Q: *What is the Breed Council?*

A: An advisory body on breed standards to the C.F.A. Executive Board.

Q: *What does it do for me?*

A: It protects you, the concerned breeder, by giving you a vote when Standard changes are proposed.

Q: *Can I get a change made in my Breed's Standard?*

A: As a Breed Council member, you can send your proposal to the elected Breed Committee Secretary. It will be evaluated and, if considered of merit, will appear on your breed's annual ballot.

Q: *If the majority of my Breed Committee votes in favor, will my proposal be adopted?*

A: It will be presented to the CFA Executive Board with favorable recommendation.

Q: *Can anyone join the Breed Council?*

A: No. Membership on any Breed Committee is limited to those who have bred and registered a litter of that breed with C.F.A.

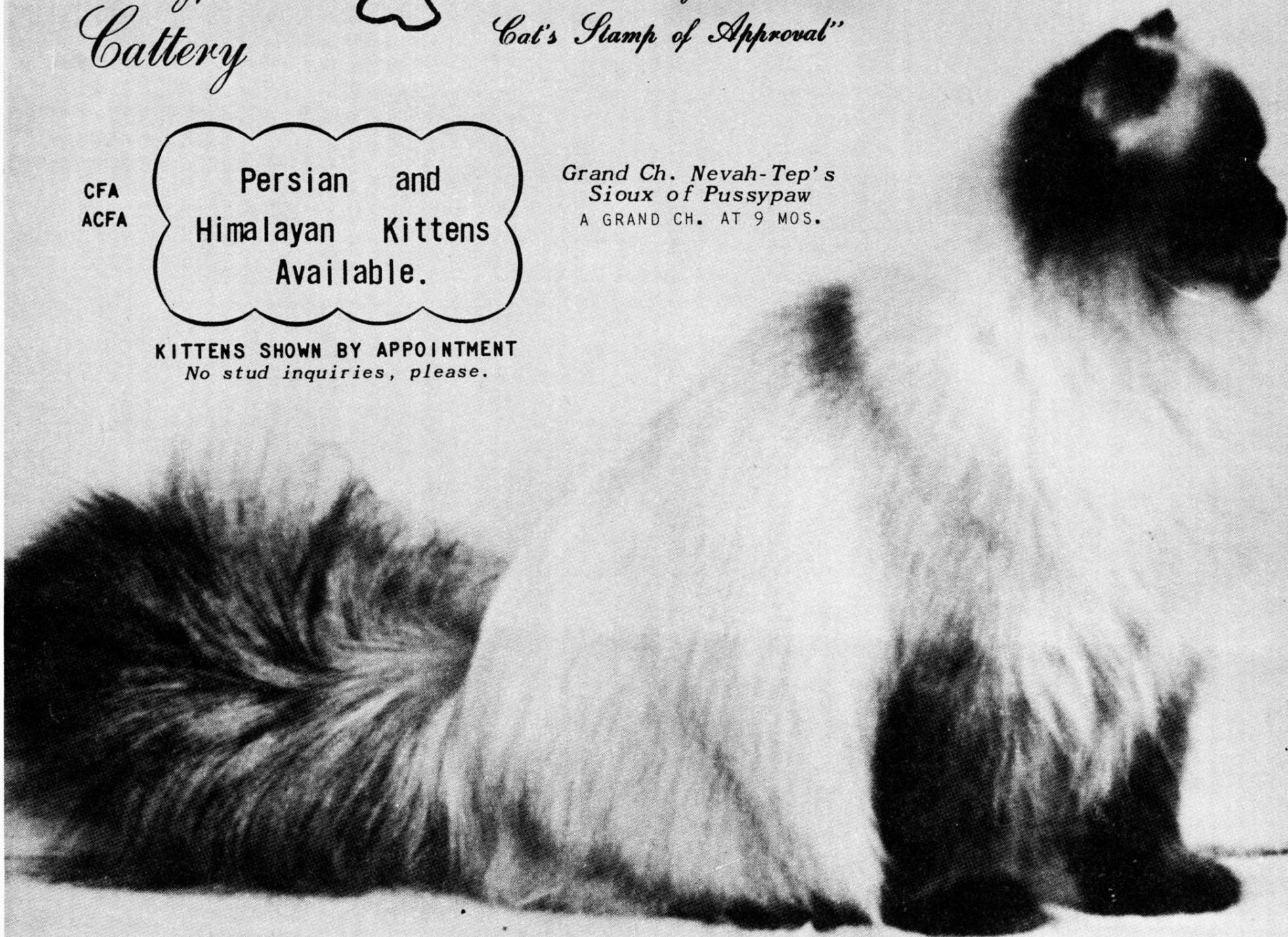

REVIEW

"1977 CFA YEARBOOK". Edited by Marna Fogarty. Published Jan., 1978, by Cat Fanciers Association, Box 430, Red Bank, NJ 07701 USA. 672 pages. US\$11.50 (US\$12.50 Canada/overseas).

CFA held its 1977 Annual Meeting in Hershey, PA. The location and occasion is forever commemorated by the chocolate-&-gold covers chosen for the 20th edition of the "CFA Yearbook".

Unlike so many of the shallow, commercial books published today about cats, this book is not something to be picked up, casually glanced at and then put down to be promptly forgotten. It is something that will last through the years and be referred to many times.

Due to its size, perhaps a 'recipe' for reading it might be useful. This year's edition weighs over 6½ lbs and is comprised of 672 foot-high pages. It is the perfect companion for a cold, wintry afternoon when one can snuggle down for several hours in front of a cheerful fire in a very comfortable chair. Be sure to have drinks and snacks at hand because, once you begin reading, you won't want to be disturbed!

The pages are of heavy, coated stock which serve to show off the many hundreds of photographs to perfection. The color photo-

graphy which abounds is a sheer delight. CFA's 1977 National Award winners are portrayed in full color---a real treat for cat fanciers who would otherwise never be able to fully appreciate their beauty. In addition, the season's Grand Champions and Grand Premiers are presented in 65 pages of black-&-white photographs.

For the serious breeder, there are articles on cat photography, genetics, showing internationally, buying pedigreed cats, veterinary reports, the Egyptian Mau and the Exotic Shorthair. For the not-so-serious, Editor Fogarty has included such subjects as cats on greeting cards, movie cats, personalities, etc.

Running the world's largest cat organization is a serious business, but the annual CFA convention has its light-hearted moments, too. Delegates will appreciate 'Surviving A Convention', Erma Bombeck's witty observations, accompanied by candid photography from the 1977 Hershey affair.

One runs out of superlatives with which to describe the "CFA Yearbook" which, like a good wine, continues annually to improve with age. The book is a 'happening', an exciting visit to the kingdom of pedigreed cats. Anyone interested in the breeding and exhibiting of purebred cats anywhere in the world who does not buy, or at least borrow, a copy of it is cheating himself of a great reading and browsing adventure.###

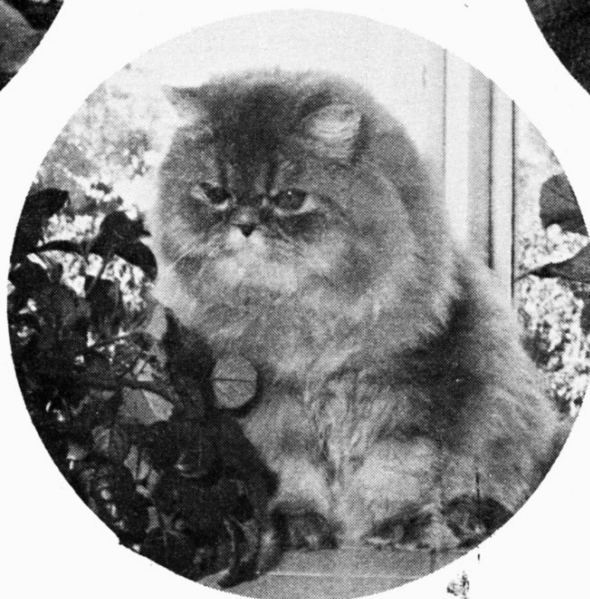

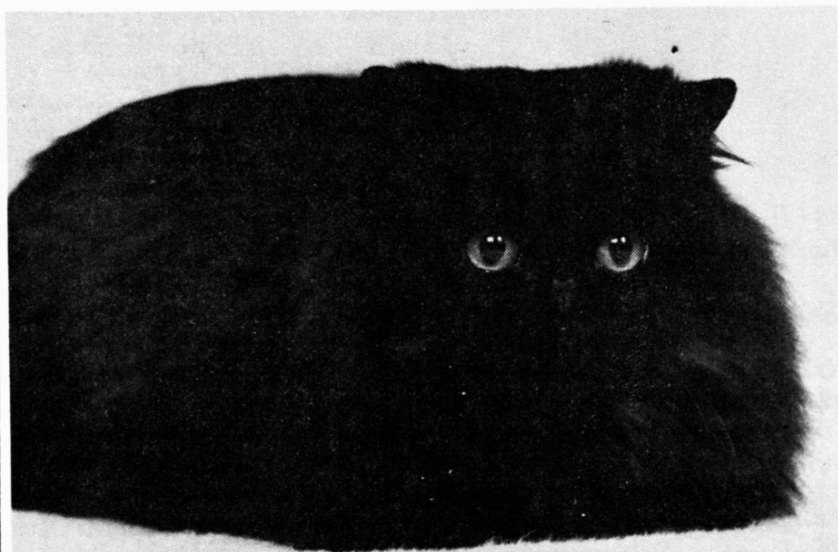

International Cattery Tour

The seventh stop on CAT WORLD readers international tour of catteries is in Adelaide, South Australia. Mr. and Mrs. Jack N. Stephens, who edit the magazine 'Purr', visited the Catisfield Cattery owned by Mrs. M. G. Black, 60 Reservoir Road, Modbury, and sent this report and photos.

Mrs. Black breeds Siamese cats and keeps two stud cats and from eight to twelve queens, as well as a neutered pet.

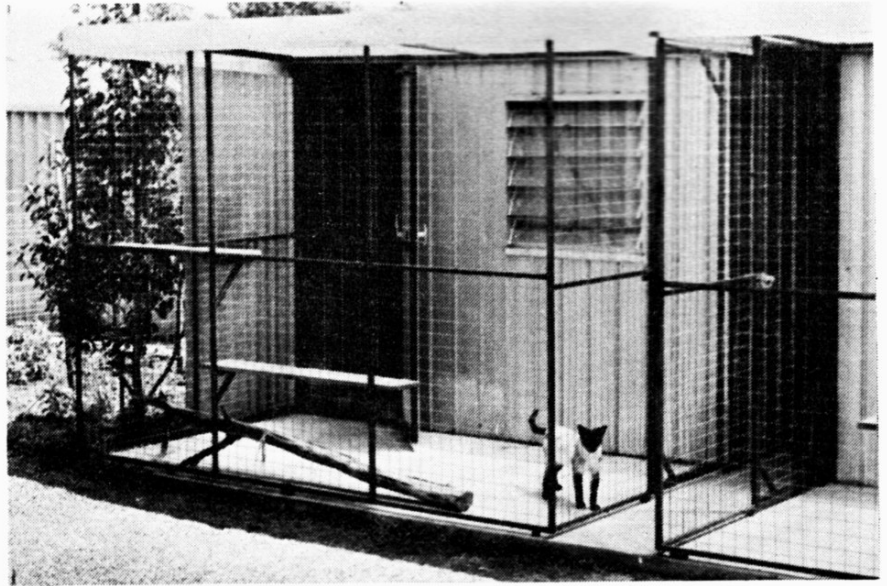
The queens' quarters are on one side of the garden and the stud houses on the opposite side. Kittens are born and reared for the first several weeks in a large kitting box with run which is kept inside the family home.

Maximum shade temperatures vary from about 42 degrees F. to 106, and, on clear winter nights, frost is occasionally experienced. Protection against heat in the hot, dry summer months is more important than protection against cold in winter. Wood is not satisfactory for external construction and pressed steel or galvanised iron have proved the most economical and satisfactory materials, each of which is cheaper to erect than concrete blocks or bricks.

CONSTRUCTION

Queens and stud houses and their runs are constructed on a framework of steel posts. The external walls and roofs of the houses are made of pressed steel, the roofs being covered with white bonded paint to reflect the summer sun. Roofs and walls are insulat-

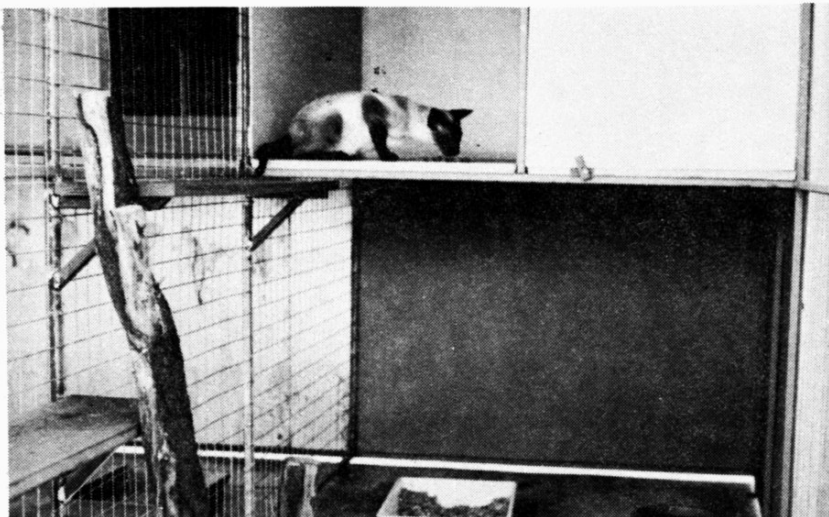
Stud houses. Note passage between the houses.

ed with polystyrene and the houses are lined with painted asbestos. Houses and runs are set on concrete pads, sloping slightly to allow water from the daily hosing to escape to drains connected to the council system. Except for the concrete pads, the houses and runs were built by Mr. Black.

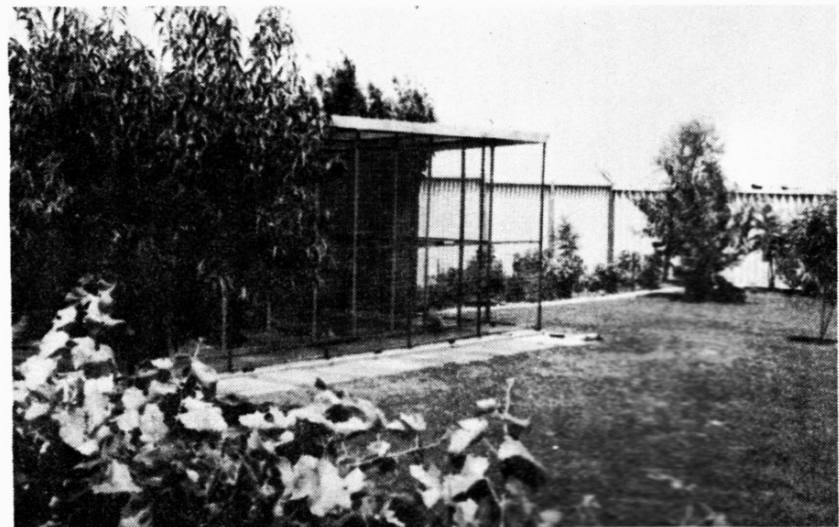
Entrance to the five queens' quarters is through an escape passage. The queens sleep, two or three to a house, in enclosed boxes built on wide shelves at the back of the houses. The fronts of these boxes are hinged at the top so that they can easily be opened up for cleaning and airing. Plenty of shelving and scratching posts are provided in each run. The runs are roofed with coloured fibre glass as a protection against rain, but are open front and sides except for the wire mesh.

Overhead dull emitter heaters are available in the stud cats' sleeping quarters and for the nursing queens and kittens if necessary.

The cattery is set in a well-kept garden of about 180' x 80' with a central grassed area, concrete paths and deciduous trees planted to provide shade in summer.###

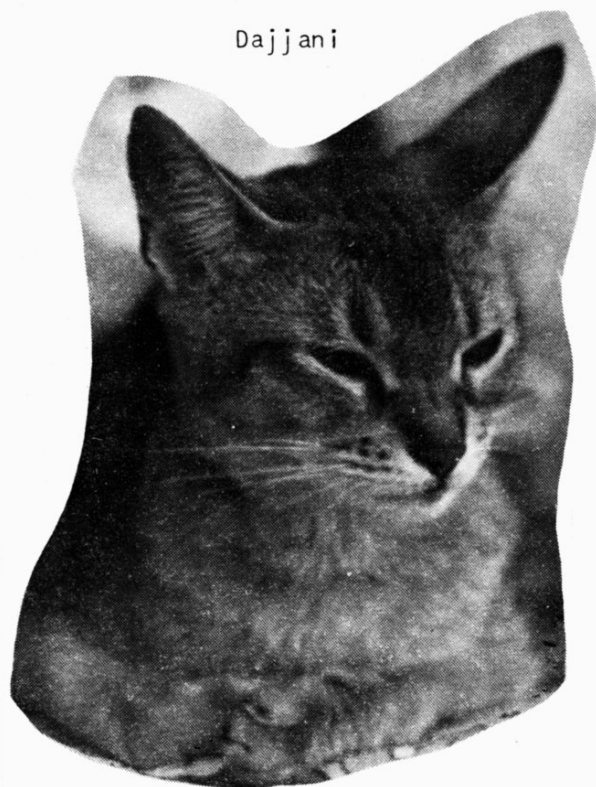


Shelf & sleeping house in queen's quarters.

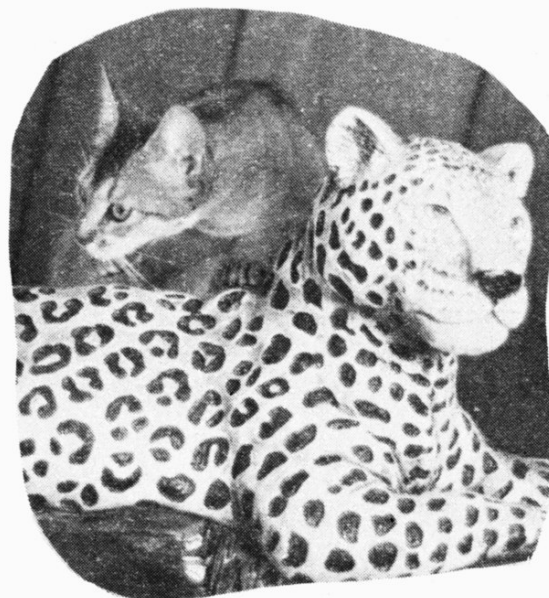

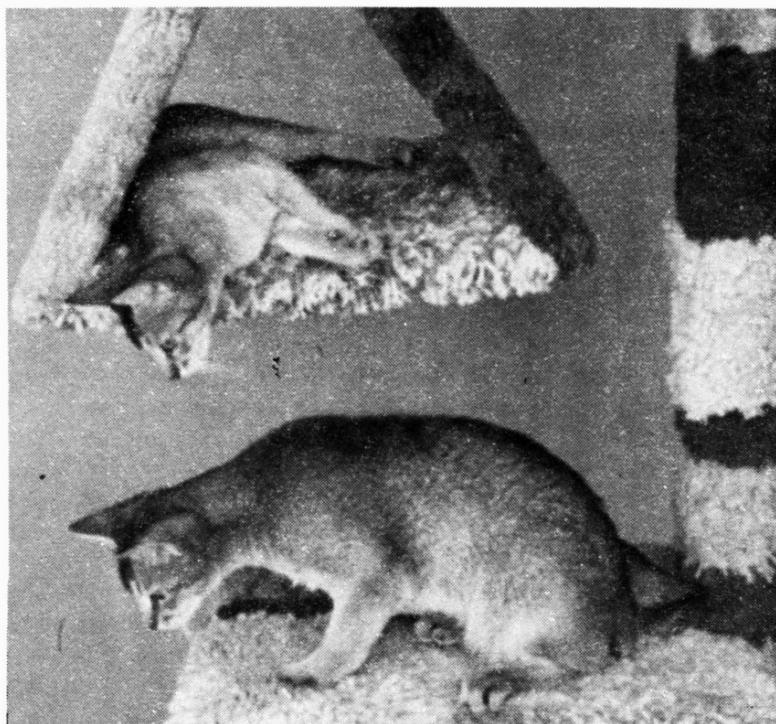

NEW ZEALAND, 1977

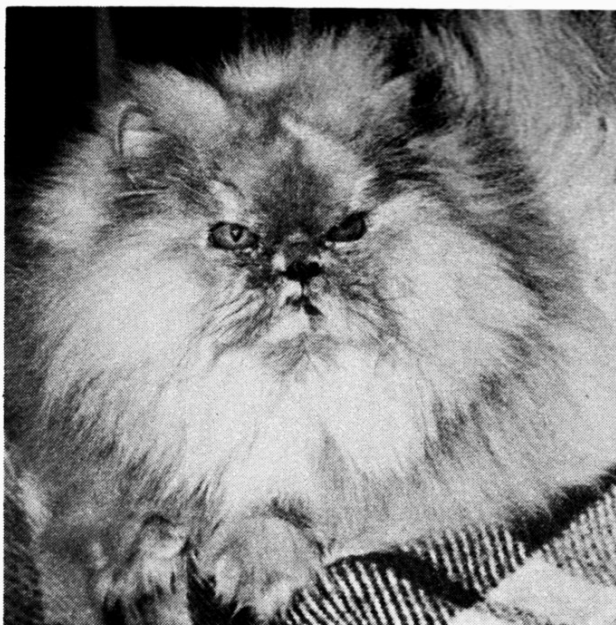
Interest in the NEW ZEALAND "CAT WORLD" AWARDS increased tremendously in this our second year of participation. During 1977, Hurle Rayner, Honorary Scorer, recorded the points won by every exhibit in every show held under the auspices of New Zealand Cat Fancy, Inc. With the expanded scoring system used in 1977, most Clubs are participating fully and sincere thanks go to those who are so conscientiously furnishing fully and accurately marked show catalogues. Full cooperation by the N.Z. Cat Fancy Inc. has made Mr. Rayner's task of compiling the annual list of winners much easier.

The show season ended last November, after nine months duration, and Mr. Rayner began the arduous detailed work of checking, cumulating and averaging the points won in 1977 by 2960 Longhair entries, 1387 Shorthairs and 3100 Siamese (including cats, kittens and neuters/spays). The CAT WORLD AWARDS scheme is free to clubs and exhibitors and gives recognition to those exhibits who have beaten the most others. They are then presented in the pages of this magazine to be seen internationally. Prior to the start of the CAT WORLD Awards, a New Zealand cat's show career reached its ultimate glory upon attainment of the magnificent 'Grand Champion' status. Now, to feature in NZCW's Best Cats/Kittens/Neuters & Spays annually is an added incentive to all breeders and exhibitors.

NEW ZEALAND SHOW FORMAT

The divisions of a NZCF Show are: Longhair and Shorthair divided into sections of Cats, Kittens, and Neuter/Spays. At the Club's discretion, these may be further divided for judging purposes into, for example, Siamese and S/H Other Than Siamese. Originally the Clubs put the Self Siamese (Orientals) in the S/H Other than Siamese section. However, all clubs (whose entries are large enough to warrant two judges in the S/H section), now divide this section into Siamese, which includes Self Siamese, and S/H Other than Siamese, as Self Siamese (Oriental) cats are cats of Siamese body conformation and freely intermatable within the Siamese so it is only logical that they should always be judged by the Siamese Group Judge.

Cats in New Zealand do not compete in All Breed rings as they do in U.S.A. Therefore, official NEW ZEALAND "CAT WORLD" AWARDS placings follow our show format. However, it

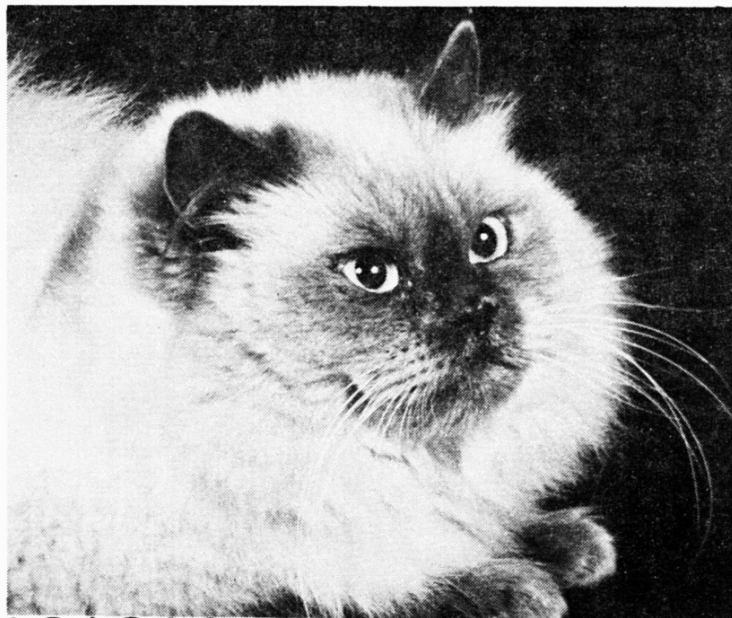

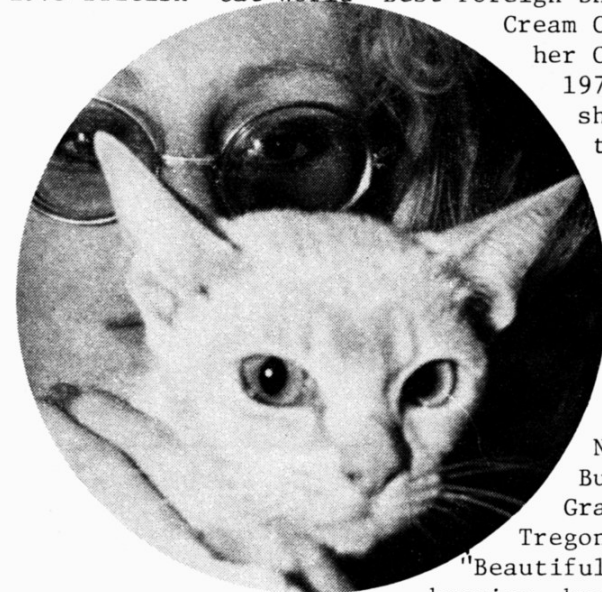

Runner-Up gained one point for every cat present and competing, less two.

All exhibits received points for their highest placing only, i.e. exhibits placed in the BIS, Top 5, Top 10, etc., automatically dropped the points accumulated at lower levels. Cats not featuring in the Top 10 received points for Group wins, and cats not in Groups received points for Breed wins - all by the same method of one point for each cat present and competing, less one.

GR.CH. NAMPARRA CREAM CAISSA (IMP.ENG.), Best Cat, Shorthair Division, owned by Mrs. D. Frost, is the daughter of 1975 British "Cat World" Best Foreign SH, Ch. Linlinkye

Cream Charisma! She won her Championship in 3 1976 shows. In 1977 she was shown 7 times to win 4 BIS Awards and 2 R/U BIS. At the 1977 National, under U.K. judges Mrs. Denny & Mrs. Shrouder, she took overall S/H BIS and became a Grand Champion, NZ's 4th Cream Burmese to achieve Grand. Judge Mrs. Tregoning wrote:



"Beautiful warm Cream, no barring, head and body true to Burmese type. A really lovely little female."

Some Breed numbers do not appear in the winners lists as the cats had no competition during the season and, while they may have had numerous Best of Breed wins, never beat another cat to gain even one point.

This scoring method allows winners at big shows to accrue more points than winners at small shows. A cat winning 8th BIS at a large show might gain more points than the actual BIS winner at a small show. Obviously, the exhibit that beats the most other exhibits is entitled to the most points.

The Awards are made to New Zealand's best cats, not to the most exhibited cats. To ensure this, the Awards are made on the basis of the highest average points. By averaging points, the cats are protected from being overshadowed and the exhibitor who cannot afford the time or money to travel to a great many shows is not penalised. There is also a minimum division number of three to alleviate the possibility of a cat winning one major award at a show and then being retired for the season, resulting in a large number of points which would provide a misleading overall result.

It is interesting to note that there are 23 shows held annually in New Zealand's North Island, and 10 in the South Island, and, on average, the N.I. shows are much larger than those in the S.I. This is quite natural when

one considers that two-thirds of our population live in the North Island. So the South Island cats who are featured in the 1977 NZCW Awards scored exceptionally highly to hold their places.

NEW GRAND CHAMPIONS AND GRAND PREMIERS

N.Z. Grand titles are very highly valued because of the great difficulty in attaining this status. Only two grand awards are made in each division at each show, i.e. one male L/H, 1 female L/H, 1 male S/H and 1 female S/H. Champions compete against all other Champions in their division for same (Siamese Champions compete with the S/H). It is mandatory there be a minimum of four exhibits in the class, otherwise the Grand must be withheld. However, from the start of the 1977 season, the male/female classes were allowed to be amalgamated (in their own division) if insufficient entries were present and if this amalgamation produced the minimum four exhibits for the class. A cat must win three Grands under three different judges at three different shows to attain the title of Grand Champion. The same rule applies to the Neuter/Spay Sections.

There were sixteen new Grand Champions in 1977: 7 Longhair, 6 Shorthair and 3 Siamese. This was an increase of 7 over the previous season. The 6 Shorthairs were all Burmese, the largest number of this breed ever to Grand in any one year.

Eleven cats became Grand Premiers in 1977: 6 Longhair, 2 Shorthair and 3 Siamese, an increase of 6 over 1976.

158 cats won Championships in 1977, while 99 became Premiers.

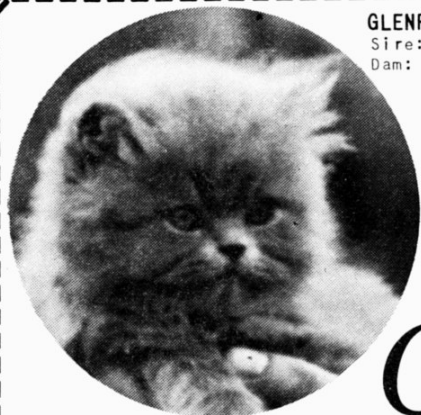

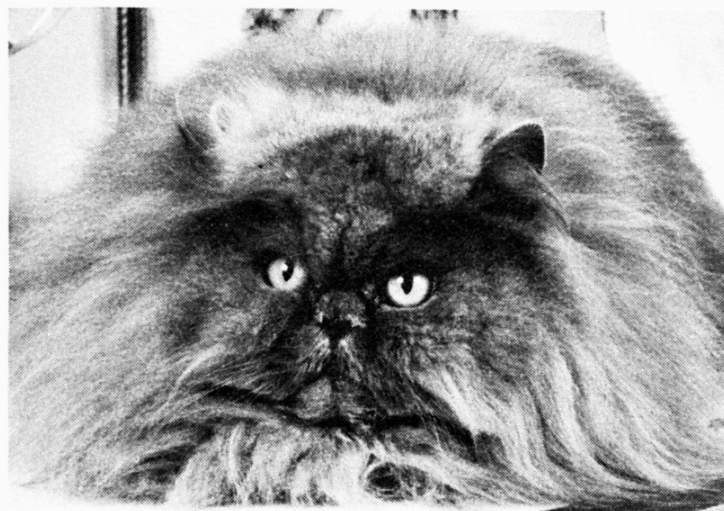

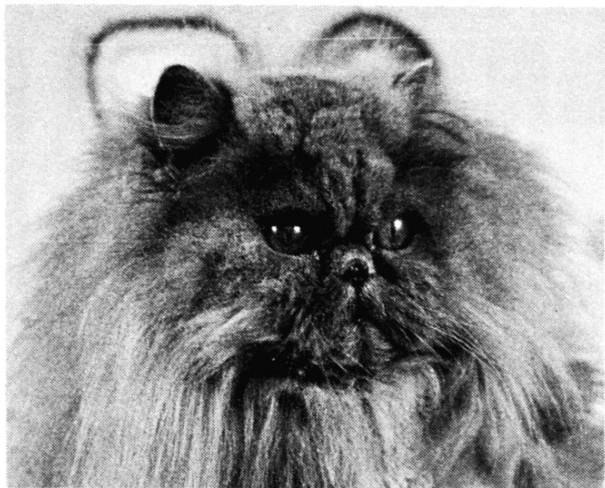

in the Awards; other placings for the same cat can be determined by checking the charts.

In doing research for this article, I found and included in my manuscript notes or judges' reviews for all the cats, kittens and neuters/spays featured in the Top Ten lists of each division. However, this resulted in 37 pages of single-spaced typing, a magazine in itself! The following material, therefore, has been excerpted from my manuscript by the editor of *CAT WORLD Magazine*.

LONGHAIRS

GR.CH. MATAHARI CASSANOVA--New Zealand's first Black LH Grand was 4th Best LH in 1976 and moves up to 3rd this season. One of his judges commented that he was the best Black he had seen since 1951 when Slapton Black Magic was imported from England. His pedigree includes such famous English BIS winners as Ch. Borrowdale Romeo, Ch. Orion of Pensford and Ch. Wildfell Ploughboy, plus NZ's first Grand Champion: South Pacific Goldmyth.

GR.CH. TUIDENE TEGAN--Another cat who is a repeat winner, TEGAN won her Grand in 1977 and her litter-sister, TUIDENE LLYN (7th Best L/H N/S Cat) became a Grand Premier. Meanwhile, their litter-brother, TUIDENE KYLAN, became a U.K. Champion in 1976.

CH. HARDENDALE PAOLO (IMP.ENG.)--CFA judge T. Hiroaka made him 3rd BIS at the N.Z. National in 1977. This majestic Smoke sired the NZCW Best Smoke Kitten, Mirriwa Tiara. His own sire is Ch. Deebank Marquis and his grandsire is the famous Black, Ch. Deebank Mascot. Another well-known ancestor is Ch. Foxburrow Frivolous.

GR.CH. WEN-VILLE RENALTO (IMP.AUST.)--A Blue/White Bi-Colour, he is the result of an experimental breeding program undertaken by Mrs. Horton in Australia with a domestic Tortie & White and the very best Blues, Creams and Bluecreams in Australia. He is NZ's first Bi-Colour Grand Champion (and youngest to Grand in 1977).

ZIBA PERFECT IMAGE--A fabulous Cream, thoroughly deserving of his top placing, is half-brother to 7th Best L/H Kitten, Ziba White Angel. He beat a vast

number of kittens in 1977 to head his division. Judge T. Dixon wrote: "A very big boy with super type and an excellent head."

LYNNEDELL NORAN--A superb Tortie with many major show wins to her credit. Although a kitten most of the season, she gained enough points as a cat to also win Best Tortie L/H Cat. Mrs. L. Jensen wrote: "Typy body with short tail, beautifully groomed, soft silky patched coat, beautiful eye colour." Her home is shared with 8th Best Kitten, CLOVERLEA FOREVER AMBER.

VILLAGATTA STARDANCER--An exquisite Odd-Eyed White with many major awards to her credit. Judge Jensen made her BIS at Geysersland and wrote: "Outstanding exhibit with glorious flowing coat, cobby body, eyes of clear beauty, perfect head."

DANICA KILLEAVY GIRL--Another fine Tortie with big wins this season at Northland, Auckland and Franklin.

GLENDAVEN BLUE TAFFETA--Niece of the 2nd Best LH Cat, TAFFETA won BIS at Takapuna under Judge Mrs. Philpott, and 7th BIS at Auckland under Mrs. Dixon.

BATHAVON LITTLE REBEL--Judge Slade, owner of the Supreme Cat, made this Bluecream R/U BIS at Franklin.

PR. KOURA GINTIE--Mrs. Barningham, judging this Shaded Silver n at Northland, wrote: "A beautiful n, near perfect colour for the breed, good head and body type, short tail ... by far the Best Neuter benched."

PR. KARBARLA CORISMA--Sired by English Ch. Blythly Onward, he was BIS at Marlborough under Mrs. Golley who wrote: "Nice even coat and good furnishings, round eyes, good stop, small ears, big feet, good bone structure, excellent grooming, very solid cat."

PR. OWEENA LAI SHING--This superb Colourpoint has 11 Challenges but has missed out on Grands due to lack of entries, according to his owner. "Beautiful glacial white coat, good mask and points markings," wrote his judge at Takapuna, Mrs. Breckon.

PR. NANCHI MIDNIGHT KISS--After judging him, Mrs. Jensen wrote: "Beautifully groomed neuter with lustrous black coat. Cobby body, good head and glorious eye colour. My BIS."

PR. REIDSTON JERICHO--This spectacular Colourpoint's pedigree traces back to the famous English Kala, Camlon and Briarry cats. He has several BIS placings.

PR. MEDROS MUHANE--A son of Gr.Ch. Pembroke Pacific Prince, he won praise from Mrs. Golley at Southland: "Good eye colour, nice width of head, well furnished and long flowing coat. Good solid cat."

SIAMESE

GR.CH. THORNWICK TIEH-LING--A spectacular Blue Point, he has won 5 Grand Challenges. When BIS at Napier, his judge, Mrs. D. Frost, wrote: "Magnificent, flat-planed head on long elegant neck. Masculine, elegant, svelte body and tail, excellent eye shape, presented in first class condition."

CH. SUNTI LADYE JANE--Not only 4th Best Siamese Cat, but Best Kitten as well in the 1977 season. A consistent BIS winner, this fabulous Redpoint girl was one of only four exhibits at the National show to be considered worthy of a Challenge Certificate by Mrs. G. Denny, English guest judge. She wrote: "A queen of elegance and type, excellent lithe body, good coat texture, long dainty legs and oval paws, length of tail."

MADCAP SHADY LADY--This Oriental Ebony's show career has been spectacular with many major wins including a BIS at only 4 months, plus BIS S/H and R/U BIS overall

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE FEBRUARY, '78 BOARD MEETING

A meeting of the CFA Board of Directors was held in Atlanta, GA, Feb. 18-20, and the members of the Board put in three long days of serious meetings totalling over 29 hours. The hospitality of Atlanta-Phoenix Cat Society in providing transportation between airport and hotel, and hosting a lavish buffet on Sunday evening for members and their wives was extravagant on their part but very much appreciated and enjoyed by the attendees. Special thanks to our hostess, Ann Bickman.

The following are excerpts from my notes and readers should consult the *CFA QUARTERLY*, when issued, for a complete and detailed report.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

The Board will present several proposed amendments at the Annual Meeting to be held June 23-24 at the Hyatt Hotel, Union Square, San Francisco. Clubs can insure their right to vote by making sure that club dues are paid, delegate forms are properly completed and sent to Central Office on time, and proxy paperwork is correctly handled if club delegate will not attend.

The first of the proposed amendments would provide for Board review and approval of all applications for membership in CFA. The major reason for this suggestion is the huge influx of applications and automatic acceptance of obvious 'paper' clubs. As an example, ten new clubs came in all with the same secretary, list of members, and Constitution (Xerox copies); and another group of nine made a similar submission just since the last meeting. The ability to 'buy' votes for the price of a year's dues is obviously not consistent with a prestige organization.

A second proposition would eliminate Regional Directors as sitting Board members. Beginning in 1980, all 14 Board members would

be elected 'at large'. A new post of Regional Field Representative would be created to handle tasks as yet undetermined, but definitely not to include a voice or vote at Board meetings.

The third proposal concerns candidate status. Candidates for CFA offices are currently required to meet a number of qualifications, one of which is to be a club delegate to the Annual where the election takes place. This is felt to be an outdated rule of very little value.

Fourth, the Board will resubmit an amendment which failed to pass last year by a small margin. This one would delete the requirement that all clubs must have held a show within the preceding 3-year period in order to vote in CFA elections and meetings. (As required by the Constitution, the Board waived this requirement for this year's Annual). When in effect, this rule tends to disenfranchise breed clubs and others whose purposes of organization are felt to be equally as important as sponsoring shows.

Resignations were accepted from Ken Withstandley (SH), James King and Anna Peyton (Trainees). All Judges were relicensed for the coming year except Barbara Maier, Muriel Slodden and Jack Wells. Their status is described in the CFA Constitution, Article XIII.

SHOW RULES

Reconsideration was given to certain Show Rules passed in October, 1977.

Motions to reconsider actions of the Board regarding Household Pet awards, Himalayan Self Colors, and American Shorthair color class groupings all lost. The Household Pet motion was defeated by a very narrow margin and will be brought up again at the Show Rules meeting in October, 1978. The other questions will also be reconsidered if resolutions are made at the Annual meeting.

The new Grand Championship requirement was reconsidered and the number of points needed after May 1, 1978, was reduced from 250 to 200. A committee (William Beck, Walter Friend, Jean Rose and Don Williams) was appointed to study and make recommendations on requirements for the titles Champion, Grand Champion, Premier and Grand Premier. REPORT ON SHOW STANDARDS

The following are notes on Standard changes approved by the CFA Board at the recent meeting in Atlanta. Complete report will be made by the Central Office.

ABYSSINIAN

5 points from condition to head.

AMERICAN SHORTHAIR

10 points from condition. Increase value of coat by 5 points and increase the value of type by 5 points. Color to be divided into two sub-categories: color--10 points; pattern --10 points.

BALINESE

5 points from condition to muscle tone.

BIRMAN

10 points from condition to: 5 points to head and 5 to body. Visible kink replaced by "Kinked or abnormal tail" in the disqualify section.

BOMBAY

The word "yellow" replaced by "gold" in the eye color description.

BURMESE

5 points from condition to body.

EXOTIC SHORTHAIR

10 points from condition to coat.

HAVANA BROWN

New standard accepted with the exception of section on coat which now reads: "The coat is medium in length, smooth and lustrous."

HIMALAYAN

10 points from condition to 5 points for balance and 5 points for refinement.

KORAT

5 points from condition to head.

MAINE COON

5 points from condition to body shape. The phrase "delicate bone structure" from penalize to disqualify.

MANX

No action.

ORIENTAL SHORTHAIR

5 points from condition to muscle tone.

PERSIAN

10 points from condition to 5 points for balance and 5 points for refinement. Blue Cream standard: phrase "paler shades preferred"

will be added.

REX

No action.

RUSSIAN BLUE

5 points from condition to eye color. Body will read: "Fine boned, long, firm and muscular. Lithe and graceful in outline and carriage." Color will read in part: "Lighter shades of blue preferred." Add to color: "A definite contrast should be noted between ground color and tipping."

SCOTTISH FOLD

New standard adopted effective 5/1/79.

SIAMESE

The phrase: "soft or mushy body" added to the Penalize section. The sentence: "Malocclusion resulting in either undershot or overshot chin" included in the Disqualify section.

TURKISH ANGORA

Increase value of head from 30 to 35 points. Increase point value of color from 15 to 20.

Numerous of the letters received on the subject of the 250-point rule also carried the theme of desiring more meaningful 'Champion' titles. This subject will be an important part of our studies.

SHOW FORMATS

In response to a request for interpretation of rules, the Board determined that if shows are benched-in on two days (for example, LH one day and SH the next) they are two shows and the 175 cat entry limit applies to each. Also, two one-day shows with a final Best-of-the-Best judging is not allowed.


A question was also raised regarding Judges accepting local transportation and lodging arrangements made by clubs. The Board stated its general policy that Judges use the club-made arrangements or communicate with the club in advance and bear any increased costs due to their preference for alternate transportation and/or lodging. This is not meant to infer that the Judge should expect less than very good accommodations, but rather that the Judge should pay any increased expenses incurred because of personal preferences.

GENERAL

A new deadline of October 15 for Breed Council membership was established to provide time for streamlining the handling of proposals and polls.

The proposed National Show has been delayed as the potential sponsor is reviewing plans and results to date to determine its continued interest.

The advisability of mail votes for CFA Officers and Directors will be brought up for general discussion at the Annual meeting. If it is favored, the Board will present an amendment the following year.###

HOW CFA CATS ARE SCORED FOR NATIONAL & REGIONAL AWARDS

Spring is a busy period for exhibitors of pedigreed cats in North America. The show season, in full swing with as many as ten CFA shows per weekend across the country, is approaching its April 30 conclusion. Speculation is rife as to which cats will have earned America's most respected and coveted recognition ... the REGIONAL and NATIONAL AWARDS offered annually by Cat Fanciers Association, Inc., world's largest cat registry. The exhibitors ponder: shall we take what we think is a hot title contender to just one more show ... which one shall it be ... which has the judges we think are most likely to put our cat up in Finals to win those last, all-important points?

Make no mistake about it. The winners of the CFA AWARDS are the finest felines in AMERICAN CATDOM. While there are other award programs, some with such pretentious handles that the novice exhibitor (or overseas fancier) might erroneously gain the impression that such winners have defeated ALL cats in America, the experienced breeder/exhibitor is well aware that the winning of any one of CFA's simply-termed 'National' or 'Regional' awards invisibly stamps his/her cat with a hallmark signifying that there is none finer in the entire continent of North America.

The names of the superb CFA winners of the 1977/78 show season will be revealed to delegates attending the 1978 CFA Annual Meeting on June 24, 1978. They will then be honored in the 6th Annual Salute to the "Great Cats of North America" in *CAT WORLD Magazine*, July/August, 1978, and in the "CFA Yearbook".

EARNING AWARD POINTS

CFA's show season begins annually on the first weekend of May and continues to the end of April. Approximately 250 shows are sponsored during these 12 months by CFA-affiliated clubs from coast-to-coast giving a wide variety from which exhibitors can select the ones in which they will enter their cats.

All cats 8 months of age and older on the first day of a show must have a CFA registration number at the time the exhibitor mails an entry for such a cat to a show entry clerk. While kittens can be entered without a number, any regional/national points attained by a non-registered kitten cannot be

recorded. (Note: Starting with the 1978/'79 show season in May, exhibitors will be permitted to furnish a kitten's newly-acquired CFA registration number upon arrival at a show and the number can be added to the kitten's data in the show catalog.)

Kittens win award points by placing in the Top Five in either All Breed rings or LH/SH Specialty rings. The Best Kitten receives one point for every other kitten judged in that ring which he/she has defeated by being named Best Kitten; the 2nd Best Kitten earns points equivalent to 90% of the points won by the Best Kitten; the 3rd Best gets 80% of the Best Kitten's total; 4th Best - 70%; and 5th Best - 60%.

In the Premiership classes, a neuter or spay competitor gains CFA award points for placing in the Top 5 in an All Breed ring, or in the Top 3 in a Longhair or Shorthair Specialty ring. As in the case of the kittens, the Best Cat Premiership is awarded one point for each cat competing and defeated in that ring. Second Best Cat Premiership receives 90% of the points awarded to the Best Cat; 3rd Best gets 80% of the number earned by the Best Cat; 4th Best - 70%; and 5th Best - 60%.

Scoring in the Championship Division is a little more complex. The awarding of points begins at Best of Breed or Division level with the Best Cat of the Breed or Division receiving one point for each cat he/she has defeated in winning this category. In an All Breed ring, the next stage at which points can be earned is when the judge names the Best Longhair, 2nd Best Longhair, Best Shorthair and 2nd Best Shorthair. The two "Bests" are credited with one point for each cat each of them has defeated up to this stage, i.e. the Best Longhair receives one point for each LH defeated; the Best Shorthair receives one point for each SH defeated. The two Second Bests similarly receive points equivalent to 90% of the points awarded to the Best Cat in each category.

Final plateau is the Top Five All Breed Finals. Here the Best Cat receives one point for each cat defeated; the 2nd Best Cat gets 90% of the points awarded to the Best Cat; 3rd Best is credited with 80% of the Best Cat's number; 4th Best - 70%; and 5th Best - 60%.

Scoring for Championship cats in the Longhair and Shorthair Specialty rings is the same as in the All Breed with the omission of the Best/2nd Best LH and Best/2nd Best SH stage.

In reading the above, it is obvious that it is possible for point-gainers to defeat the same cats again at the different stages of judging in one ring. However, any one cat receives only those points allotted to the highest win it achieves in that ring.

SCORING 'TOP TEN' AND 'BEST OF THE BEST'
As CFA President, Richard Gebhardt, pointed out in his article in the Nov./Dec., 1977, *CAT WORLD* entitled "Let's Give The Top Ten A

Real Trial Run", no National/Regional points are ever awarded for such placings as Best Open, Best Champion, Best Grand Champion.

CFA's new Top Ten format offers additional opportunities to win National/Regional points than are offered by the Top Five format. All points are awarded at the Finals stage of judging and are given to the ten cats who are participating in Finals. Best Cat wins 100% on the basis of one point for each cat defeated; 2nd Best Cat gets 90% of the number of points awarded to the Best Cat; 3rd Best receives 80% of the number gained by the Best Cat; and so on down to 10% for the 10th Best Cat In Show.

There are a number of shows during the season which also offer a "Best of the Best" judging. Cats eligible for this 5th ring, which opens following the conclusion of judging and Finals ceremonies in all other rings, include the Best and 2nd Best Cat in each of the four LH/SH Specialty rings at the show. (Shows with All Breed rings do not feature "Best of the Best"). Effective May 1, 1978, cats eligible for "Best of the Best" judging will be extended to the Top 3 in each LH and SH Specialty. "Best of the Best" also has a Kitten Division and Premiership Division with entry eligibility earned as in the Championship Division.

The "Best of the Best" ring is judged by a CFA Approved All Breed judge who has not participated during the show's foregoing judging. National/Regional points are earned in a "Best of the Best" ring in the same manner as in a regular All Breed ring. Awards given are limited to Best through 5th Best.

POINT RECORDING BY CFA

Within 12 hours following the close of any CFA show, the show secretary must send a completely marked catalog to the CFA Central Office, together with Judging Slips, Transfer/Absentee List and List of Exhibitors' Names and Addresses (if not printed in the catalog). From this material, points earned by cats at this show are compiled and posted.

From each catalog submitted, the CFA staff first determine the total number of competing entries. In the case of a cat who is scheduled to compete in one ring but not in another, it is regarded as competing in all rings. A list of points is then compiled which will be credited for each award. For example, if there were 100 cats, the number of points to go to the Best Cat would be 99, 2nd Best Cat - 89, 3rd Best - 79, 4th Best - 69, 5th Best 59. In determining these numbers, the staff deals in whole numbers only. If the percentage works out to a decimal point, .6 or higher is rounded to the next number up while .5 or less is rounded to the lower whole number.

A running record for each cat is not kept during the season. Instead, whenever a feline wins even one point at a show, the number is recorded on a separate keypunch

card for that cat for that show. At the end of the season, when all catalogs have been processed and points recorded on the keypunch cards, all the latter are fed into the CFA computer. At this point, there is nobody in the cat fancy - including CFA staff in the Central Office - who can say for sure which cats are going to be victorious. Certainly there is much speculation! Some exhibitors keep tallies of points won by their own cats and even by their cats' closest competitors. However, the official points - the ones which determine the winners - are those which emerge from the CFA computer.

The CFA Central Office handles not only the National Scoring but also that for its seven Regions. In the National Scoring the winners have topped every other cat in their category in North America; in Regional Scoring, they are the best of their Region of residence. The Region for a cat is the one in which its owner was residing on the date this cat last competed in a show during that season.

To be eligible for consideration for a CFA National Award, a cat or kitten must have earned a minimum of 200 points.

In the National Championship Division, CFA names the Top 20 Cats; Best of Breed; Best of Division; and Best of Color. In National Premiership, the Top 5 cats are recognized but in the event that all 5 are Longhairs, the Best and 2nd Best Shorthairs will also receive recognition and vice versa.

Honored in the CFA National Kitten Awards are the Top 5 Kittens; again, should these be 5 Longhairs or 5 Shorthairs, the Best and 2nd Best of the other group would be designated. Pride in the cat's achievement is the most important reward for his/her owner and breeder, but CFA also gives cash, plaque, rosette or ribbon to each winner's owner depending upon the actual award won.

The CFA Regional Awards take into consideration those cats which have accumulated a minimum of 100 points during the show season. From these, the following awards are made by CFA itself in each Region: Top 10 Cats, Best of Breed and Best of Division in Championship; Top 5 Kittens; and Top 5 Cats in Premiership. In addition to these, each Region is at liberty to designate other positions for recognition within its own boundaries. Such awards are determined by the respective Regional Directors from computer listings of points won by cats within their Regions.

In the distant CFA areas of Hawaii and Japan, CFA awards plaques to the Best Cat (Championship), Best Cat (Premiership) and Best Kitten.###

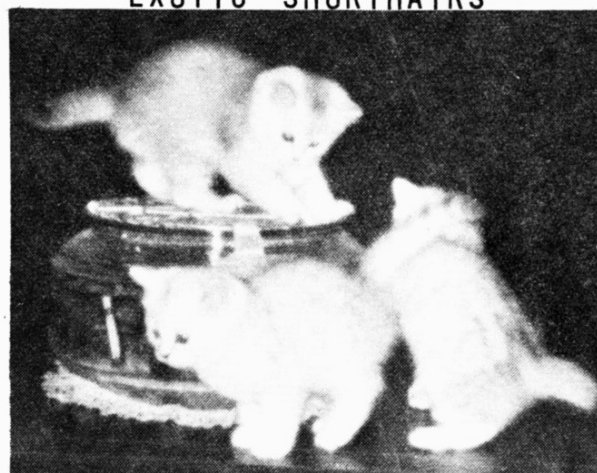

BLUESEAL SOLITAIRE--Mrs. J. McKenzie, who judged her at Hastings and made her BIS wrote: "Exquisite dainty little Foreign White. Strikingly beautiful, the ultimate in elegance ..."

SUNTI TANSY--This Seal Tortiepoint has the same sire as the top kitten, Redpoint Gr.Ch. Braydene Magnum Colorado. Her judges remark on her blaze and colour.

ARABESQUE TARABOO--His outstanding kitten career has included BIS at Otago and Southland. Judge McKenzie wrote: "A fine boned, elegant type boy. Firm muscle tone ... a real little showman."

SOUFFLE SATCHMO--Shown seldom, this Sealpoint's major wins nevertheless ensured his placing in the Top Ten.

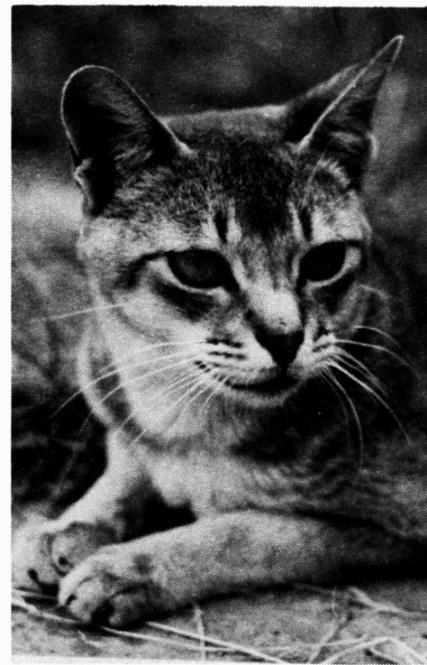

KATEISHA PAINTED PIXIE--Another stylish Cornish Rex, she carries the well-known lines: Annelida, Elan, Som Chai, Rio Vista, Lohteyn and Daz-Zling. She was in the Top Ten placings in every show in which exhibited.

CHATSWOOD GEORGIA BROWN--Her pedigree features U.K., Canadian and U.S. bloodlines. Judge Pattison wrote: "Lovely girl, beautifully balanced, super coat colour and texture. Lovely eye colour and expression."

15 ... Keep A Stud Cat

If you have one or two breeding females in your cattery, the chances are that you expect to send them out to other catteries when you need stud service for them. However, most breeders who have three or more queens prefer to have a male cat of their own. For those who have never kept a "whole" male but are considering the possibility, it should be realized that there is a considerable amount of extra work involved in caring for an active male stud cat. Most of them "spray" (deposit urine) and this has an extremely strong, unpleasant odor. "Spraying" is a natural, instinctive urge in the male cat, not a simple matter of breaking house-training, and is his way of "marking his territory" to warn other males to stay away from his "harem". While a few will confine this habit to their litterbox, which is easily cleaned, the majority will spray almost constantly on anything and everything. If a female in season is close by, it is even more prevalent. It is a long battle for the owner, but an essential one, to keep the male's quarters clean and sweet-smelling.

Obviously, if you have a spraying male, he must be confined to his own quarters so needs a large space in which to live. The ultimate is to have a "walk-in" type of cage with plenty of light, easy to clean walls and floor, a floor-to-ceiling scratching post and resting shelves on which he can jump. Access to an outdoor run is ideal but a reasonable substitute would be a spacious shelf beneath a screened window. Here the male cat can spend time looking outside from a comfortable perch. Because he must be confined, the stud cat needs extra attention so plan to spend plenty of time grooming and playing with him to let him realize that he is an important part of your family. Don't just shut him in a cage, feed and clean him and give him an occasional female. If you are not prepared to do these things for a male of your own, it is better to continue to send your females out for stud service.

The age at which a cat may sire varies enormously. Generally speaking, shorthaired breeds mature earlier than longhairs and it is not uncommon for a precocious six-month-old shorthair to sire, although the average age is approximately one year. For the long-haired breeds, some males are two years old or more before they show interest in siring but, again, others can - and do - sire at

about one year of age. Much will depend upon environment. A young male raised with females in season around him will, more often than not, mature earlier than one who has no females in the immediate area. It is very rare that two whole males will be copacetic and, even if raised together, will normally become very aggressive towards any other whole male when they mature.

WRITTEN AGREEMENTS

When you have a stud cat of your own, the matter of accepting outside females for stud service should be given careful thought. On weighing the pros and cons, you will see that in favour of this idea is:

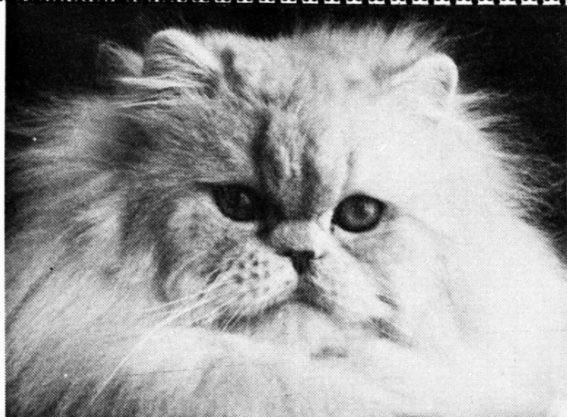
- (a) Stud fee to help defray the cost of food litter, vet care, etc., for your cat.
- (b) It will help to keep the male satisfied if you yourself have only a few females to be serviced.
- (c) It is good advertising for your cattery to see nice kittens carrying your male's name as sire.

Points against accepting outside queens are:

- (a) The risk of a queen bringing infection into your cattery, or parasites.
- (b) Ensuring that only females of very good breeding are accepted for mating to be sure that only kittens of quality result. (Never allow your stud to be used with an unregistered cat.)

If you do decide to take in outside queens, be selective. Always keep in mind that you are trying to BETTER the breed. You may wish to request the queen's owner to furnish a veterinary health certificate issued within 48 hours of the female's visit stating that she is free from parasites and has no symptoms of disease. Some breeders ask for a certificate stating that the female has been tested and found negative for leukemia, and some owners of queens request the same for your stud!

Before you allow the queen to be sent to your cattery, you should have complete details of all arrangements made between you and the queen's owner concerning the stud service put in writing, fully understood and agreed to by both parties, and signed by both you and the queen's owner. This written agreement should cover every detail which might arise in the course of your negotiations. For example, the price of the stud fee and what it includes, agreements for free (or reduced fee) return stud service if the female does not conceive or does not produce at least one live kitten, whether or not board is to be charged if the female remains at your cattery for longer than seven days and how much board should be per day, etc. Most breeders do give a free return service if the female does not produce at least one live kitten but, actually, the stud fee is for stud service from a proven male and, if this is performed and witnessed, the fee has been earned. Cats are not machines and

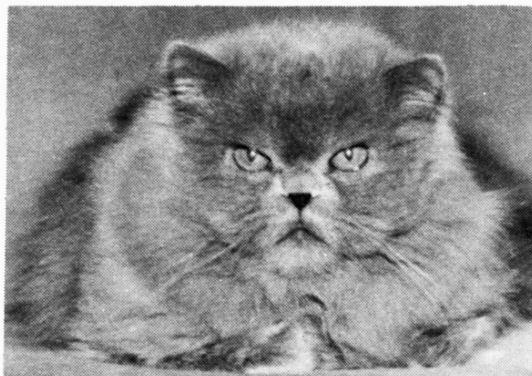

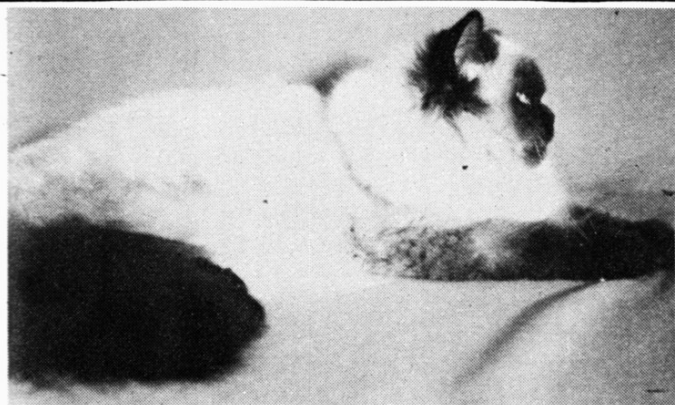

things can sometimes go wrong so it is a decent gesture on the part of the stud's owner, and one that is generally offered, to give a free return service. It is not an obligation but a courtesy.

Perhaps the owner of the queen will suggest a kitten in lieu of stud fee and this again is something that should be put in writing. Will it be for pick of litter? Second pick? Who will get the kitten if there is only one? Discuss and decide before the mating takes place ... and put it in writing!

Breeders will often cooperate with a friend who is working with the same breed and either co-own a male or exchange stud services with each other's males. If this is going to be the case, get a written agreement right from the start with terms suitable to both parties. Friendships can be strained or broken by misunderstandings, so get everything in black-and-white, with each of you owning a copy. Remember, too, that both co-owners of a cat must sign the CFA litter-registration form.

ARRIVAL OF THE VISITING QUEEN

When a queen is being sent to your cattery from another city, her owner should contact you to arrange a convenient time of day for her arrival. If the owner is not bringing the queen by car, you will probably have to collect her at the airport so will want to know airline and flight-time. Determine, too, if the queen's owner wishes to be notified by telephone of the cat's safe arrival. Such phone calls are at the expense of the owner but you may wish to help keep the expenses down by billing the owner for the call later rather than calling collect which is more expensive.

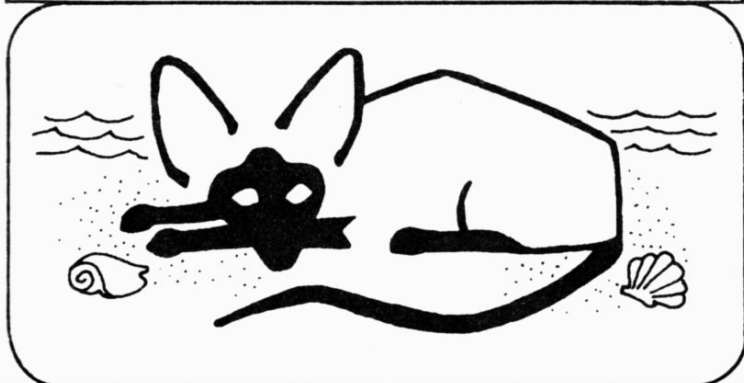
If the queen has travelled a long distance, she will probably be both tired and frightened so it will be best to leave her quietly in a safe cage until she has had a chance to adjust to her new surroundings. You will want to check her for fleas, ear-mites or any other evident problems before putting her with your male.

Now comes the time when there is a vast difference in the handling of most longhaired cats compared to the shorthaired breeds. I have often been able to put a strange longhair female straight into the cage with the stud male and, usually, she has not even hissed at him. He will be anxious and will immediately start talking to her and 'courting' her. Never have I done this with a shorthaired cat!

Shorthaired cats always need time to get to know each other. A good way to do this is to have a large cage divided into two sections by wire screen. The cats can then see each other and gradually get acquainted. As an alternative, I have a small room off of the cattery just for visiting queens. It has a glass window in the door for observation. I place the female in a medium-sized cage in this room with food, water, litterbox and

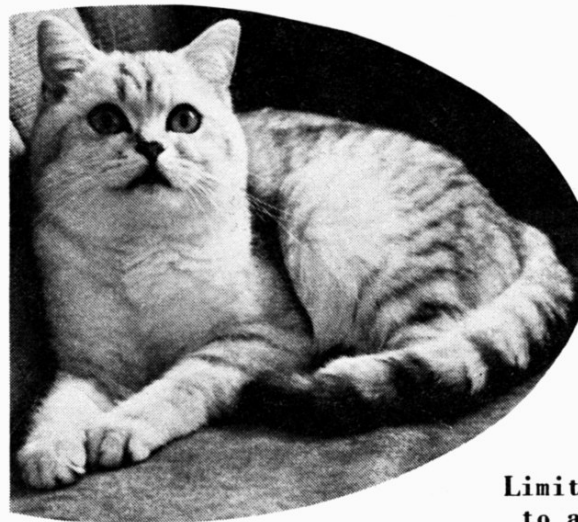

blanket and let her have a little privacy until she has rested. The length of the journey she has taken (plane trip vs. short car drive) and the individual disposition of the queen are the deciding factors on how long to leave her alone. At the appropriate time, the male is let into the room and he can talk to the queen through the cage wire with both of the cats being safe from possible attack from the other. (Both can be very aggressive at these times.) After awhile, the cats can be switched, with the male caged and the female free in the room. When the queen starts returning the male's attention by talking, rubbing against the cage, or rolling on the floor, they can be allowed out together. (Incidentally, both cats should have their claws trimmed and it is a good idea to get the owner of the queen to do this for her cat before sending her to you.) An aggressive male will usually mate the female within a few minutes, but occasionally the female will resist and fight him off at first. An experienced male will sense just the right time to act and, after the mating, will also know when to spring back from the female who will strike out at him. Therefore, it is essential, especially if the cats are caged for breeding, that the male has plenty of room in which to jump away. Of course, longhaired breeds may be handled in this same manner.

The length of time that the two cats are left together will depend upon their behavior. If the male is too aggressive, they should be separated after several breedings. Although the queen can conceive from one mating, most breeders prefer to mate the cats on two consecutive days.

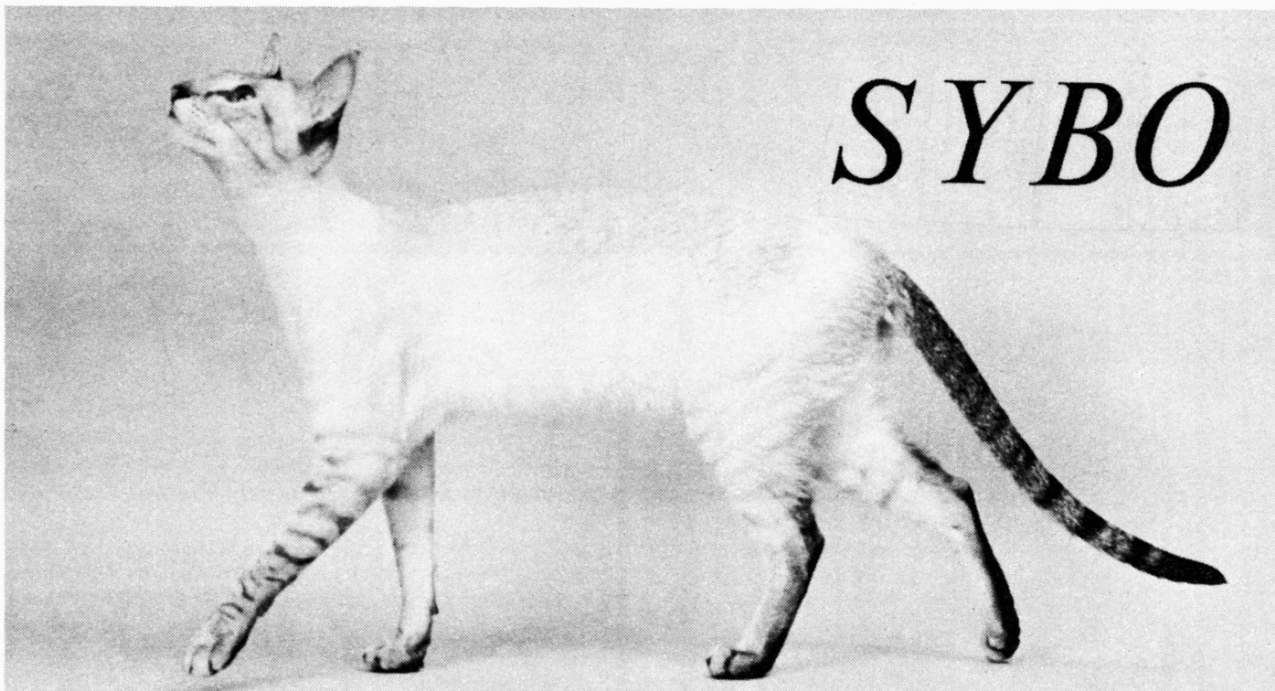
Your obligation, as owner of the stud include supervision of the mating, taking every precaution that the queen receives the best of care, making note of the dates of breeding, and informing the queen's owner of the necessary travel arrangements for the return trip home.

Don't ever let another male with the visiting queen as she could have a double conception. She must be kept apart from other males until she is out of season. (As a matter of interest, a male can still sire kittens for a couple of days AFTER he has been neutered!)

Give the visiting queen lots of loving attention and treat her as you would want one of your cats treated - as a guest of honor! She may require encouragement to eat, for although a couple of days of barely eating is not uncommon, if she is going to be with you for any period of time it is essential that you be informed of her regular diet.

Ask the owner of the queen to inform you when the kittens have been born their number, sex, color and date of birth. Record all this information as it may be very useful for future reference. Don't forget that you will be required to sign the litter registration form as owner of the sire.###

WHAT'S HAPPENING TO PERSIAN TYPE?

I readily agree with President Gebhardt about the Top 10 format. More clubs should try it, they might find they like it. I, too, had that feeling at first that the Top 10 cats would all be grands but that wasn't so at the two Top 10 shows I attended in the Great Lakes Region last year. My Chinchilla female OPEN was able to make 10th Best Cat and 9th Best cat at these shows. It seemed as though fewer grands were at these shows and more champions - perhaps their owners had the idea - and rightly so - that they could acquire more grand points in a Top 10 show than in the regular Top 5 format.

Now I would like to ask a question. How short is short and how deep is deep when the CFA Show Standards call for a short nose and a deep break on a Persian? Does a cat have to have such a short nose that it looks like a baby pig and has difficulties when eating, or a face so flat that its nose seems to come out the back of its head?

Silver breeders, in particular, have been known to receive comments from various judges that the silver cats are going to become extinct if something isn't done to improve their type, yet many do make finals; these same judges will automatically give winners ribbons to a novice or open who has no competition and who is not deserving of that ribbon. How many have the courage to withhold on a longnosed cat?

Whatever happened to the overall, well-balanced cat with more than just a head? A cat can still have a short nose with a good break without having distorted features!

DIFFERENT RULES IN DIFFERENT AUSTRALIAN AREAS

At today's meeting of our Club, one of our Vice Presidents drew the attention of members to an article in the Sept./Oct. issue of *CAT WORLD* written by Beryl Chandler.

I must explain that cat governing councils in Australia are arranged on a State basis. This State has one such body, while some have two or more. Headquartered in Sydney, this Club represents members throughout the country. It was formed nearly 12 years ago and each year runs a specialist Abyssinian show - well in excess of 100 entries were received for last year's show.

The Abyssinian breed numbers in New South Wales are: 23 - Usual (you call them 'Ruddy'); 23a - Red; (Provisional) 23c - Cream; (Provisional) 23z - Any Other Colour. Other States' governing bodies (seemingly with the exception of the one to which Mrs. Chandler belongs) have similar if not identical provisions. Certainly, the number 23 is not departed from, and the only possible differences may be that the 'Provisional' tag may be missing under some jurisdictions.

Re: *CAT WORLD*, Jan/Feb issue, "Singapore's Singapura" by Mrs. Tommy Brodie Meadow. There has been a significant increase in the pedigree cats which include Colourpoints from UK and USA, Longhair Blacks, Tortoiseshell, etc. from Australia, UK and New Zealand, Siamese--Seal, Lilac Points, Blue Points, Chocolate Points--from Australia and the UK, and Korats from Thailand. We are now looking forward to our first Colourpoint from New Zealand and more imports from Australia in the near future. There are no Balinese or Red Point Siamese on the Register, nor do we know of any in existence at present in Singapore.

We hope this serves to give an idea of the Fancy in Singapore, from humble beginnings when there were almost no pedigree cats at all, to a still small but steadily expanding Club consisting of people striving to improve standards by the importation of beautiful cats. We have recently held a most successful exhibition of pedigree cats and hope to be able to hold a show soon.

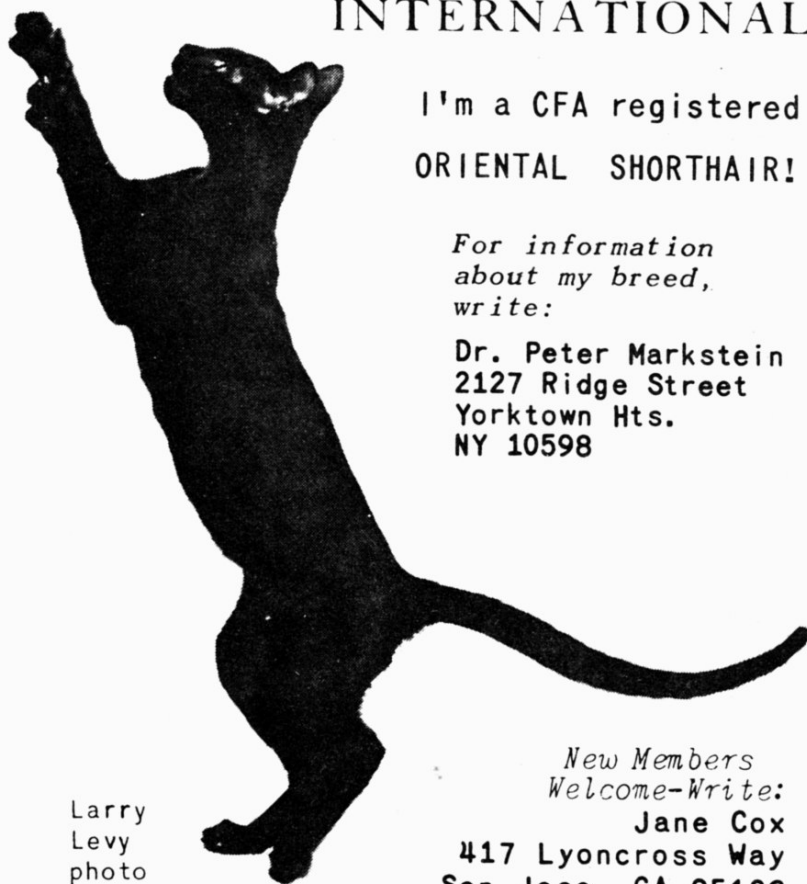

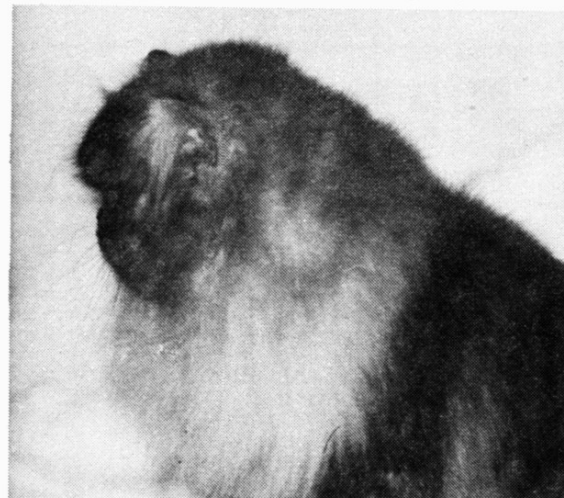

Mrs. Hardy is a delightful hostess and driver par excellence. I think we covered 400 miles in two days which is quite a feat. I have seen Budleigh Salterton, Exeter, Salisbury and Stonehenge

at sunset and am preparing for the tour guides examinations!

Because of the time of year, we saw few cats. I did enjoy seeing Mrs. Maddocks' British Shorthairs, Blacks and Blues, at her Paignton, Devon, cattery.

All holidays are too short and this one flew by, but our thanks go to Nancy Hardy for such a fine visit.

MORE ON BRITISH SHORTHAIRES

Several months ago, some readers of this column took me to task when I stated that there is periodic hybridization between Persians and British Shorthairs. No one doubted the sincerity of such criticism although I was astounded by their naivete. Most American breeders do believe such hybridization ended shortly after World War II. Perhaps they will be interested in the following paragraphs from the January 12, 1978, issue of "Fur & Feather", page 34:

"Listening to visitors' comments on British Shorthair exhibits I heard it said repeatedly: 'What's special about THAT cat?' Certainly some of today's British Shorthairs lack the great muscular magnificence of some of our older cats such as Mrs. Nash's Grand Premier Jezreel Martyn and Mrs. Procter's Champion Broadweir Someone Special. Realising this, Mrs. Marjorie Bishop, famed for her Lecreme Longhairs, mated her Blue Persian queen Champion Peela Genevieve to Mrs. Watling's British Blue, Champion Shadingfield Hercules, and one of their kittens, Mocha Sister Jill, a magnificent British Blue female, was first in a class of fifteen kittens at the National this year. Such outcrosses MUST be of benefit to a breed and we are fortunate that such crosses are not penalised in this country as they are in some overseas countries."

The writer continues that she does not advocate indiscriminate mixing of breeds but "some planned scientific outcrosses are occasionally necessary."

To put all of this in proper perspective it should be noted that CFA placed all such hybrid cats, both American and British, into the breed class: Exotic Shorthairs. It was felt by some that the different conformation was attributable to the differences between the American and English longhairs. And, of course, there are also differences between American and British Shorthairs. Recently, CFA advanced British Shorthairs to Provisional status. This was done because of assurances that sufficient numbers of cats had been imported to provide pure breeding stock.

There is nothing scientific about hybridization when it is done every 3rd or 4th generation just to improve the appearance of the cat. Because of the quarantine regulations, Britain is a "tight little island" and, consequently, registered breeding stock can be limited.

There is no penalty in the United States for hybridization. We have several breeds of cats maintained by hybridization. However, we do feel that a pedigree is something of value and the purchaser of a cat should be given all the facts.###

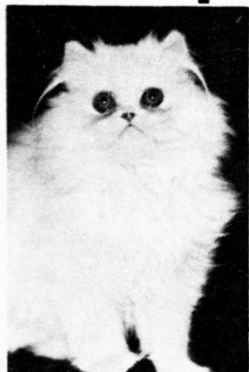

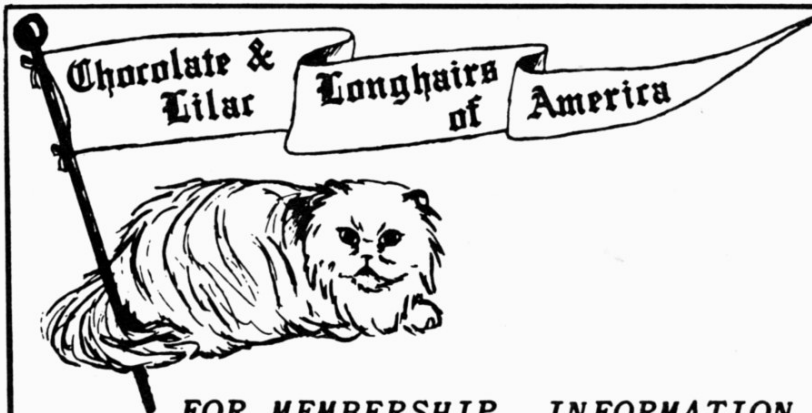

Breeder's Notebook

by A. DAVID BANDY

Editor's Note: Readers who have questions about any phase of cat fancying (or suggestion for a discussion) are invited to write to Mr. Bandy (address on page 6) for response in this column.

I have just returned from a judging assignment in the Midwest where they are having a great deal of cold weather accompanied by a lot of snow. We have had heavy rains in California. The drought seems to be over; our reservoirs are three-fourths full of water already this year.

My trip to the Far East was far more successful than I had imagined it would be. December 13th I had dinner with Mrs. Haruko Mori, Mr. Ed Radcliffe and Dr. Maggie Ajiro, a veterinarian who has a practice with her husband in Tokyo, Japan. I spent over two weeks visiting the Sri Sathya Sri Baba College of Arts and Sciences located outside Bangalore in South India. It was refreshing to me as an educator to see the discipline and eagerness to learn that was present in the entire Student Body.

The College is directed by Bhagwan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. He is regarded as an Avatar and one of the most enlightened men in India today. He never accepts any payment for what he does, and yet he goes throughout India helping people. He has been doing this since 1940 and it is interesting that only just recently has the Western world heard of him. I attended discourses by him on some extremely technical subjects and yet he has only an elementary level education. His ability to simplify knowledge and never lose any of the meaning was a constant amazement. There were people present from many of the other Western countries who were as confounded as I by his ability to wave his hand and materialize any object he desired. It was very apparent in talking with the Indians around him that they regarded him as Christians must have regarded Jesus almost 2000 years ago.

GENETIC QUESTIONS FROM NORWEGIAN READER

Mr. Roald Westre, who lives in Bjornebarstein, Norway, has sent some inquiries. I am very happy to receive correspondence from foreign countries and encourage them, although I realize some difficulties occur in corresponding in English.

Question 1: A red male (OY) x black female (OO) will give black males and tortoiseshell (black tort.) females. But suppose that the father of the red male is blue and that the black female is heterozygous for black (Dd), would not that result in blue males as well as black ones, and blue tortoiseshell as well as black tort., as the black and blue genes are inherited

independently of the X-chromosome?

First of all, there are two genes involved here that are independent units: the gene for coat color (red & black), which is a sex-linked gene found on the female sex chromosome (as a point of clarification, the white coat color gene is the dominant coat color gene in cats but it is not sex-linked); and the dilution gene which is a normal gene (not sex-linked). One must always bear in mind that these are two independently inherited genes. As a point of clarification, I shall state the symbols to be used in this discussion: R = Red Coat Color; n = Cream Coat Color; B = Black Coat Color; b = Blue Coat Color; D = absence of a dilution gene; d = dilution gene.

A Red male (R) carries one Red gene on his one female sex chromosome. Since he is Red in color, we know that he has the absence of one dilution gene (D). However, we cannot tell by observing him visually whether or not he carries a dilution gene (d). The same situation exists for the Black female carrying (B). Therefore, when you mate a Red male and a Black female, if one or both do not carry dilution genes then they will produce only tortoiseshell females and black males.

If the father of the red male is blue, then he must carry two dilution genes and will pass a dilution gene to all of his offspring. If this heterozygous Red male is mated to a heterozygous Black female, then the color possibilities in the litter would be black and blue males and blue-cream (blue tortoiseshell) and tortoiseshell females.

As indicated above, the gene for coat color is located on the female sex chromosome except for white which is on a regular chromosome. The genes for coat color dilution are also on a regular chromosome. We could simply state that a Black, Red or Tortoiseshell cat is a cat that can either have none or one dilution gene. A Blue cat is a black cat with two dilution genes that modifies the black color to blue. A Cream cat is a Red cat with two dilution genes. A Blue-cream cat is a cat that has one red gene, one black gene and two dilution genes.

According to the European FIFE Standard, the tortoiseshell pattern shall have a black, red and cream color mixing. How do you explain that a cat can have red and the diluted color cream at the same time? Is it after all a question of different red shades---what is light red and what is dark cream---due to different polygenes/polygenetic expressions?

I realize that many standards for tortoiseshells state 'Red, Cream and Black patching are desirable in the Tortoiseshell coat'. However, there are obviously tortoiseshells that do not carry dilution genes; therefore, they cannot technically carry any potential for expressing cream or blue color. If logic were to hold forth in the previous description, it should be: 'Red, Cream, Black and Blue patching in the coat'.

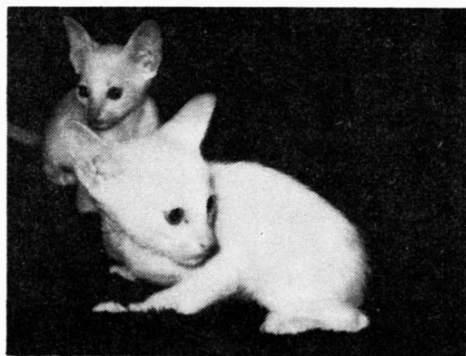

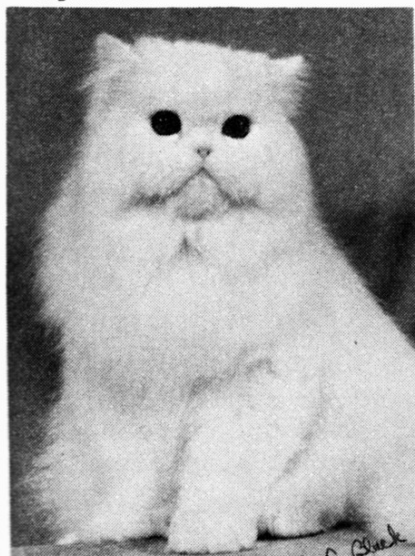

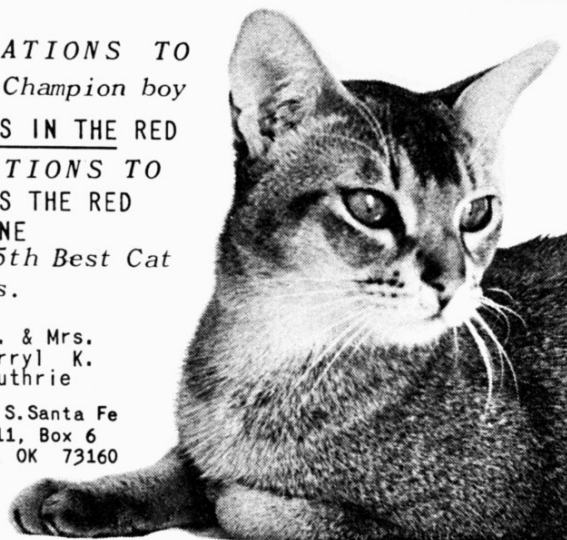

Fanciers' Forum

PROBLEM

POLITICS & CAT SHOWS: STRANGE BEDFELLOWS
The age-old disease diagnosed as politics plagues the North American cat show scene and a lot of it can be blamed on the judging procedures used. Here are some examples of what goes on:

(1) Exhibitor Sleek deliberately waits until the last call to carry his entry to Judge Slender's ring. Since he's ready and waiting to start, the judge cannot help but notice and recognize Exhibitor Sleek (who also judges) and his cat.

(Note: Judge Slender is exhibiting next weekend and Sleek is scheduled to judge. A simple case of you-scratch-my-back-and-I'll scratch yours.)

Exhibitor Sleek then waltzes his cat to Judge Lanky's ring and the cat does nothing in this ring. Judge Lanky does not know Exhibitor Sleek, you see.

(2) Judge Short has a lull between his regular judgments and his finals because of a delay in another ring. Exhibitor Hefty grabs this opportunity to have a lengthy conversation (about the weather, no doubt) with Judge Short.

Results of Short's finals: Hefty's cat places number one.

(3) Judge Svelt is running for office in XXX cat organization and will need votes. Exhibitor Smooth is an influential person with a cat club or two and also with XXX. Judge Svelt awards special wins to Exhibitor Smooth's entry with the hopes of getting more votes.

(4) Exhibitor Fluffy has a cat which has been rather unsuccessful in shows. The cat is bought by Judge Full who enters his purchase in subsequent shows. All of Full's judging friends find the cat to be one of the best.

While the names are far-fetched and fictitious, the incidents relayed above are not. I and others have seen them happen.

In an attempt to put shows and judgments back into proper perspective, and to help prevent these sort of things from taking place, a cat club in California decided to hold a show a la British with American finals. While I did not personally attend, the show received an overwhelming response. Because of its success, it warranted an encore. This route has to eliminate a good percentage of politicking. Judges are not influenced by the presence of exhibitors and are free from glaring eyes. Added benefits: judging is accelerated, show hall less chaotic (because there are no spectators and/or exhibitors),

and the cats are calmer.

Another avenue of thought: cut slips. At least one cat organization has its judges issue slips which state on what he discounted an entry (which has championship status). After a few shows, the exhibitor can compare these devaluations and see the shortcomings of his cat -- or inconsistencies in judgments.

It's highly unlikely that any method is infallible, so I don't know where the answer lies, but North America's present way of judging needs to be revamped. Serious consideration should be awarded to the adoption of an alternative system.

COMMENT

One thing a cat showhall is not noted for is privacy! Several years ago, I remember hearing about a cat club who came up with a rather unique idea to protect the anonymity of the entries in its show. This club set up portable 'retiring rooms' to be used by its judges between classes. The idea could quite easily be adopted by any club which has a spacious showhall.

Such portable merchandise as tents, pool cabanas or garden storage sheds would make suitable 'retiring rooms'. It is very possible that such items could be obtained on loan from a local merchant or department store if the Club would point out to him the advertising value of having them on view at the show before a large number of spectators and exhibitors, his potential buyers. The club could also offer a catalog ad and appropriate 'plugs' for the merchandise on its public address system. Otherwise, such items could be rented.

Prior to start of judging, each judge would wait in his/her own 'retiring room' set up close to that ring. The clerk would call up the cats in the next class and when all were in the ring cages and exhibitors gone from the ring, would notify the judge who would then emerge and proceed with judging. When ribbons had been hung, the judge would again leave the ring while exhibitors picked up the cats from that class, cages were cleaned and the next class was brought to be judged. Not only does this eliminate Mrs. Kanteman's objections to judges seeing who carries which cat up for judging, it also gives the judge a chance to sit down and relax with some privacy as he does bookwork.

I am not convinced that the British method of judging would be popular or feasible at an American show. In the U.K., cats are benched by breed ready for judging in their respective Open classes. Therefore, if an exhibitor has more than one entry his cats can be scattered all around the showhall! Unlike the average N. American show which has four judges who will each see every entry before the show is over, the U.K. show has a

AUSTRALIA

BERYL CHANDLER

A Queensland veterinarian, Dr. S. Goldfarb, has been named Veterinary Practitioner of 1977 at the Australian Small Animal Veterinary Association Conference. Dr. Goldfarb graduated from the University of Queensland, then spent 8 years in practice in America, returning to Australia to take up the position of Lecturer in Veterinary Medicine at the University from which he had graduated, later going into private practice. The veterinary 'scene' in Australia, as all over the world, is tremendously complex and demanding. At the Melrose Cat Club 'Night With The Vet' recently, the dedicated young vet. speaker said that the last 5 years have produced so much knowledge on cats that they are a full study in themselves! Maybe the time will come when one takes one's cat to vets who only specialize in cats. I can remember the time when we had to 'shop around' to find a vet who would even bother to treat cats. The last few years has seen a most professional approach to veterinary nursing in Australia, almost like human nursing. The Australian Veterinary Nurses Association has been formed and, in a special ceremony sponsored with great ceremony by Uncle Ben's Pet Foods, Miss Gail Woods of Mildura, Victoria, won the honor of Veterinary Nurse of 1977.

From South Australia comes a very good, new cat magazine: "Cats, Australian Style". 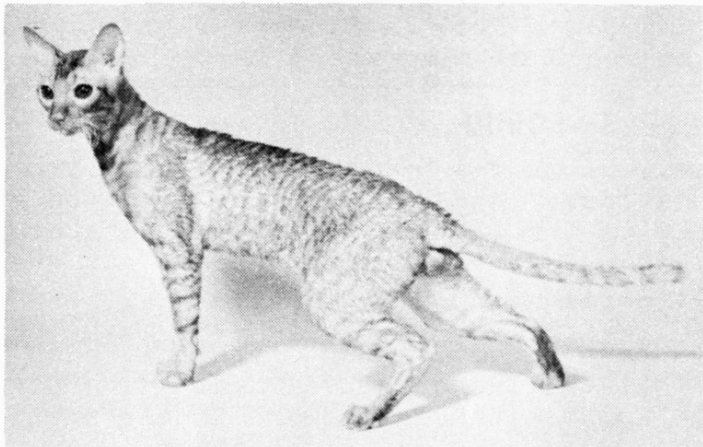

"The Natural History of Cats", a one day program conducted by Dr. Randall Eaton, an expert on the history, biology and behavior of domestic cats and their wild relatives, will be offered by UCLA Extension on May 6 at the UCLA campus. More information from P.O. Box 24902, Los Angeles, CA 90024 According to scientists with the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture, methoprene can effectively control fleas by preventing cocoon formation and adult emergence. Flea larvae form cocoons in which to pupate, and methoprene disrupts this process. It was far more effective than any of the other 16 compounds tested A nationwide survey was conducted by mail in late 1977 by the Morris Animal Foundation. Cat owners were asked two questions: 1. What was the cause of death of your last cat that died; and, 2. What do you believe is the most important disease of cats? The most frequent reply to each question was FUS (feline urological syndrome). It was given as the cause of death in 17% of responses to the first question, and was listed as most important feline disease in 27% of answers to the second question. Following urinary problems, the ratings of important diseases were: feline leukemia (20%), respiratory diseases (15%), distemper (6%), cancers other than leukemia (6%), peritonitis (4%) and kidney disease (4%). Most frequently cited causes of death in cats following FUS, came leukemia (13%) and other cancers (13%), followed by kidney disease (9%), auto injuries (9%), old age (8%), respiratory diseases (8%), periton-

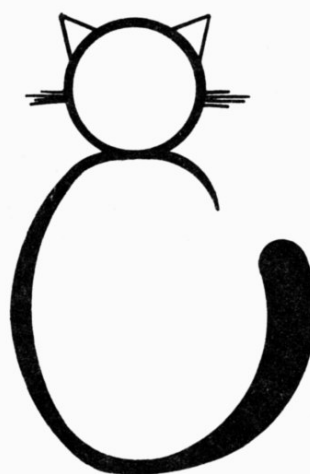

battery of judges between whom the classes are divided. An American show might be regarded as the equivalent of four separate U.K. shows: the American entrant has the possibility of gaining four winner's ribbons on the one weekend, but its U.K. counterpart would have to go to four different shows to win four Challenge Certificates. The U.K. judge walks with his steward to the section of the hall where his first class is benched. Each cat is removed in turn from its cage and placed on a portable judging table for examination. When all cats in that class have been judged, the judge and steward move on to whatever section of the showhall the cats in his next class are benched. Show managers hope that their judges will be finished at least with the Open classes by the end of the morning when spectators are admitted to view the cats. However, any Open judging not completed has to be done in competition with the spectators walking along the aisles at the same time.

It is most unlikely that an American judge would have completed judging all the cats in the showhall in a few hours so the Club would have to forego the revenue from spectators. To ask exhibitors to enter cats and have them judged in such close proximity to spectators would no doubt result in very few entries for the show!

A cat show judge is in the unenviable position of being unable to please everyone regardless of which cats he puts up. This is far from a new situation. As long ago as Feb. 1, 1916, a letter was printed in "The Cat Review" from an exhibitor deprecating the poor sportsmanship on the part of fellow-exhibitors at a recent show who questioned the judge's decisions. "I hope the fancy will some day be made up of gentlewomen, who will be able to argue a point in a calm and dignified manner, and not after the way of the wives of fishmongers," she wrote. Her letter prompted a lengthy editorial which included the comments: "One person who raises his voice and shrilly denounces the judge, brings an atmosphere of disquiet into the show room. All the novices begin to wonder if, indeed, the judge is dishonest or merely incompetent and if either, what is wrong with the members of the club that selected him. Groups form, gossip starts, scandal follows, discord reigns."

That was 62 long years ago and it seems fanciers of today are searching for the same answers as our predecessors did yesterday! CAT WORLD welcomes any constructive comments and ideas from its readers in reply to Mrs. Kanteman's letter.

itis (6%) and distemper (3%).

Dr. Pierre A. Chaloux, deputy administrator for veterinary services of USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service-APHIS said the 1976 amendments to the Animal Welfare Act require such standards so that dogs, cats and some other warm-blooded animals are not subjected to extremes of climate while awaiting shipment on airlines or delivery to consignees. "Even though we can debate what the limits should be, the Animal Welfare Act and the intent of Congress are clear that we must set temperature limits within the terminals for the protection of these animals when they are shipped on airlines or other common carriers," Dr. Chaloux said. His statement was in response to complaints by representatives of airlines, dog and cat breeders, pet dealers, etc., at a Dec. 8, 1977, meeting in Washington under the auspices of the Air Transport Association. The principal concern of the participants was the position of some airlines that animal shipments could not be accepted when outside temperatures at airports fell below 45 degrees F., or rose above 85 degrees F. APHIS officials maintain that the regulations do not refer to exterior atmospheric temperatures, but do prescribe temperature limits for animal holding areas within the terminals. Dog and cat breeders said the airlines' current interpretation of regulations has had the effect of eliminating animal shipments for months at a time at many airports.

From the "Intl. Himalayan Society" Bulletin: "Is it proper to ask a Judge, 'What's wrong with my cat'... 'Please fault my cat'... 'Why don't you like him'? One must bear in mind that one can intersperse two definite colors uniformly in a pattern and achieve a modified effect. I think it is interesting to observe cats with a white spotting gene and a tortoiseshell coat color. These cats often have large, bold patches of one solid color or another.

The question of shades of coat colors in cats is becoming more and more important to some fanciers. It is a matter of conditioning on the part of exhibitors in various parts of the world. A simple explanation could be attached to the intensity of the action of the dilution genes. One is prone to conclude that darker blue and cream could come from Blacks and Reds than from blue and cream ancestry. But I have seen non-dilute cats produce extremely pale dilute offspring. However, it seems logical to conclude that

paler coat colored cats when used over a period of years in a program will produce a paler coated line of cats. Perhaps we can hear from some breeders with experience in settling either dark or light coat color in cats.

ATTENTION: BIRMAN BREEDERS

What experiences have American Birman breeders made as to the genetics of the white paws/laces of the Birman, and do many of the American Birmans get a white spot in the points, e.g. on the chin? If they have a cat with a white spot on the chin, do they breed with it? I shall call upon Birman breeders with experience in this field for a response. I prefer to consider this column as much the readers' as this writer's. I have not bred Birmans. I have bred other mammals with white spotting in their coat color though; but I shall delay my reply to this question in order to receive some response from Birman breeders.###

U.K. Cat Tales

1978 has started with a bang and shows follow thick and fast. With one nearly every weekend, it's almost a full-time job being a judge these days.

The National was one of the best shows of 1977. Such a pleasant atmosphere and superbly run and organised by Mrs. Grace Pond with her hard-working helpers. It still remains the biggest show here. I was invited by

Pet Foods Ltd. to a Tea Party and took my Steward and four friends. We received a warm welcome with a glass of wine, then tea and excellent sandwiches and cakes; most enjoyable. I was judging the Sealpoint Siamese kittens and had one or two quite promising ones. There were 24 males entered and 26 females: for Best of Breed I chose Mrs. Beach's 7-month-old male, *SEADOG PINCHARIO*.

We had a busy time at the Notts. & Derby show with over 1000 cats present. At the Southern Counties I judged the AV Foreign Grand Champion Class. There were ten cats: a Russian Blue, an Aby., three Brown Burmese, two Cornish Rex and three Devon Rex. I found it quite a challenge to judge as they were all so close but most marks came up for Cornish Rex *JASON HALES* and he became Britain's second Grand Champion Cornish Rex. Owned by Mrs. Brownsell and bred by Mrs. Martin, he won Best Foreign Shorthair at the 1977 GCCF Supreme Show. He is the grandson of Britain's first Cornish Rex Grand, *SENTY-TWIX JASPER*, whose mother, *CH. SENTY-TWIX CRISPATIS*, is also the new Grand's great-great-grandparent on the dam's side of the pedigree!

In spite of the snowy winter we are having, we got to Glasgow for the Scottish Cat Club show, a very good one with a superb dinner party being given following the show. I had an interesting and busy day with twelve Open Classes and the Merit Classes to judge.

We were lucky to be able to make it to Blackpool the following weekend for the Preston & Blackpool show which attracted a big crowd of visitors so that judging in the aisles was quite a fight after the lunchbreak. I had the Chocolate Point females and found them rather disappointing except for a promising kitten. After dropping fellow judges Mrs. Olive and Mrs. Kidd at Bristol, 75 miles from my home, I ran into a blizzard and got

stuck in a snow drift when I came off the Motorway. Fortunately there was a house near by and very helpful people. The Automobile Association sent out a Land Rover with two young men who, somehow, through snow drift after snow drift, got me home at 4 A.M. I managed to collect my car two days later so all is well again.

SIAMESE NEWS

The Siamese Cat Society of Scotland will be ten years old this year. It was formed to fulfil a need for more positive dissemination of information on the breeding and rearing of Siamese cats. The Club will hold its fifth Championship show in April with special rosettes and, hopefully, some awards from overseas clubs.

I was heartbroken to hear of the recent death of Mrs. Deakin's *CH. SENTY-TWIX FRANGIPANI*. Except for the later-changed rule that seven or more cats had to compete in the Champion of Champions Class for awards won to count, she would have been the first Grand Champion Siamese. She won the class three times under Mrs. Furgeson, Miss Prentis and Miss Kit Wilson, but in one class there were not seven cats competing. She was a great character and always up to mischief. Once Mrs. Deakin found her lying unconscious and sent for the vet who came at once. He picked her up and sniffed her and said: "She's dead drunk". She had knocked over the sherry bottle so that the cork had partially slipped and the contents were dripping out. How could she resist those fascinating drips? It took some hours to bring her round and her hangover was just something!

Burmese cats continue to increase and multiply in their different colours. I had an interesting letter from Mrs. Boizard who lives in the Channel Islands but comes over to the shows frequently. Mrs. Giles' stud, *CH. KALOS CASTOR*, is the root of most of the beautiful Burmese on the island of Jersey. Mrs. Boizard's Lilac Burmese female, *BAMBINO LILAC TRULOV*, 20 months, was judged Best In Show twice in 1977 and won her Championship. Her brother, *BAMBINO BROWN BANDIT*, exported to Denmark, won Best In Show at Copenhagen in October. Another Bambino Lilac female, *LOLITA*, exported to Australia with a sister last year went Best In Show in October just a few days after leaving quarantine.

I received an amusing letter from *NINA*, beautiful Foreign Blue queen owned by Mr. & Mrs. Billington, Cornwall, telling me about her babies. She wrote, in part: "Dear Auntie Nancy, My five young'uns have at last let me have the chance to put paw to paper to thank you for my carton of cream that you sent me. Mum was dead rotten, though, as she only let me have a spoonful at a time; she said that I would be sick. I got my own back on New Years Eve when they went out celebrating. Daft mits, they went out leaving a prime turkey standing tothaw out. My timing was exquisite and I managed to gnaw a leg down to the bone before they got back!"###
