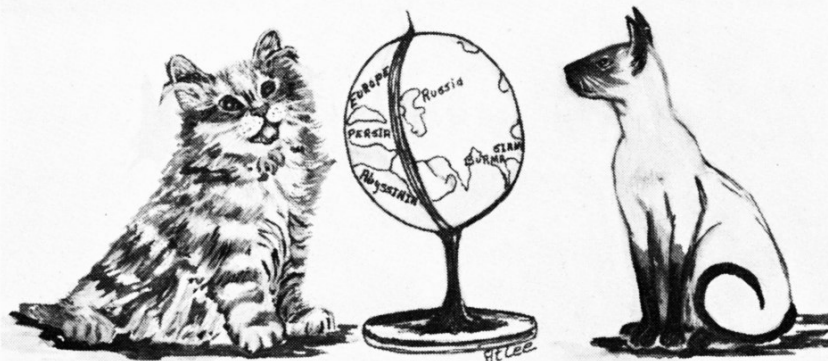

ASSOCIATION NEWS

Althea A. Frahm is new secretary for American Cat Association: her address is 302B S. Brand Blvd., Glendale, CA 91204. ACA is now offering individual memberships to fanciers with \$6 per year dues. A monthly newsletter is planned.

Fédération Internationale Féline has recognized for Championship competition the Shell Cameo LH and the Shaded Cameo LH; the Chocolate, Lilac and Red Burmese; Odd-Eyed White LH; and Smoke SH. Further, FIFE has recognized, without Championship status, the Creme-Pointed Siamese and the Korat. FIFE's so-called 'black list' of GCCF judges has been abolished.

On June 25, Britain's Governing Council of the Cat Fancy held its Electoral Meeting. Dr. W. Groom, chairman, Mrs. L. Pring, vice chairman, and Mr. R. Loveys, treasurer, were returned unopposed. It was decided that, as from June 1, 1976, no kitten shall be exhibited under the age of 3 calendar months; this ruling also applies to kittens in litters. Breeders were reminded that a veterinary certificate of entirety for adult male cats must be supplied when application is made to GCCF for an Export Certificate.

THE HAVANA BROWN

It is a relatively rare situation for a group of people to sit down and plan a new breed of cat. Cats, as a general rule, do not lend themselves to such drawing board, genetic engineering. The exception to the rule is the Chestnut Brown, or the Havana Brown, cat.

In 1951, the Baroness von Ullmann planned a new self chocolate breed and interested Mrs. A. Hargreaves, Mrs. Monro-Smith and Mrs. E. Fisher in working toward the production of such a cat. Although the first modern self chocolate had been accidentally produced by Mrs. Monro-Smith in 1952, the first planned cat was born in 1953. The breed was established by transferring the Siamese chocolate to a solid colored cat, and this was accomplished by crossing a chocolate point Siamese to a black cat of elongated conformation; in the early days, Russian Blues were also used.

The genetic problems involved are relatively simple, and have been utilized since then to produce a great variety of self and patterned coats on the elongated body type of the Siamese.

In spite of the fact that two self chocolates had been known in 1894, the scientific planning of a new breed was still an exciting and unique event in 1951. The two earlier cats are well known as was their breeder, Mrs. French, for *GRANNY GRUMPS* and her offspring, *MASTER TIMKEY BROWN*, are included in any history of the Chestnut Browns. It was said that from the beginning the cats were gentle and sweet. Perhaps this is em-

phasized to offset any disquieting impression the name *GRANNY GRUMPS* might convey.

The "accidental" modern Chestnut Brown resulted from Mrs. Monro-Smith's interest in the Colourpoints.

She had crossed a Seal Point female to a black Persian and, of the resulting litter, a shorthaired black female named *SUSANNAH* was bred to a Seal Point male named *TOMBEE*. From this cross, the first modern self chocolate was *ELMTOWER BRONZE IDOL*, born October 24, 1952. Within two years, the second male, *PRAHA GYPKA*, and *LAURENTIDE BROWN PRIOR* had been born.

Four years later, a male, *LAURENTIDE BROWN PILGRIM*, and a female, *ROOFSPRINGER MAHOGANY*, were sent to California. Mrs. Peters, who had originally imported the two, passed them on to Mrs. Elsie Quinn, America's pioneer breeder of Havanas. Today, America's most eminent breeder of the Havana is Mrs. Dallas Sidlo. Her cat, *GRAND CH. Z.Z.'S GEORGETTE OF SIDLO*, has been shown to great distinction. Before her retirement, Mrs. Christine Streetman had imported stock from Baroness von Ullman and had enjoyed her experiences with the new brown cat. In England, Mrs. Angela Sayer is well known for her Havanas, as are Mrs. Buttery, Mrs. S. Frodsham, Mrs. M. Shaw, and Mr. and Mrs. W. Clayton.

From drawing board to winner's circle has taken a relatively short time for the Havana Brown.###

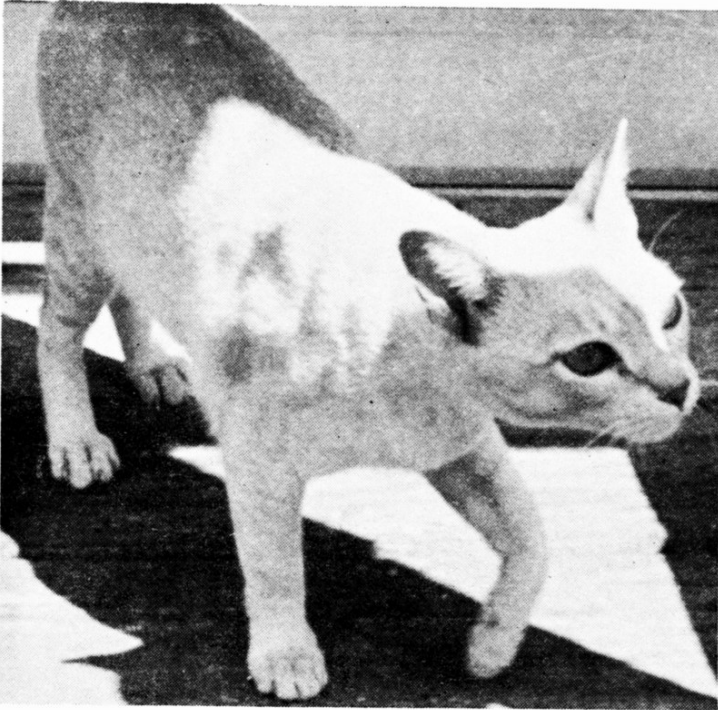

The Standard for Red Burmese calls for "a coat colour of light tangerine" and that for Cream Burmese a "rich cream". What it does not say is that the coat of the Red Burmese glows like apricot silk and that of the Cream shines with the subdued gleam of cream satin.

The story of these beautiful varieties of Burmese colouring began in England one day in 1964 when *PUSSINBOOTS TRUEPEGU*, a Blue Burmese queen bred by Mrs. Pocock and owned by Mrs. Gray, selected her own mate, a short-hair Red Tabby. In her litter was a Tortie hybrid Burmese subsequently registered as *WAVERMOUSE GALAPAGOS* and acquired by Mrs. Pocock for breeding.

This interesting little kitten was the progenitor of the new colours which caught the attention of the well-known Burmese breeders, Mr. and Mrs. Dyte and Miss Blackman. They, with Mrs. Pocock, quickly realised that other lines would have to be established to prevent inbreeding depression and to create the healthy, typical Burmese with wonderful temperaments that the Reds and Creams are today, so it was decided to introduce other cats into the breeding programme.

ARBOREAL FENELLA, a Brown Burmese owned by Mrs. Blackman, was mated to Mrs. Silson's Redpoint Siamese stud, *SOUTHVIEW HAVOC*. *KUDOS FARRAGO*, Tortie Burmese/Siamese hybrid was retained.

The third female to join the breeding programme was a Tortie & White Shorthair, *CHEVENING SUSY*, owned by Mrs. Westacott. At one time Mrs. Westacott bred Siamese and occasionally she had kittens running around her farm until they were sold at 6 or 7 months. It seems likely that one of these male kittens mated one of the farm cats, most of which were semi-wild, and that *SUSY*, who was

The BURMESE SPECTRUM

brought into the house young enough to be tamed, came from one of the females carrying the Siamese gene. *SUSY* obviously did carry the Siamese gene as her male kitten (by the Brown Burmese Ch. *Soondar Mooni*), *CHEVENING MERINGUE*, was a Red Burmese/Siamese hybrid with almost blue eyes.

Thus all the genes were present to produce the six sex-linked colours of the Burmese colour series of which, theoretically, half the litters would consist of Brown, Blue, Red, Cream, Tortie and Blue-Cream Burmese and the others would be hybrids. Torties and Blue-Creams are always female - any males would almost always be sterile.

FIRST CREAM BURMESE

When *KUDOS FARRAGO* was mated to *PUSSINBOOTS BLUE MOON*, Blue Burmese, a Blue-Cream kitten from this mating, *KUDOS BLUE BONNETIA*, went to live with Mrs. Pocock although remained registered in Miss Blackman's name. To *BONNETIA* went the honour of producing the first Cream Burmese, *KUDOS GOLD GUINEA*, her son by Ch. *BUSKINS BLUE SUNYA*. He is still living with Mrs. Pocock as a much-loved neutered pet.

Other breeders such as Mrs. Dell (Kupro) Mrs. Evelyn (Kernow) and the Hon. Mrs. S. Milln (Bosinver) joined the programme around this time to establish the new colours and to gain recognition by the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF). At each stage, breeding stock was carefully selected to maintain Burmese type and eye-colouring and to eliminate white spotting and the major fault, tabby barring.

In June 1970, *PUSSINBOOTS MARIMBA* and *PUSSINBOOTS MANDOLA*, litter brother and sister Cream Burmese kept for Mrs. Pocock by Mrs. Scott became the parents of the fourth generation litter considered by the Burmese Cat Club to be correct Burmese type and typical for the colour of Cream Burmese.

Development and recognition of the Torties and Reds came at a slightly later date than that of the Blue-Creams and Creams. *PUSSINBOOTS MANDOLA* was mated to Ch. *TAPAWINGO TAHLTAN IMP.CAN.* (27) and produced *PLAINSONG OKIMA*, a Red male owned by the Hon. Mrs.

Milln. The Tortie Burmese litter-sisters, MOONACRE MOUCHE and MOONACRE MEADOWSWEET (KU DOS GOLD GUINEA X COPPLESTONE BARDOLETTE-27) are prominent in the Kupro and Kernow lines respectively.

English Championship status for Creams was the first to be granted and in late September 1973 Mrs. Dell's male, KUPRO CREAM RAMA became the first Cream Burmese Champion. It is interesting to note that RAMA's sire, KUPRO CREAM KISMET, was nominated for Best In Show many times. Red Burmese were accorded Championship status in March, 1975, by GCCF but the Tortie varieties (Blue-Creams have been renamed Blue Torties which explains more exactly their genetic structure) were refused championship status.

COLOURING

In the Reds and Creams, slight tabby markings may be found on the face and small, indeterminate markings elsewhere (except on the sides and belly) are permissible when mature. In both colours the underparts are lighter than the back (as for the Browns and Blues). In kittens and adolescents allowance should be made for faint tabby-barring and, overall, a lighter colour than the adults. Ears in the Red are distinctly darker than the back coat colour, in the Cream only slightly darker.

The red back colouring is really a tangerine, variously described as light orange or apricot, not a mahogany-red, although the trend seems to be towards the darker colours. The cream colouring varies between a rich light cream on the back (not unlike that of the best Cream longhairs) and a darker cream like that of the golden labrador dog. Both colours are correct, but latest show criticisms from England indicate that the lighter colour without the hot red-cream on the back may become preferable.

In the Tortie and Blue-Cream Burmese the markings are not as important as type and eye colour as they are regarded as an intermediate step between Browns/Blues and Reds/Creams. Torties are a mixture of Red, Cream and Brown without any obvious barring and Blue-Creams are a mixture, as the name implies, of blue and cream, also without any obvious barring. Tortie and Blue-Cream kittens show a disconcerting tendency to display white markings. These are not the long, strong white hairs of the 'Burmese locket and patch' type but a slightly off-white softer fur which will eventually (it will sometimes take up to 18 months) deepen to a lovely soft cream.

EXPORTS

It was inevitable that these beautiful cats would attract the attention of overseas fanciers, and so it was in Australia and New Zealand. Australia was the first to import: Mr. and Mrs. Aitken of Western Australia imported the Cream male, KUPRO CREAM KIRSCH, bred by Mrs. Dell, and Mrs. Evelyn sent a pair, KERNOW CREAM KERBURHO and KERNOW CREAM CARO-



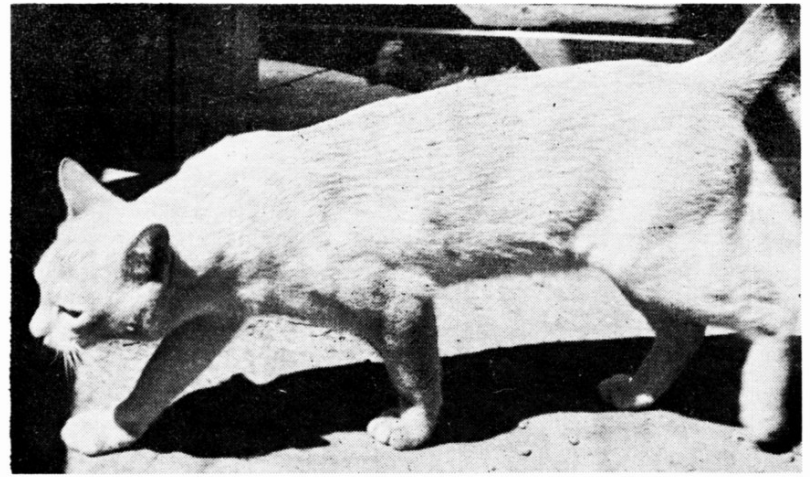

MEL, to Mrs. Bray of Melbourne who has also begun an experimental breeding programme.

The first Red and Cream Burmese to be imported into New Zealand belong to this writer and husband, Barry Frost, Christchurch. We imported from the Hon. Mrs. Milln BOSINVER FIREKIST (Red female) and BOSINVER STARDUST (Cream female) both in kitten to one of the leading English sires, ARBOREAL SITTA (27). Kittens, both Red and Tortie, from these litters are now in Australia. One, CHUNTAO RED BICHARA, has the distinction of gaining the first Challenge ever awarded to a Red Burmese. A Cream male, LINLINKYE CREAM CABRO (a son of CH. KUPRO CREAM RAMA) was a later addition to our cattery from that of Mrs. Warren-Hurlock. On the premature death of our Red queen, FIREKIST, we instituted a Tortie programme using outcross Brown queens. We hope to have Red and Cream kittens from these crosses in 1976.

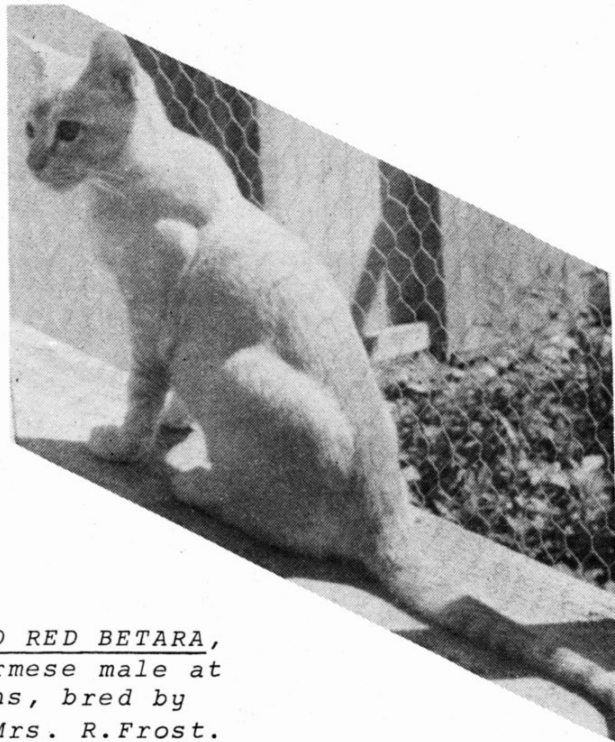

The New Zealand Cat Fancy (NZCF) follows the English system of numbering, i.e. 27d: Red Burmese; 27e: Tortie Burmese (this is the name of the breed in N.Z., not Tortoiseshell, as it was felt that the name was shortened in general useage anyway); 27f: Cream Burmese; 27g: Blue Cream Burmese.

At least one Australian Fancy has a different system of nomenclature; in the GCCF (Victoria) 27b replaces 27f and is called Champagne-Cream, 27c replaces 27g. Australia recognizes Championship status for Creams but New Zealand withheld this status until Feb. 1-2 when, at a meeting of the National Executive, Championship status was accorded all the new colours of Burmese as at the beginning of the 1975 Show Season which began in March.

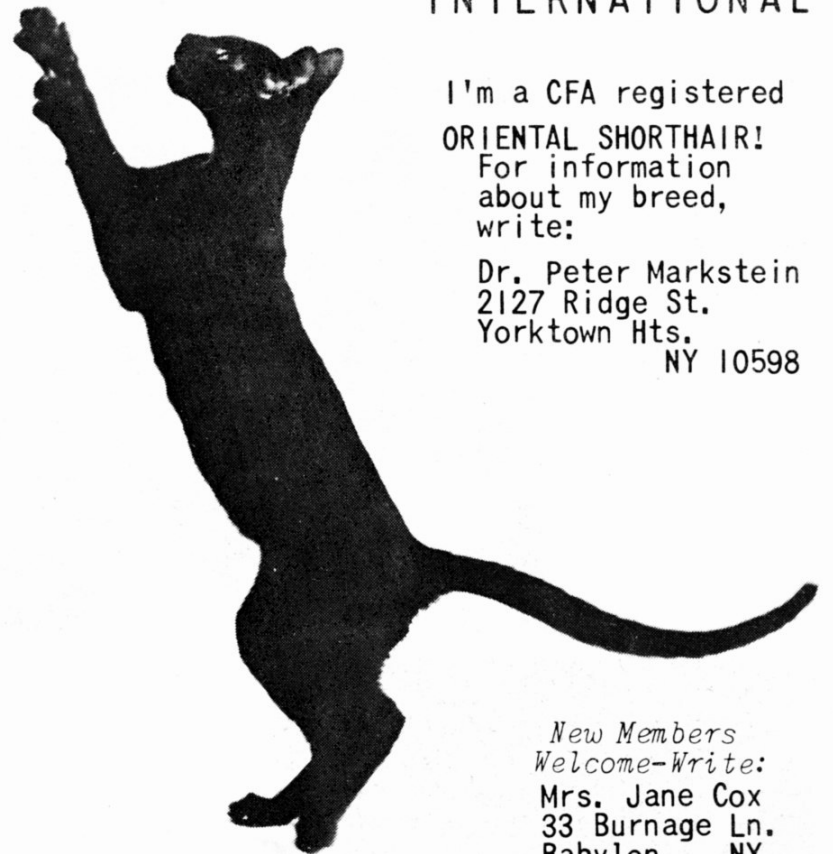

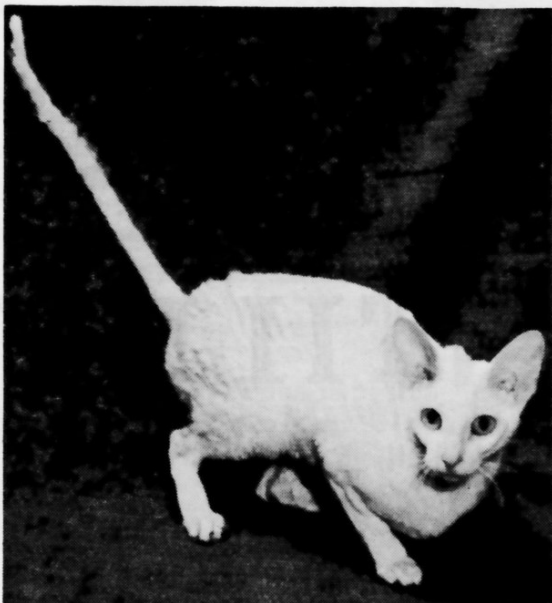

Veterinary Views

FELINE UROLITHIASIS

JOINT BSAVA/PFMA STATEMENT

During 1972 reports in the press and elsewhere linked the feeding of dry cat food with the incidence of urolithiasis and associated conditions in the domestic cat. A working party, set up by the British Small Animal Veterinary Association to investigate the matter reported in October 1972. On the evidence available at that time the working party recommended: "... that further studies should be instigated with some urgency into the whole area of feline urolithiasis ..." A joint working party (subsequently named the BSAVA/PFMA FUS Committee) considered the recommendations of the BSAVA report in detail and recommended that priority should be given to "epidemiological studies, not only to monitor the incidence of FUS, but to examine further the dietary, health and environmental background of cases ..." A one year survey of clinical cases was organised and completed on September 30th, 1974. All cases are being followed up six months later and the final report is scheduled for June 1975.

THE SURVEY

The epidemiological survey of the feline urolithiasis syndrome (FUS) was carried out from October 1st, 1973, to September 30, 1974. Veterinary surgeons from 33 practices throughout Great Britain recorded on a standard form details of 437 FUS cases presented to them during that period. The objective of the survey was to accumulate data for a further scientific study. An independent market research organisation, Dataplan, a division of Marplan Ltd., used a similar form and recorded details of a control sample of 604 cats selected at random from the domestic cat population of the practice areas.

Steps have already been taken jointly by the PFMA and the BSAVA to continue research into FUS in the UK by university research and feeding experiments designed to test some hypotheses suggested by the epidemiological data. As a check on the seasonal effect found in this survey, about 20 practices have agreed to record numbers of FUS cases on a monthly basis for a further year.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The survey indicates (within the limits imposed by the nature of the survey, the size of sample and control elements involved), the incidence of FUS cases in domestic cats in one year and the statistical association of the disease with a number of factors.

(1) The incidence of the disease has been estimated by the committee as being not more than 0.58 per cent of the domestic cat population in one year. Cases of FUS were more common in winter than in spring or summer.

- (2) Comparison of the survey of FUS cats with a control sample of cats showed a statistical association of the disease with a number of factors. By comparison with the control sample FUS cats were more likely to be older (more than two years old), to be neutered animals (especially neutered males), to be lazier taking less exercise and had less likelihood of unrestricted access to outdoors. More FUS cats came from multicat households. FUS cats drank significantly less than control cats.
- (3) The feeding of dry cat food was also numerically associated with the occurrence of FUS in clinical cases, but of these cases nearly a quarter had received no dry cat food.
- (4) Cause and effect relationships cannot be proved by an epidemiological survey of this type and the factors referred to in (2) and (3) above are not necessarily therefore either causative agents or additive in effect.

MEASURES TAKEN BY UK MANUFACTURERS

Product development. During the course of the survey, the principal UK manufacturers of dry cat food have continued to carry out their

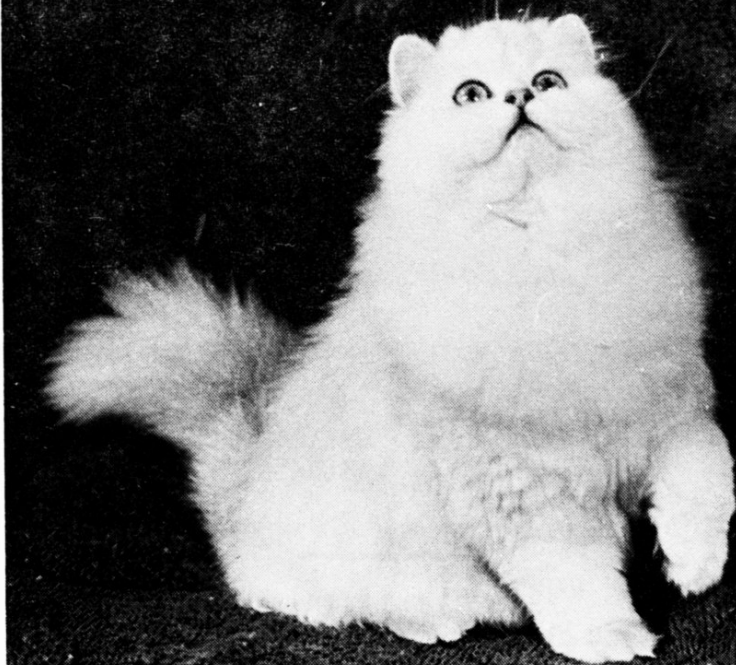

own research on all the effects of the use of their products. Results of research are being shared among the principal manufacturers. As with all pet foods, periodic modification of formulations has been aimed at improving the products in question.

Cat owner education. The manufacturers have gone to considerable lengths to ensure that users of dry cat food are made fully aware of how best to feed the products, concentrating in particular on the way in which dry cat food should be gradually introduced into the diet, the amount which should be fed on a daily basis, the availability of liquid and the desirability of consulting their veterinary surgeons if in any doubt.

ADVICE TO MEMBERS OF THE PROFESSION

The British Small Animal Veterinary Association welcomed the continuing and active support of the Pet Food Manufacturers' Association which has made joint studies possible. It is likely that the feline urological syndrome is composed of a number of clinical entities; the total incidence has been estimated as 0.58 per cent of the cat population per year. The cause of each condition remains unknown, but a number of predisposing factors, as listed previously under "Summary of Findings", appear to have been identified. Considerable further study is required, but the advice offered to members of the profession by the BSAVA on the basis of existing information can be briefly summarised as follows:

- (a) Ensure that as far as possible the cat is encouraged to exercise, to make use of outdoor toilet facilities and to drink plenty of water.
- (b) If dry cat food is used it should not be regarded as the sole food source and it should be introduced into the diet slowly.
- (c) If an individual cat has a history of urinary problems, dry cat food, if used, should be thoroughly soaked with water, milk or gravy and it should in any case form only part of the total diet.
- (d) Owners who have any doubt about any of these points should consult their own veterinary surgeon.

Comment: Until further information is available, it would seem wise for the F.A.B. to endorse the recommendations which appear in the interim report.###

SHOW BENCHING LIKES AND DISLIKES

Looking back over the past show season, I would like to share a few of my observations on the subject of show benching.

One of the nicer benching arrangements I encountered had all shorthair cats benched in one half of the show hall (the warmer portion) and the longhairs in the other section where it was somewhat cooler. On Saturday, the all-breed judge doing shorthairs and the short-hair specialty judge used the two rings in the shorthair end of the room, and the judges doing longhairs used the two rings in the longhair end of the room. On Sunday, the judges simply switched rings. Except for the all breed kitten and premiership judgings and the finals, exhibitors did not have to travel the length of the show hall to carry cats to be judged. With the distance to the rings shortened, there was less congestion in the aisles. The longhair people were happy since their cats were not benched under a heating vent, etc., and the shorthair people were happy since their cats were near the heat and were not in the middle of a cloud of powder. The show ran very smoothly.

Another arrangement which I enjoyed very much was a show which had a "no smoking" section. Option was given at time of entry.

One show attempted to have one way aisles but needed better signs and more "traffic directors" to make it work. The idea has merit especially for those halls whose size dictate narrow aisles.

The things which I heard most complaints about were:

- Siamese, Rex, etc. benched in front of doors or other drafts;
- One or two shorthairs benched in an aisle otherwise occupied by longhairs (grooming tables and great clouds of grooming powder);
- Cats benched "miles" away from the rings, especially shorthairs being at the far end of a row filled with grooming tables;
- Rows which end at a wall leaving only one way in or out;
- Deodorant dispensers hung on exhibition cages!

Perhaps some readers may want to discuss these points with their clubs before they bench their next show and try to make exhibiting a bit more comfortable. It never hurts to have a happy exhibitor; he may come back next year.

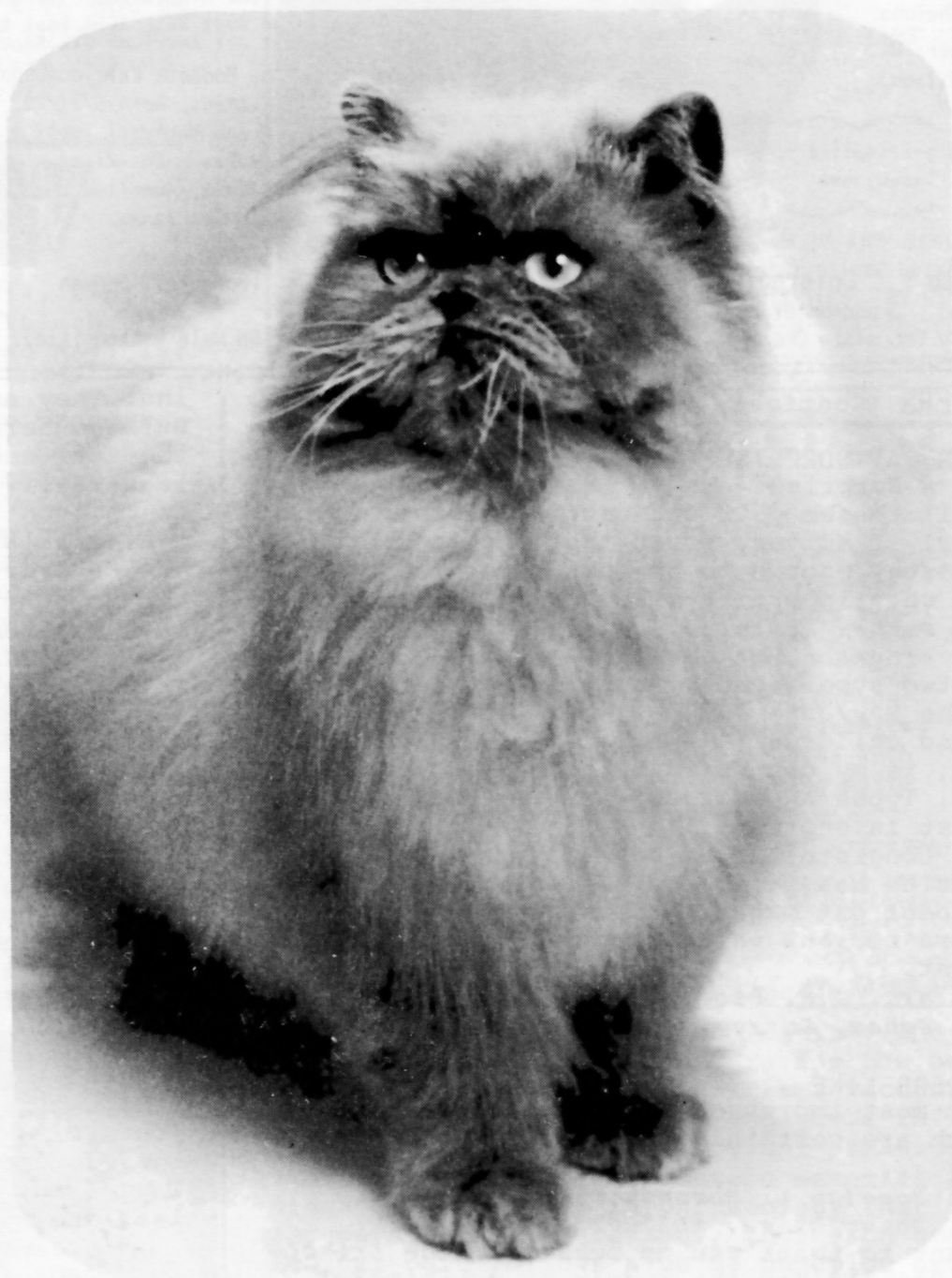

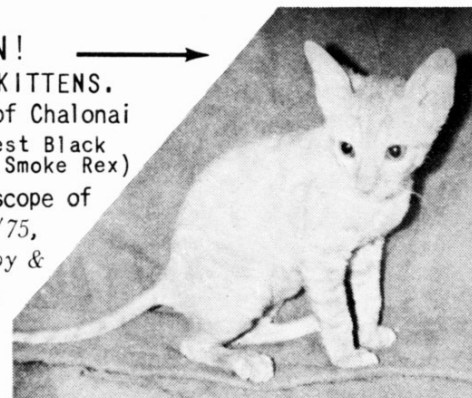

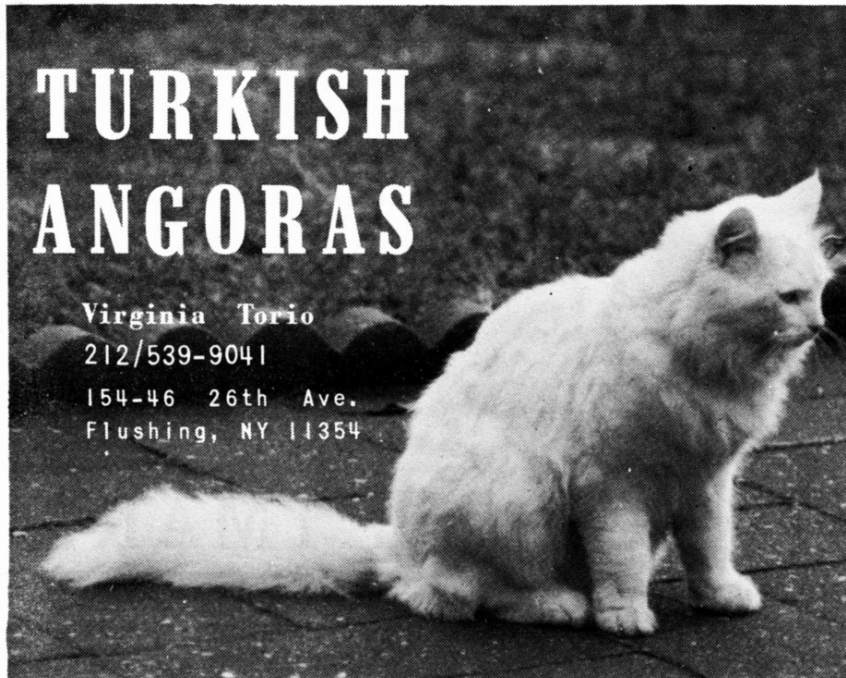
With the aid of this new book, the breeder can learn much about his/her cats' health and well-being. It offers a most unusual concept and fills a definite need.

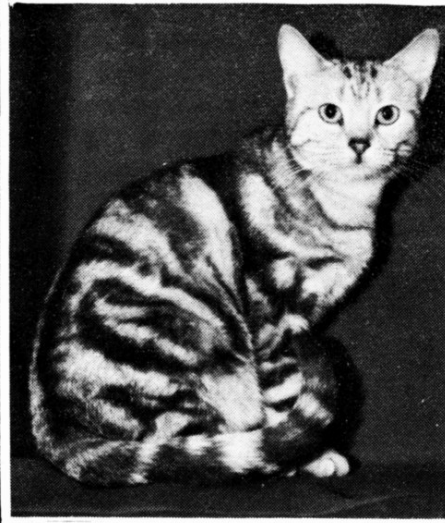

giving a cat a physical examination. The book goes on to explain how to care for the healthy cat with preventive medicine, vaccination, training, nutrition, etc., and gives information about internal and external parasites.

The next 84 pages contain material about diagnostic medicine in phraseology that the lay person can understand. Advice on home medical care follows plus 30 pages on breeding and reproduction. The book concludes with tips on choosing a vet.

Dr. McGinnis called on a fellow vet, Tom Reed, for the multitude of helpful diagrams used throughout the book, and used cross-referencing freely to enable her readers to find all information given on a particular topic.

In writing THE WELL CAT BOOK, it appears that the author expected it to be read by the average cat owner. It is this reviewer's opinion that such a complex book will be most

College Of Cat Genetics

STUDY UNIT 13

In last issue's Study Unit it was shown that a cat can have a single or double dose (gene) for a characteristic at one locus while at the same time owning a single or double dose for another characteristic at another locus. The fact that the combination of genes at different loci can, under certain circumstances, result in "interaction effects" was also described. A cat with dissimilar genes at one or more loci is known as hybrid and is said to be heterozygous. The cat with dissimilar genes at one locus is monohybrid; the cat with dissimilar genes at two loci is dihybrid (sometimes described as the double heterozygote); the cat with dissimilar genes at three loci is trihybrid; the cat with dissimilar genes at four loci is tetrahybrid and so on. A general term for a cat known to be heterozygous at a number of loci is polyhybrid.

Thus the F^1 cats used to reconstruct Mendel's experiments in earlier Study Units were monohybrid, dihybrid and trihybrid respectively.

All characteristics which may be altered by a single gene are called monogenic. Therefore consideration again of Mendel's experiments shows that the three characteristics concerned in the reconstructions demonstrated, blue dilution, Cornish Rex and piebald white spotting (when the extent and allocation of spotting is not considered) are monogenic.

BREED CHARACTERISTICS

Most characteristics defining breeds of cats are monogenic, other than in respect of build and shape. For example, the Red Persian is genetically similar to the Cream Persian

other than in respect of a double dose of dilution at the dilution locus. Considering the Persian breeds in general, the differences between most of them can be accounted for by the presence or absence of monogenic characteristics. The Black is the cat with two genes for the non agouti mutant--place even one of the mutant genes with normal agouti and the cat becomes Brown Tabby. The Blue is the Black cat with two genes for the dilution mutant; the Red is the Black with the addition of sex-linked orange; the Cream, as already described, is the Red cat with two genes for dilution and so on.

Any breeder concerned with monogenic characteristics within a breed category may undertake matings with a view to the production of different colours and patterns.

It must be remembered that a dominant characteristic cannot be "carried" and that no characteristic known to be fully dominant can be produced by a pair of cats if the dominant characteristic is not shown in the phenotype of at least one of the partners. Thus, no Siamese bred from a Chestnut Brown can produce more fully coloured cats unless mated to a non Siamese partner, no Seal Point Siamese bred from a Tabby Point Siamese can produce more Tabby Point Siamese unless bred to a Tabby Point partner; no Black Persian bred from a White Persian can produce more White Persians unless bred to a White Persian partner, and so on.

It should also be remembered that whereas two cats owning dominant characteristics may continue to breed those with recessives if mated like to like, two cats with recessive characteristics will only produce recessive progeny under those circumstances. Thus two Chestnut Browns may breed Siamese, two Tabby Point Siamese may breed Seal Points, and two White Persians may breed Blacks.

It is possible to produce cats with dominant characteristics that are true breeding. This is the case in the Abyssinian breed where most cats are homozygous for the dominant

to the Committee person to the Ring Clerk who then says little except "Clean the cages", the steward, no matter how willing, is handicapped from the outset of the show. No matter who is selected to instruct the stewards, instructions relative to the following are necessary for smooth conduct of the ring and relative harmony among the many cats passing through:

- (1) Clean the cages when and where indicated by the Clerk;
- (2) At least one steward must stay in the ring even when the cages are full;
- (3) "Dust" the cages with the spray bottle, do not drown them;
- (4) Make sure that cages are dry after cleaning;
- (5) When cats wet the cages, clean them twice and do them well;
- (6) When cleaning is finished, sniff the cage ---is it clean?
- (7) Clean and dry under the dividers as well as on the table;
- (8) Behave yourself!

Everyone is part of the successful show.

This means that when the judge wants to move along or catch-up cats, the clerk grabs a bottle and goes to work setting a pace for the stewards! It also means that when the stewards are not doing well, the clerk might direct one to spray and the other one to dry, moving along in tandem. It also means that the Show Committee watches the ring, the steward and the clerk. We could not discuss the steward without the clerk and club, as successful stewarding depends upon the inter-relationship of the three, as do many other show phases.###

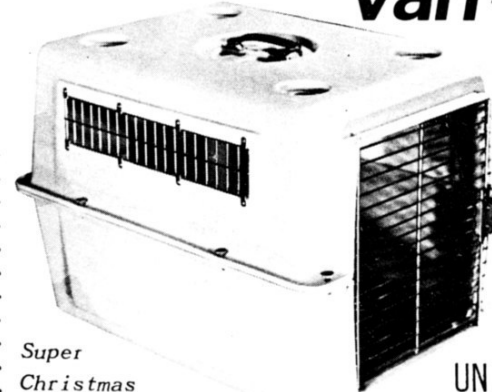

THE PSYCHOLOGY OF STEWARDING

Stewarding is "keeping things clean". Many a Successful Person of Today learned his/her disciplines at a much younger age while stewarding (or "bussing") during summer vacation! Without the steward, dirty dishes would litter restaurant tables, debris would fill hotel lobbies and untended glasses and ashtrays would render your favorite Cocktail Lounge unsuitable.



Without proper stewarding at the cat show, some of the following may occur:

- (1) Exhibitors become annoyed watching stewards flit back and forth behind the cages like ducks in a shooting gallery;
- (2) Cats are distracted by stewards poking fingers at them when they should be posing for the judge;
- (3) Howls and growls are heard throughout the showroom due to cats being upset from

- smells in dirty cages;
- (4) Sometimes cats in the judging cages square-off at one another around the partition, due to the dirty smells;
- (5) Occasionally cats are doused by disinfectant from a steward shooting his squirt bottle at another steward. Cats can have eyes injured by the fluid, or become ill after licking it off their coat. Disinfectant is intended for use in cleaning cages and should be wiped up;
- (6) Longhair breeders retrieve their cats with sloppy coats from having been in a wet cage. We have even seen stewards from one ring walk through another ring and squirt their bottles into a dry cage to tease the stewards there;
- (7) Judging is delayed by the needless upset of cats being handled due to dirty cages and smells;
- (8) Some of the exhibitors who are sympathetic about their cats will not be back next year!

Proper stewarding at the show begins with the Club and Show Committee. If the club members can work together in harmony, each of them sitting in a ring watching their own cats will be ready to police the stewards if mischief is observed, just as they will be ready to answer questions and solve showroom problems that arise in their vicinity; in this respect, the Club and its members either rate a bouquet or a brickbat. Beyond the Club members, there are ring clerks who are responsible for the smooth operation of the ring, which includes the stewards, as well as the wandering public and the exhibitor who waits for the third call.

Steward problems can be solved by first choosing desirable stewards. This author recommends 4-H'ers (in uniform) as the best choice. The 4-H'ers are attuned to animals in general, if not cats in particular, and their active programs are often in need of funds. Other forms of Scout organizations can be employed, in the author's opinion, only if they are accompanied by a genuine older 'leader' who is willing to supervise between the Club and the stewards and not 'turn the kids loose' to horseplay at the expense of the cats' and exhibitors' nerves.

In this author's opinion, children of exhibitors are either the *best* stewards or the *worst*. Some youngsters are desirous of being 'a part of things' at the show and will do a first-rate job for a little courtesy at lunch time and something for the allowance. Some youngsters are unruly as the very devil and seem to be wished-off on to the Show Committee by unsupervising parents who should have left the obnoxious little clown at home in the first place.

Steward problems can further be solved by proper instructions. If the instruction: "Do what they tell you" goes from the parent

JMFRC TO OPEN JANUARY 1, 1976

JMFRC-1: ACETAMINOPHEN TOXICOSIS IN THE CAT

D. R. Finco et al. JAVMA, Vol. 166, March 1, 1975, No. 5, pp. 469-472.

Acetaminophen, which is available without prescription, was administered to two adult Burmese cats by their owner. Both cats became extremely ill and one died. Destruction of red blood cells by the drug resulted in anemia, hemoglobin in the urine and jaundice. Jaundice resulted from death of liver cells as well as from destruction of red blood cells.

The cats became acutely ill within four hours after being given one 325 mg. (5 grain) tablet of acetaminophen. Acetaminophen produces more severe illness and is more likely to be fatal than equivalent doses of salicylates.

The JMFRC advises breeders not to use acetaminophen, phenacetin or aspirin to medicate cats unless specifically advised to do so by their veterinarian. Acetaminophen can be readily purchased over the counter in pharmacies under a variety of trade names.

Acetaminophen is used as an aspirin substitute and labels of such products should be carefully read for content in either liquid or tablet form. Cats accidentally given such drugs should receive veterinary care immediately. Hospitalization is normally required.

JMFRC-2: EXPERIMENTALLY INDUCED FELINE CALICIVIRUS INFECTION: CLINICAL SIGNS AND LESIONS.

Edward A. Hoover, D.V.M., Ph.D., and Donald E. Kahn, D.V.M., Ph.D. Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association, Vol. 166, March 1, 1975, No. 5, p. 463-468.

Doctors Hoover and Kahn studied the effects of ten feline calicivirus isolates on 66 specific pathogen free cats. The feline caliciviruses used to infect the cats were of different orders of virulence. Hence the most virulent FCV caused fever, loss of appetite, depression and shortness of breath. Less virulent FCV produced little clinical illness. Common to the viral infection, regardless of its degree of virulence, were ulcers of the tongue, hard palate and nose. Occasional sneezing occurred but infected cats did not exhibit discharge from the nose or eyes.

Clinical signs and lesions produced by Feline Calicivirus infection are: depression, fever, sneezing, coughing, ulcers of the tongue or palate, ulcers of the nostrils and pneumonia.

Rhinitis, conjunctivitis and tracheitis are less common.

The authors point out that clinical differentiation of feline calicivirus infection and feline viral rhinotracheitis can be made by the presence of typical ulcers or vesicles in the mouth. Such ulcerations of the tongue, palate and nose are characteristic of FCV. They occur only occasionally in severe rhinotracheitis. Thus, two major and relatively common feline viral respiratory infections can be distinguished clinically.

BREEDERS' REFERENCE CARDS

One important service for breeders offered by the JANE MARTINKE FELINE REFERENCE CENTER is the abstracting of veterinary medical reports and case histories. These abstracts will be included in the *MERCURY* on convenient clip-out cards for breeders' personal card-index files.

The first five cards are included here and should be removed from the magazine by cutting along the broken lines. Breeders will have their own preferences for a filing system for the cards to suit their individual needs, but these suggestions might be helpful.

Dividers bearing the names of abstract sections may be placed in a card file box.

Examples would be: *Congenital diseases; General infectious diseases; Respiratory diseases; Neoplastic; Nutrition; Genetics; Genitourinary tract diseases; Drug toxicity, etc.* The reference cards may be filed in their appropriate section either alphabetically by title of abstract, or numerically by number of abstract. A list of abstract titles will be published annually to serve as an index.

The purpose of this particular service of the JANE MARTINKE FELINE REFERENCE CENTER is to alert breeders to current research as well as common problems in cats. It is also probable that the information will be of interest to breeders' veterinarians.

References to further reading on the subject of the abstracts will often be given. These journals might be located in main public libraries, University libraries, or, sometimes, at your vet's office.

JMFR-3: CYSTITIS IN THE FEMALE CAT: THERAPY AND PROPHYLAXIS

R. A. Taussig, Feline Practice, Vol. 5, No. 3, May-June, 1975, pp. 52-54.

The author studied 65 female cats during a 3-year period at the College of Veterinary Medicine at Kansas State University. During that time, 235 male cats also presented with the feline urological syndrome, and the incidence and seasonal occurrence of the disease in both sexes were quite similar.

Each of the female cats was examined, and urinalysis revealed the presence of protein and blood. Eighty-two per cent of the specimens contained struvite crystals. Bacterial infections were noted in only two specimens.

The author states that during the final year of study the cats were placed on high quality moist cat food with salt added. Fresh water was available at all times. Bladder cauterization and instillation of iodine are drastic and risky procedures not advocated by the author. Acidifying drugs should be used only when the cat's urine is consistently alkaline and antibiotics are of value only when a bacterial infection is present.

JMFR-4: EVALUATION OF A FELINE VIRAL RHINOTRACHEITIS VACCINE

F. W. Scott, Feline Practice, Vol. 5, No. 1, Jan.-Feb., 1975, pp. 17-22.

Rhinotracheitis, caused by a herpesvirus, causes 40% of feline upper respiratory disease. Dr. Scott evaluated the modified live virus vaccine from the point of view of efficiency and safety.

Fifty cats took part in the study and they were divided into five groups. The cats were vaccinated according to various schedules to determine the optimum times for vaccination. The cats were challenged with virulent feline viral rhinotracheitis six weeks after vaccination. Unvaccinated control cats were also challenged with active virus.

Three of the ten control (unvaccinated) cats developed illness from the sixth to eighth day following administration of the virus. 35 of the 40 protected cats did not become ill. Those that did become ill had mild symptoms.

Dr. Scott determined that the vaccine virus does not spread to other cats that have not been immunized and that two injections provide the greatest protection. The second injection should be given at least 28 days after the initial one.

JMFR-5: NUTRITIONAL PROBLEMS OF HOUSEHOLD CATS

S. Gershoff, JAVMA, Vol. 166, No. 5, March 1, 1975, pp. 455-457.

Dr. Gershoff states that it is impossible to separate the nutritional needs of household cats from those established in catteries and laboratories of nutritional research institutions. He takes to task the advice given in "Consumer Reports", 1972, that owners should wait out cats that refuse to eat particular foods. To follow such advice, Dr. Gershoff says, will result in many cats either sick or dead.

The information that has been accumulated in regard to cats' nutritional requirements are presented in a bulletin of the National Research Council. Although it is generally recognized that cats require high protein diets, Dr. Gershoff questions the need for 30% to 40% since Greaves has indicated that cats actually utilize only 50% of the protein provided in high quality diets.

There has been concern about the quantity of bone ash in some canned foods. A number of these commercially available foods contained 30% bone ash on a dry weight basis and were of so low calorie value that kittens fed such foods died of starvation in spite of full stomachs.

Dr. Gershoff points out that the great excitement in British circles over dry food and the feline urological syndrome is a situation open to skepticism.

JMFRC-4: EVALUATION OF A FELINE VIRAL RHINOTRACHEITIS VACCINEJMFRC-5: NUTRITIONAL PROBLEMS OF HOUSEHOLD CATS (Continued)

The author discusses the relationship of certain diseases to vitamin deficiencies and points out that nutritionally deprived cats succumb to other diseases which they would not have contracted if they had been well fed.

Introduction

The cat fancy in New Zealand, like its counterpart in the United Kingdom, operates under the rules of only one governing body. President of New Zealand Cat Fancy, Inc. is John X. Jones, Auckland; National Secretary is Mrs. B. Wiseman, Lower Hutt.

During the 1974 show season, 24 shows were conducted. The first one was the Auckland Kitten Show on March 2 and the last was the Dominion Shorthair Kitten show on November 23.

To win a Championship in New Zealand, a cat must be awarded a total of three Challenge Certificates which may be earned for first-place wins in Open classes for the particular breed. As the Open classes are judged but once at each show, it takes a minimum of three shows before a cat can even hope to complete title requirements.

81 felines won Championships this past show season: 31 Longhairs (including two Colourpoints (Himalayans)); 26 Siamese (led by ten Chocolate Points); 11 Burmese; 5 Abyssinians; 4 Havanas; 3 Cornish Rex; and one Russian Blue. 47 females and 34 males are among them.

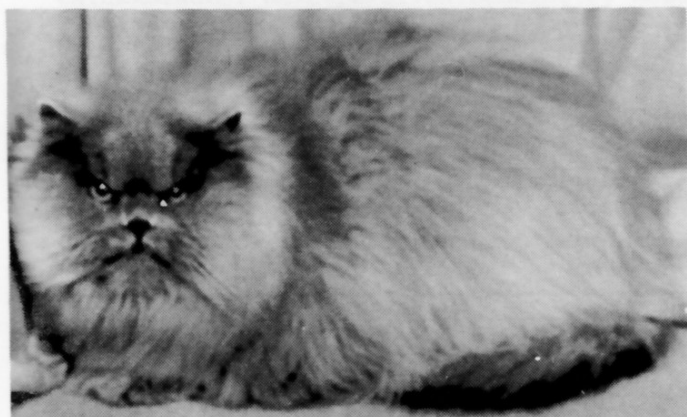

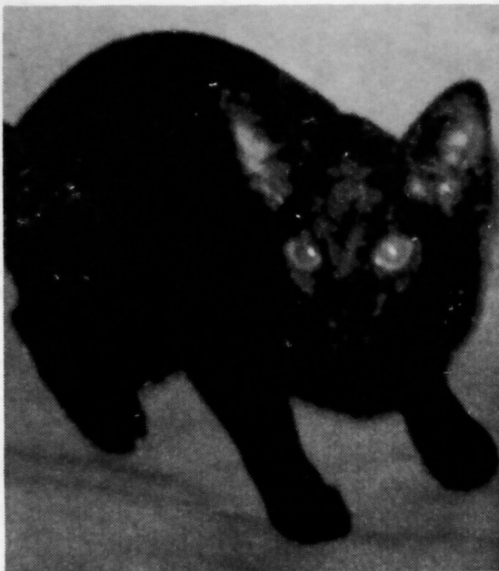

4 . . . Show Your Kitten (Part II)

JUDGING BEGINS

When the show begins, the judges are introduced, the exhibitors are welcomed, and then the numbers of the cats required in each ring are announced over a loud-speaker system. The numbers are called three times and if the cat is not brought to the judging ring at the third call it is marked absent. Don't let this happen to you! Remember your kitten's number - write it on the front of your catalog (also on the back of your hand if it will help!)

You will notice that each judge has his own 'ring'. This consists of at least nine cages and a table for the judge and clerks. Each judge works independently in his own

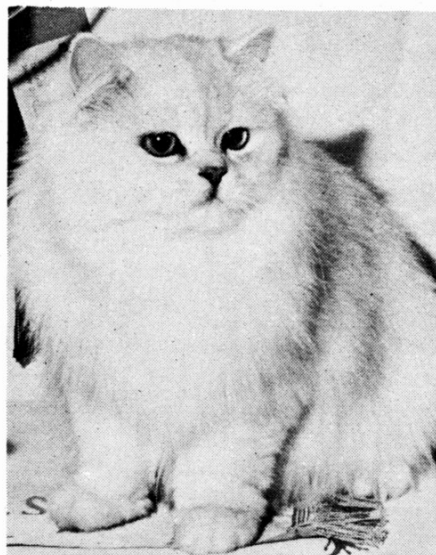
ring and is assisted by clerks and stewards. A clerk will post numbers on the cages for the cats about to be called, will supervise the cleaning of the cages after each class has been judged, will keep all records, mark the awards in the show catalog, and generally act as chief assistant to the judge. (See: "CFA Clerking Program" by P. & W. Friend, Mercury section, CAT WORLD, Jan./Feb. 1975). The stewards perform the very essential service of keeping the cages clean and deodorized.

Let us say, just as an example, that you have entered a Blue Persian female kitten and her catalog number is 12. You will see that the White Persian kittens are judged before the Blues, so your kitten's number will be called very soon after the start of the Long-haired Kitten judging. You will want to give her a last-minute grooming before you take her to the judging ring. Make sure her eyes are clean, that there is no powder in her coat, that she is well combed and looking her very best.

Number 12 is called!! Carry her gently but firmly to the ring and place her in the cage marked number 12. Some judging cages have front and back doors and, if so, are

usually placed so that the cat may be put in the back door. However, if there is only a front door, put the kitten in quietly, close the door firmly, leave the ring and sit in the area at the front of the judge and watch the procedure.

The judge will take each kitten, one at a time, from the cage and place her on the table. He will examine bone structure, coat texture and color, length of tail, etc., and see how closely each entry conforms to

the official standard of excellence set for that breed. The only information the judge has on each entry is the number, age, breed, color-class and sex. He does not know the cat's name nor the owner's name and will not have access to a catalog until after the completion of all judging. Incidentally, there must be no identifying marks on your kitten: she must not wear a collar, ribbon or such, as this would disqualify her.

After the judge has handled all the Blue Persian female kittens, he will choose the three best and will hang ribbons on the front of the cage: *blue* for first place, *red* for second, and *yellow* for third. He marks these awards in his judge's book and the clerk records them in the show catalog.

The male kittens of each color are always judged first (Women's Lib, anyone?) so the Blue Persian male kittens will already have been judged before your kitten and the ribbons placed. The best of the male and female Blue Persian kittens will then be chosen and awarded a black "Best of Color" ribbon. The judge will then award the white "Second Best of Color" to his second choice.

You will notice that the judge disinfects his hands and the table after handling each kitten. This is to prevent the possible spread of infection and it also deodorizes.

When all the kittens in the ring have been judged, the clerk will announce that they may be taken back. Collect your kitten,

take your ribbon(s) and return the kitten to her exhibitor cage. Do not talk to the judge before, during or after the judging unless the judge requests it for any reason. Display your ribbon on the front of the cage and then carefully watch the other judging rings in case your kitten is called.

Hopefully your kitten won a first and Best of Color and, if she is really good, may be called back to the first judge's ring for the "Finals" at the completion of all the kitten judging

The top 5 kittens will be chosen in a Longhair Specialty or a Shorthair Specialty show. A Longhair Specialty show is one in which only Longhairs compete; a Shorthair Specialty is for Shorthairs only; in these shows the LH and SH kittens do not compete against each other. However, in an All Breed show, as the name implies, all the Longhairs and Shorthairs do compete together for final wins. Not only will the judge pick the top 5 kittens in an All Breed show, but will also honor the Best and 2nd Best Longhaired kittens and Best and 2nd Best Shorthaired kittens, with each finalist receiving a rosette and, possibly, a trophy, too. There is a

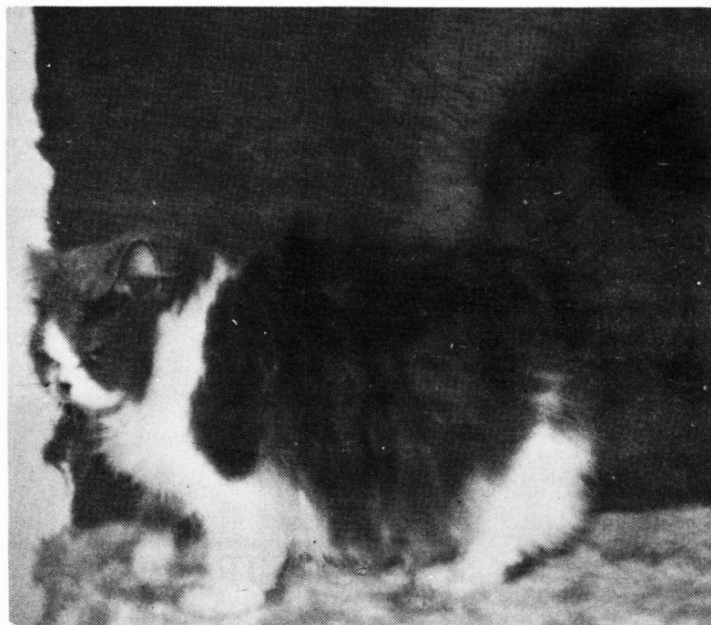
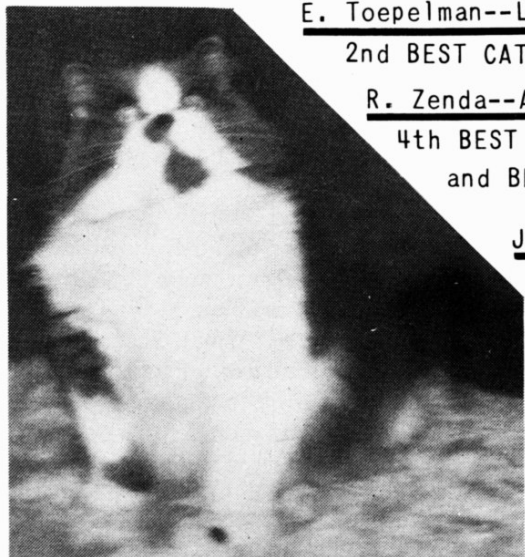

section in the catalog where you can mark the numbers of the winning kittens.

Sometimes, if there is an especially large number of excellent kittens, the judge will call back more than the top 5 and then eliminate some. This practice is referred to by many exhibitors as "tie-breaking" and it is generally regarded as an honor even to be considered for the finals. So, do not be disappointed if, after a second call back to the ring, your kitten does not place in the top 5.

It is a common mistake for newcomers to think that their kitten must have won a blue ribbon and a Best of Color award to be able to place in the finals. This is not so. A red ribbon winner, or even on rare occasions a yellow ribbon winner, can place in the top 5. The mechanics of show finals can be very complicated and will be explained in a future column. For now, just be sure that you wait until all the finals are over to see if your kitten is called. If you must leave the show-room, have someone watch your kitten and listen for her number.

For a one-day show, there will probably be little or no lunch-break and it is better to take a sandwich with you than to go out to lunch and miss part of the judging. Some shows have a refreshment stand which is great for the exhibitors; others offer no food facilities so it is as well to go prepared with a simple snack of some kind.

If you are attending a two-day show, you should plan to arrive back the second day with your kitten at least half-an-hour before the advertised or announced time of judging. This will give you time to tidy up the cage, change the water, groom the kitten and be all set for the second day. Adult cats are required to stay until the completion of all judging, but kittens may be removed from the show-room at the completion of the Kitten finals. If you decide to leave with your kitten while the show is still in progress, place her in her carrier, remove the drapes, litter pan, water-dish, etc., and pack them quietly - do not disturb your neighbours. Leave your cage area tidy and remove all garbage.

SHOW-ROOM ETIQUETTE

There are some unwritten rules for show-room etiquette that exhibitors are expected to observe and this may be a good time to mention them:

1. NEVER touch another exhibitor's cat without the express permission of the owner.
2. Be a good loser and congratulate the winner - or be a gracious winner yourself.
3. After grooming your cat, do not leave hair, cotton swabs, etc., around. Put them in the garbage container.
4. If you use your own grooming table, do not block the aisle. Keep it close to your cage or in the designated area.
5. When spectators stop to look at your cat, answer the questions politely. Help to

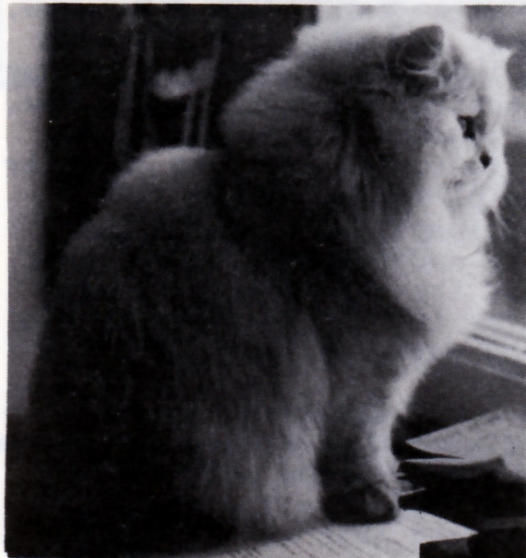
spread knowledge of cats and cat-care to those who have paid to come and see the show.

6. Keep the area around your cage tidy and, at the end of the day, empty the litter pan in the garbage container provided. Also, at the end of the show, clean out everything from the cage; it is a big help for the tired show committee who must clean up the show-room.

AT THE MOTEL

Many hotels and motels welcome cat fanciers and some even offer special rates. However, there are others who do not allow cats, having had bad experiences with thoughtless exhibitors who have spilled litter on the floors and allowed male cats to spray in the rooms. Please, do take supplies to the motel with you. Put down newspaper, preferably in

the bathroom, and place your cat's litter-pan, food and water there. If your cat is a whole male and likely to spray, take a collapsible cage with you if you are driving, or confine him to the bathroom where it is easy to clean up.

Take spray-deodorants and cleaning materials so that you can leave the room as clean as you found it. Most motels will hold owners responsible for any damage. Wrap all garbage and put in a plastic bag. Consider your neighbours and don't leave a howling cat in the room. A little thoughtfulness will help make cat fanciers welcome everywhere!

Before you let your cat out of the carrier, carefully check the room for any open windows or vents, also for broken window screens.

ant Abyssinian tabby pattern and so, even if bred to the more recessive striped or blotched tabby pattern cats would produce F¹ progeny with Abyssinian tabby phenotype. Methods by which the homozygote for dominant characteristics may be produced and proved will be explained in detail in a later Study Unit.

BREED CLASSIFICATIONS

The cat breeds, being generally divided into classifications according to shape and build known as 'type' are subdivided into classifications of colour and pattern, which, in most cases, are inherited as monogenic characteristics. As well as the sub-classifications for colour and pattern there are also those for coat quality (short, long, upstanding, flat lying, rexed, etc.) Not all coat colours and patterns are found in conjunction with all coat qualities and not all coat qualities, colours and patterns found in conjunction with all categories of type. Thus, in the cat fancy, although Abyssinian tabby pattern is well known in conjunction with foreign type and short hair, it is not normally seen in conjunction with Persian type and long hair (although this would be an ad-

vantage in the breeding of red selfs).

Any one breed represents a particular combination of characteristics from each category. If the Blue Persian is analysed genetically it can be said to represent a combination of two genes for recessive dilution with two recessive non-agouti, and two genes for recessive long hair, together with millions of genes with additive effects producing the required Persian type. It also has one or two normal genes at the locus otherwise giving chocolate brown. The characteristics of type are described generally as polygenic since they are produced by the additive effects of a large number of genes each with small effect. Just as it is said that "the last straw broke the camel's back", so can it be said that "the last gene produced the Persian type". Although there are certain monogenic characteristics affecting type, seen for example, in the absence of tail when the Manx gene is present, the general characteristics of shape and build are inherited in the manner described.

The cat breeder has a number of considerations to bear in mind when arranging programmes of matings.###

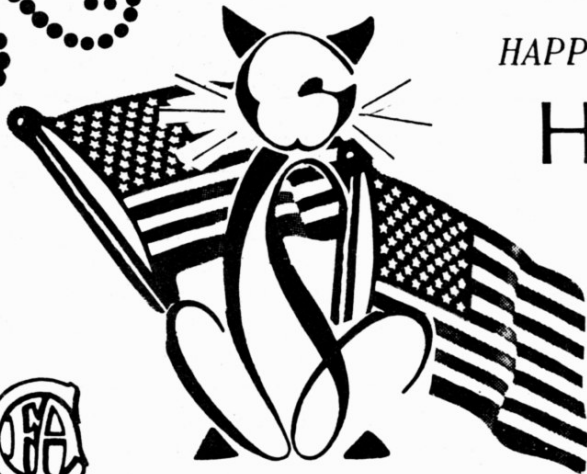

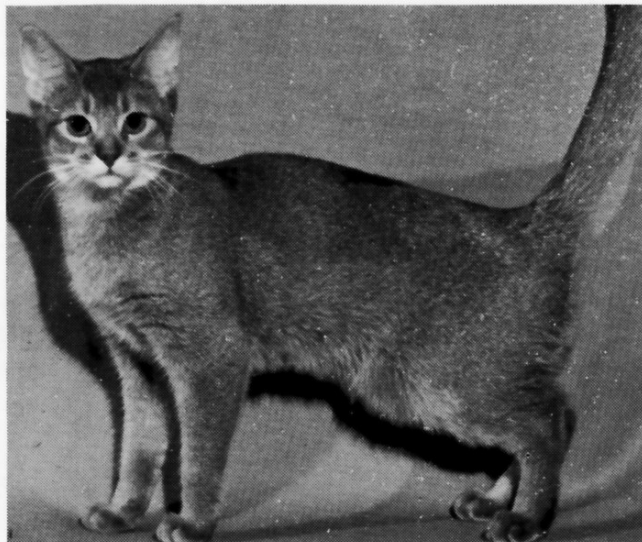
