The LYNX POINT SIAMESE

Cats may be beautiful or graceful or handsome and some are truly elegant. I reserve the term for the Lynx Point and a favorite brown breed. The Lynx Point has been around since 1902 while the Burmese appeared much later. The difference in the immediate appeal, or lack of it, has a great deal to do with snobbery. Because the Burmese was something totally different to American breeders in 1930, it caught on; on the other hand, the tabby-point hybrid, which first appeared in England

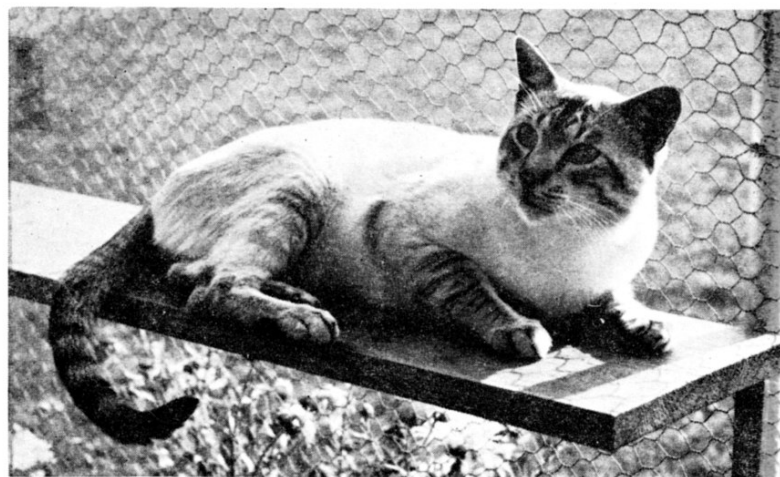

and later in Scotland, was a behind-the-garden wall, mismated and misbegat cat whose illegitimacy was clearly advertised on face, tail and feet. It was not until 1961 that breeders cast aside their fancy ideas of what is Siamese and saw the cat.

Marjorie Hudson wrote "such exquisite little creatures with cobweb-brushed faces, upstanding striped tails and glorious sapphire eyes". She was smitten by Miss Eileen Alexander's kittens. Miss Alexander's Seal Point Siamese *LADY ME* kept a rendezvous with a friend in the neighborhood and, upon her return, was bred to a more suitable consort, a Seal Point named *DRUID*. One Lynx Point kitten, a female named *PATTI*, was born: at maturity *PATTI* was crossed to Mrs. M. Buttery's Seal Point, *SAMSARA SARACEN*. The sire of the initial litter had also been of Mrs. Buttery's stock. *SARACEN* and *PATTI*'s litter included four Lynx Point kittens. These kittens and their progeny went to other breeders. Mrs. Hudson acquired a male that she named *FAUX PAS*, and the late Mrs. G. Hindley obtained a female named *TANSY*. Unfortunately, *LADY LYNX* a female acquired by Mrs. Hudson, was killed; but *FAUX PAS*, the first Lynx Point stud, sired kittens.

From 1961 the pattern variety of Siamese has increased in popularity and they are really "show stoppers". Many more are seen in England than in the United States. As expected, registration bodies were thrown into a "tizzy". How and where does one register an intentioned hybrid and should it be called Siamese? The British decided to call them Tabby-points, while Americans felt that Lynx Point was more glamorous. By any name, this Siamese smells as sweet and looks even better.

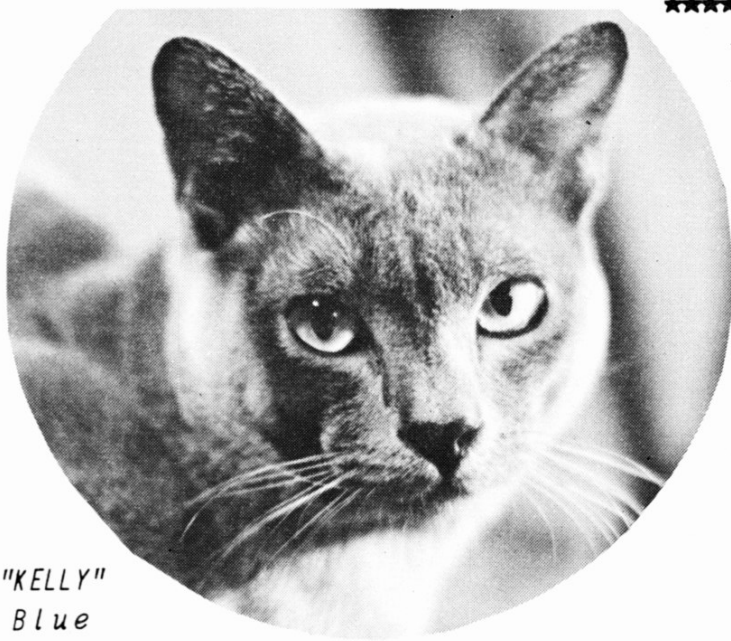

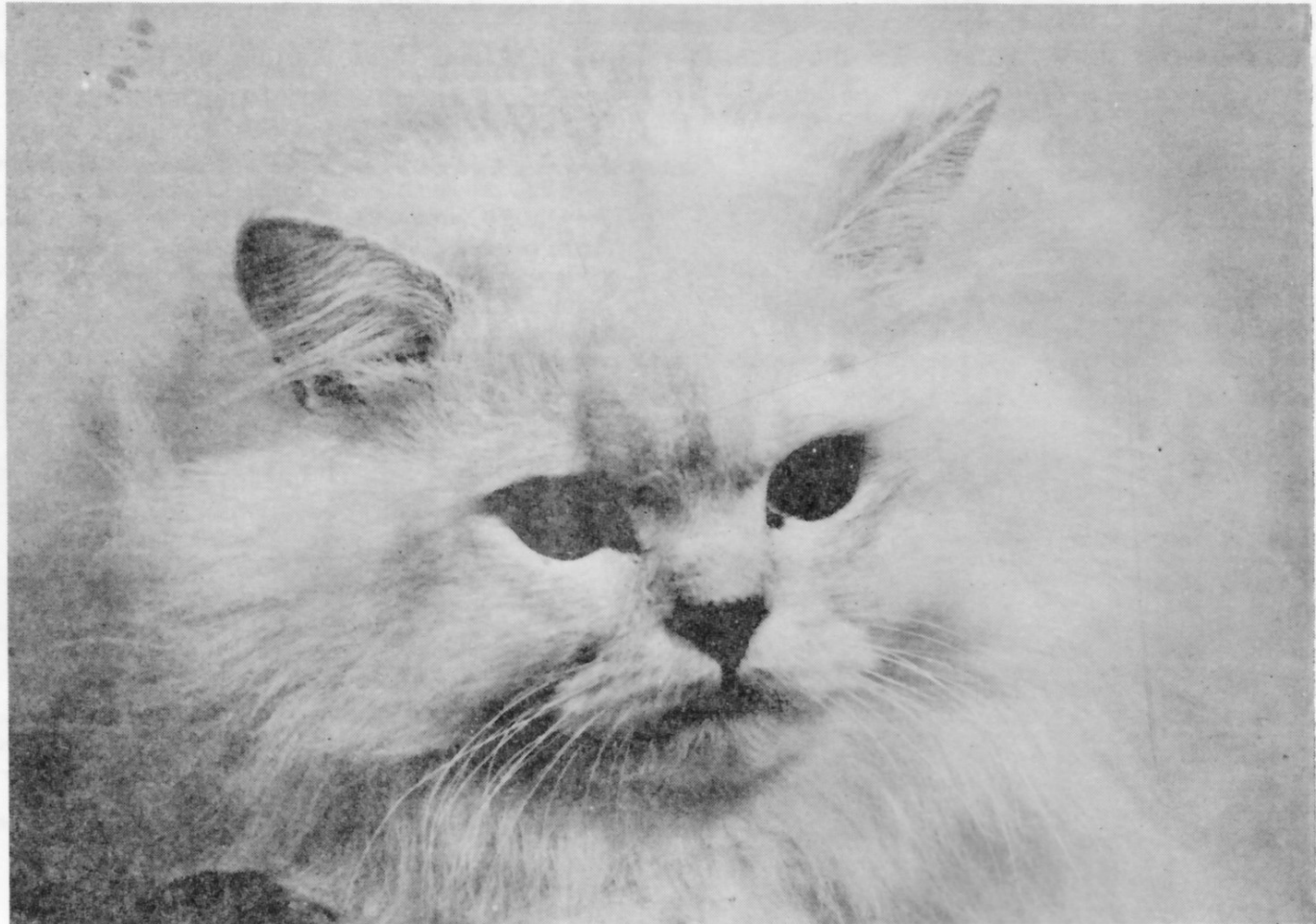

1975 BRITISH CAT WORLD AWARDS

A new dimension was added to the cat fancy in the United Kingdom during the 1974/'75 show season which saw the inauguration of the annual *BRITISH CAT WORLD AWARDS*, a program established to bring international recognition to Britain's top felines, their owners and breeders. It is appropriate that the elegant 1975 award winners be presented to the world in conjunction with this third annual salute to the *Great Cats of Great Britain*.

It is a splendid achievement for a cat to merit a *BRITISH CAT WORLD AWARD* because competition is stiff. Every adult cat (unless neutered) is automatically scored each time he/she competes in the Open Class at a GCCF Championship show anywhere in the United Kingdom. The program is sponsored by this magazine and no charge is made to exhibitors or clubs for scoring, etc.

Mr. John Mais of Eastbourne, Sussex, is BCWA Honorary Scorer. It is his diligence and dedication to all the paperwork and

record-keeping involved in the scoring which has made the new awards program a reality.

To earn their places on the "Roll of Honor", each winning cat earned more BCWA points than any other cat of the same GCCF breed number during the season. The "Award of Excellence" winners are the five highest-scoring cats in each of four divisions: Long-Hair, British Short-Hair (including Manx), Foreign Short-Hair and Siamese. The "Supreme Cat" is the one who gained the most points.

Miss Woodger, another charming personality, a Judge and excellent Veterinary Surgeon.

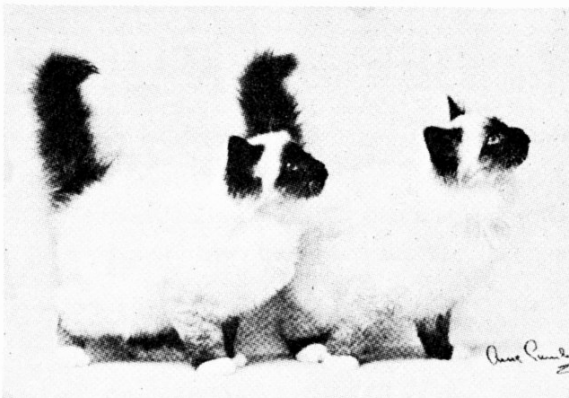

5 . . . Show Your Cat As A Novice

Now that your kitten has reached the age of 8 calendar months, at her next show she will be entered in the Championship category. For show purposes, she is considered an adult cat at this age, but must be at least 8 months old on the opening day of the show. For the first adult show, most exhibitors enter their cat in the NOVICE class, but this is not a requisite and, if you prefer, you may put her in the OPEN class. The difference? Well, the Novice class is for registered cats, 8 months or over, that have never won a Winners ribbon in any CFA show. (We are using CFA rules in all our examples in this series.) The Open class is for registered cats, 8 months old or over, except cats that have completed requirements for Championship confirmation. So, your cat is eligible for either class.

COMPLETING THE ENTRY FORM

Assuming you are entering your cat as a Novice, you will find when completing the entry form that the requirements are a little different from when you showed her as a kitten. Firstly, she *must* be registered to be eligible and the Entry Clerk cannot accept any entry in the Championship category without a CFA registration number.

The entry blank must be completed with the exact information that is on the registration certificate, so to be sure it is correct, copy it directly from the certificate. After you have filled in the name, number, date of birth, breed, color, sex, eye color, sire, dam, breeder, owner and phone number, don't forget to sign it.

You will notice that at the bottom of the official entry blank there are 3 columns headed: "Non-Championship", "Championship" and "Premiership". The Non-Championship classes are for Kittens, Household Pets and Provisional Breeds. The Championship classes are the Novice, Open, Champion and Grand Champion. The Premiership classes are for registered altered cats (neuters and spays). So, for your cat, you would check the NOVICE category under the heading "Championship".

At the bottom right-hand corner of the entry form is the heading "Names of Shows". Here is where you write the types of shows in which your cat is entered. For example, if the show has 2 All Breed rings and 2 Specialties, for a shorthaired cat you would put: "2 All Breed, 2 Shorthair Specialties"; for a

longhaired cat you would put: "2 All Breed, 2 Longhair Specialties". If, for any reason, your cat cannot be shown under one of the judges, you would also write in this space: "Cat not entered in Judge John Doe's ring." For example, if the judge is the breeder of your cat, the show rules prohibit him from judging cats of his own breeding.

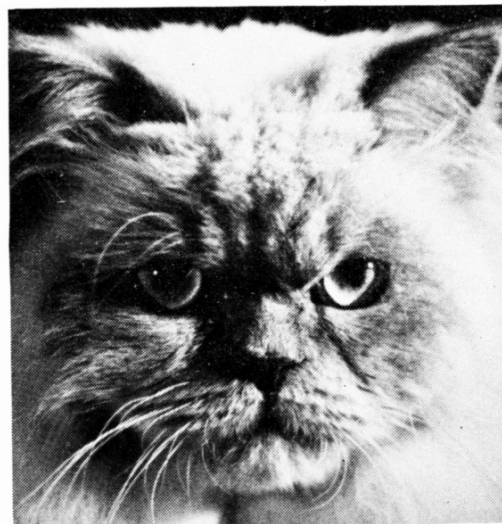
Send off your entry with the required fee and prepare your Novice for the big day. When you get to the show, check the catalog carefully and be sure that the information on your cat is correct in every detail. If there is an error in the spelling of her name or any discrepancy at all, inform the Show Secretary and the Master Clerk at the show and ask them to correct it in the official catalog that will go to the CFA office after the show.

COMPETITION BEGINS

In the last article in this series, we used a Blue Persian female as an example so, this time, we will switch to a shorthair - a Seal Point Siamese female.

As a Novice, your cat will compete with the other female novices in the same color class (that is, Seal Point Siamese female novices) for first, second and third place ribbons. After the Novices, the Seal Point female Open class will be judged and, again, the first, second and third place ribbons are awarded. The cat winning first in the Novice

The governing organisation in Sweden, SVERAK, is affiliated to Federation Internationale Feline (FIFE). SVERAK now contains 19 clubs from different parts of the country, each with about 100 to 400 members. The single member is connected to SVERAK only through his own club. We have a very close cooperation with NRR in Norway and with SUROK in Finland. As no quarantine restriction exists between Sweden, Norway and Finland, everyone is free to take their cats to shows and to stud cats in either country without any problems.

SHOWING in SWEDEN with FIFE

This year, like last, we have 8 shows in Sweden and, together with the shows in Finland and Norway, we have at least 12 good opportunities to show our cats. We have small shows with about 120 cats and big ones with 525 cats as a record, the average being 350 to 400 competing cats. Almost every breed is represented at the shows, the most frequent ones being Siamese and Persian cats which are, of course, separated by different colours. At the show in Gothenburg in November, 1974, there were 115 Siamese out of 500 competing longhaired and shorthaired cats. In Scandinavia, as in all FIFE governed organizations, the Siamese breed contains the four classical Siamese colours as well as the new varieties (known in U.S.A. as Colorpoint Shorthairs) thus forming only one breed. The longhaired Colourpoint is, in the same way, regarded as a Persian cat and not as a specific breed like the Himalayans in U.S.A. The breeds so far not shown in Sweden or in Scandinavia are Balinese, Scottish Fold, Sphynx

and Angora. The latter four breeds are not recognized by FIFE and, therefore, have no standard: except for the Angora, we have none of these cats in Sweden.

The new varieties such as Foreign White, Oriental Shorthairs and the new Burmese colours are shown in very small numbers but they are now growing more popular and their numbers will probably increase at the shows in the future. Foreign Whites, Havanas, all Burmese colours (except the torties), Smoke Shorthairs (but not Chinchilla or other Red Silver SH) are recognized for certificates. The Oriental Shorthairs (except the Maus), the Burmese torties, the Shaded Silver LH and a few others are recognized and have a standard but cannot have certificates yet. It takes time for FIFE to get the recognitions ready and they usually follow Britain's GCCF (Governing Council of the Cat Fancy). First they recognize a breed and give it a standard and, later on, give it certificate rights. For example, the Cream Point Siamese has a standard and can be registered and bred but (as of July, 1975) they cannot have a certificate.

SHOWS LAST TWO DAYS

Our shows are usually two-day events, starting early on a Saturday morning with the vetting in and ending on Sunday about 6 P.M. To enter a show in Sweden a cat must have an FIE inoculation certificate not older than one year and not more recent than fourteen days. The veterinary investigation is very thorough and a cat with the slightest sign of being out of condition is rejected from the show together with all other cats from the same owner. In order to prevent diseases from being spread, we also have regulations which prohibit cats from being shown too often. A lapse of 18 days and, in practice, three weeks, must go between each time the cat is shown.

After the vetting-in, the cats are placed in separate pens decorated with cur-

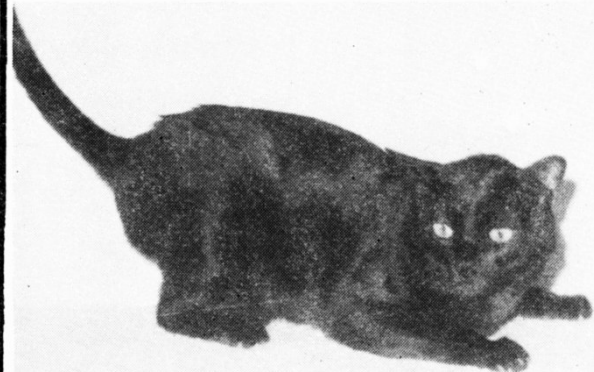

tains in different colours. The cats are not judged in these pens but brought by a steward to the judge. The judging usually takes place in a separate area in the showhall or in a separate room and is performed in front of an audience. The judge is assisted by two or three stewards, who bring the cats of each class one by one to the judging table where they are examined. They are then put into undecorated pens in the judging ring for comparison. Each cat has a number and is totally anonymous to the judge; the owners are not allowed to touch their cats until these are brought back to their own pens but are permitted to watch the judging giving, of course, no indication of ownership.

CAT'S SHOW CAREER

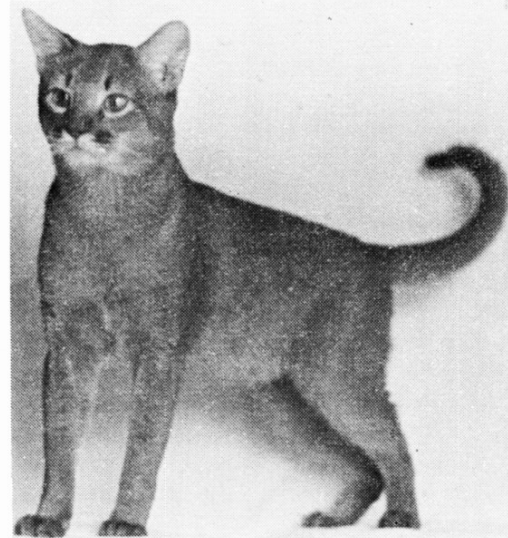
You can start to show your cat in kitten classes from the age of 3 months until it is 10 months old at which time the cat will compete in open adult classes. As in other European countries, to gain the championship status the cat must win three CAC for three different judges at three different shows. 'CAC' stands for Certificat d'Aptitude de Championat.

The next class for the cat is the champion class where the cat can be given a CACIB. When your cat has won three CACIB from at least two different judges at shows in two different countries, you have an International Champion. 'CACIB' stands for Certificat d'Aptitude de Championat Internationale de Beauté. A judge has the right to withhold a certificate when the cat does not score at least 93 points which is minimum for CAC, and 95 points which is minimum for CACIB. Open classes and champion classes are separated by breed, colour and sex. The hitherto highest class to compete in is International Champion class where the reward is first prize; this class is divided only into longhaired and shorthaired cats by sex.

If you want to show an altered cat, there are the same classes to go through. The first one is open class for alters where CAP is given and then premier class where your cat must win CAPIB to become an International Premier. 'CAP' stands for Certificat d'Aptitude de Premier and 'CAPIB' stands for Certificat d'Aptitude de Premier Internationale de Beauté. The rules for gaining the status of premiership and international premiership are the same as those mentioned above.

A CAC is a worthy win, but there is still more for your cat to win at a show. The next thing is to be elected "Best of Colour" and if you have, for example, a Blue Persian cat or a Sealpointed Siamese, the "Best of Colour" is really worth something.

Then the cat is ready for the "Best of Breed" and "Best Cat" elections. There are three titles for longhaired cats to win, namely: Best Longhair, Best Longhair Alter and Best Longhair Kitten; and three titles for shorthaired cats, namely: Best Shorthair,

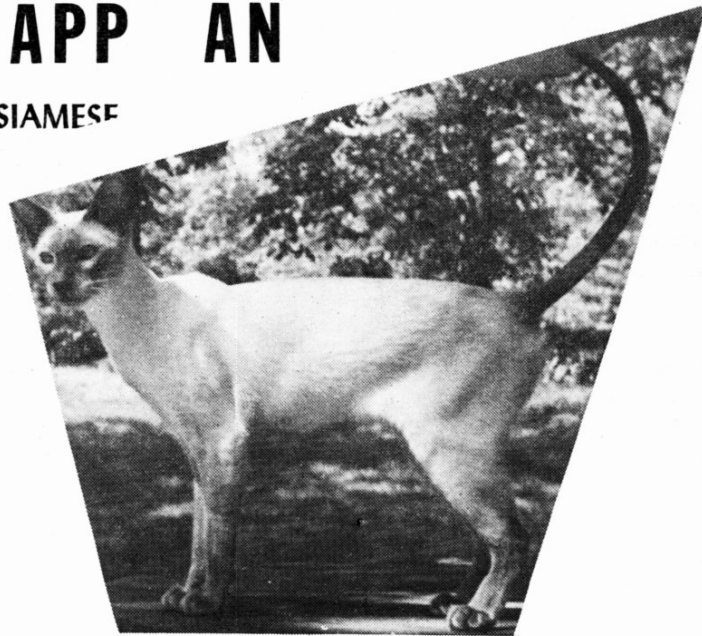

Best Shorthair Alter and Best Shorthair Kitten. We have no "Best Opposite Sex" at our shows. If there is an allround judge at the show, "Best in Show" is chosen between the "Best Longhair" and the "Best Shorthair". Even a kitten can become "Best in Show" as the "Best Longhair" and the "Best Shorthair" titles are not restricted to adult cats. An altered cat cannot, according to the new FIFE rules (1975-01-01) become BIS (or BSH, BLH, BOB or BOC).

We do not have prize money at our shows, but single exhibitors, catteries and clubs can put up presentation prizes and challenge cups. Every cat that has won a certificate is given a conformingly designed rosette and, sometimes, even medals by the arranging club. All "Best" cats will receive special rosettes and for the "Best in Show" there is a laurel wreath.

At the height of the show season in Sweden, we have the presentation of "Cat of the Year". That presentation is usually made at the last show of the year, about the beginning of December. "Cat of the Year" is not elected by judges directly; the winner of this very high award is the one who scores most points during the year, the points being added from the four best shows for each cat. To become "Cat of the Year", a cat needs at least two "Best" titles as these are worth many valuable points. Best In Show, Best SH and Best LH (adult, kitten or alter) are worth 40 points; Second Best 38 points;

CAC(P)IB and CAC(P) counts 35 and 30 respectively. There are also points for second, third and fourth place in different classes. Each defeated cat gives an extra $\frac{1}{2}$ point. "Cat of the Year" in 1974 was INT. PR. SAN-TREE DARK ECHO, an outstanding and very attractive Sealpoint Siamese neuter. He was elected "Best Shorthair Alter" four times out of the five he was shown in 1974.

JUDGES

Each judge at a show can have an apprentice and, if there are many cats in each class, even a ring secretary. As a judge has a limited number of 80 cats to judge, there are usually five judges on duty at our shows.

To become an apprentice, a person must have stewarded at least six times at different shows during at least two years. To go on to become a judge, one must, after the two years of stewarding, act as an apprentice for another two year period, six times for either of the groups of cats, i.e. Longhairs, Siamese including Oriental shorthairs, or the remaining shorthairs. To become an allround judge, a person must act as an apprentice again six times for each of the other groups.

The apprentice must pass through an examination to become a judge. The two examiners must be international judges and they must have judged at least three years. The apprentice must be at least 25 years on the day of the examination. The examination can



AT THE OCTOBER, 1975, BOARD MEETING

A meeting of the CFA Board was held in Morristown, NJ, on October 18 and 19, 1975, with all members present. The following report is from my notes and is neither complete nor official. See the next *CFA QUARTERLY* for the official minutes.

ALL-AMERICAN SCORING

The cost of All American scoring has become extremely high - \$10,500 last season, \$12,000 estimated for this season. Next year would be even more. The Board decided this was an exorbitant cost for results that virtually duplicate our own CFA National Awards. The money could better be used to increase the value of the CFA awards, to contribute toward more feline health research, etc. Therefore, CFA will not participate in All American scoring after April 30, 1976.

CFA NATIONAL CAT SHOW

This committee's first report was presented and discussed. Many details must be ironed out before the schedule can be set. It will not be held in competition with any other CFA show. It appears that the first national show will permit open entries but have a special judging format.

BREED NEWS

Breed decisions that affect Show Rules were made at this meeting. Breed Standards will be the subject of the February, 1976, meeting in San Francisco. All actions below are effective May 1, 1976:

EGYPTIAN MAU

These cats were accepted for Provisional status as a natural breed.

ORIENTAL SHORTHAIR

These hybrid cats were accepted for Provisional status. Siamese, Colorpoint Shorthairs, American Shorthairs and Oriental Shorthairs are permitted as parents of Orientals.

Research Committee Report

KITTEN STUDY

The Research Committee wishes to call your attention to a new questionnaire which expands our former KITTEN AND YOUNG CAT MORTALITY STUDY. This questionnaire will be printed next issue (Jan./Feb., 1976). Breeders will be asked to provide information on all breeds and that information is to include all occurrences of sickness and disease in cat-teries. I wish to emphasize again that no identifying information should be placed on the data supplied.

RHINOTRACHEITIS VACCINE

Feline rhinotracheitis vaccine has been available over one year and apparently is being more widely used at present. Evaluation of the vaccine was done by Dr. Frederic W. Scott of Cornell and reported in "Feline Practice", Jan.-Feb., 1975. In summary, Dr. Scott reported no serious adverse effects in 50 cats utilized in the evaluation. Significantly he stated that use of the modified live virus vaccine did not spread to unvaccinated cats. Dr. Scott recommends two does of the vaccine twenty-eight days apart.

It is our understanding that the feline rhinotracheitis vaccine will be combined with feline panleucopenia vaccine in the future.

As Chairman of the Research Committee, I feel compelled to urge you to discuss very seriously with your veterinarian the advisability of using such a combined vaccine.

The Research Committee is extremely interested in our breeders' experiences with rhinotracheitis vaccine. If breeders will let me know of any problems, I will be most grateful. My address is 516 Decatur N. Prof. Bldg., 755 Columbia Drive, Decatur, GA 30030.

COMMENTS ON VETERINARY LITERATURE

As a service to breeders, the JANE MARTINKE FELINE REFERENCE CENTER reviews current veterinary literature and abstracts pertinent material. The abstracts are printed so that they may be cut out and filed as the breeder sees fit--please refer to page 26, Sept./Oct., 1975 for suggestions on filing. It has been my responsibility to review the literature and select papers which are of practical as well as thought provoking nature. Some of the material is contradictory, which, in itself, should be of interest to the breeder. As an example, Scott, in evaluating rhinotracheitis vaccine, noted that unvaccinated animals, in contact with recently vaccinated animals, did not contract rhinotracheitis. In the current abstract on viral vaccines, Schultz states that all animals should be vaccinated at the appropriate time to avoid transmission of the herpes virus from the vaccinated to the unvaccinated. It would seem to me that any modified live virus vac-

JMFR-6: FELINE UROLITHIASIS SYNDROME SURVEY
 Vet. Rec., 96, April 5, 1975, p. 299.

British veterinarians detailed studies of 437 cases of the feline urolithiasis syndrome. A similar survey was conducted among owners of 604 cats, thus providing a control sample. The study was conducted between October 1, 1973, and September 30, 1974.

The findings are as follows:

For that year the incidence of FUS was 0.58%. The syndrome occurred more frequently in winter.

Cats with FUS were usually:

- Older than 2 years of age;
- Neutered animals;
- Came from multicat households;
- Drank significantly less water;
- 1/2 of cases had not been fed dry cat food;
- 3/4 of cases had received dry cat food.

JMFR-7: FELINE UROLITHIASIS/CAT FOODS: CONCENTRATION OF CALCIUM, MAGNESIUM, PHOSPHATE AND CHLORIDES IN VARIOUS CAT FOODS AND THEIR RELATIONSHIP TO FELINE UROLITHIASIS

F.C. Chow, Ph.D., D.W. Hamar, Ph.D., I. Dysart, B.S., and L.J. Rich, D.V.M., Ph.D., Feline Practice, Vol. 5, No. 5, Sept.-Oct., 1975, pp. 15-19.

Ten per cent of the male cat population have either urethral obstructive disease or urinary tract calculi; and, of that group, 50 to 70% are subject to recurrences. Alteration of a non-urolith diet by the addition of magnesium and phosphate has been shown to cause urolithiasis. Mineral imbalance of the diet characterized by high magnesium, high phosphate, low chloride, low calcium or a calcium phosphate ratio of less than one can provide a hazardous physiologic setting for urinary tract pathology.

Dr. Chow et al purchased 46 kinds of cat food off grocery store shelves for analysis. Of the total, 32 were canned, 3 were moist type and 11 were dry foods. The majority of the foods analyzed had Ca:P ratio greater than 1.

Dr. Chow found that two out of eight male cats fed 0.75% magnesium developed urethral obstruction in 50 days. Of 16 cats fed 1.00% magnesium, seven developed obstruction in 35 days and it was felt that the amount of magnesium in the diet was a significant factor in stone formation.

JMFR-8: NASAL TUMOR IN A CAT

A. M. Legendre et al, JAVMA, Vol. 167, No. 6, Sept. 15, 1975 pp. 481-483.

Nasal tumors do not occur frequently in cats. Of 395 feline tumors reviewed, only five were found to involve the nasal passages. Dr. Legendre reports of a case of a 7-year old neutered cat that presented with sneezing, increased tearing and swelling of the left side of the face. Ultimately a mass was found immediately inside the nose, and this proved to be an undifferentiated sarcoma.

Initially, nasal tumors may present as chronic respiratory infections, but by the time the tumor is apparent on X-ray, it is usually far advanced. The outlook is extremely poor because the majority of these tumors are malignant and invasive.

JMFR-9: VIRAL VACCINE IMMUNITY

Ronald D. Schultz, Ph.D., Ithaca, New York. Abstract, AVMA Convention, July, 1975. JAVMA, Vol. 167, No. 9, Nov. 1, 1975 pp. 856-857.

Of the many questions that arise from the use of vaccines to prevent viral disease, those which have special significance are:

1. Whether to use a killed viral vaccine or a modified live virus vaccine. Each has advantages and disadvantages.
2. How to provide active immunity to the newborn that has maternal antibodies. This can be accomplished by increasing the amount of antigen and altering the route of administration.
3. The route of administration. "Parental vs. local immunization" ... "it would appear that in certain instances vaccines administered locally (intranasally or orally) are more efficacious than those given" by injection. In regard to herpes virus, "it is important that all animals are vaccinated so that virulent virus is not transmitted from vaccinated to non-vaccinated individuals, resulting in disease."

Problems with vaccines. Problems include:

1. Hypersensitivity, immediate.
2. Immune complex.
3. Kidney disease.

JMFR-10: CHRONIC PROGRESSIVE POLYARTHRTIS OF THE CAT

N.C. Pedersen et al, Feline Practice, Vol. 5, No. 1, Jan.-Feb., 1975, pp 42-51.

Chronic progressive polyarthrits in the cat has been only briefly discussed in scientific literature. The authors state the majority of cases of arthrits in cats is caused by nutritional imbalance, injury or infection.

From 1969 to 1974, five male cats were studied at the Veterinary Teaching Hospital at the University of California at Davis. The cats ranged in age from 2 to 4 years and presented with the following symptoms and signs:

JMFR-11: EXPERIMENTAL FELV VACCINATION

Feline Practice, July-August, 1975, p. 28.

"The results published in an article entitled 'Antibody Response and Virus Survival in Cats Vaccinated Against Feline Leukemia' by W. Jarrett, L. Mackey, O. Jarret, H. Laird and C. Hood in Nature 248: 230-232, 1974 indicate the feasibility of vaccination against feline leukemia by inducing either large primary responses or small primary and large secondary responses.

"The following conclusions were drawn from the results published. If the cat had previous experience of FELV and had responded immunologically even to a mild degree, a second response occurred and no persistent infection resulted. If the virus input dose was high, the animal became infected, but subsequently suppressed the infection. Cats with no previous experience of infection seemed to have a cell dose-related response. The higher doses induced a good antibody level but did not terminate the infection, even when observed over a long period. In the groups given lower doses the antibody rise took place in the first month and virus was not found in the animals at that time or later."

JMFR-9: VIRAL VACCINE IMMUNITY (Continued)

4. Production of clinical disease by the vaccine ("i.e. encephalitis, attenuation is a relative term, and the host is a critical factor; if the host's immune system is compromised, an attenuated virus may act like a virulent virus and cause disease.").

JMFR-10: CHRONIC PROGRESSIVE POLYARTHRITIS OF THE CAT (Continued)

The cats were studied extensively and were examined for erythematous and rheumatoid arthritis. Tests for serum protein abnormalities as well as bacterial, mycoplasma and viral infection were done. Cell free inoculates of synovial tissue failed to produce the disease in kittens. Radiographs showed soft tissue swelling initially and later revealed extensive periarthicular osteophyte formation. Three cats had lymphosarcoma diagnosed by lymph node biopsy. All cats had glomerulonephritis which led to the supposition that the disease of polyarthritis in cats is systemic.

Cats will respond to corticosteroids but require larger doses as the disease progresses and run the risks of steroid therapy.

2 --- MRS. PAULINE ARMIT, AUSTRALIA

Membership in the Siamese Cat Club of S.A. was Mrs. Pauline Armit's first step into the cat world. Subsequently she became its President for eight years. She edited the club's newsletter "Siamese Cat Talk" for five years, managed numerous shows and became an All Breeds judge.

When the Feline Association, one of Australia's governing bodies, was formed in 1972 she gradually transferred her work from the club to the FA. Currently she is a member of both the FA Executive Committee and the Standing Committee on Breeds & Standards. She is in charge of the training of judges and edits "Purr", the FA magazine. Mrs. Armit lives at 33 Pine Avenue, Warradale, South Australia 5046. She writes:

THE AUSTRALIAN SCENE

Because of Australia's small population and the long distances between the main cities, control of affairs in the cat world is exercised separately in each of the six states and also in the A.C.T. (Canberra) and the Northern Territory. To complicate matters further, three of the states have two or more controlling bodies. However, this situation is ameliorated by reciprocal agreements recognizing registrations, cattery prefixes and judges. Show standards and procedures are based almost universally on the English ones.

The high cost of travel and communication prevents all but a few exhibitors from showing in states other than where they live. This means that the very best cats from all over Australia seldom compete against each other. Nevertheless, shows get large entries, e.g. 1400 cats were benched at the last Federal Cat Club Show, Sydney, and, even in Adelaide, over 500 cats are sometimes exhibited, although the population of the whole state is only around 1,000,000.

Breeding pedigree cats is still a relatively modest hobby in Australia and few breeders keep more than one or two studs and two to six breeding queens. Cats may be entered in shows for as little as one dollar per cat. However, in certain breeds, such as Siamese, which have been established for some time, cats of excellent type are often produced.

THE LOCAL SCENE

In South Australia, where I live, there are two controlling bodies which, between them, license 16 to 20 shows a year in Adelaide and some half dozen in country towns. Both bodies issue their own Challenge Certificates and Championship Honours and organise annual contests for the best entire and neutered cats and show rules are much the same. People wishing to breed experimentally must submit their programmes to councils for approval before the kittens may be registered. Judges' courses, in practice and theory, are conducted and candidates are examined before they can qualify as judges.

Cat shows are organised by the clubs, of which there are about 16, in South Australia, the largest being the Siamese Cat Club of S.A. with over 350 members. There is a great deal of member participation in club work. Most clubs run two or three shows a year, hold monthly meetings and issue quarterly newsletters.

We are fortunate in the Feline Association in having good contacts in other Australian states and overseas, in England and USA. We receive help and interest from personal contacts in CFA and through such media as the CFA Year Book. We learned a lot from Mrs. Betty O'Brien's visit as Principal Judge at the Siamese Cat Club's Festival Show in 1974 and have exchanged rosettes and medalions with CFA clubs in USA and Canada. Though I have never witnessed a CFA show, I was privileged to meet a number of cat breeders when I visited California in 1974. I wish our contacts with American cats could be closer but, under the stringent Australian quarantine regulations, cats may only be admitted from USA after 6 months quarantine in England and a further 3 months in Australia, or from Hawaii direct with 9 months quarantine in Brisbane. In partnership with a friend, Mrs. Eve Clarke, I did import a pair of Korats in 1968/'69. This proved a very complicated operation and the cats took 11 months to reach us. They were certainly well looked after during all that time but it isn't a project one undertakes lightly.###

Bombays were accepted for Championship status as a hybrid breed.

JAPANESE BOBTAIL

These cats were accepted for Championship status as a natural breed.

MAINE COON CAT

This breed was accepted for Championship status as a natural breed. Maine Coon Cats will be shown in four competitive color classes: Solid colors, Tabby's, Particolors and All Others.

The questions regarding acceptance of Torbie colors, Golden Persians and Shaded Tortoiseshell Persians were referred to the appropriate Breed Committees concerned. The question of an open or closed registry for the American Shorthair is to be referred to the ASH Breed Committee.

REGISTRATION FEES

After a thorough review of the budget, it was determined that Registration Fees must be increased for the first time since 1970. The new fee schedule will be effective January 1, 1977. Few, if any, service charges have held the line for seven years in these times of inflation.

SHOW RULES CHANGES (Effective May 1, 1976)

Many rules were edited for clearer or more concise terminology. Others had substantive changes. The major changes are summarized below but, remember, these are unofficial advance notices - be sure to study the new Show Rules when published.

Household Pet awards will be specified. Pets will be shown in three classes: Males/Neuters, Females/Spays and Kittens. Top three of each class will be awarded if ten or less competing, top five if over ten. Then a Best HHP Award.

Clipping the cats' claws will be required.

The rule concerning early leaving or not competing in all rings has been rewritten (current rule #71). Be sure to read the new rule carefully.

Show management will no longer be required to provide food for entries.###

cine carries such a serious potential. In this instance of seeming contradiction, Dr. Scott made an observation of what occurred in his work, while Dr. Schultz warns of the possibility.

One thing that is important is to be critical of all scientific literature. As an example, much is being written these days about the feline urologic syndrome. On one hand we have urinary stones being formed in flasks of viral cultures, while on the other we have stones being formed when the mineral content of the diet is manipulated. And then we have the British in an uproar about dry foods. Now all of these workers know that FUS is a complicated syndrome with more than one cause. When there are many theories there is never one answer. At least, there is none at present.

In the most recent issue of "Feline Practice" there are two papers on heart disease in cats; as a practising cardiologist, I found these papers quite superficial and of little value to the breeder much less to a practising veterinarian.

Another observation is that research workers in the veterinary field seem to form firm conclusions on the basis of limited experience. To state that something is so on the basis of studying a vaccine or a disease in 10 to 50 cats is crawling out on a limb with saw in hand.

One thing that is readily apparent is the relative paucity of papers dealing with feline disease. Thus far, it has been necessary to review six to eight journals in order to present four abstracts. It well may be that, periodically, there will be insufficient material to present to you. It is our intention to keep you informed.

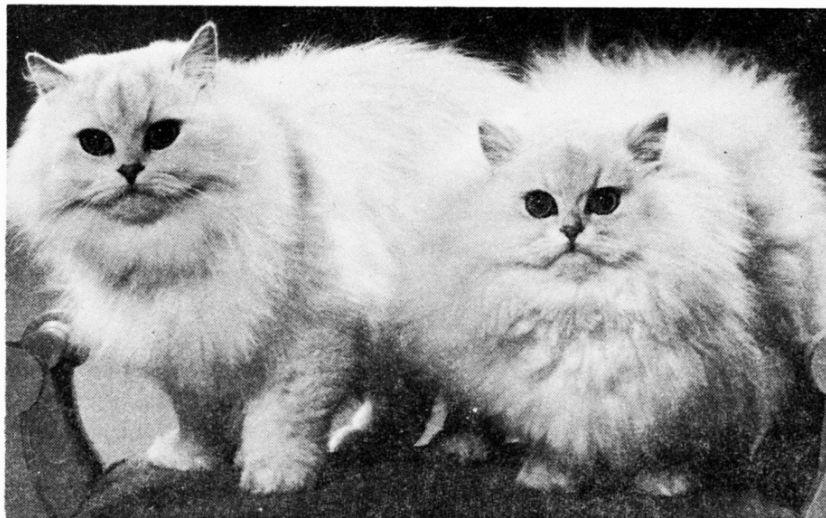
CHINCHILLA LONGHAIR

Last year I was fortunate enough to visit both Germany and New Zealand and to see many Chinchilla Long-Hairs, both in catteries and on the show bench. It is very interesting to note the bloodlines they are descended from, and the judges' taste, as compared to the British Long Hair Cat Fancy.

Chinchillas in Great Britain are rivaling Blue Persians for popularity and it is wonderful to see the huge classes of kittens and adults at our shows. At the National Cat Shows of 1973 and 1974, over 60 Chinchilla kittens were entered and about 40 adult males and females (six-plus were Champions) both years. It is common to see many beautiful Chinchillas on show at the London and South-East England shows although, generally, the size of entries and quality of exhibits is not so high in the West, Midlands and North of England and Scotland. It seems that the main concentration of Chinchilla breeders live in the South of England, although there are several successful breeders elsewhere.

All British Chinchillas are descended from the same basic stock which is mainly Allington - pedigrees carrying also such names as Thame, Porchester, Green Gables, Correndon, Thistledown, Foxburrow and Sarisbury. Mrs. Turney of Bonavia Chinchillas (*Ed. note: see "Mercury", CAT WORLD, March/April, 1975*), has been breeding top winners since the 1950's, her main lines being based on

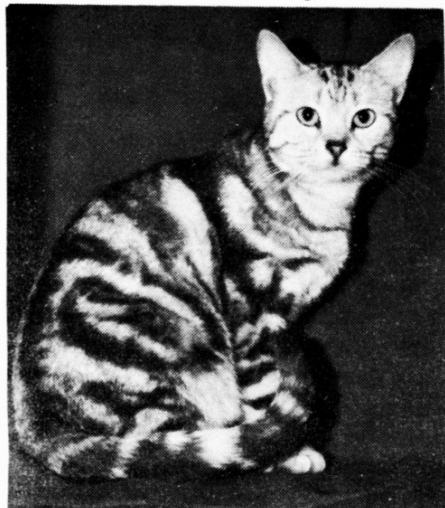
CH. CLICQUOT PERFECTA with her daughter CLICQUOT BUTTERFLY, both bred by Miss Sanders. (Alexander Studio photo)



Allington and Sarisbury. In the late 1950's and 1960's, she imported some Chinchilla males from America, the most successful as a stud being SILVER MESA APACHE, although descendants of KUTEKIT SILVER NICKNACK are also good.

Chinchillas, at that time, were very lovely but were suffering from the ill effects of inbreeding, and the new lines improved stamina and size. Unfortunately, since the late 60's, the Chinchillas are again becoming very inbred and, in 1973, several breeders imported Chinchillas from American lines. I myself bought a male Chinchilla, SIR ROBERT OF BO-D, and a female, HILLSBURY'S DAISY MAE, and, after going through 6 months quarantine, they both attained 2nd in their Chinchilla breed classes only a few days out of quarantine. A month later, SIR ROBERT became the first U.S. Silver to win a champion certificate in England at only 10 months of age at

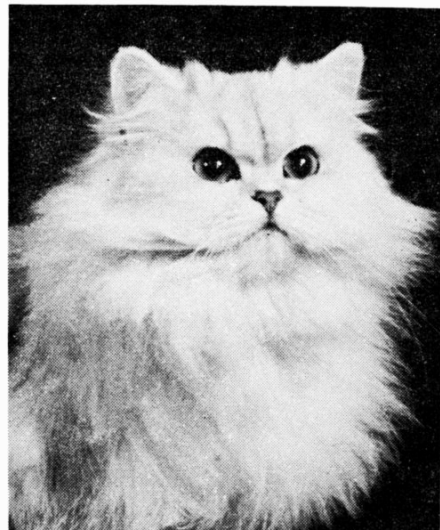

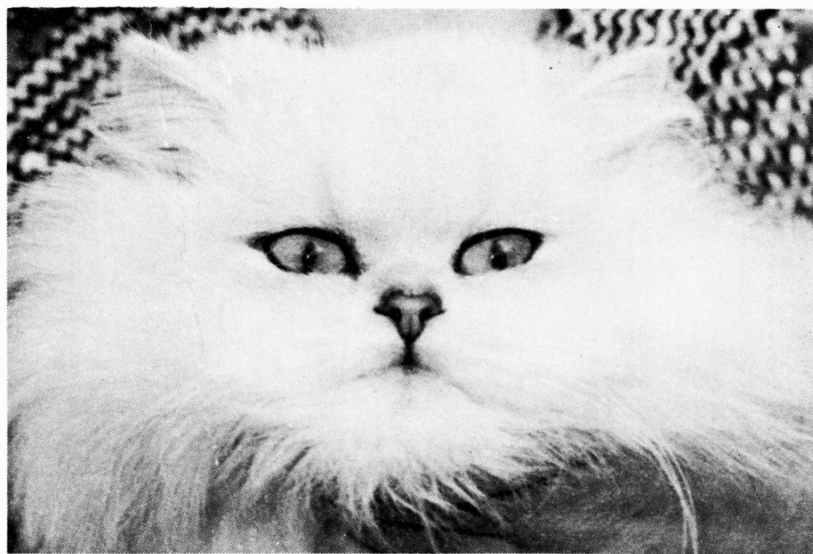

the Southern Counties Show, London, but, tragically, four days later he died of salmonella food poisoning. However, *DAISY MAE* had four kittens by English *CH. PEGASUS D'ARTAGNAN* on April 25, 1974, and four months later her daughter, *CLICQUOT KRISTINA*, won Best Chinchilla Kitten at the Herts. & Middlesex Championship show, London. This kitten subsequently was exported to South Africa and, in March, 1975, won Best Chinchilla Adult and a Challenge Certificate in that country winning every class in which she was entered. Around the same time, her litter-brother, *GRAND MARNIER*, won his first certificate in England at 10 months of age.

DAISY MAE is from Delphi and Walnut Hill lines and is full sister to *GRAND CH. HILLSBURY'S GYPSY ROSE LEE*. It is likely that these new lines, which do have a little Eng-

lish ancestry, will improve stamina and type in English Chinchillas, although, as they have some Shaded Silver in their lines, care will have to be taken that the high British standard for colour is retained.

British Chinchillas have shown that they are of a top standard by winning many awards when exported, and the best bloodlines in Europe and America are descended from Chinchillas imported from Britain. It should be stressed, however, that in America great emphasis is given by judges to head type and heavy bone, while higher marks are awarded in Britain for colour than for head type.

OVERSEAS VISIT

In April, 1974, I visited the Berlin Cat Show and stewarded for Madame Guggenbuhl, the Swiss judge. I was very impressed with the quality of many of the Long-Hairs and it was interesting to compare the different system of classes for the cats, as well as the different judging methods. There were some lovely Chinchillas present, mostly descendants of

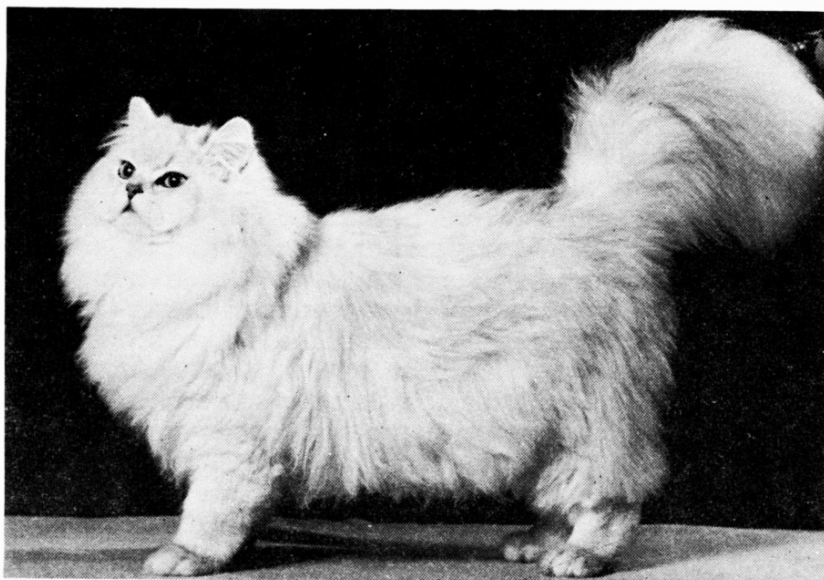

Bonavia Chinchillas exported from the U.K. to Switzerland and the Netherlands, and also from American bloodlines such as Walnut Hill and Dearheart. The best of these cats would have won top awards in England and were similar to the British cats for type and coat colour.

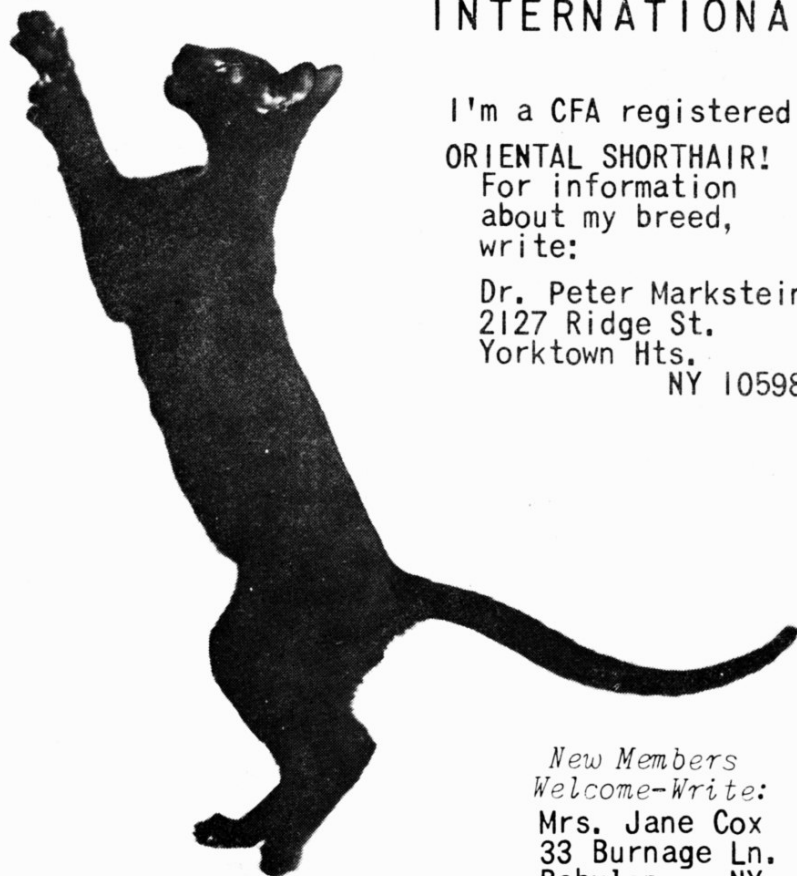
I was very interested to see the system used for examining applicant judges and I stewarded for a Czechoslovakian candidate who was taking her examinations for Long-Hair judge. These were extremely difficult as she had to judge cats judged by international judges the previous day, without knowing their decisions.

In June, 1974, I visited New Zealand for a working holiday and attended four cat shows and visited several catteries. I was very fortunate in receiving some very useful information on Long-Hairs imported from Britain from Mrs. Barningham, the famous Tuidene Chinchilla breeder. I was especially impressed with the quality of the Chinchillas I saw, many of which were bred in the Auckland area.

In the 1950's some fine cats were imported from England to help improve the quality of the New Zealand Chinchillas. Miss Langston sent CH. SETH OF ALLINGTON, who was noted for his excellent eye colour. Mrs. Turney sent CH. BONAVIA CAMPANELLO, a full brother of the famous CH. BONAVIA CONTENTA (Ch. Mark of Allington x Ch. Sarisbury Aphra). BONAVIA BENJAMINO, who arrived in the 60's, was sired by American SILVER MESA APACHE and his maternal grandfather was American-bred KUTEKIT SILVER NICKNACK. CH. REDWALLS TIMOSHENKO, who features in nearly every N.Z. Chinchilla pedigree, was also from Allington parentage. Mrs. McLeod sent a very lovely queen, CH. DILLY OF THAME, who has passed on her lovely large round eyes to many Chinchillas. In the early 1970's Mrs. Turney exported CH. BONAVIA DEBONAIR to Auckland, New Zealand, and he has sired some good winners.

The only Grand Champion Chinchillas in New Zealand are all descended from the Brit-

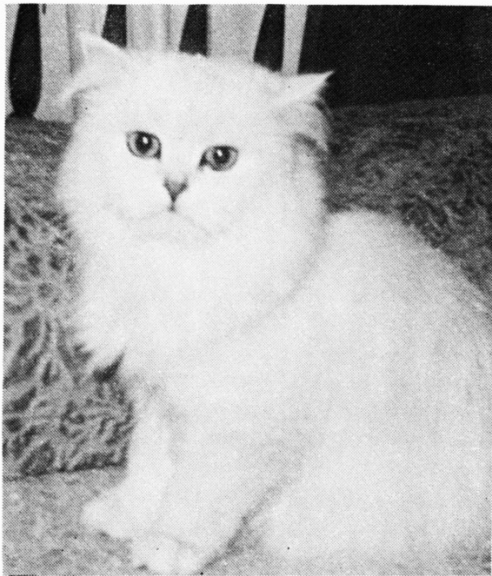

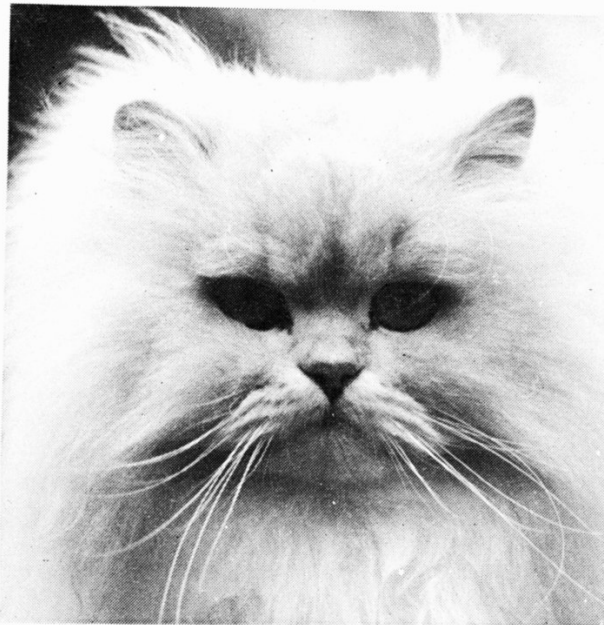

ish-imported Chinchillas: GR.CH. TUIDENE YUM YUM, GR.CH. TUIDENE PETITE MAIDIE and GR.CH. JOHANN MOONLIGHT SONATA (sire Ch. Tuidene Periwinkle).

Several top Chinchillas have been exported from New Zealand to Australia and have won Best in Show awards and Grand Champion titles. Australian Chinchillas I have seen in New Zealand tend to be very large-boned and have heavy coats, but seem to have longer noses and larger ears than the British and American Silvers.

New Zealand Chinchillas seem to have very pale, pure colour coats, and great emphasis is placed on marking down barred legs and smudged under paws. They have the slightly pale nose leather, which is a fault prevalent in England, but eye colour generally seems very good and most cats have large round straight-set eyes, without the "oriental pinch" which is now often seen in England. I was surprised at the profuse coats on the cats I saw at the shows, in view of the warmer climate in the Auckland area, where the temperature even in winter is 15-16 degrees Centigrade.

I took home with me from New Zealand a 9-month-old Chinchilla male, TUIDENE KYNAN, a descendant of the best British Chinchilla imports, who has the typical New Zealand Chinchilla expression. KYNAN should be valuable in improving eye shape in the British Chinchilla and he also has a profuse coat of pale colour with unsmudged feet, combined with very good type and eye colour.

OUTCROSSING FOR TYPE IMPROVEMENT?

There is considerable controversy at present in New Zealand, Australia and Britain regarding the benefits of outcrossing to self colour cats to improve head type. It is generally felt by experienced breeders worldwide that, by the time the green eye colour has been regained, any benefits in head type have disappeared.

Personally, I am not convinced that it

is worth outcrossing to Blues, etc., but, possibly, if an excellent type Blue-Eyed White was used, some improvement would be seen; however, white masks other colours in the ancestry, such as blue and cream, and the excellent type Blue-Eyed Whites are generally from strong Blue Persian or Orange-Eyed White stock. The best way to improve type in Chinchillas is by strict selective breeding, mating good head type to good head type.

One breed in which the cross has been made to blue, black and cream to improve type has been the Colourpoint (*Ed. note: Himalayan*) and it is noticeable that the best head type Colourpoints have a large proportion of blue, etc., in their breeding, although these cats generally have pale eye colour with the shorter nose. The poor eye colour would also generally occur in Chinchillas with blue ancestry, as the copper eye of the self colour is dominant over the Chinchilla's green eyes. Coat colour purity is likely to suffer also due to introduction of self colours, and it has taken many years of selective breeding to attain the evenly tipped coats one sees in modern day Chinchillas.

In America, two categories of silvers exist--Chinchillas and Shaded Silvers. There is frequently some difficulty in deciding what colour a cat should be registered as. In the early 1900's in England the cat fancy decided to retain just one colour, the Chinchilla, as judges were finding it difficult to decide which category a cat belonged to. In Australia and New Zealand the Shaded Silver are recognized and eligible for championship titles; however, it should be mentioned that, as in America, the Shaded Silvers have the same eye colour as the Chinchillas and have to be evenly and heavily tipped. They are not the product of Blue Persian cross Chinchilla.

Considerable importance is given in America to top head type in Silvers and heavy bone and the best show cats rival the self colours for type. In Britain, 20 marks are awarded for head type in the standard and 25 for colour.

The Chinchilla is regarded by many as the most beautiful and glamorous of Long-Hair cats, but it is difficult to breed a top show specimen which combines all the good qualities. Judges differ on the type of Chinchilla they favour, some prefer a lighter-boned cat with an ethereal look, others the heavy-boned cobby cat which is nearer to the self colour Persian.

By working on an international level, which now seems to be happening, we should progress faster towards a higher standard. I should like to thank all those breeders who have helped me and worked with me, both in Germany, America and New Zealand, and send best wishes to Chinchilla enthusiasts worldwide.###

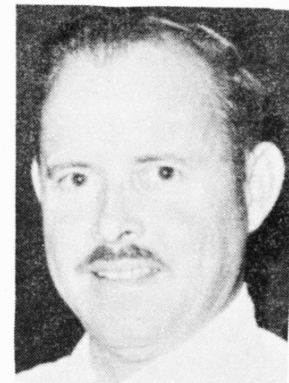


Showmanship

by DON FIX

SETTING UP YOUR JUDGING SCHEDULES

This is a difficult column to write, and deals with one of the most important of show items. If you have grasped the idea of proper sequencing of cats through the judging rings, you can set up judging schedules easily and efficiently; if not, chances are that you have been copying the judging schedule from a previous show catalog and are trusting to luck that cats will not 'bunch up' and that exhibitors will have somewhat even spacing between their calls. Your success then depends upon whether you copied a good schedule or one set up by another amateur.




SOME BASIC THINGS TO LEARN in order to schedule easily involve timing of the rings. Can you, as a show manager, scan your rings at 2 P.M. and then, from the judging schedule, predict when each ring will finish? Consider for a moment the show that has 160 cats per day. Assuming that you start at 10 A.M. and want to finish at 6 P.M., you have 8 hours, or 480 minutes of show time. Of this, the judge will likely take 30 minutes for lunch and another 30 minutes to figure and hold Finals at the end of the day. Another 60 minutes will be devoted to holding Finals for the Kittens, Premiers and HHP's so you have 360 minutes left for the ring operation of handling, hanging ribbons and cleaning of cages.

If a sharp clerk can average 8 cats per setup (call-up), then this remaining 360 minutes will contain 20 call-ups ... averaging 18 minutes each for the cycle ... which will perhaps mean 5 minutes for the exhibitors to bring in the cats, 5 minutes for the stewards to clean the cages, and ONE MINUTE EACH for the 8 cats being judged. Get the picture now? This is what the show is all about in terms of the *time that it takes to judge the show!* If you can envision this timing, the judging schedule is an easy matter because it simply will reflect the timing to the exhibitor on paper.

ANOTHER BASIC THING TO KEEP IN MIND is to have TWO RINGS break for lunch at a time. This keeps two rings in motion for the benefit of paying spectators. To coordinate the lunch schedule, *feed your judges, clerks and stewards* so all can eat at the same time and be back to work at the same time. Don't be cheap with respect to the clerks and stewards ... a smooth show is worth the minimal cost.

However, now we're digressing a bit from the schedule since most do not indicate the lunch breaks but let them take their natural course.

JUDGING SCHEDULES ARE VERY SIMILAR, NO MATTER WHAT STYLE OF SHOW YOU HAVE. The daily sequence of cats will be (1) Allbreed; (2) Shorthair, or (3) Longhair. The ALLBREED sequence appears in the ONE DAY ALLBREED SHOW, so popular nowadays. On the SPLIT SPECIALTY SHOW, judges do SHORTHAIRES on one day and LONGHAIRS the next. On the traditional (or 'old-fashioned', since cats were present in the showroom for two days) show having two Allbreed Rings and two Specialty Sets, scheduling involved two Shorthair and two Longhair rings per day, the Specialties holding Finals at the end of EACH DAY, and the Allbreeds holding Finals only at the end of the second day.

No matter how you cut it, have Shorthairs one day and Longhairs one day and your scheduling is made easier than any other scheme. One note on the traditional show, life is made more interesting in scheduling in that Kits, HHP's and Premiership classes involve the calling of BOTH the LH and SH classes on the same day, but it is simple to have the AB kits in one ring and the AB Prem's and HHP's in the other, and then reverse the schedule for the second day, keeping the specialties out of the way.

ALWAYS SCHEDULE THE ENTRIES BETWEEN THE RINGS EVENLY. If you have four rings doing the same thing (AB's, Sh's or LH's) start Ring #1 out at the natural beginning of the catalog sequence (except move Prem's & HHP's up to the front to get rosettes out into the showroom) and start the following rings out at the 1/4, 1/2 and 3/4 points along the total number of entries. To illustrate:

Then simply set up each column of judging schedule starting at the START line for that ring (the One-day Allbreed Show is illustrated), and continue down the list. AB kittens will follow Parti-Colors. The exact "Quarter Points" above would have been at 1, 41, 82 & 123; but 1, 40, 86 & 122, as shown above, is quite close enough! Simple? No matter what kind (style) show you have concocted, you can layout the sequence of cats (or cats per day) into a reasonable line-up. THINK ABOUT IT!##

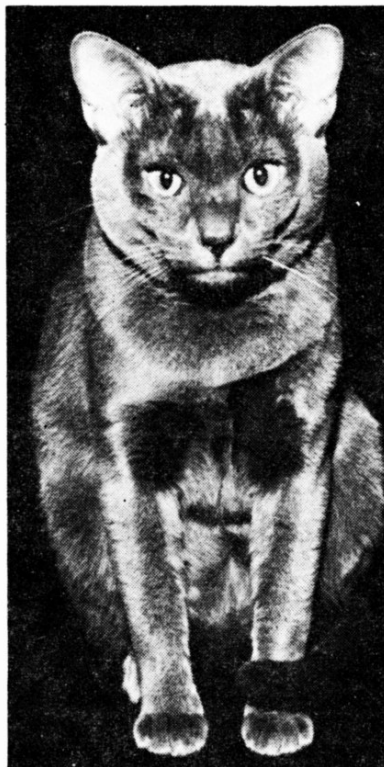

STUDY UNIT 14

PROGRAMMES OF MATINGS

The cat breeder has a number of considerations to bear in mind when arranging programmes of matings. He may be seeking to "improve" type with reference to a cat fancy standard of points for the breed concerned, he may be attempting to eliminate a characteristic he considers undesirable or he may be hoping to transfer a quality or colour from one breed to another.

ARTIFICIAL AND NATURAL SELECTION

There are cat lovers who maintain that "natural" breeding is best and that "tinkering about with genetics" results only in freaks. Even if agreement could be reached over the definition of "freak", it is doubtful that such a hypothesis could be effectively proved or disproved in an age where the domestic cat population is already largely determined by

man's selection. The very words "domestic cat" imply this selection. In fact, were man to have had no hand at all in the shaping of contemporary cat populations then no doubt most of the cats in Europe would be rangy, wild, short-haired tabby creatures inhabiting the woods while those in warmer more humid climates would be correspondingly darker in colour.

While domestication by man has not been the cause of the many variants, there is no doubt that it is responsible for providing the opportunity for the variants to spread. Long before William Bateson advised animal breeders to "treasure your expectations", cat lovers had begun to do so by favouring certain mutants and selecting for them. An extremely good example of the effect of man's selection is that of the blotched tabby, already mentioned as being the result of a recessive mutant. In fact, tabby pattern (as distinct from agouti which gives it expression) has three alleles and of the three "blotched" is the most recessive. This pattern, often described in the cat fancy as "marbled" is thought to have mutated much later than the Abyssinian tabby pattern as seen in *Felis chaus* and the striped (or mackerel) tabby pattern as seen in *Felis lybica*. However, it is gradually displacing the other two patterns in non-pedigree cat populations. Worldwide gene surveys have shown that it is gradually spreading out from urban centres in Europe, and the inference is obvious. When left to themselves even domestic cats operate no particular colour bar - the average tom cat is happy to sire kittens to any queen of any colour or shape. The forces of mutation, natural selection, and gene flow between semi-isolated cat populations would not account for the diversity, allocation and frequency of certain colours and patterns without artificial selection by man playing its part.

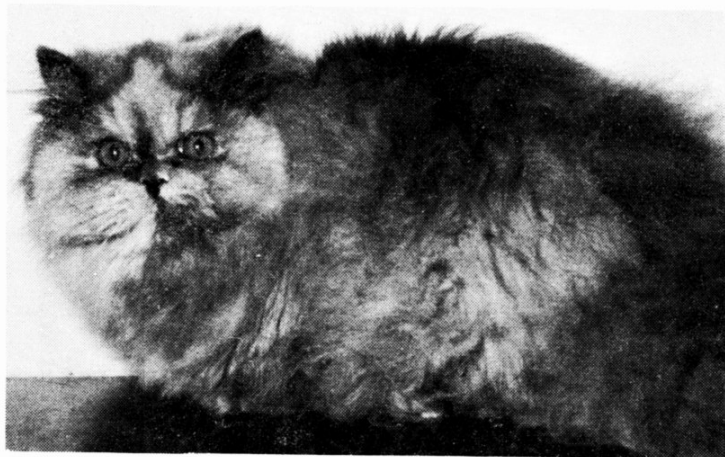
An interesting report by Roy Robinson and Maureen Silson, England, shows unexpectedly large discrepancy between the numbers of red cats observed in areas of Southern England and the number that would be expected to occur. Again one explanation they consider is a human bias towards keeping red cats in preference to others.

EVOLUTION OF PEDIGREE BREEDS

The selection practised by the pedigree cat breeder is really only an extension of the selection practised by the average cat lover over the centuries. Selection has led to the evolution of the pedigree cat breeds and the breed names chosen, although in some cases reflecting the place of origin (or supposed origin) are basically descriptions for combinations of qualities of coat, colour, pattern, shape, build and general character. It is selective breeding for particular charac-

teristics practised by serious cat fanciers that has resulted in the evolution of the individual breeds.

The production of each breed has involved "shuffling" of genes that at some time in history have mutated from the normal or wild type. In this context the use of the word "normal" does NOT infer that the mutated gene is in any way "abnormal" - it is a general term for the alternative to the mutation. While in the cat fancy the age of a mutation usually adds to its "respectability", it must be remembered that at some stage in history even the best known and oldest mutants must have been new.

Of course there are some mutants that are definitely harmful although these usually affect characteristics other than those involved in the evolution of breeds and should thus be the concern of all cat lovers. An example of this sort of mutant is that for congenital hydrocephalus recently reported in Siamese but likely to occur in any breed. Other mutants may be regarded as undesirable by some while not strictly speaking harmful. Such a mutant is polydactyly and which, in the fancy, generally is selected against, abounds in such frequency in certain parts of the world that artificial selection in its favour must almost certainly have been involved. There are some mutant genes with pleiotropic effects as explained earlier in this series, although pleiotropic effects need not necessarily be harmful.

Some mutants, such as that for dilution, already discussed, are recessive; others such as white coat are dominant. Sometimes a new mutant may produce an effect considered attractive by cat breeders who then, by a planned programme of matings, find the method of inheritance and then tests its viability and increase its frequency. By such means new breeds may be produced. The Cornish, Devon and German Rex mutants are good examples.

Other breeds are the result of chance or considered combinations of genes other than those previously found in association. Breeds such as these are the Siamese "32's" (Tabby Point, Red Point, Tortie Point, Any Other Dilution); the Havanas; while those varieties such as Havana dilutes (Foreign Lilac); Foreign White; Chocolate British SHs and Persians; Red and Cream Burmese, etc., represent breeds in the making.

Breeds with programmes for their production planned in advance are often called "man made", although "man designed" would probably be more accurate since they are made with materials (genes) already present in cat populations.

None of the programmes for their production represent anything more than considered attempts either to combine for the first time, or to reproduce a combination already seen as a result of chance matings, alleles at different loci.###
(Study Unit 15 will discuss designed breeds.)

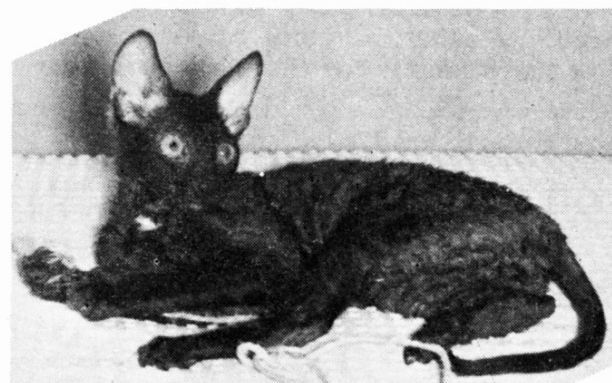

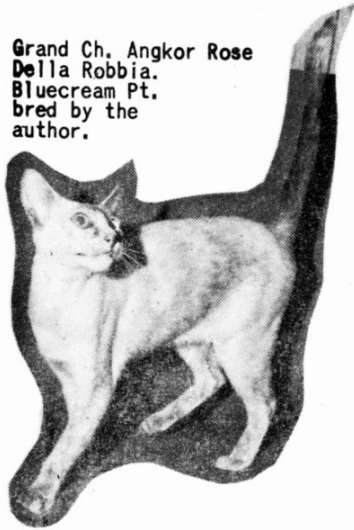

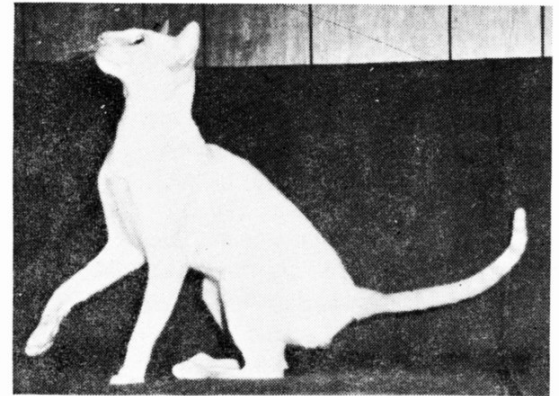

Since the recognition by Cat Fanciers Association of the various Colorpoint colors for Championship competition, I have received many enquiries concerning the possible results from various matings between the standard colors of Siamese and the Colorpoint variety. It is a most complicated matter, even more so than with the standard Siamese since we have the same problems plus more in the Red, Cream (dilute of red), and the various colors of Parti-Color points.

Often it is practically impossible to predict the outcome of certain breedings simply because we may not know for sure if the parents are carrying factors for blue, dilute, cream, etc. It may be that only after kittens are born can we figure out what the parents are as far as color genetics are concerned.

The breeder should bear in mind that the color genetics of all cats are the same, Siamese color being restricted to the points, and that the knowledge and experience of Persian breeders, for example, can be of great help. Breeding combinations of Black Persians, Blue Persians, Tortie Persians and Blue-Cream Persians work the same for Seals and Blues, Seal Torties and Blue-creams in Siamese and Colorpoints; Red Persians and Cream Persians correspond in color genetics

to Red Points and Cream Points and the same results will occur.

It should also be pointed out that, just as in other breeds, the red must be visible or it is not present. In other words, a Seal Point cannot possibly carry any "red factor" even though he or she may have had a Red Point ancestor. Remember, also, that in order to produce a Red Point or Cream Point male or a Parti-Color Point female (Seal Tortie, Blue-cream, Lilac-cream, Chocolate-cream), the red color must be visible on one parent.

A Red or Cream Point female may only be produced if red or cream is visible in both parents: Red or Cream Point male and either Red or Cream Point dam or Parti-Color Point dam.

Though I have taken the precaution to have this material checked by experts, I am calling it 'tentative'. As I am not a geneticist, there may be errors in what I have done. I have used articles by Keeler, Cobb, Bryant, Shaw, Bandy and Peltz as the basis of my work as well as Kilborn's presentation in Pascal's triangle form.

But enough of this introduction, just check the material (*adapted to chart form by 'Cat World' editors*) and see for yourself what wonderfully fun combinations are in store for the breeder of that variety of Siamese known as Colorpoint Shorthair!###

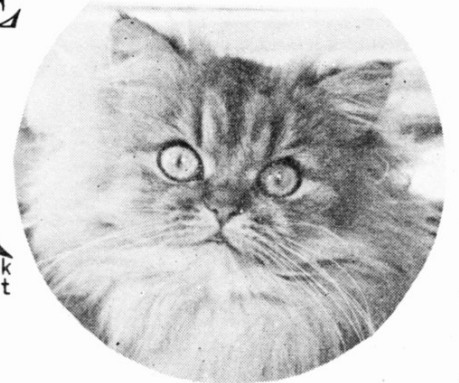
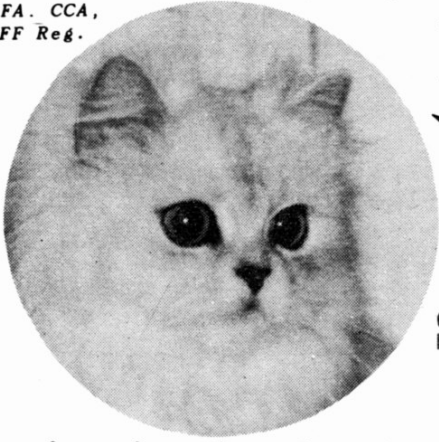

class will compete against the cat winning first in the Open class and the better is awarded the red, white and blue *Winners* ribbon. The Seal Point female Champions are then judged, followed by the Seal Point female Grand Champions. First, second and third place ribbons are awarded to each of these classes but, of course, winners ribbons are no longer needed as these cats already have won Championships. The male class of Seal Point Siamese has already been judged in the same order before the females and now each of the first place cats - male and female - compete for the *Best of Color* (black) ribbon and the *Second Best of Color* (white) ribbon. Red ribbon (second place) winners may also be considered for the Second Best of Color award. The term "Best of Color" in this case means the Best Seal Point Siamese.

(The term "Best of Color" can be quite confusing to the newcomer, as it does not literally mean that the cat winning it has the best color! It means that the cat is the Best Seal Point Siamese in that ring. A cat is judged on conformation, not only for color but for type, coat, condition, etc., etc., as set down in the standard for that breed, and, possibly, the winning cat will NOT have the best color but is the best all-over cat in that particular color class. The same thing applies in any color class, shorthair or longhair, i.e. the Best of Color in the Cream

When all the other color classes of Siamese have been judged, the awards of Best Siamese, 2nd Best Siamese and Best Siamese Champion are made. Usually, the Chocolate Points are judged first, followed by the Seal Points, then the Lilac Points, ending with the Blue Points.

THE 'FINALS'

At the end of all the shorthair judging, the Shorthair Specialty judge will call back to the ring the cats needed for the 'Finals'. Cats chosen will be:

- Best and 2nd Best Novice
- Best and 2nd Best Open
- Best and 2nd Best Champion
- Best and 2nd Best Grand Champion
- Top 5 Cats.

Do not leave before the end of all the finals if your cat won a first but not a Best of Color as she could still take a final win.

To compete for Best Novice, your cat competes *only* with other novices that also won a first ribbon. A future column will be devoted to explaining some of the complicated mechanics of show finals but, for now, remember, as explained in the article on kitten judging, a red ribbon winner, or even a yellow ribbon winner could be called to the finals.

At the completion of all judging in the All Breed ring, the best cats in the long-haired divisions compete for final wins with the best of the shorthaired breeds. It is a thrilling occasion for the owner of a cat taking ANY final win so, needless to say, a final win in an All Breed ring is a big honor.

WINNERS RIBBONS

If you are lucky and your cat won a Winners ribbon, at her next show she *must* be entered in the Open class. This does not mean that if she wins a Winners ribbon in the first ring that she must be transferred to Open in all the other judge's rings. She stays a Novice for the whole show. She must be in the Open class at her next show. If you have already entered her as a Novice in several shows, be sure that you inform the Show Secretary when you vet-in at the next show that your cat is transferred to the Open class. This information will be given to all the judges and clerks so that the judges' books and the clerks' catalogs will be corrected before the start of judging. It is a good idea to also check with the Master Clerk to make sure that the transfer was correctly recorded.

It requires six Winners ribbons under 4 different judges for a cat to become a Champion. As a cat cannot compete for Winners ribbons in more than four rings at one show, she must attend at least two shows (and often several more) for those six precious ribbons.

Some Thoughts On Neutering

WHAT IS NEUTERING?

Neutering is the rendering sterile of a male or female animal by surgical or chemical means. Many synonyms are used in various geographical locations in Great Britain, such as spaying, doctoring, fixing and dressing. The proper clinical term is castration in the male cat and ovaro-hysterectomy in the female. These operations are routine and commonplace in general practice, and involve a full sterile operation under general anaesthesia. At one time, immature male kittens were castrated frequently without anaesthetic. Since the advent of the "Protection of Animals (Anaesthetics) Act, 1964", the law has required satisfactory anaesthesia to be employed for any age group. In the male cat, the operation involves complete removal of the testicles and part of the spermatic cord, and it is advisable, in the sexually mature animal, to ligate blood vessels to eliminate the risk of haemorrhage. No skin suturing is required.

Vasectomy is a simple operation to perform in the cat, but its indications are extremely limited, since the only effect would be to produce sterility while the vasectomised animal still functions as an entire male, due to the production of the male hormone testosterone, the disadvantages of which are mentioned below. Vasectomy would, therefore, normally only be performed in large stud colonies where one required the use of a "teaser" tom for detection of cats in season.

The operation in the female involves the removal of the ovaries, Fallopian tubes, the horns and body of the uterus (womb). This is obviously an internal operation involving abdominal surgery. The incision may be performed in the flank, but occasionally the mid-line of the abdomen is preferred, due either to pregnancy or to the risk of pigmentation following surgery in light-coated breeds such as the Siamese. Certain surgeons prefer the so-called "stab" incision when the flank operation is done; this results in a very minute scar which is often so small as to require no suturing though, as a general rule, this will be necessary in the case of female cat neutering.

EFFECTS OF NEUTERING

The main purpose in neutering a female cat is obvious; the operation causes the oestrous cycle to cease and the queen is therefore rendered incapable of breeding. Pregnancy cannot ensue where the operation has been properly performed.

There are also certain medical reasons for neutering - less commonly encountered in the cat than in the dog - but these include hormonal upsets involving skin symptoms, and of course disease conditions of the female genital tract. The reasons for neutering male cats are somewhat less agreed, but we do consider that the neuter is unlikely to "spray" in the domestic environment, is less inclined to wander in search of female conquests and, as a result, is less likely to be involved in either street accidents or cat fights.

SIDE EFFECTS

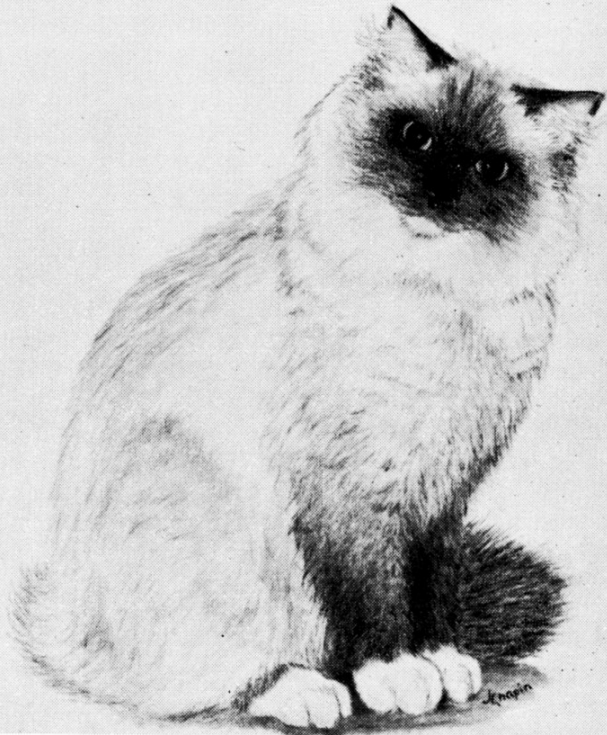
It is believed by some people that the temperament of a cat is altered with neutering. I believe emphatically that any apparent alteration or deterioration in temperament would have been likely to ensue without surgical interference. It does seem apparent that neutered cats have a tendency to gain weight where entire cats do not but, on careful analysis, one gets the impression that the numbers of neutered animals are equally divided between average body weight and those that have gained excessive weight, and this may largely be the result of unwitting over-feeding by owners - possibly supplemented with additional food gleaned by scavenging out of doors. In addition, it has been suggested by some authorities that male cats neutered before sexual maturity have exhibited immature or under-sized diameter of the urethra, making them more prone to urinary disorders such as f.u.s. However, this would appear to have been disproved by recent work done in the U.S.A.

WHAT AGE?

We are frequently consulted by cat owners asking at what age the neutering should be done. I believe that the absolute minimum should be 4½ months, for prior to this the kitten physically is not, in my opinion, of adequate size. Sexual maturity in cats comes about from the age of 6 months, and as a species it seems to matter little the precise timing of the operation. However, on grounds of increased risk, I do believe that a complete embargo on the neutering of female cats in the process of calling should be observed. It is my distinct impression in the U.K. that something like 75% of cats of both sexes are neutered before sexual maturity; I further see little evidence that this has harmful effects in the vast majority of patients.

Absolutely no Ragdoll kittens or cats will obtain their crest unless there is absolute proof that all requirements of breeding have been met. ONLY CRESTED CATS MAY USE THE NAME RAGDOLL. Coat of Arms crests are \$5.00.

All information and Advertising regarding Ragdoll cats must be approved by the Dept. of Corporation thru Ann Baker.

The sale of Ragdoll breeding pairs were ordered off the market April 15, 1974 (last year) and so far has not been back pending Gov. rules and regulations ... it ended with five breeders. Starting a precedent is not easy, it involves years of legal work and research.

Alternatives to neutering in the female cat consist of, simply, confinement. This may seem rudimentary, but cats are born escapologists, and open windows, etc. additionally provide an entrance for wandering toms. In addition, certain breeds, particularly the Oriental cats, have such a vociferous call that life can be very unpleasant for humans in the household, although general sedation may be of some help. Other methods of control are hormonal in nature, e.g. progestagens which may be administered orally or by injection, and there is evidence to suggest that further different hormone preparations may be coming into use in the foreseeable future. It would be wise to bear in mind - particularly over a long-term - that these hormones may not be without risk, and such drugs should be used with the full consent of one's veterinary adviser.

In the case of the male cat, there are few practicable alternatives to surgical neutering. Again, confinement; for example, flat (apartment) -dwelling cats will not have ac-

cess to damage from either vehicles or other cats and, indeed, may not develop the habit of spraying, which would appear to be partly hormonal in cause and partly mimicry of other entire male cats. Again, sedation may be of some help, but, since sexual activity in the male cat is continuous and not periodic as in the queen, I tend to reject the thought of continuous sedation as unsatisfactory and inhumane. There is additionally available a drug preparation which is 'anti male hormone' in function which may be used to advantage, but this requires to be given by injection at intervals of 4-8 weeks and, on the whole, appears less satisfactory in controlling the entire male cat than it does in the entire male dog.###

My next article will explain how to claim a championship but, in the meantime, keep a list of the Winners ribbons that your cat wins - recording the names of the judges who awarded them and the names, dates and locations of the shows. This information is required by Central Office before the championship can be confirmed.###

BOOK REVIEW

"THE BURMESE CAT", D. Richards, R. Pocock, M. Swift and V. Watson. Batsford Ltd., 4 Fitzhardinge St., London W1H 0AH, England. Published July, 1975, 182 pp. UK£4.95.

As *CAT WORLD* readers know, Dr. Rosemonde Peltz has immortalized the Burmese cat with her comprehensive, in-depth study, "A Burmese History". In the series she briefly referred to the export to England by Mrs. Warren of California of three Burmese cats in the late 1940's (*CW*, May/June, 1974, p.25). Now a quartet of British Burmese enthusiasts has picked up the story and compiled this chronicle of the advancement in the United Kingdom of the breed.

The authors include three GCCF judges of Burmese: Vic Watson, Robine Pocock and Moira Swift. The two former are, respectively, the founder of the U.K. Burmese Cat Club and the Editor of the Club's "News". Dorothy Richards is a Burmese breeder and writer. Together these authorities have produced a worthwhile addition for the libraries of Burmese fanciers. The book contains a great deal of information of both a practical and historical nature to please the breed's devotees. The 46 photographs are a delight.

While the question is still hotly debated in the U.S.A. and Canada, the U.K. does recognize the Burmese in other colors besides the traditional Brown (Sable). Breeding began on both sides of the Atlantic with similar stock so, whether one is in favor of the other colors or not, following the reasoning

behind and development of the colors in the U.K. makes fascinating reading. It will also be seen that Burmese fanciers in the two areas have different conceptions of what a Burmese cat should, ideally, look like.

The authors offer a collection of diet sheets for the pregnant queen, nursing queen and two ages of kittens which each feature no less than 28 meals for a week, and one for the stud cat with 21 tasty suggestions; sketches appear for a kittening box, queen's nesting compartment, stud house, etc. In the appendix is a wealth of material: US/UK standard comparison; pedigrees of early Burmese; color mating chart; gestation table; etc.

The varied aspects of breeding concerning the stud cat, queen, and the subsequent birth and rearing of kittens receive 30 pages of advice.

Ever wonder why a female adult cat is known as a 'queen'? The authors suggest that the term might be derived from 'quean' meaning 'hussy'---how appropriate!###

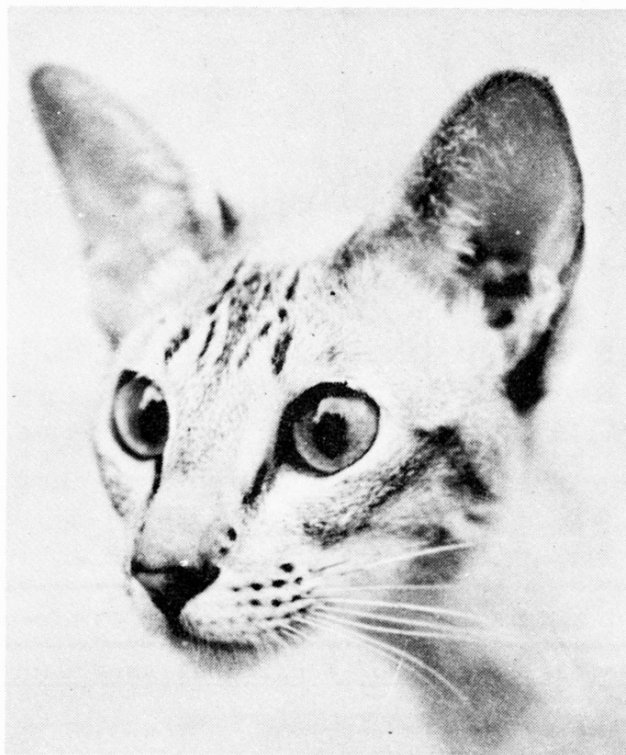
only take place in an international show with at least 100 participating cats. After passing the examination, the apprentice becomes a national judge for either Longhairs or Shorthairs, never both at the same time. To become an international judge, a person must judge in three different stadiums: first kittens and litters, second open classes (CAC-P) and, finally, champion classes (CAC-P-IB), under the supervision of an international judge who reports the results to FIFE (there is no second examination to pass).

It used to take six years to become an allround judge but now it takes eight. It takes nine years to become an international allround judge as one has to do the three stadiums of judging. Therefore, to become an international Longhair judge takes 5 years and to become an international Shorthair judge takes seven years (we can't yet become Siamese or AOS-judge).

BREEDING PROGRAMMES

Because of our quarantine regulation, our possibilities to show cats and to use stud cats in countries other than Norway and Finland are very limited. This creates severe problems in our breeding programmes which we try to overcome by importing cats from Great Britain. Imports from other countries, even Denmark, require a four month quarantine.

We have very strict registration rules, probably more so than most countries, and this has both advantages and disadvantages. FIFE and SVERAK have restrictions against matings between colour-varieties within different breeds, i.e. we are not allowed by FIFE to mate Chinchilla Silver with Shaded Silver, nor are we permitted to mate the classical Siamese colours with the new varieties freely by SVERAK. All this decreases the numbers of

possible matings considerably and makes the situation very difficult for the smaller breeds.

On the other hand, it is prohibited to use animals without a veterinary certificate stating that the cat is free from umbilical hernia and, in males, the absence of cryptorchidism. This helps us to get healthy cats without defects and we have already noticed a decrease of umbilical hernias which very few show cats have nowadays in Sweden.

We hope that *CAT WORLD* readers, through this report, will gain an idea about the fancy in Sweden. Later we will be back with another article on our internal club work and more details of our governing organisation and registration matter.###

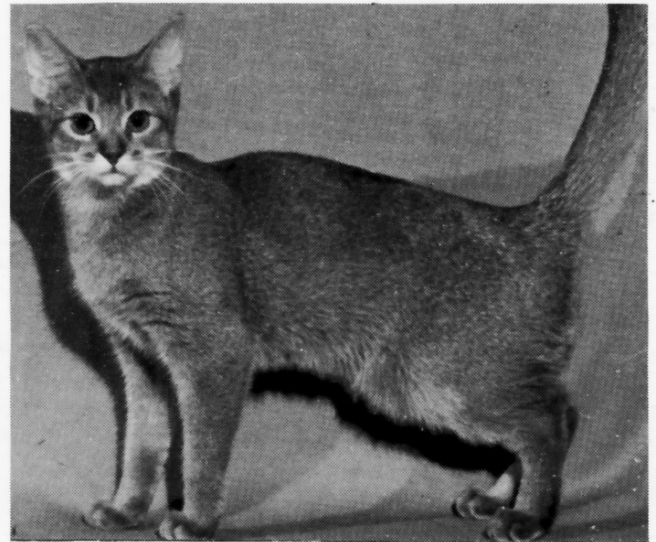
