# BI-COLOURS & CALICOS

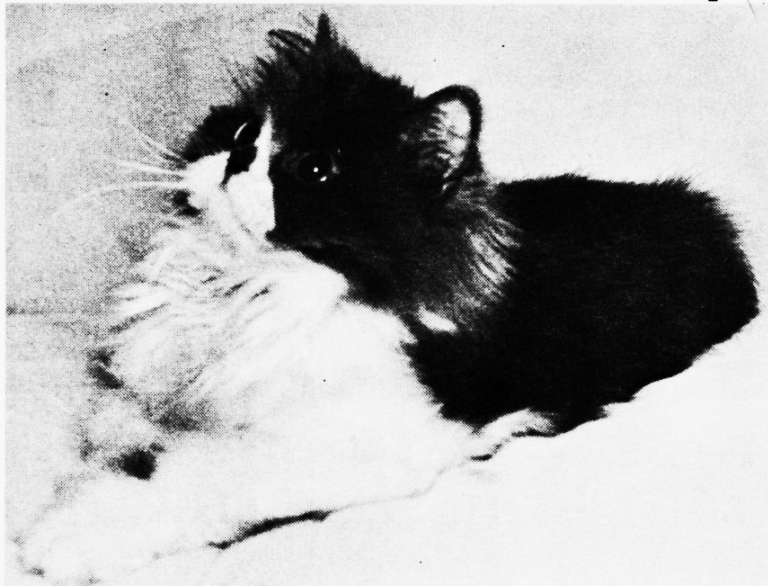
Although there has been much speculation as to the origin of the Bi-Colour and Calico Persians, no one, as yet, has come forward with a foolproof explanation as to from whence they came. But, then, despite all theories advanced, we still do not know the true origin of the longhaired cat at all, and very little is known regarding the evolution of our present day Persian. We do know, however, that many of the longhaired cats first registered in the United States were Bi-Colours. In order to avoid an import tax or "tariff" on cats being imported to the United States, in 1906 an enterprising group of cat fanciers set up the "U.S. Register and Stud Book for Cats". The first Bi-Colour registered was a Black-&-White female named *MARTHA*. *MARTHA*'s birth date is shown as April, 1898. Only whole cats were exempted from the tariff as they were considered "livestock"; alters were still taxed. In the first Stud Book of the American Cat Association published in 1907 there were ten Bi-Colours registered. They were then called "mixed colors with white".

Despite the fact that they have long been a favorite of fanciers, many years passed before the Calico Persian was recognized for Championship competition and it was in the mid-1950's that they began appearing in CFA shows. It took even longer for their "sisters and brothers under the skin", i.e. the Bi-Colours to achieve recognition. Cat Fanciers Association was the first to recog-

nize the Bi-Colour Persian and this was accomplished largely through the efforts of the National Bi-Color Club of which my late husband and I were charter members. Mrs. Barbara Maier, well-known CFA judge, was the club's founder and did much to advance the cause of these cats who became eligible for CFA Championship competition effective May 1, 1971. Most of the other associations in the fancy soon followed suit. It has been a long and arduous struggle on the part of those breeders who worked tirelessly with these colours for years and exhibited them as AOV's before recognition was given, but the Bi-Colours have finally arrived and they have done it in a most spectacular manner. Today it is not uncommon for a Bi-Colour or Calico Persian to be named Best In Show! There is a great deal of interest in these colours and the number of those breeding for Bi-Colour and Calico Persians (for the two go hand-in-hand) is constantly growing.

## STANDARDS

The present CFA Standard for the Bi-Colour Persian reads as follows: "Black & White, Blue & White, Red & White or Cream & White. White feet, legs, undersides, chest and muzzle. Inverted 'V' blaze on face desirable. White under tail and white collar allowable. Eye color: brilliant copper." This is a far cry from the original standard set by the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy, England, which was very precise in that the required markings had to resemble as closely as possible those of a Dutch rabbit! For those who have never seen a Dutch rabbit, this old GCCF standard read: "The self-colour, i.e. black, blue, orange (red), or cream, to start immediately behind the shoulders, round the barrel of the body and to include tail and hind legs, leaving the hind feet white. Ears and mask of face also self-coloured. White shoulders, neck, forelegs and feet, chin, lips and blaze up face and over top of head, joining or running into the white at the back of the skull, thus dividing the mask exactly in half." While this Standard was in effect, very few

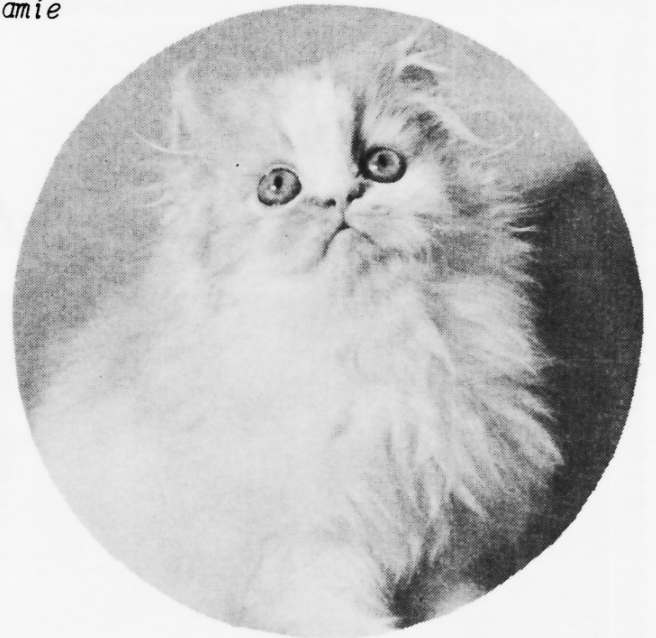


Bi-Colours attained the title of Champion. The British breeders soon realized that this was most impractical: the distribution of self-colour and white in cats does not conform to a strict pattern and for the Dutch rabbit markings to be consistently reproduced it would be necessary for a new gene to appear. In June, 1971, GCCF accepted a revised Standard. As with the Calicoes, the beauty, fascination and eye appeal of the Bi-Colours lies in the infinite variety of their markings and I hope the day never comes when they all look as though they came from the same mold.

The CFA Standard for the Calico Persian reads: "White with unbrindled patches of black and red. White predominant on underparts. Eye Color: brilliant copper." Dilute Calico: "White with unbrindled patches of blue and cream. White predominant on underparts. Eye Color: brilliant copper." We should note here that in Great Britain, as in most other American associations, the Calico is known as Tortoiseshell-&White and, in some associations, there is a slight difference in the Standard for the Tortie-&White; for example, ACFA calls for some cream, as well as red, black and white in the coat. To confuse the issue even further, in at least two American associations, namely, CFF and ACFA, there are separate colour classes for the Calico and the Tortoiseshell-&White, each with their own set of Standards! For breeding purposes, the two are interchange-

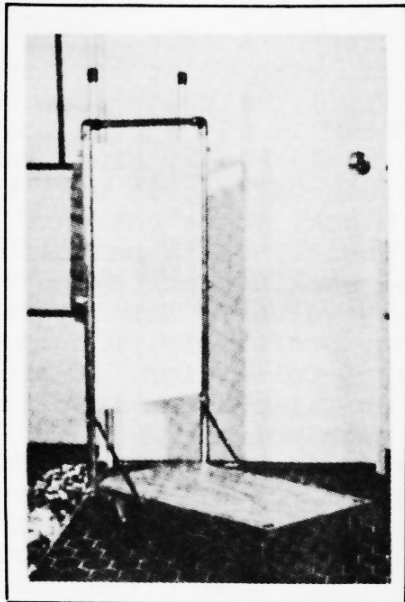

able.

The Dilute Calico is also known as the Blue/Cream-&White. Although the dominant calico has been recognized for quite some time, the dilute calico was not approved for Championship status by CFA until the October, 1974, Board meeting.

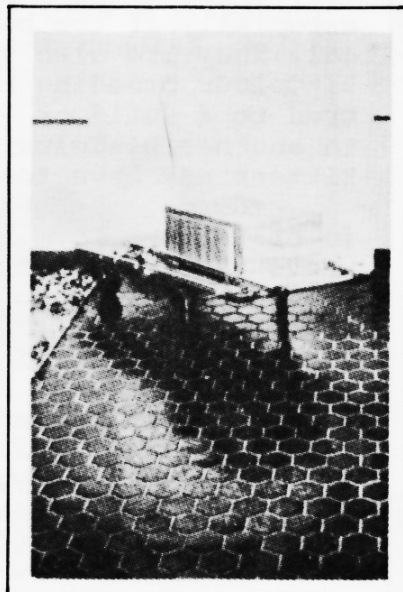
At the present time there is a breed club called the Persian Bi-Color and Calico Society, CFA affiliated, whose members have proposed several changes in the present Bi-Colour and Calico standards and have recommended that CFA recognize the harlequin bi-

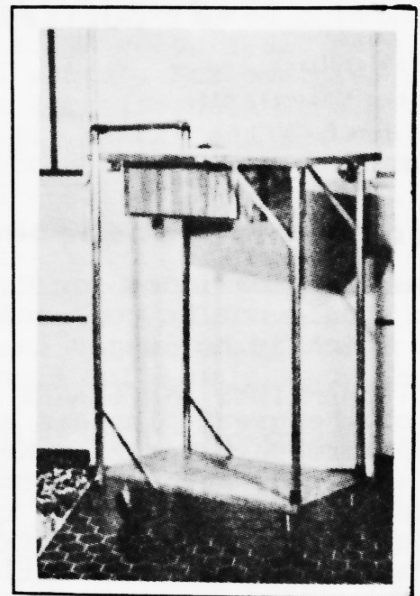

colours and calicoes for Championship. This club should not be confused with the original club which is no longer in existence.

**FIRST CHAMPIONS AND GRANDS**

One of the great pioneers among the early Bi-Colour breeders was Miss Norah Woodfield of Christchurch, England. From her famous Pathfinders Cattery came that country's first Bi-Colour Champion, *PATHFINDERS SUNRAY*, a Red-&White male who won his title in 1966. First CFA Champion was *JAY-KAY BOW TU OF OHIO*, Cream-&White male bred and owned by Dorothy Anderson, Cincinnati, Ohio; he gained his title in 1972 the year after the CFA Board of Directors recognized the Bi-Colours for Championship competition. First of this variety to Grand in CFA was *VOGUE'S SUNNY SIDE UP*, a lovely Cream-&White male bred and owned by Susan Ellsworth, Long Island, New York; he succeeded in the 1972-'73 show season.

Mrs. Anderson also bred CFA's first Calico Champion, *JAY-KAY'S LU ANN*, who won the

title in 1955 the year Championship competition began.

The 1973/'74 season produced CFA's first Calico Grand Champion, *BEIRUT'S WILDFELL*, bred by Mrs. Dorothy Akers of Dallas, PA, and CFA's second Bi-Colour Grand, *BEIRUT'S HAIL TO REASON*, a Black-&White male also bred by Mrs. Akers. Then, in 1975, another Black-&White male attained the title of CFA Grand Champion, *OLDE CALICO'S ARTFUL DODGER*, bred by Mrs. Bobara Pendergrast, Mendham, NJ. At long last, the Bi-Colours were well on their way.


The 1975/'76 season not only saw several other Bi-Colour and Calico Persians achieve Grand Champion status, but *GRAND CH. LEE'S CHIEF WHITE CLOUD*, a Blue-&White male bred by Mr. and Mrs. William Lee of Grand Rapids, Michigan, was CFA's Number 2 Kitten of the Year! It is most interesting to note that behind all of the aforementioned cats, with the exception of *BEIRUT'S WILDFELL* and *BEIRUT'S HAIL TO REASON*, are Pathfinders bloodlines!

**BREEDING PROGRAM**

How does one go about breeding for Bi-Colours and/or Calicoes? This is a question we often hear nowadays. In order to produce Bi-Colour and Calico Persians, at least one parent must be either a Bi-Colour or a Calico (Tortie-&White). For purposes of brevity, the word "Calico" is being used interchangeably with the words "Tortie-&White".

You may breed Bi-Colour to Bi-Colour or Bi-Colour to Calico, which will usually result in either a predominantly Bi-Colour litter, or an all Bi-Colour/Calico litter. Often there will be what we Bi-Colour breeders call a "Harlequin" in the litter. A true Harlequin is basically a white cat with color confined to the head, legs and tail, although some do have an occasional spot of colour on the body. The tail should be entirely black, blue, red, cream, or, if a Harlequin Calico, it will be patched with red and black. These cats are very interesting and usually quite beautiful, especially if the head markings are symmetrical. They are also very valuable for future Bi-Colour breeding but, preferably, should be bred to a Solid or Parti-Color, for, if bred to another Bi-Colour or Calico, the resulting kittens may have too much white.

You may also breed a Bi-Colour to a Solid or Parti-Color and this usually will improve the type of the resulting Bi-Colours/Calicoes, but, when doing this, one must be prepared for the fact that, most often, the litter will be half Bi-Colour/Calico and half Solid, although it is possible to get predominantly Bi-Colour and/or Calicoes, or even all Bi-Colours and/or Calicoes, but this is most unusual, and you might also find yourself with an entire litter of Solids and Parti-Colors! Of course, selective breeding is essential and, when using Solids in the Bi-Colour breeding program (which I feel is absolutely necessary in order to retain type)

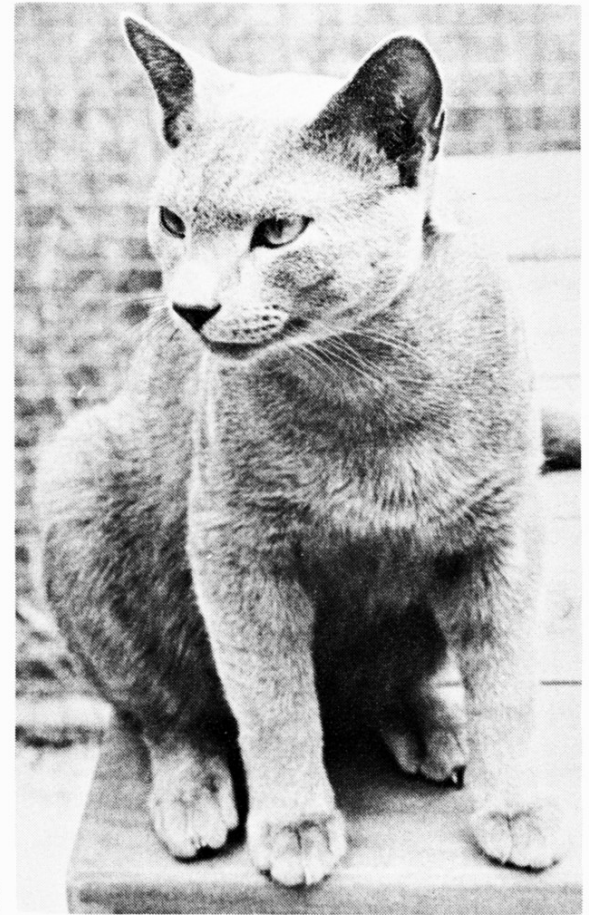

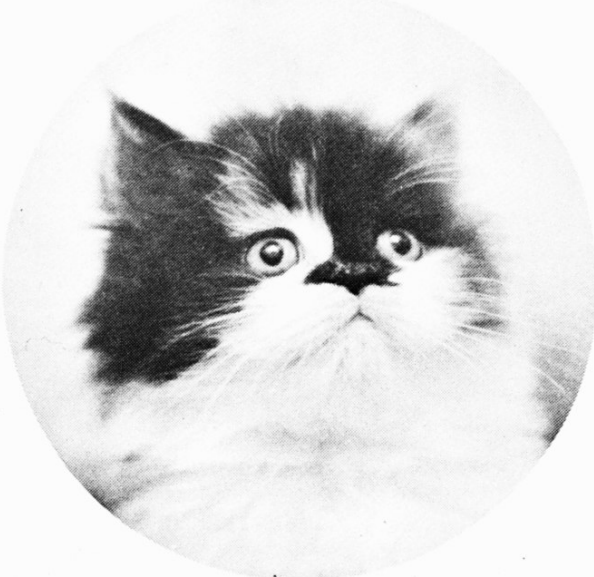

only Solids or Parti-Colors of the highest quality should be employed. I believe you will find that the Bi-Colour breeders who have produced such outstanding specimens as previously mentioned have done so by introducing excellent solid colour and/or parti-color Persians into their lines.

Personally, I prefer to use a top quality Tortie or Blue/Cream with the typiest possible Bi-Colour male available in order to produce a rainbow of colours in the resulting litter. I have also often employed an outstanding solid colour sire with a bi-colour or calico dam with excellent results.

In order to know what colours one may expect in any given cross, one only has to follow the formula for sex-linked colours pertaining to the solid colours and merely add the words "and white". For example, a Red or Cream male to a Tortoiseshell female can result in Red, Cream, Black, and Blue males, and Red, Cream, Tortie, and Blue/Cream females. Thus, a Red-&White or Cream-&White male to a Calico or Tortie-&White female will result in Red-&White, Cream-&White, Black-&White, and Blue-&White males, and Red-&White, Cream-&White, Calico, and Dilute Calico females, and possibly one or more of the aforementioned Solid colours or Parti-Colors.

There is nothing which can equal the experience of witnessing the birth of a litter in which one expects Bi-Colour and/or Calico kittens. The exquisite suspense of waiting to see what colour "comes next" and "how is he or she marked?", and the ultimate thrill of watching these colourful babies grow up!

I think that it is important to note here that any resulting solid or parti-color kittens, even if bred to another solid colour kitten out of bi-colour parentage, will never again produce a "white-spotted" kitten, unless bred to a "white-spotted" cat, i.e. a bi-colour or a calico.

Most solid colour breeders will admit that, occasionally, there would appear in their litters a kitten with a white locket or

# BOOK REVIEWS

"PORTRAIT OF CATS" by Angela Sayer. Published 1975 by Hamlyn Publishing Group, Astronaut House, Feltham, Mddx. England. 125 pages. UK£1.99 (approx. US\$3.75).

"PRACTICAL GUIDE TO CATS" by Ivor Raleigh, Patricia Scott, Elizabeth & Oliphant Jackson. Published 1976 by Hamlyn. 127 pages. UK£2.50 (appx. US\$4.50)

Have you ever been exhibiting your cats and had spectators tell you that they want to "get into cats" but don't know which breed to buy? Next time this happens, tell them to run, don't walk, to the nearest bookstore and buy a copy of "Portrait of Cats"! This is the best, reasonably-priced book ever published to introduce the fancier-to-be to the wide variety of cat breeds and colors available today. Mrs. Sayer is a talented writer who really knows her subject. She has been breeding and showing her Solitaire cats for many years and has travelled extensively. It matters not whether the reader is in Britain or North America, Mrs. Sayer comments with authority about breeds on both sides of the Atlantic, new and old. The majority of the 150 beautiful photos (many in color) which support her text are by Anne Cumbers. This is a book this reviewer thoroughly enjoyed.

It is becoming a popular practice in the U.K. for specialized knowledge about cat fancying to be presented in book form by means of chapters contributed by different people each considered to be authorities on certain aspects. A current example is "Practical Guide To Cats" in which the scientific angle (cat characteristics, behaviour, feeding, training) is handled by Dr. Patricia Scott of the Royal Free Hospital of Medicine, London; health and home nursing by veterinarians Oliphant and Elizabeth Jackson; and all other phases capably embraced by All Breed judge and former GCCF Chairman, Dr. Ivor Raleigh.

The book is well-illustrated with stud-

ies of cats by a number of photographers led by Animal Graphics, Ltd., founded by fanciers Angela Sayer and Malcolm Lauder. Thirty pages are included in color and about twenty more in black-and-white. Jennifer Middleton did the line drawings; of particular note are three which illustrate a cat in the early stages of urinary blockage and may help readers recognize this trouble quickly.

Although the book is written primarily for the U.K. reader, most of the good information contained in the text would be useful to cat fanciers anywhere.

In neither of these Hamlyn books are the cats appearing in the photos (with one exception) identified by name. In this reviewer's opinion, this omission (which is not confined only to this one publisher) not only detracts from the serious reader's appreciation of a cat book, but does an injustice to the breeders of these fine cats. We congratulate Mrs. Sayer on naming the kittens in the caption of one photo in her book; we hope that she will have set a precedent that publishers will follow in the future.

"THE TURKISH ANGORA: REVIVAL OF AN ANCIENT BREED" by Aletha Hendrickson. Published 1976 by National Turkish Angora Cat Club, 2315 Gillis Road, Woodbine, MD 21797. 101 pages. U.S. \$3.50 (Foreign \$4 - approx. UK£2.30).

For the serious fancier, a vacuum exists in the book publishing world. Few publishers are willing to put out books on one breed reasoning that readership and profits will be too limited. NTACC solved this problem by publishing its breed's own book written by a well-versed fancier, Aletha Hendrickson, with addenda contributed by other Turkish Angora enthusiasts.

Everything known about the elegant long-hair from Turkey is incorporated into this carefully-researched book. Its twenty chapters provide a complete history of the Turkish Angora; its quest for Championship compe-

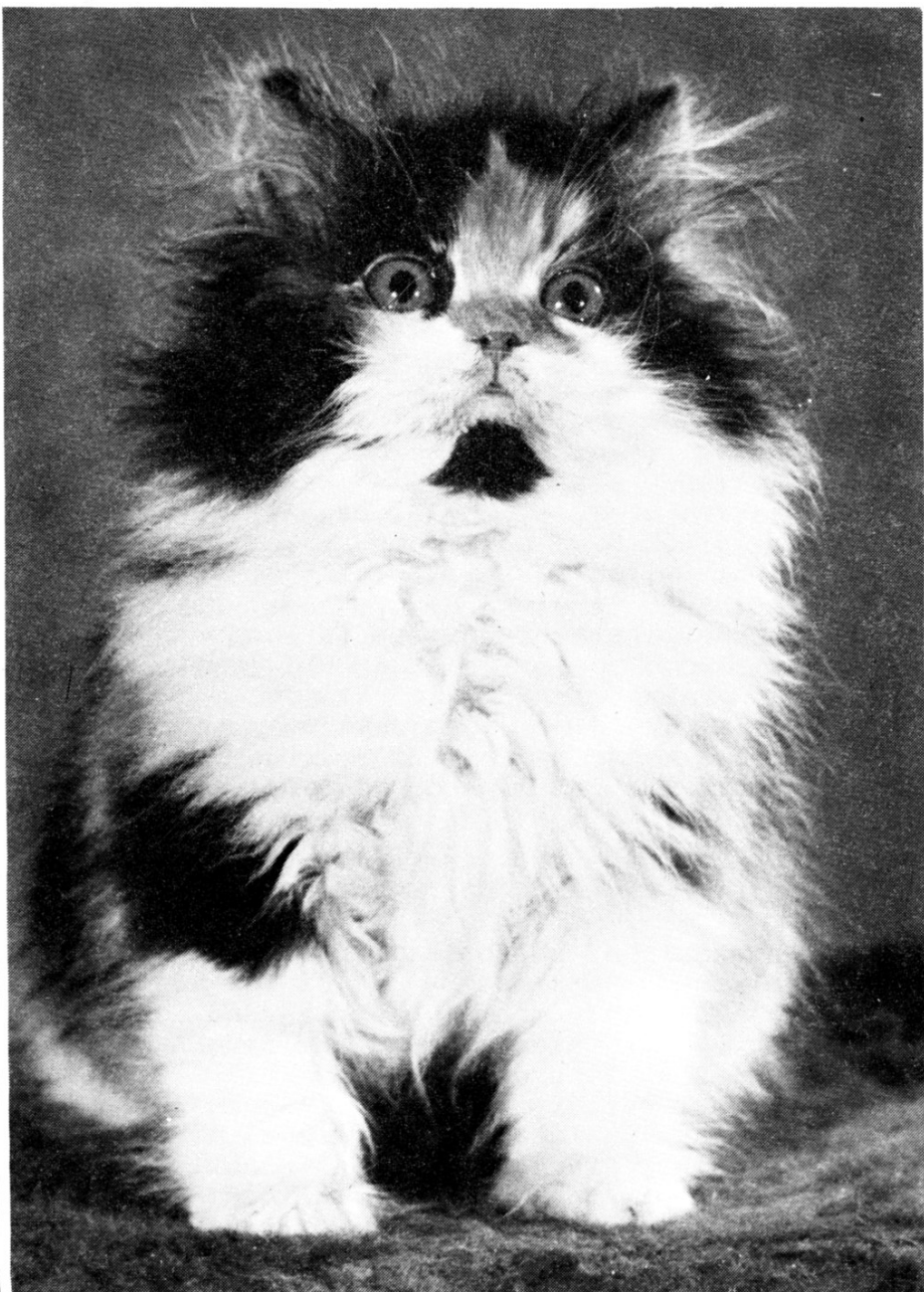

tition; standards; clubs for its protection and advancement; diet; care; ethics; genetics; grooming; and much more useful information. The breed's show stars and coming kittens are presented, many of them in excellent black-&-white identified portraits by the famous Creszentia.

# 1976 BRITISH CAT WORLD AWARDS

United Kingdom cat fanciers had an opportunity to see some of the country's top cats of the 1975/'76 show season on display at Alexandra Palace, London, on September 11. Mrs. Annette Wilson, organizer of the gigantic Herts. & Middlesex Championship Show, kindly invited the 1976 British Cat World Award winners to be present. Through the cooperation of John Mais, Honorary Scorer, and Patricia Turner, CAT WORLD feature writer, arrangements were made with the owners of the winners. To the best of our knowledge, this was the first time in the history of catdom that a country's top award-winning cats have appeared on exhibition together.

The annual British Cat World Awards program is becoming very popular and the competition adds yet another challenge to breeders. With a number of shows drawing entries around the one thousand mark, Mr. Mais was kept extremely busy recording all the points won by so many cats and computing the totals to determine the winners.

Under present GCCF show rules, once a cat becomes a Champion, he/she does not automatically advance to competition in the Champion of Champions class only. Instead, an owner may enter a Champion cat in either the Open or the Champion of Champions class or in both classes at the same show. British Cat World Award points, however, are limited to achievements in the Open class.

For the second consecutive year, a Siamese was the highest-scoring U.K. cat in the

program which is sponsored by this magazine. CH. CHEONA PINDAR, outstanding Tabby (Lynx) Point succeeds handsome GR.CH. DARLING RED SHADOW, Red Point, the Supreme Cat of 1975, as the U.K.'s reigning feline. A close contender for the title was Odd-Eyed White LH, CH. MANDESSA COPPELIA. A Brown Tabby Manx, CH. PURRCHANCE RAPUNZEL, leads the British Short-Hair Division and Lilac Burmese, CH. MIBUYA LE MARQUIS, the Foreign Short-Hair Division.

From an American viewpoint, it is rather interesting to note that the Top 5 Foreign Shorthairs are cats of varieties seldom seen in North America, and four of the Top 5 Siamese would find themselves transferred into another breed, Colorpoint Shorthairs, were they to emigrate from U.K. to U.S.A.!

The 1975/'76 Championship show season of the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy was comprised of 31 shows. CAT WORLD editors thought readers would enjoy 'seeing' the 1976 British Cat World Award winners 'in action' at these shows and, in some instances, know how they appeared to their judges. The reviews of the latter are condensed from the newspaper, "Fur & Feather". In this article we will refer to the cats by name only; owners' and breeders' names, as well as cats' championship status appear in the complete list of 1976 winners starting on page 20.

## SEASON BEGAN IN JUNE

The season began on June 7 with the Siamese Cat Association show managed by Mrs. Arnold. The judges still talk about the picturesque 16th century manor house where they stayed for the weekend. Championship competition began in earnest in August with the "Three Counties" at Southampton managed by Mrs. Wilson. MIBUYA LE MARQUIS, Lilac Burmese, was nominated for Best-In-Show (BIS) by Mrs. Thake ("*Lovely, well-grown, very masculine boy, well presented, well behaved, even coat colour, excellent texture, head shape, eye setting and colour, well set ears, correct tail shape.*") BIS British Shorthair

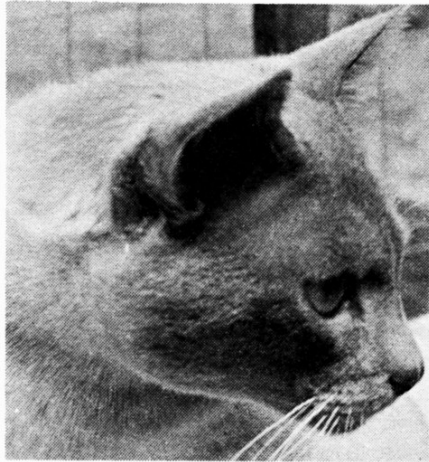

was VECTENSIAN RED EXCELLENCE who was judged by Mrs. Denny ("Lovely, rich coloured boy, excellent type, massive puss, lovely large bumbly head, gorgeous eyes of deep orange, splendidly marked.") Mrs. Thake nominated this boy later at the "Southern Counties" and referred to him as a "superb exhibit, just like the red tabbies of 20 years ago".

Next Saturday, the "Kentish" took place at Maidstone. CC winners included Blue Smoke LH, CLYBET MINNESOTA, who finished her Championship, and Devon Rex BRYLOU TIMBO ("Good coat crinkled all over body, nice clear white coat, good type with short face. Mrs. Newton).

An unplanned 'feature' of the 1975 Herts. & Middlesex show, which 1,600 fanciers would cheerfully have missed out on, was the bomb scare which emptied the vast Alexandra Palace for more than an hour in the middle of the show! Chocolate Point, KIMOKI DAGMAR, was BIS Siamese. ARJAZE WARLORD won his first CC and a BIS nomination from Miss Prentis ("Excellent type, head and eyes, coat, nice smoke"). Two months later at the 'Cheshire' he became Britain's first Smoke SH Champion.

More CC winners at the "Herts. & Middlesex" were: SILBRANA SEQUIN, Tortie Point Siamese ("Good type Tortie, excellent head and eyes, coat colour good, mask marbled with pleasing tints of red and ivory..." Mrs. Eustace); Bi-Colour LH UTA VOM ANGORAHOF ("Red & White of very good type, nice round well-balanced head, ears ... placed well apart, good eye shape and colour, short, full face, long coat of good texture, good brush, cobby build. Mr. Tomlinson); and PRAETORIAN PROBUS, who defeated his sire, ("Very promising, excellent coat of pure jet black, neat cobby body, good bone structure, nice short tail, good rounded eyes of wonderful colour." Mr. Pearson). SILKPAWS GOLDEN SUNSHINE, who was to become Britain's first Red Burmese Champion, won a CC from Mrs. Giles ("Very nice young queen, good overall type, excellent head and eyes, good break and chin, coat a rich warm colour, good tail ...").

1976 Supreme Cat, CH. CHEONA PINDAR, was Best-In-Show at the Siamese Cat Club's Sept. 13 show at Guildford which was organized by Mary Dunnill. Judge Mrs. Dadd wrote: "A really outstandingly beautiful cat with lovely temperament, shown to perfection, long fine body and whip, beautiful coat colour and texture, long straight head, large well set ears, gorgeous eye colour with superb oriental slant, very elegant ..."

The show action moved north on Sept. 20 to South Shields for the "Northern Counties" managed by Mesdames French and Stafford; 534 cats were entered. Havana, SHIMRATH CHARMAIN, won her first CC here from Mrs. Genty ("Very good wedge head, lovely ears, splendid profile, very dainty girl, excellent coat, slim body, ... good green eyes.") Red LH SPRINGHEELS ROSEMARY won a CC and Cream Point Siamese NIKKY'S RED ENKA added yet another first-place to his large collection (Cream Points still do not have Championship status). He is a British Cat World Award winner for the second consecutive year. Odd-Eyed White MANDESSA COPPELIA earned a CC from Mrs. Brice-Webb ("Very attractive cat, excel-

lent eyes for shape, one deep copper, the other deep blue, wonderful head and type, lovely soft coat ...")

Lesley Pring, GCCF vice-chairman, was in charge of the 23rd "South Western Counties" with 450 exhibits at Newton Abbot, Devon. AN-TORIA PATCHWORK, Tortie LH, won her Championship; and KAYSERLING KHAZAN, Brown Burmese, and PATHFINDERS BELLA, Tortie-&-White SH, were among other CC winners.

The "Yorkshire" on October 4 was managed by Mrs. Baxter. Two beautiful felines, as yet ineligible for CCs, who won their respective classes were DANDYCAT MISTY MOONLIGHT, Foreign Lilac, and RYANNA SPARTAN, Foreign White. Of the latter Mrs. Wilson wrote: "Good wedge, nice ear set, lovely eye shape and colour, good straight profile, long neck, good head carriage, good body shape, nice tail ..." Mrs. Knight was impressed with the quality of the Blue Long-Hairs and chose as her best, WILLANBET EATON ("Pale even coat, broad round head with great width between small well-placed ears, lovely type, short broad nose, strong chin, large round copper eyes, short full tail"). He became a Grand Champion at the "Croydon" in March. CLYBET MICKEFINN was another CC winner ("Lovely type, good chin, eyes bold and good colour, nice nose, ... good tail, lovely white coat, well prepared." Mrs. Bryce).

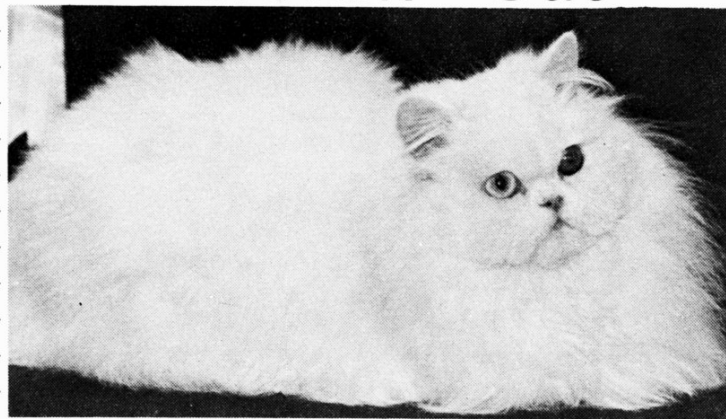

The "Midland Counties", managed by Mrs. Bullock and Mrs. Haywood, attracted a large entry of 1,115 cats to the New Bingley Hall, Stafford, on October 25. Mrs. Pond gave CCs to Bi-Coloured SH THELDON TOOTSIE ("Blue and White, colours well divided and distinct, face well marked, big yellow eyes, good type") and to BROADWEIR BEDTIME STORY, Blue-Cream SH, ("A nice cat with good intermingling of coat, ... good British head, cream blaze, enormous round eyes").

FRENCELLE COEUR DELION was the victor in a good class of nine Seal Point Siamese males at the Edinburgh & East of Scotland show managed by Bill and Christine Lowe on November 1. The same cat went BIS two weeks later at the "Cheshire". KAPRICO ICEBERG won both his Open class and the Champion of Champions class ("Beautiful Lilac Point male, difficult to fault, excellent head and profile, excellent tail, elegant paws, superb texture of coat, excellent condition, lovely temperament." Mrs. Price). This cat became a Grand Champion in January, won a British Cat World "Award of Excellence" two consecutive years and is now retired.

The Blue Persian show (for that variety only) took place in London on Nov. 8. The same day, Malvern's Winter Gardens Pavilion was the setting for the West of England & South Wales show managed by Mesdames Olive and Roberts. CC winners at the latter included Odd-Eyed White SH DELLSWOOD STELLA'S FELLA

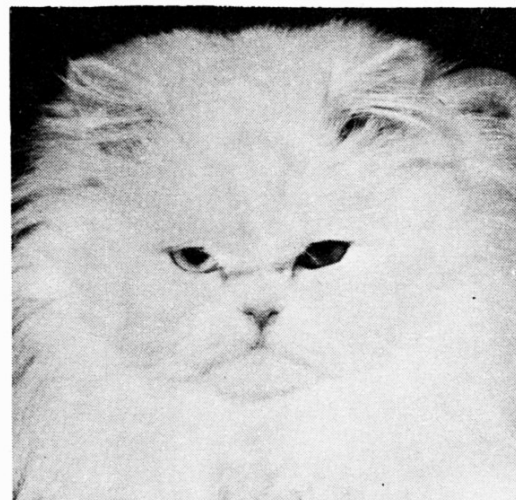

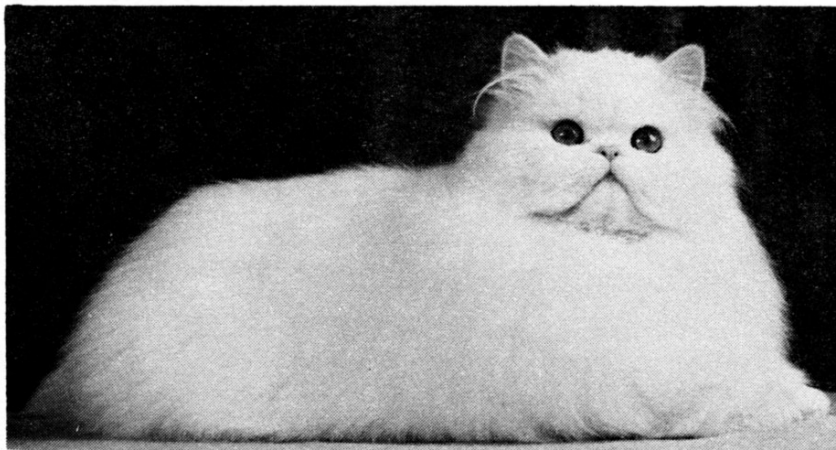

belly spot. These white lockets are the result of an entirely different white gene. I believe there are at least four separate and distinct forms of white appearing in cat coat colour, and, although I am not a geneticist, I can attest to the fact that the gene which produces white lockets is indeed an entirely different one from the bi-colour or piebald spotting gene.

No! You cannot produce a Bi-Colour or Calico by breeding a Tortie to a solid White male, a common enough error made by novice breeders who, in all good faith, have attempted, futilely, to do so.

The number of Bi-Colours and Calicoes being shown is rapidly on the increase. For instance, there were seven Bi-Colours and three Tortoiseshell-&-Whites entered in a recent CFF show in New Castle, Delaware. A year from now, I predict that we will see twice that number being shown together.

## U.K. Cat Tales

In my column last issue, I promised to get more information for CAT WORLD readers about the male Tortie Point Siamese I judged at the Lancashire. CAPRICORN ADAM COLOMBO was born August 20, 1974; his breeder/owner is Mrs. I. Pound, 261 Padiham Road, Burnley, Lancs. His interesting pedigree features many well-known cats.



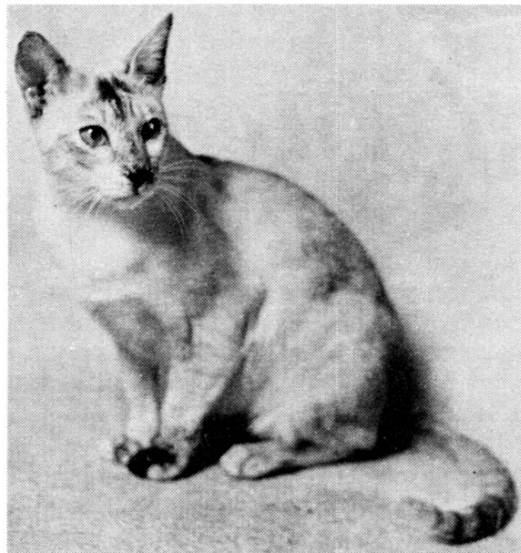
I judged him in a Miscellaneous Class at the Lancashire and found him to be a most friendly cat; my report read: "Well set, large ears, mottling fair, slight bars on the mask and tail but with good tortie markings, too. Pale slightly mottled coat and one rather solid paw. Medium wedge, profile fair, nose a little short and weak chin. Good oriental brilliant blue eyes." I awarded him a Very Highly Commended card as he had come up against some very fine males. In his Open there were two Tortie Points and he got 2nd prize.

ADAM has sired three litters of kittens. When his dam was mated to him, she produced two Red Point females, a Seal Tortie Point female and a Seal Tortie Point male; three faded out leaving only one Red Point female which Mrs. Pound is keeping. Mated to a Tortie Point Colourpoint (Himalayan), he sired ten kittens, seven of which were successfully reared. The third litter was the result of an accidental mating with Mrs. Pound's Self Red Persian; it included three spotted Red Tabbies and two Red Tabbies. These kittens of ADAM's which are only crosses, were very pretty, according to their breeder who placed them in homes as pets. ADAM is now being advertised for stud work.

The Tabbypoint Siamese & Progressive Breeders A.G.M. was well attended. # NEW ZEALAND'S FIRST BURMESE GRAND

by ARTHUR ROWLANDS

GRAND CH. CHINDAH CHERITA, first Burmese Grand Champion in New Zealand, was born nine years ago on 22nd February, 1967, from CH. RANSEIN MAI LING by CH. OMAHEENI ARIEL (IMP. ENG.). ARIEL was the third of his breed to arrive in New Zealand in early 1958 and went Best In Show several times. A grandson of CASA GATOS DA FOONG, he left dark seal brown coats and friendly, fearless, extrovert kittens. CHERITA's Blue Burmese mother was from one of the history-making 1960 litter of all Blues, the first in the Southern Hemisphere. In four years showing, MAI LING only once or twice had any competition in her colour, but won several times Best of Breed over Seal Browns. Ten weeks after CHERITA's birth, MAI LING caught FVR and died July, 1967, of secondary pneumonia.

In the same litter, CHERITA had one brother and four sisters. She and one other girl were still with us for final selection when the FVR curtailed our show season, CHERITA having been Runnerup Best In Show Kitten once.

1968 was CHERITA's big year when twice BIS, thrice RuBIS including a Felix National. She made Champion in four shows and then competed in three shows in the Grand Challenge class to win her Grand Championship at 17 months (the youngest then and for some years). The whole 1969 show season was missed when she escaped from the top of a window on the eve of a show late in February in another city. Many searches and letterbox leaflets were fruitless until the driver of a pets taxi service remembered her from a leaflet in a

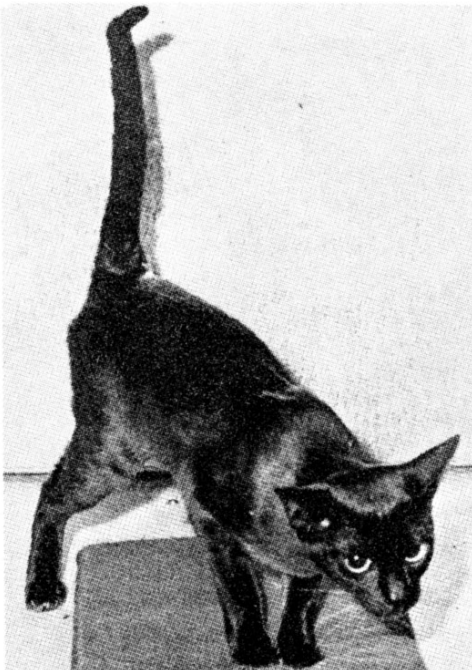
vet's clinic. We got her back in late July when most shows were over---as if we wanted then to exhibit and risk losing her again! In 1970 she went three times Opposite Sex or RuBIS before retirement.

CHERITA'S NIECE WINS CAT OF THE YEAR TITLE  
Four other Seal Brown full sisters from earlier litters won BIS and Champion each. They and CHERITA helped popularise Burmese in New Zealand by winning 23 BIS, OS or RuBIS, four of these at Felix Nationals. The result of a combination we used four times, these queens laid the basis of "Chindah" successes. One sister is the mother of our 1974 "Cat of the Year" winner, CHINDAH IRAMA.

Before and after her 1969 escapade, we had no luck mating CHERITA, but, in 1970 and 1971 she had two pregnancies giving stillbirths. Her unshown litter sister was similarly afflicted. The FVR as kittens may have affected their breeding abilities as it had also laid their mother low.

Always a quiet girl, CHERITA was known to several stewards (and possibly judges, too!) for the friendly nuzzle she gave to the chin of her handler. In 1968 after winning BIS at her home show, a photographer captured her mood in response to congratulatory endearments. Her happiness showing in her curled tail was often mistaken in the photo for a kink! This famous photo is reproduced below.

Now spayed in retirement after a meteoric show career, she turns her never-realised maternal ambitions to being "Auntie" to litters of her juniors.###



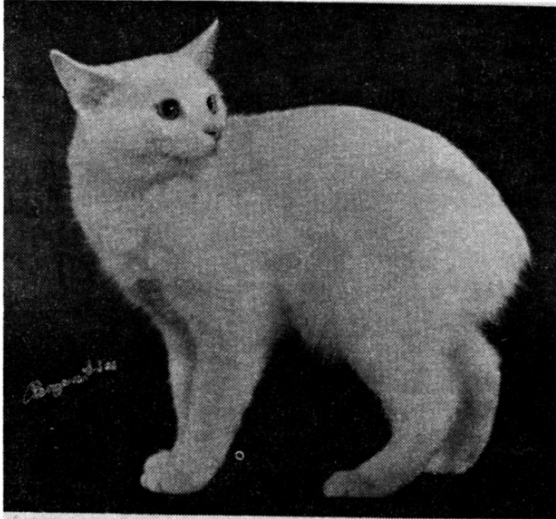

### BRITISH CAT WORLD AWARDS

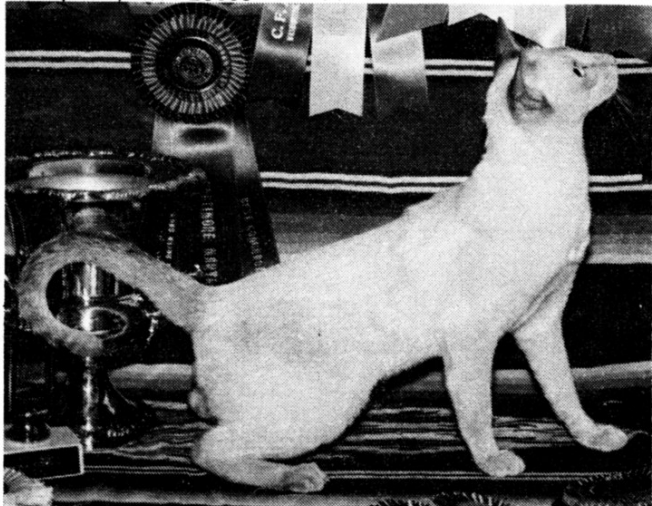

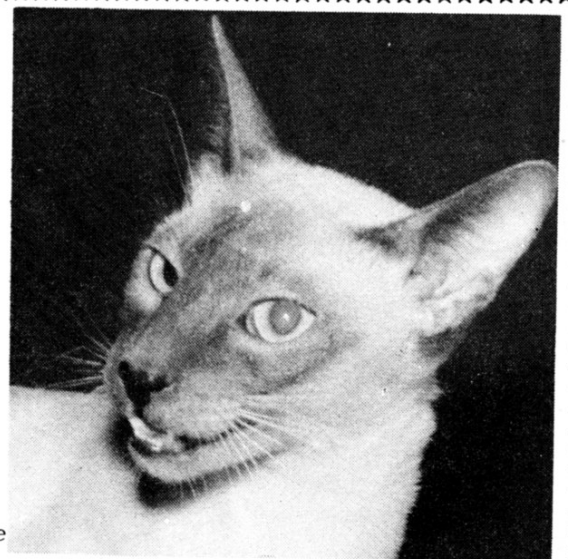

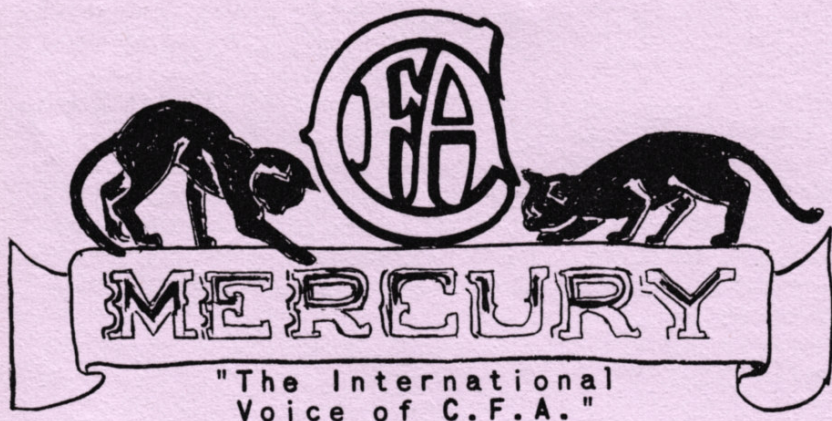

### GENERAL NEWS

We are still in the process of surmounting insurmountable obstacles in producing a pilot series of cassette tapes for club programs. Thus far, Angell Memorial Hospital has promised us a tape on scientific information on the cat . . . . A new rhinotracheitis-calicivirus vaccine has been introduced by Norden. The vaccine is given by placing a droplet in each eye and on the nose . . . . The Robert H. Winn Foundation has awarded a grant of \$4,500 to Dr. Susan Cotter, Angell Memorial Hospital and Harvard University. The study will involve healthy FeLV positive reactors . . . . The Animal Air Transportation Association has been formed to "encourage research in the safe, humane and efficient transportation of live animals on aircraft. This Association has been formed primarily in the interest of transportation of livestock. James Anderson, Trans-International Airlines, Oakland, CA, is President. Membership is open to individuals or organizations concerned with the shipment of live animals by air. Dues are \$10 for individuals and \$100 for organizations . . . . The Mortality & Disease Survey submitted by our breeders was sent to Cornell University for tabulation. It is not yet complete. As with the first run on any study of this kind, more time was required to place the information in the computer. Dr. Fredric Scott of the Feline Research Laboratory at Cornell is enthusiastic about compiling more information and, therefore, we should proceed with the survey again next year.###

be denied or considered unethical that would improve the quality of life of the cat. The cat fancy appreciates what the American Veterinary Medical Association is trying to do. Fortunately, the number of unethical veterinarians is as small as the number of breeders who would request procedures designed to deceive.###



## COMMENTS ON VETERINARY LITERATURE

In the May 15th issue of the "Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association", there is a report from the Council on Veterinary Services. The report deals with unacceptable surgical procedures applicable to domestic animals. Herewith is the section that pertains to cats:

*"Surgical modification of certain hereditary and congenital abnormalities can obscure, disguise, or eliminate an undesirable characteristic in a dog or cat. Such surgical operations may be done when an animal's health, comfort, and welfare require them, but such operations should not be done to conceal an animal's genetic potential or to deceptively or artificially enhance the value of an animal intended for sale, for breeding purposes, or for showing in competition.*

*"It is unethical for a veterinarian to perform a surgical procedure in a purebred dog or cat for the purpose of concealing a congenital or hereditary abnormality which sets a dog or cat apart from the normal as described in the standard for the breed. Listed here are some examples of surgical procedures that would be unethical.*

1. Changing the length, set, or straightness of the tail.
2. Repair of umbilical or other hernias of genetic origin.
3. Alteration of the natural dental arcade.
4. Alteration of the location of the testes.
5. Changing the length or shape of the pinna of the ear.
6. Removal of areas of undesirable color.
7. Surgical correction of spina bifida.
8. Surgical correction of strabismus.
9. Use of mechanical means to straighten deformed feet and legs."

It is interesting to note that in each instance of the report relating to either cattle, or swine, goats, sheep and horses, an information source is specified. Although not listed as an information source, The Cat Fanciers Association, Inc., was consulted and, indeed, replied to the inquiry that the welfare of the individual cat was the primary concern and that no surgical procedure should

# SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

by Richard H. Gebhardt

A "Guest Editorial" by Beverley Amos appeared in the "National Turkish Angora Cat Club Bulletin", Vol. 5, No. 2, February, 1976, and it was commented upon by Richard Gebhardt in the April issue. The text of both are reprinted here by permission of N.T.A.C.C.

Dreams End presents an open letter to all Turkish Angora breeders and exhibitors: I'd like to start off by telling of an incident which happened to me at a recent show just before Christmas and the Turkish Angoras were called to the ring. As I was putting one of my cats into the cage, I heard the judge whisper to his clerk, "Are the Angora's in the midwest as vicious as those in the east?"

This comment made me stop and think and brought home a point. We, as owners, breeders exhibitors of the Turkish Angora owe it to ourselves and to our breed to show it at its very best. This means to present them healthy, clean and good tempered. We should not campaign a cat that is hard to handle or is upset easily. We now have enough good cats on the circuit that we should not have to show a short tempered one.

So please, members, for the sake of our breed, let's alter and keep home those who do not like shows. Let's put only the very best we have before the judges. Let's stop handicapping our cats. We will never make headway until we can be honest with ourselves and with our fellow exhibitors. It is not shameful to alter a good cat because of temperament, but it is shameful to subject judges to serious harm for the sake of a ribbon. Let us make the Turkish Angora a breed to be proud of, not to be laughed at or to be afraid of.

Mr. Gebhardt's reply:

Your "Guest Editorial", by Beverley Amos, took courage and guts. I congratulate her forward and objective thinking. Ms. Amos' kind of thinking need not apply only to Angoras but should be used in the breeding and showing of all breeds of cats.

The breeders and exhibitors must realize that bad publicity can be a definite set back in the development of any breed, and it takes very little time before the judges and public begin drawing their own conclusions. No judge enjoys trying to display a difficult cat. It is of little interest to judges that the cat is fine at home, that's not where we have to judge the cats.

An exhibit of less quality has a far better chance of moving on towards the finals

## SCOTTISH FOLD LITTER STUDY

For the past two years, members of the International Scottish Fold Association have conducted a survey of the litters produced. Of those breeders reporting, the following information is obtained:

1. 149 kittens were born of which 71 had folded ears.
2. 13 kittens were born dead or died shortly after birth. Since folding of ears occurs at about 3 weeks of age, it is impossible to tell which of these kittens would have been folds.
3. 7 kittens were stillborn.
4. 3 kittens had cleft palates.
5. The other causes of death were: strangulation by umbilical cord at delivery, prematurity and unknown.
6. 1 litter was euthanized some weeks after delivery because of poor development.
7. There have been, thus far, 4 Fold to Fold matings. Of these, one kitten in a litter had a cleft palate; the remainder in that litter were normal. One kitten in another litter was stillborn. Interestingly, one litter resulting from a Fold-to-Fold breeding produced only straight-eared kittens.
8. Straight ear kittens out of Fold breedings, at maturity, have been mated to Folds to produce 6 litters. No deformities were reported.
9. Studies of the bone structure of the Scottish Fold have been instituted at the University of Pennsylvania. Thus far, no deformities have been found.

The members of the International Scottish Fold Association are to be congratulated for their cooperation. The reason for the survey was the deformities that occurred in the breed in England. One cannot help but wonder how many other breeds, as candidates for championship status, could be subjected to such scrutiny and achieve such an excellent record.###

when it is a cat that shows well and is a pleasure to handle. The high quality we see at the shows today can be a nightmare for judges to eliminate, but one sure bet is that when all else is equal TEMPERAMENT will often be the deciding factor.

With thirty years of breeding, I can speak from experience. Temperament is every bit as much of a quality as is coat, color, and conformation. Like the latter three you have to breed for, you do not teach it. The wisdom in your editorial is pure gold. I hope all breeders and exhibitors will take it to heart.###

JMFRC-17: PHENAZOPYRIDINE TOXICOSIS IN THE CAT

J. W. Harvey & H. P. Kornick, JAVMA, Vol. 169, No. 3, August 1, 1976, pp. 327-331.

Pyridium Toxicity in Cats.

Symptomatic relief can be obtained by the use of pyridium in cystitis. This analgesic turns urine a bright orange and relieves pain. The generic name of the drug is phenazopyridine. Toxicosis resulting from the drug is reported in a cat and confirmed on an experimental basis. The use of this drug in cats is hazardous.

JMFRC-18: MUCOPOLYSACCHARIDOSIS IN A CAT

K. R. Cowell, P. F. Jezyk & M. E. Hopkins, JAVMA, Vol. 169, No. 3, August 1, 1976, pp. 334-339.

The discovery of Herler's Syndrome in the Siamese breed has recently been reported by K.R. Cowell et al. The syndrome, which has been known in man for approximately 60 years, appeared in a Blue Point Siamese female. The disease, which may manifest itself by skeletal, cardiovascular, neurologic and ocular abnormalities, is an inherited disease of mucopolysaccharide metabolism in cats. When ocular abnormalities are present, dwarfism is usually present also.

The case presented occurred in a 21-month old Siamese female, the product of a mother-to-son mating. Prior litters resulting from the same cross had produced similar kittens. The cat had been brought to the University of Pennsylvania because of acute lameness. The cat which was the runt of the litter had had eye problems at 4½ months of age. Abnormal gait had been noted at 7 months. Because the cat had been fed primarily beef liver, a mistaken diagnosis of hyper-vitaminosis A had been made. When hypothyroidism was suspected at 13 months, the cat was placed on thyroid. Marked skeletal deformities were noted on X rays. The diagnosis was made on the basis of multiple deformities plus the presence of metachromatic inclusion bodies in the white blood cells plus a high concentration of mucopolysaccharides in the urine.

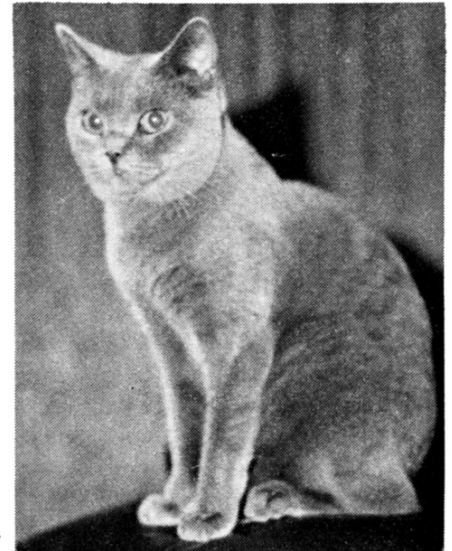
CCA FOUNDED SIXTEEN YEARS AGO

## AUSTRALIA

Cyclone 'Tracy' is indeed just a memory if the cat fancy in Darwin is any indication. A recent cat show held in this tropical Northern gateway to Australia was a wonderful benching of quality cats and kittens. In Siamese many outstanding Lilac and Lilac Tabby Points as well as Chocolate Points and Chocolate Tabby Points. Fewer, but just as typey Blue and Seal Points. Top Burmese, Browns in majority, with other colors pushing hard with quality; more and better Long Hairs than before 'Tracy'. Korats, Russian Blues and British light in numbers, high on quality. Darwin is now a city of magnificent buildings and fine suburbs gradually erasing the scars and devastation of the 'Big Blow' . . . . South Australia and the recent benching of Long Hairs at the Persian Cat Club show was an eye opener: Reds of the richly glowing color of Irish Setter dogs, something not seen in years; Chinchillas as fairylike as a dream with bone and type to challenge other Long Hair color variants . . . . 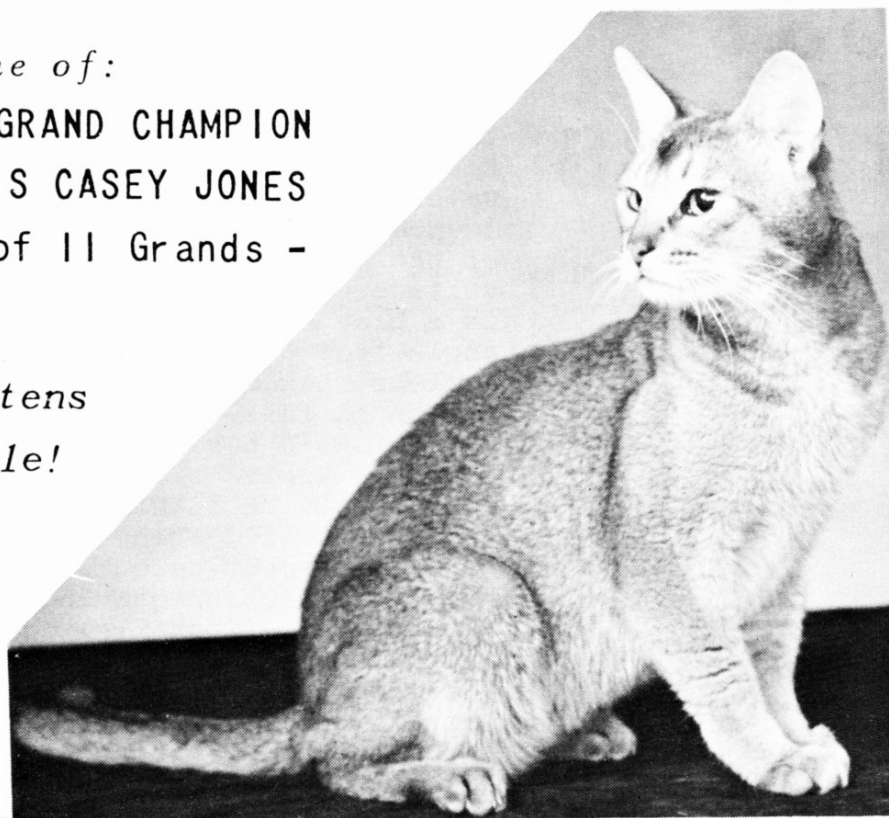

# College Of Cat Genetics

Patricia Turner

## STUDY UNIT 19

There are many kinds of colour in animals and these are due to the reflection of some, although not all, of the components of incident white light. A coloured object reflects some of the components and the actual colour depends upon the wavelengths on which they reach the retina of the observer's eye.

Some colour is 'structural', that is to say that the physical nature of its surface is responsible for the colour. Other colour may be 'pigmentary', that is to say it is caused by the presence of pigment, and some colour may be due to a combination of both structure and pigment. Structural colours are caused by interference, diffraction or scat-

tering of light and examples can be given of the colours of a soap bubble or the colours in mother of pearl, or the blue of the sky. In fact, soap bubble colour is caused by the reflection of light from both outer and inner surfaces with that from the inner surfaces travelling further. If the distance between the inner and outer surfaces is such that optical retardation is an odd number of half wavelengths then part of the spectrum is 'cancelled out' and the observer sees the sum of the remainder. As the distance between the surface varies in different parts, the result is a play of colours and these vary with the angle from which the bubble is observed. This 'colour change' is due to interfering rays of light. In fact, colours vary with the angle of vision in a very definite order known as Newton's series and such changes of colour occurring with differences in eye position constitute iridescence.

Iridescent colours can also be produced by a 'diffraction grating'. These can be seen if a series of parallel equidistant scratches are made very close together on a polished metal surface. On either side of a beam of white light falling across the scratched lines there appear spectra giving an iridescent appearance to the surface. In mother of pearl superimposed layers formed by tablet-shaped crystals of aragonite are cemented together by very thin layers of an organic substance and lie inclined to the inner face of the shell. As they strike against the shell surface their parallel laminae form a curved diffraction grating.

In some mammals, coloured light is reflected by part of the coat of the layer in the eye that contains blood vessels and pigment (situated immediately outside the retina). Light that would otherwise be absorbed by dark melanin pigment is reflected; the effect can be seen at dusk and is known as eye shine. It is thought that these reflected colours are due, in some instances at least, to diffraction.

Structural colours produced by interference or diffraction change according to the angle from which the object is seen but there

is another kind of structural colour which looks the same from any angle. This is produced by the scattering of the shorter waves in white light by very tiny particles and is the sort of colour already described in the blue of the sky. If the particles are small, they scatter more of the short wave than of the long wave components of white light and in the spectrum the violet and blue end is much more scattered than the red end. (The spectrum ranging from the short end to the long end as follows: violet, blue, green, yellow, orange, red).

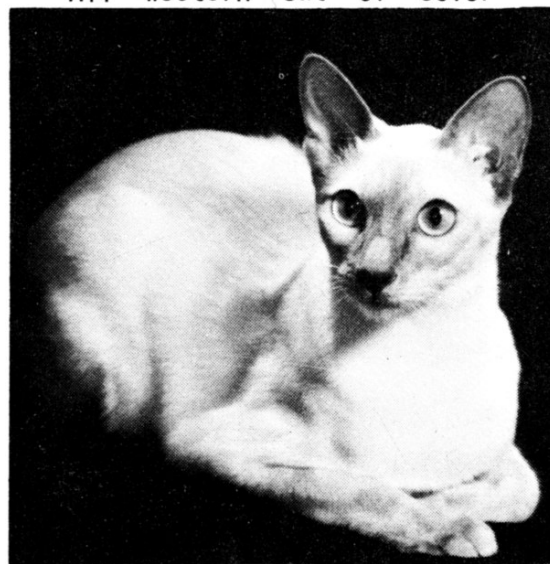
There are two sorts of 'scattered colour' and in this discussion 'colour' includes black, white and their intermediates. One sort of scattering occurs in white hair. Whiteness of hair is like whiteness of snow or of lilies; it is caused by air spaces in a solid translucent substance. The air spaces lead to light-scattering but there are no pigment granules or other substances to absorb light. If it was possible to produce white hair with air spaces very very minute, then the colour effect would be blue.

There is a special name for the sort of scattering that produces colour by the presence of very minute particles. In 1869 John Tyndall studied and explained the phenomenon of the blue colour of the sky and henceforth the type of light scattering producing blue has been known as 'Tyndall scattering'. Tyndall scattering is the type of scattering that produces the blue sky colours already mentioned, the blue colour of human eyes and

the blue colour of some cats' eyes. In 1866 a researcher stated that blue eyes are blue from a turbid medium in front of a dark background and, later, C. W. Mason found that minute protein particles in the iris which have a higher refractive index than the surrounding stroma (connective tissue) scatter the incident white light and thus cause blueness. A gradual increase in the size of the particles with advancing age causes a gradual lessening of the Tyndall effect and thus a gradual lightening of colour. Light is apparently scattered against pigment at the back of the iris which prevents the red colour of the blood in the capillaries from 'over riding' the more feeble blue. Albino animals, which lack the layer of melanin therefore have 'pink' eyes. In Tyndall scattering, a dark background increases the intensity of blue; this is seen in the bright blue of the African lizard where melanin pigment behind the protein particles which scatter again increases the intensity of blue. Another frequently quoted example is that of the bluish chin of dark-haired men seen after shaving. One explanation is that the colour is due to the black souls of men coming out on their chins every morning! The other, more scientific explanation is that of Tyndall scattering --without the black roots of the hairs for a background the feeble Tyndall scattering would not be seen. In fair men, where there is no dark background, the bluish effect is not seen.### (This subject will be continued in Study Unit 20. Association recently started Specialist Breed Committees to cater for the interests of these minority groups, namely: British Shorthairs, Rex, all Self Siamese Type, Russian Blue, Korat. The Committees intend to keep their members up to date with all information re these Breed Groups. Other ideas are to exchange ribbons, rosettes, etc., with overseas Clubs interested in these Breeds; compile slide and book libraries; conduct seminars, etc. .... All our Self Siamese type (Breed Group 29) cats that do not have individual names now have their colour prefixed with the word 'Oriental', e.g. Oriental Lavender, which is far more descriptive than the previous term 'Foreign' which also described all other S/H cats with the exception of British S/H ..... Recently the NZCF adopted Breed Numbers and Standards for registration purposes for all colours and patterns of Smokepoint, Silverpoint and Pastelpoint Siamese, Oriental Smokes, Silvers and Pastels. The numbers were allocated on our standardised system of Breed numbers; therefore the entire 24 and 29 Groups' numbers are used with the prefix 'S' to annotate the Smokes and Silvers and the prefix 'P' to annotate the Pastels. For show purposes, these cats will be exhibited in four groups: all colours of Oriental Smokes and Silvers as S29, and all colours of Oriental Pastels as P29. Challenge status for these cats has not to date been applied for.

## U.S.A.

Puget Sound Cat Club, Seattle, WA, has donated the proceeds of the Club's 1974 and 1975 shows to the College of Veterinary Medicine, Washington State University. The \$2,500 will be used for research in the field of Feline Leukemia ..... The 1977 Pet Health Congress will take place June 12, 1977, at the Thunderbird Inn, Portland, OR ..... Norden has introduced a new rhinotracheitis/calicivirus vaccine which is administered externally rather than by the conventional injection method ..... The Sacred Cat of Burma Fanciers 4th show attracted a large entry which included 52 Birman cats and kittens, a new record ..... ACFA has recognized the Turkish Angora in colors for Championship competition ..... 1975-'76 Top Cats in CFF include Kamara Mysteria, Lilac Point Siamese female (Best Cat); Suttonian's Musette, Shaded Silver Persian female (Best Kitten); and Natasha of La Marchesa, Russian Blue spay (Best Alter). ###

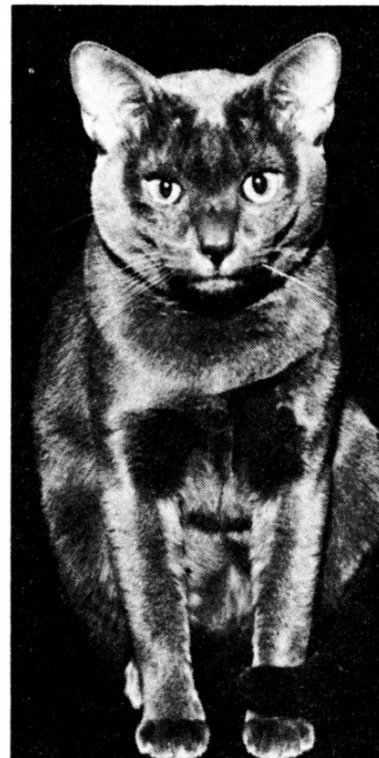

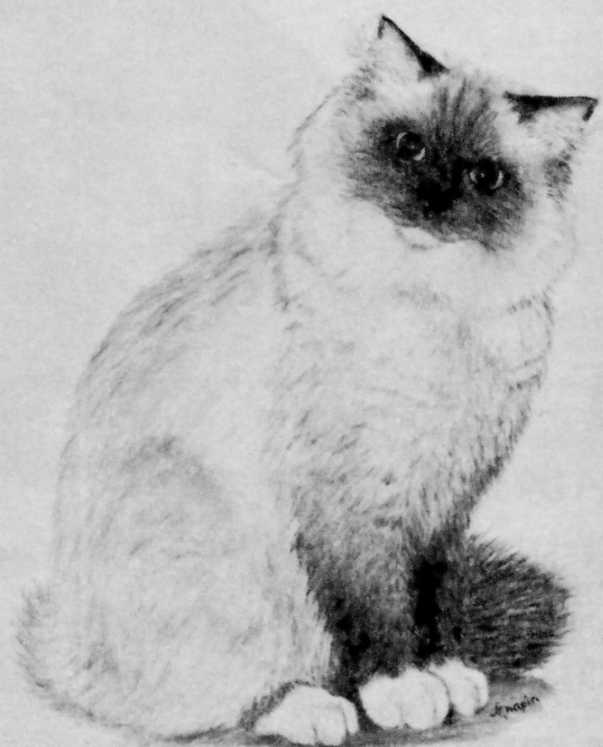

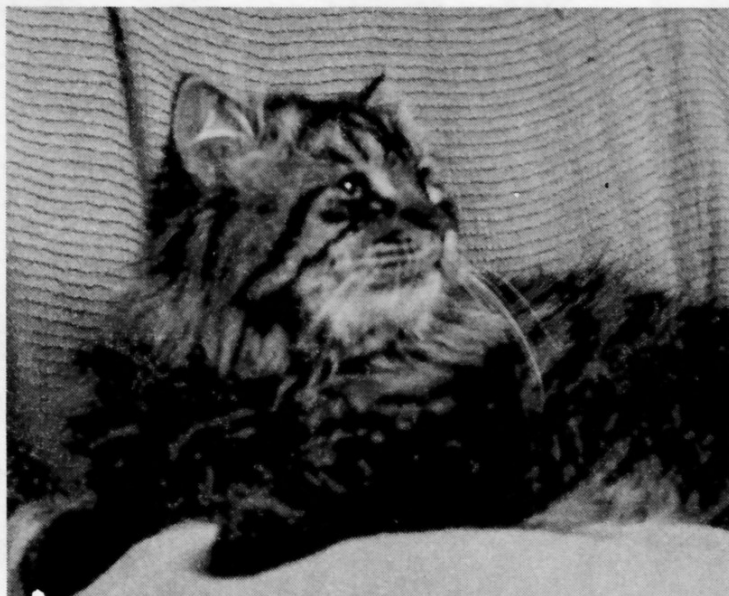

## International Cattery Tour

This new series begins at the Saren-Del Cattery, Mequon, Wisconsin, USA, home of 3 American Shorthair studs, 6 queens and 5 neuters and spays. Their owner, Mary McIntyre, who describes her cattery plan here, has been in the fancy for 10 years and shows her cats at about 24 CFA shows each year.

Saren-Del's cattery is located on the second floor of a two-story frame farmhouse that dates back to 1870. The room itself is 24 feet by 17 feet giving an all-over area of 408 square feet. There are windows on three sides which provide good ventilation and excellent light.

The cages are built in and are made of wooden frames with chicken wire; they are backed with the natural wall except in the case of the three males' cages which are tilted. The floor is linoleum, easily cleaned. The cage area consists of six cages 3'x4'x8'; four cages 4'x4'x3½', and six cages 2½'x3'x3'. This leaves approximately 272 square feet of romping room. Each of the walk-in cages has a floor-to-ceiling climbing pole and shelf and each of the smaller cages has a shelf.

The cattery cost in the range of \$2,000 to build but is a constant pleasure to the cats, as well as a set up that we can show to visitors with pride. The ease in cleaning has made it able to be maintained so that there is practically no time that it is not presentable. The following sketches illustrate the placement of cages, shelves, etc., along each wall of the cattery:

Above: View of cattery's North side. Below: View of South side.

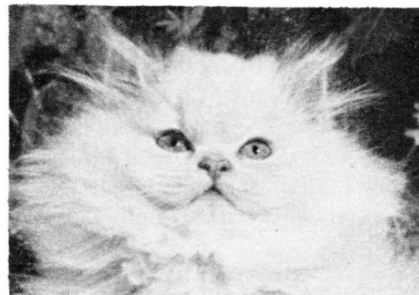

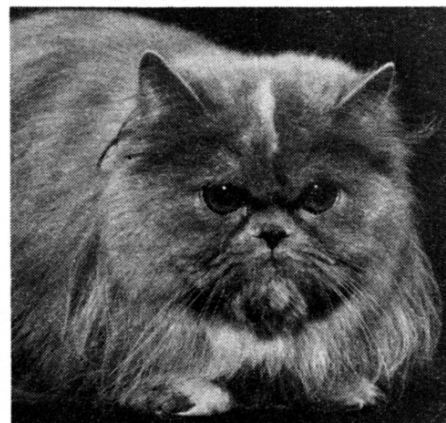

## PLAIN FACTS: PICK OF THE LITTER

Some people have a problem selecting the best kitten in a litter of four or five excellent kittens. Most breeders have an average litter in which there are one or two standouts. Then there is a third group obliged to pick the best of the worst. Obviously, the batting average of picking the best, even by the most experienced breeder, is not 100%. If that were not so, you would not read about Minerva Newcomer having a Grand in her first show season. That Grand was sold to Minerva because Odette Oldtimer didn't have her glasses on when the deal was made. Having spent nearly twenty years in the fancy, I put to bed long ago the rumor that some breeders will sell their best. When they do, it is by accident.

Kittens change into cats through a series of very awkward stages. What appears typey one week looks like the last rose of summer the next. In order to keep errors at a minimum, it would seem sensible to know the standard of the breeds which interest you. Body types fall into three major - actually four - categories: (a) short and cobby; (b) elongated; (c) intermediate; and (d) Manx. At one end of the spectrum we have Persian, Exotic Shorthair, Himalayan and Burmese. At the other end is the Siamese, Colorpoint SH and Oriental SH.

For some breeds, the best time to pick the pick of the litter is at birth. Although there is some molding in lengthy deliveries, when the kitten is wet is the best time to see bone structure, orbit and eye set and ear set and actual tail length. At birth it is the head type that is best seen. Granted, noses and ears elongate with time, but we are talking about practical practices in the impractical and improbable world of cats. If one could hold on to an entire litter for at least a year the job of selecting the best would be considerably less difficult. Once the kittens are dry, another kitten might look better. By two weeks and eight weeks the choices have been changed again.

A suggested method for positive identification of the littermates in their early stages is to mark their nails with fingernail polish.

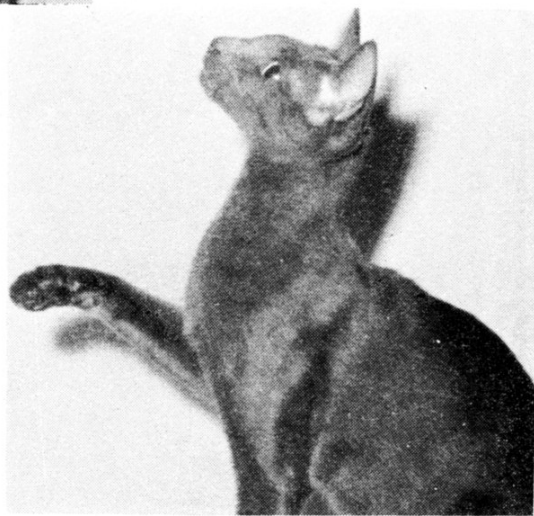
Experience, which provides the breeder with the ability to project what a kitten will look like in a year, is gained by observation and the making of mistakes. The best way to gain such experience is to start and build a catalog of each litter. If it were practical, a good notion would be to keep a

notebook listing the kittens by order of preference at birth, two weeks, eight weeks, six months and one year. Full face, profile and a side view photos of the better kittens at regular intervals would be ideal. The observations of a trusted and more experienced breeder are of great help. But this is a very practical and fast-paced world. By three months kittens are usually placed but communication between breeder and buyer frequently will help in determining whether or not the decision to place a particular kitten elsewhere was a correct one.

Some breeds mature more rapidly than others. Some lines in particular breeds develop more slowly. All such factors require consideration. As a general rule, the elongated body type reaches full potential more rapidly than the short cobby cat.

#### PRACTICAL APPROACH TO BETTER DECISIONS

As every breeder knows, choosing the best kitten in a litter is not an easy thing to do. Regardless of knowledge and experience the correct decision will rarely achieve 100% accuracy. However, a practical approach to making better decisions involves:

1. Thorough knowledge of the breed, its current standard and its usual progress to maturity;
2. Thorough knowledge of the pedigree of the sire and dam of the litter and their own developmental progress to maturity;
3. Presence at the time of birth to study bone structure;
4. Careful observation of the litter as it develops to age 3 months (this observation should be critical and objective);
5. Periodic photographs of littermates to form a reference catalog for use over the years of active breeding;
6. The valuable advice of an experienced breeder who will be critical rather than kind.###

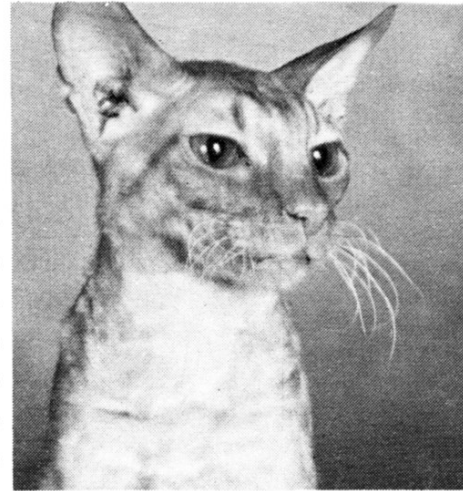

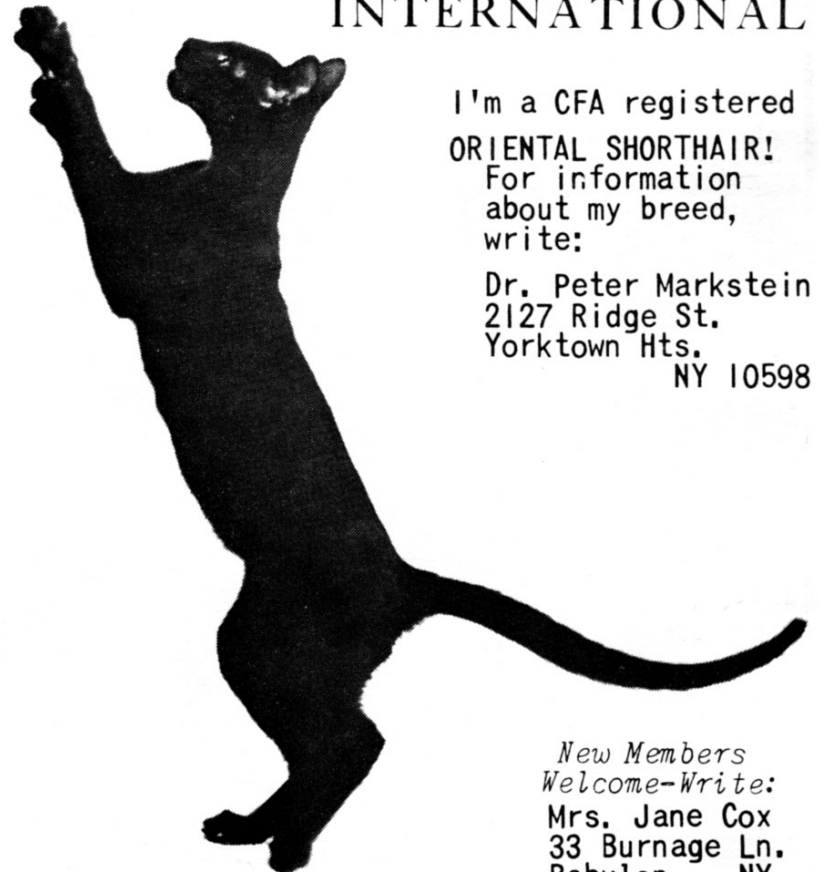

## PROBLEM

**SELLING SHOW KITTENS TO THE NOVICE EXHIBITOR**  
I have read many times the trials and tribulations of cat purchasers ... but never do I hear the trials and tribulations of the breeders! I consider myself a breeder, as well as an exhibitor, and would like to state some facts that I feel deserve recognition.

The months of carefully checking kittens to be sure that they are consistently growing --not getting too fat or too lean--sneezes, scratches, or whatever kittens can have (and there are many things) are long and tedious, and the care that goes into a top show kitten cannot be evaluated. The pleasure in sending this kitten to a prospective purchaser, or taking it to a show ready to be picked up, and having the purchaser exclaim, "How beautiful she is ...", or "How pleased I am with this beautiful boy", makes it worth all the trouble.

Another long-time breeder immediately appreciates the quality and potential of the kitten, but, unfortunately, the Novice to the Cat Fancy immediately begins to find fault. Such remarks as ... "The tail could be some-

what longer ...", or "The ears could be bigger ..." are immediate.

It should be obvious to everyone that a perfect cat there is not ... and if there was, and the breeder knew it, she would certainly not sell it to anyone but would capitalize on the cat.

In many instances, the breeder loses money on the sale and, although the purchaser perhaps meant well, they do not want to pay for anything if they are not satisfied with the kitten. The fact that the breeder has shipped the cat, paid for the vet certificate for shipping, etc., are of no interest to the prospective purchaser.

I know it was a deeply satisfying feeling to me recently to purchase a kitten from someone and I immediately advised the breeder that she was exactly what I wanted (in this case, it was the ear set involved). Whether she had faults or not, that was not important; I knew what I wanted, and this cat had it. Sure, she was not perfect ... but I did not buy that and I was happy with her and made it a point to advise the breeder of same.

Impatience is another factor with novice cat purchasers. They think they can phone tonight and demand a top show cat and ... poof ... there she is, all ready to go up there and win ribbons and trophies. If they would only wait and trust the breeder they have approached for a top kitten, their waiting would not be in vain. I must put in at this time that even though a cat is a "winner", her first show might be a failure and the second show might be the winner. You cannot evaluate any cat on one show alone; even the winners get beat sometimes!

Another fallacy that is becoming more and more current is that everyone wants a top winning kitten ... but what do they do with it? Show it only when and where it is convenient for them to do so. In other words, they want a top cat that a breeder has lovingly chosen to be a winner just for a pet

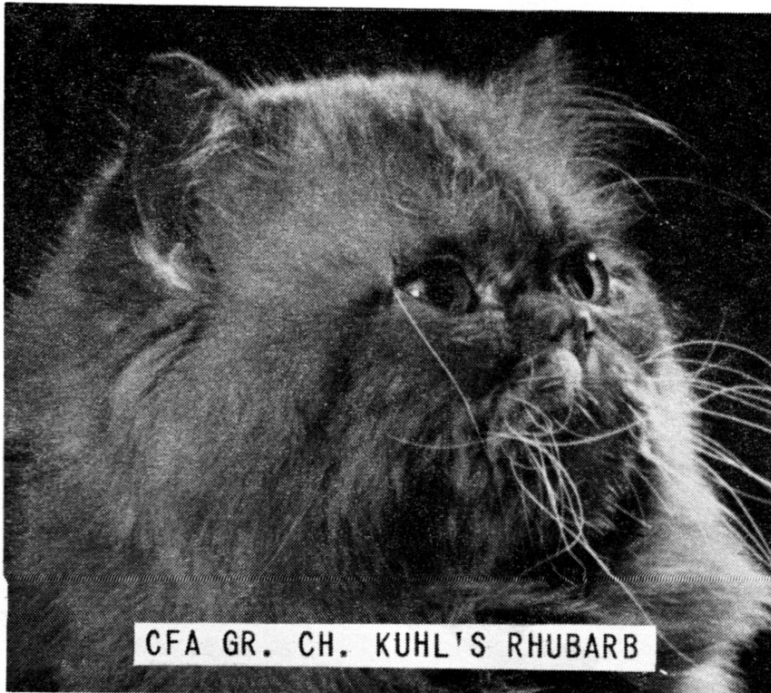

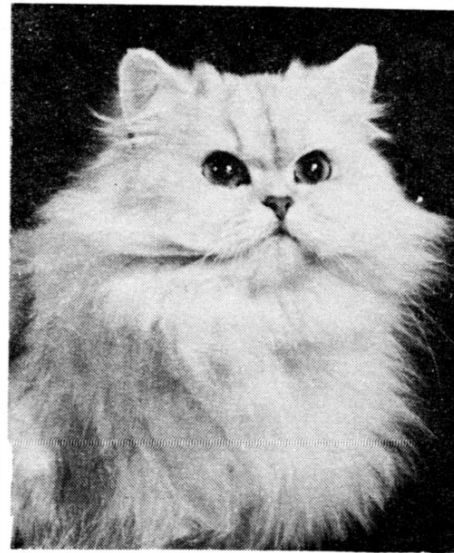

alone ... to show when they feel like it and at a show that does not require driving, flying or money to speak of. And, this is what they wanted "Mrs. Jones' best product" for--- to be a pet for them. This is a complaint I get from many breeders and they do not wish to sell their best unless it will be shown.

Last, but not least, the purchaser wants you to send her the kitten for approval (after a modest deposit). After keeping it for several weeks and asking everyone else's opinion on it (some good, some bad--those that have a better one for less money, of course) and then the breeder may receive a phone call that the purchaser has decided this was not the cat for her.

I know of a recent case when the purchaser refused to send the kitten back to the breeder and this turned out to be quite a mess. The breeder was out a top show kitten while the purchaser was sitting there with a kitten but no papers. I am happy to say it was finally resolved ... but not until a tremendous phone bill was incurred (by the breeder, of course).

There are many tales that can be told of the many experiences involved in breeding and selling show kittens or cats, too many for this article.

I hope my "sounding off" does not offend anyone, but I felt it was time something was published from the breeder's side of the picture. It can be a very disappointing one at times, but it can also be a proud and exciting pleasure on the other side of the scale ... especially when the purchaser phones to advise the cat has Granded with 275 points!

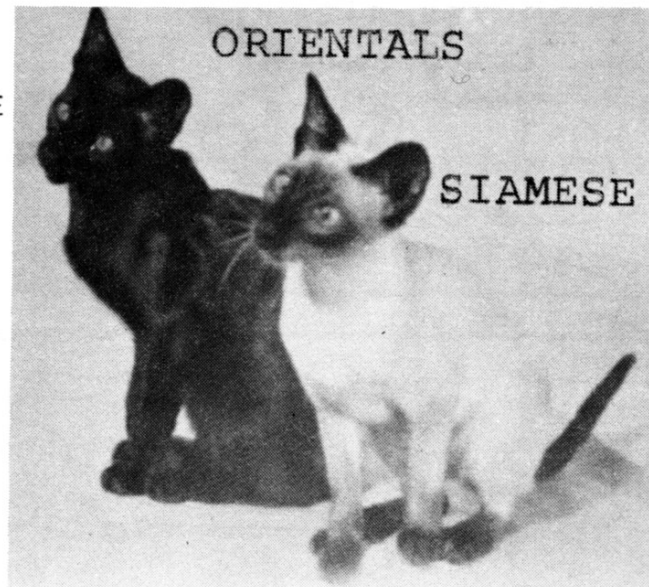

ed and followed, especially when working with the novice exhibitor.

As all experienced breeders/exhibitors know, the "100-point perfect cat" has still to be bred but, all too often, the newcomer innocently believes that all it takes to own a "guaranteed Grand" kitten and enjoy the resulting rosettes, trophies and show glory is money. It is only by participation and education during a number of years that the "novice" can become a "veteran", so the breeder who is approached for a "top show kitten" by the newcomer must be willing to explain some of the "facts of fancying" in a way which can be readily understood and absorbed. Should a kitten sale result, the newcomer should then be better able to appreciate his purchase.

Many of us are very pressed for time and

it is tempting to handle inquiries by phone. However, it is more businesslike to conduct cattery affairs in writing: not only does this afford the breeder a permanent record of transactions, but it enables the novice inquirer to read over the information several times and understand it better. Data given over the telephone is likely to be misunderstood and quickly forgotten. A photocopied or mimeographed "form letter" stating cattery policy is much more satisfactory and can be sent with a short personal letter.

The following letter gives a general outline which can be adapted to suit the individual breeder's personal policies and the breed of cat concerned.

Thank you for your inquiry for a top show quality (color), (breed) (sex) kitten. I would like to explain to you the sales policy of my cattery.

Kittens are grouped in four categories: 1. Pet; 2. Breeder; 3. Breeder/Show; 4. Top show. Category one kittens are those which have a show fault which I consider too serious for the kitten to be shown; Category 2 are those which are especially good in certain points and, when selectively bred to a cat who is strong otherwise but lacking in one of these, could be expected to produce very good kittens; Category 3 includes kittens which have some excellent qualities and are worthwhile showing but which I do not feel will make their CFA Grand Championships; Category 4 kittens are those which I would expect to have outstanding show careers provided that they are cared for according to my instructions and shown extensively. However, at no time do I guarantee that a kitten will grow up to become a Grand Champion. Many changes take place between kitten and adulthood and my judgement is based on the kitten's growth to date and my experience of how this particular line develops. A kitten which I rate as Category 4 is one which I would confidently expect to make its Grand if I were to retain it and raise it by my standards, on my recommended diet, and show it under my direction.

It is important to remember that the judging Standard of Points adds up to 100. The cat worth 100 points in a show-ring has not yet been bred and it is unlikely that it ever will be. Therefore, the cat you receive from this, or any other, cattery will not be "perfect". Should you order a Category 4 kitten and assure me that the kitten will be shown at least (number) times during its first (number) years to the best of your ability, the kitten I will select for you will be as close to perfection as possible. If you want a Category 2 or a Category 3 kitten or young adult, it would greatly assist me to determine the right one for you if you will advise me what your current stock is lacking (i.e. do you need better ear-set? eye-set? longer tail? firmer chin? longer body? finer bones?) Adapt for breed concerned.

Kittens are not shipped from this cat-

tery on approval. (An exception to this rule might be when the inquirer is known to the breeder and trusted. In this case, upon receipt of full payment, a kitten could be sent on 24-hour approval, i.e. shipped one day with written understanding that it is to be sent back the next day if not satisfactory.)

Should you wish to make payments on a kitten, we have a payment program by which you may make advance payments on a kitten from a future breeding, or one newly-born, so that the payments will be completed by the time the kitten is old enough to be shipped.

The price which I am quoting to you for a kitten includes the following:

(a) kitten; (b) CFA litter registration; (c) 4 (or 5) generation pedigree neatly typed (or handwritten); (d) enteritis and rhino-tracheitis vaccination; (e) veterinary health certificate obtained not more than 3 days prior to transfer of kitten to you; (f) if kitten is to be sent to you, rather than personally delivered, a cat kennel---if you return this to me within 2 weeks in good condition, I will refund \$25. Air freight is extra.

Minimum age at which I will ship a kitten is \_\_\_ months and no kitten is shipped until payment is received in full. Papers (b) and (c) are sent by certified mail as soon as I am notified of kitten's safe arrival.

With this letter, I am enclosing a sketch pedigree of a kitten which might meet your requirements, together with price and comments on my judgement of his/her potential.

If you are interested in owning one of our kittens, please inform me of your plans for this kitten and tell me how it will be housed and something about the everyday environment into which I would be sending it.

The above suggestion is offered by CAT WORLD editors. Comments and ideas from breeders who have experienced similar problems to Mrs. Crotzer's in dealing with the novice fancier and have devised satisfactory solutions would be welcomed for this column.

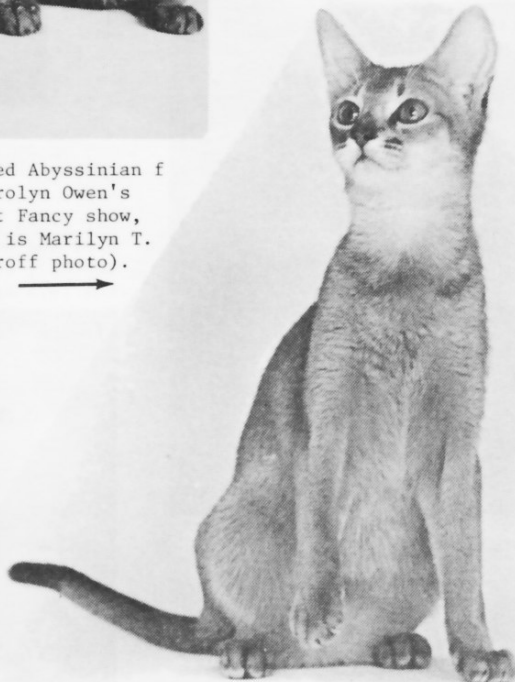

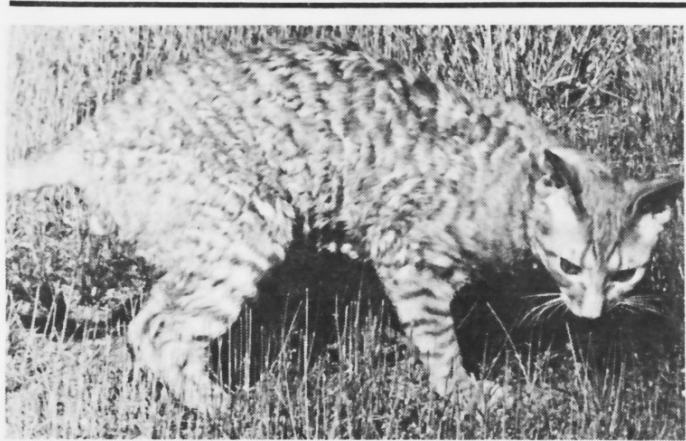

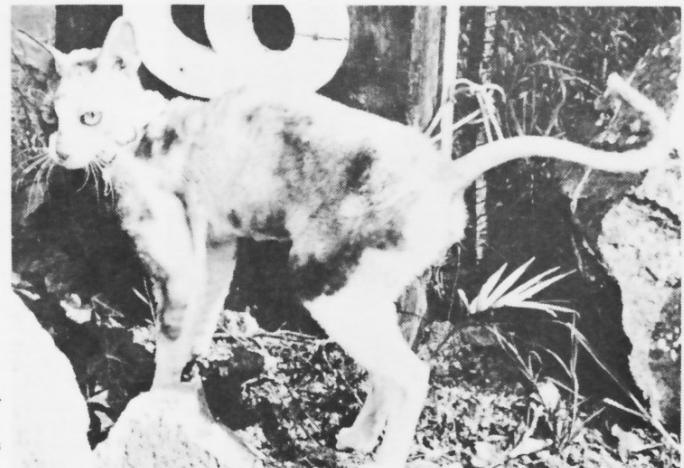
