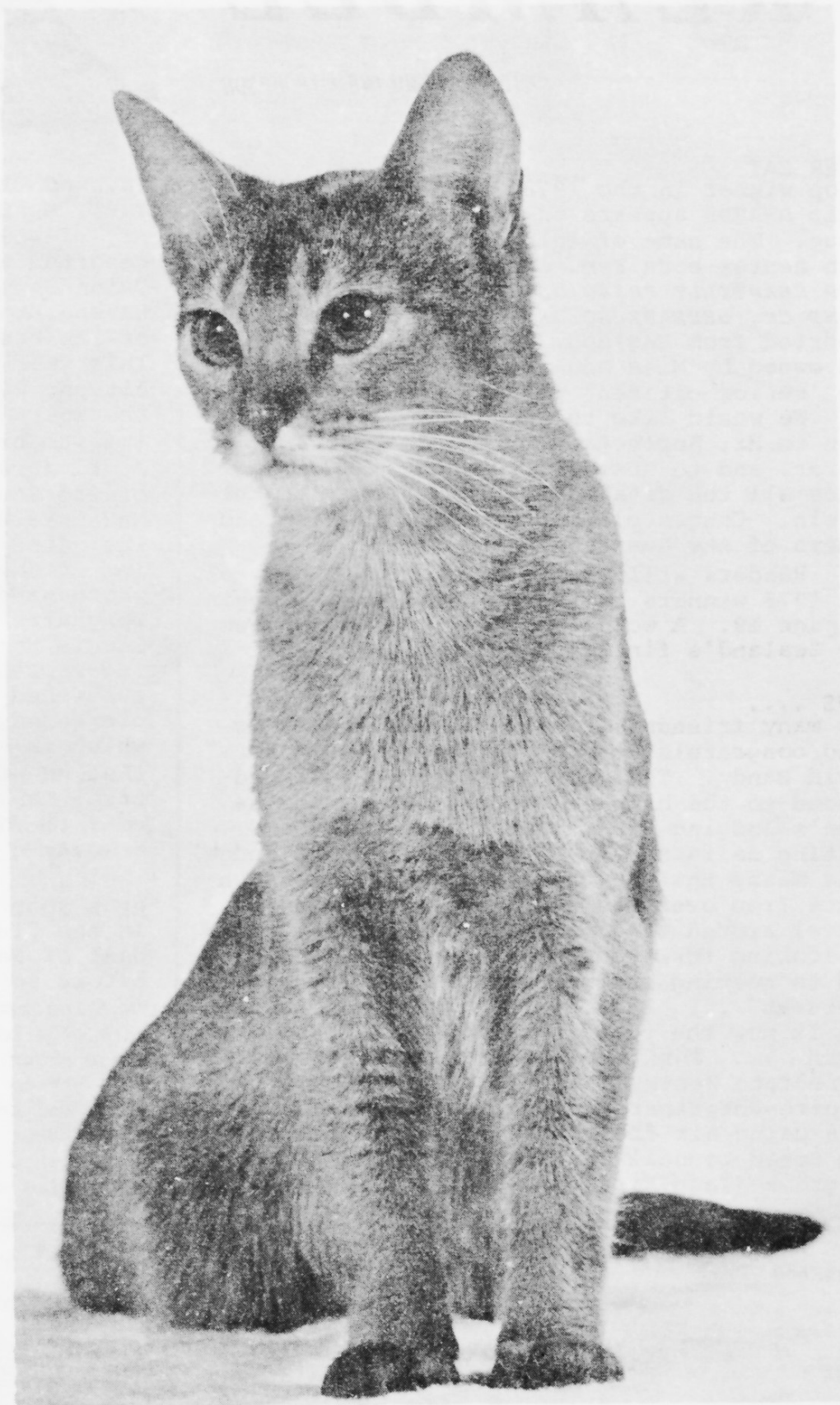

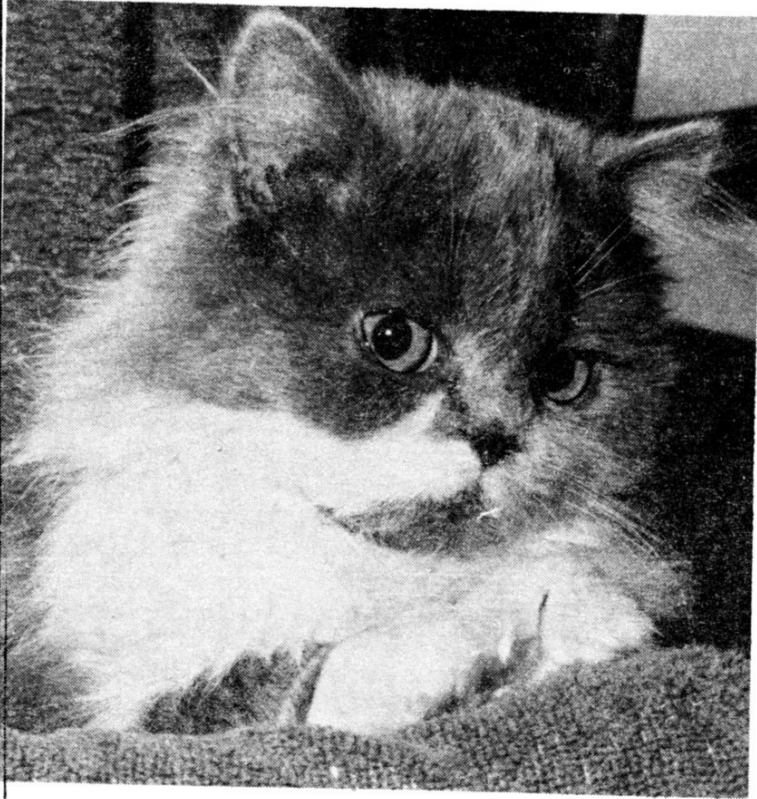

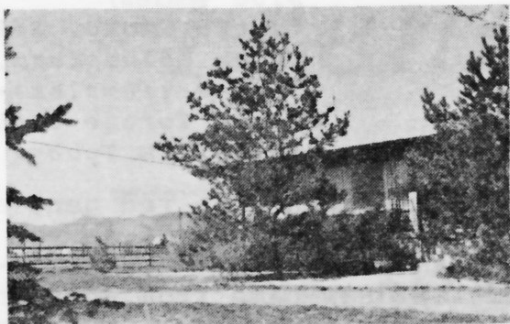

# A Bluecream Male? Are You Sure?

Tortie and Bluecream males do exist but they are so few that when you get such a genetic oddity in one of your litters your first thought must be: "This is impossible" and you must do all that you can to prove to yourself that he is not a Bluecream. Look very carefully at the kitten as he grows and study the pedigree of his sire and dam.

For this article, I shall disregard the Tortie male as I have only seen one in my life, a Tortie & White Shorthair, who was a true male. As a judge and pedigree secretary I have often seen Bluecream males and females who were, genetically, not Bluecreams and, with an experienced eye, one cannot be mistaken.

I do not think this error can happen easily in America where the Standard calls for patched Bluecreams, but in other countries where it calls for intermingled Bluecreams, a Blue Tabby without markings can readily be confused with a Bluecream especially in countries where the Blue Tabby is not recognized and, therefore, seldom bred and never shown.

What is, genetically, a Blue Tabby? It is the dilution of the Brown Tabby. The rich tawny ground colour of the Brown Tabby is diluted as fawn coloring in the Blue Tabby and the black marks become blue. This fawn colour can easily be confused with cream but it has absolutely no cream as inheritance. Two Blue Tabbies can never produce a Cream kitten.

Anyone breeding Brown and Blue Tabbies with purpose is using stock with markings so that a Blue Tabby without markings will probably never appear in such a line. But when such a kitten is born in a litter never intended to produce a Blue Tabby, the eye of the breeder first notices a Blue kitten with a faint fawn tinge on the face and on the tummy. Later this appears on the sides. As this fawn coloring is diffusing farther in the blue coat when the kitten grows, it is clear that the breeder thinks that she has a good intermingled Bluecream. Still later on, the fawn creeps on to the paws looking very often as cream patches would because the coat is shorter at this spot.

The main difference between such a Blue

Tabby and a Bluecream is the face. When grown up, they always have "spectacles" round the eyes from a very pale bluish ivory. Above the eyes there is a short ivory mark. The chin is very pale blue, sometimes white, just as the chin of many tabbies, and the nose leather is pale brick with a dark line around it. And that nose can never be the nose of a Bluecream. A Bluecream has a blue or a pink nose leather, sometimes half blue/half pink, but never with a dark rim. The chin of the Bluecream is blue or cream (or both, or intermingled) but never white, and the eyes are plain in a blue or cream or intermingled area.

This resolves the identity of your Bluecream male. What about the female? Exactly the same mistake can be made but, in her case, there can be another possibility. She can be a Blue Tabby and, too, a Bluecream Tabby (it seems strange to speak about a tabby without markings, but I cannot find any name to describe these odd Blue Tabbies), still recognizable by the "spectacles". She has true cream spots near the fawn spots and it is very difficult to see the difference.

Studying the pedigrees with genetic knowledge will be the only proof to determine exactly what your strange kitten is.

When there is some cats of the Silver Division (Chinchilla, Shaded Silver, Smoke, Cameo, Silver Cream, etc.) in the pedigree, there is always the possibility that you will get a Brown Tabby and his dilution, Blue Tabby, in the litter. They will probably be without markings as the silver ancestors carry the ticking but not the markings.

Let us look at some examples:

<i>Shaded Silver + Blue</i>	=	<i>Black, Blue, Smoke, Brown Tabby, Blue Tabby (males &amp; females)</i>
<i>Cameo male + Blue</i>	=	<i>Smoke, Brown Tabby, female Blue Tabby, Black, Blue (males) Tortie Smoke, Silver Cream, Bluecream, Tortie (females)-- Brown Tortie-Tabby, Bluecream Tabby.</i>

It becomes complicated when the red gene and its cream dilution are introduced, as you then get cream with blue tabby. The Bluecream Tabby female I saw came from a Brown Tabby Tortie dam and a Blue sire. The dam brought the necessary factors with the help of a dilute sire.

If you still have any doubt about the identity of your Bluecream male, give him a suitable female, one which does not carry the red gene in order to avoid confusion. If a Bluecream or Tortie kitten is born, then your male is a true Bluecream. If he is a Blue Tabby, you will get the following:

<i>Blue Tabby male + Black female with dilution factor</i>	=	<i>Black, Blue, Brown Tabby, Blue Tabby males and females.</i>

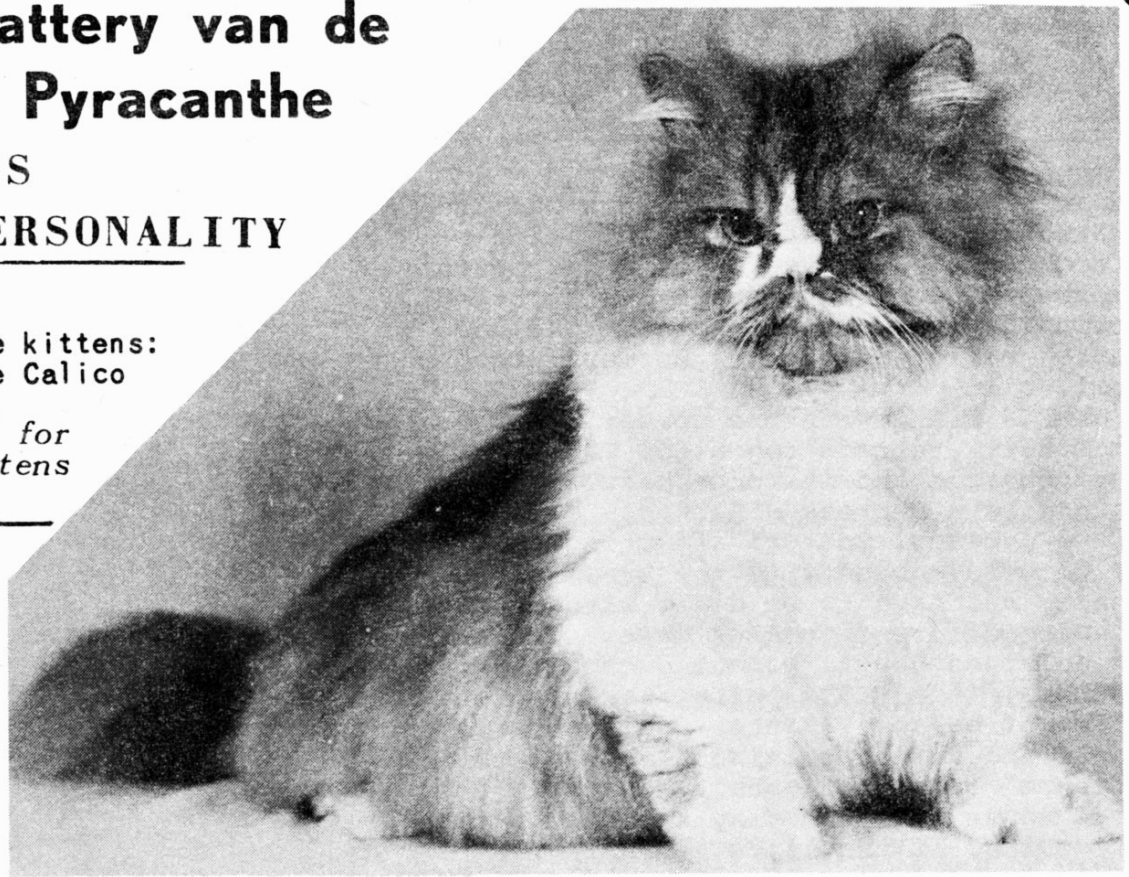

# Fanciers' Forum

## AN OUTCROSS FOR THE DOMESTIC BURMESE

There are over 80 Burmese breeders who are now having to consider the registration of imported Burmese for use in outcross breeding to improve health and stamina of the breed. Questions on this subject will be included on a special ballot of the CFA Burmese Breed Council.

What's wrong with the domestic Burmese? Its mortality rate is too high. The overall size of the cat and its once heavy bone structure have decreased markedly over the past two decades. Factors affecting the mortality rate have been with the breed since the beginning and have to be dealt with in one's own choice of breeding practices. These include enlarged heart, patent ductus, umbilical hernia, 'head tilt' with its associated problems of balance, taste (don't nurse), deafness and defective vision, the birth of 'miniature' cats (not usually dwarf in the medical sense but just tiny kittens, often frail, which, if they live, do not grow to full size) and depressed sternum ('swimmers' or pectus excavatum) which results in too small lung capacity and an increased susceptibility to respiratory disease or compensatory enlargement of the heart.

The Burmese as a breed are many times more popular now than they were 20 years ago and the increased pressure to breed precipitates the surfacing of problems that were there but were recessive. The distressing factors just mentioned are not confined to the Burmese breed but, since the Burmese are really all each other's sisters, cousins and aunts, all common characteristics are more easily concentrated and intensified in ordinary breeding without even the impetus of intentional inbreeding. They are not getting any farther apart as the generations go on. The gene pool just isn't that big.

Believing that our 'domestic' Burmese need an outcross, and preferably one which will not change their nature or their Sable color, I have been working with a Sable Burmese male whose sire was imported in 1974 by Frank and Barbara Smith, Bowbell Cattery, and whose grandparents were ACA registered Burmese from the CFA-registered cattery, Mahajaya, in Bangkok, Thailand. This is, in a way, like going back to the beginning and bringing in a new line, similar to the line of *WONG MAU*. The border of Burma is as close to Bangkok as Baltimore is to Philadelphia. Such cats are very rare but they do exist in the Malay peninsula and have been reported in parts of China and northern India.

Various examples have been imported over the years since 1930 when *WONG MAU* started

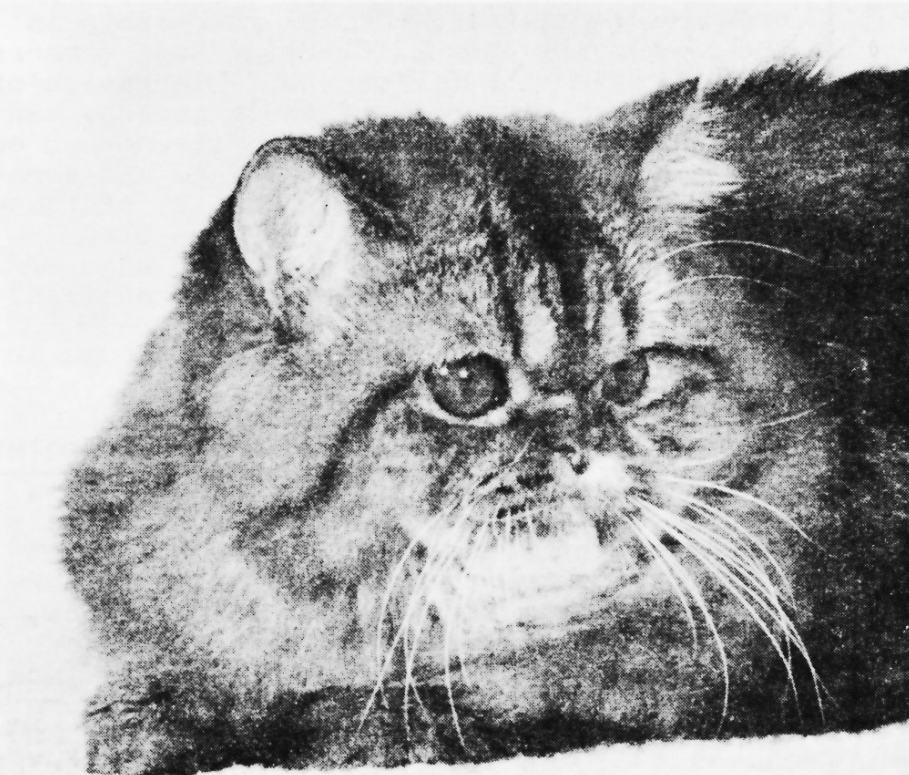
our present domestic Burmese. Usually these were brought in by military or government personnel as pets but some have found their way into the Burmese registry. Because of the fairly recent designation of Burmese as an Established Breed by CFA, the imports of the 1970's have not fared as well. Rules for registration no longer exist which take into account the need for outcross breeding.

There are in U.S.A. at least three imports from the Mahajaya cattery whose characteristics are well known and whose progeny has shown itself to be acceptable in the ranks of our domestic Burmese. In my experience, litters of seven and nine healthy, Sable kittens have resulted from the breeding of a *DETOUR* daughter to the son of one of the imports. One of these female kittens produced a male, *STAR SHINE*, born last Christmas sired by *SUL-LEE'S SPIT SHINE*, who was dying of cystitis and kidney failure at the time of breeding. Two litters of five each have been produced by other females.

Now on record are five generations of registered Burmese in the case of the Bowbell imports and three generations in the case of the other one imported by Ardith Flood, Pandit Cattery. 95 kittens, all Sable and in good health, have been produced from these

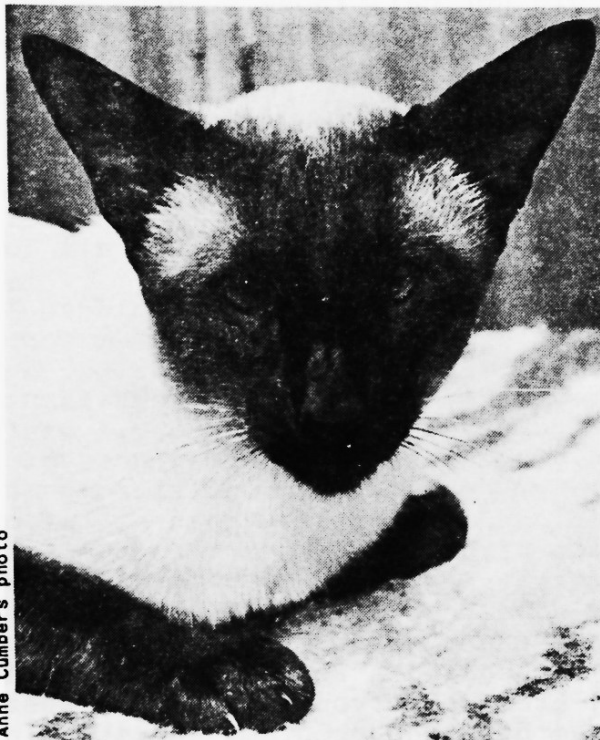

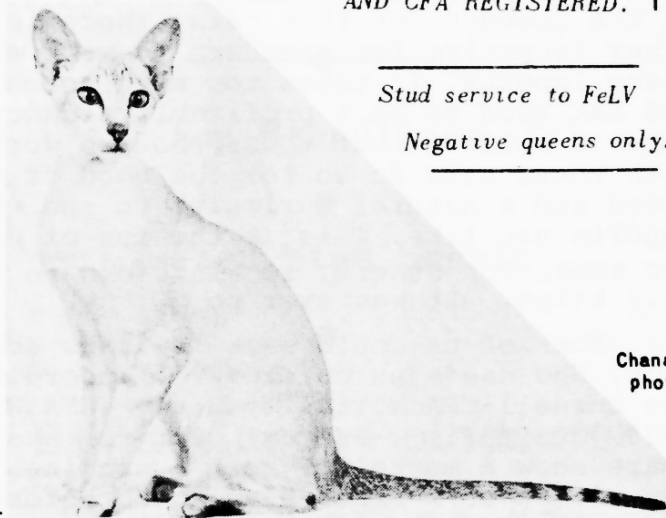

imports and their offspring bred to domestic Burmese. None with stillbirths.

The imports have both ACA and ACFA registration. They come from a respected, CFA-registered cattery. Their offspring are registered with ACA, ACFA, UCF and a Japanese cat association affiliated with CFA. The breeders of these offspring are trying to learn what can be produced from this new line. Some sibling breedings have been made and others are in progress as well as father-daughter combinations. So far the resulting kittens are comparable in appearance and personality with the majority of offspring from domestic Burmese. The import who I have seen, MAHAJAYA TOFFEE OF BOWBELL, looks like a beautiful, big-boned, yellow-eyed, Sable Burmese. Possibly other native Thai cats would look less like Burmese; the cats to be used as outcross should be the best candidates available.

TOFFEE and four of his offspring were exhibited at the Houston Show in January 1979 and he appeared at the Empire show together with his 5 month old granddaughter bred by Carolyn Lees. Exhibition of these cats has won over many previously indifferent or hostile breeders who had feared that their introduction would prove detrimental to the breed. Once seen and handled, these cats have convinced many that only good would result. The imports look like many Burmese seen on the showbench in the recent past and their offspring look better than some seen today. They do not look like CFA Grand Champions (particularly those Grands who have the extreme round head), but the majority of our domestic Burmese would not be of that calibre either.

Support has been offered by several breeders of the country's top Burmese as well as by many judges. My own veterinarians, who have a rather large Burmese practice, gave shouts of hurrah and offered me "Congenital Defects In Domestic Cats" (1978 Veterinary Practice Publishing Co.) as evidence of need.

Beyond the goal of improvement in the health and stamina of the breed and the love of the breeder for this cats, there is little other incentive for breeders to work with these imports. It takes too much space, time and cat food to be a profitable financial venture. I believe that those who are working with these cats do so for the good of the breed and a natural curiosity to see what the imports are like. This is the fun of breeding for some. For others, to win seems to be the only thing. It was ever so.

Most of us could say: "My cats don't get sick. Who needs an outcross?". According to the Cornell-CFA Mortality Study (CFA Winter, 1978, Quarterly), Burmese over the past three years show a mortality rate averaging 35%. How sick does a breed have to be before we recognize it? Doris Springer warned of this 15 years ago in her article "The Burmese Cat" in the 1964 CFA Yearbook and urged the introduction of new blood from imports. People have had misgivings about the effect this

would have and some have said: "We have plenty of hybrid vigor already from so-and-so's cats", but most have said: "Great! Let me know when CFA accepts them."

Now I'm letting you know. If you want them accepted, you must help. As a Burmese breeder you are eligible for membership in the CFA Burmese Breed Council. Soon members will be asked to vote on the registration of the imported cats so that their progeny can also be registered and used to strengthen our Burmese. The entire Burmese breed has something to gain from the availability of these outcrosses. Registration will make them available to those who wish to use them.

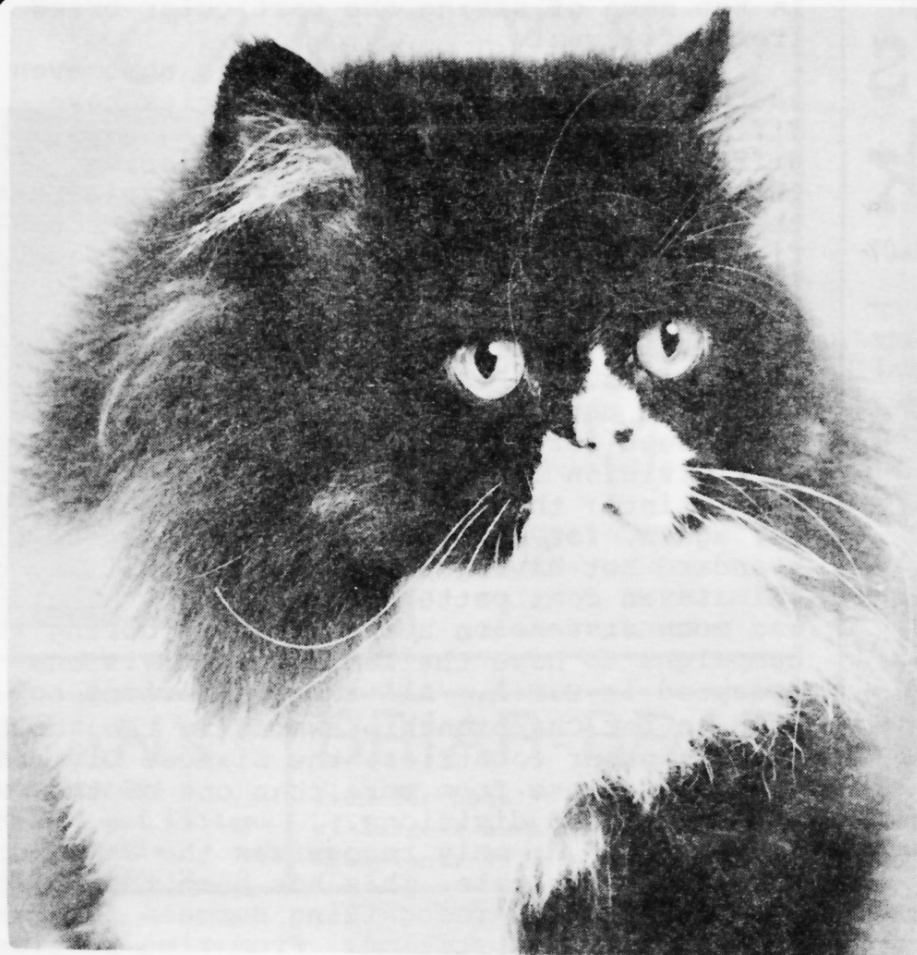
### A COLORPOINT IS A COLORPOINT IS A COLORPOINT

In the not too distant past, there lived a man who had a dream. He owned some animals and loved them dearly but he saw how, with the use of some other breeds, he could perhaps create a masterpiece of intelligence, beauty and usefulness. So he went to work and, by judicious breeding, his masterpiece of hybridization slowly evolved. His name was Karl Friedrich Louis Dobermann. Out of the fire of his imagination, and the crucible of genetic combinations and determination was born the exciting, elegant Doberman Pinscher. In the process of this creation, one of the breeds used was a Rottweiler, and puppies were sometimes born that appeared to be Rottweilers. But they were not called Rottweilers, and were not part of the ultimate goal except for their possible use in breeding. Puppies were also born that epitomized his dream. He did not call those puppies a variety of Rottweiler, nor did he attempt to have them accepted as a variation of Rottweiler. They were the first Doberman Pinschers; and eventually Doberman bred to Doberman produced only Dobermans. And Herr Dobermann smiled.

Rottweiler lovers continued to breed and love Rottweilers, and the Doberman Pinscher earned the respect and admiration of all dog fanciers.

So, my Colorpoint Colleagues, please read on. Here's another point of view for your consideration. A Colorpoint is not a Siamese. Yes, the essence of the cat is Siamese. But it is a special creation. I don't want to go into genetics, but for those of you who do have an understanding of some basic genetics, a Sealpoint cat born of one or two Lynxpoint parents can never produce Lynxpoints, unless bred to one. BUT, this does not mean it should be called a Siamese, any more than the puppy who appeared to be a Rottweiler was called a Rottweiler. That animal is a by-product if you will of the basic thrust of the breeding program, and its ultimate goal is to produce NONE of those recess-

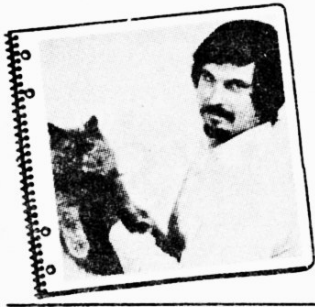

# Breeder's Notebook

by A. DAVID BANDY

Editor's Note: Any reader who has a question about any phase of cat fancying (or a suggestion for discussion) is invited to write to Mr. Bandy at his home address (see page 6) for response in this column.

Dear Mr. Bandy:

While living in England last summer, I acquired a Blue Burmese cat. Not only was this cat respected there, but it could trace its lineage back a great deal further than I could my own!

Now I have returned to America to find that she cannot be shown, probably not registered, should be ashamed of her ancestry. When I contact people (not all) on the phone about her in hopes of breeding, the answering party is rude if, in fact, they'll talk to me at all.

In England, the breeders are under the assumption the Blues are acceptable here. Can you give me a complete unbiased view?

Dear Mrs. Falkow:

With our increased mobility in our present society, animal fanciers are becoming aware of the differences in standards for the same breed of cats in various countries.

Burmese have been bred in several countries of the world for many years in a variety of colors such as Blue, Sable and Tortoiseshell. These colors have met with acceptance in several countries for a number of years. It is interesting to observe the influence that a country with an established cat fancy has upon a country that it lends assistance to in developing a cat fancy. In most cases, the developing country relies heavily upon the information already compiled by the assisting country, including accepted breeds.

After a country has established a cat fancy then, over the ensuing period of time, further changes can occur that escape the influence of the original sponsoring country. This lends individual character to cat fancies in various countries and also lays the groundwork for some healthy and often heated debates on a world level about just what characteristics are important in a particular breed of cat. Occasionally political pressure (cat fancy type) is brought to bear to attempt to elevate one country's opinion over another country's opinion about a particular breed. Sometimes some of the most bizarre actions and statements are made in the defense of the standards and coat colors accepted in a particular country. At about this time, sound reasoning is tossed out the window and a variety of actions are condoned all

in the name of saving the particular breed from defilement.

What we must bear in mind is that even as the people of different countries have different habits, so they will also have different tastes in the characteristics of their fancy animals. The only criteria that they can be expected to meet is to be satisfied with the animals they are producing.

The C.F.A. in U.S.A. accepts only four colors for registration in the Siamese Division: Lilac Point, Chocolate Point, Seal and Blue Points. C.F.A. also has two other divisions for cats bred to a very similar standard except for color. The Colorpoint Shorthair Division is for Red, Tortoiseshell and Lynx Points; the Oriental Shorthair Division is, again, for cats bred to the same general standard but having solid coat color, i.e. no 'Himalayan coat pattern' acceptable. There was much dissension among breeders during the campaigns to have the latter two divisions accepted in C.F.A. All three divisions now compete for Championship awards in the shows. In some other countries, the Siamese Division includes colors from more than one of the abovementioned divisions.

The C.F.A. only recognizes the Sable color in Burmese cats. This has been the policy from the time of recognizing Burmese for Championship competition. From time to time, there is discussion of recognizing Champagne colored Burmese as they occasionally are born to Sable parents from some bloodlines. But there has not been enough support as yet to have them recognized in C.F.A. However, Champagnes, and perhaps other Burmese colors also, may be recognized in other American cat associations.

Campaigns for recognition of new breeds do not appear to meet such a wall of resistance if they are not closely similar to the standard of an existing breed; for example, the Scottish Fold and the Wirehair. Perhaps this is because the fancy is not extremely knowledgeable of them and does not feel that they threaten the existence of already accepted breeds.

The C.F.A. Burmese Standard calls for a more massive cat of short, more compact stature than most of the Burmese I have seen in other countries. The latter tend to be longer bodied and legged giving them a rangy appearance. The head type is also different in some respects.

I hope this will give you some idea of the rationale behind the situation in which you find yourself. It might be possible to find a suitable stud in Canada if they recognize the various colors in Burmese.

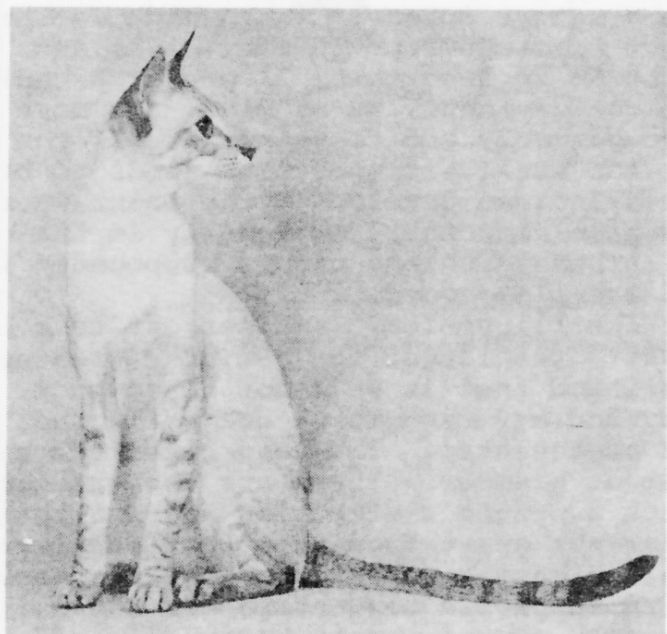

the breeder started out with large sized Persians and is satisfied with the stock he is producing, then he could develop a preference for larger size stock.

I think of a Persian as a compact, cobby cat with a square appearance, as high as they are long. Persians come in many sizes and balance to me is important. I prefer a medium sized cat as these, to my mind, are more likely to be cobby and to standard. If the stock is too small, it sometimes tends to be fine boned and can develop to the point where breeding problems occur, especially in the females. These problems can be compounded if the cats are fine boned.

But I still prefer a smaller cat to a larger cat. The larger the cat, the greater the likelihood that it will not be compact and cobby and may tend to be coarse in the features of the head. The head gives the cat character or glamour. These are the aspects that catch a person's attention and set that particular cat apart from the other specimens. It is this pleasing appearance that arouses the desire in people to want to own and maintain the cat.

Coat is another important feature of the Persian. It can certainly enhance the beauty of the cat, but it can also cover a great deal of faults. A cat can be long legged and long bodied but if he has a very long, heavy coat, he can appear to be compact and cobby to anyone who is looking at him. One must really be able to handle him to discover his body type.###

ives!! YOU CANNOT HAVE YOUR CAKE AND EAT IT TOO! Don't be a Colorpoint, or for that matter any hybrid breed fancier, if you cannot cope with the realities of creativity. You should all be working on a long-term breeding program that has as its MAIN goal the creation of a genetic pool strong enough and with enough type to breed ONLY Colorpoint to Color-

point, and the eventual closing of the Stud Book to any other combination! And please don't tell me you cannot do this; that i.e. "you can't breed Lynx to Lynx" etc. You can breed good Lynxpoint to good Lynxpoint and do just fine. There have been enough years and enough breedings done at this time for the Colorpoint people to stop kidding themselves, to stop whining, to stop looking at "What might have been"---(the smashing Sealpoint kitten who could have knocked 'em dead if only he could be shown!) So what? You are a COLORPOINT BREEDER---PRODUCE COLORPOINTS THAT WILL KNOCK 'EM DEAD!! Now, all this takes time, effort, education, money, devotion, love, laughter and not a few tears. Maybe you don't qualify.

And the Oriental Shorthair breeders should be looking at the same goal: the eventual creation of a gene pool suitable for breeding OSH only to OSH. No, I don't want to see the OSH AOV (that looks like a Colorpoint) accepted as a Colorpoint. Come on, folks. Are we to be the laughing stock of the purebred animal fancy. (And, no, to breed good Lynxpoints, you don't need to breed to AOV Oriental Shorthairs!)

If you must win today, and if you cannot look past winning, then you should pick a different breed. Because this is what motivates all the endless discussion and the myriad proposals for acceptance of AOV's in Championship competition. Keep your fantastic Sealpoint Colorpoint if its quality demands its use in your breeding program, but remember it is a stepping-stone, a tool in the realization of your ultimate accomplishment---that breathtaking Lynxpoint, Redpoint or Tortiepoint. Don't demean my breed or yourselves by saying this is your end product. A beautiful Siamese cat in the "standard colors" is truly a work of art. But what is born of our dream, out of the fire of our imagination, is a supreme creation in its own right. It is a Colorpoint.

Now, if there are any of you still willing to read on, I want you to know that I've been where you are. Yes, once upon a time I, too, said my cats are Siamese and "THEY MUST ACCEPT THEM". And I, too, wanted to "show them" by exhibiting exquisite AOV's to prove my point. But as the years have passed, the fundamentals became inescapable. You can't hide your head under a pillow without getting very short on oxygen. Nobody ever said HYBRID was a dirty word. Try telling Doberman breeders that their breed is in some way "lesser" because of its unique history. So, Colorpoint Breeders, arise. Stop feeling sorry for yourselves. Get rid of your inferiority complexes. Take inspiration from the beauty of your cats. Mine are not Siamese; are yours?

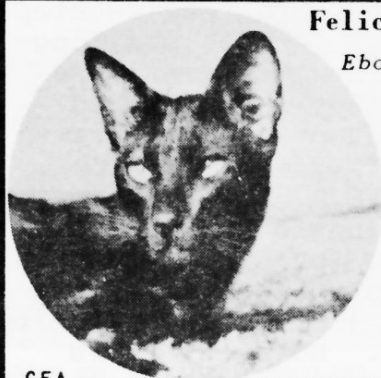

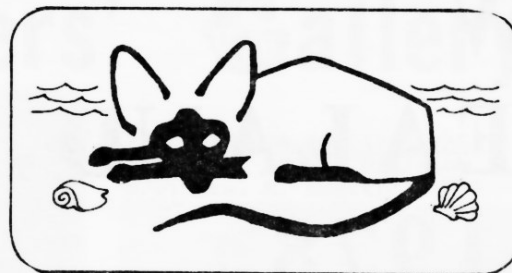

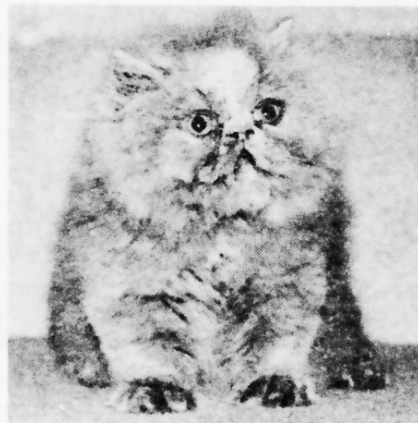

# NEW ZEALAND, 1978

by JILL DAWSON

OUR THIRD GREAT YEAR OF NEW ZEALAND "CAT WORLD" ANNUAL AWARDS! In November, 1978, the end of New Zealand's 9-months long show season, Hurle Rayner, Honorary Scorer, has had his free time fully occupied by the meticulous job of checking, cumulating and averaging the points won by 3,454 Longhair entries, 1,581 Shorthair, and 2998 Siamese (including Cats, Kittens and Neuters/Spays). Total number of exhibits during 1978 was 8,033, an overall increase of 494 over the 1977 total of 7,447. There were 494 more LH entries and 194 more SH, but 102 less Siamese entries.

Mr. Rayner willingly devoted a phenomenal amount of time during the season recording the points won by EVERY exhibit in EVERY show of the New Zealand Cat Fancy Inc. whose complete cooperation makes his voluntary task of compiling the official annual lists of winners possible. After the essential results are recorded for the NZCF Inc., (using the official NZCF Inc. marked catalogues which must be forwarded by all Clubs to the Honours Officers for the Fancy's records, the "CAT WORLD" scoring is done independently. Later again, these same official catalogues are used for NZCF Inc. Regional scoring, Specialist Breed Club scoring, etc.

The "CAT WORLD AWARDS" scheme is completely FREE to clubs and exhibitors and gives recognition to those exhibits who have beaten the most others during the season. The winners are presented internationally in CAT WORLD Magazine and nationally later in greater detail in NZ CATS Magazine. Prior to the introduction of the "CAT WORLD AWARDS", a New Zealand cat's ultimate glory was to attain that elusive triumph of Grand Champion status but now there is this added incentive, greatly looked forward to: to feature in NZCW's Best Cats/Kittens/Neuters & Spays annually.

## NEW ZEALAND SHOW FORMAT

The two 'divisions' of an NZCF Inc. show up to and including the 1978 season were Longhair & Shorthair. These were further divided into 'sections' of Cats, Kittens, N/S Cats & N/S

Kittens, with NO competition between divisions, i.e. separate Best In Show awards, etc. However, commencing with the 1979 season, there will be three divisions: Longhair, Shorthair & Siamese (including Orientals), so in future there will be no competition between Siamese and other Shorthair exhibits, just as there has always been no competition between SH and LH. Another progressive step taken recently by the NZCF Inc. is the long-awaited adoption of many new Breed numbers for LH and British SH. 1979 shows should feature a wider variety of breeds/colours (oil crisis permitting).

While cats in the U.S.A. may compete in All Breed rings, and be judged a number of times by different judges for Best In Show, cats in New Zealand do not; each exhibit is judged ONCE only and has just one opportunity to make BIS at each show. However, it is most exciting to rank the winners into an All Breeds Chart according to their final point averages. Out of 45 cats/kittens/neuters and spays in the above placings, 17 are LH, 12 are SH and 16 are Siamese; however, the LH considerably outnumber the SH and Siamese in the Cat and Kitten charts, while the Siamese outnumber the LH and SH in the N/S chart. The highest-placed cat from the South Island in the Top 15 is CH. SAZANAMI BROWN SACHA in 15th place. There are no South Island exhibits in the Top 15 Kittens, but the Top 15 N/S Cat chart shows 11 N/S from the South Island with only 4 from the North Island of New Zealand.

#### GRAND CHAMPIONS

Grand Champion status (Grand Premier for N/S Cats) is very difficult to attain in New Zealand, with only a few cats achieving the honour annually, so NZ Grands are highly prized. 1979 brings change but, during 1978, only four Grand classes were available in each division at each show, i.e. 1 male, 1 female, 1 neuter, 1 spay for the entire Longhair Division, similarly for the Shorthair Division. Champions (or Premiers) competed against all other champions (or Premiers) in their own division. A minimum of four exhibits in the class is mandatory but, since 1977, male/female classes may be amalgamated (neuter/spays likewise) should there be insufficient entries present. The Judge may award ONE grand to the winner of the amalgamated class should there be a minimum of four present. Three Grands must be won under three different Judges at three different shows to reach Grand Champion (or Grand Premier) status.

1978 Grand Champions: There were fifteen new Grands for 1978--6 LH, 6 SH and 3 Siamese. This brings the total of Grand Champions produced during the past four seasons to only 52. 7 males and 8 females won the title in 1978.

1978 Grand Premiers: Seven new Grand Premierships won in 1978 brought the four-season total to 25. The 5 neuters and 2 spays included 3 LH and 4 Siamese, no Shorthairs.

1978 Champions & Premiers: 176 cats became Champions in 1978: 74 LH, 45 SH and 57 Siamese. 97 neuter/spay cats became Premiers: 35 LH, 26 SH and 36 Siamese.

#### SCORING SYSTEM

The NEW ZEALAND "CAT WORLD" AWARDS are for the country's BEST cats, NOT the most exhibited cats. To ensure this, the Awards are made on the basis of the highest average points. By averaging points, the cats are protected from being overshadowed and the exhibitor who cannot afford the time or money to travel to a great many shows is not penalised.

There is also a minimum division number of three to exclude the possibility of a cat winning one major award at a show and then being retired for the season, resulting in a large number of points which would provide a misleading overall result.

As in previous years, some Breeds/Colours do not feature in the winners' lists. Although exhibited often during the season, and possibly having numerous Best of Breed/Colour wins, a cat might, unfortunately, never beat another exhibit to gain even one point.

Exhibits receive points for their highest placing at a show only, i.e. exhibits placed in the BIS, Top 5, Top 10, etc., automatically drop the points accumulated at lower levels. Cats not featuring in a show's Top 10 receive points for Group wins, and cats not in Groups receive points for Breed/Colour wins - all by the same method of one point for each cat present and competing that they have beaten. The merit in this system is its fairness and simplicity, although anomalies may occur with any scoring system as the 'perfect' system has not yet been devised! This scoring method allows winners at big shows to accrue more points than winners at small shows, e.g. a 10th BIS at a large show may be worth more points than a BIS at a small show, which is the fairest system possible as obviously the exhibit that beats the most other exhibits is entitled to the most points. Perhaps this is a little hard on South Island exhibits, though, as two-thirds of the population (and their cats) live in the North Island.

There are 35 NZCF Inc. registered Clubs and, during 1978, there were 23 shows in the North Island (16 All Breeds, 5 Shorthair only and 2 Longhair only), and 10 in the South Island (6 All Breeds, 2 Shorthair only and 2 Longhair only).

## NEW BREEDS & COLORS

CFA Rules Governing Acceptance & Advancement  
(Effective May 1, 1979)

A new breed or color must first be recognized for registration, then as a Provisional Breed, and finally for Championship show competition. CFA is willing to register any litter which fulfills the requirements for registration as set down in this outline; registration does not mean eventual progression to Provisional and Championship statuses.

The Cat Fanciers' Association, Inc. is the largest registrar of purebred cats in the world. For the purposes of registration, CFA has arbitrarily divided cats into the following groups: NATURAL, HYBRID, ESTABLISHED and MUTANT breeds. Since the British cat fancy had been established long before that of the American, the artificial boundaries of four large groups was necessary to encompass those breeds present and those to come in the future. It should also be pointed out that registration rules need not also follow the laws of genetics.

The purpose of a registry of purebred cats is to provide a continuing history of cats as a service to breeders. Because of changes in registration rules that have occurred from time to time in the history of CFA, this article has been prepared to offer guidelines to breeders interested in developing new breeds and colors of cats.

New breeds of cats occur either as spontaneous mutations or result from the hybridization of two previous known breeds. When two cats come together and produce offspring unlike either parent, a mutation is strongly suspected. It does happen that a different offspring may occur as a result of different breeds or colors in the ancestry of the parents. Such a kitten is not a mutation but rather a reflection of its ancestry.

Mutations take the form of skeletal changes (i.e. Manx, Scottish Folds); new coat forms (i.e. Cornish Rex, Devon Rex, American Wirehair); and new colors (i.e. Red Abyssini-

an). Examples of new breeds are the Himalayan, Exotic Shorthair and the Oriental Shorthair.

CFA wishes to impress upon those breeders who would consider hybridization to create a new breed the consequences of such an undertaking. Not only must the breeder consider the validity of the planned breeding program, but if the product of this proposed hybridization will enhance the fancy by its addition. The breeder must also consider if breeding stock will be available from those breeders who will be called on to participate in the breeding program and, most important, is the proposal possibly simply a whim?

CFA believes that the import of these considerations must be weighed carefully. Not only will the future of the proposed breed depend on just this evaluation but, indeed, the future of the fancy is dependent on conscientious, moral judgements.

Though CFA is eager to aid in the development of any cat offering a unique and healthy addition to the fancy, CFA does assume the position that not all hybrid crosses will be acceptable to the fancy.

CFA feels that any new breed of cat should be an asset to the fancy both in health and in beauty. Realizing that some new breeds will rarely attract the following of some older ones, CFA still insists that there be sufficient numbers of breeders and sufficient numbers of specimens of the new breed to warrant registration. It should be emphasized that registration of a new breed or new color does not automatically insure future championship status.

### CONDITIONS FOR CFA REGISTRATION

#### I--RECOGNITION FOR REGISTRATION

A. Formal application signed by at least ten breeders who state in the application they are working with the breed or color together with Cattery names, numbers and addresses.

B. Classification information:

(1) Breed or Breeds allowed in the pedigree. Breeders must determine into which category the new breed should be registered and what breeds will be allowed in the ancestry of the cat. They must also determine how long those breeds will be allowed in the history of the breed.

(2) To be classified as a NATURAL, ESTABLISHED or HYBRID Breed, or MUTATION. If classified as a Natural Breed from another country import certificate or verification of import and of ancestry, if possible, must be provided.

C. A tentative standard including a list of colors acceptable for registration.

D. Properly completed registration applications (with fees) for at least 50 specimens of the new breed or color. The applications must be by litter registration except that original stock may be individually registered if from unknown ancestry if unknown ancestry is permissible.

The Application must be submitted to the CFA Central Office as a package. After all information is verified by the Central Office the application will be submitted to the CFA Executive Board for consideration. All applications for new colors within existing breeds must have a favorable endorsement from that breed council.

Although it is not essential, it is certainly desirable for breeders to form a CFA affiliated breed club and issue a newsletter as a form for the exchange of ideas for improvement of the new breeds. It would seem desirable to include the CFA Central Office and members of the Executive Board on the mailing list for such publications. Acceptance for registration of a new breed or color is at the discretion of the CFA Executive Board of Directors.

#### II--RECOGNITION FOR SHOW STATUS AS A PROVISIONAL BREED

- A. Request for recognition as a Provisional Breed may be made to the CFA Executive Board after not less than 100 cats of the new breed or color have been registered with CFA over a period of not less than five years. The breeder list must be current to include twentyfive active breeders.
- B. Presentation of a definite standard.
- C. A list of acceptable colors for Provisional Breed show status need not include all colors recognized for registration.)
- D. The cutoff date for breeds allowed in the background ancestry.
- E. At least one breed club, a CFA member.
- F. Recommendations for Breed Committee Members: a Secretary and two other breeders familiar with the breed (to be appointed by the CFA Board.)
- G. Sufficient facts to demonstrate the potential value to the fancy of the proposed breed and the differences between the proposed breed and existing recognized breeds. Compliance with the requirements of these rules will not necessarily guarantee acceptance of the breed or color by the CFA Board.

It is highly desirable that examples of the breed or new color be presented to the CFA Executive Board at one of the regular meetings. It is essential that a breeder, thoroughly familiar with every aspect of the breed or color be in attendance to present

the cats and information to the Board.

Once provisional breed status has been achieved, there must be evidence of the new breed being extensively shown in all regions. Judges are required to submit objective reports regarding new breeds and colors exhibited under them.

#### III--ACCEPTANCE FOR CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW COMPETITION

The Board on its own motion will accept any Provisional Breed for Championship competition when, in the opinion of the Board, such action is proper and, again, it is emphasized that acceptance at the two previous levels does not insure automatic acceptance for championship status. CFA recognizes that quality and benefit to the fancy are more important than numbers. Before such action, the CFA Board must have:

- A. A standard agreed upon by the breeders.
- B. A list of acceptable colors for Championship competition. (Note: Colors for Championship competition may not include all colors recognized for registration or Provisional Breed status).
- C. Proof that at least twentyfive different cats have been shown throughout all the regions in CFA shows.

In every instance of request for recognition at whatever level, all material shall be in the Central Office no less than sixty days prior to the Board meeting at which formal requests for recognition are to be made.

#### NEW COLORS

New colors in older breeds face other problems. The most obvious of these is the prejudice of established breeders. Breeders of such new colors must be prepared to present acceptable evidence that new colors have appeared spontaneously and are not the result of hybridization in natural breed classes, or must provide evidence of derivation of color from other breeds. Breeders must be prepared to present evidence of the dominance or recessiveness of new colors. This can be done by statistical evidence of all colors appearing in all litters bred for at least three years. New colors must request registration in the same manner as new breeds. New colors must be shown in the A.O.V. class in numbers comparable to those required for new breeds.

b) New color description for Flame Points in view of Cream Point acceptance.

MAINE COON CAT:

All submitted changes were accepted.

ORIENTAL SHORTHAIR:

All submitted changes were adopted. Abyssinians were not added as a permitted outcross breed.

SCOTTISH FOLD:

All submitted changes were adopted. Competition will continue in one color class.

TURKISH ANGORA:

New colors were accepted for Championship competition.

DEVON REX:

Accepted for registration.

**NATIONAL AWARDS**

The previously announced change in national scoring for next season (using a one point differential between top cats) was reconsidered and defeated. Next season the differential will be changed from the current 10% to 5%.

Discussions were held on possible realignment of national awards to place more emphasis on Breed/Division winners, to add more recognition of Regional wins, and to increase the number of awards for Kittens and Premiership cats. National Kitten and Premiership awards will be increased to the Top Ten next season; other possible changes for adding emphasis to breed wins will be presented to the Annual delegates.

**SHOW MANUAL**

A revised edition is in the offing. Please send suggestions and ideas that have worked for your Club's shows to Jeanie McPhee, 9809 Warwana Road, Houston, TX 77055, or to Kathryn McGinnis, 2770 Dean Pkwy., Minneapolis, MN 55416.

**YEARBOOK**

The 1978 edition is nearly sold out. The press run was increased over 1977 but over 4200 have already been distributed versus 2800 at this same time last year. Early space reservations and timely ad copy are requested for 1979.

**PUBLIC RELATIONS**

A radio tape with three 30-second spots promoting neutering and spaying is available from Vaughn Barber. Price is only \$5. This is something a Club should obtain and prevail

upon its local stations to air as a public service announcement.

**NATIONAL SHOW**

This project is back 'on the shelf'. CFA does not want to compete for publicity and gate to the detriment of local clubs. The Houston Cat Club felt a 'National Show' there could seriously hurt their traditionally large and successful undertaking. When a good compromise could not be agreed upon, the plans in work were cancelled. Another requirement, underwriting the financial risk by a pet food company or other such organization, is also difficult to fulfill. At this time, the National Show Committee is dissolved.

**SHOW FORMAT**

Next season the Top Ten format will continue to be authorized. Top Ten Shows may be used in any combination with the 'traditional' Top Five. For example: two All Breeds Top 10 and two sets of Specialties Top 5; or three All Breeds Top 10 and one set of Specialties Top 5; or two All Breeds Top Ten and two All Breeds Top Five, etc.

**ANNUAL MEETING IN JUNE**

June 22-23 are the dates of the 1979 Annual Meeting to be held in New Orleans at the Fairmont Hotel. Board of Directors meetings will be held on June 21 and 24. Other events during the period include the Showman's Club banquet, a Riverboat Cruise, and, most important, a Feline Health Seminar sponsored by the Winn Foundation. The Seminar, \$15 early bird or \$20 at the door, will be held from 1 to 5 PM on Wednesday, June 20 and will include Dr. Niels Pedersen and Dr. Terry McGinnis as speakers.

To insure their right to vote, Clubs should be certain that dues are paid, delegate forms completed and sent to Central Office on time. Proxy paperwork must be correctly handled if the Club delegate will not attend.

## HOPEFULLY HELPFUL HINTS FROM ENGLAND

### 1. FOR SHOW DAY:

(a) Take an old litter tray, lined with newspaper and sprinkled with litter, to tempt your cat before giving him the white show gear. Hopefully it will be used and can be removed and cleaned out whilst the "real thing" stays in pristine condition.

(b) Take water in a sealed polythene container. This saves searching for the source (and spilling on the way back) and, at the end of the show, it's quickly returned to the container which saves emptying time.

(c) Try cheese as a show food. It's clean, easy to serve and not smelly or messy; both my cats and I share a chunk.

(d) Before showday, for show entries, I find it time saving to keep a duplicate form with all my show cats fully entered. This avoids searching for registration numbers and other details on many different forms. And do keep a note of cats entered (I use the front of the schedule for this) so that you don't turn up with the wrong cat on the day.

### 2. FOR LABOUR DAY:

Try one-way nappy (diaper) liners or hospital undercloths when your queen kittens. It keeps the new babies a little drier and warmer than otherwise.

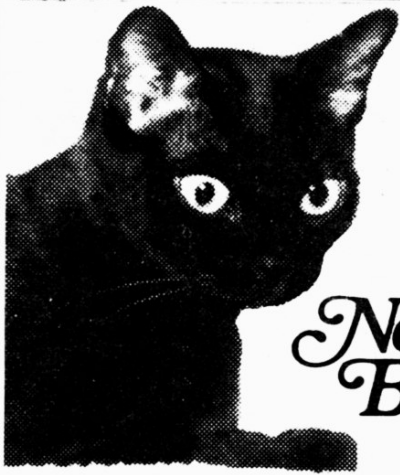

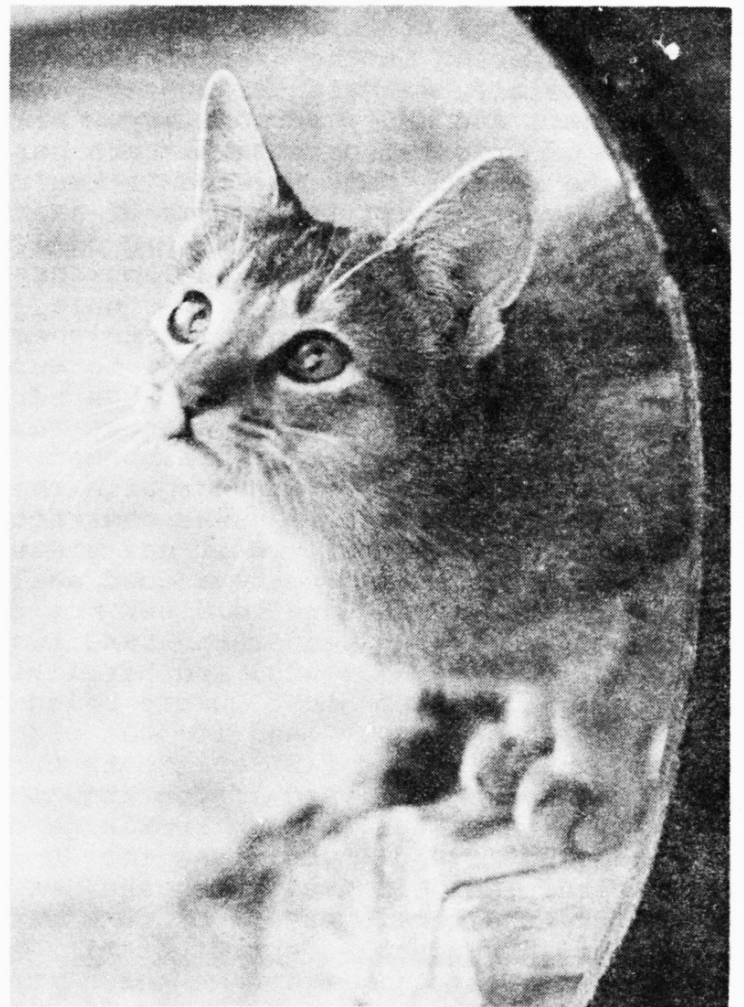

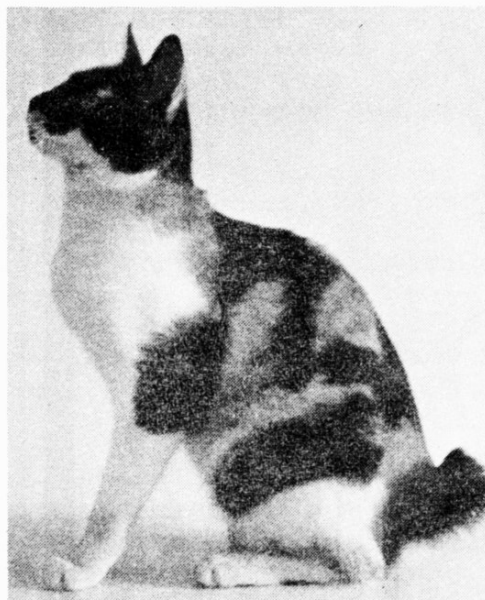

# CFA's FIRST JAPANESE BOBTAIL GRAND



**Grand Champion**  
**Maryott's Quan**  
**Yin of Amberleigh**  
(born 1/30/76)

First CFA Grand Champion Japanese Bobtail, Highest Scoring of the breed in CFA Region II and Highest Scoring in the nation! She was Mi-Ke (tri-color), with luxurious soft coat, bunnylike tail and saucy personality. Like a fine piece of Oriental porcelain, turn her over and she reads: "Made in Japan". You're right. She was *MARYOTT'S QUAN YIN OF AMBERLEIGH*.

My partner, Mary Olsen, and I purchased virtually her entire cattery from Connie Voeth who was unable to keep her cats when transferred from her home in Hawaii to Europe on military assignment. Mary had seen her ad in a Spokane newspaper and, knowing we were both looking for another Shorthair breed, answered it and became very taken with the funny-tailed little kittens. She contracted for one and called to tell me of her great find asking if it seemed to be a good deal (\$25.00). I kidded her and told her not to be so cheap, be a big spender and take two. She bought *QUAN YIN* (Quanie) and her litter-brother. We all joked about Quanie being our "bargain basement beauty" and it just proves that you can still find fantastic cats tucked away in someone's back yard if you know what to look for. Mary has so much knowledge of breeds, having raised Abyssinians for 20 years. After these initial purchases, we later acquired the remainder of Connie's cats and owe her an unpayable debt of gratitude.

Quanie came to live with me for a 'trial run'. I did not know how she would fit into my household nor how she would be accepted in the "show circle". Shortly afterwards, Mary gave me a beautiful kitten, another Mi-Ke called *SHADES OF JADE*, also outstanding.

Quanie moved in with my Abys as if we had been waiting half a century for her arrival and all would surely be well now that she was here! Mary and I had decided that Quanie would be the Japanese Bobtail to introduce her breed to shows of our Region when the new season began on May 1, 1976. I well remember her first show and first win: 2nd Best Novice under Diana Doernberg in San Francisco in October. Diana was not at all familiar

with the breed and referred to her Standards for which I commend her. She commented that Quanie fit the Standards as though they were written for her and added: "This is the most endearing little cat I have judged all day." This summed up Quanie in a nutshell.

Another CFA judge, Wayne Park, saw her at the show and invited me to bring her to his La Paz show, San Diego, early to be on TV.

Public reaction to this unusual little cat was incredible. The kidding was the fun part: what happened to your cat's tail ... how do you get it to curl, with hair rollers? ... sure a poor Manx ... did you paint the spots on to get them so perfect, etc. One judge used to refer to her tail as a "squeaker toy". Spectators continually asked if she was a Manx and as I always benched by my friend, Mary Stewart, a Manx breeder, we had to make cage signs - mine read: "No, I'm not a Manx, I'm a Japanese Bobtail" while Mary's read the reverse.

Quanie's brief show career spanned less than five months. Before her untimely death, she achieved the ultimate title in CFA: Grand Champion. Mary and I were broken-hearted at her loss and it was a great surprise a few months later to learn that she was CFA's 1977 Best Japanese Bobtail nationally.

The breed has existed for centuries in Japan and evidence may be seen in many prints, paintings and sculptures both ancient and modern. The cats were obviously held in very high esteem by the Japanese people and there is even a temple in Tokyo whose facade bears pictures of the Mi-Ke with paws upraised, a symbol of good fortune.

The Bobtail is an easy cat to feed and groom. Quanie had the same diet as all my cats: raw horse meat, Prescription Diet CD, vitamin supplement and chicken. Treats included raw egg yolks, Swiss cheese, etc. She had a bath before each show with blue shampoo to enhance her white. I blew her dry and fluffed her bunny tail. I never had to use a coat conditioner as her fur always remained

result was a decision to form an autonomous, national recommendatory, advisory and coordinating Australian Cat Council with reciprocal and cooperative links with cat bodies outside Australia. The 'Recommendatory Only' form on which the new Council will operate was stressed. It will be a Council wherein ideas will be pooled, better ways of doing things will be arrived at, and goals will include progressive activity and development toward a bigger and coordinated national cat fancy.

Australia is a big country and any national cat council must be tailored to fit the overall concept. The terms of reference and plans of the National Council inaugurated at the meeting on February 17, 1979, certainly do this.###
