CAT FANCY IN YUGOSLAVIA

by SASA DERZAJ

The Union for Breeding and Protection of Little Animals in Yugoslavia was constituted in January, 1977, with separate sections for breeders of pigeons, birds, rabbits, cattle, cats and aquarium fish. Each section has its own status with its President being a member of the Presidium of the Union. The committee for protecting and breeding all the species does intensive work on any problems.

The idea for the formation of a Yugoslav Union as the official organization for the evolution and furthering of breeding and protection of felines was originated by Professor Szlivka Laszlo, a cooperator at the Yugoslav Academy of Science & Art. With the formation of the Union, a base has been established for the breeding of new lines. Previously, a small number of cat breeders were systematically working on the breeding of pedigreed cats. Some of them are members of specialty clubs abroad, including organizations in Austria and West Germany, from which they obtained pedigrees.

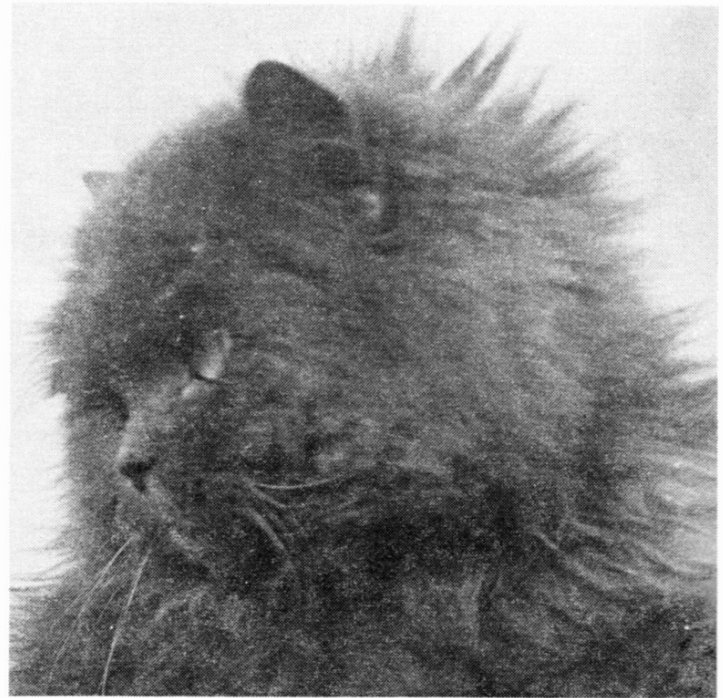
Upon learning of the work of our organization, it is hoped that other breeders, too, will join the Yugoslav organization. By forming this Union, we want to build and reach a greater circle of breeders and fanciers. We feel that besides the breeding of cats in special programs, a most important factor is the protection of cats in general and we have in our organization special members who are exclusively engaged with this question.

What has been done in this short time? First of all, arrangements were made to register, test, and publish the pedigrees for Yugoslav cats. We are sure that these were the most important obligations of our Union. Before this, we did not know what varieties and numbers we had, nor did we know the type of kittens and grown up cats or if their conformation is generally similar to those of

the same breed in other European countries.

In unison with other Yugoslav republics, a catalogue was made of pedigreed cats and their pedigrees in the same form as used in other states. We have now:

These are the registered cats. Probably we have over 500 yet to be registered because we know definitely that in Ljubljana (Slovenija) there are Chinchillas and in Maribor (Slovenija) Brown Tabbies, and in Belgrade Red Tabbies. These cats have all been imported from Germany and England.

Our Union is not yet a member of FIFE because up until now we did not have a sufficient number of pedigreed cats, but judging is done to FIFE Standards.

FIRST CAT BREEDER

Research has revealed that the first breeder of pedigreed cats was Dr. Szlivka Aurel, a veterinarian who came in 1919 from Czechoslovakia. He has Blue and White Persians which, at that time, were known as "Angoras". After his death, his son, Szlivka Mihael, a chemist, continued his father's work and bred Turkish Cats with great success until 1949. This breeding program resumed in 1966 when Prof. Szlivka Juhasz Maria established a new cattery of Persian cats with the name: "Lotus". The foundation stock came from West Germany from the "Ramachersfeld - Hoburg-Stein - Holzle Konig" lines. The Professor's second bloodline came from Czechoslovakia. From the first, these cats have had excellent coats.

We must say that the feline population in Yugoslavia does not have the usual type of Persian cats. Lotus Cattery is trying to change this to modern-day type (see photos with this article). At the moment, the main problems are head and length of tail. The cats are larger than required so Lotus has imported from Holland a short-bodied Blue-Cream female and, from Czechoslovakia, a Cream male, in hopes that future offspring will have better type.

It should be emphasized that the Lotus Cattery is not doing this work as a business but out of a great love of felines. The cattery is very modern with facilities for 24 breeding cats. Another cattery which, in the past, bred Blue Persians is located in Maribor but may not now exist. A cattery in Sarajevo (Bosna) breeds Blue and Blue-Cream Persians in small numbers. There are two catteries in Belgrade which breed Seal Point Siamese, as does one in Subotica (Vojvodina) and one in Sivac. All the Siamese are of the old-type and, as a result of in-breeding, one can see a degeneration of quality. Plans are being made to import Lilac Point and Tortie Point Siamese.

The Presidium of the Yugoslav union is in Novi Sad (Vojvodina) in the main town of Vojvodina.

The address of the President is: Prof. Szlivka Laszlo, 24300 Backa Topola, Svetozara Markovida 45/a, Yugoslavia. Letters will be welcomed.###

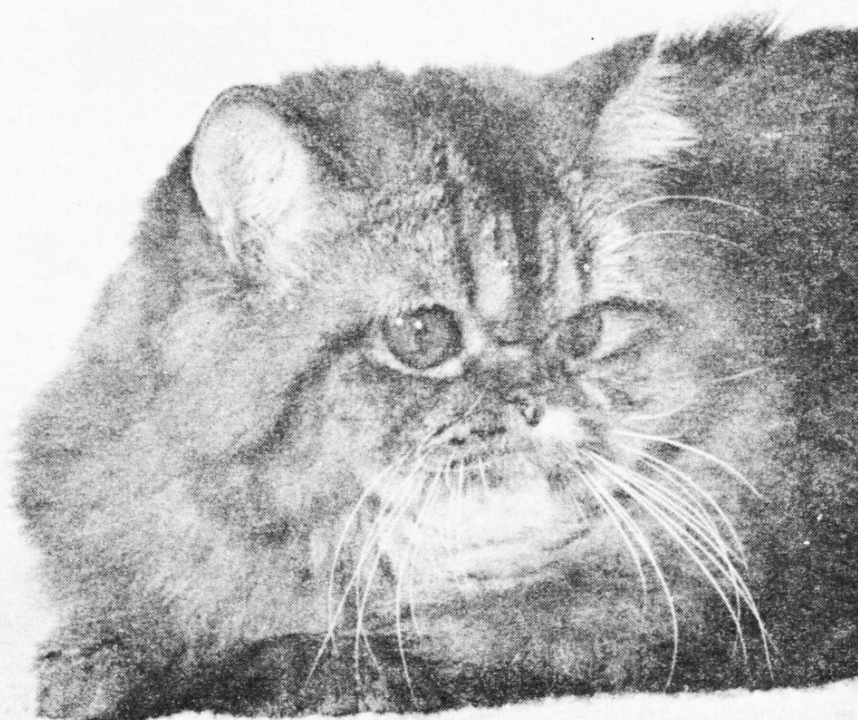

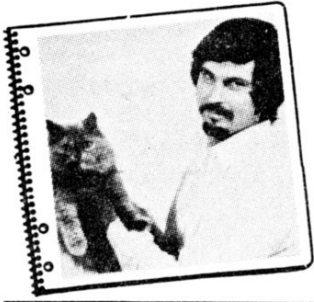

Breeder's Notebook

by A. DAVID BANDY

Editor's Note: Any reader who has a question about any phase of cat fancying (or a suggestion for discussion) is invited to write to Mr. Bandy at his home address (see page 6) for response in this column.

It's summer and I plan to spend most of it overseas again. This year my travels will take me first to Tokyo where I will meet Japanese fanciers for a seminar organized by Mrs. Haruko Mori; then to Hong Kong where I will hold another seminar and judge a show. After two weeks in India, I will go to Germany to meet with Mr. and Mrs. Deutschmann of Essen and Mr. Barrie Jamison, newly-elected President of FIFE. Next stop will be Holland where I will see Mr. and Mrs. Prose. The Deutschmanns visited me in California last Thanksgiving and Mrs. Prose, with her friend Mrs. Verbeek, in April. Finally, I will go to England to visit Mrs. Nancy Hardy and take in some U.K. cat shows. Now to questions ...

Dear Mr. Bandy:

Have seen 4 cats grand the past year that had either a tooth or tongue out, or both. We then showed our Cream girl, who has a tongue out, whom we considered too extreme to show, and she made finals and got her championship. How do you feel about teeth and tongue out, or very undershot jaws? How can you get the chin necessary to win CFA without accompanying problems? (Name withheld by request.)

The ability to obtain strong chins in Persians without exposed teeth or tongues is obtained by using lines that produce extreme stock. When I first went into breeding Persians over twenty years ago, we had some very good specimens often in every respect except for chin. Some cats that were Best In Show winners were often extremely weak chinned. I feel that in order to balance the Persian head the cat must have a strong, wide chin that counterlevers the broad tophead and wide earset in producing the round Persian head, hopefully with the nose centering the entire arrangement.

In those beginning years, I neutered some otherwise outstanding specimens and placed them as pets merely because they were weak-chinned. Over the years, by using strong-chinned stock, I overcame the problem so I don't have to worry much with my present stock as most have adequate chins, some very strong chins, without mouth problems.

I have occasionally tried to introduce new blood from other lines with mixed results. It seems that if a line has bad mouths, misplaced teeth, protruding tongues, and crooked

jaws, set in it then the problems generally are much harder to deal with. I do not mind breeding from an animal with slightly protruding teeth if they are straight in the mouth where they should be. I have seen cats who did not have any problems in early life allow their tongues to protrude at an older age. I have never seen a cat whose tongue protruded eventually correct the condition.

To my mind, a far more serious fault is a crooked jaw, or wry mouth. If this isn't stringently selected against, one will have it appearing in many offspring when it is set in the line.

There is another structural defect that occurs occasionally in the heads of Persians. It often is not apparent when they are kittens but becomes evident as they mature and develop massiveness, especially in males. It appears that a spot on the face, often under an eye, ceases to grow in the bone of the skull. At first there is only a slight crookedness to the head so that when you glance at the animal you can see the balance of the overall head has been interrupted. While this one spot doesn't grow, the area around it continues to develop normally until a depression is formed. If the hair on the face is long enough, it can be disguised by a skilled groomer. It is frequently less obvious as the cat ages.

How do you feel about people (exhibitors) who 'visit' the judge after the judging is over? Between classes? Bringing their cats up after judging is over? Sending personal thank you notes to the judges for finals received? (From same letter as above.)

This is a rather interesting area to observe. Sometimes in order to provide a buffer zone between the judge and the exhibitors there are rules set down to govern conduct between them. Some judges may feel that they must be protected against being asked their opinions of specimens outside the judging ring. Some exhibitors may feel that interaction between judges and exhibitors shouldn't be allowed to avoid having politics or personal associations influence the decisions of the judges. A few exhibitors attempt to catch the judge's eye when they place their exhibits in the judging ring. Others will not take their own exhibits up under certain judges because they feel that if the judge connects the exhibit with them he will not deal fairly with it.

All of this is a mirror to the human ego involved in exhibiting animals. One occasionally wonders who is doing the winning, the exhibit or the exhibitor.

Personally it makes no difference to me who owns which exhibit. I believe a judge has a serious responsibility to the fancy to place the exhibits entered under him to the best of his ability in the proper order according to their quality and condition on the day of the show. To me, titles such as champion or grand champion are secondary considerations. It makes no difference to me if

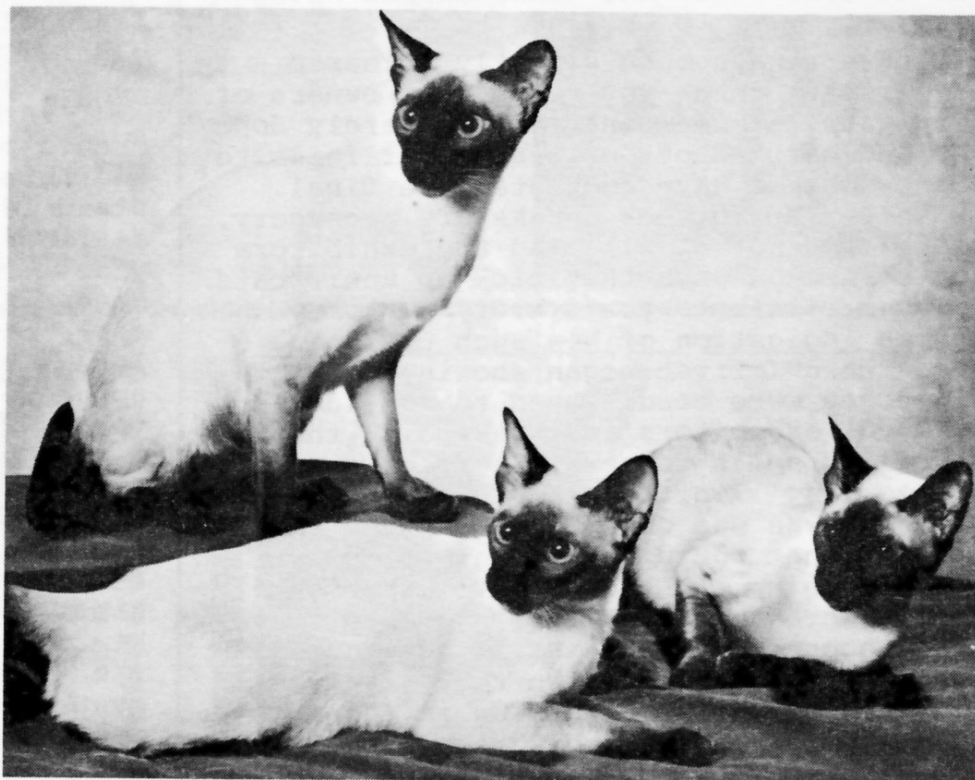

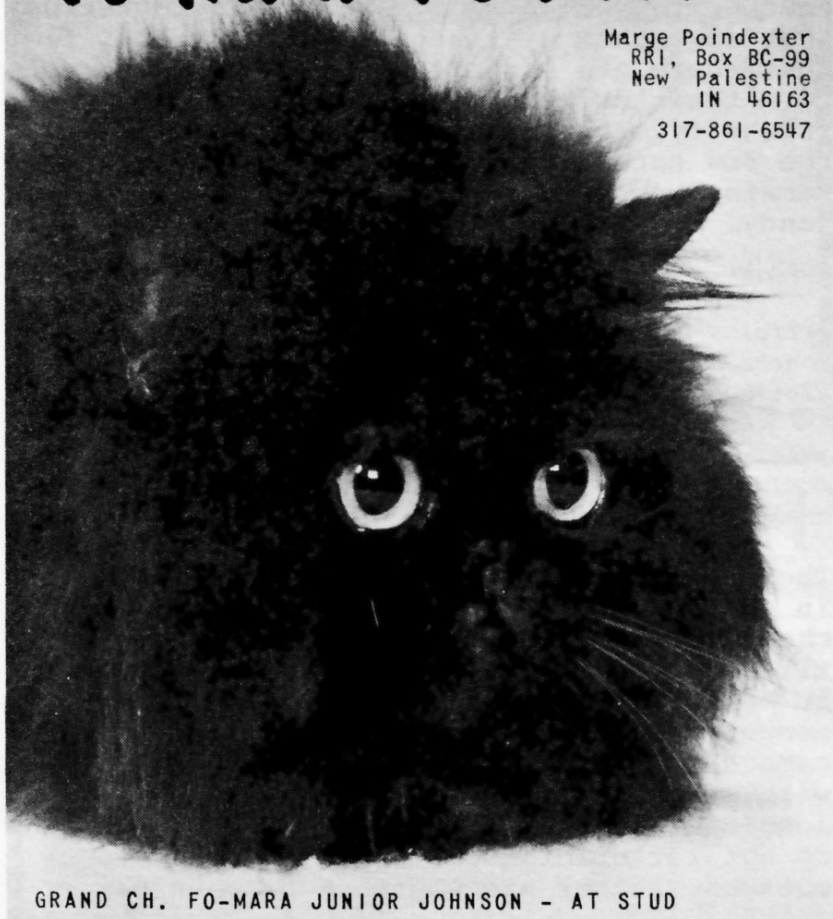

someone were to try to catch my eye. My decisions would be as I felt they should be.

There is a problem about permitting people who are seriously interested in knowing more details about the judges evaluation of their exhibits to contact the judge. This should be done after the final awards have been made.

I have always been slightly bothered about personal thank you notes from owners of winning cats. I feel that I have merely done my job and carried out my responsibilities to the fancy when I have completed the final placements. No further thanks are necessary. However, I do not at all mind the exhibitors saying thank you when they pick up their cats.

I can relate to you a story that may give some indication of how such paranoia arises. When I first began showing cats, the local judges were conditioned to considering a few local exhibitors' cats as being the best quality and a few exhibitors always expected to win. I often went to a show because there was one out-of-state judge there. Frequently that would be the only ring my cats would go up in. Years of exhibition gradually wore this away until more fair evaluations occurred. I can still remember showing an outstanding brown tabby female on the west coast until I was blue in the face without having her noticed. Matil Rotter was judging in one show and made her Best Champion and 2nd Best Cat in an All Breed and she became a Grand Champion. After that she won more awards but not what she would win today since brown tabbies have been shown on the west coast for a few years and the local judges are accustomed to judging them.

I recently had a conversation with a breeder who has been in the fancy for many years. It was this breeder's opinion that at least 75% of the judges could be influenced to award a win to some particular breeder's cats. Influence consisted of compliments, presents, dinners, friendship, cats given outright or at a reduced rate to the judges,

etc. It is a sad state of affairs if the fancy has, in fact, come to this turn of events. But you have to realize that it takes two to tango and it is as much the responsibility of the breeder involved in the intrigue as it is the judge.

Honesty and integrity are characteristics that are developed at an early age. The older a person becomes, the more difficult it is for him to change.

Perhaps potential judging applicants should be more closely screened for honesty and integrity. Fellow breeders should not stand idly by and permit a person of low moral fiber to be accepted to the Judging Program. The higher a person progresses, the more difficult it is to remove him from the list, especially if he has influential associates. Some judges can do outrageous things and never have a complaint brought against them. Other judges can innocently break some minor regulation and be faced with severe discipline. All of this comes under the case of people influencing people.

A judge should be properly trained to tell the difference in quality among the exhibits of the various breeds entered under him in a show and have the integrity to make the awards accordingly. What the breeders must realize is that it is their fancy, it was developed for the benefit of people breeding and showing cats. They can exert a tremendous amount of influence when they choose to do so.

I still think that CFA is one of the most progressive organizations in the fancy. We have many distinctive breeds that have been developed to individual characteristics that make them distinctive and unique. I feel that there are many fine CFA Judges that perform their duties with great conviction and integrity. And I sadly recognize that it is the few exceptions that often stand out and remain important in people's views of the fancy.

Dear Mr. Bandy:

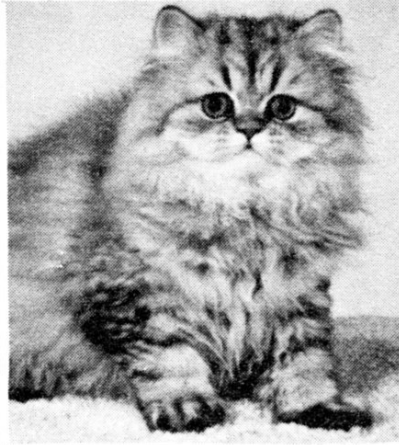

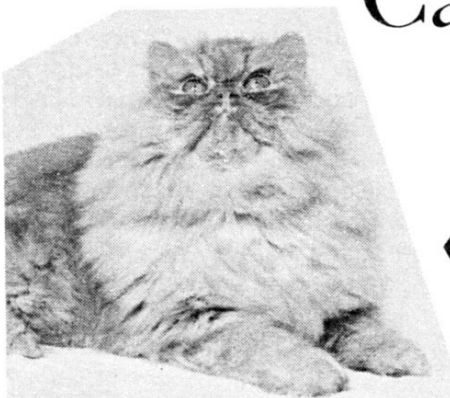

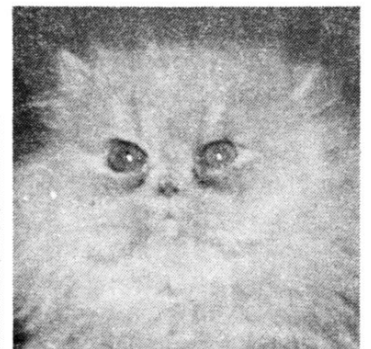

Editor's Note: The following article is Part I of the text of a presentation given by Dr. Lewis at the 1978 Annual Meeting of the Morris Animal Foundation.

METHODS OF FEEDING

The two methods of feeding the cat are self-feeding and hand-feeding. Each has advantages and disadvantages. The major advantage of self-feeding is that it takes the least amount of work, thought and knowledge. All you have to do is leave some food in the bowl

that they are cheaper, may be self-fed and provided good exercise for the teeth and gums. Cats and dogs raised in confinement and fed exclusively canned or soft-moist rations accumulate tartar on the teeth and the gums become inflamed. Dry foods are abrasive enough to prevent the accumulation of tartar. These are the reasons that on an energy basis 60% of the cat food and 80% of the dog foods sold in the United States are in the dry form.

at all times. In addition, if several cats are fed together, it ensures that the meek animal is assured of getting his share and not being crowded out at the dinner table.

The major disadvantage of self-feeding is that some cats may overeat if the food is always available free choice and will get fat. These cats therefore should not be self-fed. Obesity, however, is much less of a problem in cats than in dogs and humans. From 25-30% of the dogs kept as pets are overweight, as compared to 6-12% of the cats. The cat is much better able to control its energy intake on a free choice feeding regime than is the dog, and does not commonly become obese even when quite palatable rations are available free choice. A dry or soft-moist ration must be used for self-feeding.

The second method of feeding is hand-feeding. With this method you must know the correct amount to feed and remember to do it. Frequent feedings throughout the day are alright. In fact nutrients are utilized more efficiently with frequent feedings of small amounts. The kitten from weaning up to 6 months of age and the queen during lactation should be fed at least three times per day. All other cats should be fed at least twice a day. Establish a regular meal routine.

Other advantages and disadvantages of the two different methods of feeding are primarily as a result of the form of the ration used and not the feeding method.

FORMS OF CAT FOOD

There are three forms of cat food available: dry, soft-moist and canned. The way they are sold commercially, and their energy, water, protein and fat content are shown in Table 1. The adult cat needs a minimum of 21% protein and 7-8% fat in the ration dry matter. The kittens fat requirements are the same as that of the adult but the minimum protein needed is 33%. As shown in Table 1 most good quality commercial cat foods, in any of the three forms, will meet the nutritional requirements for both the adult and for the kitten.

The major advantages of dry foods are

Dry rations, however, do have some disadvantages. For most cats, unless they are accustomed to the dry foods, these rations are less palatable than the other forms. Dry foods may be moistened with water or milk if this is preferred by the cat. If this is done, add just enough to moisten it, not make it mushy. Milk may be used if the cat can tolerate it. Many cats past nursing age cannot and it will cause diarrhea. Moistening the dry food, however, prevents its beneficial effect on the teeth and gums and it cannot be self-fed.

Dry foods generally contain less protein than the other ration forms, although most do contain enough for growth and considerably more than that needed by the adult. However, the less protein the ration, the less palatable it is for the cat. As for the quality of the protein in the ration, that depends on the ingredients it contains and not the form it is in. Cereal products generally contain a lower quality protein than animal products but dry and canned foods are both mixtures of animal and cereal products. Protein quality depends on the ingredients the manufacturer uses, not upon the form of the ration.

The heating used in processing dry rations, if in excess, may decrease its digestibility and cause vitamin and fatty acid losses. Whether this is a disadvantage of the dry ration depends on the manufacturer.

During storage fatty acids in a dry ration undergo oxidation or become rancid which destroys their nutritional value. Increased temperature and humidity decreases the time this takes. Whether this is a disadvantage of dry rations again depends on the manufacturer, the amount of fats added to the ration and the processing method used, and the length of storage prior to being consumed. As a general rule, cat food should not be over 6 months old at the time it is fed.

Although a fatty acid deficiency is not common in the cat, if it occurs it causes a dry, lusterless hair coat. It is treated by adding 1 teaspoon of cooking oil or bacon grease to the cats ration each day. Even if

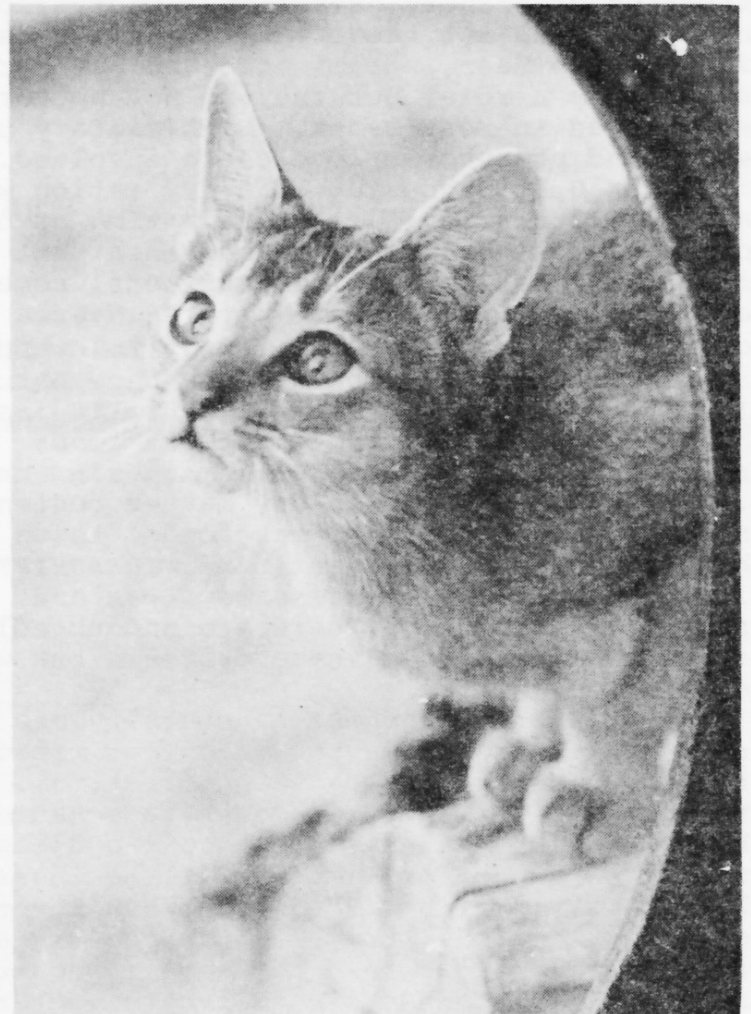

a fatty acid deficiency is not present, these are occasionally added to the cats diet to promote a glossier coat, although there are no controlled studies of the effectiveness of this practice.

UROLITHIASIS: A POSSIBLE DRY FOOD PROBLEM

The major disadvantage of dry rations is that if fed as the sole diet for the cat there appears to be an increased incidence of urolithiasis or urinary stones. Urolithiasis is a very common and troublesome disease of cats. Up to 5% of the cat population develops this disease and, following treatment and removal of the stone, it reoccurs in 70% of these cats.

Urolithiasis results in the passage of bloody urine, frequent voiding of small amounts of urine and partial or complete obstruction of urinary excretion. Castration and obesity do not predispose to this disease. Viruses have been incriminated and may certainly play a role, but they do not appear to be involved in most cases. High dietary magnesium and phosphorus levels are involved. As little as 0.4% magnesium in a dry ration will cause urolithiasis in as short a time as one month. Although this is higher than that present in most commercial cat foods, some have levels of 0.25% which, if fed over a longer period of time, are likely to cause calculi formation. High dietary phosphorus also increases the occurrence of urolithiasis. For these reasons we feel that cat foods should contain less than 0.1% magnesium and 0.7% phosphorus in their dry matter content. In testing 46 commercial cat foods, three that fit these requirements are: *PRESCRIPTION DIET C/D*, *FRISKIES BUFFET BEEF LIVER* and *HEINZ 9 LIVES LIVER*. There are undoubtedly others that also meet these criteria but were not tested.

Dry cat foods generally contain less energy in their dry matter than that present in the dry matter of most canned rations. Therefore, in order for the cat to consume the same amount of energy on the two diets, a greater amount of dry matter will be ingested when the dry ration is fed than when the canned ration is fed. Thus, if both the dry and canned rations contained the same magnesium and phosphorus content in their dry matter, more of these minerals would be ingested and therefore need to be excreted in the urine when the dry ration was being consumed. The increased excretion of these minerals in the urine increases their formation into calculi and therefore increases the incidence of urolithiasis. This appears to be the reason for the higher incidence of urolithiasis reported in cats which are consuming exclusively dry rations as compared to those consuming primarily canned rations.

To prevent urolithiasis in the cat:

1. Feed a canned ration most of the time.
2. Use a ration containing less than 0.1% magnesium and 0.7% phosphorus.
3. Add 1 teaspoon of table salt and $\frac{1}{2}$ tea-

spoon of ammonium chloride to the ration daily. Salt increases water intake and therefore urinary excretion which helps flush out the calculi before they become large enough to obstruct urinary excretion. Ammonium chloride acidifies the urine which increases the solubility of the calculi producing minerals.

4. Always ensure that there is good fresh water available free choice and that the cat is able to urinate as frequently as it desires.

In summary, dry cat foods are cheaper, may be self-fed and help promote healthier gums and teeth. However, they are less palatable for some cats. They contain adequate protein for the cat and protein quality may be equal to that in canned rations. Improper processing and prolonged storage may decrease vitamin and fatty acid content. If fed as the sole diet for the cat, the incidence of urolithiasis may be increased.

SOFT-MOIST RATIONS: PROS AND CONS

The second form of commercial cat food is the soft-moist rations. As shown in Table 1, these rations contain a higher protein, fat and water content than that present in dry rations. The increased level of all three of these makes the soft-moist rations more palatable than dry rations for most cats. In addition, the soft-moist rations, like the dry rations but in contrast to the canned, may be self-fed. However, soft-moist rations don't promote healthier gums and teeth as do dry rations and are generally more expensive. They may contain a high phosphorus content because phosphoric acid is frequently utilized as a preservative. A high dietary phosphorus content predisposes to urolithiasis.

CANNED RATIONS: MORE PALATABLE

The third form of commercial cat food is the canned rations. There are two major types of these: the regular rations which are sold in the large 12-15 oz cans, and the specialty or gourmet rations which are sold in the small 6 oz cans. Canned rations contain about 75% moisture, so when you buy them three-fourths of what you are paying for is water.


All of the different forms of cat food may be sold in a variety of flavors, although the greatest variety offered is in the rations in the small cans. These rations, besides being available in a variety of flavors generally contain much more protein and fat than that present in any of the other rations. Thus these rations are generally by far the most palatable. This does not mean that they are the best nutritionally. In fact, many are not intended to be fed as the sole diet for the cat but instead to be interspersed with other rations and simply add variety and taste appeal to the cat's diet.

The advantages of both types of canned rations is that they are more palatable than the other ration forms. Second, their nutritional value doesn't decrease upon storage as





it may for dry rations. Third, the incidence of urolithiasis appears to be lower in cats fed primarily canned rations.

Canned rations do have several disadvantages. They are more expensive, particularly the specialty rations in the small cans. Three-fourths of what you are paying for in the canned ration is water as compared to only 10% water in the dry ration; therefore you can afford to pay nearly 3-4 times more per pound for the dry ration than for the canned ration and still be receiving the same quantity of nutrients. A second disadvantage of canned rations is that they can't be self-fed. Third, some of the specialty rations are not nutritionally complete and therefore should not make up over one-fourth of the cat's total diet, i.e. they should not be fed any more often than once every four feedings. If the ration is nutritionally complete, the label should say: "complete, perfect, scientific, or balanced." If it doesn't, assume that it is not nutritionally complete and use it only for an occasional meal, not as the major diet.

A fourth disadvantage of the rations in the large cans is that although they contain adequate nutrients for the mature cat for maintenance, they may not contain adequate quantities for lactation or for the kitten for growth. If the label doesn't recommend, or give directions for feeding it to the kitten or lactating cat, assume that it is not adequate for them and use a different ration. A fifth disadvantage of canned rations is that they don't provide exercise for the gums and teeth. If fed as the sole diet, the cat will accumulate tartar on the teeth and have more gum and teeth disease.

FEEDING RECOMMENDATIONS

In summary, there are advantages and disadvantages for each of the three different forms of commercial cat food. My recommendations for feeding the cat are:

1. To assist in decreasing urolithiasis, feed canned rations as the major diet. For expense and nutritional balance, use the larger cans, but, to add variety to the diet, feed one of the small cans of specialty foods once every few days.
2. For convenience, to promote healthier gums and teeth, because many cats like to eat between regular feedings, and because obesity is not a problem for most cats, leave a dry ration out and available free choice for them at all times. Feed only enough canned ration so that on the average they eat about ¼th of their diet as dry food.
3. Switch flavors of rations fed so your cat doesn't become addicted to a single one.

From weaning on, you should feed a variety of commercial foods--variety both in form, type and flavor. If this is done you will have no trouble getting the cat to eat the various forms and types of food or in changing the cats ration as may at times be necessary. Many cats if you allow them to will develop a fixed food preference. This could be quite detrimental to their health.

Although obesity is not a problem for most cats, it certainly is for some. If your cat is one of these, the feeding recommendations given above must be modified. Don't self-feed such cats. Initially decrease the amount fed to about one-half that needed so that the cat will lose weight. Once optimum body weight is reached, feed enough to maintain the cat at this weight. Weigh the cat frequently to ensure that the body weight is being maintained. Obesity decreases the cat's life, enjoyment of life and your enjoyment of the cat as a pet, and predisposes to a number of medical problems.

AMOUNT TO FEED

The amount of the various commercial rations needed for maintenance of an average size 8-lb. cat is given in Table 1. These are intended as guidelines only. There may be significant differences between individual animals. There are not only breed differences, but differences in activity levels which must be considered. Either high or low environmental temperatures will increase the amount of food needed, as will pregnancy, lactation and growth. In addition, even cats that have the same genetic background, general activity and similar environment can have different rates of food utilization. For these reasons the cat should always be fed based on individual requirements and body condition as much as possible. Thus the best guideline as to how much to feed is the amount necessary to maintain a normal body weight and condition. Most cats are able to control their energy intake quite well so that if good quality palatable food is available they will eat the proper amount. Unless your cat is obese, don't restrict it to the amounts of food given in Table 1. Give it all the food it wants.

LYNX POINTS ARE SIAMESE CATS

As one of the pioneers in the development of the Lynx Point in the United States, let me say: "My Lynx Points are Siamese. They always were and they always will be."

To compare the development of the Doberman with that of the Lynx Point is incongruous. Karl F. L. Dobermann planned from the onset to produce a new breed of dog. And he succeeded beautifully. The 'dobie' is one of the most handsome of all dogs.

The Lynx Point breeders, however, had no intention of producing a new breed of cat. The aim was to create a different or new point pattern on an already long established breed--the Siamese--and nothing more. It is obvious the job has been admirably done. The Lynx Point is a strikingly beautiful Siamese.

It has been stated that a Seal Point from two Lynx Point parents can not produce the Lynx Point pattern when bred to another Seal Point. Well, a Lynx Point bred to another Lynx Point does not necessarily produce Lynx Points. (I have positive proof of this in my own cattery.) The basic fact remains, the only difference between a Seal Point and a Lynx Point kitten is absolutely nothing other than a difference in point color.

Working on the premise set forth by Mrs. Boyd, a breeder who has a litter of kittens from any two Lilac Point parents should register any kitten that is any color other than Lilac as an A.O.V. kitten, simply because it is a different color.

To produce the Lynx Point pattern, a Seal Point Siamese was bred to a pure bred classic silver tabby. (And before other breeders begin saying, "Ah Ha! The Lynx Point is not a pure bred Siamese," they had better take a long, hard look at the skeletons in their own closets.) Since the initial matings there has never been any need to breed other than Siamese to Siamese. (A geneticist can tell you how many generations after an outcross a breed becomes pure again; the Lynx Points are many generations removed from their beginnings.)

I am not (and I am sure there are many other Lynx Point breeders who are not) frantically trying to convince everyone to recognize the Lynx Points for what they really are, Siamese, not colorpoints.

It is not those of us who say the Lynx Point is a Siamese that have our heads under the pillow; but rather those who say it is not a Siamese that are the ostriches with their heads buried in the sand.

WILL CFA PERMIT SHOWING OF DECLAWED CATS?

To those of us in the cat fancy who are involved in humane work and for whom the overall welfare of the cat - ANY cat - is the prime motivator, news of the sanctioning by delegates at the recent CFA Annual of the showing of declawed cats is a setback. If the CFA Board of Directors permits this, we would be deprived of a strong argument. No longer will we be able to plead: "If declawing is RIGHT, would cat association rules state that such cats may not be shown?"

The motives behind the original proposal presented at the Annual were no doubt sincere. However, taking entry fees which entitle a cat to compete and receive honors if worthy, and then using the opportunity to lecture the owner of a declawed cat and point out how wrong and cruel they have been is hardly the way to get happy exhibitors.

Surely CFA will not be the one to open the door to the showing of declawed cats, and actually bestow awards on a cat whose owner has had it subjected to this operation. Will there be a decrease in the number of surgeries performed? Making declawed cats eligible for the receipt of the awards is more likely to result in an upsurge. It will seem like an endorsement of the surgery.

Who will remember that the purpose of the proposal was to lure the owners in and deliver a sermon to them? Will the Show Rules, if this rule is adopted, include instructions to clubs on how to admonish such owners? If the only declawed cat in a class is the most deserving, will the judge make the award to the cat owned by the verbally-trounced exhibitor? Of what use will all scolding be then?

This matter, referred "favorably" from the CFA Annual Meeting this year, will be voted upon by the CFA Board in October. 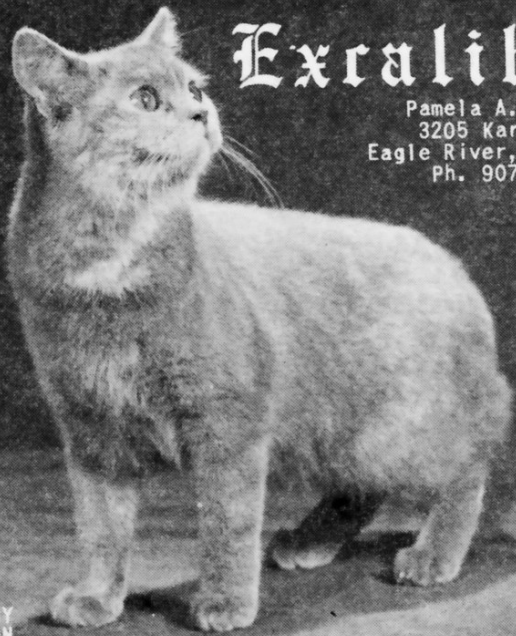

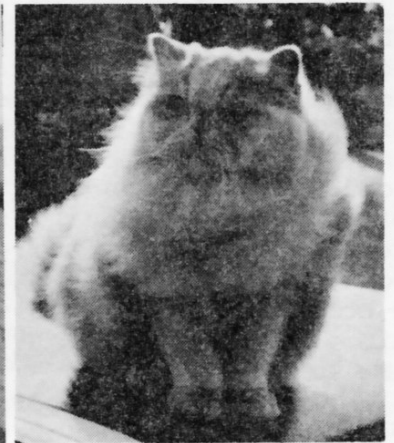
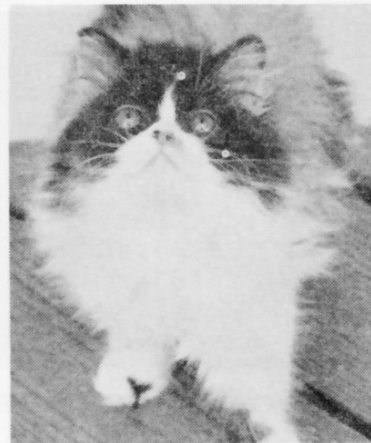

WHY NOT COMMUNICATE & SEND YOUR BEST CATS?

In a letter I received from Alaska, the gentleman complained that he had written to eight other breeders over two months ago, but had not received one single reply! I feel this is very sad and wish that there were some way to correct the situation. Why do people bother to advertise if they are not going to answer the inquiries they receive? Even if they do not have what the person is looking for at the time, they could at least be courteous enough to write and tell him so. This was not the first time I have heard the same complaint.

More than one American breeder has said to me that they do not want to send their show quality cats overseas or to places where the cats will not be shown frequently, due to a lack of shows in those areas. This is understandable. These breeders want to see their cattery names in the show reports. I know that the reason our cattery name does not appear in these reports more often is because we have sent so many of our show cats to foreign countries. However, we feel that, as serious Persian breeders dedicated to the improvement of the breed, we have an obligation to do what we can to help those breeders in other countries whose aim is to improve the type of their Persians by using American stock. It is most gratifying when you receive a letter or telephone call telling you what wonderful offspring the cats you have sent are producing! One of the breeders in Holland to whom I sold three cats recently sent me, along with a note of thanks, the cover of their show catalogue which featured her solid red Persian female who is out of two of the bi-color Persians which I had sent her. This kitten's type would make any Persian breeder proud. Needless to say, it made me feel very good. A breeder from Yugoslavia wrote: "...your cattery is very famous in Europe for the fine quality of your cats ..."

Frankly, I feel that too many breeders are very selfish in refusing to let any of their best cats go, or, if they do let one go, it will only be if they feel it is to their immediate advantage. I would like to see less jealousy and more cooperation amongst breeders.

Today we shipped another cat to Germany. Last month we sent one to Portugal and soon we will be shipping one off to Yugoslavia. I want to thank *CAT WORLD* for making all this possible. It's so exciting to correspond with breeders from different countries. *CAT WORLD*, in my humble opinion, is THE MAGAZINE for the SERIOUS BREEDER because you make it possible for breeders all over the world to communicate!

That minimum fare is for the "red-eye special" which arrives in Seattle at 5 am or so. Adding hotel, transportation to the show hall, and meals makes a show an expensive proposition. (And I haven't added in the entry fees!) In order to show in states other than Washington, one has not only the additional air fares to deal with, but these constantly changing airline schedules complicate matters. Another consideration is the stress factor - air travel for cats is stressful. Alaska is a great place to live, but there are times when I wish we weren't so far away!

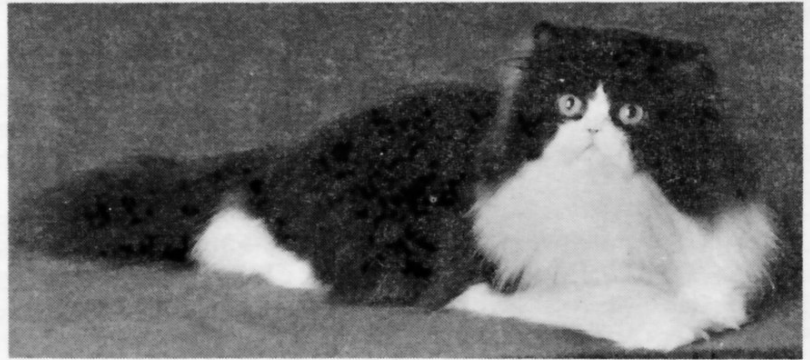

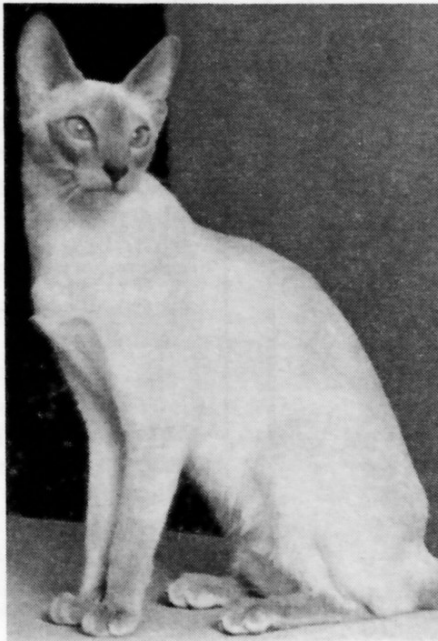

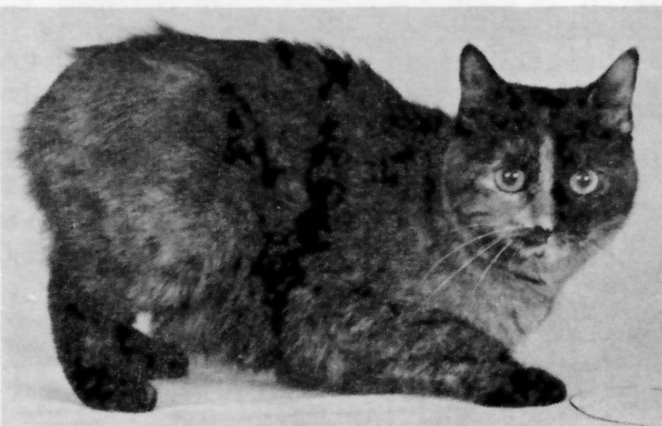

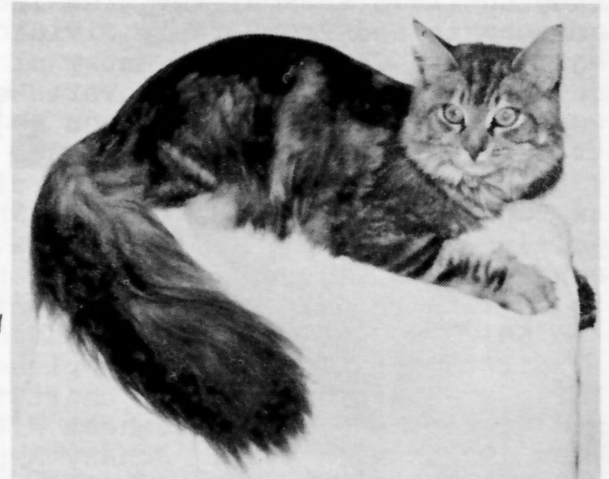

GREAT CATS OF N. AMERICA, 1979



While costs rose and gasoline became more scarce as the months went by, CFA's 1978/'79 show season evidenced a modest increase in the record-breaking number of shows its affiliated clubs had produced the previous year. There were 263 shows held in mainland U.S.A. and Canada during the past season, 12 more than in 1977/'78.

Total number of entries was 45,484: Kittens--11,323; Championship--29,892; Premiers--4,269. In addition, there were over 14,000 household pet entries. The average cat show had the following exhibits present and competing: Kittens--43; Championship--114; Premiership--16.

Empire Cat Club, New York, swept the field! During the 1978 season, the club led both Championship and Premiership Divisions, setting a record Championship entry of 385. The pace-setter could have been overtaken in the Premiership Division this season by Narragansett, however, had this club staged a two-day all-specialty show (as Empire did) rather than two separate events: one-day Shorthair Specialty on Saturday followed by a one-day Longhair Specialty on Sunday. The Premiership entries in Narragansett's events added up to 65!

Citrus Cat Club, Johnny Appleseed and William Penn are back on the chart this season. Citrus had the 4th highest Kitten entry in the 1977 season (89); Johnny Appleseed the 5th highest Championship that season; and William Penn in the 1976 season was 5th in

the Kitten Division (86) and 2nd in Championship (264). Frontier, along with Narragansett, makes its first appearance on these charts this season.

NEW CFA GRAND CHAMPIONS

380 cats won Grand Championships during the 1979 show season. This was a decrease of 230 from 1978, but the feat of these cats is even more notable in that they were required to attain 50 more points than previous Grand Champions. For six seasons, the point requirement was 150; earlier it was 100. Cats begin earning Grand points once they are confirmed Champions. They do so by winning Best Champion of Breed or Division, or Best or 2nd Best Champion in Finals awards. Such points are accrued on the basis of a point for each Champion defeated. The 200 points now needed are harder to get, not only because of the extra 50, but because many owners are so discouraged at the idea of that 'extra mile' that they simply retire their cats from the showbench as soon as they achieve the six winners ribbons required for Championship status so there are less Champions in the shows to defeat and build up the needed point count.

In looking at the show entry statistics for the Championship Division (which includes Open, Champion and Grand Champion classes), the combined entries for the Top 5 1978 shows was 1,650, but the entries for the Top 5 1979 shows totalled 1,219, a decrease of 431 Championship entries. On the other hand, the Kitten entries for the Top 5 shows increased by 17 and the Premiership entries also increased by 28.

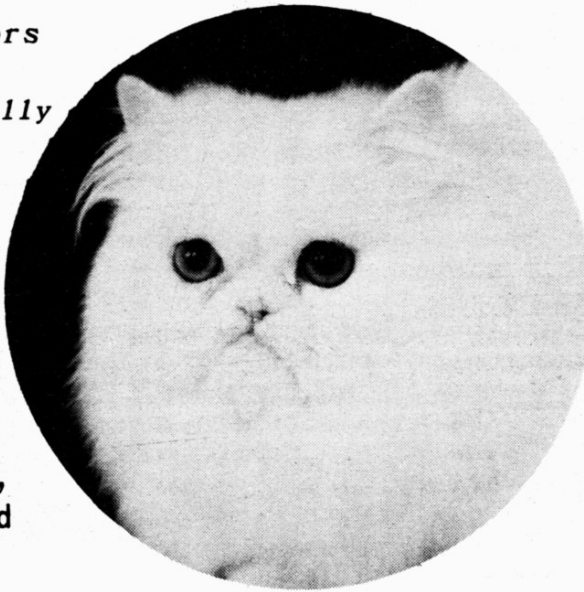
20 breeds are represented on the list of 1979 show season Grand Champions. They are led, as usual, by the Persians (162), Siamese (38) and Burmese (29). The Manx, tied last year with Exotic SH, were far ahead this season with 14 Grands to the Exotic's 7, thus retaining 7th position while the Exotic's dropped to 11th. Similarly, the Rex and Colorpoint SH breeds tied for 8th position in 1977/'78, but this year, with 12 and 4 Grands respectively, the Rex are 9th and the Colorpoints are in a 14th place tie with the Birmanians. Missing from this year's list are the Bombays, Egyptian Maus and Japanese Bobtails. Making their chart debut are the American Wirehair with one Grand and the Scottish Folds with five Grand Championships to show for the breed's first show season.

225 females and 155 males are included on the Grand list so, percentagewise, the balance between the sexes is very close to the

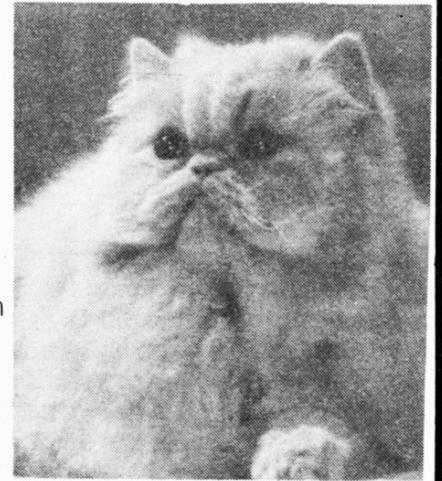

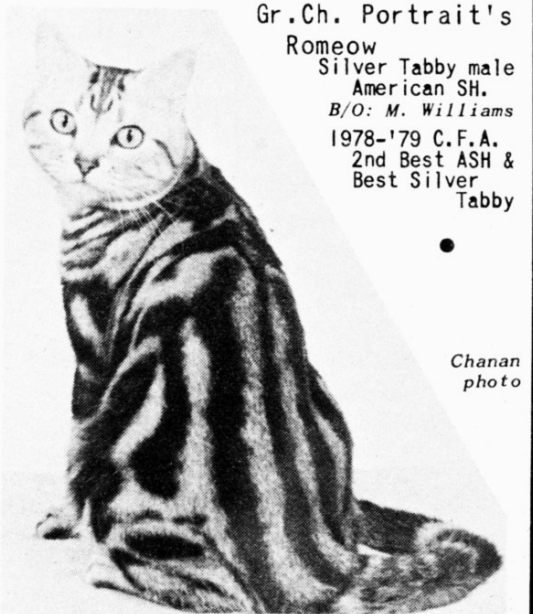

To *MIRIBU'S GREY GHOST* goes the honor of being this year's senior Grand. This Korat female was born May 25, 1971, but did not begin a 'serious' show career until she was six and is now enjoying retirement. Her photo is on page 43. *BLUE TARTAN'S QUEEN OF SCOTS*, Cream Persian female born August 16, 1973, is next oldest Grand Champion of the season.

The record number of Grands fielded by one cattery in one season set by SIN-CHIANG in 1976 with its 9 new Grand Champions still stands.

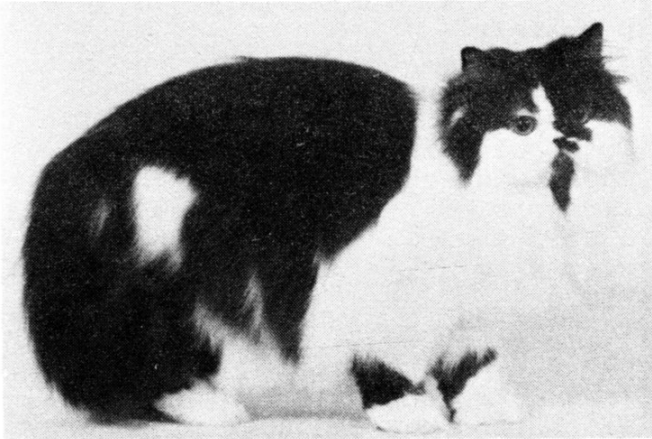

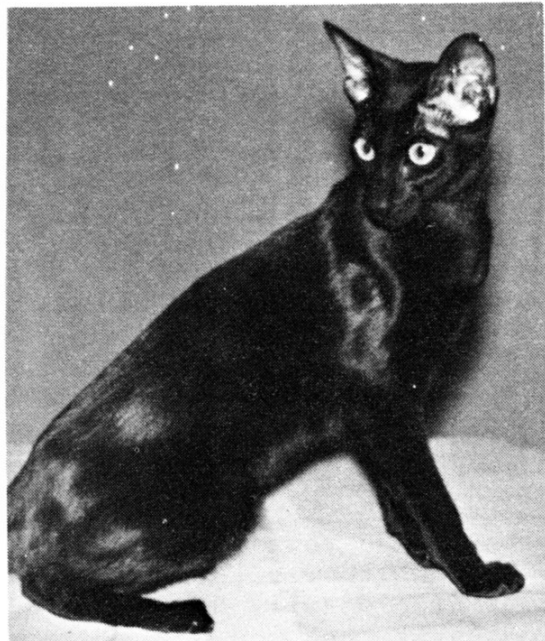

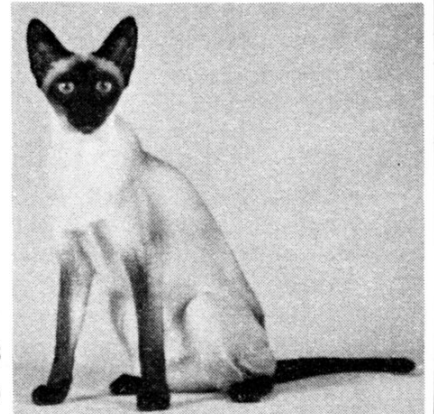

new Grands, 4 Persians and 1 Himalayan. 54 more exhibitors can be proud of the fact that they own more than one cat that became a CFA Grand Champion.

GRAND PREMIERS

92 cats won CFA Grand Premierhips in the 1978/'79 season, an increase of 4 over the last one. CFA did not alter the number of points required to win this title and it remained at 150.

The new Grand Premiers include: 30 Persians, 17 Burmese, 8 Siamese, 7 American Shorthairs, 6 Abyssinians, 6 Russian Blues, 4 Korats, 3 Manx, 3 Rex, 2 Himalayans, 2 Maine Coons, a Birman, Bombay, Scottish Fold and Turkish Angora. 51 are spays, 41 neuters.

Five cats born in the mid to late 1960's are contenders for 'senior citizen' status with the winner being *DEARHEART PRISANNA*, Shaded Silver Persian spay, whose birthdate is July 26, 1966. Runners-up are two Blue-Cream Persians: *PEGS DEN PIXIE*, born August 1, 1968, and *CALIOPE JASMINE*, born seven days later. Youngest of the Grand Premiers is *WALTUR'S HEATHCLIF*, Seal Point Siamese neuter born November 15, 1977, with *LA CHRISMA STEFANI*, Chinchilla Persian spay born August 6, 1977, next in line.

CFA NATIONAL AWARDS

At a show in Colorado Springs, Colorado, in April, 1978, our attention was caught by a striking Black-&-White Persian. She was sitting in her benching cage attired in a paper plate 'Elizabethan collar'. Tucked into the wire of her cage was a notice to inform spectators that this was to keep her bib clean! She was beautifully groomed and obviously a very much loved little cat. Now, just a year later, *GR.CH. CLARE-WAY CHEERS* is AMERICA'S NUMBER ONE CAT! Her proud breeder-owner is Clare Johnson, San Jose, CA. *CHEERS* competed in 43 1978/'79 shows and was named Best Cat In Show 120 times. Her photo is on page 27.

AMERICA'S BEST KITTEN is Tortoiseshell female *GR.CH. KYINA PATIENCE OF OAKWAY*, bred by Anne and Amanda Bright and owned by her breeders and Judy Sturm. She was born July 25, 1978. In 16 shows she was Best Kitten 31 times.

AMERICA'S BEST PREMIER is *GR.CH. & GR.PR TABBYLAND'S TRIxie*, Silver Tabby Persian spay bred by Beverly Witbeck and owned by Sandy and Jim Smith. Born May 18, 1973, *TRIXIE* won her Grand Championship in the 1973/'74 show season. Entered in 42 shows last season, she was named Best Cat In Premiership 84 times. Her photo appears on page 27.

For the third consecutive year, the top position in all three of America's show cat divisions is won by a Persian. CFA's famous Top 20 list consists this year of: 8 Persians, 3 Abyssinians, 2 Burmese, 1 American SH, 2 Exotic SH, a Russian Blue, an Oriental SH and two new breeds on the list--a Scottish Fold and an American Wirehair.

Two of America's Best Kittens from 1977/'78, *JO-LE'S JET SET* and *BRYN MAWR PARTI GIRL* as well as the Best SH Kitten, *SOLETUMI SAMADARI*, fulfilled their early promise and made this year's Top 20 in 2nd, 14th and 3rd positions respectively.

Repeat catteries on the list from both of the past two seasons are: JAMA KATS and JENSEN.

12 of the winners are males, 8 are females. Oldest winner is the American Wirehair, *FESENBRAD'S HOLLYWOOD HOT*, Red Mackerel Tabby male born in July, 1975; youngest is *LOTUS AZIZA*, Sable Burmese female born in February, 1978.

The Top 5 Kittens are all Longhairs: 4 Persians and a Himalayan. Three of them are already Grand Champions. It is interesting to see that the 2nd and 3rd Best Kittens are from the same catteries as the Best and 2nd Best Cats: Clare-Way and Jo-Le. Both the Best SH Kitten and runner-up are Manx.

CFA expanded the Best of Breed or Division Awards for last season to include both Best and 2nd Best Cats. Repeating their 1977/'78 wins are: *HARDENDALE SILVA MORN*, *RAN WIN'S FUJI-SAN*, *OUIJA LEMMINKAINEN* and *SANGPUR JONATHAN DOT DOT*. *KEJO KYRIE* is Best Bombay for the third year in a row.

What does it take to win these high accolades in terms of prowess at shows? Here is a look at some of the award-winners with the number of shows in which they competed during the season and the number of Best Cat In Show Awards each one attained. In addition, of course, they all won many other Top 5 and/or Top 10 Finals:

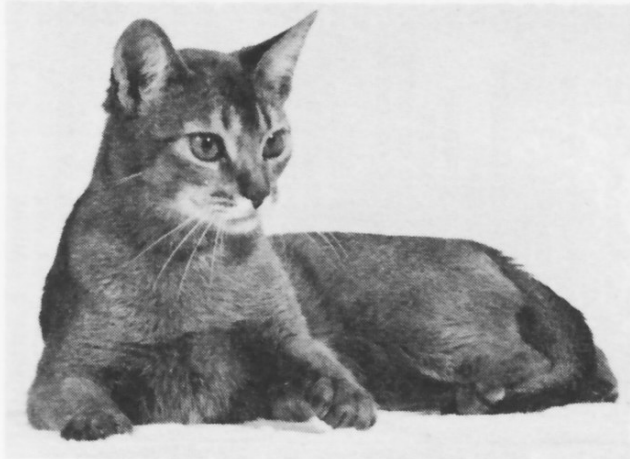

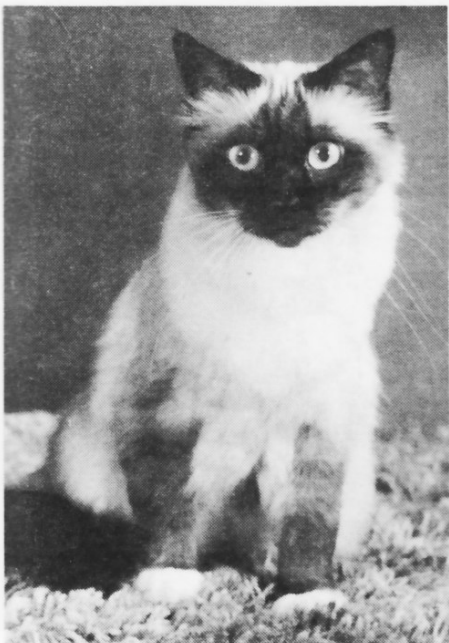

CFA's 1979 ANNUAL

by Edna Field

The 1979 CFA Annual Meeting took place in New Orleans on June 22 and 23. Official Minutes will appear in the next issue of the CFA QUARTERLY and this article is simply from my notes.

Richard Gebhardt, CFA President, opened the meeting by welcoming the delegates who included representatives from Japan, Germany and Belgium, as well as Canada and U.S.A.

The Advertising Committee report was given by Becky Jones who announced that a new program was underway on a limited budget. Will Thompson stated that he had no report to make for the Awards Committee. On behalf of the Budget Committee, Walt Friend said that plans are to keep costs at a no-increase level in areas where this is possible. He suggested holding the line on salaries, budget and advertising; where increases were inevitable, these should be no more than 4%. Continuing for the Clerking Program, he announced that there are over 300 people now working in the program and that Clerking Schools are being held in all seven regions.

Dr. Peltz, reporting for the Robert Winn Foundation & Research Committee, said that the Symposium held prior to the Annual Meeting was a great success and they hope to hold one in conjunction with every Annual. Dr. Margo Mellies spoke on a questionnaire that she had mailed out to breeders concerning Herpes Virus in cats and its association to humans. She said she received 78 responses and that twelve skin lesions were reported to have appeared in humans within two weeks of vaccination of their cats. This worked out to .048 people affected per year which, in her opinion, is non-conclusive and of no merit.

Betty O'Brien announced that two people had resigned from the International Committee -- Mrs. Lottemarie Heuser, Germany, and Mr. Lionel Farminer, Australia. The latter is now living in the United States. Two new appointees to the Committee were announced from Germany and one from Japan. Reports were read from England, Germany and Australia. Mr. Watanabi from Japan read his report first in Japanese and it was then translated by his companion. He thanked CFA for the continued

support and said that the cat fancy in his country is getting stronger and better. Will Thompson gave a report on the Judging Schools recently held in Japan and said that five Trainees had just been promoted to Apprentice LH and two to Apprentice SH to judge in Japan only. Rita Swenson gave a lengthy report on the Judging Program during the past year and announced that the Board has accepted the following people as Trainees:

Shorthair: Larry Adkinson, Robert Fellman, Diane Lemos, Jim Lynch; Longhair: Lou Rose. Lionel Farminer was accepted as Apprentice Judge LH as he has already judged in U.S. as guest judge from Australia.

The following were advanced to Apprentice from Trainee:

SHORTHAIR: Glen Becker, Hazel Lindstrand, Norma Placchi; LONGHAIR: Kim Wheelwright, Roger Lawrence.

To Approval Pending:

SHORTHAIR: Becky Jones, Ricky Carroll; LONGHAIR: Gene Darrah; ALL BREED: John Royal, Jim Thompson.

To Approved:

SHORTHAIR: Sylvia Fitzgerald; Sharon Kapilian, Frank Roderick, Judith Shaw; LONGHAIR: Craig Rothermel; ALL BREED: Pauline Frankenfield, Don Swanson.

Ray Hampson, Miriam Williams and Mary Kate Carroll resigned from the Program.

Vaughn Barber, Public Relations Committee, stated that the tapes made by TV stars on neutering and spaying of cats has been well received by the public. He suggested that more clubs buy them and send to their local TV stations.

Jeanie McPhee said that the new Show Manual is being prepared and requested clubs and individuals to send her any good suggestions for helping to improve shows.

Marna Fogarty talked of the improved layouts she is now receiving for the Year Book. She said that advertisers are realizing the importance of a clear picture and in keeping the ad simple. She suggested that advertisers try to come up with new and different ideas for their ads as the Year Book is valued in all countries and is the showcase for our cats. Some Year Books are still available for 1976, 1977 and 1978.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The next order of business was the presentation of the proposed amendments which were described in detail in the Summer, 1979, CFA QUARTERLY. Those that carried included numbers 2 (Art. IV); 3 (Puerto Rico & U.S. Virgin Islands to Southern Region); 4 (Art. XIII); 9 (Annual delegates to pay \$6 registration fee); 10 (Mississippi to Gulf Shore Region); 19 (Top 10 format permitted at Color or Breed Specialty shows with 100 or more entries); 26 (4th & 5th Best Cats to be named and receive points in Premiership Specialty rings); 30 (a judge to handle only one exhibit at a time); 38 and 39. The matter of CFA obtaining a master liability insurance policy to cover

all clubs holding shows was referred to the Board for discussion. 33, to allow declawed Household Pets to be shown, carried without a 2/3 vote and was referred to the Board.

Resolutions presented from the floor and carried were that Best of Breed and Best of Division awards be announced at the Awards Banquet at the Annual; that Best and 2nd Best of Breed and Division be scored; and that judges may accept other assignments if their judging contracts become mutually abrogated in case of the judge changing place of residence (if Club does not wish to pay for extra air fare) or in the event of a show being cancelled. Travel allowance for judges' mileage is to be raised to 22 cents per mile. Point score of winning cats to be noticed to their owners two weeks before the Annual and not changed.

Defeated amendments included numbers 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 28, 29, 31, 32, 35, 41. A proposal from the floor that a new award of 'Senior Champion' be made to cats winning 100 Grand points was also defeated. Amendments 1, 34 and 42 were withdrawn.

Invitations for the 1982 Annual to be held in Chicago were read from the Mayor, Governor of Illinois and Board of Commerce. A vote was taken and it was unanimously decided

that the 1982 Annual Meeting of CFA be held there on June 18-19. Becky Jones informed the delegates that plans are well underway for the 1980 Annual in Buffalo. Fixed hotel prices are \$36 single, \$44 double.

DIRECTORS AT LARGE

Prior to the presentation of Amendments it had been announced that Joanne Sandefur Cummings had withdrawn her name from the ballot for Directors at Large. Ballots were supplied for the delegates to vote for seven and the result was as follows: Don Williams (339); Fred Jacobberger (239); Jeanie McPhee (237); Rosemonde Peltz (228); Betty O'Brien (185); Barbara St. Georges (157); and Meriellen Dunston (157). These seven were declared as the new Directors at Large for the next two years.

AWARDS BANQUET AND NATIONAL AWARD WINNERS

The Awards Banquet included a local New Orleans Jazz group and, later, a dance band. The awards were presented to the Top 20 cats, Top 5 Kittens, Top 5 Cats in Premiership, following after the awards of Best of Breed or Division. (These are listed in this issue.)

Hospitality suites were offered by several Gulf Shore Region groups and also by the California winners. A very pleasant Annual!#
