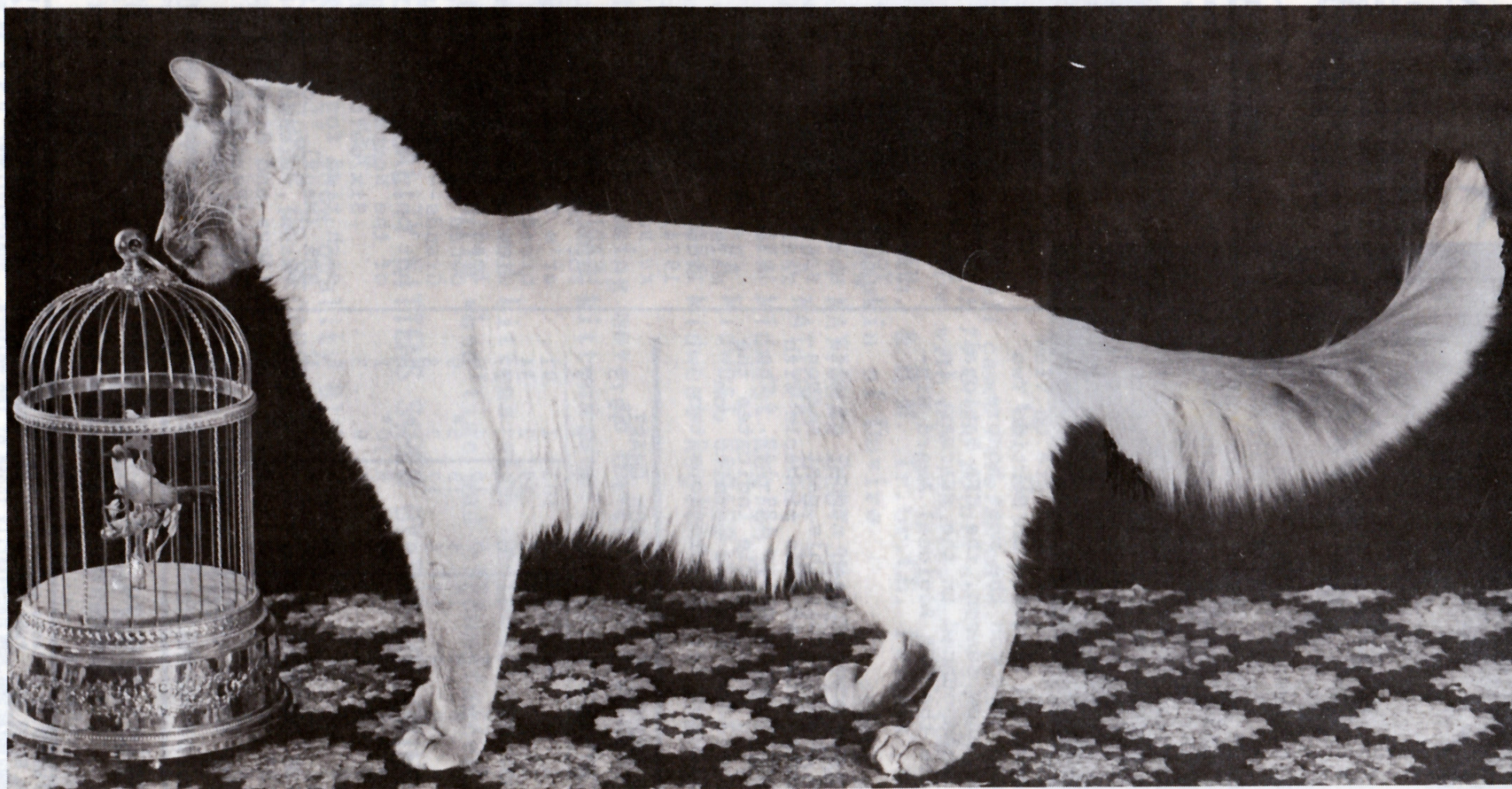

Introducing this season's *GREAT CATS OF NORTH AMERICA* is *GR.CH. CARAN'S SAIDI OF TATHA-GATA*, Korat female bred by Mrs. Carl Carlson and owned by Mrs. Esther Epstein, Brockton, MA.

SAIDI won her CFA title during the 1974-1975 show season and is Best National Korat.

This year's *GCNA* commemorative edition of *CAT WORLD* is being presented in two sections. In this section, a complete list of the new CFA Grand Champions is given and many of these extremely beautiful cats are on view in "Grand Gallery". Included in Section Two are the cats who have won the most honors during the past show season, the CFA National Award Winners. Announced in the *MERCURY*, in Section Two, are the CFA Regional Award Winners.

GRAND CHAMPION STAKES

CFA reported a new record high number of cats to win a Grand Championship this past season. 336 superior cats attained this pinnacle with female cats outnumbering males 189-147. The chart accompanying this article indicates the breakdown by breed and sex and permits comparison with figures for the previous two seasons.

total of three Birman Grand Champions the Exotic SH breeders again came up with five new titlists the Manx fanciers came up with over twice as many as they did in 1974 and seven of the Grands were White Black Smokes led the Rex parade Siamese cats had a great season which saw 60 of them granding: 30 Seals, 13 Blues, 12 Lilacs and 5 Chocolates Persians, too, showed a big Grand increase for the season: 87 Solids, 17 Shaded, 5 Smokes, 11 Tabbies, 27 Parti-Colors.

JUNIORS AND SENIORS

Youngest Grand Champion is *PUSHKIN'S SCARLET RIBBONS*, Red Persian female born June 24, 1974. Hot contenders were a pair of Siamese, *THAI-BOK SUGAR BLUES*, Blue Pt. female, and *THAI-BOK TERIYAKI*, Seal Pt. male, both born June 7, 1974.

Senior titlist is Black Smoke Persian male, *NEW MOON OF MORNINGSTAR*, born May 25, 1966. Oldest Shorthair to become a Grand in 1974/'75 is Sable Burmese male, *NA ALI'I HAI-KU BOY*, born March 19, 1968.

LEADING CATTERIES

For the second successive year, Evelyn Prather's PRIM-PET Cattery was responsible for breeding the highest number of new Grands with a total of seven; last year hers was the leading cattery with five. *KALAMAR* Cattery, owned by Cal and Marge Lee, bred five new Grands---four Persians and an Exotic who was not only a NATIONAL winner but also Top Cat of the North West Region.

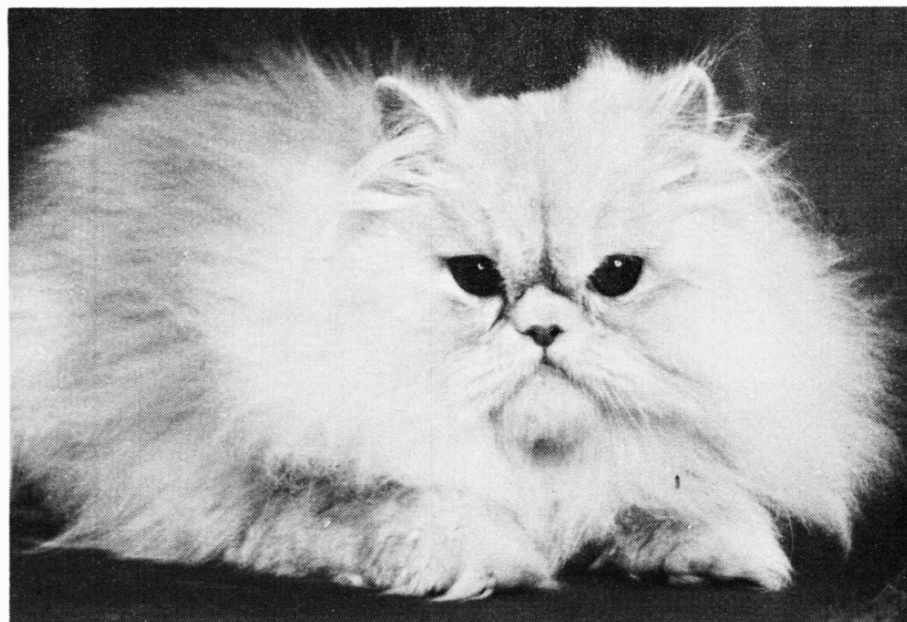
Six catteries with four Grand Champions each tied for third place: Judith Shaw's *KEL-SHA* (Manx), Loretta Willwerth Baugh's *KITTRIK* (Manx), Richard and Becky Jones' *QUIN-JO* (Abyss and Siamese), Mrs. S. Weston's *SIMBELAIR* (Persians), Merle and Betty Crotzer's *SIN-CHIANG* (Siamese), and William and Rose-Mary Hermann's *WIL-O-ROSE* (Persians).

Seven of the new Grand Champions are owned by Merle and Betty Crotzer, including the lone Siamese to rank among CFA's TOP 20 cats.

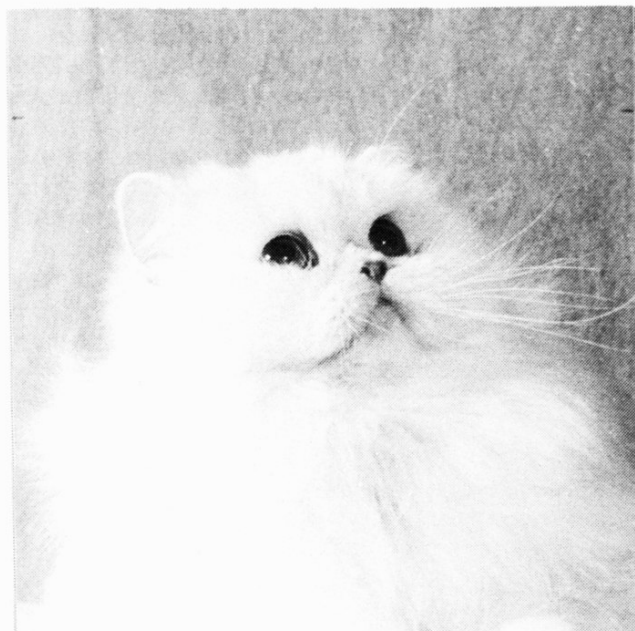

AFTER 'THE BLOW'

There is a new dating system in Darwin, a remote city in the Northern Territory of Australia. Things happened either before THE BLOW or after THE BLOW. "The Blow" referred to is CYCLONE TRACY which struck the city on Christmas Day, 1974, devastating most of the suburbs and rendering the city centre a ruin.

Darwin is a government town with a great deal of the work force employed by the Government. It is a defence area and supports a large contingent of Royal Australian Air Force personnel, as well as Navy and Army, and has an international airport.

The population at the time of the cyclone was 48,000; now it is approximately 31,000. Official damage estimates are as high as 600-million Australian dollars and it will take five years to rebuild.

True to the pioneering spirit of the people of the Northern Territory, the populace is now able to look back on that long night with a grin and a smile and a funny anecdote to relate.

CATS AND THE CYCLONE

Much has been written and filmed about that night and the ensuing days with the mass evacuation of nearly everyone in the area, but for members of The Cat Association of the Northern Territory there was the added concern of their pets. With the danger of disease rife, the authorities took to destroying animals, especially dogs. One or two members' cats were shot by police but the majority of others used their ingenuity to escape or defy the danger.

One member packed a small VW with husband, 8 cats and a few saved possessions and drove 2,000 miles to Adelaide. Another took two Great Danes plus three cats with the family when the house was in ruins and camped in a warehouse. A member whose husband was called to duty and who was to be evacuated with two children, left ten cats in the shell of the house with food and water and ignored the authorities' request for animals to be destroyed. Luckily her husband got to them two days later and took them to a cattery about 20 miles away. One woman evacuated her four children by plane but loaded a van up with herself, cats, dogs and fish and drove over 2,000 miles by herself. Some members whose cats were being minded while they were away on holidays came home to find their animals had disappeared but, happily, a surprising number of these turned up as much as 4 months later. One hears of very few dogs or cats actually killed during, or as a result of, the cyclone.

THE CAT FANCY IN DARWIN

The Cat Association of the Northern Territory (CANT) is the sole cat authority in the area and has a policy of recognition of all other cat bodies in Australia. It has a close association with the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy, Australia & Victoria, and it was the latter who offered help and assistance in the formative years and examined the two Darwin trained Judges (this writer and Mrs. H. Lowe). Since the GCCFAV instigated the formation of the Australia National Cat Federation, we have been founder members. GCCFAV discontinued their association with ANCF but CANT continued and is at present affiliated with ANCF which is not a governing body in itself but is an association of governing bodies. ANCF will hold its 3rd National Cat Show in Melbourne on July 6, 1975.

Before "The Blow", CANT, which is the only cat club in the Northern Territory, had been in operation for about eight years and has held six championship shows annually at each of which some 120 cats were benched. Exhibitors do not have to be members of CANT but they get cheaper rates for showing if they are members. All pedigreed cats must be registered with CANT to be eligible to compete in our shows. Membership before Tracy was approximately 150 to 200 but it is not known what the present membership is likely

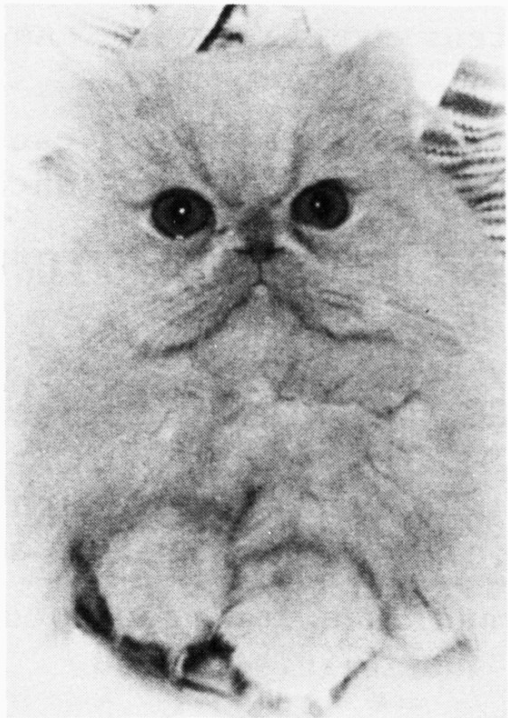

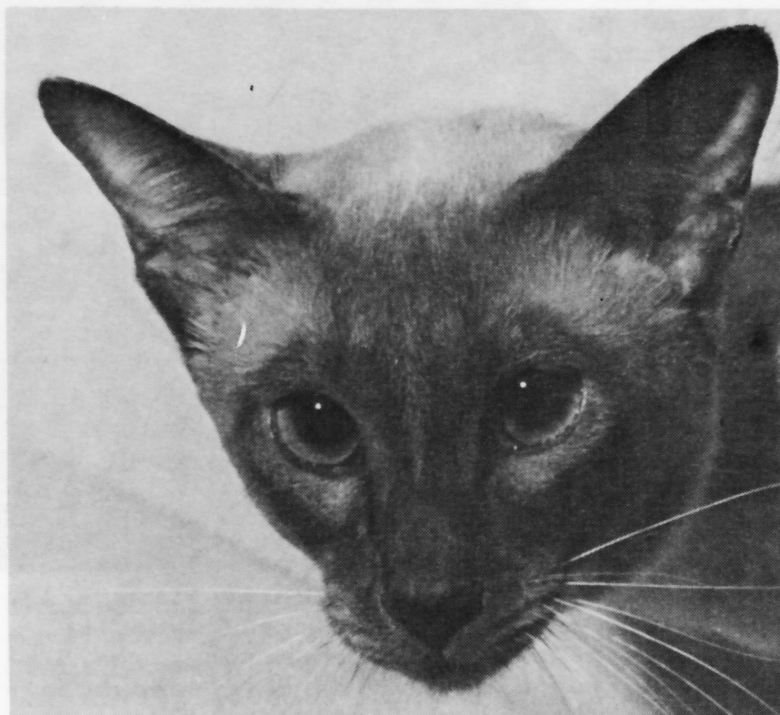

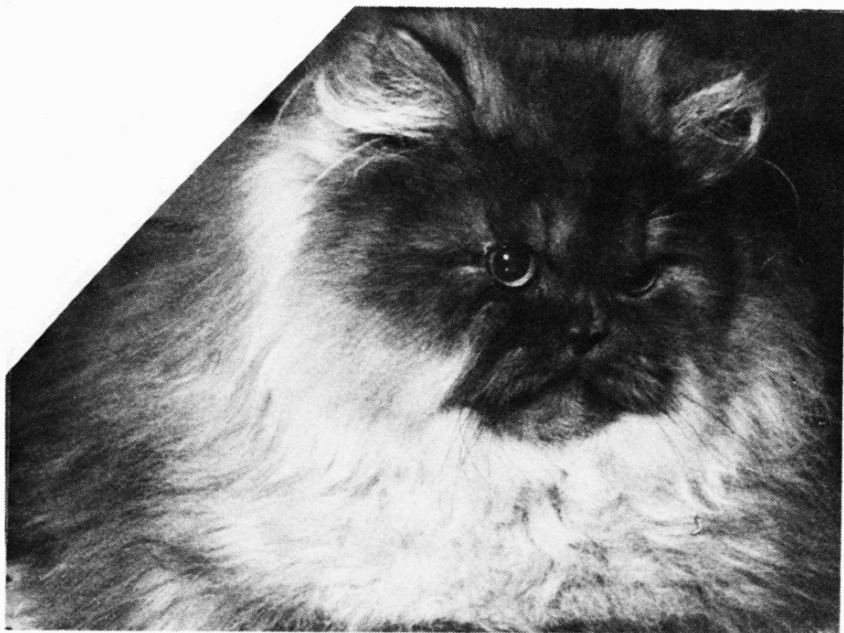

The Smoke Long Hair today is a variety of Persian which arouses great interest at every show, particularly when it is shown at the correct time for the beauty of its coat contrast to be apparent. The number of Smoke exhibits grows steadily, as do the number of breeders now devoted to its evolvement. At the 1973 National Cat Show in London, England, there were thirty-three Smokes competing in four classes, which, I think, breaks all previous records, and the standard was higher than ever before. At present in Great Britain, the type of Smoke compares favourably with the best Blue or Black, and they are consistent winners of Best-In-Show awards, but this has not always been so.

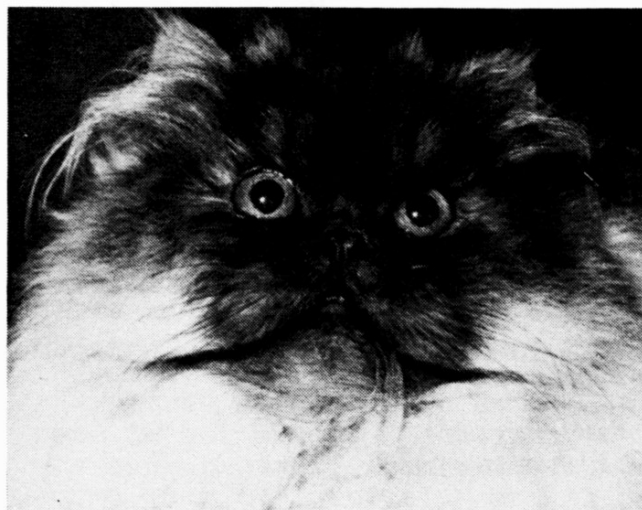
The Smoke appeared in British shows in the late 1800's and appears to have originated from a mutation of Blue or Black to Silver Tabby. Smokes were being shown some fifteen years before the appearance of the first Chinchilla, and were extremely popular. Their popularity remained until the 1920's and then for one reason or another the fashion changed to place the spotlight of fame on other varieties and they declined. Some of the most famous Smoke cats of the early years were CH. BACKWELL JOGRAM, CH. SUFFOLK DUMPLING, and an American cat, WATERSHIP CAESAR (imported from England), and much is made of these cats in early literature; however, by today's standards they look very poor in type, although excelling in coat and contrast. During the 1930s and 1940s, Smokes almost vanished and, whenever one reads cat literature of the early 1950s and looks up "Smoke Long Hair", a dismal story unfolds of the poor quality and

numbers of Smokes being bred and shown, all having failings which place them far below the minimal requirements of the official Standard. However, as I will explain, this depressing state was halted, and, gradually, with dedicated breeders, the numbers increased and the type improved and we can now state that Smokes compete on equal terms with the other varieties within the Persian breed.

Readers will know that the Smoke is one of the Silver group, and one of the most genetically complex. Its origin, as stated is a matter of some controversy. Until the present decade, all published scientific literature on cats lists the Smoke as the non-agouti Chinchilla without modifying genes that produce the Chinchilla breed genotype. This is open to argument and recent thinking and evidence confirms that Smokes are not recessive to full colour. We also know that Smokes have appeared from accidental or planned cross breeding of Silver to a solid colour, mostly Black, Blue or White; consequently it is difficult to own a purebred Smoke, if that means Smoke bred to Smoke for generation after generation because, like so many other breeds, they have evolved as a result of spontaneous mutation. I have proved also that if one breeds Smoke to Smoke, tabby markings become apparent after two or three generations, and there is a loss of type and eye colour. It is my belief that, before all

else, the Smoke Long Hair should approximate the Persian type and not regress to the long nosed, sharp featured cats of many years ago. The important thing to stress is that the immediate "Smoke type" evolved from accidental or planned mating where there is no accepted Smoke in the immediate pedigree should be registered as AOV until its ability to reproduce accepted Smoke standards has been proved over, say, three generations. I am sorry to say that in Britain the GCCF does allow owners to register their cats as Smokes from this type of mating, and this I cannot agree with. We sometimes have seen cats on the showbench bred from two solid coloured cats with no silver in their background registered as Smoke and entered in Smoke classes, when it is apparent that these cats are only shady Blacks or Blues.

ESTABLISHED LINES

In Britain there are now several established Smoke lines. The Of Spen/Beauvale line, which goes back at least to the pre-1920s, through such famous cats as CH. BIRCOTTE NONO, CH. TREETOP'S ZEPHYR, CH. BEAUVALE CONQUEST to BUNTY OF SPEN, is the line from which my own Hardendale Smokes have descended. The Kala Smokes trace their ancestry back via CH. SUFFOLK DUMPLING to the same era. The third group is composed of breeders who have deliberately bred from Chinchilla to Black, then the progeny of this mating possessing the most Smoke characteristics was mated to Blue

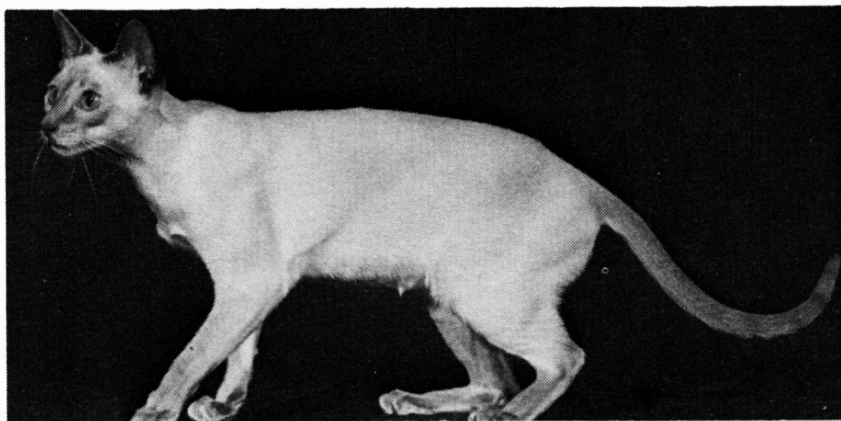
and this progeny mated back to father, brother, sister, etc., until a cat approximating the Smoke breed standard was produced. This method of breeding Smokes was, I believe, sponsored by the British Chinchilla, Silver Tabby and Smoke Cat Society in conjunction with the GCCF immediately after the war in an effort to prevent the breed dying out completely. I have not been able to trace the descendents of this programme in today's Smokes, but, at the time, no one seemed to think that the Smoke had much of a future, and money was allocated for this experimental breeding. I understand that the late Mr. B. Stirling Webb of Colourpoint fame was concerned with this programme, with a few other breeders most of whom are no longer alive. In the 1960s, a number of breeders, including Mrs. K. Emslie and Mrs. F. Roden, employed this formula to breed the Smoke lines now recognized as the Almondhill and Sonata lines. Fishermore, Bianca and Dunrobin lines have also come from this type of breeding.

The Hardendale Smokes have evolved from the Levings' Beauvale line, and here I must pay tribute to the late Mrs. K. Leving and her husband who did so much in the late 1950s and early 1960s to improve and rebuild the Smoke image with their constant devotion to a rather unpopular breed at that time. My original Smoke was BEAUVALE CONCHITA, who possessed the most wonderful coat in quality and contrast but was lacking in type and good eye

colour. I mated her to a well-known Blue, CH. ORION OF PENSFORD, and produced some very lovely cats amongst which was my gorgeous CH. HARDENDALE NICHOLAS. He is the only Smoke in Great Britain shown as cat and kitten who, after 31 shows remains unbeaten by any other Smoke; he has 22 Challenge Certificates. I have also had success through breeding Smoke to Black, in this case CH. DEEBANK MARQUIS, and in my cats' pedigrees only Smoke, Black and Blue are to be found. For more definition of colour, I breed Smoke to Smoke and then out to solid Black or Blue to keep the eye colour and type. I know that there is a tendency today to breed from any colour be it Red, Cream or Silver Tabby, and whilst I know that lovely cats are produced in this manner and registered as Smoke, I prefer to stick to my own recipe.

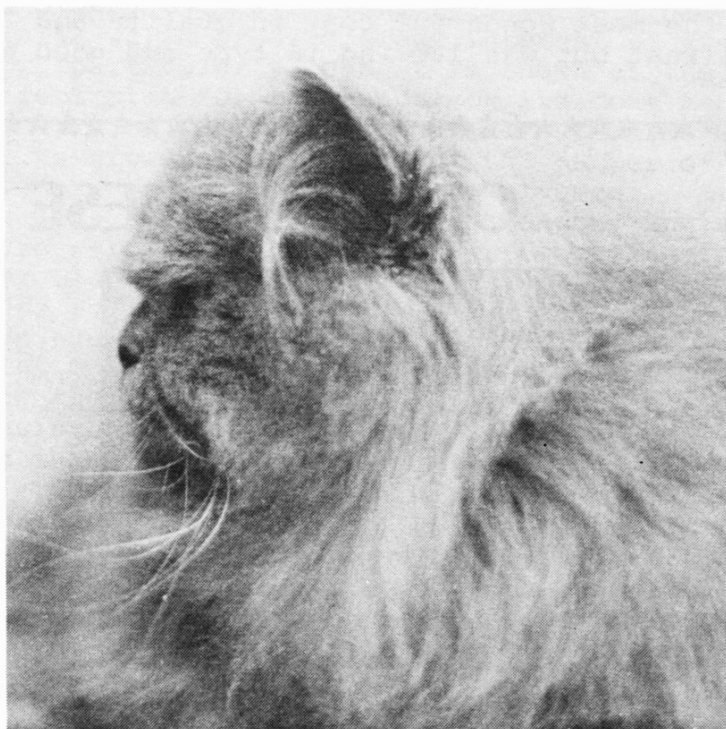
STANDARD

The Standard for the Smoke states that this cat of contrasts should have an undercoat as

ash white as possible, with the tips shading to black, the dark points being most defined on the back, head and feet, and the light points on frill, flanks and ear tufts. The body colour should be black, shading to silver on sides and flanks. Mask and feet black with no markings. Head: broad and round with width between ears, snub nose; ears small and tufted. Body cobby, not coarse but massive, short legs. Eyes to be orange or copper, large and round in shape with a pleasing expression, tail short and bushy. For Blue Smokes, the word 'black' should be substituted by 'blue'.

Therefore, by Standard, the mask and feet of the Smoke should be dense black unmarked by tabby striping, the ruff and ear tufts of silver (not white as I have so often heard from both breeders and judges who should know better), the whole body having an undercoat of pale ash silver tipped with black, shading to silver on the flanks and legs, so that, when he walks, he shimmers like shot silk with the silver ash of his undercoat showing through. How often I find that it would appear that both breeders and judges have not read the Standard and one finds a cat with very marked tabby striations in black on a silver mask and body, like a heavily striped silver tabby, winning in preference to a cat with a solid mask merely because the former cat may, at that time, have a very white frill and bib. I do not know if these errors of judgement occur in the States, perhaps not! In Britain we do not have separate classes for Blue and Black Smokes, which I think is a pity as the Blue variety seems to be quite a Cinderella. One of the most outstanding examples of Blue Smoke is CH. BEAUVALE BALLERINA, owned by Mrs. J. White.

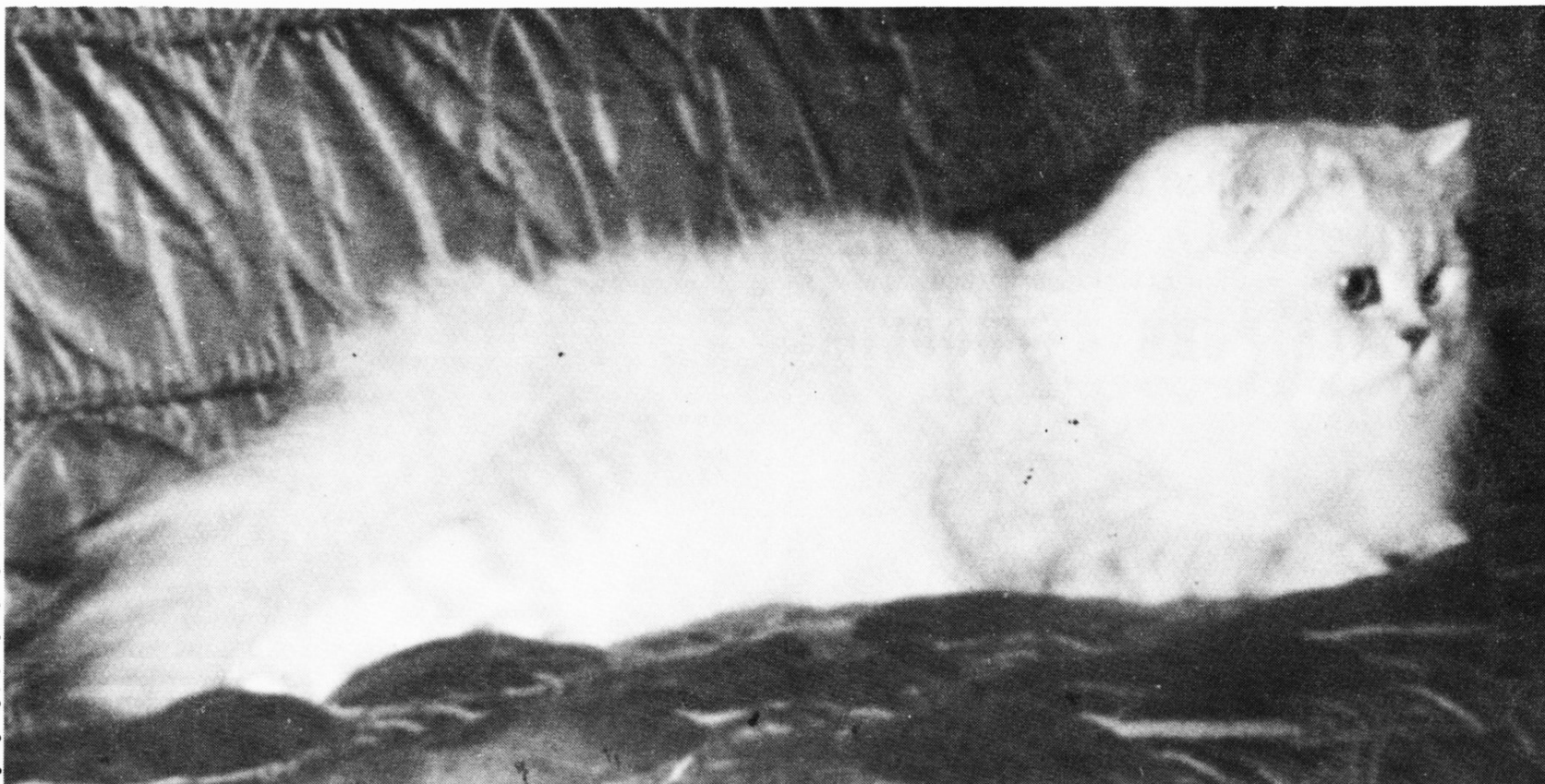
SMOKE KITTENS

Whenever one picks up a textbook to read up on the Smoke, one is told that the kittens are born black. In nearly ten years of breeding experience I can say that this is incorrect. Immediately after birth I can tell a Smoke kitten; he is the one with the clown markings lightly etched in silver around his eyes and nose. Genitals and feet are usually much lighter in colour, too. After about six weeks, the black appears to grow out, revealing an undercoat of silver, and silver ear tufts and other furnishings appear. However, I have sometimes known this colouring to be reversed like a photographic negative, where the kittens have been born silver with black pencil lines, genitals and feet. These kittens take much longer to develop their correct colour than the normal pattern, but are very beautiful and eventually make the correct Standard as adults.

I have also noticed over the years that Smokes which are Chinchilla bred are much lighter when young, and sometimes also in adulthood. The depth of ticking on each hair is less than that of the long established

GRAND PREMIERS

This season there are 54 new Grand Premiers as compared to 30 for last season. Eleven breeds are represented. There are 26 neutered males and 28 spayed females.

Oldest cat on the list is *CHATELAIN NEP-ETA*, Blue Cream female born September 15, 1966. Youngest is *DOCIA DAO SUPERCAT*, Black Smoke female Exotic born July 30, 1973; she was youngest cat to win a Grand Championship the previous season.

Data given on the Grand Charts, beginning on page 25, include's name of the new Grand Champion, birth-date (first figure indicates month), color, sex, breeder and owner (when a cat is owned by its breeder, the name is just printed once).

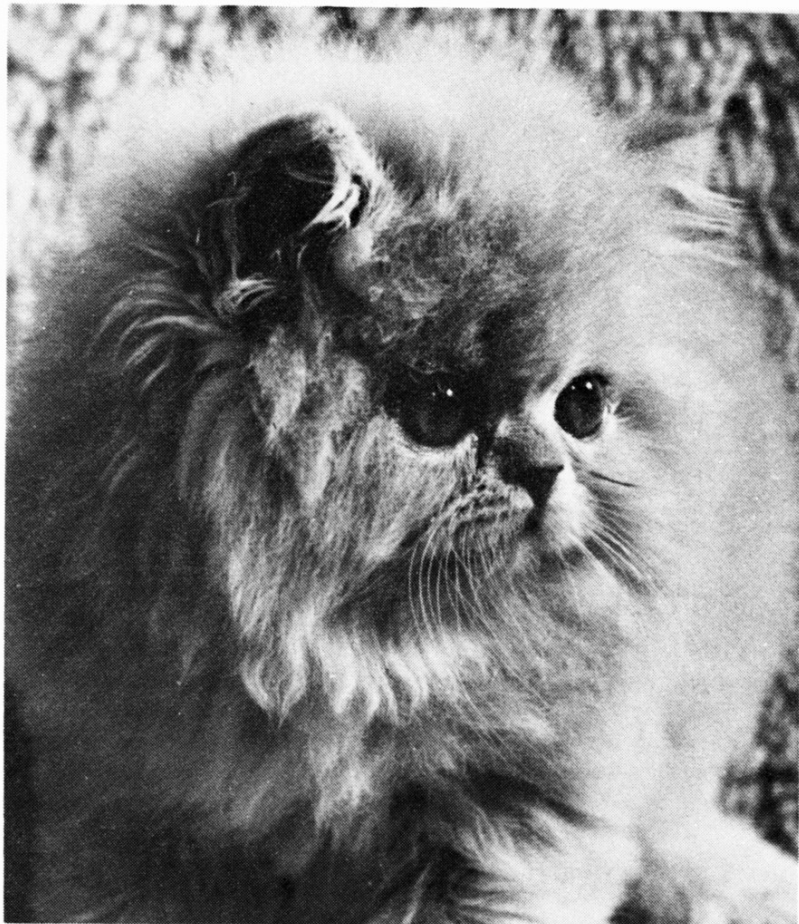
GLADNESS MIXED WITH SADNESS

Perhaps the most exhilarating happening for a breeder/exhibitor is the news that his/her cat has won a National award. By contrast, the most devastating thing that can happen is to lose a dearly beloved feline to a disease for which a cure is yet to be found. Some of the owners of this year's Grands wrote us sad little notes telling us that their cats were no longer with them. As breeders ourselves, we have been along that road and know the heartaches they now suffer.

Many dedicated research scientists are working hard to find ways to combat feline disease but are handicapped by lack of funds. Few of us these days have much money to spare but give what we can. Is there any other way to channel dollars into desperately-needed research? We think there is one way which would free many thousands of dollars for research. It's a matter of majority choice ... which is most important: financing research which will lead to the prevention and/or cure of feline disease ... or financing the commercial scoring of cats' prowess at shows.

There are two widely known sets of awards made annually in North America. One of these systems is run by Cat Fanciers Association and not only is this award program completely free-of-charge, it also gives monetary prizes to owners of the winning cats. The CFA National Awards are particularly meaningful; for example, a cat must score a certain number of points to even be considered for an award. It is not simply a matter of having a handful of points and, because it has little competition in its breed and color, it automatically gets some title or another.

The second award system is run on a commercial basis with a fee being charged to all cat clubs sponsoring shows who wish the cats entered in their shows to be scored. Really, the clubs have little choice but to pay the fee. If they do not, cats' wins in the non-

participating show, will not be counted in this competition, even though the wins will count so far as the club's affiliated association is concerned towards championships, etc. Exhibitors faced with the choice of two shows on one weekend would tend to enter the one which is paying for the commercial scoring rather than the one which is not. Therefore, entries at the latter event would be jeopardized. This commercial award system offers no monetary prizes whatsoever to the hundreds of cats to which it gives a title ... yet, this commercial scoring is costing the North American cat fancy OVER \$20,000 PER YEAR!

The results of the commercial scoring of the 1974-'75 show season will be out in October. The results of the non-profit C.F.A. scoring appear in Section Two of this issue. It will be extremely interesting to see how many duplications there are in the top awards made free-of-charge to exhibitors by C.F.A. and those made by the commercial operation at this exorbitant cost.

We feel that this is a most appropriate time for exhibitors who are true lovers of show cats to ask themselves which is most important to them ... being told twice that they own one of the top cats in the land, or settling for the one announcement and advocating that the \$20,000+ paid for the commercial scoring of cat shows be donated instead to feline research. An award certificate can

be very cold comfort if the cat who earned it has succumbed to a disease for which a cure, or vaccine, has yet to be found. These many thousands of extra dollars spent for research could turn the right key.

We realize that this would be a difficult decision for those exhibitors who presently might not be showing with CFA and whose cats would not be eligible for the free scoring program. However, if even those exhibitors would feel in their hearts that they would prefer to see this enormous sum of money being used for research rather than commercial scoring, perhaps the answer might be found in an approach to Cat Fanciers Association to see if all cat shows currently held in North America could be scored by them in one annual awards program.

It's a point to ponder ... research vs. commercial awards. ###

PRICING HIMALAYANS

by *BORIS E. TERON*

A current subject of much controversy in the cat fancy is the pricing of Himalayan cats and kittens.

There is no one who can tell us "How much" is "too low" or "How much" is "too high" a price to charge for a kitten or cat that we sell. We each establish our own scale of pricing.

It is certainly a fair way to do business if we each put ourselves in the position of the potential purchaser of an animal which we are offering for sale and feel that the price is one we would want to pay ourselves for the animal. If you don't feel that you would be taken by paying the asked price, then your customer (or potential purchaser) would, likewise, feel the same way and leave your cattery or home as a satisfied customer and friend with his purchase in hand.

Himalayan pets should not be sold for peanuts, so to speak. At our Nevah-Tep Cattery, we have found, through the years, that a fair price for our pets is US\$75.00 for males and US\$100 for females; naturally, they are sold with a neuter or spay agreement at these prices. The neuter and spay agreement requires that the purchaser provide us with a certification from their veterinarian stating that their animal has been altered and we, in turn, provide the pedigree and registration papers, noting (in ink or ball point pen) on the registration that the animal is either a Neuter or Spay. This protects the breeder.

There are breeders who sell pets with full registration and pedigree papers at pet prices. This can injure the breed as many of these folks really want to breed their pets to produce more pets, similar to what has happened in other known breeds of cats. It is unwise to sell pets with papers unless you know the purchaser and can trust them to alter the cat or kitten at the proper age without breeding first.

If a pair of cats produce nothing but pets, this combination should definitely not be repeated as there happens to be too many pets in the world now and each of us should try to protect them and not permit more to appear on the scene. In some areas of the country, there is a good pet market, but in other areas breeders have some difficulty in selling their pets and excess kittens. This should always be considered when a breeder goes on a heavy breeding program. The protection and improvement of the breed should

be goals of all breeders---all *ethical* breeders.

After pets, we move along up to breeder quality. A fair price to ask for a kitten of breeder quality normally would be from US\$125 minimum, with most going for at least US\$150 if they are worthy of their pedigrees and carry no major faults. The top price for an extremely worthy breeder quality kitten can be as high as US\$225. Most breeder quality kittens should be capable of attaining their championships at the shows.

Adult cats being sold for breeders normally sell for anywhere from US\$150 to US\$225, provided they are proven sires or dams, or are younger than breeding age and carry excellent pedigrees.

Normally, when show quality or potential is mentioned, breeders expect to pay a minimum of US\$200 upwards. A fair price for a Himalayan with show potential can run anywhere from US\$250 to US\$300. With this specimen, price can jump to US\$400 or even US\$450 we have heard. BUT, it should depend entirely on QUALITY.

There is much to be said about "overpricing"; however, we hear little comment about breeders selling good stock and "underpricing". Over-evaluations can be most detrimental to folks who do this; in fact, pricing at "fair market value" is much better than going too high which ends up in unhappy customers. A good, sound reputation in dealings is what we should all strive for, and honesty in judgement always seems to pay off in the end. Remember, no one likes being "taken" and few come back for a second time around. Establishing customers and friends in the fancy can be accomplished through honest dealings and frankness on the part of the seller.

One good rule of thumb is: Charge what you would expect to pay for the same merchandise. We find this satisfies both the buyer and the seller.###

DISCUSSION: C.F.R.

Since last fall when CFA President Richard Gebhardt wrote of the fancy's need for a Central Feline Registry ("One Cat, One Registration", *MERCURY* section, *CW*, Sept/Oct), much has been written on the subject in these pages and those of other publications.

To better determine exhibitors' wishes, we invited readers to express their views. As the response came in, it was quickly evident that there was an overwhelming trend in favor of a Central Registry.

81.9% of the breeders and exhibitors taking time to express their opinions want a Central Registry (CFR); 9.5% do not; 5.3% had no opinion; and 3.3% were undecided.

Here is the CFR as viewed by *CAT WORLD* readers.

PAPERWORK

Mrs. Linda Kirsch, Palo Alto, CA, was against its current manner of presentation yet would favor a neutrally-operated CFR. She considered the plight of busy breeders who are tired of the endless paperwork posed by the present system and suggested that one solution would be the formation of a small company who would, for a fee, undertake the 'secretarial' work

of registering a fancier's cats on his/her behalf with one or more of the existing associations.

Some of the 'undecided' respondents liked the CFR concept but wondered if it would result in a loss of revenue to the smaller associations or if it would create a monopoly.

NO OPINION

Several breeders had no opinion because they had questions they wanted to be answered first. These questions were passed to Mrs. Jean Rose and the answers appeared in the *MERCURY*. One breeder commented that as hers is a CFA-exclusive cattery, multi-registrations are not required so a CFR would make no difference to her.

NEGATIVE

Unfortunately, some of the negative votes were cast because the breeders did not quite understand the function of a CFR and thought it would alter show rules.

Three of the nay voters gave no reason for their antipathy but four opined that variations in the registration rules of the nine associations would make it too confusing for a CFR to function successfully.

Janet Sauer, Worcester, MA, Joan Bergstein, Amityville, NY, and Elree Kellogg, Chicago, feared that a CFR might result in the fancy becoming similar to the dogs AKC (American Kennel Club), a possibility that other breeders wanting a CFR found of some

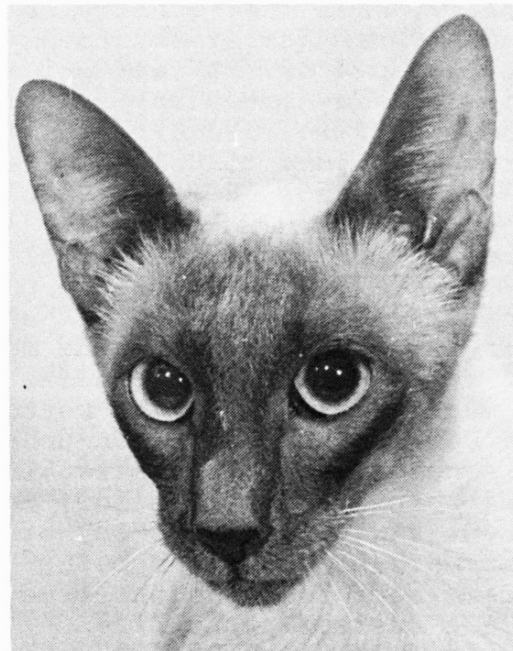

attraction. Mr. Kellogg, who described himself as a 'dyed-in-the-wool CFA person', wrote: "... one of the things that makes the Cat Fancy so much nicer than the dog world is the fact that if one doesn't care for one association, one can go to another."

A philosophic observation was made by James Becknell, El Paso, TX: "There is no way all associations will agree to work with each other!" Another Texas breeder, John Hargrove, Houston, felt things are best continued as they are with each system seeking its own level and the best man (association) emerging the winner, but he added hopefully: "Now, if only ACFA and CFA would agree to merge"

Two Easterners, Elaine Smith, Hull, MA, and Herb Zwecker, Monroe, CT, cast their 'no' votes because of a concern that CFR would result in the closing of the small associations but a Westerner, Merrylyn Polan, Albuquerque, NM, formerly of England, said: "How about only ONE association in the USA? This is really the answer. It works very nicely in Britain. Why not here?"

LET'S START THE CFR

The predominant themes of the 81.9% who gave the CFR the green signal centered on economy of both time and dollars; simplification of paperwork and record-keeping, and the very desirable point of having *one name and one number for one cat*. Sixteen of those in favor did not give a reason for their choice and two of those wanting a CFR recommended that it be under the auspices of a 'neutral' body.

In contrast to Elaine Smith and Herb Zwecker, several felt that a CFR would benefit the smaller associations and perhaps help them to prosper.

Barb Sims, Aurora, CO, wrote: "If all could be done at one time, I might be more inclined to keep my cats registered in more than one association. As it is, I only register in CFA." A similar opinion was voiced by Suzanne Schabel, Fairport, NY.

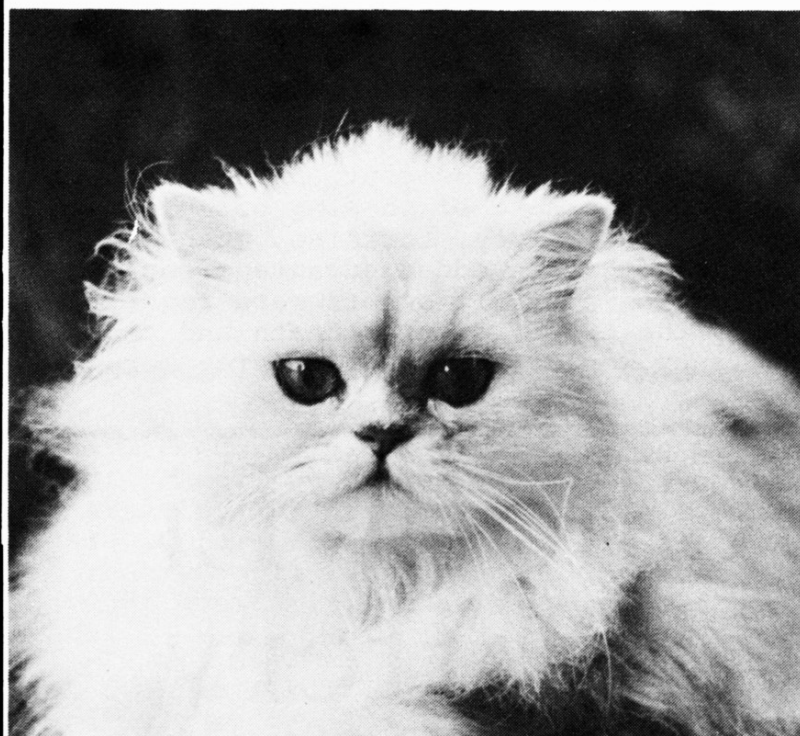
Kathie DiGregorio, Eatontown, NJ, said she would go to more shows if a CFR was in operation, shows that she does not bother to go to now because her cats are not registered with that particular association and she does not want to have to fill out more registration forms. James Glenn, III thought a CFR would help to unite the cat fancy as well as cut cost, and it might help save some of the small associations. Erica Mueller, Woburn, MA, thought the CFR would encourage exhibitors to enter the shows of some of the smaller associations thereby raising the level of quality seen at such shows. John Morris, Jr. Ionia, MI, pointed out that CFR would forestall the doom of the dying associations and generally improve the relationships among breeders and the fancy as a whole.

Steve and Patricia Taylor, Avon, MA, see a definite need for a CFR but would prefer to have one association with one set of rules and regulations. They feel that the dog breed-

ers with their one governing unit seem able to accomplish more than the cat breeders with multiple units are able to do and are better recognized. "If anything," they wrote, "it is way past time for all of us to unite for the sake of our cats."

An Arizona breeder shared the Taylors' last remark, saying: "...multi-registration of catteries and cats is expensive, does not benefit the cat fancy, and only spreads money (already spread thin) among registries set up by dissident factions. Therefore my money, reluctantly, is being used to support factions that ought to pull together for the common good of THE CAT."

Mrs. Virginia Driscoll, South Boston, MA thought that computer registration would not only be faster but that family history of each cat could be checked better to prevent any falsification. Saving on registration fees would result in more money being available for show fees, was Mrs. Lynne Breen's thought. A Crown judge commented that so far as she was concerned, CFA was already a Central Registry because, with a CFA number, an exhibitor may show and claim a cat's championship in Crown, an association which was formed to cut the cost of showing cats.

Mrs. D. Harvey, Lorraine, Quebec, Canada suggested that an added advantage could be gained from a CFR if owners were required to notify the CFR of a cat's death and cause. The fancy would then have a source for cat

population count, breed count, etc., for use in research studies.

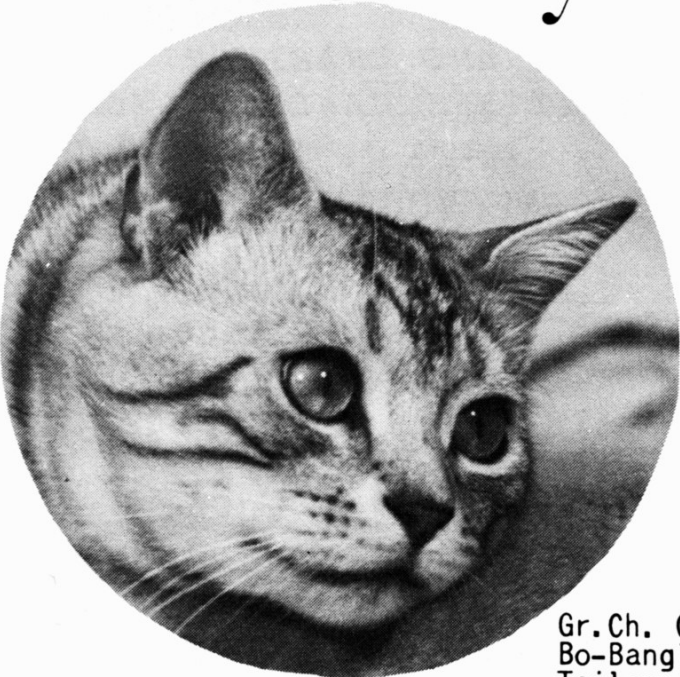
Of prime concern to many breeders is having many names for one cat as a result of today's 9-association registration system. Mrs. Earl Deslippe, Windsor, Ontario, feels this is most confusing, especially to newcomers to the fancy. Mrs. Esther Epstein, Brockton, MA, brought up an interesting point when she wrote: "A CFR is especially needed, not only for the money involved, but because a cat may be registered differently in several associations. That can spoil any ideas an owner might have in attaining high scores in AA scoring."

POSITIVE REASONS

Survey results would indicate that breeders and exhibitors definitely want to see the establishment of a Central Feline Registry for the following reasons:

1. Simplification of paperwork.
2. Saving of time and money.
3. Assurance of one name and one number for one cat.
4. Protection of cattery name against duplication in any association.
5. Simplification of ownership transfer.
6. Money now used for multi-registration could be used as show fees.
7. Simplification of registration would result in larger entries for small associations' shows.

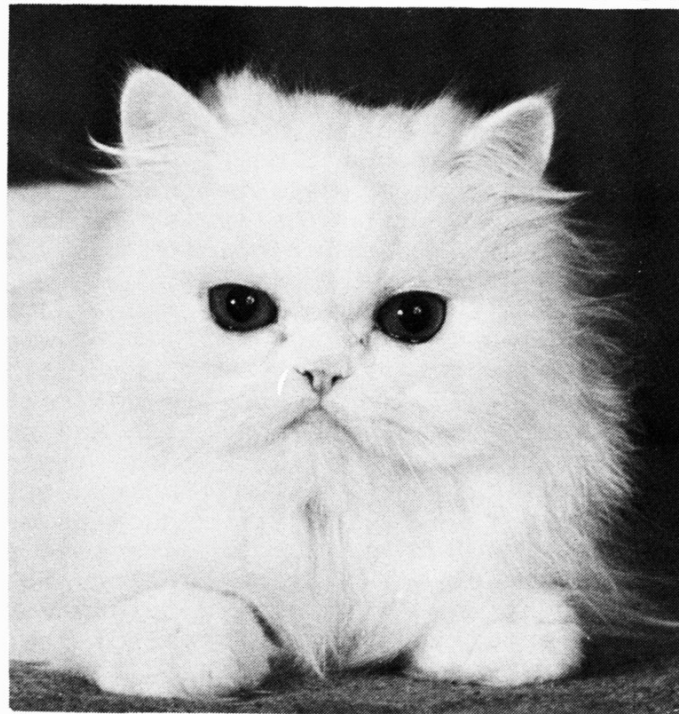

8. Entering shows would be easier and errors made on show entry forms would be reduced.

AS WE SEE IT

Contrary to the impression formed by some exhibitors, a CFR would in no way affect the registration requirements of each individual association. A cat who, because of its breed or ancestry, is not eligible for registration in all associations, would be registered via CFR only in those whose requirements it met and with whom the owner desired the cat to be registered. If, at a later date, one or more of the other associations changed rules so that this cat became eligible for registration, the owner could then have it so registered via the CFR and the cat would still have only one registration number and only one name.

Another common misconception is that the CFR would have an influence upon the show rules and/or standards of the different associations and all would have to conform to one set of rules. Again, not so. The CFR would handle only matters concerning registration, not show affairs. The latter would continue to be handled directly by the individual association in accordance with their own rules.

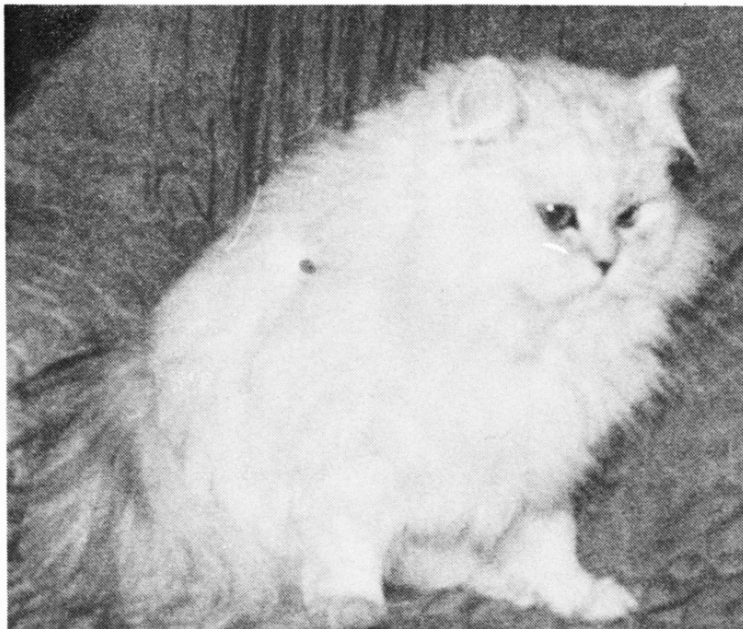
Although a few respondents felt it would be better for a 'neutral' organization to run a CFR, it would greatly simplify and speed the formation of same if Cat Fanciers Associ-

ation would undertake the responsibility as Richard Gebhardt has indicated it is willing to do. According to his estimate given in his article, 90% of all cats eligible for registration are registered with CFA already and that association is the only one with a computer available and already-trained personnel.

It is interesting to compare registration figures for 1974 recently published respectively by CFA and American Cat Fanciers Association (ACFA) which is the biggest of the small associations in the U.S. During a 12-month period ending January 31, 1975, CFA registered 33,942 cats. In the 12 months ending December 31, 1974, 9,688 were registered by ACFA, 28.54% of CFA's total number.

Would its operation of a Central Feline Registry give CFA a monopoly? The Britannica World Language dictionary defines the word as "*the exclusive right or privilege of engaging in a particular traffic ...*" The only *privilege* for CFA as operator of the CFR would be a considerable amount of extra work for little, if any, financial reward and the good possibility of having to absorb a financial loss. Consider ...

Mrs. Jean Rose has been using a suggested fee of \$3 per cat for registration via the CFR, with \$1 extra to be paid for each association in which the cat is to be registered. However, CFA, whose current registration fee is \$3 per cat, has not said that it will

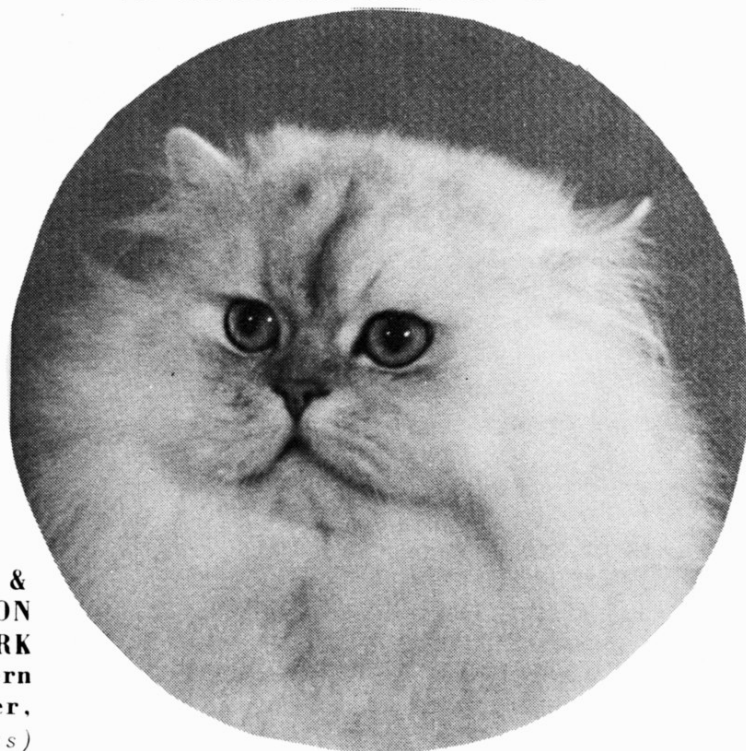

charge the extra dollar for the cat to be CFA registered but, instead, will include this (for CFA-eligible cats) with the CFR fee.

According to Mr. Gebhardt's estimate, nine-tenths of all registered cats are registered with CFA. It follows that this ratio will hold true for future kittens as born. Therefore, CFA is offering to undertake the responsibility of CFR operation and the additional work of processing of registrations of cats for other associations without getting any increase in its own revenue. The \$1-per-

association fee passes to the other associations with no portion retained by CFA as compensation for time, paper, printing, postage, computer, personnel, etc. in giving this service.

Regardless of which one of the present 9 associations would be selected to operate the CFR, profit potential simply isn't there. The only chance would be if the operating association were to charge the CFR fee plus an extra fee for registering in that association. It is more likely that the CFR would be an operating loss for the association. Because of its size and successful businesslike operation over the years, CFA is the only one of the associations existing today which could afford the luxury of such a loss.

Returning to the suggestion of setting up an independent body to run the CFR, this method would obviously make the project more expensive. The 'independent' would have to start from the ground up, personnel would have to be hired and trained in the requirements of the fancy, office space would need to be rented, equipment purchased, computer time rented, etc. In all probability, the breeder/exhibitor would have to pay the cost in one form or another.

The United States is now celebrating its bi-centennial. What a milestone it would be if officials of all cat registering bodies in North America would, for the present at least, set aside their differences and meet personally to discuss a Central Feline Registry.###

to be until all renewals have, or have not, been made.

Nearly all judges for our shows have to be brought to Darwin from Australia's Southern States and this is a great financial burden. One judge is expected to judge a whole show of up to 120 cats so must be an All Breeds judge. If a specialist judge is invited (which is very seldom), then one of the three local All Breeds judges completes the rest of the show. If local judges are used, then the number can be from one to all three for any particular show. Those judges from the Southern States must travel between 2,000 and 3,000 miles.

THE SHOW GOES ON

First show planned since "The Blow" took place on June 1, 1975, with sixty cats entered, an amazing number considering the reduced population. Fortunately, registrations of CANT were all saved as they were contained in a newly-bought filing cabinet which was under the tropical-style home (house on piers) of the registrar. Her house and her own personal filing cabinet was blown away but the CANT archives under the house remained. They were water damaged but otherwise unharmed. Other paperwork, cards, a typewriter and duplicating machine have had to be replaced.

The show was a success although the hall had been double booked. It was a school hall so the CANT had to make do with two class rooms. Special cyclone ribbons were issued for the first post-Tracy show which was judged by Mrs. M. Hawkes of F.C.C., Victoria.

The standard of exhibits was high although the numbers were few. Best-Cat-In-Show was a Siamese Lilac Point male, *BYAMEE MIRACLE*, bred in the Northern Territory and owned by Mrs. D. Simpson. Reserve Cat was a Brown Burmese male, *CH. AMBERRIDGE BEYAN*, also locally bred, owned by Mrs. H. Lowe. Best-Kitten-In-Show was E. Overden's Seal Point, *CHI-LANG LAPIS LAZULI*, while Reserve Kitten was a Cream Longhair, *SHARBRU SHILOH*, owned by Mrs. J. Dumigan. Best-Neuter-In-Show was Miss Tracy Joyce's Seal Point Siamese, *GRAND P.N. BYAMEE DENILQUIN*.

A very enjoyable Baramundi (fish) barbeque was held down the track at a member's 22 acre block the night before the show. Mulled wine and excellent salads amazed the Judge as they were produced from a caravan, the member's present home, with no mains water, electricity, phone or sewerage. Mrs. Hawkes was also surprised by the bonfire lit to cheer the cool evening which, to her, was a balmy tropical night but, to the locals, quite cold---about 22°C.

At least two more shows are planned for 1975, one on July 25 in conjunction with the big Agricultural Show held by the North Australian Show Society and the big end of year October show where all the perpetual trophies are presented. Any further shows will depend

on the number of workers who can be 'press ganged' into assisting and the financial situation of the Association.

During the year, points are awarded at each show for Best in Show, Reserve in Show, Best of Breed, 1st and Challenge in Open or Best Kitten. The highest point winners are honored at the October show which climaxes the show season. Most of these perpetual trophies survived "The Blow" since they were among the first things winners rescued as they fled their homes.

FUNDS TO BE RAISED BY CYCLONE MAGAZINE

The Cat Association of the Northern Territory lost a great deal of its equipment in "The Blow". In a self-help scheme to attain the necessary funds for replacements, club members have written their cyclone stories and these are being published in a magazine which is being offered for sale to cat fanciers all over the world. CANT's target is to raise the sum of A\$500 from sale of "Cyclone"; the price is A\$1 per copy, plus A50¢ for seamail postage.

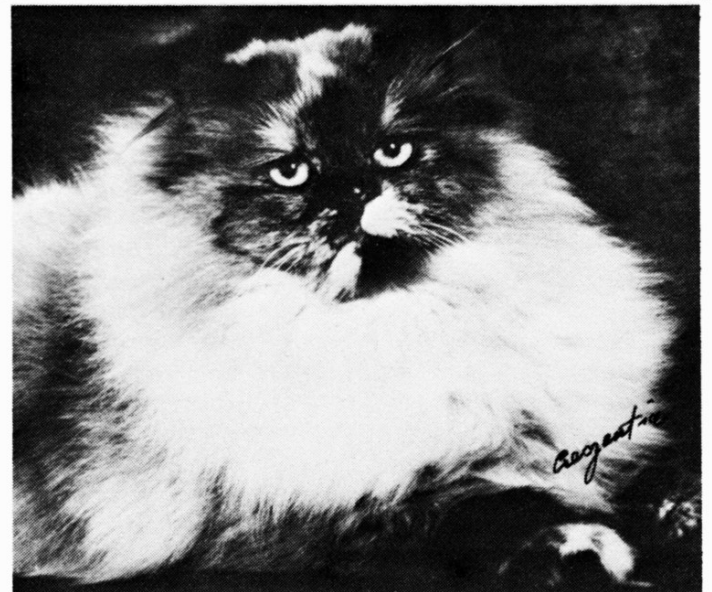

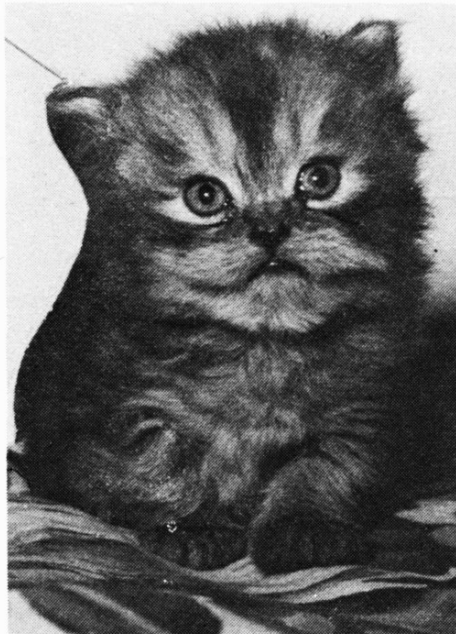

Smoke lines, consequently they lack the denseness of colour required in mask and feet. Many people appear to have difficulty in deciding if they have a Smoke or not, and many breeders in the course of a season approach me to tell me that they think they have a kitten which is a Smoke, also some very odd kittens appear in the Smoke classes at shows. I think that, in the main, these errors occur because their owners have been misinformed by friends who are not familiar with young Smokes. If at birth your baby kitten has the silver pencil lines as described and, within a few weeks, develops the clown markings, then this little ugly duckling will, in the course of time, be transformed into a beautiful Smoke kitten.



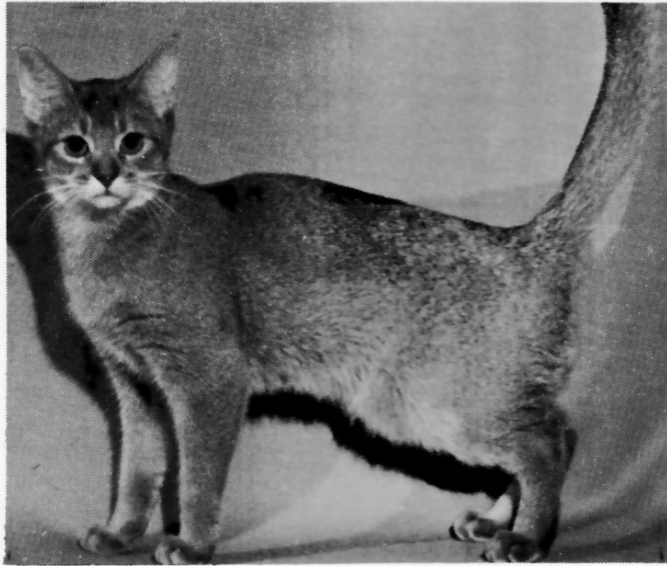
A Hardendale kitten pictured at one month. The clown markings can be seen growing out and the silver undercoat emerging.

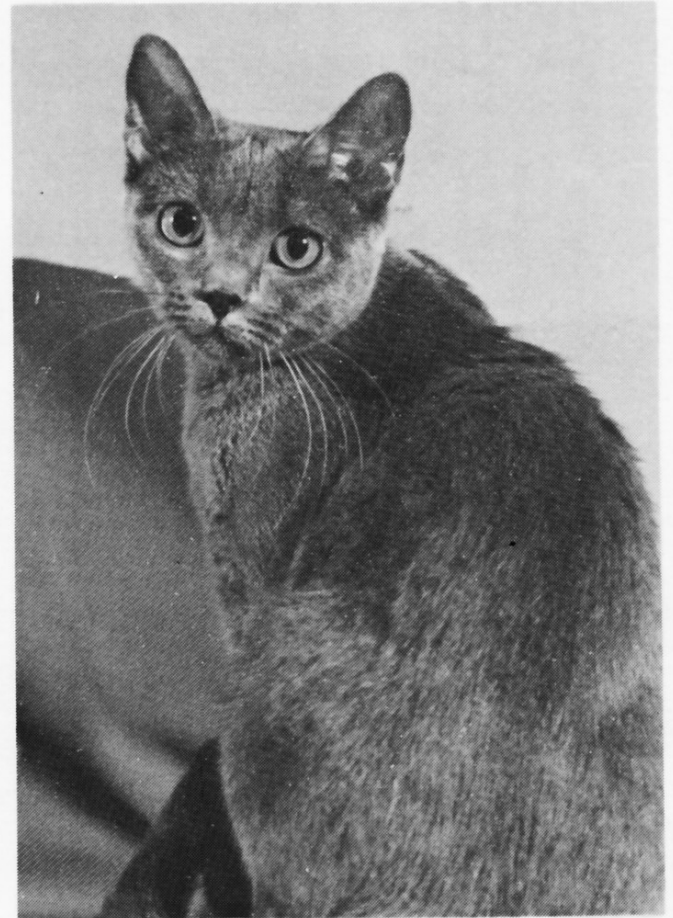

It is to be hoped that other breeders will now, through their efforts, make doubly sure that this most beautiful of Persians never again comes so near to being lost, as it did in Europe at least, as a result of neglect prior to and during the war years. Long may our beautiful Smoke Longhair survive and evolve to grace not only the showbench, but also our homes, and give pleasure and joy to our hearts.###

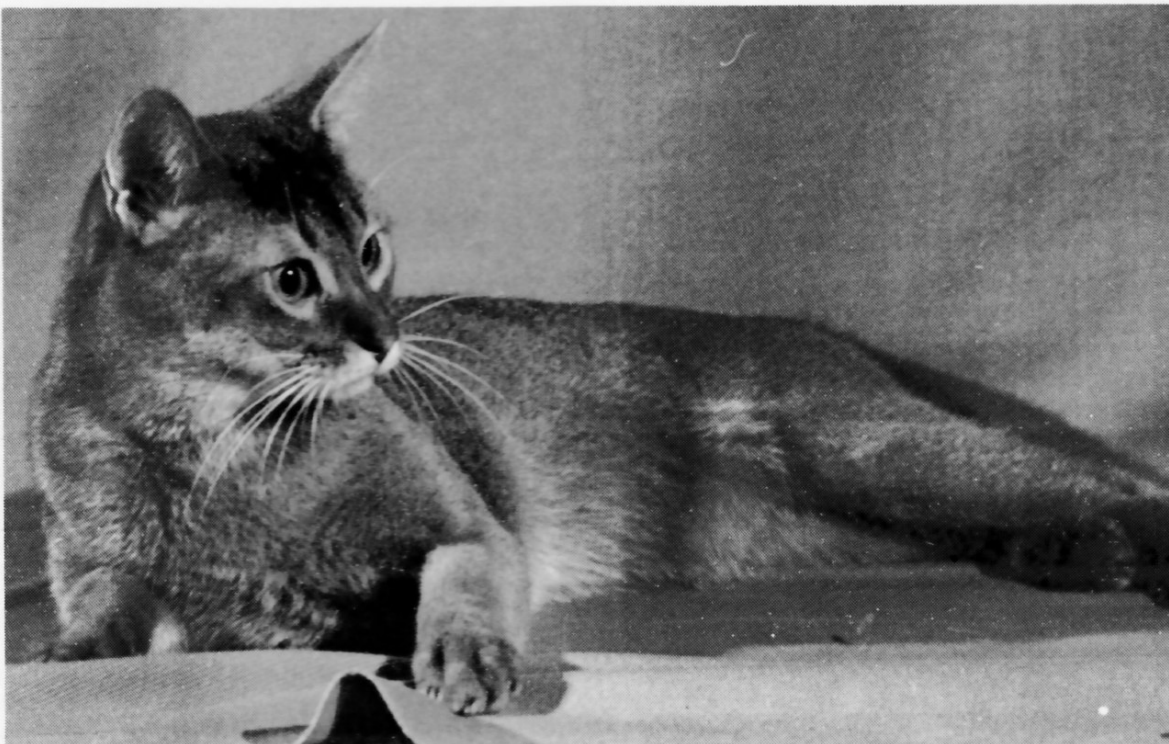


