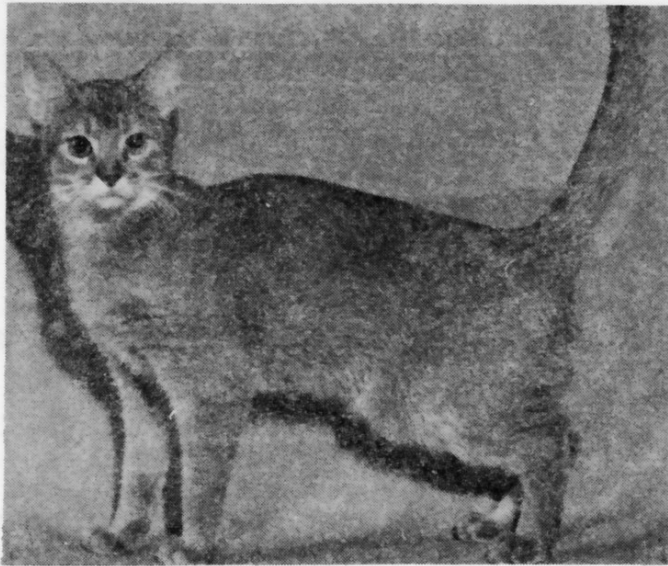

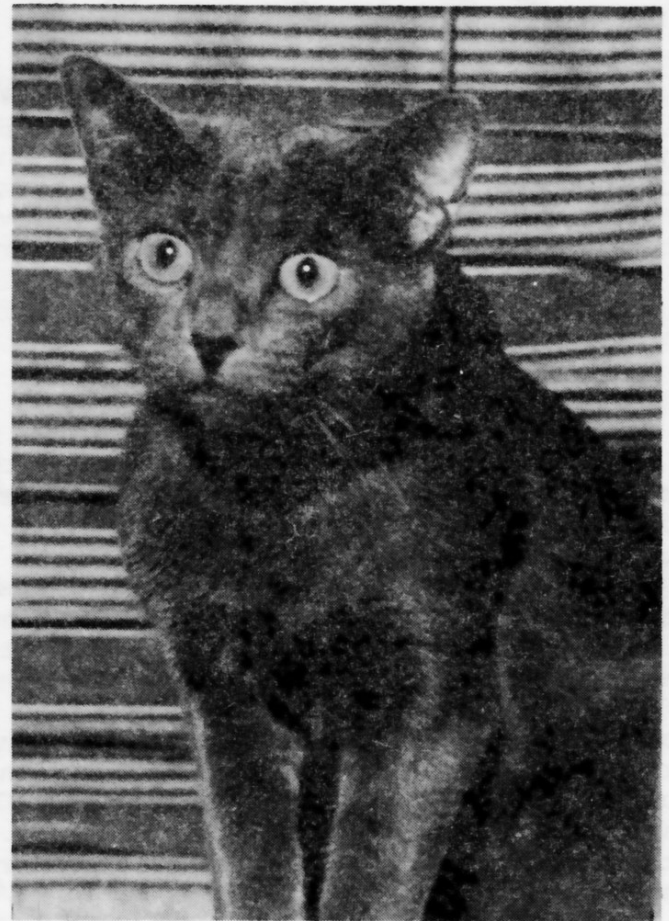

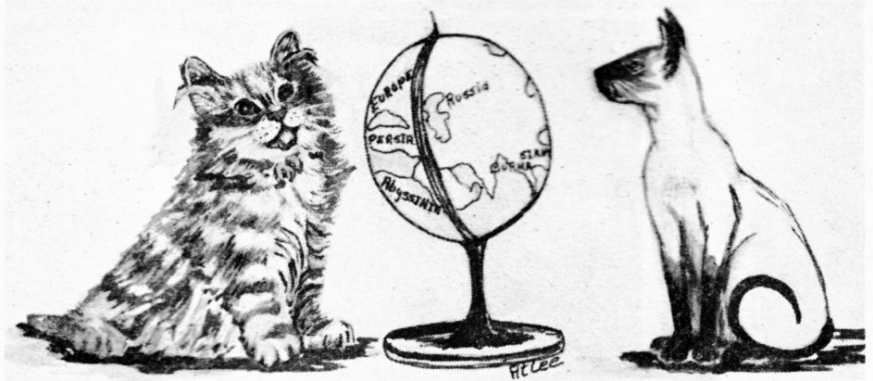

The premiere edition of the CFA MERCURY in the center of this issue, represents another example of leadership by Cat Fanciers Association, Inc., America's largest and most progressive cat registering body.

Previously, this association's dynamic ideas, news, views and results of its important research work were disseminated in the pages of the CFA QUARTERLY. Your letters with questions and comments on this subject are invited: a selection will be published and all will be forwarded to Mr. Gebhardt.

## THE ROYAL CAT OF SIAM

In a world of well bred Longhairs and stout British Shorthairs, the arrival of the Royal Cat of Siam must have been something of a shock that ultimately turned out to be a pleasant one. The breed which was new to Britain apparently arrived in different colors, or at least there were different shades of the same hue which were difficult to describe. Some were called dun colored with dark chocolate brown points while others were said to be light gray with black ears and facial markings. It is impossible to be certain, but there were at least two, if not three, varieties.

In addition to the dun or light fawn and light grey Siamese, there were also deep brown colored cats that were self browns for all practical purposes. While the former are reported to have had amber eyes, the latter self browns were blue eyed. It is tempting, indeed, to speculate about these various reports in regard to the sequence of development and introduction of seal and blue varieties of Siamese and the Burmese cat.

From the various graduations, the British developed the Seal Point Siamese.

Harrison Weir reported in "Our Cats And All About Them" that a survey of Crystal Palace catalogs from 1871 to 1887 revealed fifteen female Siamese and five male competitors.

During the early years, Sir Robert Herbert, the Duke of Wellington and a Mr. Brennard had either imported or sent the new variety to England. Mrs. Vyvyan of Dover had acquired a pair of kittens with their sire and dam. Mrs. Vyvyan and her sister, Mrs. Forestier-Walker were early breeders of Siamese. Their efforts produced the great *TIAM-O-SHIAN* and succeeding *TIAM-O-SHIANS*, the fourth of which sired famous progeny including *EVE*, *SUZANNE* and *KITYA HARA*.

Mrs. M. Robinson acquired *WANKEE* from Hong Kong in 1896, and *WANKEE* is reported to be the first Siamese Champion in England. His offspring were *BEBA*, *MENELIK*, *CHASELEY ROBIN* and *SAM SLY*.

Other early Siamese breeders in England were Lady Dorothy Nevill, Mrs. Cunliffe Lee and the Rev. S. Baring-Gould.

There are various reports as to the arrival time of Siamese in America. Two of the earliest arrivals were *LOCKEHAVEN SIAM* and *LOCKEHAVEN SALLY WARD*. The cats belonged to Mrs. Clinton Locke of Chicago. The Seal Point male had been imported to France from

*PROUD PETRONELLA*, was Best Shorthair in 1949 at the Scottish Cat Club's show in Glasgow. Owned by Miss E.H. Grant, Auchterless, Aberdeenshire, she was bred by Major Murrell.

Siam, and Mrs. Locke acquired him in France. Mrs. Spencer of Ohio bought the Chocolate Point female, *SALLY WARD*, from Mrs. Locke.

Mrs. Clinton Locke founded Beresford Cat Club and initiated a Beresford Cat Club Book which lists the following Siamese:

# Showmanship

by DON FIX

## YOUR SHOW FLYER AND ITS COUSINS

Your show flyer is the first public contact that your show has; mailed almost two months ahead of the event as an announcement to exhibitors, it will end up (1) on the bulletin board, (2) on the den shelf, or (3) in the wastebasket, depending upon its appearance and the message it gives exhibitors (somewhat tempered by the reputation of your club).

Your show flyer has two cousins of which you may be unaware. They are the (1) show poster, and (2) catalog cover. Many clubs relegate the flyer to the entry clerk, the poster to the publicity chairman and the catalog cover to the remainder of the club in a contest or to the catalog chairman whose wife can draw a cat. Generally, the result is a pretty nice catalog cover (having had some time and attention), a rather spartan poster, and a flyer that reads like a set of orders specifying the sequence of KP duties to an Army unit in the field.

It must be remembered (and verify this if you like) that your 'captive audience' at shows is less than 25% of your exhibitor list (fanciers who want the points no matter what); your 'semi-captive' crowd is another 25% (fanciers whose cats need one or two wins and who will generally make an effort to support the show); but the remaining 50% are those who want to show their cats for social reasons, preferring local shows and free weekends. If they like the presentation they'll return, if not, they'll play bridge, bowl, watch TV or visit friends or mow the lawn ..... the fact that most 'average' fanciers are in the circuits for a very short time accounts for the fact that there are no 1,000-cat shows despite a growing fancy and growing popularity of cats as members of the household. If you have been on committees updating exhibitor lists from year to year, you might have been astounded more than once at the number of show 'dropouts' and it might have occurred to you that the shows were not competing effectively with other weekend offerings. This is true. It has to do with more than the show flyer, but the flyer is what we are talking about this time and so the better it does its job, the better off the show. If every exhibitor who has entered shows stayed with the shows for two years, we would have had 1,000-cat shows for the past half-decade.

Consider for the moment the selection of the show theme almost as soon as the show is planned; the drawing of the catalog cover shortly thereafter, and then either (1) 'overlying' vital data such as fees, judges, location, entry clerk, closing date, etc. etc.

**A** tradition in the British cat fancy is the publication of reports following each show written by the judges on the winning cats in their classes. These reports appear every other Thursday in the cat section of *FUR & FEATHER*, an intriguing little newspaper for fanciers of rabbits, covies, mice, pigeons, poultry and cats.

No punches are pulled in these reports and, for those who have presented their cats for judging in less than tiptop condition, the remarks, which include names of owner and cat, can be downright embarrassing! Mrs. Denton, writing of a Longhair in one of her classes last season, said: "This little cat was spoilt on day by preparation. Lovely head, neat ears, short broad nose, very typy, good chin, eyes round and lovely colour, stained badly, coat not at its best on day." She placed the cat third in a class of five.

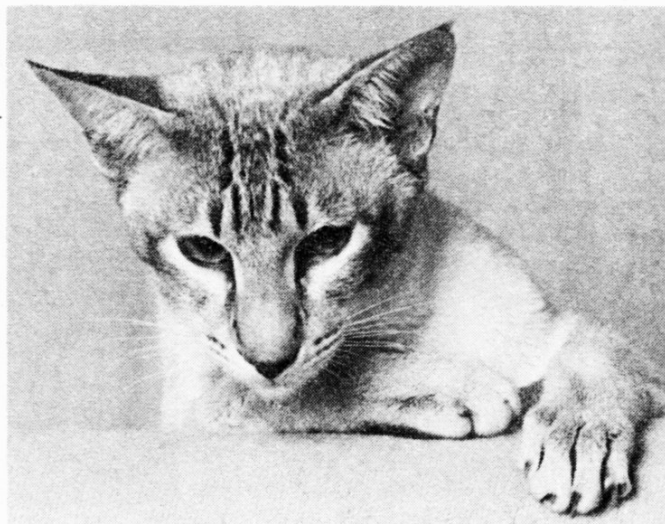
A Challenge Certificate (CC) can be awarded to the cat who wins first place in its appropriate Open class; however, if the judge is not confident that the CC is truly merited for any reason, he/she has every right to withhold it and does not hesitate to do so. Mrs. Nancy Hardy, withholding on a Cornish Rex, wrote in her report: "I was sorry to have to withhold the CC but he did not quite qualify for it. Good medium wedge, strong chin and flat skull, large well set ears and fine eyes, good whiskers, firm long body, slim legs and long tapering tail with some straight hairs and very bald from the base along the top, dense waved coat inclined to be a bit shaggy and rusty in patches, thin fur on the flanks and ears."

Even when a CC is merited and given, the judge's report is likely to include a word or two of criticism as well as compliments as will be seen from this article. For the breeder/exhibitor there is much to be gleaned from these judges' observations, not only on a cat in which one has a personal interest, but about what pleases each judge in a particular breed. Praise is not lightly given: when it is, it is highly appreciated.

For CAT WORLD's 1974 salute to the *GREAT CATS OF GREAT BRITAIN*, we felt that readers would enjoy meeting some of the new GCCF Champions, Premiers and Grands via the words of their judges of the past season. Each cat included in the charts earned at least three Challenge Certificates under three different judges to become a Champion with the Premiers and Grands fulfilling similar requirements in their respective classes. Additional data on the cats reviewed will be found in the chart for the breed concerned.

At the time of going to press, the complete, official list of cats winning their titles during the 1973/'74 season had not been issued by the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy. This feature was compiled from notifications sent to CAT WORLD by exhibitors. Let's relive some of the past season as it

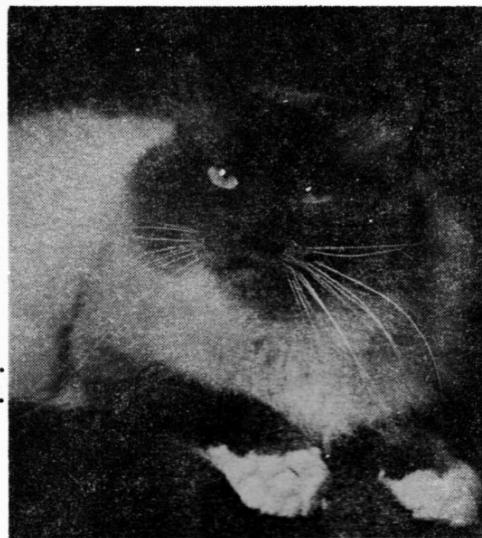
#### EARLY SEASON SHOWS

The Siamese Cat Association began the 1973/74 season with their Championship show at St. Albans on June 2 managed by Mrs. Arnold. Mrs. L.J.A. Price, judging Lilac Pt. Siamese gave a CC to Mrs. Snelling's SPRINGFIELD MONGKUT and reported: "Excellent head and profile, elegant paws, good tail, still very young, colour on paws tended to be a little too pale, slight rings on tail, shape of eyes excellent and this decided me to place him first in this competitive class. Very balanced and attractive cat of wonderful temperament."

Ten Exemption and Sanction shows followed during the summer including the Essex Cat Club's July 14 event at Chelmsford with 260 entries and 1,000 spectators. It was an exciting day for Mrs. Elsie Fisher as she saw her PRAHA NEPSENI, Seal Pt. Birman, win his class and go on to take Best LH In Show! 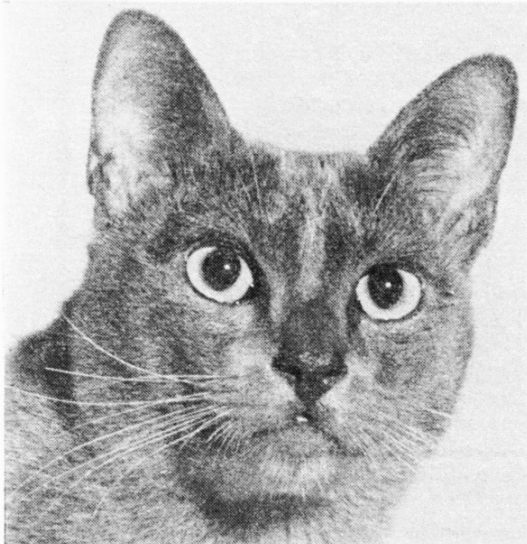

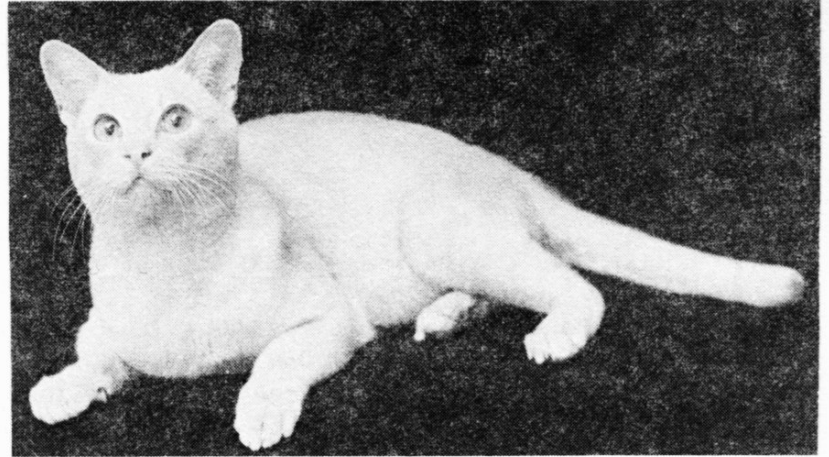

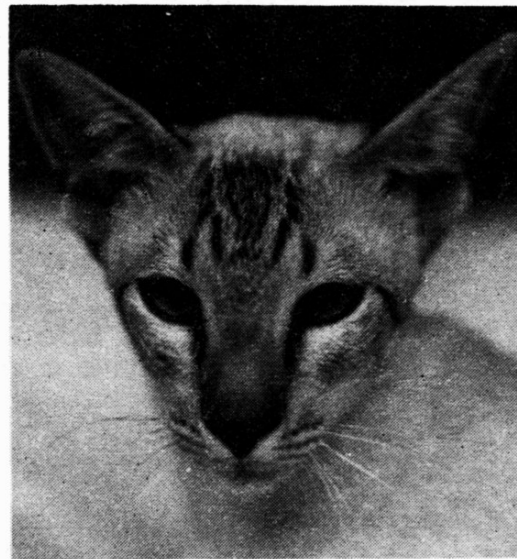
feared due to the possibility that the enormous, cold hall could not be heated on the

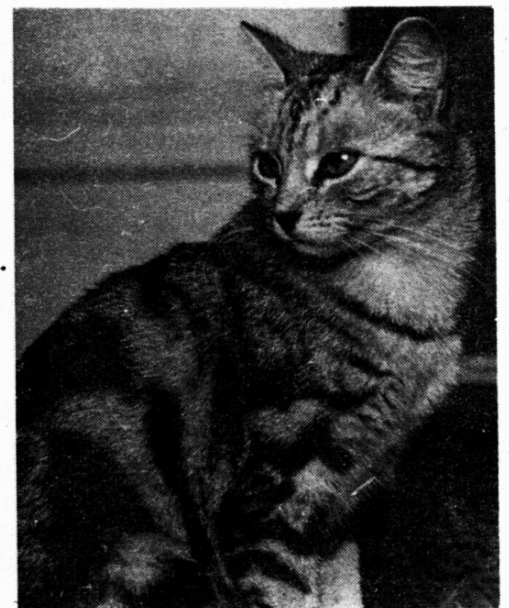
## EYES TO THE NORTH IN FEBRUARY

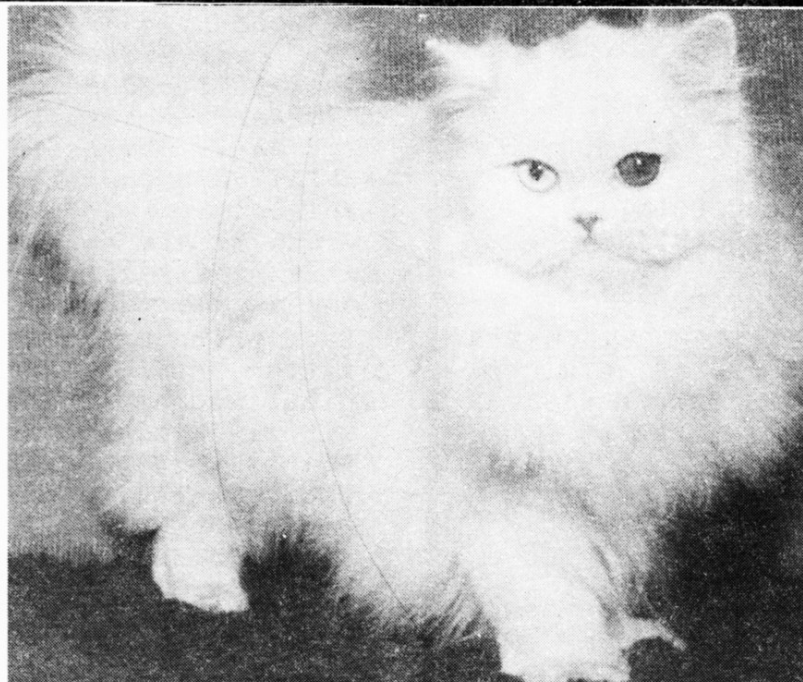

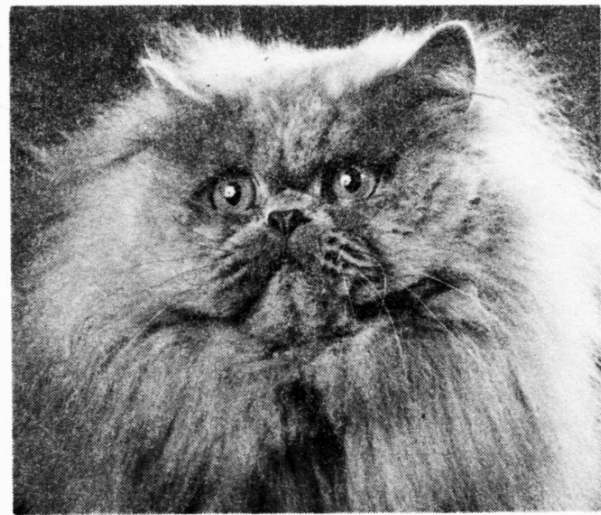

# College Of Cat Genetics

## STUDY UNIT 8

### THE 9:3:3:1 RATIO

The study of single gene differences in what are known as monohybrid crosses led to Mendel's discovery of the principle of segregation and through the use of this principle it became possible to predict the segregation between two different alleles in any single gene pair as well as to predict their subsequent behaviour in succeeding cat generations. However, Mendel did not stop his experiments at that stage but went on to consider the progeny of individuals differing in two pairs of genes. Such crosses are known as dihybrid crosses. He chose plants which were true breeding for two dominant characters (yellow and round seeds) and two recessive characters (green and wrinkled seeds). In the  $F^1$  generation he obtained seeds which were all yellow and round and even by varying the parents as to which one carried the dominant and recessive characters he never obtained any  $F^1$  generation of any different character.

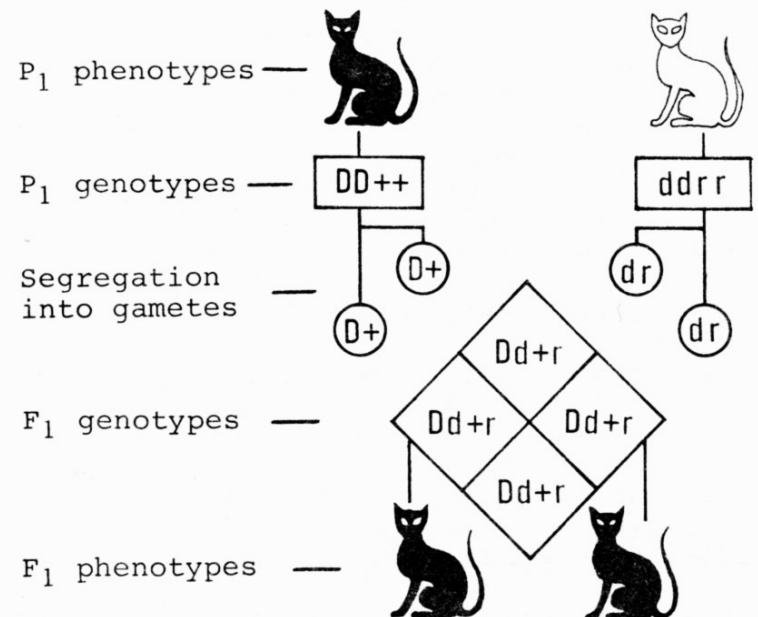
When the  $F^1$  plants were allowed to self pollinate, Mendel obtained four kinds of  $F^2$  individuals in what appeared to be a new ratio of numbers. The actual results were 315 yellow round, 101 yellow wrinkled, 108 green round and 32 green wrinkled. In terms of proportion, these numbers are very close to the 9:3:3:1 ratio.

Mendel's experiment can be reconstructed with cats as follows:

A cat homozygous for both full intensity of colour (black) and straight coat is mated to a cat that is homozygous for dilution of colour (blue) and Cornish Rex coat. All the kittens will be black and straight coated and when mature and mated either together or to others of the same genotype they will produce an  $F^2$  generation in the ratio of 9 black non-rex: 3 black rex: 3 blue non rex: 1 blue rex. Looking carefully at the  $F^2$  kittens, it can be seen that each pair of characters (i.e. black and blue and non-rex and rex) shows a ratio of three to three black to one blue and three non-rex to one rex. The two pairs of characters are segregating independently and combining independently as well. So the chances for a cat to be black or blue are independent of its chances to be straight or rex coated. This applies to many sets of gene pairs: black and brown and full colour and siamese which segregated and recombined

can give blacks, seal point siamese; chestnut brown foreign and chocolate point siamese is but one other example.

The experiment reconstructed with black and blue and non-rex and rex is shown diagrammatically as follows:



The mating of two cats, one homozygous for black colour and straight coat and the other homozygous for blue colour and Cornish Rex coat. The  $F^1$  generation are all black and straight coated.

The kittens produced by the mating of the F<sup>1</sup> heterozygotes are as follows:

- 1 DD++ homozygous black homozygous non rex. (Black Shorthair).
- 2 DD+r homozygous black heterozygous for rex. (Black Shorthair).
- 2 Dd++ heterozygous black homozygous non rex. (Black Shorthair).
- 4 Dd+r heterozygous black heterozygous for rex. (Black Shorthair).
- 1 DDrr homozygous black homozygous rex. (Black Rex).
- 2 Ddrr heterozygous black homozygous rex. (Black Rex).
- 1 dd++ homozygous blue homozygous non rex. (Blue Shorthair).
- 2 dd+r homozygous blue heterozygous for rex. (Blue Shorthair)
- 1 ddr+ heterozygous blue homozygous rex (Blue Rex).

Although the kittens carrying genes Dd+r, DD+r, and Dd++ are heterozygous for one or more characteristics they are, of course, identical in appearance or phenotype to DD++ kittens as a result of the dominance of genes for full intensity and non rex or straight coat.

These kittens therefore have the same phenotype but not the same genotype and until they have matured and produced sufficient kittens for classification it is not possible to state their genotype with any degree of certainty. Two new combinations have arisen in the course of this experiment. The experiment started with two types of cats: black non-rex and blue Cornish rex, and finished with four types of cat: black non-rex, black rex, blue non-rex and blue rex. The black rex and the blue non-rex are the new combinations and are described as recombinants.

The expected ratio of combinations from a large enough number of matings would, therefore, be 9 black non-rex:3 black rex:3 blue non-rex:1 blue rex. As dilution of colour and Cornish rex coat are said to be on different chromosomes (in point of fact it

would be truer to say that they have not been shown to be linked) the ratios given pre-suppose no linkage.

Of course the 9:3:3:1 ratio refers only to the phenotypes produced and by denoting the gene for full intensity of colour as D, the gene for dilution of colour as d, the gene for non-rex coat as + and the gene for Cornish rex coat as r the original cat parents were symbolised DD++ and ddr. The gametes formed by each of the parents either had the formula D+ or dr which combined to form the genotype of F<sup>1</sup> kittens Dd+r. Obviously the dominance relationship between D and d was not affected by that between + and r since all the kittens of the F<sup>1</sup> generations were black non-rex. According to the principles of segregation, the gametes of the F<sup>1</sup> generation contained D and d in equal proportions. Similarly for the +r gene pair half the gametes contained + and the other half r. There were then equal proportions of D and Dr gametes and also equal proportions of d and dr gametes. To sum up: the four types of gamete produced by the F<sup>1</sup> were D+, d+, Dr and dr in a ratio of 1:1:1:1 or ¼ to ¼ to ¼ to ¼. The probability that each of the four types of gamete from one parent would combine with any one of the four types of gamete from the other is ¼ x ¼ = 1/16.###

# A KITTEN & YOUNG CAT MORTALITY STUDY

PREPARED BY THE RESEARCH COMMITTEE OF C.F.A. (DR. R. PELTZ, CHAIRMAN).

Since we are all concerned with breeding cats and trying to produce kittens of good quality, it seemed worthwhile to try to determine how many kittens we were losing. More importantly, it seemed vital to find out why kittens die. What are the most common causes of death in the newborn and young kitten? For we must know where our problems are in order to solve them.

"A Kitten And Young Cat Mortality Study" was initiated by CFA. Considering the fact that CFA has averaged about 375 to 400 clubs in the past four to five years, the response to the survey was poor. We received only 50 replies to the first study and, for 1973, 79 questionnaires were returned. The questions concerned the first year of life and we found that the total number of kittens born from January 1, 1973, to December 31, 1973, in the catteries of reporting breeders was 1,080. Of that number, 336 died of various causes within the first year.

By breed, the information obtained from the catteries reporting deaths is as follows:

From the reports of our breeders, we find that their greatest loss was those kittens that never breathed. From what I could determine, of the 86, only two appeared that they had died in utero and had been dead for some time prior to delivery.

The most interesting point to me was that breeders do not know how to, at least, try to salvage the newborn. Such comments as 'the mother cat didn't seem to know what to do' emphasized the fact that the breeder did not know either.

There are many causes for stillbirths, the majority of which cannot be determined by the breeder. Malformations incompatible with life may be obvious. Prolonged labor resulting in prolonged anoxia to the kitten during delivery may well be suspected in certain instances. Internal injury to kittens during labor and delivery could go unsuspected. It seems to me that the best way to determine the causes of stillbirth is to enlist veterinary help and obtain post-mortem examinations.

COMMON SENSE WAYS TO SAVE KITTENS

The second greatest cause of kitten death is infection. 67 deaths were reported as having been caused by infections, the majority of which involved the respiratory tract. And most of these occurred during the first two to three weeks of life.

How can some of these deaths be prevented? Well there is no substitute for plain, everyday common sense.

First, keep the kittens in a draft free area. If the mother cat has an infection, obtain treatment for her and try to find a wet nurse for the kittens.

Do not be so proud of your kittens that you invited every Tom, Dick and Harry, together with their children, to see the proud additions. Do not let anyone near your kittens, and do not add to the stress of the mother cat by letting your own kids and the family dog create a disturbance near her kittens. Any kind of stress lowers the cat's resistance to infection.

It should go without saying that new cats brought into the household should always be isolated, and certainly no cats returning from shows should be in contact with mother

cat and kittens. If you, yourself, have a cold or cough, try to keep your contact with the cat to a minimum. In other words, try to prevent trouble.

If, in spite of all precautions, the kittens develop respiratory infections, consult your veterinarian and follow his advice. That's one half of the battle: the other is, the provision of nourishment to the kittens. For once they have such an infection, they stop nursing and you must start force feeding. The chances for survival at such a tender age are slim, indeed.

Once the kittens are out of the box, the next serious problems that can occur are: kerato conjunctivitis, chronic rhinorhea, simple vomiting, diarrhea and diarrhea due to coccidia and worms. It was of great interest to me that none of these common problems was reported as a cause of death. Perhaps we are getting smarter.

The third greatest cause of deaths encompassed 47 kittens. These died for no discernible reason. What can one say to this, except to emphasize that in many instances the kittens were autopsied and still no cause of death was found. Perhaps some of you are unaware of the fact that an autopsy does not always provide the answer but that should not deter us from at least trying to find out.

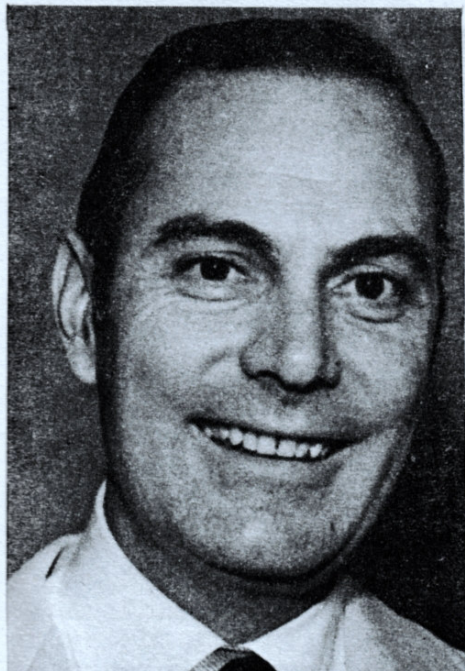
FADING KITTEN SYNDROME

The Fading Kitten Syndrome accounted for 44 deaths. These deaths were difficult to categorize. They occurred during the first five to ten days of life for the most part and included those kittens that either failed to

# One Cat - One Registration

The cost of cat food goes UP .... gasoline goes UP .... show entry fees go UP .... a never-ending upward spiral. Wouldn't it be good news to you,

North American Breeders and Exhibitors, to know that you have the power to force the cost of one phase of cat fancying DOWN?

The secret is .... demand one registration for one cat!

In this age of high costs, it makes no sense whatsoever for one cat to be registered maybe as many as nine times ... a cost to the cat's owner of up to \$25.00 when \$3.00 could and should be the maximum.

Financial consideration is not the only argument in favor of just one registration for one cat. A cat's name (and cattery name) is registered for protection: to secure this it is actually necessary to register nine times with nine different associations. Remember, though, the protection gained from all this effort and expense is good only until a few individuals decide they want a 'kingdom' of their own and we have a tenth association! You, the breeders and exhibitors, are paying for this and the cost is staggering in time, effort, money and the duplication many times of all the work and expense for all concerned.

Many breeders have discovered that the name chosen for a particular cat and registered by one association is not available in one, or even several, of the others. Therefore, this one cat must be given a second and third name .... or even more names. For the breeder this creates a cattery record-keeping problem, loss of identity in advertising, and other related difficulties.

## WHO IS THE BREEDER?

Consider, too, what happens when a multi-registered cat is sold. The new owner may not want to go to the expense of paying transfer fees to all the associations in which the cat holds a registration number, so decides to officially transfer ownership in only one or two.

Later this cat has a litter of kittens which are subsequently sold to new own-

ers who are confused to learn that the seller is officially the breeder only in those associations in which he transferred ownership of the dam, not in those with whom he elected to forego the transfer expense! What happens then? The needless paperwork, expense and confusion goes on and on.

Then there is the problem regarding the cat's title. A cat might be sold as a Champion, which it is in one association. Its new owner may decide to show the cat in CFA and enters it as a Champion instead of Novice or Open. This is an innocent mistake on the part of the new owner and the cat must be disqualified by the CFA Central Office. Mrs. Jean Rose, CFA Executive Director, has commented, "In all the years that I have worked with the office, I have yet to be able to disqualify a cat without regret."

THE SOLUTION .... A CENTRAL FELINE REGISTRY Several years ago, Cat Fanciers Association, accurately forecasting the impending enormous growth of the cat fancy, set up a modern, 3,200 sq.ft. computerized Central Office complete with the latest equipment and a staff trained in computer technology. The office is under the direction of Mrs. Jean Rose, herself an experienced breeder/exhibitor, who has handled C.F.A. business since 1958.

C.F.A. is by far the largest of any North American registering body. As an example, a comparison of recent figures indicates that C.F.F. (Cat Fanciers Federation) and A.C.A. (American Cat Association) register fewer cats, catteries, litters, etc., in an entire year than C.F.A. registers in one month. A.C.F.A. (American Cat Fanciers Association) registers almost 45% of the number of cats registered in a year by C.F.A. As a conjecture, I would estimate that of all cats eligible for registration, 90% of them are registered with C.F.A., 5% may never be registered because of early demise or their status as pets only, and 5% are not eligible for C.F.A. registration. The other eight associations have duplicates, or registrations for cats that would not meet C.F.A. requirements.

It has always been a goal of C.F.A. to unify the cat fancy. As a step in this direction, the association offered the use of its vast equipment and facilities to handle the registration of cats for any other or

all associations so that each one could give to its exhibitors the great advantage of just one registration for each cat. Each of the eight other associations was invited to send a representative to visit C.F.A. and discuss a mutually agreeable way to operate a Central Feline Registry for the benefit of every cat breeder and exhibitor in the nation.

That was over a year ago. To date, not one association has accepted the invitation so no discussions have taken place. Incredible as it may seem, not one representative from even one of these eight registering bodies has been sufficiently interested in saving money for YOU to come and discuss with C.F.A. how it can be done!

AN APPEAL FOR BREEDER/EXHIBITOR ACTION

In view of this completely negative attitude on the part of officialdom, I now appeal to YOU, the cat fancier, because it is YOU who will decide the fate of the cat fancy in America and even throughout the world. Do YOU want to be able to register each cat only once, have the registration number accepted anywhere and know that there could be no possibility of duplication in cattery name or cat's name?

C.F.A. offers a reliable service to the public .... YOU, the breeder/exhibitor. Its purpose as a registering body is to record the backgrounds of cats. When we register a cat of a breed, we have an obligation to determine that the progeny of that cat will be the same. When an individual buys a cat of a particular breed, he is entitled to know that when he mates that cat the resulting kittens will be of that particular breed. With the use of the Central Registry, which would record every exhibitor's cats, *regardless of the association in which he/she chooses to show them*, this valuable protection would automatically be at the service of all.

Interested? Want to force down spiraling costs? Want to eliminate paperwork duplication? Here's what you can do. Call or write the secretary of one or more of the eight small associations and give them your opinion on the idea of one registration for one cat. Request that they meet with C.F.A. for discussions. The door at C.F.A.'s Red Bank, New Jersey, office is open .... the year-old invitation still stands.

Let's get the Central Feline Registry rolling .... one registration for one cat. Who will benefit? YOU!###

thrive and faded away, and some kittens that were alive and well one day and dead the next. These latter deaths would not seem to me to be 'fading kittens'. I was quite hesitant to include them under this heading but these deaths were classified as the breeder indicated. I realized that I would have the oppor-

tunity to comment on them.

Let us exclude those tiny kittens of the litter, those which are always the tiniest and most perfectly coated and patterned. These are the runts which require special care for survival. They are akin to our well formed human infants that need incubator care. Their only problem is smallness and, as a result, they cannot compete with the large kittens in the litter.

What about those kittens that are well one day and dead the next? Obviously such a kitten cannot be considered a fading kitten unless, of course, the breeder has not carefully checked the kitten each day and the kitten has been ill longer than suspected.

The sudden, or seemingly sudden, death is a special category. In such cases we should certainly consider trauma. Mother cats frequently tote kittens around and can drop them. Other cats may have jumped into the kitten box or gotten into the kitten cage and accidentally injured one of the kittens. Head injury is frequently deceptive. The kitten may have had a seizure at the time of injury, recover and then succumb to cerebral bleeding several days later. The breeder may not have witnessed the injury and may not have seen the terminal seizure and death. Suddenly the kitten that was well and nursing is dead.

Such an accident occurred to one of my kittens and I would have considered the death as sudden and due to unknown cause had I not seen the initial trauma, the initial convulsion, the recovery and subsequent absolute well-being for one week and the sudden and final seizures.

Another group of kitten deaths during the first ten days of life which may seem sudden are those due to umbilical cord sepsis. Occasionally one may see some redness at the umbilical stump, but usually the kitten is well one day and dead the next.

Then the breeder must consider the possibility of congenital malformations, usually involving heart and/or lungs, which are compatible with life and growth up to a certain point in time. Then death occurs without apparent reason and usually it is sudden heart failure. An autopsy would clarify such deaths.

So there are several causes for kittens that suddenly die. These kittens do not fade.

Well, what about the fading kitten syndrome and the 44 deaths correctly or incorrectly attributed to that cause? The fading kitten syndrome is a vague etiologic cause of death but the term describes the situation quite accurately. I am not at all certain as to the etiology of this syndrome. It well may be defined, but I strongly suspect that it may be due to improper nutrition in the queen during gestation and during lactation. The mother and kittens' body stores are borderline. Minimal depletion of calories, early in life, disturbs the borderline balance,

and the kitten becomes too weak to nurse and then fades away.

ACCIDENTS AND EUTHANASIA

Twenty kittens died as a result of accidents, some of which conceivably could have been avoided. Certainly the family dog has no place near kittens. One such instance was reported: the family dog killed the kittens. Various and sundry injuries following no particular pattern accounted for the accidental deaths.

Farther down the list one comes to euthanasia. I should like to refer to one particular instance in which apparently healthy kittens were euthanized because one cat in the cattery was positive for leukemia. Sometimes words get garbled in the translation, but, from the response on the questionnaire, it seemed that the breeder followed the advice of her veterinarian and had the kittens put down. I disagree with this, and I think most veterinarians would also disagree. The usual recommendation is to isolate and periodically check titers. Another thing that concerns me is the number of false positive and false negative titers. I don't believe breeders should rely on the results of one or two tests. The quality of the laboratory in which the tests are done is quite important.

BREEDERS WORLDWIDE URGED TO KEEP RECORDS

Although the response to CFA's survey could have been better, we did glean some information which will be helpful to everyone. It is intended to repeat this study using the period JANUARY 1, 1974, TO DECEMBER 31, 1974. All breeders in all countries are urged to keep records and participate. Records should be sent to: C.F.A. Central Office, Dept. S, P.O. Box 430, Red Bank, NJ 07701 no later than January 31, 1975.

Information submitted should include name of the breed and number of years experience with the breed, together with complete information on all breedings that took place in the breeder's cattery during the period of the study as follows:

- A. Total number of kittens born; number dying within 24 hours, 6 weeks, 6 months, and

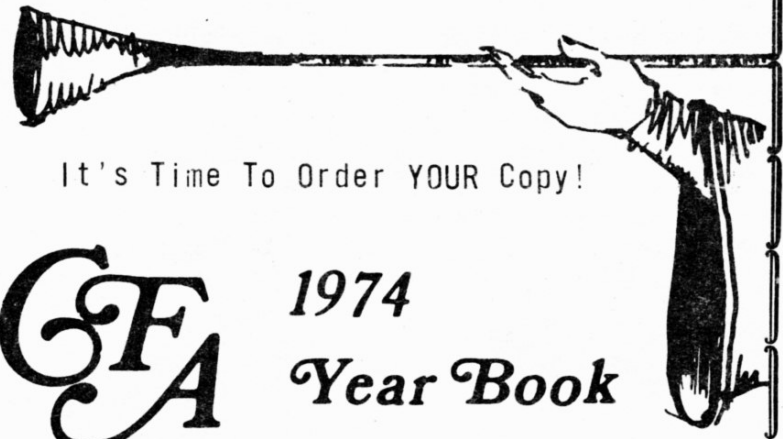
one year respectively, stating, to the best of your knowledge, cause(s) of deaths.

- B. The total number of kittens born alive or dead which were malformed and, of these, how many malformations affected (a) head, (b) mouth, (c) chest, (d) abdomen, (e) legs and paws, (f) other.
- C. How many times it was necessary to have a C. Section and why (listing each instance if more than one female needed this operation).
- D. If various colors and patterns are recognized in the breed concerned, describe your experiences if it is felt that certain colors have had a greater number of kitten deaths.
- E. For each queen, indicate age, whether or not she is a Grand Champion, the number of conceptions, abortions and resorptions she had during the study period, and for each litter born to the queen indicate age of sire and whether or not he is a Grand, the number of stillborn, malformed and live kittens in the litter and the number, if any, delivered by C. Section.

Breeders participating in this second Kitten And Young Cat Mortality Study are not required to identify themselves by name unless they wish to do so.

The results of the Study will subsequently be published in the CFA MERCURY.

# The ARCHANGEL BLUE

by FLORENCE LAUGHER

The Blue Cat is one of nature's oldest mutations. Buffon mentions it as being a variety of shorthaired cat as long ago as two centuries back, and present-day research indicates that it first appeared in China long before that, although the precise date is not known. It is, however, a variety that is able to 'breed true'. That is, to reproduce itself, since when blue is mated to blue, the offspring are blue.

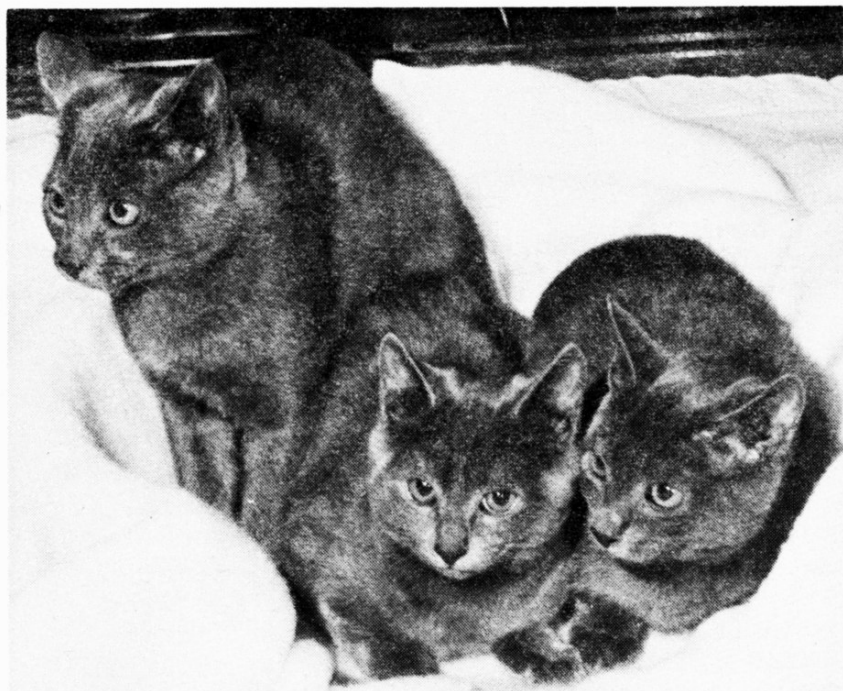
The Blue Cat has appeared in various forms, the most popular, of course, being the Blue Persian. Blue itself is a dilution of black; black, in turn, is a variant of tabby, the basic coat pattern of all cats. Black is simply tabby without the genetical factor for the pattern, the absence of which causes the cat to appear self-coloured. When, however, the dilution gene is present, the absence of the patterning gene is often incomplete, thus giving the 'Blue Tabby' and, as a matter of fact, some of the earliest shorthaired blues in England were Blue Tabbies which came from the north of Norway and were known as 'Canon Girdlestone's Breed'.

Harrison Weir, who wrote one of the earliest books on cats, shows a lovely little drawing of 'Mrs. Herring's Blue Small-banded Tabby', what we would call today a mackerel-striped tabby. These cats had dark blue stripes on a light blue or silver ground, (Jennings 1893), not fawn as they are today.

Around this time, there also appeared some beautiful shorthaired blues, some of which came from Northern Russian, in part-

icular, from Archangel which gave rise to them being known as the 'Archangel Blue'. Their outstanding feature was an extremely beautiful, short, thick, silvery-blue coat resembling sealskin. In type they were very different from the round-faced, cobby British type cats, and they were taken up enthusiastically by one breeder in particular, Mrs. Carew-Cox of Saffron-Walden, Essex, two of whose cats we illustrate, *YULA* and *BAYARD*. To quote the lady herself from "The Book Of The Cat" by Miss Simpson, published in 1903: "*OLGA* came to me in 1893 or 1894 and still lives. She was imported, and has been a great winner in her time, but is getting an old cat now. She is the mother of my stud cat *BAYARD* who was born in 1898 and whose sire was *KING VLADIMIR*. *FASHODA* was born in 1896 and was imported, she is a large, strong cat and a winner of many prizes. *ODESSA* is a daughter of *FASHODA* by *BLUE GOWN*. *YULA* came to me in 1901 and was imported from Archangel!"

ARCHANGEL, RUSSIAN OR BLUE FOREIGN  
So the foundations were laid. At that time, both the British and the Archangel (or Russian) had to compete in the same classes at shows and, as the British type almost always won, gradually the Archangel disappeared from the show scene although several breeders continued to maintain it as a breed.

The breed was originally known as the Archangel or Russian Blue. In those days, breeders were confined mainly to the aristocracy and, due to the unpopularity of the revolution taking place in Russia in the early 1900's, the title 'Russian' was quietly dropped and those few who bred the variety called it the Blue Foreign to indicate it was the imported and not the British type.

Around 1936, an attempt to label it Blue Russian again was made, and one of the stud



books did list it as such, but it fell through and the breed continued to be known as Blue Foreign until after the 1939 war. Because of its name, the breed had always been unpopular through the refusal to allow it to be called officially the Archangel Blue, its correct title of origin.

#### POST-WAR YEARS

In 1939 when war broke out, descendants of the old Blue Foreigns or Archangel cats were to be found at the famous Theydon Bois Cattery owned by Miss Pelly. They were *THEYDON BLUE BOY* and *THEYDON FAIRY PRINCE*. The offspring of *THEYDON BLUE BOY* were lost during the war, but *THEYDON FAIRY PRINCE*, the descendant of *GRISHA* and *PRINCESS OLGA*, owned by Miss Speakman, is the ancestor of Miss Marie Rochford's famous stud, *CH. DUNLOE SILVERTOES*, and thus of a large number of our present-day cats. Miss Rochford's cats became famous all over the world under the prefix 'Dunloe' and it is to her we chiefly owe the preservation of the original characteristics of the breed.

In England, however, after the war, there was an enormous increase in experimental breeding and hybridization. The use of the Siamese cross gave rise to many problems within the breed, particularly the maintenance of the true coat and type: those which reached the show bench often displayed the points of the Foreign Blue or Self-coloured Siamese type. Gradually new breeders became confused, thinking the Foreign Blue to be the old 'Blue Foreign' or Archangel. This is not so. It cannot be overemphasized that the Foreign Blue and the Archangel Blue are totally different.

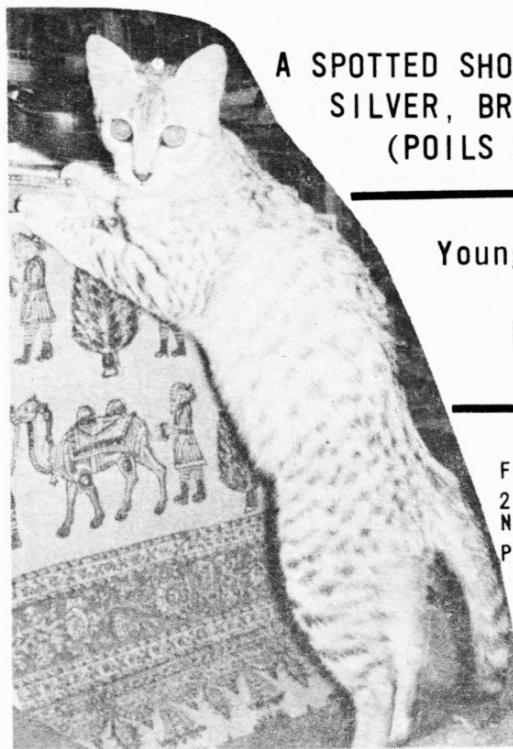
For many years there was a sharp difference of opinion among the breeders showing the two different types, but a small group of the older breeders succeeded in maintaining the chief characteristics, although, as once before, few were shown. One of the breeders who contributed most to the survival of the breed is Miss Mary Shyvers of Kew, Surrey. Her Archon cats were mainly descended from Miss Rochford's *SILVERTOES*, and her stud cat, *ARCHON NICCOLO*, is in the pedigree of some of the best cats of today. Unfortunately, space does not permit mention of all the others individually, but their prefixes now are well-known. To mention just a few: Sylphides, Windywhistle, Meadliam, Harvees, Crumberhill, Michifer - and others.

In 1967, Mrs. Patricia Metcalfe of Lympsham, Somerset, and myself decided to follow the lead adopted in the U.S.A. and we each imported a male from Scandinavia, Mrs. Bjornberg's *KABBARPS BLUE IRIS* and Mr. and Mrs. Heinsen's *BOUNTY BLUE LEFINE*. Together these fine cats are making a distinct improvement in the quality of our English stock. We are trying, by careful selection and judicious matings within the families, to 'maintain and improve' the breed ... motto of every serious breeder.

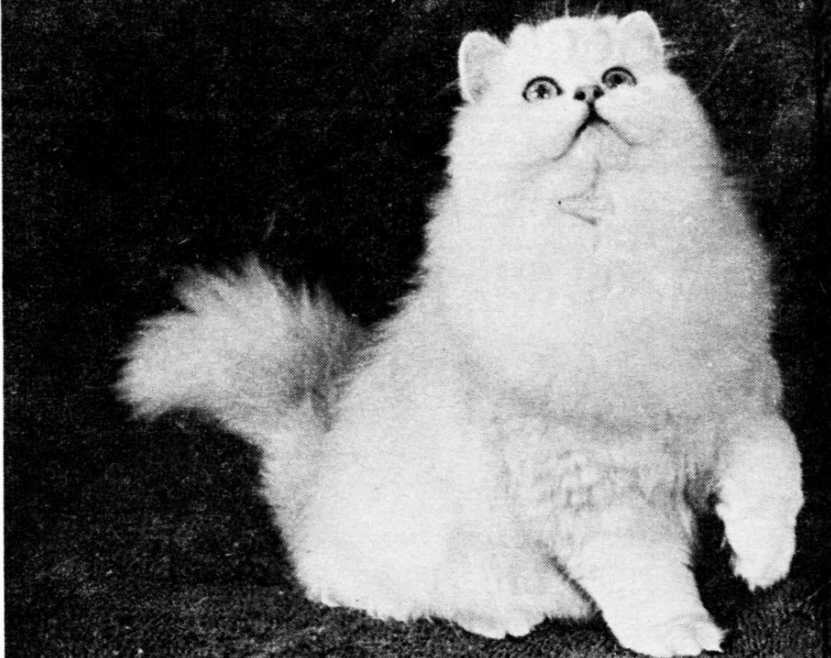

#### BREEDING RECOMMENDATIONS

Breeding the Blue Cat is not easy and there are many pitfalls. Breeders seem to take one of two paths in their breeding programmes: either they go for inbreeding, and close inbreeding at that, or they step right out of the breed and cross with a Siamese, Burmese or even a Rex. Both paths, if followed to the logical conclusion, will inevitably end in a 'No exit' situation. Inbreeding often results in infertility and, sometimes, bad temper. An outcross means the introduction of unwanted, and frequently irremovable, genes of all kinds both in colour and physical reproduction. I personally have found that it is better to stick to a programme of line-breeding together with, as I have said, careful selection.

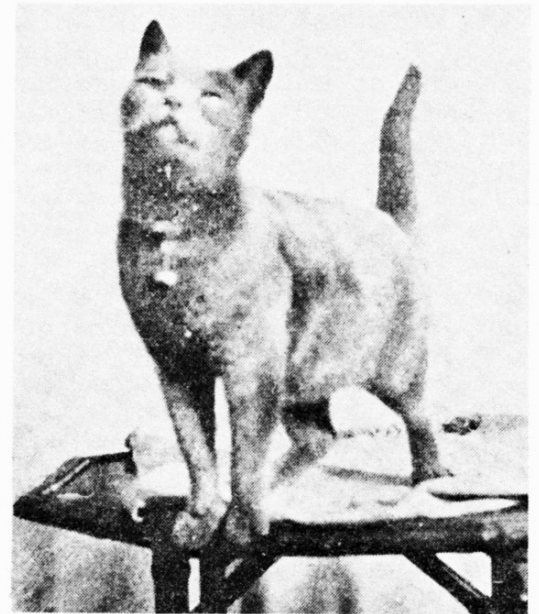
It should be realized that there are two forms of the blue or 'dilution' gene: the correct one for this breed is the dilution of black, from the tabby, which is the basic coat pattern of all breeds since all are descended from the wild cat. When you cross with a Siamese, the dilution of seal, not

black, produces a pinkish or brownish shade of blue which, though attractive, is not really the correct colour. It should be a true lavender blue - not lavender pink

The coat should also have a silvery appearance due to the silver tipping on each hair. Although the paler shades of blue are more popular, the silver tipping is usually seen to better advantage on a coat of medium blue. Above all, it should be very soft, thick and upright, and silky in texture. Eyes should be almond shaped, as green as possible, and ears should be large and upright.

One cannot give a 'recipe' for successful breeding. If that were so, no doubt we should all be successful breeders by now, but it cannot be overemphasized that the key to success is rigid selection.

How to select? Well, that knowledge is what makes the difference between a good and a bad or indifferent breeder and it only

comes with years of experience and a thorough knowledge of one's own stock. However, here are a few of the principles I have personally followed in my own breeding.

Firstly, never use a bad-tempered animal or one that shows signs of undue nervousness. Never use one that you suspect of being unsound, even though it is so beautiful it makes you want to cry: I can assure you that those who buy the kittens will cry even more than you, and for a different reason. Keep the show-stopper for the showbench, where it belongs, and see that it stays there and does not find its way into some unsuspecting newcomer's breeding cattery.

The necessity for testing one's own stock for soundness and fertility means keeping each generation as it is bred, until breeding age, so that one can examine the progeny. This is a lengthy process but the only way in which a check can be kept on hereditary faults and qualities. It is also ex-

pensive which is why a really successful breeder can often end up as poor as the proverbial church mouse if not poorer!

Finally, on the question of white hairs, a vexing problem, certainly, but there is no point in losing sleep over it. The incidence of white hairs is not completely controllable and my own experience of it is that every now and again a failure occurs in the self-colour gene expression thus causing the odd appearance of white hairs. However, cats showing definite patches of white anywhere certainly should not be used. In time, the partial suppression of the self-gene would become full suppression if this were done. We just have to accept that we cannot control nature's own mutations, we just have to do our best to correct them. It is part of the challenge that faces every breeder.

The standards of points for U.S.A., England and Europe are basically the same with each insisting on the importance of the coat, a short, thick, silvery-blue and silvery-tipped coat of a sealskin-like texture. The word 'plush' was used by Miss Simpson to describe the coat of those cats which were shown in the early 1900's, but it is very difficult to understand just what is meant by this term. In fact, none of those people who actually bred this cat ever referred to it as 'plush' and the early photographs resemble a true fur, such as sealskin, much more closely.

#### DIET

I do my best to ensure that my cats have as varied a diet as possible. They eat mainly shredded raw beef, cooked filleted fish, liver, kidneys, heart, pilchards and, once a day, a drink of milk. They have a vitamin supplement, yeast, and plenty of calcium which I regard as very important. With the exception of the stud cat, all my cats live in my home sharing my life. This is the only way in which one can truly learn the thoughts and ways of animals.

In temperament, these cats are ideal for pets being very silent and sweet-natured but, at the same time, very individualistic. Take a good look at the Archangel Blue ... it's worth it!

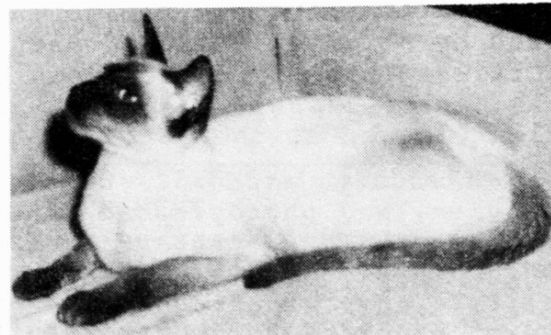

MME. JOSINE GETHMANN REVIEWS  
HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 1973/'74

# European Independant Season



It was a pleasure to be invited to do this feature again for the 1973-'74 show season during which more shows were organized than ever and which was successful in spite of the oil crisis.

For me the season began with a trip to Chartres for the first show held by the Association Feline de France in that city. The September event was well attended not only by local Club members but by fanciers from outside France, with a fair display of the various breeds. Best Cat was *SOLITAIRE AURORA LARA*, Oriental Self Lavender female imported from England by Mme. Janine Cellier-Abry, who has a lovely coat of iridescent Lavender, green oriental eyes, long head with straight profile that could make many Siamese owners jealous, elegant body and good long tail. Her judge commented that *LARA* could fix the standard to strive for for Continental Lavender and Foreign Type breeders and had no hesitation in putting her forward for Best Cat. She won the award over the other Foreigns, the Siamese and Longhairs which included a nice collection of Sacred Birmans in Seal and Blue presented by Mrs. Hardy of the Chartres area. Mme. Bacquet, Paris, had the double honor of winning BIS Sh Male with her *Aby, CH.INT. SESOSTRIS DE NOUVELLE-BUBASTIS*, and BIS LH Male with Blue Persian *INT.CH. ULYSSE DE ST.WITZ*.

The next weekend I was in Rotterdam, Holland, judging at the Dutch Society of Cat Friends' 10th anniversary show. The Longhairs were groomed to perfection, the Whites in particular. My choice for best LH was Mrs. Boer-Olivier's *SNOWWHITE VAN DE KONINGSBURG*, a lovely female with extra long, silky fur, very good head type, deep copper eyes, excellent sturdy body, good short legs. After due comparison with other LH judges' nominations, this cat became Best In Show. Amongst the BIS youngsters were a nice Red Cameo male in the 3-6 months class, *RENZO VAN ATJANNA-ROMI* bred by Mrs. van Gelderen Hof, and a sweet Tortie-&-White bred and owned by Mr. and Mrs. van Ginkel, *INGRID VAN WALCHEREN*. When I first looked at the latter, I thought she had

a long nose but, on closer inspection, I saw it was an optical illusion due to her black patch running over her nose and upper lip.

In the SH classes in Rotterdam it was interesting to note that several BIS wins went to newer breeds. After judging the Burmese, I was suprised to find a 'Black Burmese' on the table which I consequently judged as a Bombay. I conferred with my British colleage, Mrs. Shirley Beaver, about our Best Neuters and this Bombay, *ALICE'S MORI-AAN*, was named BIS male, and her

candidate, lovely Blue-Cream & White European SH, *ZANUSCHKA V.H. RUIGEPLAATBOS*, owned by C. v. Ijzendoorn, BIS Female Neuter. Mrs. Kok owns the Bombay and a study of his pedigree confirmed that he was third generation experimental Burmese from a Black Tortie Burmese backcrossed to Sables.

A few weeks later in Mons, Belgium, we had a chance to compare some of the Best Cats from the Rotterdam show with German exhibits competing at the Hainaut Poussy Club's show. Three cats from Germany won the BIS SH awards: *MERRYLEGS PETIT PRINCE*, Blue Point Siamese male owned by Miss Steyer, *MERRYLEGS VELVET NOSE*, Lilac Point girl owned by Chantal Westermann, and Chartreux female *CALYPSO D'AIN SEFRA*, bred and owned by Mrs. Grete Westermann. BIS Neuter was Count Serge de Borchgrave's *THAIDO DE PAMPONG*, Seal Point. BIS European Neuter was won by the Club's mascot, *BOULU DE DÜREN*, Blue Tabby male owned by Mr. Honore.

A week later in Lyon, France, we attended the first international cat show organized by Association Feline Rhodanienne. Club president, Mr. Touveron, a succesful Blue Persian breeder, put his own cats out of competition to give all the chances to his exhibitors. Best LH was *ULYSSE DE ST.WITZ*, a name often cited in show reports. He is a real good fellow and conforms to the standard 100% according to one of his judges. Mrs. Ducommun, Geneva, owns the BIS LH Female, Blue Pt. Himalayan *GR.CH. INT. SYLVIA DU HOGGAR* maintaining her all-around quality in spite of the presence of younger cats of her breed. Mme. Nodari's Copper-Eyed White, *ZARKA DE VAL REINE*, with his extra long, flowing fur, won Best Neuter.

Mme. Cellier's famous Burmese female, *QUINT.GR.CH.INT. ADLE SURABAYA MY-DIEM*, then 4, went Best Cat In Show. Her owner told me that she is retiring this all-too-successful girl from show in order to give a chance to other younger cats.

One of the first shows to feel the effect of the fuel crisis was Neokat in Eindhoven, Holland, on November 17-18. There was a definite decrease in both exhibitors and visitors and there was a rather special atmosphere there summarized best by the words 'the show must go on'. This meant that only the enthusiasts of our cat fancy were present and,

thanks to some exhibitors from France, Belgium and Germany, the show could still be called an international one.

ULYSSE DE ST. WITZ was Best LH and Best Cat and I also liked a lovely Cream Persian male kitten, SUMMERS ROMEO, recently imported by Mrs. Ros-Deelen. Amongst the Shorthairs I very much liked Blue Point Siamese kitten, I'TCHANG DU MONT DARAIZE, owned by Mr. H. de Vos, Antwerp. KAYMEN GALLAHAD, Seal Point Siamese owned by Dr. and Mrs. Deeming, Germany, was BIS SH Male.

The following weekend found me in Geneva for the 40th anniversary of that city's club which was founded by the Abbe Chamonin, writer of the famous cat book, "Nos Amis Les Chats", under the pen name of Marcel Reney. After his death, the Club's presidency was continued by his sister, Miss Bertha Chamonin. Despite the fact that this is one of the oldest cat clubs in Europe, it was nice to see how up-to-date it really is. There were many really good cats amongst the Shorthairs and my pleasure was almost as great as his owner's when I learned that my BIS SH Male, ANNELIDA PARAIDA, beautiful Blue Cornish Rex belonged to Miss Chamonin who started this wonderful breed in Switzerland. My other BIS SH was a Ruddy Aby female, VITA DE BREIZ, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charlie Stoutz, a very pleasing exhibit. It was interesting to note how popular the Abyssinian is in Switzerland. My Best Female Kitten was SOLITAIRE AURORA LARA while a lovely Lilac Point Siamese, ILYS DE SURABAYA, owned by Mr. Jaccoud, was BOX. In the LH classes, it was again GR.CH.INT. ULYSSE DE ST. WITZ who became BIS with a lovely Blue Pt. Himalayan, ULLA DU HOGGAR, owned by Mr. Eric Gairin, becoming his BOX. ZARKA DE VAL-REINE repeated his success of Lyon and a promising Seal Point Sacred Birman, XAVIER DU SAPIN BLEU, bred and owned by Mrs. Wampfler, was Best LH Male Kitten.

Two weeks later, as Europe still coped with the oil crisis, I took the comfortable TEE train on a 5-hour journey to Frankfurt to show my two Red Abyssinians at the Deutscher Katzen Club's show.

Amongst the Shorthairs I admired a Blue Point Siamese male owned by Mr. Gringet, MERRYLEGS PERCY and it was interesting to see going BIS the lovely Lavender SH SOLITAIRE AURORA LARA and a striking Lavender LH bred by Mrs. Prose, LILAC WONDER VAN HOOG-MOERSBERGEN.

It was nice to have a break from shows during the Christmas season but the second weekend of January I went to the 'Ville Lumiere' (Paris) to judge Shorthairs. Again it was the same international set of old faithfuls, plus the local people, braving the energy crisis to come to the rendezvous. This was LARA's first show as an adult and she was BIS SH!

I was pleased to award Best European to a Red Tabby novice male, SACHA, whose owner, Mr. Philipson was so happy that he promised to show again at Besancon.

Something unusual occurred at the Longhair tables: a Red Point Himalayan, UNEXPECTED VICTORY VAN HET BENTHUYNS, made history for his breed by winning BIS LH and Best of Best LH. Bred by Baroness van Heerdt and owned by Mrs. Prose, he was in excellent condition. It was certainly his owner's day as both her kittens, XANTINE VAN HOOG-MOERSBERGEN, Tortie Pt., and WANJA VAN HOOG-MOERSBERGEN, Seal Pt., were BIS winners in the 3-6 months class.

Then came the Hague, mammoth show organized by one of the Low Countries' most gifted managers, Mr. Lauwers, of the Dutch Cat Breeders Society. It was held in the Congress Building which easily accommodated the 1,000 exhibits and 25,000 visitors. Best of the BIS winners were lovely Chinchilla female, GLAMOUR VAN DE EIKEN, bred and owned by Mrs. Roer-

Perhaps one of the most pleasant rewards of the fancy, besides the cats, is the welcome breeders receive via correspondence and travel throughout the world. For there is a bond among cat people that stretches around the world; and, as a part of that bond comes a sharing of knowledge and experience.

Although we've never met, Grace Burgess and I became friends years ago. We shared Burmese experiences while she was writing her book on the breed. It turned out to be a charming book, one that is filled with information on the history of Burmese throughout the world. Several weeks ago, Grace sent me a picture and a story that we would like to share with CAT WORLD readers this issue and I will resume the series, "A Burmese History", next time.

For many years it has been thought that the first brown cat to leave the East was *WONG MAU*. But now we learn that another brown cat went to New Zealand in 1891. Miss Burgess says that when she attended a recent cat show, a lady named Mrs. Culshaw looked her up and presented her with a picture of a cat called *DHU*. Mrs. Culshaw said that her great uncle, Captain Wade, had brought Mrs. Culshaw's mother a large brown cat in 1891. Captain Wade owned a ship that traded around the East and he used to bring back unusual gifts to his niece and daughters. He had brought back from Burma two cats, one of which went to his niece (Mrs. Culshaw's mother) and the other remained in his own family.

Mrs. Culshaw said "the people in the Hutt Valley (where her mother lived) had never seen a brown cat before, and many of them wouldn't believe it was a cat---they said it must be some sort of monkey." The cat, which they named *DHU*, was described as "a great lump of a cat". *DHU* apparently was a treasured member of the household for not many cats were photographed in 1891.

# BURMESE: Around The World Then & Now

Another picture to be shared is an early one of *WONG MAU* which was given me by Frank and Barb Smith of California. This photograph gives us another and less familiar pose of the mother of Burmese in America together with an early brood.

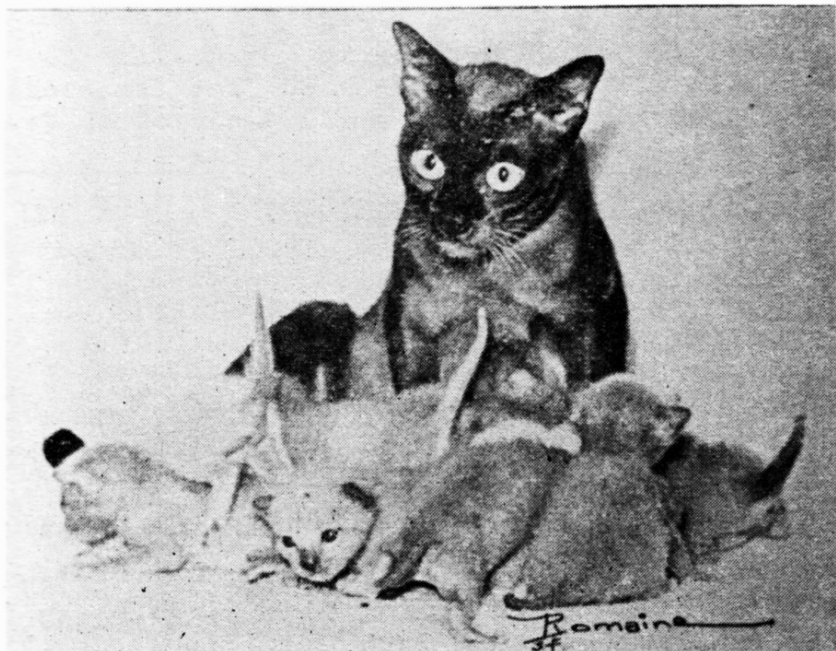
The third picture is that of a modern Burmese, the Copper Cat of Thailand. Mme. Ruen A. Rajamaitri of Bangkok graciously allowed two lovely females to come to America. The picture is of *THONG DAENG*, owned by Anne Bickman. The cat is appropriately named for, as Daphne Negus explains in her "Journey To Thailand": "Supalak cats, or Thong (gold) Daeng (red) actually means Copper colored cats. Supa means good, beautiful, progressive; lak or laksana means characteristic. Hence, Supalak cat means a cat of beautiful characteristics.

"The characteristics of the Thong Daeng cat surpass the characteristics of all others in existence. Their coat color glitters like copper bright. Their eyes shine like the glittering sun on high; all harmful things will be driven away and all evils be converted to benevolence."

The benevolent Burmese---what a grand phrase to describe our brown cats of the world! It fits that "great lump" of a brown cat named *DHU* that went by sailing ship to New Zealand in 1891. It fits the lovely brown girl that sailed to America with Joseph Thompson. It describes their modern, living counterpart, *THONG DAENG*, that came by airship to us from Bangkok.###

horst, and Blue Point Siamese female, *ISIS DE FONTENAILLE*, bred and owned by Countess Trayer de Dhuizy, France.

Next show on my list was March 16-17 at Liege, Belgium, presented by the Association Feline Belge. Mr. and Mrs. Delbushaye did everything to make exhibitors feel at home: one nice feature was that every cat chosen Best of Variety received a special ribbon so imprinted. These ribbons came from the U.S. and I hear that many other Independent Cat Clubs are following this idea.

Best LH was *CH. VAHINE DE LA BIEVRE*, Blue female bred and owned by Mrs. Bourny, with *TR.GR.CH.INT. QUICK DE CORAIMONT*, Cream owned by Mrs. Visele as *BOX*. This lovely boy has a charming way of helping himself to his BIS (I hear this was his ninth) which I must tell you about. When he is placed before the judge by the steward, he looks up at him or her, walks straight up, and gives a kiss on the nose! He is simply irresistible but, beyond his good nature, he has great qualities such as pale cream coat, round face, sturdy body with low legs, and waves a well furnished brush to welcome his admirers.

Best SH was *SOLITAIRE VAHINE*, lovely female Havana imported from England by Mr. J. Luyten. Opposite sex was *CH.INT. VI-KING DU MONT DARAIZE*, Blue Pt. Siamese bred and owned by Mrs. Mouzon.

On April 20-21 I decided to keep my promise to attend the show in Besancon, France, as it was not the fault of the AFF that the Club Felin de Belgique Bruxelles had decided to wait until the oil crisis was over to choose another date. Besides, it was the 30th show of the AFF and I was lucky enough to be able to travel by car with friends. The 800 km trip took us through beautiful countryside and we arrived to find 200 cats pre-

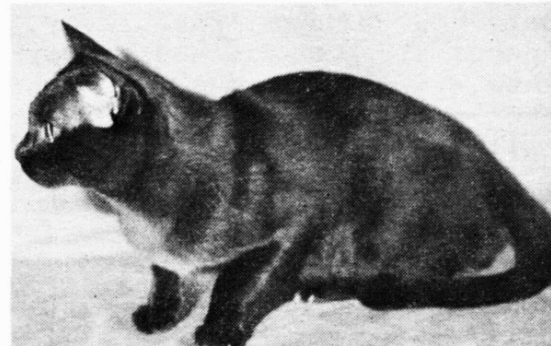

in some area of the catalog cover design, or (2) 'adding' same to the cover design, to make the front sheet of the flyer, complete with the attractive artwork that will eventually hallmark the show itself.

Covers are printed on card stock. Posters can be printed on 20-pound paper (this tapes to store windows just fine), and flyer 'front sheets' are the posters. Run your specifications as overlays on front, and on the reverse side of the poster, and you have a flyer that 'keys' to everything else! The same printer can be used for the entire job at a cost savings, compared to doing the same thing piecemeal.

It makes more sense to the spectator who buys a catalog that has a cover resembling the poster that attracted the family to the show in the first place; it 'relates' more to the exhibitor who enters the show with the 'cat and Abe Lincoln' on the front of its flyer and then has essentially the same design on the catalog. Think about it!

### FLYER CONTENT

No matter what your preference in flyers, always give the master copy a verrrrrry careful check for two things:

(1) Count all negative words and negative expressions! Better to say "*Cats must be removed from the hall overnight*" than "*No cat may remain in the hall overnight*". Better to begin a sentence with "*Exhibitors must ....*" than "*No exhibitor may ....*" If you find more than six or seven 'negative' words in the flyer, REWRITE THE FLYER: tell your exhibitors what they MAY do instead of what they CAN'T do (like attend the show and save all this misery!), and you'll find better reception, especially from the 50% mentioned above.

(2) Check the flyer for misspelled words such as 'entritis', 'trophys', 'elligible', 'registred', 'pneumontis', etc., etc. that may make your show sound (and read) like a 'flea market' instead of the wonderful exhibition that you are carefully planning!

The better your flyer, the better your initial reception to the event. The more care you put into your flyer, the better the 'pace' of your subsequent work toward the show. You never get a 'second chance' to

We retired KINUBA from the show ring in 1968.

His dam was CHESTERMERE TOSHIKA and, prior to KINUBA's debut, it was her granddam, ACFA TRIPLE GR.CH. BRIARRY FEMME FATALE OF CHESTERMERE, a Blue Point bred by the late Brian Stirling-Webb, England, who received many show honors. She was All American Himalayan in 1960/'61 and All American Honorable Mention Blue Point Female in 1961/'62.

Through his show accomplishments, KINUBA succeeded in drawing much-needed attention to the Himalayan breed. Exhibitors, breeders, judges, and even spectators, began to take notice of these beautiful cats who had been somewhat overlooked until his time. Ten or eleven years ago, the Himalayan classes were judged rapidly; today there are some judges who are so thorough that they even check bites! It should be noted that many of the Flame, Tortie and Blue Cream-pointed Himalayans which carry type have KINUBA somewhere in their backgrounds.

KINUBA was a cat who enjoyed excellent health; therefore, it was quite a shock to us when he developed a nephritic condition soon after his sixth birthday. Although this resulted in a loss of weight and his diet had to be cut to a low-protein level, the ailment did not affect his sunny disposition, playfulness, love of life and female companionship during his last year on earth. He went to Himalayan-Heaven on March 7, 1969 ..... we alone know how much we appreciated and enjoyed having and showing KINUBA, how much we still miss him, and how proud we will always be of this great, great Himalayan.

Through the years, Himalayan breeders have referred to KINUBA as 'King of the Himalayans' due to the fact that his impression was left, like a rubber stamp, on his offspring, great-offspring and great-great-offspring. 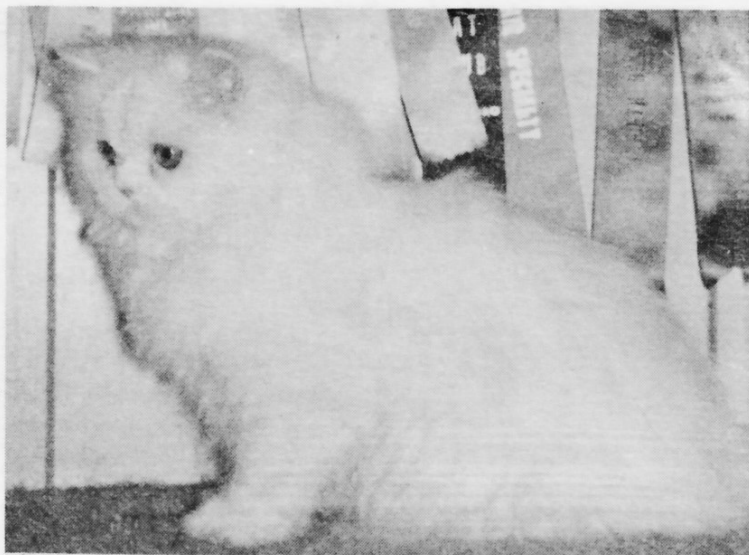

Of the 375 cats competing in the show, no less than 34 were Birmanians ... 28 adults, 5 kittens, 1 neuter. The Club believes that this is the largest representation of the breed ever to be seen in one show anywhere in the world.

A 'first' for the Turkish Angora breed was recorded in June when Elaine Gesel's White female, *CH. TAI-PHOON KAYA-ALA OF NO RUZ*, bred by Gisela Stoscheck, was named Best Cat by CFA judge, Mrs. Dorothy Baker, in her All Breed ring at the Rochester show. This marked the first time that a Turkish Angora has been awarded the top win in any show.

A new CFA-affiliated club has been formed for those interested in colored Turkish Angora cats. Details from Joan Kapetanakis, 1 Edwards St., Roslyn, N.Y. 11577.

The American Manx Club now has available the results of their breed survey conducted in 1972. Copies are available (40¢ each) from Club president Bland Jensen, Box 132, Elmont, N.Y. 11003.

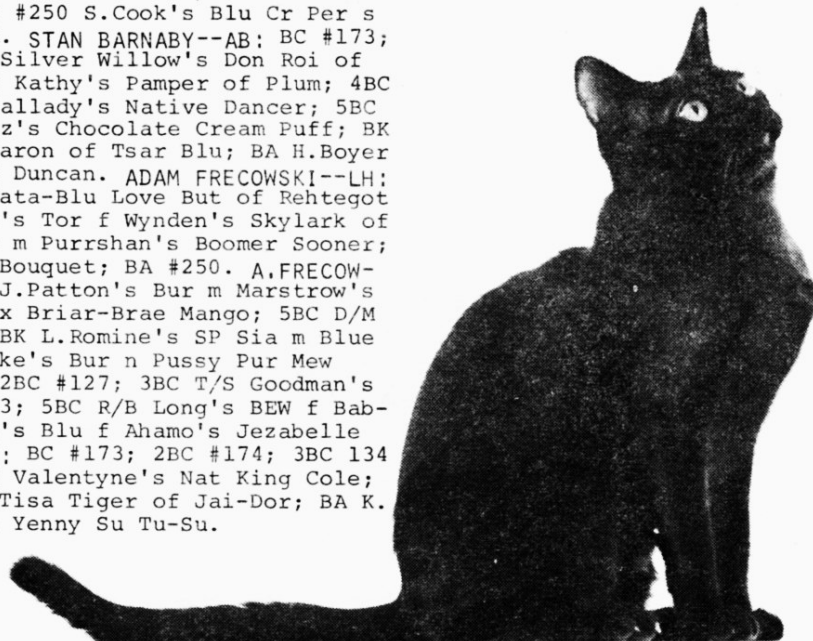
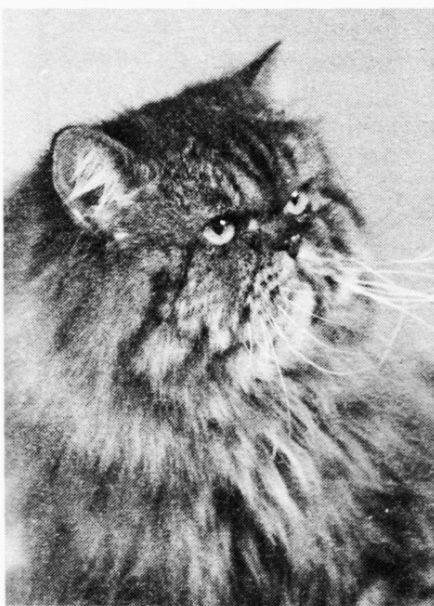

*KINUBA* succeeded in accumulating final wins and the necessary points to be acclaimed not only "Grand Champion" but "CFA's First Himalayan Grand Champion" following the Atlanta show!

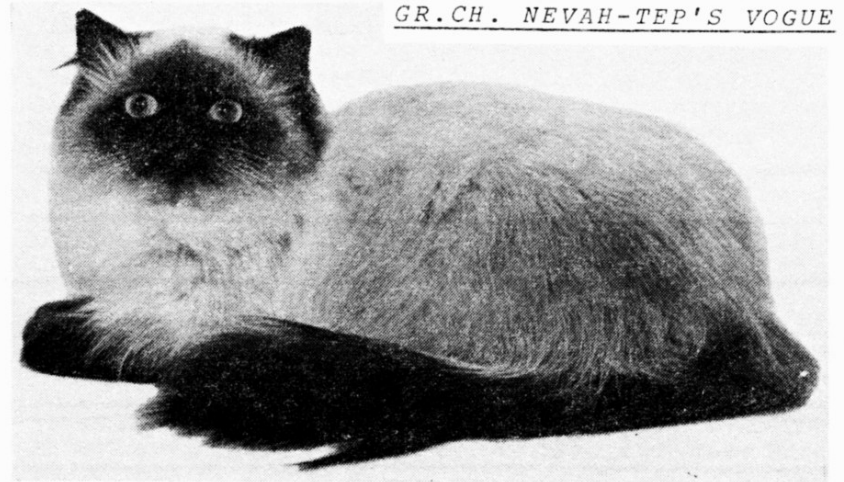

2. Another daughter, *CH. CHESTERMERE DUBLIN'*, Blue Point, went All American Best Himalayan Opposite Sex to *KINUBA* in both 1966 and 1967. Owned by the Borretts, she has produced several Grand Champions including CFA Judge Will Thompson's Blue Point female, *CFA GR.CH. CHESTERMERE CHAHILA*, who was CFA's Best Opposite Sex Himalayan to *KINUBA* 1966/67, CFA #2 Longhair Female as well as Best Himalayan in 1968/69, and in the 1969/70 show season she became #3 Longhair Female as well as Best Himalayan again. In turn, *CHAHILA*'s Blue Point daughter, *CFA GR.CH. QUICKSILVER'S CASCADE*, also owned by Will Thompson, California, did extremely well at show and was CFA's Best Himalayan in 1970/71.

3. A third daughter, *CFA CH. NEVAH-TEP'S BO-KI*, Seal Point, was the dam of *CFA GR.CH. TAILSPIN ASTRO*, Seal Point male who was CFA's Best Opposite Sex Himalayan in the 1969/70 show season, owned by Rev. Al and Clare Lunde of Pennsylvania. *ASTRO* produced several Grands including the fabulous Seal Point female, *CFA GR.CH. COSCIA'S CUPCAKE OF CONFECTION*, bred by Mrs. E. Coscia and owned by Diana Lagerwall, New Jersey (unfortunately, *CUPCAKE* passed on at a much too early age), and Seal Point male *CFA GR.CH. LORD BYRON* who was CFA's 9th Best Cat in 1972/73 as well as Best Himalayan. He is owned by Albert and Dorothy Sand, New Jersey.

Some of *KINUBA*'s sons include the now deceased *CFA CH. LU-MAR-PO'S BALTASSAR* shown by Peggy Polito, Florida: he was one of the first Lilac Point Himalayans to both carry and produce type; *CFA GR.CH. & ACFA RM QD. CH. CHEMU CHEBEE*, Blue Point owned by Betty Musgrave, Illinois; *ACFA GR.CH. & CFA CH. NEVAH-TEP'S POLO*, Seal Point, owned by Bob &

Ellen Smith, California, in the mid-'60's; and *ACFA QD.CH. & NCFA SR.CH. CLAUDINE'S COCHISE OF YEHTI*, Seal Point, bred by the late Irene Gifford, Illinois. *COCHISE*, now passed away, in turn, sired the lovely female Seal Point Himalayan pictured in color on the current Pet Pride stamps, *CFA GR.CH. NEVAH-TEP'S VOGUE*, whose show career has been exclusively CFA. Born March 16, 1970, she was CFA Highest Scoring Himalayan in the 1971/72 show year and Best Cat in the International Himalayan Society as well as in The Himalayan Society the same season. She made only one appearance last season and went Best Cat in Show, All Breed.



*GR.CH. NEVAH-TEP'S VOGUE*

One of *KINUBA*'s grandsons, *CFA GR.CH. LU-MA-CA JAHNI SINGH*, a Blue Point shown by Emolyn Maddox and Lucy McClesky, Georgia, skyrocketed at the shows at a young age but, sadly, died shortly after completing his Grand Championship in early 1969.

Another grandson, *CFA GR.CH. GEM'S OSKI-WA-WA*, Blue Point owned by Ken and Ann Griffin, Islington, Ontario, Canada, was 1973/'74 Best Cat and Best Kitten of the International Himalayan Society, as well as CFA Best Himalayan.

*CHESTERMERE CHOLITA OF NEVAH-TEP*, born June 14, 1960, Seal Point half-sister to *KINUBA*, by their sire, *CHESTERMERE PAUL*, is still with us, frisky as a kitten at the young age of 14. She is an ACFA and NCFA Grand Champion, CFA and CFF Champion. Her CFA debut was made at the age of 5 and she won her title at her first show. Later, at the age of 13, we showed her as a spay; she earned her Premiership title in two shows going into the finals each time.

Bred to *KINUBA*, *CHOLITA* produced *CFA & ACFA CH. NEVAH-TEP'S CHOKIN*, Seal Point male who, in turn, sired our lovely Seal Point female *NEVAH-TEP'S MEMOIR*, 2nd Best Kitten and Best Longhair Kitten in CFA in 1969. *CHOKIN* also produced *CFA GR.CH. & ACFA R.M. QD. CH. CHEMU MUCHO*, Blue Point male owned by Betty Musgrave, and *CFA GR.CH. LEE-CEE'S POOCHIE*, Blue Point male bred by Lee Coburn, Michigan, owned by Jane Swindell, Virginia.

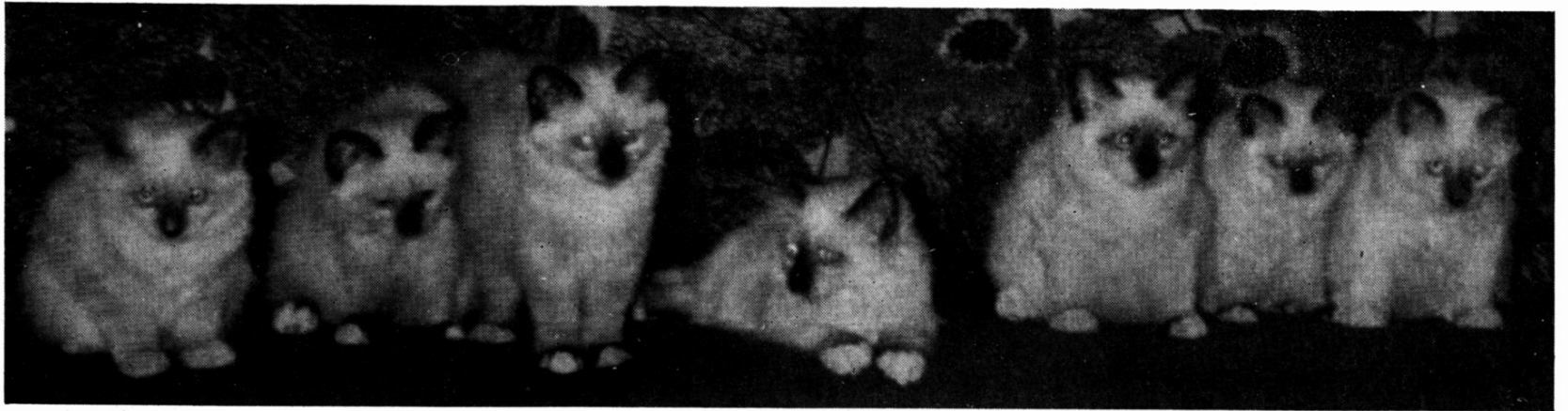
