived. The ectoderm is clearly seen as the outer layer. It gives rise to the skin and all its structures, the nervous system and to a part of the fore and hind gut. Once the skin has developed from the ectoderm it becomes a self maintaining, self regulat-

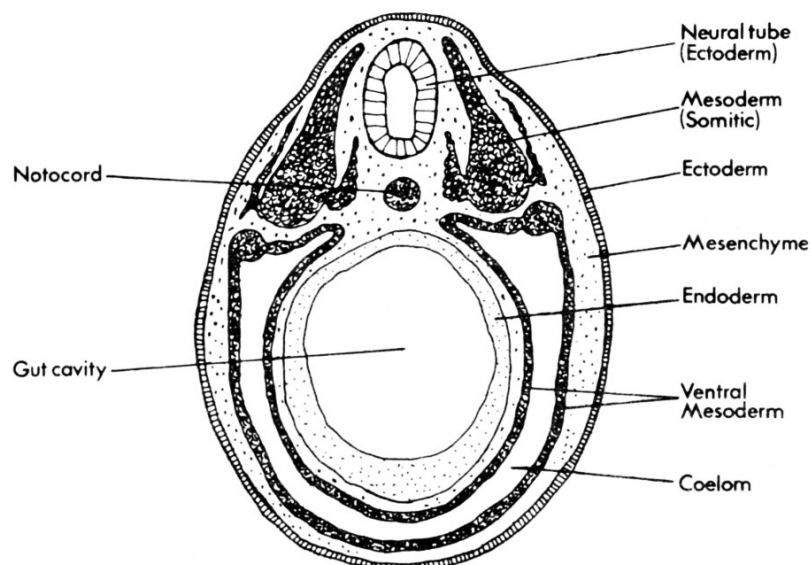

ing organ. The lowest layer of the epidermis (seen in Fig. 2 and known as "the Malpighian layer") is constantly dividing in a plane parallel to the skin's surface so that new layers of cells are always appearing to replace those rubbed off the outside. As the cells produced by the Malpighian layer get older and nearer the surface they die and become flattened. The flattened dead cells are made of a protein called keratin, the material from which claws are made. This outer layer of the cat's skin is often called the stratum corneum or "the horny layer". Underneath the epidermis is the dermis, a layer made up of connective tissue in which there is a large amount of intercellular substance in relation to the number of cells present. Many tissues go to make up the dermis including nervous tissue, muscle tissue and connective tissue. The dermis contains the sebaceous glands, the blood vessels, the hair follicles, muscles and nerve endings.

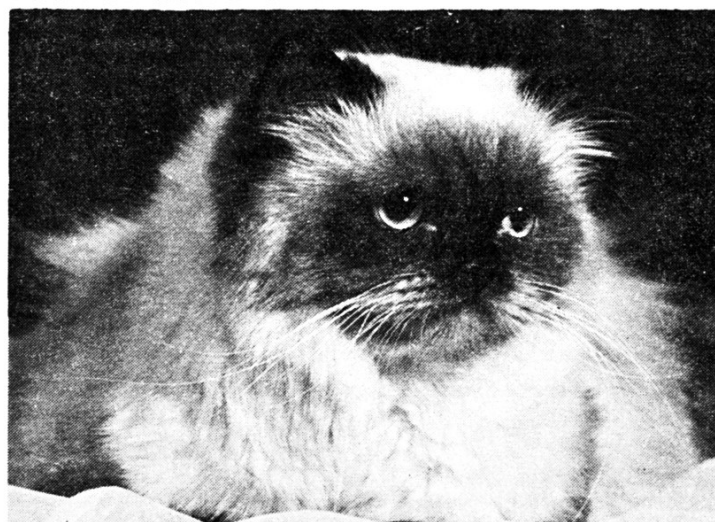
Like all the cat's organs, its skin is responsible for carrying out a number of things on behalf of the whole body. Some of these functions are listed:

- (a) It protects the cat's body;
- (b) It receives stimuli;
- (c) It regulates temperature;
- (d) It provides milk for kittens;
- (e) It conserves water;
- (f) It produces claws, whiskers, eyelashes and fur.

PROTECTION OF THE CAT'S BODY

The cat's skin stretches over the whole surface of its body and it also continues into several of the body orifices. When its surface is intact the only places where germs can penetrate it are the hair follicles (pores) and the sweat ducts. (There are, of course, other means of entry through apertures of the urinary, genital, alimentary and respiratory tracts). If "invaders" DO get in through the epidermis, the connective tissue in the dermis forms a very efficient second line of defence and the process of inflammation develops. This combats the infection. Fuller details of this will be given in a forthcoming article.

Protection against harmful effects of solar radiation is provided by pigment cells lying just below the Malpighian layer. White cats, with skin lacking pigment, also lack this protection and this is the reason for the "sunburn" often seen on the skin in front of the ear and on the tips of the ear when

they are subjected to prolonged sunlight. In the wild state, cats (the wild type tabby cat) are also protected by the "cryptic" colouration of the pigmented hair allowing them to look like their normal background.

RECEPTION OF STIMULI

The whole of the cat's body is covered by receptive spots for touch, heat, cold and pain and, at any one time, thousands of receptive spots are being stimulated. It is from the general pattern of these stimulation fields that the cat's central nervous system allows the whole organism to be aware of the changing conditions around it. Certain areas of the skin are more sensitive to stimuli than others and it appears that skin that is hairless, such as on the lips, has a more highly organized sense receptor system than does hairy skin such as on the trunk. It is thought that any particular nerve fibre can respond to only one kind of stimulus, special nerve pathways for temperature, pressure, pain and touch information. Unfortunately, it is not possible to identify the function of individual nerves by the structure of the receptor as nerves with differing functions may start at what appear to be identically structured receptors. The nerves, which start as receptors, are situated in the dermis of the cat and can be seen in the diagram (Fig. 2). If only as a means to convey information to the cat's central nervous system the cat's skin is very important in adapting the cat's body to its surroundings.

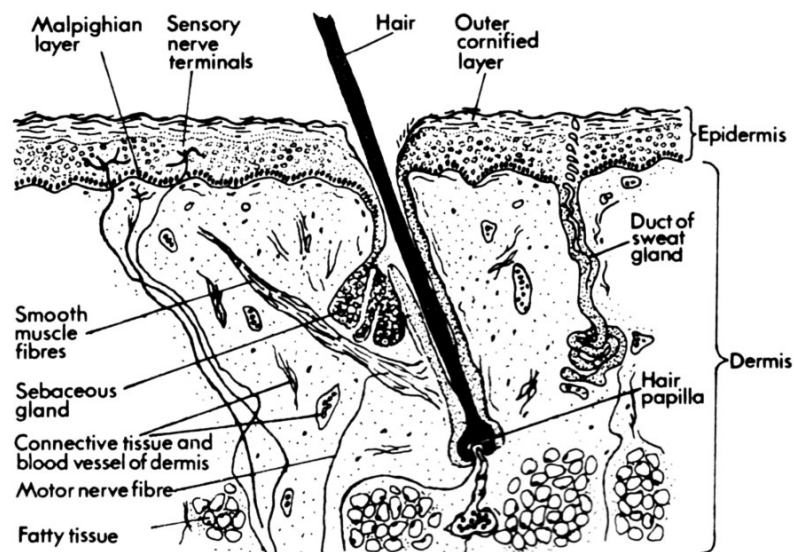
REGULATION OF TEMPERATURE

This third function of the skin is found only in birds and mammals--animals described as homiothermic. Other animals are called poikilotherms. Homiothermic animals, such as the cat, can adapt to live in the tropics or the arctic or to function efficiently in the heat of mid-day or the cool of midnight. Poikilotherms may be either too hot or too cold to even move under these conditions. Although some homiothermic animals hibernate when conditions are really cold, the majority, including the cat, live an active life throughout the year. The ability to regulate temperature has enabled the cat to extend its

range of activities much further than the reptiles could ever have gone and the evolution of this ability was essential before living in air was fully mastered by animals. The range of temperatures encountered when living in air is much greater than that of living in water and the speed at which changes occur is more rapid. The development of this ability meant that the early mammal ancestors of the cat could move away from places that were overcrowded with competitors and that they could feed at night when the temperature would be unsuitable for poikilotherms.

The constant internal temperature is also a very great advantage in the complex animal that is the cat, for chemical reactions can proceed at a much more constant speed than would be possible in a temperature that fluctuated.

The cat's skin is very important in temperature regulation because its large surface is a potential site for heat loss. So the first requirements of the skin of the cat is that it should be a good heat insulator.

The layer of fat beneath the skin and the fur fulfils this requirement. The cat's fur is of importance because air is trapped beneath it.

Another very important fact governing the amount of heat lost is that the amount of heat supplied to the skin can be varied by altering the diameter of the blood vessels in the skin. If the smooth muscles in the walls of the arterioles contract a reduced quantity of blood and heat is present in the cat's skin. So, in cold weather, the arterioles contract and the areas of the skin that can be seen will look "pale". On the other hand, when the cat's body is too hot the arterioles dilate and a greater volume of blood flows through the skin, thus losing heat from the body. Thus the amount of heat entering the skin is controlled by constriction or dilation of blood vessels whilst the subcutaneous fat and hair help by insulating the body from its environment.

All mammals lose some heat in their breath and as the cat has no true sweat glands other than on the pads of the feet it can, if necessary, lose heat by panting. It also controls heat loss by its behaviour. On cold days the cat will curl up like a ball, presenting only the smallest possible area for cooling. On hot days it will stretch out on its side with its limbs extended to expose the maximum amount of body surface. Vigorous movement generates heat within the body whereas lassitude keeps the body cool. So it

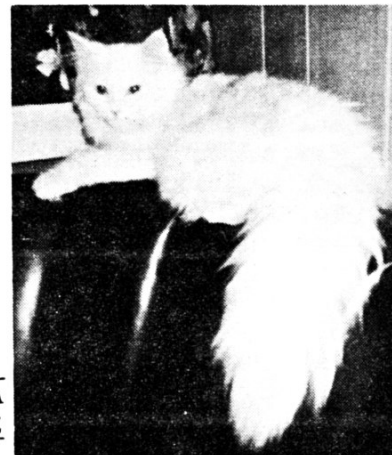

can be seen that several tissues in the skin co-operate to regulate the cat's body temperature.

CONSERVATION OF WATER

The dead cells of the stratum corneum are heavily keratinized so that they form a waterproof layer which keeps water in the cat's body. This property of its skin allows it to live in dry places. The sebaceous glands also produce a secretion which may help in waterproofing.

PRODUCTION OF MILK

The mammary glands are made up of cells resembling those of the sweat glands and are usually considered to be modified sweat glands. These glands are derived from the skin and supply milk to feed the young kittens.

PRODUCTION OF CLAWS, WHISKERS, EYELASHES, FUR

There are also other derivatives of the inner and outer layer of the cat's skin and these include the claws, whiskers, eyelashes and fur.

VIGGO A. MORTENSEN (DENMARK):

Due to the rapidly increasing population of stray cats in the suburban areas of Denmark and the problems attached thereto, the question arose, "How is it possible to limit the birth of kittens?"

Under veterinary surveyance, the population of stray cats was, as far as possible, localized and registered in a town of approximately 60,000 inhabitants. At various feeding places, the cats were fed with fish into which was added the product *medroxiprogesteronacetate*. This product impeded the female cat's rutting season and, within a short time, it turned out to be a success.

There have been, and still are, objections against this form of limiting the cat population. The two most important objections are: (a) the medicine must be taken regularly; if not, pregnancy might occur ending with stillborn kittens which the mother might have difficulty in bringing forth; and (b) there is no knowledge as to how this product will affect the males eating it.

This experiment was, however, the starting point for experiments with the product on cats in private homes. The amount of 2.5 mg turned out to be sufficient for impeding the rutting season, i.e. one pill per week prevents all the inconveniences connected with the rutting season.

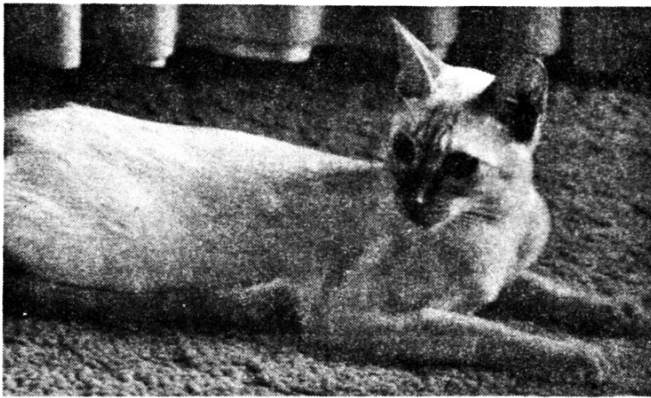

Veterinary Views From

At present we do know that the above-mentioned amount is sufficient to keep cats off season, but we do not yet know exactly how long a time it takes for them to come in season after the administration of the pill is ceased. This period varies from 14 days to 3 weeks or even longer, a fact which is of great disadvantage to people involved in breeding.

Because of the above experiences, it is our opinion---which is shared by many vets especially concerned with cats---that the most reasonable thing for a cat owner keeping a female cat as a pet is to have her sterilized and this is also beneficial to the cat itself! For those breeders who prefer to keep the female cat from rutting season for a shorter time, we can recommend the product as long as the medicine is administered regularly, under control and in the prescribed dose.

The product *medroxiprogesteronacetate* is available under different names from various medical firms. In Denmark it is *Perlutex Leo*.

Because of the explosion in the pet population, there has been a growing interest in developing an effective, cheap and safe birth control device for animals. This would be a desirable thing for owners and exhibitors of purebred animals. The recurring estrous cycle can cause problems in the show ring such as behavioral distractions, coat appearance and mismatings.

In small animals, various progesterone compounds have been tried and used for this. During the early sixties, Promone, (made by the Upjohn Company), medroxyprogesterone acetate, was being used by veterinarians in dogs and cats. In a small percentage of animals administered to, a condition known as pyometra developed. This condition is where the uterus fills up with a toxic exudate. The animal becomes very ill and may die if not treated right away. In practically all conditions of pyometra, an ovariectomy is usually the only successful treatment. Because of this, the Federal Drug Administra-

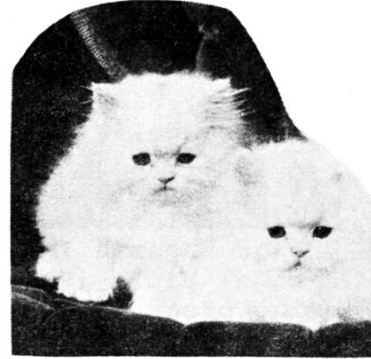

tion withdrew the drug from veterinary use. The same drug may be obtained under a human label but most veterinarians are reluctant to prescribe it because of legal and ethical considerations.

Testosterone, a male hormone, has been used to suppress the estrous cycle in greyhounds. Greyhounds are not allowed to race when in season. Various greyhound breeders with whom I have talked claim good success with very little aftereffects. To my knowledge, no one has tried this in cats.

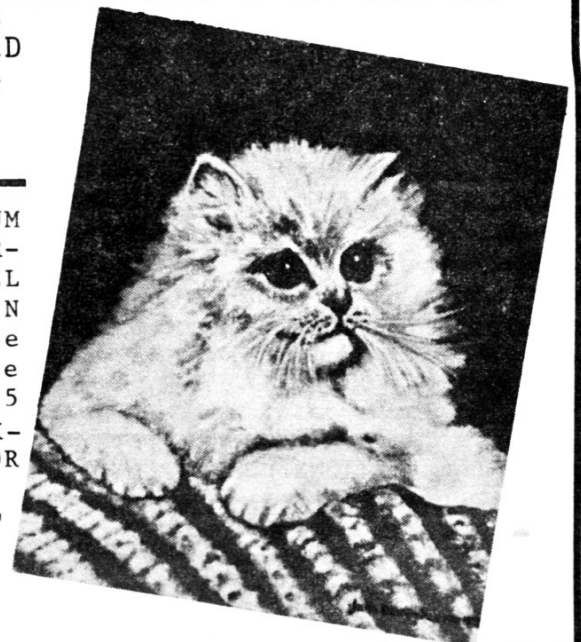

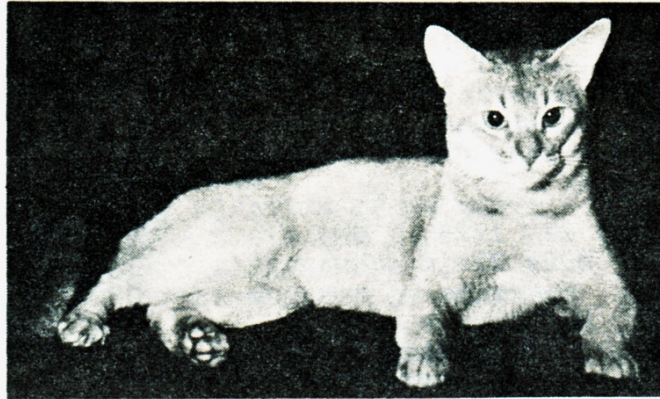

Introduction

In 1930, CAT FANCIERS ASSOCIATION, largest registering body of cats in the United States of America today, instituted GRAND CHAMPIONSHIPS. Forththree years ago, the first cat to qualify for the new accolade was *EASTBURY TRIGO, IMP.*, Red Tabby Persian male.

TRIGO was born in England May 22, 1929, and was imported into the U.S. by Miss Elsie Hydon, a past president of C.F.A. Later he was owned by Mrs. John S. Hunter, Mt. Vernon, New York. He died on September 17, 1936, and was still regarded, many years later, as the finest Red Tabby ever bred in England or to compete in the U.S.

This past show season, a total of 190 cats earned the coveted status of GRAND CHAMPION by their prowess in C.F.A. shows. In addition, thirteen other cats became C.F.A. GRAND PREMIERS.

Seventeen of the nineteen breeds recognized by C.F.A. for Championship competition are represented in the list of new GRANDS which finds the females outnumbering the males 111 to 79. Only the Balinese and Havana Browns are missing.

Breed leaders this year are the Persians claiming almost half of the GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP titles with 91 cats (48 females, 43 males). Fifty of these competed in the Solid Color Division, among them 13 Blues and an equal number of Creams. Of twelve cats in the Shaded Division, 6 are Shaded Silvers and 4 Chinchilla Silvers. There are seventeen Parti-Colors, 11 of which are Blue Creams. Six of the Persians in the Tabby Division are Brown Tabbies, and there are two new GRAND CHAMPIONS in the Smoke Division.

C.F.A.'s Siamese breeders came up with 34 GRAND CHAMPIONS of whom no less than 32 are females! There are 15 Seal Points, 8 Lilac Points, 8 Blue Points and 3 Chocolate Points.

In third place are the Burmese with seventeen new GRAND CHAMPIONS.

The next four places were won by the Abyssinians with eight Ruddy and two Red cats; American Shorthairs and Manx with nine GRANDS each; and the Russian Blues with seven males and one lone female.

Five Exotic Shorthairs and three Rex made the honor roll which is completed by one GRAND CHAMPION from each of the Birman, Colorpoint Shorthair, Himalayan and Korat breeds.

Of the thirteen GRAND PREMIERS, five are Burmese females, four are Persians and there is one American Shorthair, an Exotic Shorthair, a Manx and a Siamese.

There was a tie for the distinction of being the cattery to produce the highest number of cats meriting a GRAND title. The following six catteries each bred three of the new GRAND CHAMPIONS:

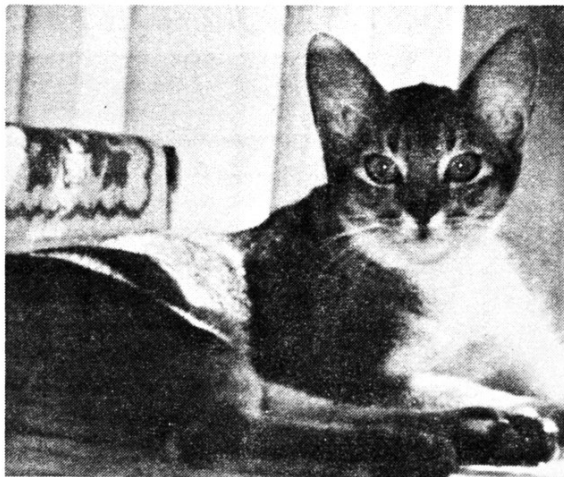

Other regional winners were: *TOK-LATS LITTLE AWFUL ARNIE*, Burmese male, Best Midwest Kitten; *PHAROH CITATION OF SWINGATE*, Ruddy Abyssinian male, 2nd Best Northwest Kitten; *EEE-DEE LITTLE TID-BIT*, Chinchilla Persian female, 4th Best Southwest Kitten; *ERIADOR'S PIPPIN II*, Ruddy Abyssinian male, 4th Best Midwest Kitten; and *PHI-LINE LITTLE BIG MAN*, Burmese male, who tied for 4th Best North Atlantic Kitten.

To win their GRAND CHAMPIONSHIPS, each of these cats had to accumulate 150 points (earned by defeating other Champions) and be selected as one of the Top Five cats in at least one of the shows in which he/she competed. It is not easy to win a C.F.A. GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP. Cats who succeed are really deserving of their laurels.

CFA's 1st Silver Tabby Persian Grand Champion

When breeders and show people think of 'silver tabbies', there is almost an immediate association with 'American Shorthairs'. This is because so many outstanding specimens of Silver Tabby American Shorthairs have appeared at shows for many years. They have been shown to 'Best Cat' many times and, on several occasions, have gone on to become 'Cat of the Year'.

Recently greater interest is being generated in the development of this colour in other breeds; quality silver tabbies are being shown in Rex, Manx, Exotics and Persians. Judges, too, have usually been receptive, and indeed enthusiastic, over finding fine examples of silver tabbies in these breeds.

This past show season, *YOUR PETS STORM CLOUD OF FANFAIR* became the first Silver Tabby Grand Champion in the history of the Cat Fanciers Association.* She completed her Grand Championship at the Daffodil Valley Cat Fanciers' show, Tacoma, Washington, January 13-14, 1973. Her success indicates that the Persian can be bred in this colour to compete with even the typiest solids.

GR.CH. YOUR PETS STORM CLOUD OF FANFAIR was born on May 19, 1970. She was bred by C.F.A. judge, Mrs. Dorothy Baker, who has been working almost alone on the Silver Tabby Persian for close to twenty years. *LOUDY* has a fine pedigree with Co-Mc, Shawnee, Nigrette and Skyway figuring prominently in her Background.

Typewise, *LOUDY* is a big girl with solid, heavy boning, short legs and a beautifully short tail. Her head is very broad, with widely spaced ears and large round eyes. She has a strong chin, and a lovely deep "break" in her short nose. Her eye-colour is hazel, correct for a Silver Tabby Persian for it is near to impossible to obtain black markings and green eyes in the same cat if it is to be typy as well.

When I received her from her breeder in January, 1972, I found that her disposition is as it must be in a pet or show cat--quiet and sweet. Nothing seems to greatly upset her and she arrives unruffled after a long plane trip to a faraway show. She has gone from her home in British Columbia, Canada, to shows as far east as Calgary and as far south as Portland, Oregon.

Silver Tabbies have always been rare in Persians. Perhaps the struggle to keep green eye-colour while trying to improve type defeated most aspiring breeders. Judges now seem to realize how difficult it is to obtain both type and pattern---deep green eyes are just too much to ask. American Shorthairs did not have them, so why persecute the Persians?

Maybe this oversight can be forgiven since breeders and judges have been used to exceptional eye-colour in Persians for what seems eons and finding hazel eyes in the Silver Tabbies just 'turned them off'.

All methods of obtaining this lovely colour class, except colour-breeding, necessitates the use of copper-eyed Persians in the breeding program, usually to a great degree to keep 'solid' type. Crosses of a Silver to a Black, Black Smoke, Red or Brown Tabby can, theoretically, produce Silver Tabbies, but these are many times lacking in pattern and can show traces of tarnishing (brownish tinges) in the coat, especially on the face and down the spine.

Breeding Silver Tabby to Silver Tabby is usually not feasible due to the shortage of quality stock. Males seem especially rare and the author knows of only one sire male Silver Tabby of good show quality. Breeders are, therefore, forced to 'go through hoops'

to develop their line. Most give up before an end is realized.

There have been a few outstanding examples of this colour of breed in the past, practically all from Dorothy Baker's line. *CH. YOUR PETS' MEESE* and her daughter, *CH. YOUR PETS' SEE MEE* are both excellent. *SEE MEE* has over 200 C.F.A. Grand points but, because of the rules, recently changed, requiring a Top Five and Best Champion win in C.F.A., she couldn't complete her Grand. She should have no trouble now. In the East, there are two other lovely Silver Tabby females, *TABBYLAND'S TEQUILA OF RAY-ANN* and *TABBYLAND'S TALCUM*, litter-sisters bred by Mrs. B. Witbeck, who are both climbing to top show wins.

GR.CH. YOUR PETS' STORM CLOUD OF FANFAIR recorded another C.F.A. 'first' by becoming the first Silver Tabby Persian to go Best Cat in an All Breed final. This honor was accorded her by judge Ray Henke at the Red 'N Ruddy Happening show, Everett, Washington, December 2, 1972.

Other top C.F.A. awards she has received during her show career have included: Best Kitten (Matil Rotter, Canton Hall of Fame, January 2, 1971); Best Novice Opposite Sex (Don Williams, Johnny Appleseed, February 6, 1971); 5th Best Cat (Ray Henke, Red 'N Ruddy, March 19, 1972); 4th Best Cat (Catherine Hummer, Red 'N Ruddy, March 19, 1972); 5th Best Cat (Wayne Park, Fraser Valley, April 15, 1972); and 4th Best Cat (Jane Martinke, Puget Sound Cat Club, November 4, 1972). *LOUDY* was C.F.A.'s Northwest Regional Tabby Persian, 1972, and All Star Silver Tabby Persian, 1972.

YOUR PETS' STORM CLOUD OF FANFAIR has also earned a Grand Championship in A.C.F.A. who named her Royal Regional Silver Tabby Persian and Inter-American Silver Tabby Persian in 1972. Another 1972 title she was awarded was All-American Silver Tabby Persian.

It is very exciting to see good Silver Tabby Persians on the show bench after so many years of neglect. With all the new breeders showing such keen interest, it seems that we will be seeing a lot more of them. ###

STUDY UNIT 3

Mendel chose the garden pea in his experiments probably because plant breeding was his hobby much as cat breeding is the hobby of many readers. The experiments he made were all with pure breeding pea plants, but cat breeders can probably understand them more easily if they are reconstructed with cats as the subjects under study. So if two cats known to be homozygous, one for black and one for blue are used to reconstruct Mendel's first experiment the processes and results are as follows:

THE 3:1 RATIO

In the first cross of a homozygous black cat with a homozygous blue cat the first generation progeny, known as the first filial generation and symbolized F₁, will be found to be all black. Black is dominant to blue and blue is recessive to black. The next part of the experiment crosses two of these identical black cats and produces the next filial generation, F₂. The kittens of the F₂ generation will be found to be black and blue in the ratio of 3 black to one blue. However, this is one point where Mendel's experience cannot be reproduced as he obtained 1064 pea plants in his F₂ generation and the likelihood of 1064 kittens resulting from matings between litter mates of F₁ litters are rather remote! However, the ratios remain the same. Many cat breeders would feel hesitant about mating littermates even in the course of an experiment, but of course the ratio of three black to one blue from heterozygotes applies even when the mates are not related. A mating between F₁ progeny can be taken to mean either between littermates or between cats of the same genotype as the littermates.

Thus it can be seen that in this experiment the recessive characteristic (blue) which disappeared in the F₁ generation, reappeared in the F₂ generation intact and not blended in any way with the black. The experiment suggests that the genes responsible for the production of black and blue are transmitted together to the F₁ kittens and are then separated and segregated in the F₂ kittens. The experiment also suggests that each gamete of the original parents contains two genes (either two black genes or two blue genes) and that the two genes then separate or segregate in the formation of gametes, each gamete receiving only one of the genes. If the gene producing black is described as D

Problems

The following problems are based upon information contained in Study Unit #2 published in the May/June issue of *CAT WORLD*. Solutions will be printed in September/October.

2. It is stated that the cat's coded instructions govern the nature of both the chemical ingredients from which it is made and the nature of the chemical changes in its body during its life. If the cat develops from a fertilized cell, in which part of the cell are the instructions carried?
3. Why has use of the symbol y (denoting the sex-linked colour gene producing the red and tortie varieties) been discontinued?
4. The gene producing extra toes (polydactylia) is symbolised Pd . Is this gene inherited as a recessive or as a dominant and how is this information given in its symbol?

SOLUTIONS TO MAY/JUNE "PROBLEMS":

1. 'In the cat there are 36 autosomes' The chromosome complement of the two types of gamete produced by the male cat are (a) 36 autosomes plus two X chromosomes, and (b) 36 autosomes, one X chromosome and one Y chromosome. (a) gametes will be female and (b) gametes will be male.
2. 'Why do genetic differences arise' Genetic differences arise during meiosis rather than from mitosis because mitosis is the normal type of cell division in which the cells divide in a manner resulting in all the daughter cells retaining the full complement of 38 chromosomes. But in the cell division that occurs just before the gametes are formed (meiosis), each daughter cell has only 19 chromosomes. It is only at fertilization, when the daughter cells from each partner unite, that the full complement of 38 is regained. Clearly the fertilized cells will have some chromosomes from each parent and will differ from those produced by each parent during mitosis. Mitosis

and that producing blue as d the original parents are DD and dd respectively. The gametes of the DD cat must be all D and the gametes of the dd cat must be all d . So all the F_1 kittens must inherit alternative genes Dd . Since D is dominant to d , Dd would appear as D or black. In the second generation (F_2) the gametes of one cat must be either D or d as must be those of its mate.

Mendel proposed that hereditary units (in this case D and d) segregated in the gametes and that the gametes themselves united at random. Thus the F_2 kittens must be either Dd like the F_1 parents or DD or dd like the original parents which are known as the first parental generation P_1 , and the ratio of one genotype to another in the F_2 must be $1DD:2Dd:1dd$. Since both DD and Dd kittens appear black, this results in F_2 progeny that are in the ratio of 3 black:1 blue.

These test matings reconstruct the experiments which led to Mendel's first law or principle of segregation, and help to explain that while cats may appear alike they may have a different coding. This distinction between appearance (phenotype) and coding (genotype) must often be made.

A reconstruction of Mendel's experiment is shown diagrammatically in next column.

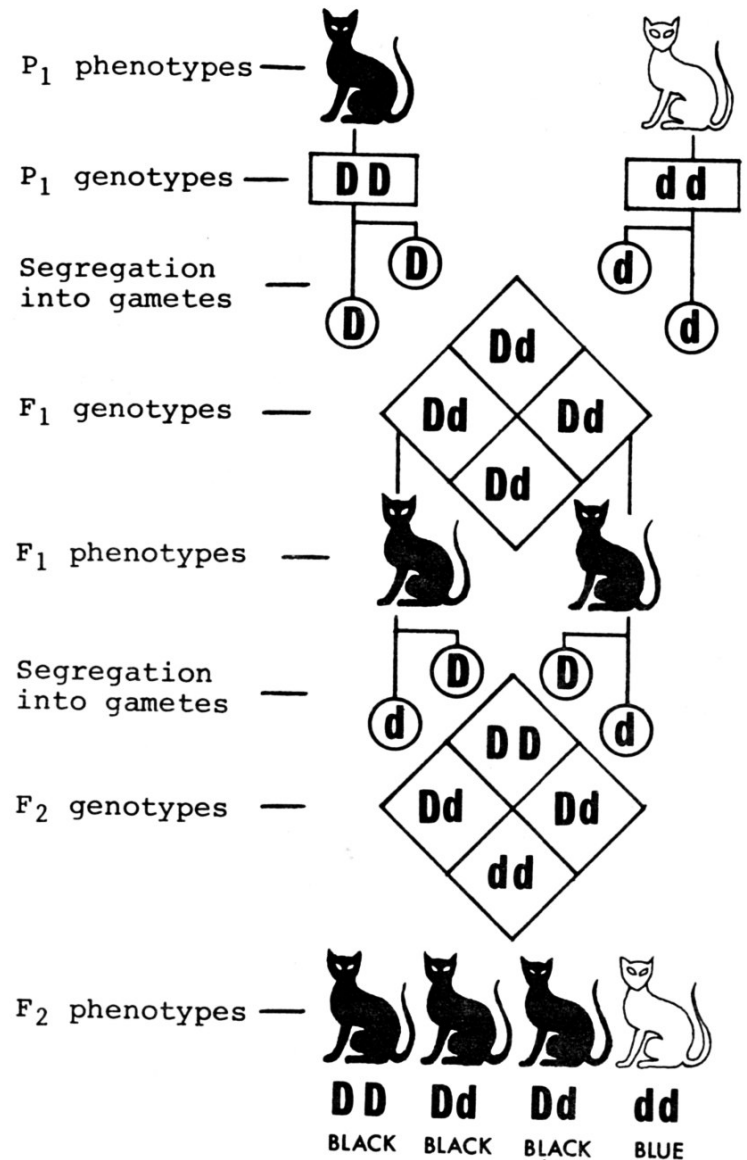
The checkerboard, a Punnett's square, shown on end in the diagram is a useful aid to the cat breeder and the same experiment can be rewritten as follows:

- (1) Cat No. 1 = DD - homozygous black;
- (2) Cat No. 2 = dd - homozygous blue
- (3) The DD cat will produce gametes carrying D .
- (4) The dd cat will produce gametes carrying d .
- (5) Therefore fertilization of any one gamete by another will result in the genotype Dd and since D is dominant to d all the F_1 kittens will be black.

To obtain the F_2 a mating is made between the F_1 littermates or to unrelated cats of the same genotype as the F_1 littermates---each of these cats producing two types of

results in daughter cells with the same chromosome complement whereas meiosis results in daughter cells with half the chromosome complement.

3. 'Recessive Oregon Rex, recessive Cornish' No, a mating between an Oregon Rex queen and either a Cornish or Devon Rex stud will not produce any rex kittens. They will all have normal hair. The non-rex kittens produced will be carriers for both rex varieties as the three varieties of rex are non-allelic to each other.
4. 'In a litter from a Seal Tabby (or Seal Lynx) Point Siamese' The Tabby (or Lynx) Point kitten is heterozygous for agouti. The Seal Point kittens will never produce Tabby (or Lynx) Points if mated to Seal Points.

gametes in equal proportions---one carrying D and the other carrying d. The chances for any male gamete to fertilise a female gamete similar to itself are equal so that four types of fertilisation are possible.

The experiment between black and blue cats shows the method by which a single dominant or recessive characteristic is inherited and the ratios will apply to any matings between black and blue breeds and similarly to any matings between cats with dominant and recessive characteristics.

Since any recessive coloured cat must be homozygous in order to express that colour, the only doubt may be concerning the genotype of the dominant mate. If, by its pedigree, homozygosity is uncertain then its previous breeding records could give the answer.

So the kittens of any blue cat x homozygous black cat are black and the kittens of any cat of recessive characteristic x cat of homozygous dominant characteristic are of the dominant characteristic.

Keeping to the blue x black matings a few examples are given as follows:

1. Blue Persian x homozygous Black Persian = all Black;
2. Blue Smoke x homozygous Black Smoke = all Black Smoke;
3. Blue Chinchilla x homozygous Normal Chinchilla = all Normal Chinchilla;

4. Blue British x homozygous Black British = all Black;
5. Blue Burmese x homozygous Brown Burmese = all Brown;
6. Blue Point Siamese x homozygous Seal Point Siamese = all Seal Point;
7. Blue Tabby x homozygous Brown Tabby = all Brown Tabby.

The above matings are all between cats with either D or d in their genotype as Brown Burmese is black amended by a gene for burmese; Seal Point Siamese is black amended by a gene for siamese; Brown Tabby is black amended by a gene for agouti; Chinchilla is black amended by another, etc.

All the Black, Black Smoke, Normal Chinchilla, Brown Burmese, Seal Point Siamese and Brown Tabby kittens will, of course, be heterozygous for blue.

The kittens of any mating between these cats heterozygous for blue or any one other recessive characteristic will assort in a ratio of three dominant to one recessive and taking the same examples again the results would be as follows:

1. Heterozygous Black Persian x heterozygous Black Persian = 3 Black:1 Blue;
2. Heterozygous Black Smoke x heterozygous Black Smoke = 3 Black Smoke:1 Blue Smoke;
3. Heterozygous Normal Chinchilla x heterozygous Normal Chinchilla = 3 Normal Chinchilla:1 Blue Chinchilla;
4. Heterozygous Black British x heterozygous Black British = 3 Black:1 Blue;
5. Heterozygous Brown Burmese x heterozygous Brown Burmese = 3 Brown:1 Blue;
6. Heterozygous SP Siamese x heterozygous SP Siamese = 3 SP:1 BP;
7. Heterozygous Brown Tabby x heterozygous Brown Tabby = 3 Brown Tabby:1 Blue Tabby.

NEW REX MUTATION?

In your second issue of CAT WORLD there were several fine articles about rex cats. I am a small, new breeder of Cornish rex but just recently I was lucky enough to obtain a curly adult cat from a barn population in Pennsylvania. The cat, Radar, is from a semi-feral line of ASH with no known exposure to registered rex cats. Radar is quite typey ASH but with lovely, thick, soft curls.

Hair samples have been sent to Roy Robinson for examination and evaluation. He reports: "The hair samples reveal that the hairs are typically rexoid. Not of the Devon type but somewhat similar to the Cornish." He recommends experimental crosses to both Devon and Cornish to determine if Radar is indeed a distinctive rex variety. An experimental breeding to ASH has already been made and we are awaiting kittens at this point.

Anyone who is interested in assisting in these first crosses please let me know. I would be happy to hear from anyone who may know of any other "barn" rexes.

DEVON REX BREED CLUB FORMS

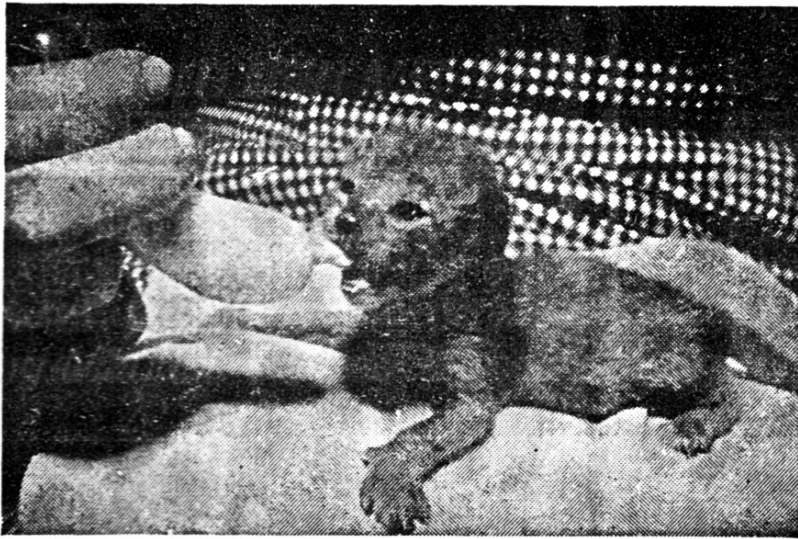

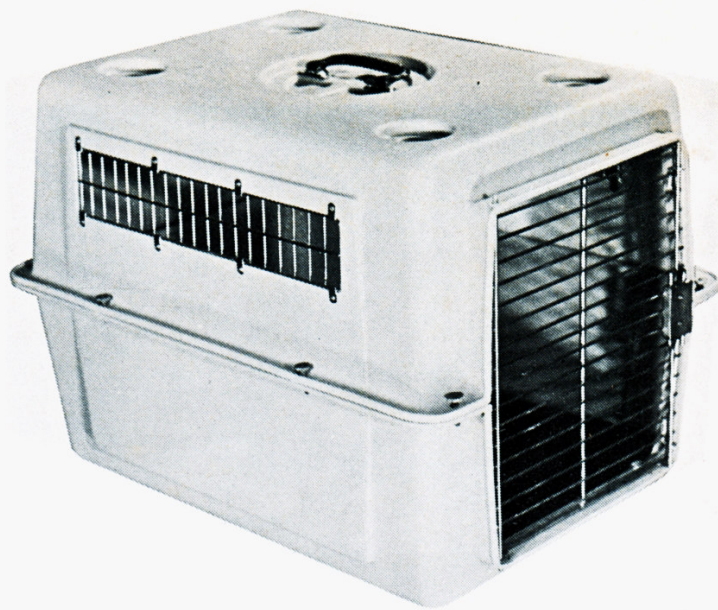
