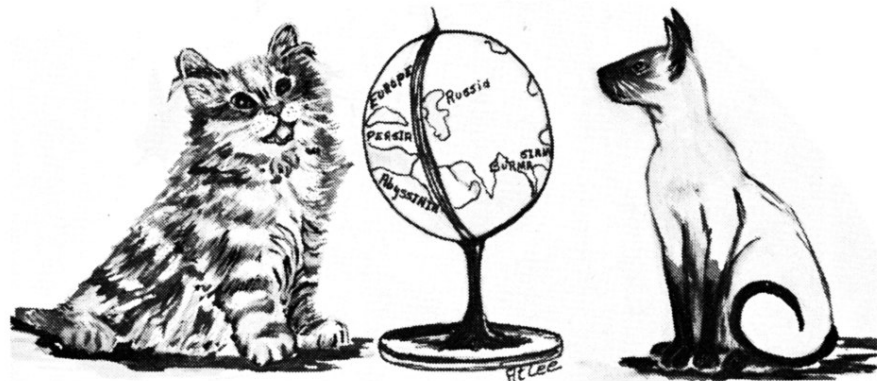

PIA HOLLENSTEIN, PRESIDENT, FIFE, TELLS WHAT HAPPENS
AT SHOWS IN

PARIS, AMSTERDAM, STUTTGART

Let us start with THE exhibition which approximately 50 years ago set the milestone on the European Continent for the annual International Cat Show organised by the FIFE (*Federation Internationale Feline*), the big, sophisticated Parisian exhibition. In 1974 it inaugurated the Centre International de Paris du Palais des Congres, a new, very modern center designed for all types of exhibitions. It has several halls surrounded by a maze of modern shops illuminated by coloured lights, an image of Paris with its luxurious artistic decor so typical of the capital of France.

The hall where the cats are shown is huge, the ceiling decorated with lots of gleaming crystal lamps that shine the whole day. At least 580 cats are present and some turned away due to lack of space. Cats of all breeds attend from France, Italy, Germany, Belgium, Holland, Austria and Switzerland.

In order to judge such a great number of cats, at least a dozen judges (longhair, siamese, shorthair and all-round) are needed. The pens are assembled in great squares, each one having different colour varieties. In the center of each one there is space for the

judges. In the afternoon, after the main judging is over, the exhibitors may sit in these squares by their cats. The visitors circulate around the outside of the squares. These square islands are decorated with plants and bushes, and the walls are covered with colorful flags of all the countries participating at the show.

JUDGING AT THE PARIS SHOW

Each judge has a mobile table and is assisted by two to three stewards. The doors of the pens face the inside of the square where the judge works. A steward lifts the cat out of its pen and puts it on the judge's table continuing to hold it until the judge touches, examines and appraises. The judge then writes his report on the cat in a judging book. The numbers of about eight cats, their classification and qualification, appear on the right side of this book and there is space on the left side for the judge's notes. One turns the page to find eight more cats in the same class. This arrangement is very clear to look over.

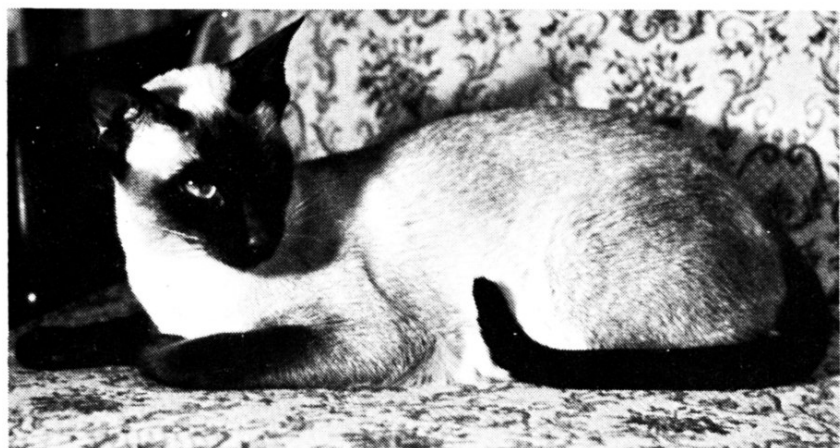
After the judge has examined one class, he selects the three or four best cats and compares them again. He then chooses the best one from these candidates who may win, for example, an Excellent 1 with or without a CAC (*Certificat d'Aptitude de Championat*). He then selects the cat which deserves Excellent II, or Very Good, or Good, followed by the 3rd and 4th place. The remaining cats of the class can only win a qualification but no placing. And so on, from class to class.

A full Champion has to have won three CAC under three different judges in three different shows in the Open Class. An International Champion has to win three CACIB (*Certificat d'Aptitude Internationale de Beaute*) in the Champion Class under two to

three different judges in two countries; one judge can be the same but has to judge the second time in another country. A cat can never win both a CAC and a CACIB.

After completing a color, the judge moves to the next square of pens and begins judging the next color as indicated in his judging book. The exhibitors, not allowed into the square while judging is in progress, observe from a certain distance every movement of the judge. I sometimes enjoy pulling the exhibitor's leg by feinting to ignore a specially beautiful cat during the final selection even though I have already made up my mind that it will receive the CAC. It goes without saying that the owner is thrilled when he wins the unexpected prize!

The full International Champions, again

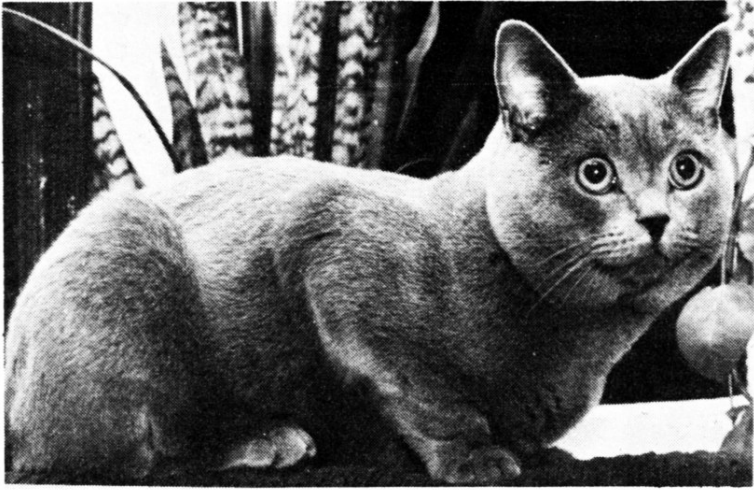

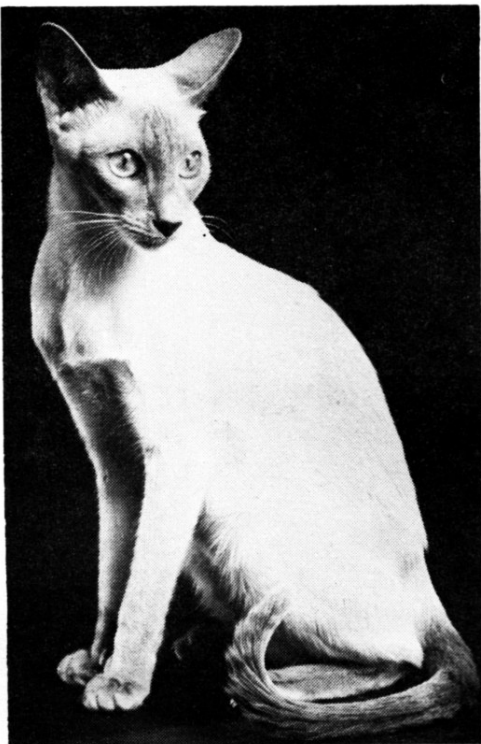

him to participate in the final judging of the "Best In Show" and to take part in both judging panels.

The first day usually ends at 7 PM and a quick judge has finished all his classes by then. Judges and exhibitors return to their hotels. The judges are usually invited for dinner which is known for good French cooking. Some exhibitors prefer, however, to omit dinner and instead visit "Moulin Rouge", "Casino de Paris", "Lido" or to go to the theatre.

SUNDAY IN PARIS

"Best In Show" is judged everywhere after 10 AM the second day. First the Longhairs are considered. Each judge presents his best cat. These cats are shown again, one at a time, on a long table being handed along from judge to judge. Each one is allowed to examine the animal carefully, to touch and lift it up, before passing it on to the next judge in line. There are sometimes ten cats and, when all have been thoroughly appraised and examined, each judge writes on a piece of paper the number he has selected. There is no discussion permitted during this process. The judges hand their folded-over pieces of paper to the

show manager who counts the votes and the cat with the larger number is the winner.

Afterwards, the "Opposite Sex" is voted upon by the same system. The "Best Kitten" is selected in the same way but there is only one winner, (no opposite sex). Next the "Best Longhair Neuter" is chosen.

The hall is crowded at this time and the judging panel is separated from the spectators by a rope. As each winner is announced, he is lifted up for all to see and applauded enthusiastically. Following the ceremony, the cat is put into a separate, specially-built honorary pen to be admired by visitors until the end of the show.

This same procedure is followed to select the "Best In Show" Shorthair winners.

Distribution of prizes begins at 5 PM. Cards are given for CAC or CACIB, for Best In Show, Best Kitten, Best Pair (from the same owner), or Best Group. Honorary prizes are distributed to the Best Male and the Best Female. The cat's owner must win a challenge 3 times before he can own it. Every exhibitor receives a souvenir, the same for everyone, i.e. a cup, a barometer in the shape of a cat, Limoges china; the gift varies each year. The show closes at 6 PM. Afterwards the judges meet at their hotel and talk about their impressions and the beautiful cats. The exhibitors pack their luggage, put their cats in carriers and take plane, train, bus or car back home.

LET'S GO TO AMSTERDAM

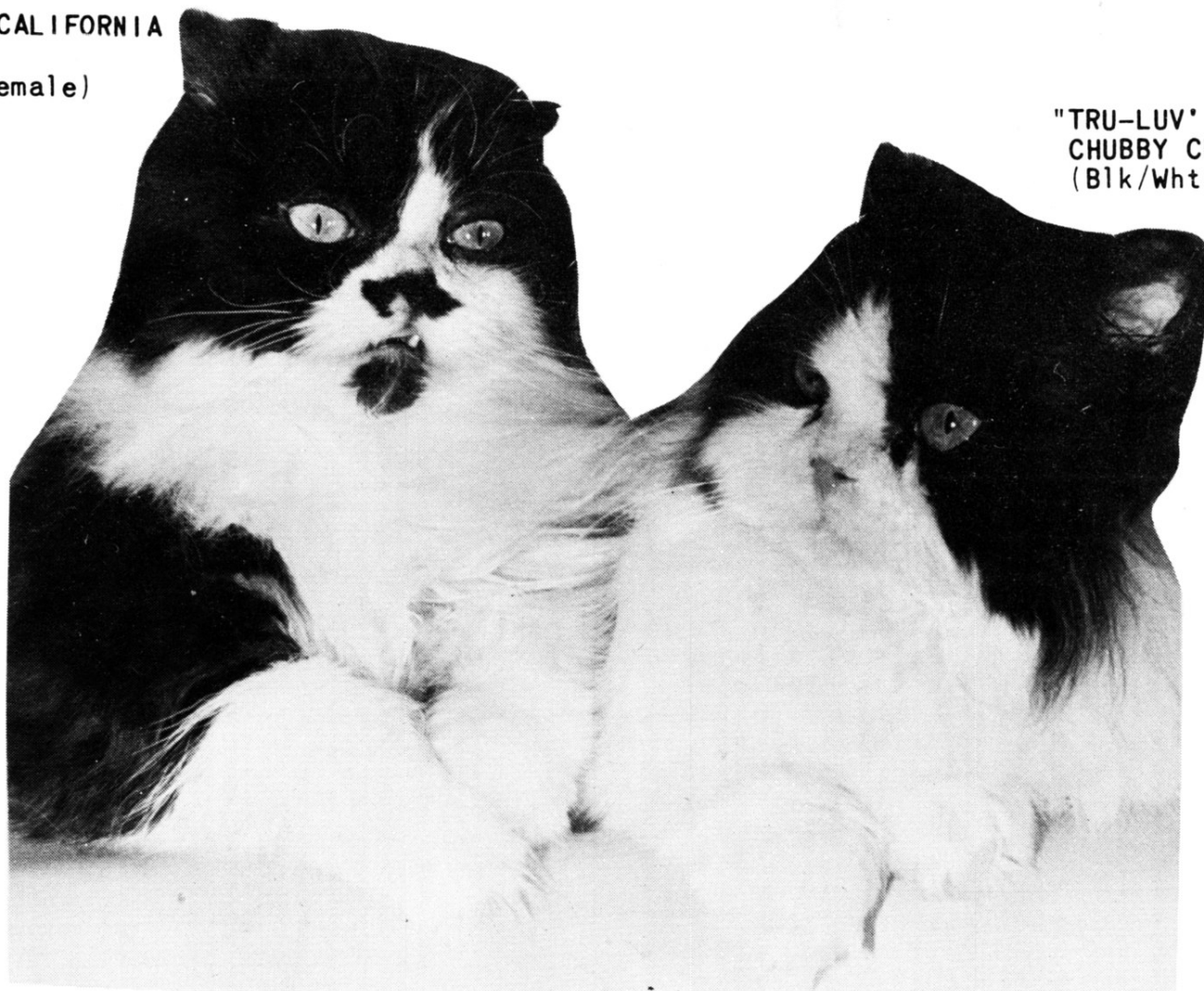
Our next show is Amsterdam, an 11-hour train journey from my home near Zurich, Switzerland. If the Club happens to be generous, a judge can travel by plane which may be risky, however, in the winter due to fog especially in Switzerland and the Nordic countries. I per-

sonally prefer to take the train because a judge's first rule is to be on time.

The Amsterdam show also takes place in a huge hall where there is room for up to a thousand cats. When you walk into this very bright "glass house", the first thing you notice is not the cats but a very nice pool decorated with water-lilies with living pink flamingos strutting around. They do not seem afraid of people but are quite tame and move their wings and flexible necks with a lot of grace.

Here, too, the pens are assembled in big squares whose centers are for the judges. The judging table is not mobile but stands in the same position for two days, isolated from the public by a rope. Two to three stewards carry the cats of each specific class to the judge who has at least ten empty pens in which to hold several cats of an Open Class. Each cat is put on the table and judged in the same manner as described at the Paris show but there is no judging book. Instead, the judge has a sheet of paper with two copies for each cat. This applies to all classes. The complete report for each cat is pinned to the cat's pen, one copy goes to the secretary and the third is kept by the judge. So the judge personally writes down the first prize, excellent and CAC, or any other verdict he chooses. Everything is written and authentic to make sure nothing has been altered. This system is not very practical when judging a large class: the papers are floating around and it is difficult to keep them in order but the exhibitors prefer to know the results as soon as possible. Another drawback to this system is that every exhibitor and all the visitors can read the judge's report. When there is a negative point such as a knot in the end of the tail, or a green circle in the copper eye, it is rather embarrassing for the cat's owner to have it announced so publicly. France and Switzerland prefer to use the more discreet system of the judge typing his report after the show and sending it to show management from whom the exhibitor can get his report.

It is also permitted in France and Swit-

zerland, as well as in Italy, for the exhibitor to get the information direct from the judge after the selection of "Best In Show". I enjoy very much having direct contact with the exhibitor and to discuss the specific cat with him, weighing the advantages and disadvantages and, sometimes, proposing a mating to improve the following generation. I can explain these points in German, French, English and Italian according to the language of the exhibitor. I have learned the technical expressions in these languages as I feel I owe it to the cats to be able to communicate with the cat fanciers. It is very important for a judge to gain the exhibitor's confidence. This personal contact is part of the reason I receive so many requests to judge.

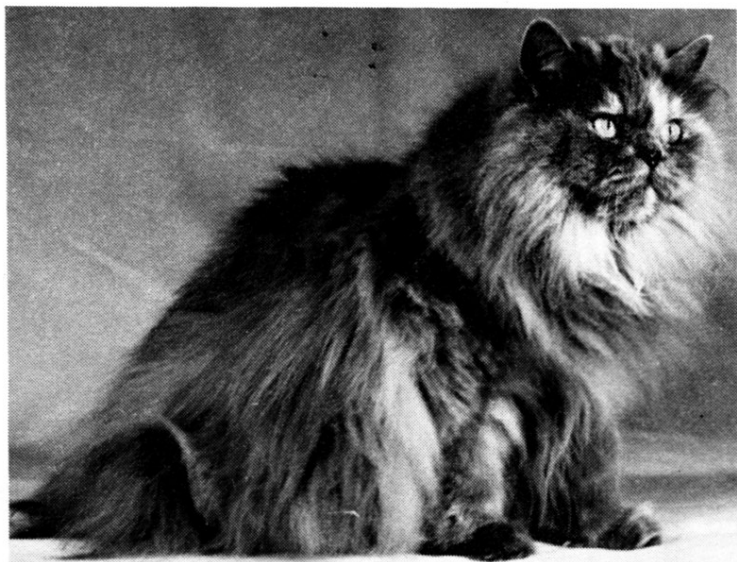
The Chinchilla classes in Amsterdam are especially big and outstanding in type. There are also big Siamese classes in every color with very good type. I think Scandinavia has the best Siamese breeders: they have purebred Seal Points for five generations back which is so seldom seen nowadays.

In Amsterdam, as in other FIFE shows, the procedure for "Best In Show" judging is the same as described for Paris and prize distribution is also similar. Exhibitors' souvenirs are usually ceramics from Delft or candles painted with Delft-blue designs. During the Saturday evening dinner, every judge receives an original gift such as a silver lipstick, silver pill box, etc. The dinner is followed by entertainment: music, dancing and speeches. There is a lot of excitement and many exhibitors enjoy themselves until dawn.

ON ... TO GERMANY

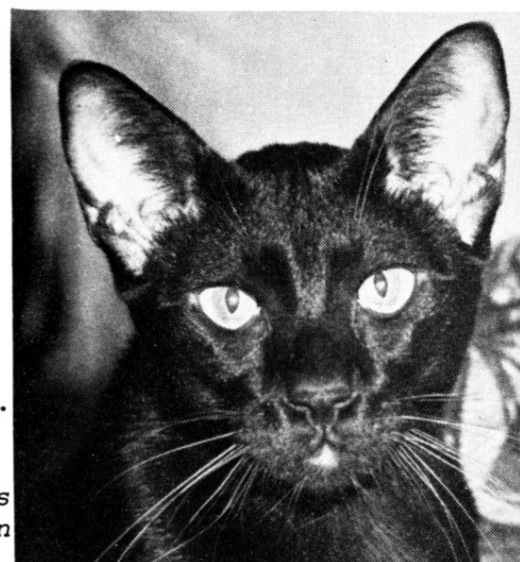
The German exhibition accepts the largest number of cats. In 1974, a hall in Stuttgart was chosen which can house over 1,000 cats. Every judge - there are more than 18 - has his own judging table by a window so clear daylight facilitates the examination of fur and eyes.

The pens are erected in long straight lines with several meters space between to allow the crowd to circulate easily. Again,



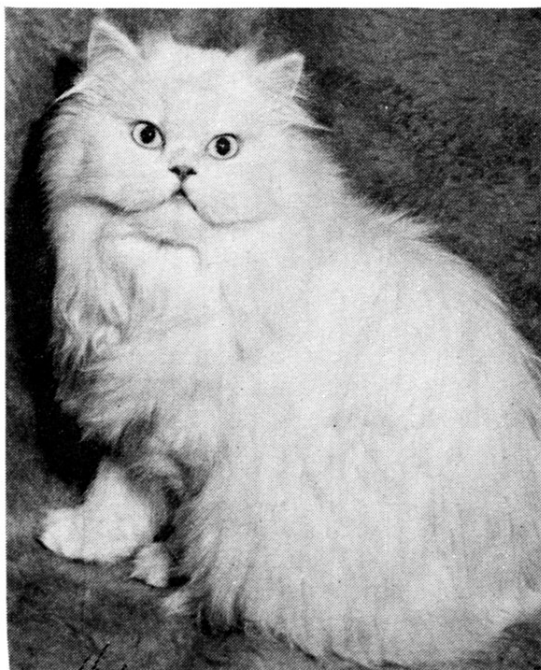

the cats are not judged by the pens and a handwritten report is attached to each rating card. Just like in Holland, there is no judging book, only loose paper with three copies per cat.

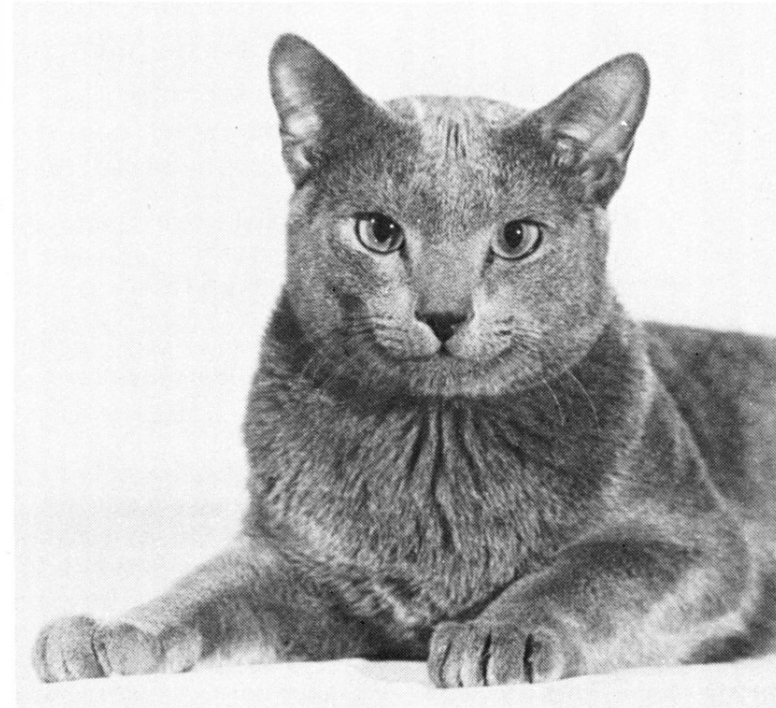
White cushions or woollen blanket can be placed in the pen; the curtains should be white, too, but colored curtains are allowed. Pale green curtains behind a chinchilla and a beautiful blue behind cream shows off the colors much better. Following class judging, the pens are decorated with cards, medals, flowers and flags.

Sometimes one cat is exhibited in three or four classes. Apart from the Open (i.e. champion class), the cat can be judged as a pair or in a group with other cats of the same owner. This applies also to the national class, the breeder class, or the import class. For example, via his direct descendants, a male can compete with other males for the title of Best Longhair Stud Male, a female for Best Queen. A similar title can also be competed for by Siamese and other Shorthair cats. Eight-week old kittens are shown in company with their dam or wet-nurse for the title "Best Litter".

At this show, every judge is assisted not only by two to three stewards but also by a judging student who sits by the table to observe how the judge selects the cats. He takes notes and questions the judge after each class has been completed but is not allowed to talk during the actual judging unless spoken to by the judge. I usually test my students as follows. I ask them which of the three selected cats will take the first and second place. If the answer is correct, I want to know whether the first prize winner merits a CAC or not; many pupils fail to give the right answer to that question. Sometimes I ask in the middle of the work: "What qualification would you give to this male?" I often ask this question when the animal is second rate and one has to decide whether very

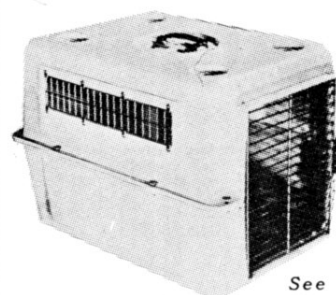

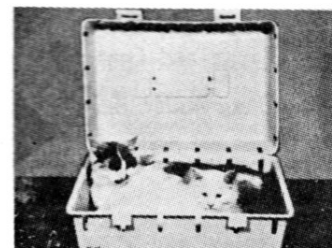

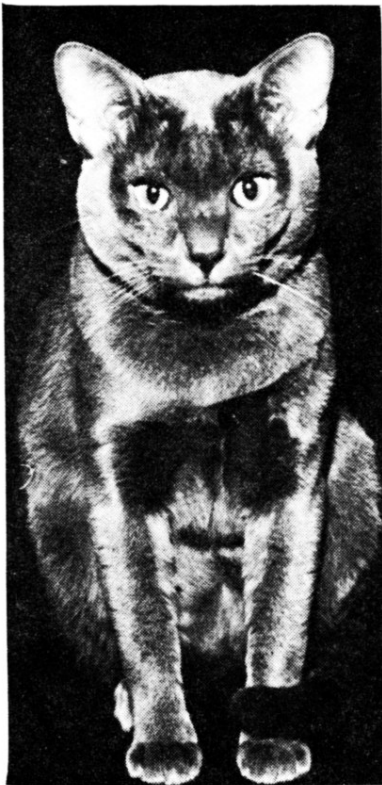

College Of Cat Genetics

STUDY UNIT 16

Earlier articles have explained that mutants reported in the cat can be studied through breeding records and pedigrees in order that the method of inheritance can be ascertained. Studies are made by the collection of facts through observation, and facts can be defined as observations that can be confirmed by other people. A researcher must be able to repeat the matings from which he has obtained his facts and these matings must also be repeatable by other researchers or breeders.

Observations include all information obtained through the senses, or through scientific instruments such as microscopes which are extensions of the senses. Information which can be said to be fact (as above) becomes data and the collection of data is the foundation upon which all research into cat genetics is based.

Generally speaking, breeders have no difficulty in agreeing upon the facts, i.e. how many kits in a litter, what sex, what colour, etc. However, the point where controversy may arise is when the facts are interpreted. When a genetic researcher interprets facts, he usually does this in the light of a particular hypothesis.

Genetic research is like detective work and the geneticist, like a detective, is continually working with a view to solving problems. Einstein said that before solving a problem the situation must be investigated and the facts of the case collected. The creative part of the work of the genetic researcher comes when he makes a suggestion for the solution of the problem. Suggestions, or tentative solutions, have to account for all the known facts and should also predict what other events have happened or will happen. Such a tentative solution is called a hypothesis. On the basis of his hypothesis the genetic researcher looks for further clues. If the new clues tend to support the hypothesis then that hypothesis is said to be strengthened but if they tend to contradict it then the hypothesis must be revised or even discarded. It is not unusual for a number of hypotheses to be tested before a solution to a problem is found.

Probably the formation of a hypothesis is the most creative activity in science--a great many hypotheses have been said by their originators to be lucky guesses or hunches

although extensive background knowledge is obviously necessary in order to form the hunch.

Some researchers use the word theory instead of hypothesis, but the definition generally accepted is that a hypothesis describes the initial attempt to solve the problem and that if it stands repeated testing it may be called a theory.

So, firstly, a hypothesis must explain the problem and account for all the data related to the problem. Then it must explain the relationship of the data to the problem and, most important, it must lead to the prediction of new information. If experiments subsequently confirm the prediction, then the hypothesis gains support.

A hypothesis must be tested by experiments (if in the case of genetic research, by test matings), and as new data is predicted it must be confirmed through observation and test matings. Controlled test matings attempt to make certain that only one problem is being tested at a time.

EXPERIMENTAL BREEDING

"Experimental breeding" have become dirty words in the cat fancy mostly because of the "trial and error" methods adopted by some of its members, reminiscent of the medieval alchemists trying to produce gold. "Trial and error" methods are usually known as empiricism, their procedure being based almost entirely upon observations of experiments made where hypotheses are not used. Thus empirical knowledge can be said to be that gained through direct observation. As a method, empiricism has little to commend it and is usually a slow and unsuccessful process not to be recommended unless there is no other alternative.

True experimental breeding--test matings based on hypotheses for particular problems--

is quite different and its results can confer great benefit on the fancy. Therefore, to consider any one problem in cat genetics, it is necessary to collect facts which can be repeated and verified. The controlled test mating is important in the testing of a hypothesis.

Having considered the importance of controlled experiment whenever possible, the fact that the raw material for genetic knowledge of the cat is the cat himself immediately draws attention to the fact that some matings are not planned by the breeders and that the results are often useful as extra fact which can help to prove or disprove hypotheses on which controlled test matings may also be made. Therefore, while there is little to commend in the mating of two cats from different breeds or with different characteristics just to see what will happen, details of matings made accidentally between such cats may well become valuable data in the hands of the experienced genetic researcher and can often form the basis on which a hypothesis may be made.

It may seem odd that the biggest contribution towards an understanding of cat genetics has been made by the mouse. The mouse, which breeds quickly and easily, is one of the most popular animals for biomedical research and thus provides the largest amount of breeding data likely to be accurately recorded.

The mutant genes of the cat have largely been perpetuated by cat fancies rather than geneticists, but when information on mammalian species is compared it is at once seen that the variants reported in the cat are often similar in methods of inheritance or effect or both to those already studied in the mouse.

Thus, a study of mouse genetics is both practical and valuable for the genetic researcher and can often give a starting point for study of a problem in the cat.###

7 ... Show from "Champion" to "Grand"

For those who find show rules and categories confusing, this may be a good place to explain a little on the breakdown of an All Breed show, other than that of Kittens, Championship and Premiership as previously explained.

An All Breed show is basically divided into two groups: the Longhaired cats and the Shorthaired cats. Taking a look first at the Longhairs (for they are listed first in the catalog), the following breeds are at present accepted for Championship competition:

BALINESE. Colors: Chocolate Point, Seal Point, Lilac Point and Blue Point.

BIRMAN (Sacred Cat of Burma). Colors: Same as Balinese.

HIMALAYAN. Colors: Same as Balinese plus Flame Point, Tortie Point and Blue-Cream Pt.

PERSIAN. As there are so many colors in the Persian breed, it is sub-divided into Divisions as follows:

Solid Color Divn. Colors: White (Blue-eyed, Copper-eyed & Odd-eyed), Blue, Black, Red, Peke-Face Red, Cream;

Shaded Divn. Colors: Chinchilla and Shaded Silver, Shell and Shaded Cameo;

Smoke Divn. Colors: Black Smoke, Blue Smoke & Red Smoke;

Tabby Divn. Colors: Silver, Red, Brown, Blue, Cream and Cameo Tabbies - both in Classic and Mackerel patterns, also Peke-Face Red Tabby;

Parti-Color Division. Colors: Tortoise-shell, Calico, Dilute Calico, Blue-Cream & Bi-Color. (The latter may be Red & White, Blue & White, Cream & White or Black & White.)

TURKISH ANGORA. Color: White. Eye color may be Blue, Amber or Odd-Eye (one eye blue and one amber).

The judge will award a "Best Champion" win in each of the Longhair Breeds and Divisions, with all these winning Champions competing at the end of the show for "Best and 2nd Best Longhair Champion" (e.g. the Best Himalayan Champion will compete with the Best Parti-Color Champion, etc., etc.) This does not mean that each of these champions will be brought back to the judging ring for comparison. The judge keeps a very accurate and detailed Summary Sheet of the cats and only occasionally when it comes to a very close decision are several cats called back to be seen together before the final award is made. This is often referred to as "tie-breaking" or "eliminations" by exhibitors.

The Shorthaired cats are divided into separate Breeds and the ones presently accepted for championship status are as follows:

ABYSSINIAN. Colors: Red and Ruddy;

AMERICAN SHORTHAIR. Colors: the same as the Persian class except that the Peke-Face Red and Peke-Face Red Tabby are omitted.

BURMESE. Color: Sable.

COLORPOINT SHORTHAIR. Colors: Solid Color Point, Lynx Point and Parti-Color Point.

EXOTIC SHORTHAIR. Colors: Same as American Shorthair.

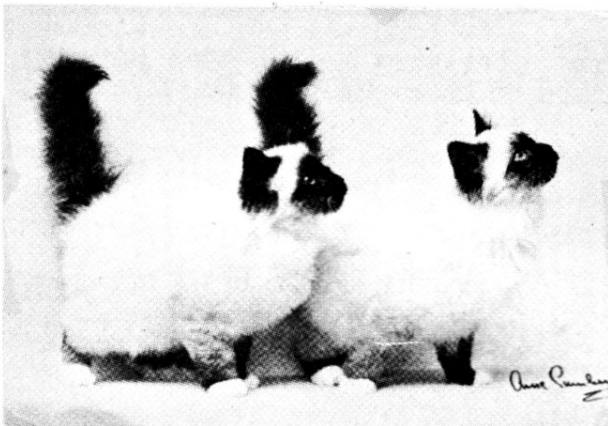
HAVANA BROWN. Color: Brown.

KORAT. Color: Silver Blue.

MANX. Colors: Same as American Shorthair except for the Cameo colors which are omitted, plus a class for O.M.C. (Other Manx Colors) such as Tabby & White.

REX. Colors: Same as American Shorthairs except for Cameos, plus O.R.C. (Other Rex Col-

SIAMESE. Colors: Chocolate Point, Seal Point, Lilac Point and Blue Point.

The Shorthair champions compete for "Best Champion of Breed" and then on to "Best & 2nd Best Shorthair Champion".

At the end of an All Breed show, the two winning Longhair champions will compete with the two winning Shorthair champions for "Best & 2nd Best Champion in Show".

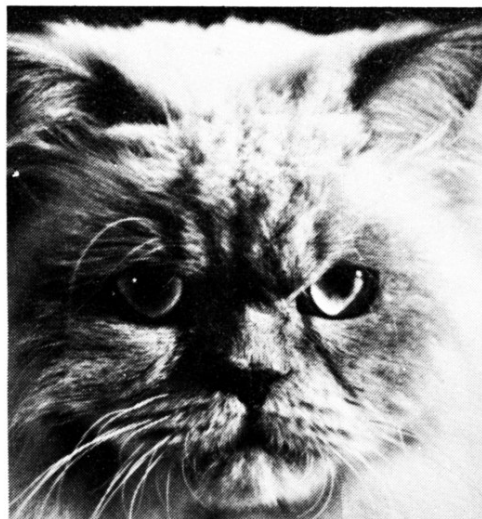
HOW TO BECOME A GRAND CHAMPION

To work towards a Grand Championship, a champion must accumulate 150 'Grand' points. Such points are earned by the defeat of other champions. Your new champion begins her count by winning a "Best Champion of Breed or Division" award. To be eligible for such an award, your Seal Point Siamese female must first win her own Champion class (exclusively Seal Point Siamese female Champions) and she is then considered with the first-place male and female winners of the Siamese Champion classes for the other three colors and the Seal Point male. If she wins the title "Best Siamese Champion", she will gain one Grand Championship point for every Siamese champion that she defeated, e.g. if there were two Chocolate Point champions (either sex), six Seal Points, four Lilac Points and six Blue Points present and competing, she would have gained seventeen 'Grand' points (she does not get a point for herself, so if there are eighteen champions she gets seventeen points),

Although a cat may defeat other champions in winning first place in its class, it **MUST** win "Best Siamese Champion" to gain any 'Grand' points. The judge does not choose a 2nd Best Champion of Breed but a cat that is also a Siamese champion could possibly win "2nd Best Champion" in the ultimate finals if a Siamese was "Best Champion in Show". To receive the latter award, the cat would have to have been "Best Siamese Champion" **FIRST**. Even a red (second place) ribbon winner in the same color class could win a "2nd Best Champion in Show" in the finals, too.

The judge also awards "Best and 2nd Best of Breed or Division" ("Best and 2nd Best Siamese" in this case), selecting from the Novice, Open, Champion and Grand Champion Siamese entries, but at this point we are only concerned with the champion wins which carry 'Grand' points.

The next step in accumulating 'Grand' points at a show is the award "Best Shorthair Champion". If your cat is very good and wins this, she will gain one 'Grand' point for every shorthair champion of any breed and of either sex that this award indicates she has defeated. If she does not get that cherished win, but does get "2nd Best Shorthair Champion", she will gain 90% of the points won by the "Best Shorthair Champion". Incidentally, if she wins either "Best or 2nd Best Shorthair Champion", she automatically **DROPS** the points won as "Best Siamese Champion" and

takes the greater amount, but not both. The winner of the "Best Champion in Show" in the All Breed ring gets one 'Grand' point for every champion present and competing - both Longhair and Shorthair - and then the points really mount up. "2nd Best Champion in Show" in the All Breed ring gets 90% of the points won by Best Champion. Needless to say, these are very big wins and cause much excitement for such a win will put your cat well on the way to her Grand Championship.

When the required 150 points are won under at least three different judges, you will be notified by Central Office. You do NOT have to claim this highest of CFA awards. It has been CFA's practice to send confirmation of the Grand Championship by Air Mail Special Delivery, usually on the Thursday following the show at which your cat completed the requirements for Grand.

Let me hasten to add here that it is EXTREMELY difficult for a cat to win a Grand Championship and he/she must be exceptionally good to do so. Although it is a good thing to set one's sights high, do not expect your first cat to breeze through a few shows and emerge effortlessly as a Grand Champion! This happens to only a few cats and, although it is possible in a large show for a champion to "grand" in one show, these cats are few and far between. Nevertheless, if and when the time comes that you receive confirmation of a Grand Championship, do not forget - in all the excitement - to transfer the cat at the next show to the Grand Champion class!###

The quality of these Burmese is remarkable. Great credit is due to the Kemps for their choice of breeding stock to produce such a fine cat as KEOWEE. Not to be overlooked in his shadow were two absolutely spectacular females: Mr. and Mrs. C.E. Mozley bred something very special in SIM-SAM'S MAGIC MOMENT, and John Catlin's ARIADNE is a show stopper. The progeny of MAGIC MOMENT and ARIADNE should assure the future of the breed.

BREEDING BURMESE

There are certain precepts that apply not only to Burmese but to all breeds. Perhaps it would be a good idea to tack up a few rules on the cattery door to keep each of us ever mindful of our original good intentions.

1. KEEP THE POPULATION DOWN. It costs just as much to feed a poor cat as a good one. Overcrowded catteries lead to disease. Do not overbreed; constantly weed out to good homes those cats which will add nothing to your line.

2. FEED YOUR CATS WELL. Find out what diet produces the strongest and healthy stock for you and stick to it.

3. BREED FOR HEALTH AND KEEP THEM HEALTHY. Be certain that your cats receive their regular immunizations. Worm periodically according to your veterinarian's instructions.

4. BE OBJECTIVE AND CRITICAL OF YOUR OWN STOCK. Look at your cats as if they belonged to someone else. What would you think about them under such circumstances?

5. DO NOT BEAT A PATH TO THE LATEST GREAT WINNING STUD. Go to the older stud, the one whose progeny have done well also. Try to see his littermates for you will be getting their genes too. The older stud, or older dam, has longevity built in, an important consideration for your lines.

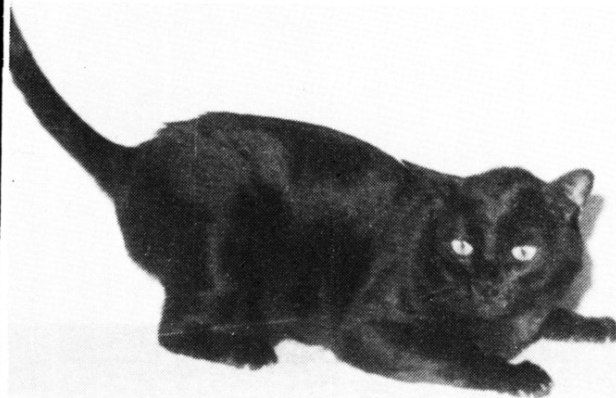
6. DO NOT BE A GADABOUT visiting every cattery around; and, at the same time, keep visitors out of your cattery. You may be very social-minded and enjoy cat people, but you won't enjoy their germs. Every cattery has its own community of viral agents that are potentially dangerous. While your cats may be resistant to infectious agents in their own environment, they may succumb to visiting germs.

7. ENJOY AND LOVE YOUR CATS. A few healthy cats, whether they win or not, are a joy. Too many cats become a burden to look after and an expense to feed.

Everyone has to start somewhere. If Burmese are your cup of tea, then look at all the Burmese in as many shows as possible. Read as much as you can about the breed but do not be overwhelmed by flashy advertisements. Get to know Burmese breeders and see how they measure up. Before you buy, find out which breeders are reputable in every way. Be certain that you understand the differences between pet stock, breeding stock and show quality Burmese. If you buy breeding or show quality, then pedigree, blue slip and/or registration papers should be in your hands when you pay for the cat. If your newly acquired cat becomes ill, the most common problem is the ignorance of the buyer in not knowing how to care for a new cat. All too often a reputable breeder takes the brunt of the criticism and ignorance of a new breeder who really wasn't prepared to care for a new cat in the first place.

When you buy a Burmese, find a short, well-rounded, well-balanced cat. It should all hang together; by weight and sturdiness the Burmese should feel like a locomotive but if when you pick up the Burm it seems to come up with several cars behind the locomotive then it is too long. There should be good width to the chest and shoulders. One learns what is right by looking at many cats. The head should be well-rounded and the top should be a dome pushing apart two small bat ears. The eyes should be well-rounded and deep gold in color. The nose break requires study and comparison. It is one of the finer points of the breed. The chin should be firm and not underslung. The coat should be short, glistening brown, without any marks, and the hairs should be brown to the roots. There are many other fine points, but the most important features of the Burm are its bone structure and sleek brown coat. Read the Burmese standard, honed to its unachievable fineness by many breeders; see in your mind's eye what the words mean.

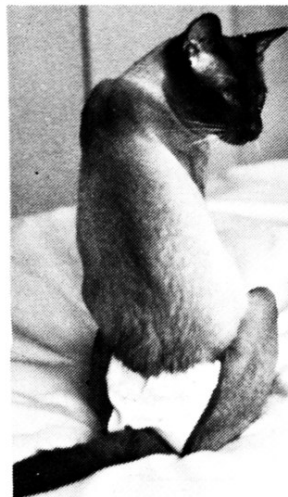

THE BURMESE QUEEN

No cat is happier than a pregnant cat. No cat is more beautiful than the Burmese queen with her babies. While she is awaiting your bundle of trouble, the Burmese matron should receive an excellent diet and prenatal vitamins. The expectant Burm should continue to be muscular and well exercised.

It is assumed that the breeder knows the expected date of confinement and has alerted the veterinarian of the date. Your queen will start building a nest a week or so ahead of time and tear up every box you arrange if you do so too soon. A day before the expected event, put a large, deep box in a quiet area; place it next to your bed as it cuts down on a lot of wear and tear on you. No children or other animals should be in the room until the kittens have been born and are well established. Line the box with several layers of clean newspaper on top of which should be placed some soft washable material.

When the queen is ready, she will dis-

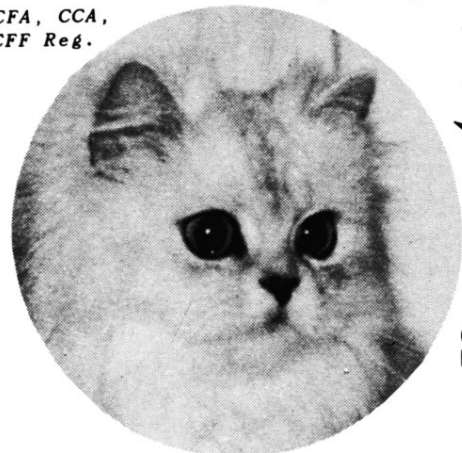

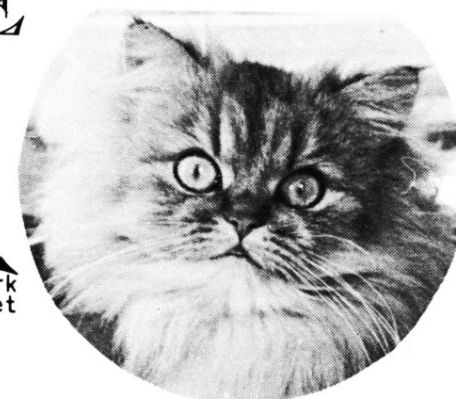

charge droplets of liquid and begin having contractions. If labor continues without difficulty, a kitten will soon appear either head or feet first. Do not be alarmed by a breech birth for if you become frightened your fear and anxiety will be immediately sensed by the dam. Reassure and calm her between contractions, but do not push on her abdomen. If the remainder of the kitten does not deliver within a few minutes, notify your veterinarian and follow his advice. Kittens may deliver with membranes intact. It is important to gently free the kitten's head from the membranes if the dam does not do so immediately. With gentle care, wipe the kitten's face clean of secretions and see that it breathes. Shortly thereafter, the placenta or afterbirth will deliver and the mother will sever the umbilical cord and eat the placenta. If she does not do this within a reasonable time, cut the cord with sterile scissors. Be certain that you cut at least an inch or two away from the kitten's belly. All will proceed well if you are prepared. With experience you will instinctively know when you need help. The best advice is to seek advice whenever you are in doubt.

WEANING KITTENS

As a general rule, kittens will accept food

at 4 weeks of age. However, if the litter is large, the breeder has been providing supplemental feeding from age 24 to 48 hours. If the litter is small, the kittens may be large and fat and accept food at 2 to 3 weeks of age. For many years, the author weaned kittens on an evaporated milk formula but times change and ideas do, too. I start kittens on cereal and egg yolks (no bacon) with prenatal vitamins added. Get them to accept the food from a small spoon at first and then teach them to lap the soft food from a flat saucer.

The second meal after soft cereal is eaten should be strained meat, usually lamb which is easily digested. Mix the meat in with the cereal and egg yolks. Supplement the four daily meals with a portion of Esbilac. As the kittens grow older, mix powdered Esbilac in the cereal-meat mixture. Next add cooked ground meat and, finally, raw meat. In spite of the horrors of toxoplasmosis, I believe cats are still carnivores and thrive on raw meat. By eight weeks, the kittens should be completely weaned and eating a regular diet. Unlike many others who advise otherwise, I do not have great faith in canned foods fed unsupplemented. Vitamins should be added according to the manufacturer's directions to one meal daily. This is particularly true for kittens.

GROOMING BURMESE

If ever a breed was ready for the show ring at a moment's notice it is the Burmese. If the Burmese has been well fed and groomed regularly, then there is little to do for the show. Any cat should be in show condition at any time. The Burmese should be bathed regularly and this is easily accomplished by sponging off the cat with undiluted Listerine once a week. The bathing area should be draft free and the cat should be rubbed dry with a soft towel. The coat should be gently brushed and combed when the cat is bone dry. Obviously, ears should be cleaned and nails clipped.

The coat of the Burmese should be brown, short and glistening. Much of this is accomplished by breeding and diet. However, if the Burmese is kept too cold, the coat will lengthen; if the cat is kept too warm, the coat

HIGHLIGHTS OF FEBRUARY, 1976, BOARD MEETING

The CFA Board of Directors held a meeting in San Francisco on February 21-22, 1976. The following report is taken from my notes and is incomplete and unofficial. Minutes will be reported in the next *CFA QUARTERLY*.

NATIONAL AWARDS

The CFA National awards cash prizes will be increased for the 1976/'77 show season when CFA discontinues participation in All-American scoring. Another change will be the replacement of national kitten awards with a Best Kitten award in each region. It is hoped that this change will discourage over-campaigning of kittens throughout the country.

REGISTRATIONS

In the future, breeders will be required to sign each "Blue Slip" for individual registration as well as the litter registration form. This should give the breeder more protection and eliminate some misunderstandings and disputes.

JUDGING PROGRAM

The following advancements were made:
To Apprentice LH: Donna Davis, John Dawe, Al Lunde, Donna Norris, Sheila Reyes; *To Approval Pending LH:* Russ Haussman; *To Approval Pending AS:* Carolyn Owen, Earl Sandefur; *To Apprentice SH:* John Connaughton, Don Swanson; *To Apprentice AS:* John Royal; *To Approval Pending AB:* Walt Friend, Georgette Wawrzyn; *To Approved LH:* Theodore Napolski; *Accepted as SH Trainees:* Sylvia Fitzgerald, Thomas In-sall, Marsha Saleh.

A resignation was accepted with regret from Mary Alice Farrell, apprentice longhair judge.

For one-day all LH or one-day all SH shows, no more than one trainee will be authorized by the Judging Program Chairman to

do color-class training. The reason is to restrict overhandling of the cats.

All Approved and Approval Pending Judges on the current list were relicensed for one year.

BREED STANDARDS

Results of all Breed Council Questionnaires were reviewed and, where the breeders had cast a clearly decisive vote for a change, revision to the standard was considered. A brief resume of changes that were adopted follows, but see the new Standards when issued for official wording.

AMERICAN SHORTHAIR: Open registry will be continued.

BALINESE: New tail description adopted; crossed eyes will be penalized; any kink in tail will be disqualifying as will a definite double coat (i.e. "downy" undercoat).

COLORPOINT SHORTHAIR: Kittens born on or after Jan. 1, 1977 must have only Siamese or Colorpoint Shorthair parentage.

HIMALAYAN: All items on the questionnaire were adopted except that the Self Chocolate and Self Lilac colors, which were not favored by that Breed Council, failed to be accepted.

KORAT: Eye color will be described as "luminous".

MANX: The general description will be revised. Inability to stand or walk properly will be disqualifying. After Jan. 1, 1977, Persians will not be permitted as parents for Long-haired Manx (for registration purposes).

Research Committee Report

At this stage of its existence, the Reference Center has developed a more meaningful relationship to our breeders than might have been expected. We had had good rapport with our Panel of Veterinary Scientists. Two papers have been contributed for our use; these have come from Dr. Susan Cotter of Angell Memorial Hospital and Dr. James Morris of the University of California. Dr. Robert Cello, also of the University of California, has given us a volume of material for future use.

Our Panel of Breeders is working hard to establish communication between themselves and specific breed groups. The difficulty here is the fact that breeders are reluctant to discuss with others the fact that they have problems. They do not wish to attach stigma to their respective catteries or to a particular breed of cat. It will take time for all of us to realize that all catteries have problems and until we are open and forthright, secret problems will remain unsolved. Free and objective discussion which remains devoid of bias will have to come if we are to be truly successful.

COTTER:

FELINE LEUKEMIA:

THE MAKING OF A VACCINE

The immune response to the feline leukemia virus (FeLV) has been studied for some time. It has been known for several years that when exposed to FeLV under natural conditions, cats will respond in various ways.

1. Some cats will develop lymphosarcoma or a related disease such as aplastic anemia. These cats are unable to mount an effective immune response or have an overwhelming exposure.

2. They may produce antibody to the feline oncornavirus cell membrane antigen (FOCMA). This is an antibody directed against host cells which have been transformed into malignant cells by the FeLV. If this antibody is produced, the cat can eliminate these abnormal cells before any detectable disease is produced. This is an example of immune surveillance. Cats with high FOCMA antibody titers are immune to lymphosarcoma.

3. They may produce virus neutralizing antibody and thus eliminate FeLV from the body. It is possible for a cat to produce FOCMA antibody and not produce neutralizing antibody, in which case the cat would remain a healthy carrier of FeLV. If the FOCMA titer drops at a later time, the cat may develop lymphosarcoma.

4. They may produce both types of antibody and remain negative for virus and have some degree of immunity to lymphosarcoma. This is what happens to the majority of naturally exposed cats. Leukemia cluster households usually have more extensive exposure situations so carriers occur more frequently.

Initial experiments with vaccines have

FIRST REPORTS INDICATE PROBLEM AREAS

Reports have been received from panelists involved with the Abyssinian, Balinese, Color-Point SH, Havana Brown, Himalayan, Korat, Maine Coon, Manx, Rex, Russian Blue, Siamese and Turkish Angora breeds. The problems which require attention are:

1. Chronic gingivitis in FeLV negative cats.
2. Breeding problems with queens in the form of cystic ovaries, resorption and failure to conceive.
3. Eosinophilic granuloma.
4. Cerebellar ataxia.
5. Deafness.

SCOTT:

CATTERY DESIGN & MANAGEMENT AS IT INFLUENCES SPREAD OF INFECTIOUS DISEASE

The design and operation of a cattery can have a significant influence on the spread of infectious diseases. One should try to minimize this spread as much as possible, and should be aware of the degree of "isolation" or "prevention" being exercised in the daily operation of the cattery.

MODE OF SPREAD OF INFECTIOUS DISEASES

A. Cat to Cat (direct)

1. Contact--licking, rubbing, coital.
2. Aerosol.
3. Common feed and water dishes, litter pans, runs, cages.
4. Vertical (in utero, neonatal).
5. Carrier animals.
6. Iatrogenic-diseases of medical progress.
 - a. FVR in cats given corticosteroids.
 - b. Immunosuppression.

B. Indirect

1. Fomites--feed dishes, uncleaned cages, brushes.
2. Aerosol--long distances.
3. Contaminated vaccines, drugs, syringes, equipment, etc.
4. Hands and clothing of people. Very important.
5. Feed.

AIMS OF ISOLATION FACILITY

1. Prevent entrance of infectious agent.
2. Prevent its spread within facility.
3. Prevent its escape from facility.
4. Protect personnel.

WAYS OR FACTORS USED TO PREVENT SPREAD OF INFECTIOUS AGENTS

- A. Distance--causes dilution of agent and reduces both (a) chance of exposure, and (b)

6. Cystitis.
7. Fungus infections.

Now any of these conditions can occur in any breed. In future issues of the "Mercury" section of *CAT WORLD*, reference cards will be published on as many of these conditions as possible.

Perhaps the greatest satisfaction comes when we can help a breeder by referring a problem directly to a University Center for help. We can obtain leaflets on a variety of subjects as well as reprints of papers which can be sent to breeders.

1. Separate cages.
2. Separate rooms.
3. Separate buildings.
4. Separate facilities.

B. Barriers

1. Cages:

- a. Open--only of value as barrier if no aerosol spread.
- b. Closed--(1) filter cages, limited air circulation.
- (2) fiberglass filter cages, effective and practical.
- (3) Horsfall, effective but expensive, not practical for cattery.

c. Germ free--soft or hard plastic, not practical.

2. Fences:

- a. Restrict both animal and human flow.
- b. No effect on airflow.

3. Walls--prevent animals, persons, and air and water flow, and vectors (insects, rodents).

C. Air flow--very important. Best to use only fresh outside air. Should have 10-15 air changes per hour. For economic reasons (heat loss) may have to recirculate air.

1. Air pressure:

- a. Use positive pressure in cage or room for protection of animals.
- b. Use negative pressure for protection of personnel, and to prevent spread of agent in environment. Isolation wards should have negative pressure.
- c. Gradient pressure. The more contaminated the area, the greater the negative pressure.

2. Filtration of air--used to prevent entrance, spread, or escape of agents. Especially important when recirculating air to wards.

- a. Hepa filters (excellent but fragile).
- b. Remove dust particles and bacteria (viruses ride on dust or water).

c. Electronically charged filters remove infectious agents which have surfact charge.

D. Personnel Flow

1. It should be difficult enough to enter isolation or quarantine area so only designated people enter, but not so difficult to enter that care of cat is sacrificed.
2. Care for healthy cats before infected or quarantined cats are cared for.

3. Clothes changes.

- a. Outer clothes (lab coats, coveralls, shoes)--sufficient in most cases.
- b. Complete change--not practical for cattery. A necessity for SPF colony.
- c. Shoes important--change or wear covers or boots. Keep one pair for isolation area.
- d. Wear rubber gloves.

4. Wash hands after handling infected or quarantined cat.

E. Decontamination

1. Soap and water--will do wonders--dilution factor.
2. Autoclaving, boiling and dry heat.
3. Chemical--disinfectants vary in their effectiveness. (A product advertised as virucidal will not necessarily inactivate all viruses). Little information available about effectiveness of specific disinfectants on cat viruses. (To next page)

- Ethylene oxide, very effective but expensive.
 - Formaldehyde, effective but irritating. Excellent for isolation cages. Effective against panleukopenia virus.
5. UV lights:
- Within wards or isolation area.
 - Within air return ducts.
- F. Control Animal Flow
- Quarantine animals before entering cattery. Minimum of two weeks.
 - Prevent contact between infected and healthy cats.
- G. Control of rodents, insects, etc., which can carry infectious agents.

given promising results. The two basic approaches to vaccination include vaccines directed against the virus and those directed against the malignant cell. The virus may be modified in such a way to make it nonpathogenic but still stimulate immunity. This type of vaccine would be likely to produce good immunity but may produce a carrier state and the virus may eventually revert to a virulent state and spread to other nonvaccinated cats. A killed virus vaccine would eliminate this possibility, but it is more difficult to stimulate a strong immune response with a killed virus vaccine. The possibility of producing a vaccine against a purified virus envelope protein is being investigated by Hardy. Virus neutralizing antibody is directed against this virus envelope and thus would be expected to protect against virus infection. This type of vaccine is technically more difficult and more expensive to produce. Also neutralizing antibody protects only against the subgroup of virus infected, so that the three subgroups must be included.

the aspect of a vaccine against the malignant cell, thus stimulated FOCMA antibody production. Cats have been inoculated with various dosages of virus infection cells. High doses have resulted in decreased immune response and carriers being produced. Lower doses cause a more rapid response with no carriers. Inactivated vaccines may also be considered here.

Purified leukemic cell membranes may also be used as an immunogen and some success has been achieved with this. The malignant cell membrane is the FOCMA antigen which stimulates formation of antibody against lymphosarcoma of all subgroups.

Although a vaccine looks promising experimentally, commercial production is still another matter. The vaccine must be effective, safe and economical. The USDA has requirements which must be satisfied before such a vaccine will be marketed.

At present, a commercial vaccine exists which has been successful in preventing leukemia in chickens and it will probably be only a matter of time before the same will be true for cats.### Dr. Susan Cotter,

U.K. Cat Tales



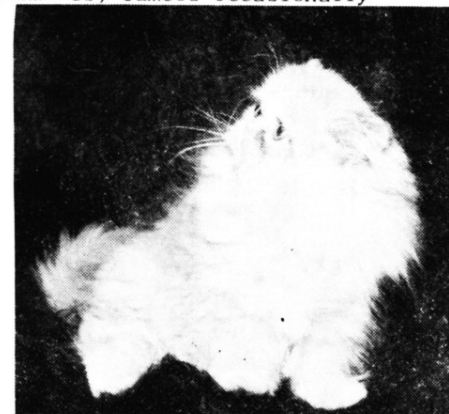

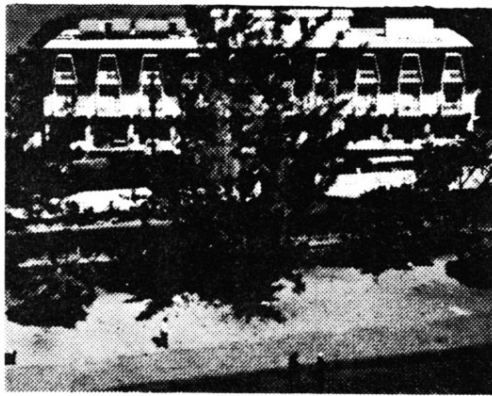

Grand Champion Foxavon Sharon



Britain's First Female Grand Champion

A British Blue Shorthair male, *BRYNBUBOO LITTLE MONARCH*, became Britain's first Grand Champion in 1971. Two years later another male, *FINCHFIELD MICHAEL*, was the first Long-Haired cat to Grand. Who would be the first femme to carve herself a niche in cat fancy history? In another ten months the world would know!

In 1966, we purchased a Blue female kitten, *COLLETTE OF PENS-FORD*, from Mrs. Joan Thompson. Although this lovely little girl was Best In Show Kitten once, she never made an impact at show because she was always very nervous. For a queen who would one day become dam of a famous Long-Hair, her first attempts at motherhood were not too successful. At an early age, she had two pet quality kittens sired by an outside stud, followed by two premature litters born before she had milk to nurse them.

In those days, *COLLETTE* rather fancied *PR. MOONCOIN PORTHOS*, a Blue neutered male, my 1964 Christmas present from my husband. We had difficulty getting her in kitten and sought Mrs. Thompson's advice on buying a Blue male of our own. She referred us to Mrs. McVady of the well-known Gaydene Cattery and we made arrangements to acquire *GAYDENE ROMEO*. When we went to collect him, however, his littermate, *GAYDENE ROBIN*, "chose" us so Mrs. McVady kept *ROMEO*.

ROBIN had a good show career both as a kitten and as a cat. He competed in 28 shows in 4½ years and his credits include: 4 Best In Show Adult awards out of 8 nominations; ten Challenge Certificates; 66 first; 33 seconds; and 29 thirds. At the 1969 Blue Persian Show, *ROBIN* was unbeaten in nine classes and was named Best Adult Exhibit. Three years later, three of his progeny were named Best Adult, Best Kitten and Best Neuter at that same show. To my knowledge, this

feat has never been equalled.

COLLETTE's first litter sired by ROBIN produced CH. FOXAVON MANDY, Blue female, whose show career includes 4 Challenge Certificates, two Best of Breeds and a Best In Show. She next produced two males and a female, all of whom were exported to U.S.A. Then, at 7:30 AM on July 5, 1972, she gave birth to FOXAVON SHARON and FOXAVON SHIRLEY.

SHARON AT SHOW

Many weeks passed and I could not sell either kitten for even as little as forty pounds (Ed. note: about US\$81 at current exchange rates) because I would not guarantee that the kittens would win every time entered --who can? So I entered them both in the Long Haired Cat Club Show where they made a marvellous debut. SHARON was reserve and SHIRLEY V.H.C. (very highly commended). I overheard one of the judges remark that she had a class of 24 kittens to judge during the afternoon and any of them who received a card would be really good, so I was very pleased when my two won 3rd and reserve (4th).

A few weeks later, I entered SHARON in the Blue Persian Show which was to prove such a memorable event for ROBIN's progeny. She was unbeaten in six classes, Best Female Kitten and Best Kitten In Show. At that same show, her older sister, CH. FOXAVON MANDY, was Best Adult Exhibit and my husband's MUSKOKA JAMIE was Best Neuter.

SHARON, competing in the class for 3 to 5-month old kittens, drew the following review from her judge, Miss J. Spencer: "Very good type, eyes very good, excellent chin and muzzle, ears just a wee bit upright, good sound coat." At the National Cat Show that year, a fancier from France offered me £200 for SHARON, but, by then, I had grown too fond of her to part company.

In May, 1973, SHARON won her first C.C. at the Bedford show, then scored a big triumph at the autumn Herts. & Middlesex Show by winning her second Challenge and Best In Show. Her judge, Mrs. M.E. Crickmore, wrote: "A really lovely female of excellent type, good head with short nose and firm chin, lovely eyes and expression, full soft coat." She repeated this feat at the 1973 Blue Persian Show where she completed her Championship.

The time had come for SHARON to try for a Grand Championship. There is only one Grand Challenge Class offered for Long-Hairs

at each show; there is no separation by sex or breed number (colour) and the class is open only to Champions. The awards given are limited to two: Winner and Reserve. At her first attempt, SHARON won Reserve, then, in March, 1974, Mrs. Ross gave her the first of the three Grand Challenge Certificates needed for the title. This judge commented: "Beautiful pale blue flowing coat without any shading, lovely type with strong chin and good width between the ears, dark round open eyes". At the Bedford that year, SHARON got her second G.C.C. and a Best In Show nomination, followed by another Reserve at the Croydon.

Britain's second largest show, the Herts. & Middlesex, is held annually in September. SHARON had won Best In Show there in 1973 so it was very appropriate that the Alexandra Palace should be the scene for her ultimate achievement. On September 7, 1974, Mrs. Joan Thompson gave a Grand Challenge Certificate to this lovely Blue girl and she became GRAND CHAMPION FOXAVON SHARON, first female of any breed to win Britain's top show title.

SON Sired BY 'SNOWLEOPARD'

In December, 1974, SHARON produced three lovely kittens but, unfortunately, they faded at 5 days of age, a great disappointment. We intended to mate her to GRAND CH. FINCHFIELD MICHAEL, Britain's first LH titlist, but she only comes into season during September or October and MICHAEL had gone to his new home in South Africa. Instead, we mated her to CH. WILLOWBANK SNOWLEOPARD and, on November 24, 1975, she presented us with a super little White male. He weighed 5 ounces at birth and 20 at one month; he is the biggest kitten we have had and looks a credit to his parents.

To me, SHARON is more than 'just a cat', she is more like a human friend. She spends hours with me in my office and I call her 'my sleeping partner'.

Retired from show these past three years, ROBIN is at limited stud. I only accept queens from Breeds 2, 2a, 2b, 3, 5 and 13 (Blue-Eyed, Orange-Eyed and Odd-Eyed White, Blue, Cream and Bluecream) so his progeny do not number as many as some other studs in Britain. However, I am very proud of the fact that two of them are SHARON and GRAND CH. BLUE REX OF PENSFORD which make him the sire of the country's first female Grand and the first to sire two Longhair Grand Champions!##

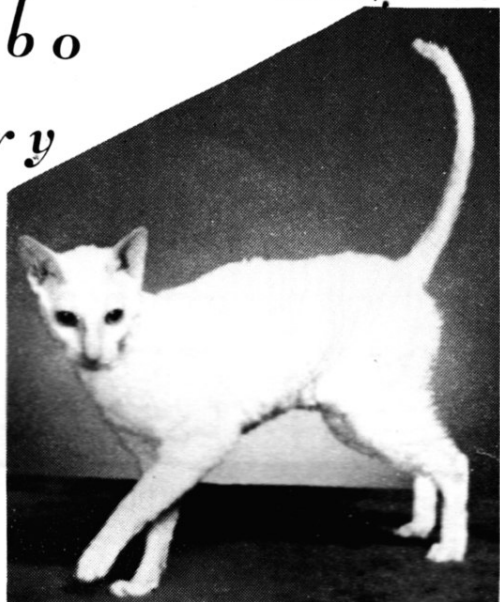

good or only good is appropriate. In my opinion, this is the most practical method for a student to prepare himself for the exam.

"Best In Show" judging of Longhairs and Shorthairs takes place simultaneously. A judging table for each is set up at opposite sides of the hall. Here no judge works with both Longhairs and Shorthairs.

The Germans offer a big dinner in the evening. Judges and exhibitors are invited; friends and relatives may join the group upon payment. A nice band plays good music and there is dancing and entertainment until dawn. Entertainment might include a Belgian judge who is a very good illusionist and produces handkerchiefs, living turtles, bantams and even cats from cylinders and tiny boxes; and a classical dance exhibition by his four daughters who have much talent, grace and rhythm. Their costumes are always very well chosen and one can see that they have a very solid ballet dance background.

On Sunday morning there is a car tour around the town and its environments for the exhibitors. The award cards are distributed in the afternoon and the prizes at the end of the show. Apart from the challenges, cups, bowls and medals, gifts are offered such as books, vases, cat statues, etc. The FIFE rules never allow monetary presentation.

Like all other shows, this one ends abruptly. As soon as people have received their prizes, they pack up their cats and make their way home ... perhaps to prepare for yet another show next weekend.###
