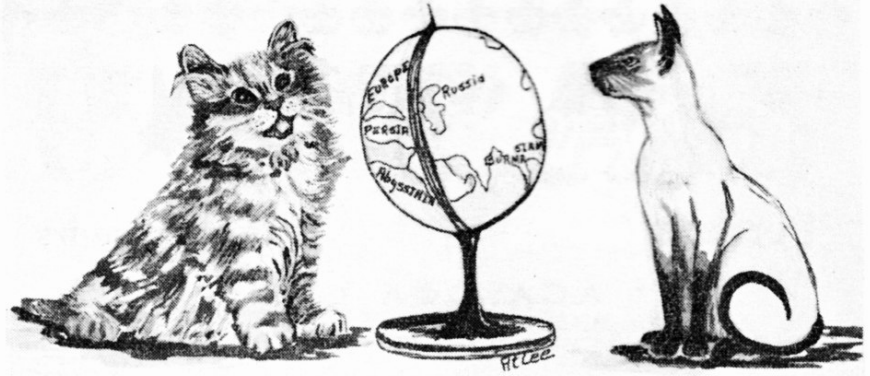
A NEW EDITOR FOR 'CAT WORLD' MAGAZINE

We do appreciate receiving the breed club and other publications. All are carefully read and do a great deal to keep us up-to-date on cat fancy matters.

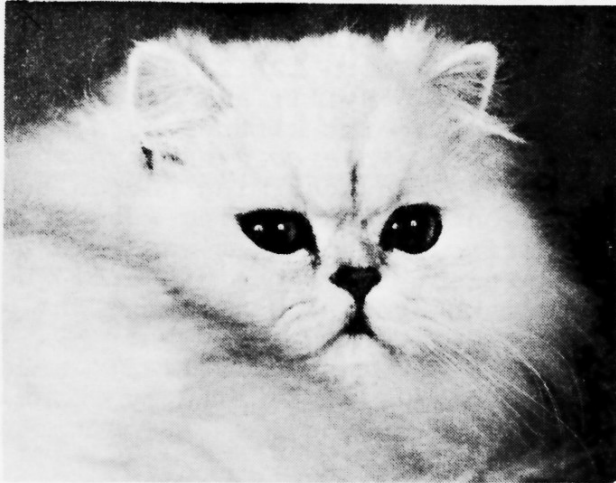

# Interpreting the ... BALINESE STANDARD

by ADELLE HATHAWAY

**GENERAL:** The ideal Balinese is a svelte, dainty cat with long tapering lines, very lithe but strong and muscular. Excellent physical condition. Neither flabby nor boney. Not fat. Eyes clear. Because of the longer fur the Balinese appears to have softer lines and less extreme type than other breeds of cats with similar type.

**HEAD:** Long tapering wedge. Medium size in good proportion to body. The total wedge starts at the nose and flares out in straight lines to the tips of the ears forming a triangle, with no break at the whiskers. No less than the width of an eye between the eyes. When the whiskers and face-hair are smoothed back, the underlying bone structure is apparent. Allowance must be made for jowls in the stud cat.

**SKULL:** Flat. In profile, a long straight line is seen from the top of the head to the tip of the nose. No bulge over the eyes. No dip in nose.

**NOSE:** Long and straight. A continuation of the forehead with no break.

**MUZZLE:** Fine, wedge-shaped.

**CHIN AND JAW:** Medium size. Tip of chin lines up with tip of nose in the same vertical plane. Neither receding nor excessively massive.

**EARS:** Strikingly large, pointed, wide at base, continuing the lines of the wedge.

**EYES:** Almond shaped. Medium size. Neither protruding

nor recessed. Slanted towards the nose in harmony with lines of wedge and ears. Uncrossed.

**BODY:** Medium size. Dainty, long and svelte. A distinctive combination of fine bones and firm muscles. Shoulders and hips continue same sleek lines of tubular body. Hips never wider than shoulders. Abdomen tight.

**NECK:** Long and slender.

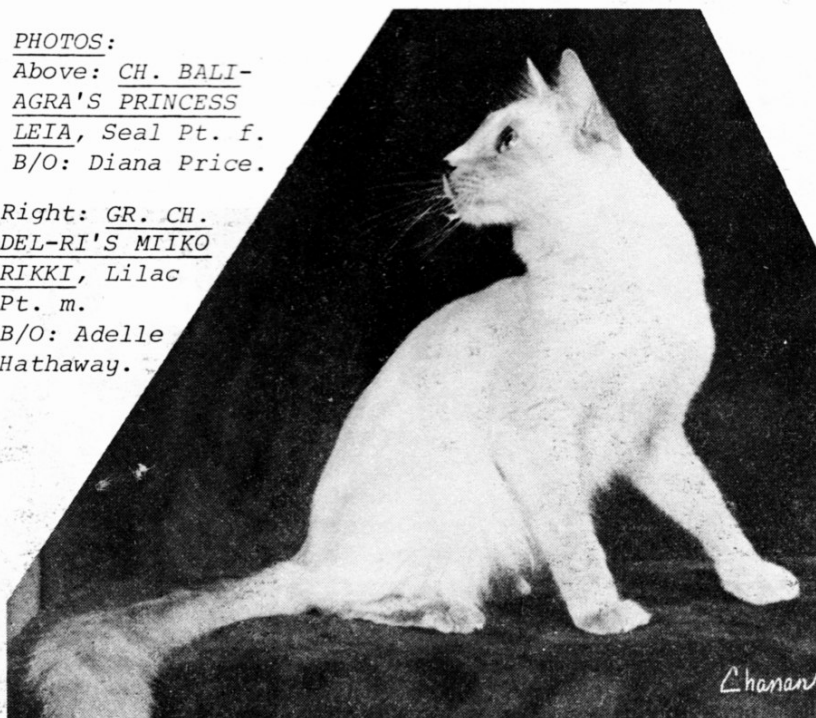
**LEGS:** Long and slim. Hind legs higher than front. In good proportion to body.

**PAWS:** Dainty, small and oval. Toes: five in front and four behind.

**TAIL:** Bone structure long, thin, tapering to a fine point. Tail-hair spreads out like a plume.

**COAT:** Long, fine and silky without downy undercoat.

**COLOR: Body:** Even, with subtle shading when allowed. Allowance should be made for darker color in older cats as Balinese generally darken with age, but there must be definite contrast between body color and points. **Points:** Mask, ears, legs, feet, tail dense and clearly defined. All of the same shade. Mask covers entire face including whisker pads and is connected to ears by tracings. Mask should not extend over top of head. No ticking or white hairs in points.

**PENALIZE:** Lack of pigment in the nose leather and/or paw pads in part or in total; crossed eyes.

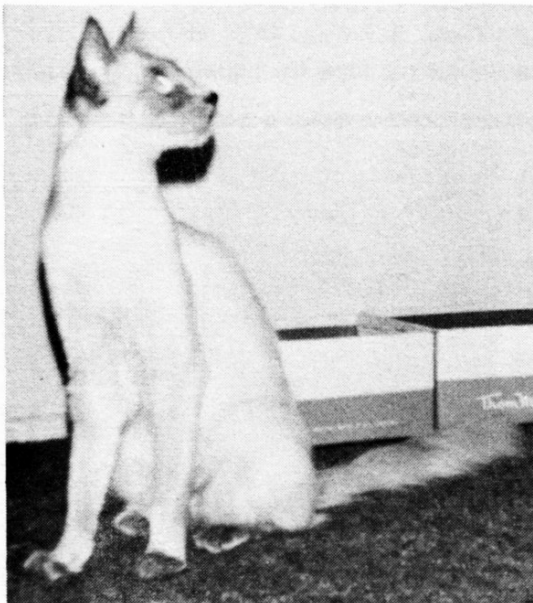
**DISQUALIFY:** Any evidence of illness or poor health. Weak hind legs. Mouth breathing due to nasal obstruction or poor occlusion. Emaciation. Kink in tail. Eyes other than blue. White toes and/or feet. Incorrect number of toes. Definite double coat (i.e. downy undercoat).

(Refer to CFA Show Standards for Color Descriptions)

"What is a Balinese Cat?" This is the question an exhibitor most often hears at a cat show. To answer this, one must also be prepared to answer still more questions: how are they different from the Siamese? Or, up until a few years ago, how are they different from the Himalayan?

Since the Balinese is still a relatively "new breed" but bears the distinctive pattern of the Siamese, called the Himalayan pattern, this can be very confusing to a novice person. I feel the best answer is: "A Balinese is a pure, longhaired Siamese". Based on this description it is not so difficult to imagine a Siamese cat with long fur.

"Long fur" does not mean the cat should have the double coat and length of the Persian or Himalayan; instead it is a single layered, medium length coat, soft and silky in texture, flowing along the lines of the body, culminating in a plumed tail.

## ORIGIN

The origin of the Balinese has been disputed by many. But, in fact, the ancestry on all of the original Balinese has been traced back as far as possible with some of the pedigrees dating back to the early 1900's with nothing but pure Siamese bloodlines. Therefore, it was considered a "mutation" of the Siamese when the original breeders applied to the different associations for registration.

The Balinese breeds true, as the long-hair gene is recessive to the shorthair gene. As far as was able to determine, longhair kittens were "popping" up in purebred Siamese litters for many years with few Siamese breeders willing to admit it. For the most part these kittens were either given away as pets without papers or carefully disposed of. It was a long time before a few brave Siamese breeders, intrigued by the distinctive beauty of the longhaired "variety", decided to breed them and found that the lovely, long silky coats were an asset to the Siamese cat.

Although the records show that a long-haired Siamese cat of pure Siamese ancestry was registered with the Cat Fanciers Federation as early as October 11, 1928, there does not seem to have been a serious effort to promote the breed until the 1940's. So far as we know, the first breeders to recognize the potential of the longhaired Siamese were Marion Dorsey of Rai-mar Cattery in So. California and Helen Smith of Merry Mews Cattery in Seaford, New York. It was Helen Smith who gave the cat the name Balinese, as a means of distinguishing it from the shorthaired Siamese. Some of the original catteries having their own "mutations" were Ruby Greene - Verde, Elcy Crouch - E.L.C. Cats, Diane Murphy - El Gato, Marion Dorsey and Helen Smith.

Gaining Championship recognition from all the associations was a long struggle. First we had C.F.F. Then U.C.F. and N.C.F.A. granted recognition. Soon A.C.A., A.C.F.A. and Crown voted us in. C.F.A. was the only hold-out. Finally in May, 1970 Championship status in C.F.A. was ours, thanks to the tireless efforts of Sylvia Holland.

With the popularity of the breed ever increasing all over the country, the need for some kind of organization became obvious, so "B.B.F.A." came into being. The Balinese Breeders and Fans of America, an independent, unaffiliated club originally started in California, and founded by Sylvia Holland of Hollands Farm Cattery, was intended to unite breeders of the purebred Balinese cat.

Through B.B.F.A. came the present standard for the Balinese. Today's Balinese is a great improvement over the early specimens which resembled the "old type" Siamese with its heavier body structure and rounder head. In order to bring the Balinese breed closer to the Show Standard, all associations allow breeding back to Siamese, the parent breed. This, however, is a time consuming process because the breeding of a Balinese to a Sia-

## BOOK REVIEW

"ENCYCLOPEDIA OF THE CAT" by Angela Sayer. 227 pages. Published 1979 by Octopus Books, Ltd., London. (Now available in U.S. bookstores.)

The 'eighties have only just begun but there is already a book out that could be frontrunner for the title 'cat book of the decade'! Angela Sayer's "Encyclopedia of the Cat" is superb! The author is well-known as a judge and show manager in the U.K. and as a breeder all over the world with her 'Solitaire' prefix. She writes as an expert and her advice can be depended upon. Mrs. Sayer is also a talented photographer and the majority of the beautiful cats which are presented in full color were 'captured' by her camera. There are hundreds of photos---elegantly posed Champions, kittens at play and educational scenes. These are complemented by wonderful watercolor sketches by Barry Jackson and delightful black-&-white drawings by John Lobhan. Their work is used to illustrate cat habits, how things happen or should be done.

Four main sections are included: "Cat in Context"--evolution and history of the cat family; "What is a Cat?"--health, behavior and genetics; "Cat Care"--70 pages of invaluable advice on every aspect of a cat's life; and "Pedigree Cats"--an in-depth look at breeds, shows and standards.

Unique features in the book are the double-page color-coded chart on the diagnosis of various cat diseases; the chart on breeds and their derivations; and the glossary of cat language (excellent for the newcomer to the fancy!).

Michael Findlay, BVMS, MRCVS, well-known for his dedicated work for the Feline Advisory Bureau, England, acted as Veterinary Consultant on the book. This reviewer had the privilege of being U.S. Consultant Editor.

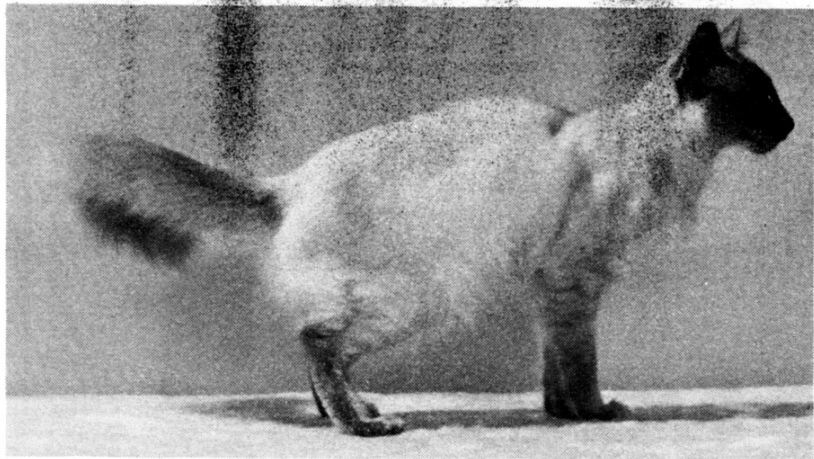

mese produces, almost always, shorthaired kittens (all carrying longhair genes) or variants as they are known. These variants have to be bred back to a Balinese or to each other to produce longhaired kittens. The ratio for longhair kittens when the breeding is between a longhair and a variant is half longhair and half shorthair. When two variants are bred together it is 1 longhair to 3 shorthair.

There is of course no question here of "hybrid" outcrossing, since the Balinese cat is a Siamese cat and since C.F.A. recognizes only four point colors, seal, blue, chocolate and lilac in the Siamese breed at this time, the Balinese would be "hybridizing" by breeding any other color than the four colors accepted by C.F.A. Although some other associations do accept other colors, it is because they are recognized in the Siamese as well. There is still a great deal of controversy on this subject and the mere fact that an association may permit a longhaired cat of obvious hybrid ancestry to be registered as a Balinese does not make it a Balinese since registration rules in no way alter the basic laws of genetics. That is not to say longhaired cats of other point colors, such as red, tortie and lynx are not beautiful cats, they certainly are. But they cannot be called Balinese in C.F.A. unless the rules governing the Siamese are changed to accept those colors.

#### BALINESE STANDARD

The standard for the Balinese varies only slightly in each association with differences mainly in wording. In C.F.A., basically it is the same as the Siamese standard with five points taken from eyes and five taken from eye color to make up the extra ten points needed for coat.

As with most breeds of cats in various parts of the country, the cats differ slightly in that climate conditions in the colder parts of the country result in heavier coats than in warmer all year around climates. Still the basic rule for coat is that it is a single layer coat which is fine, silky and flowing without downy undercoat or double coat which is a disqualification.

Differences in type can only be attributed to breeding practices. The Balinese must look like a Siamese with a long coat. If no Siamese are used in a Balinese breeding program for a number of years the Balinese will not improve in type. Let me add here, that by using mediocre Siamese you will get mediocre Balinese. Top quality Balinese can only be obtained by using top quality Siamese. It has been my practice, over the years, to use the most extreme, healthy Siamese available for breeding in order to obtain the desired head, body and leg length called for in the Standard.

The present C.F.A. Standard describes the Balinese as a svelte, dainty cat with long tapering lines, very lithe but strong and muscular. This parallels the Siamese description with the addition: because of the longer fur the Balinese appears to have softer lines and less extreme type than other breeds of cats with similar type." Here I must point out the word "appears" because one must feel for body type and bone structure on a Balinese as it is not as apparent to the eye as on a Siamese due to the longer fur.

**HEAD:** The head type states: "Long, tapering wedge. Medium size in good proportion to body.", etc. Again following the Siamese Standard but adding: "When the whiskers and face-hair are smoothed back the underlying bone structure is apparent". Since the Balinese have longer face-hair than the Siamese the facial structure must be felt.

**SKULL:** "Flat. In profile, a long straight line is seen from the top of the head to the tip of the nose." The difference in judges preferences seems to play a big part in what is acceptable. As in the Siamese, the Balinese profile comes in two varieties. One is called a two-plane profile, the other a single plane profile. What is desirable of course, is the "flat" profile. What is not acceptable is dips, bumps or breaks in the profile or "Roman nose". Allowance is made for kittens who still have a "growth ridge". That is a ridge above the eyes across the skull, horizontal to the lines of the wedge. No bulge over the eyes.

**NOSE:** The nose description speaks for itself: "Long and straight. A continuation of the forehead with no break."

**MUZZLE:** Muzzle is: "Fine, wedge-shaped." This means refinement. In the past there were what were called "horse heads" in the Siamese. This was a cat with an extremely long, narrow head resulting in a heavy or square looking muzzle, usually with a definite "pinch" or break in the facial structure at the whisker pads.

**CHIN AND JAW:** "Medium size. Tip of chin lines up with tip of nose in the same vertical plane. Neither receding nor excessively massive."

**EARS:** "Strikingly large, pointed, wide at base, continuing the lines of the wedge." Ears can vary greatly in Balinese as well as in Siamese. Some cats have "bat ears," this is an extreme ear set too far out on the sides of

the head, distorting the wedge and giving the face a bat-like appearance. The other undesirable extreme is "donkey ears", that is ears set too high on the head giving a donkey-like appearance. The correct ears are neither too big nor too small, large, but in proper proportion and balance to the total wedge of the head.

**EYES:** "Almond shaped. Medium size.

Neither protruding nor recessed. Slanted towards the nose in harmony with the lines of wedge and ears. *Uncrossed.*" Since five points were taken from eye color and five from eye shape to make up the extra ten points for coat in the Standard, I believe much has been lost on that account. We see too many cats with round, pale colored eyes. The color which appears in the Standard for eye color, says: "Deep vivid blue". It is interesting to note here, that the deepest, most vivid blue eye color in the Balinese today comes from an out-cross that Sylvia Holland did to that famous Siamese line, Fan-Tee-Cee, about nine or ten years ago. This outstanding eye color is quite apparent in most of the cats descending from that Hollands Farm Line, today.

**BODY:** In summing up body description including neck, legs, paws, and tail, I can only say that condition, balance and proportion say the most for the highest quality overall cat.

**COLOR:** The body color in the Balinese usually tends to be lighter than the Siamese. This is possibly because of the longer fur, noting that during hot summer months, or when "out of coat", the Balinese will darken somewhat, only to lighten up again when the "new" coat comes in. I must include a note on Point Color, in particular to Chocolate point. There has been much discussion on "hard to get" good matching Chocolate point coloring. Some say the fault lies in the blood lines, others say the weather and still more say the age of the cat. My own opinion varies between age and lines. I have seen both in my own cats. Kit-

tens who start out at three months with mat-  
ching point color and keep it and some who  
have good mask, ears and hind leg color, but  
it is not until they are two years old or more  
that the front paws and tail match. Also the  
Standard calls for a milk-chocolate color,  
warm in tone. I have yet to see a perfectly  
matched milk-chocolate color in a Siamese cat,  
let alone in a Balinese. I am inclined to  
agree with the last Siamese Breed Council bal-  
lot in C.F.A. in which the breeders wanted to  
make allowances for non-matching point color  
in cats under two years.

#### DISPOSITION

In summing up the Standard for the Balinese cat it seems only appropriate to include a few words on disposition. I would say, about 90% of the Balinese shown in the past and today have wonderfully sweet temperaments. By nature the Balinese is an outgoing, friendly, curious and loving animal. They are very sensitive to their treatment and respond greatly to affection. As with any breed, of course, there are a few exceptions, mainly the adolescent boys who are still trying to assert themselves in their territory.


Balinese breeders have worked very hard over the years to improve type and produce the consistent show winners we have today. Many of the older breeders continued with their breeding programs through many years of small classes and little or no recognition. The long struggle to promote and improve the Balinese is by no means ended. The breed is gaining much popularity in the cat fancy, and each new generation is showing definite progress.

#### EARLY BALINESE GRANDS

In 1975, for the first time in the history of the breed, a Balinese cat earned a C.F.A. Grand Championship. This was Lisa Grime's Blue Point male, *TI-MAU'S SZABO AKI OF DIE LILO*, bred by an early pioneer of the breed, Elaine Young, who deserves much of the credit for today's outstanding cats. Since then, we have had a Blue Point female, *GAYNELL'S TANISHA OF DIE LILO*, bred by Nellie Sparrow and owned by Lisa Grimes, win her Grand title. In 1978, *ELITE SUNUP SKY OF SUNUP*, another Blue Point female bred by Carol Dial and owned by Ila Logan became a Grand.

In 1979, the first two Lilac Point Grand Champions were recorded and both had over 200 points: my own male, *DEL-RI'S MIIKO RIKKI*, and a female, *TI-MAU'S KISS ME KATE OF MIKASO*, bred by Elaine Young and owned by Mike and Kathy Sokolis. *MIIKO RIKKI*, in addition to being the first Lilac Point Grand, was the first one breeder-owned and the first in the CFA Southwest Region. At this writing, another Blue Point male, *SHARAMAR'S HAIRY OF NAGAI-KE*, bred by Sharon Martin and co-owned with Lorene Campbell, has become a C.F.A. Grand Champion.

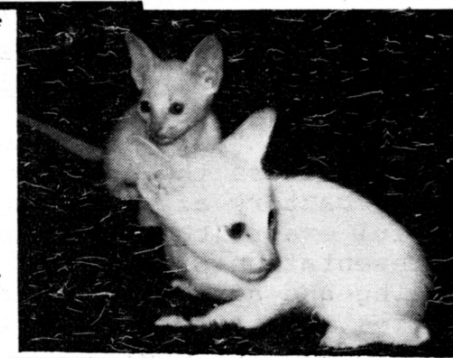

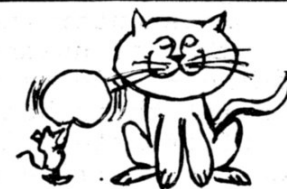

## CFA'S NEUTER & SPAY TAPES

by DAPHNE NEGUS

### CFA'S NEUTER & SPAY EDUCATION PROGRAM

We, the cat fanciers, have the power and the means to bring about reforms in the feline world. Individual experienced breeders, cat clubs and our national governing bodies can set out to see that novice owners are fully informed.

We hear: "We thought we'd get a pair and they could live together.." This is our cue to explain ALL the aspects of having a whole male, the crying loneliness of the stud cat. To be truthful about the keeping of whole females, particularly where their cries for solace are a compounded nuisance to neighbors. To counsel about the expense of showing and advertising the litters which will arrive too often if adequate quarters are not provided to separate the "pair" from too frequent breeding. To stress the need for strict management of all cattery affairs, eternal cleaning, careful exact (tedious) paperwork, truthful representation of quality, contracts in writing and agreed to ahead of time by all parties, strict contracts to neuter/spay those of lesser quality.

The results of breeders selling or giving away stud services to poor quality or unregistered queens are found in growing hordes in pet shops, shelters and pounds. The role of the breeder must be finely performed with nothing less than the finest specimens.

As we enter the new decade of the 1980's the number of unwanted cats, rather than diminishing - despite the efforts of individuals who burst their hearts and pockets to help the unfortunate, educate the ignorant and guide the uncaring owners - is spewn forth like a ravaging tide that eats up the too meagre funds scraped up to stem it. There is little excuse nowadays for any but the most discriminating breeding program. Careful thought is applicable before breeds that generate "leftovers" in the form of armies of non-conforming cats are taken up. Demand for these outwardly different tho carrying the genes animals is too small. In the hands of less than truly dedicated breeders, the "leftovers" join the ranks of those whose life path usually leads to death.

We cat fanciers must be so conscious of every life we cause that we guarantee it the

place in the sun that is not now, but should be the birthright of every cat.

Cats are NOT independent. They now depend upon humans for their very existence in a world where the force of their overbreeding has diminished each chance of a home. Not even a fancy coat saves them. They are now so numerous as they run loose, their neighborhood nuisance value is half that of dogs; the next step is local cat licencing ordinances.

### HOW CAT CLUBS CAN HELP

Cat clubs are well equipped to provide help for the uninformed and misguided and to show how to reverse the suffering built up in previous decades. Many of their members are aware of the true life of cats who don't make it to the show bench because their own work with the rescue groups has taught them that it isn't only the strays that need aid. Educational meetings, lectures and shows all provide demonstrations of careful ownership, with the full cooperation of humane groups, who are only too glad to join with the clubs.

Support for these cooperative efforts is being given by Cat Fanciers Association Inc. which provided the means for Vaughn Barber to commission Richard Negus to write and produce tapes to encourage neutering/spaying and care of cats. These are available now from the CFA Central Office: PO Box 430, Red Bank, NJ 07701. Clubs can purchase them for play on local radio stations and at their shows. Betty White, Bill Macy and Edward Asner recorded them in English. In addition, ready to be taken up by CFA, there are tapes of a Spanish translation by Ed Asner as well as songs bringing the message with well-known tunes.

### CFA PROTECTS CATS

During my years in the cat fancy, CFA Presidents Louise Sample, Lillias Bloem and Richard Gebhardt have preserved a tradition of looking out for the welfare of the cats. Though many clubs advocated the declawing of cats in 1979, the CFA Board refused to sanction this inhumane mutilation proposed for only the UN-registered cats.

Beautiful non-pedigreed or unregistered cats grace many show benches and their owners can learn much about their care. Special Classes for very young (7yrs. and up) owners would be an education in ownership and loving stewardship for youngsters and their parents. Parents often are so discouraging that children everafter refuse to open their hearts and homes to the rewards of cat companionship and teach their children to shun cats.

There are unlimited opportunities for all to apply to the inevitable elevation of the status of the cat. First there must be a taught awareness of the utter dependence of cats upon the actions of us, the fanciers. If we do not expand our activities, how can we compensate cats for giving us the infinite pleasure of their love and the rewards we accept for their perfection of form?###

# WORLD NEWS

## NEW ZEALAND *by JILL DAWSON*

The 8th Annual General Meeting of the New Zealand Cat Fancy (Inc.) was held on 13/14 October, 1979, in Wellington. Delegates representing all Clubs registered with the N.Z. Cat Fancy attended to discuss and vote on all items on the very lengthy agenda. Happily Challenge status was at last granted for some of the Oriental Smoke & Oriental Silver colours - O/Ebony Smoke, O/Blue Smoke, O/Chocolate Smoke, O/Ebony Silver Tabby, O/Blue Silver Tabby & O/Chocolate Silver Tabby. These are the Smoke and Silver varieties that have long fulfilled the latest NZCF requirements for Challenge status, i.e. have been exhibited under their own breed number, in at least three shows, over a period of not less than a year. Another pleasing item, was that in future the National Executive will be able to deal with applications for challenge status, for other colours of Oriental Smokes, Silvers & Pastels, as they fulfill the requirements, (as the Exec. may do for other varieties) instead of only being able to apply to the Annual General Meeting.

The Annual General Meeting also resolved 'that scoring points of CAT WORLD Awards be published in N.Z. Cats when the Top 10 Cats, Kittens, Neuters and Spays are featured'. A show rule requiring an exhibit to have been in the new owners name for at least 21 days prior to exhibition, was finally deleted. Updated copies of the NZCF Constitution, and Standards of Points are to be printed as soon as possible.

The 1978 AGM progressively resolved that the Shorthair Division would become two divisions, Siamese Div. and SH Div. However, after only one year, this new system was deleted in favour of returning to the old method, of all Siamese and all Shorthairs competing in the same Division. So again, in the larger shows, Judges will have the time-consuming job of liaising for their top places.

A new standard of points was adopted for Birman LH Cats. Tabbypoint Siamese disappointingly, still did not receive their recognition, although surprisingly a Breed no. and standard was granted for Blue Abyssinians yet to be seen on NZ show benches. It is now accepted that Red Abyssinians are in fact, pale chocolate, and their breed no. was altered from 23A (now blue) to 23B.

Mr. Peter Hovey, Mrs. Dee Shaw & Mr. Terry Clarke were re-elected unopposed to their respective positions, of National President, National Secretary, & National Treasurer.

The Northern Region of the NZCF recently

held their AGM, and Mrs. M. Breckon was re-elected to represent the Northern Region at the National Executive, along with Mrs. Tui Dixon (Furfun Manx and Excelda LH & Scottish Folds) on her first nomination, to become a member of the National Executive. The Southern Region of the NZCF also recently held their AGM, and Mrs. Ruth MacDonald was re-elected Regional Chairman, with Mrs. Pat Hogan, seeking nomination after a year off, being elected Regional Vice-Chairman. Mrs. MacDonald and Mrs. Hogan will both now attend the National Executive meetings representing the Southern Region.

The NZ Show season, finished November 17, 1979 with Dominion Banner Show, held at Paraparaumu. This popular little show was very well attended and the maximum number of entries was received long before the closing date.

The 1979 New Zealand 'CAT WORLD' Annual Awards are now being compiled and will be forwarded to the USA for publication in the Mar/Apr issue of CAT WORLD Magazine. These results are awaited with great interest - will last years winners or some of them, feature again? What new up and coming stars do we have? Results are confidential until published in CAT WORLD, but our Honorary Scorer, Hurlie Rayner, is working very hard indeed. A point that sometimes seems to be misunderstood, is that cats gain one point for every cat beaten, so, therefore cats featuring in the BIS placings in LARGE shows, obviously gain many more points, than those featuring in the BIS placings in small shows.

Locally, the National Show '80 Organising committee is working very hard to make this show the biggest and best ever. April 27, Sunday, will see the culmination of our hard work. Three C.F.A. Judges, Edna Field, Don Yoder & Terry Hiraoka are traveling all the way to NZ to judge LH, Siamese and Shorthair cats respectively. We look forward to their arrival here in Christchurch tremendously.


In my last "World News" column (CW Sep/Oct '79) I mentioned that new clubs set up within the past year included the Oriental SH & Rex Cat Club, and already I have had enquiries for membership of this club, from all around the world. As a young club, starting out with the betterment of these two varieties in mind, this overseas interest has been a great incentive.

# Pros & Cons Of Extreme Cats

by KIM EVERETT

In an Opinion Poll conducted by CAT WORLD magazine, one reader asked: "What are the pros and cons of extreme cats and do the standards really allow for some of the 'extreme' ugly cats we are seeing now?"

First off, the word 'extreme' is often misinterpreted both by exhibitors and judges. Using the term extreme has been done over the years to indicate that a cat comes close to the standard by being a 'stand out', or as 'too extreme' and deviating from the standard. It is a term we should try to avoid in judging if we mean that the cat is exceptional, but this will take some adjustment. I have been an offender in using this term but have always used it in the complimentary sense. Undue criticism is kept to myself: the award tells the story.

Cats can definitely be 'too' extreme and not suited for the show ring, but may make a valuable contribution as a sire or dam of top quality kittens. Any breed can go too far and today we have class after class of superior quality cats.

I first started with Siamese (Seals and Chocolates), but when the look became coarse and anything but a look of beauty and intelligence, I went to another breed: the Abyssinian. Siamese have regained the beauty which I feel fits the standard and the bumps on the back of the head, slit eyes, coffin heads, deformed mouths, sunk-in eyes, and overly-thin, unmuscled bodies with protruding shoulder blades are all but gone. Credit goes to the Siamese breeders' hard work.

In Persians there are many looks or expressions which can be identified with certain lines. Where a cat to one judge may appear 'too extreme', to another it may be a cat of extreme beauty. Whether it be a SH or LH, we all have a point where we feel a line should be drawn and this varies on a slide rule in opinion. The bone structure is vitally important in judging any cat as is the muscle structure. Eye shape and placement can determine the proper balance of the head in relation to the standard. So much controversy over the bite in the Persian has continued to be a matter of discussion - what truly is a malocclusion? Again, every judge interprets a fault differently: if all judges felt the same in their interpretation of a standard, we could all be replaced by robots.

I feel crooked jaws and teeth that protrude to any noticeable degree is serious. I

am not one to pry cats' mouths open and check the dental situation as you are just asking for trouble and, besides, you could ruin a cat from further showing. If a cat's mouth and jaw are straight, it has a strong chin, well balanced in harmony with the rest of the head, and the lips cover the teeth, this is, in my opinion, good enough. A weak chin in a Persian is serious and I am not in favor of a breeding practise which ensures bite but loses chin. A bite that is just a bit off is common in leading winners in Persians--very few can boast of perfect occlusions. The main thing is to watch that a small imperfection in bite does not result in extreme over-extensions in the lower teeth. Obviously we don't want to get the nose so short that only two holes are left where a nose should be.

The key to any breeding program and judging is to search out 'all over balance'. No single feature of any cat can hold it together, nor should a cat be over-faulted because of one feature that is less than perfect and noted in the standard as only a fault--a tail that is too long on a Persian for example--but the rest of the cat is lovely should not kill its chances to win. Ears a little high, the same thing should apply. Pet quirks of judges should be avoided so that over-emphasis of what the standard really says is not abused. If it says '3 off maximum' for ears, you cannot ethically take 10 off.

I have mostly discussed head extremes but extremes also occur in other areas such as color. For example: many reds (persians) with barring go up as Best Cat, while a blue or cream would not get to second base--what's good for the goose is not always the same for the gander! A white with poor eye color goes Best Cat, a Black with nothing but the deepest copper would not go up. All the same standard, but allowances given in some cases and not in others. Avoiding these pitfalls is almost impossible but must be strived for. Judges are human and have personal feelings about each cat subconsciously.

All cats have the right to win, whether they be one in a show or many--if a cat conforms to the standard written for it, it should be considered with the others.

Each breed should be judged on overall balance, grooming, condition and showmanship which is becoming more important as the quality continues to get so close to perfection. You can have extremes in temperament, too: over-aggressive (hostile) and over-shy.

All breeds should be amenable to handling. Temperament can be bred in or out. What is more beautiful than a cat that handles well? A delight to the judge, the owner and the spectators - and great advertising for the breed.

Extremes either way have really become outdated, except in a breeding program where with close observation they can be used to lend balance to a line. The judges, even

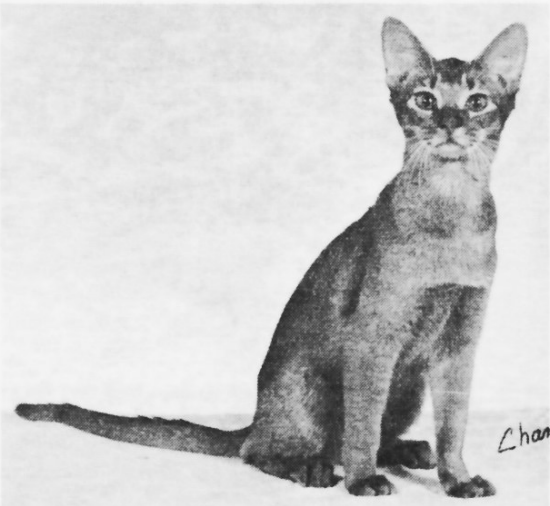

some of us 'dyed-in-the-wool' hard line extreme judges, are not the 'headhunters' we once were. The total picture of a winner is the 'complete cat'.

There will come a day, and very soon I feel, when our present standards will all have to be adjusted to include refined areas such as descriptions for males and females, and faults such as cow-hockedness, bowed legs, splayed feet, etc. Some standards already are including this and I am most pleased. I am not inferring that the cat fancy should become a duplicate of the dog fancy, but upgrading to the highest degree of professionalism is a must. We want to keep the 'fun' in the fancy, fair competition and judging, and good sportsmanship, and the rewards the exhibitors get from showing their own animals. #

judge to weigh-in the cats as they take them out of their cages before they even consider the Standard of Perfection? Perhaps each club could conduct a weighing-in ceremony similar to the ones held for jockeys at race-tracks before cats are admitted to the show-hall.

There is an Oriental breed club based in the Northeast U.S.A. It would be most helpful to breeders in other areas to have a second CFA-affiliated Oriental SH club which would follow the example of many breed clubs and conduct its affairs entirely by mail. This practice gives all members, wherever they reside, the chance to vote on the club's stand on matters affecting the breed. It would help prevent this type of controversy appearing on the important CFA Breed Council Questionnaire and catching breeders by surprise with no time to air their views before deadline for return of the survey.

# Feline Acne and Stud Tail

Feline acne and stud tail are two related conditions of the cat which, although not serious have received scant attention in the veterinary literature (Austin 1975, Muller and Kirk 1976, Wilkinson 1966). They are probably more common than is generally appreciated as most cases are mild and pass unnoticed. More severe cases, however, may respond slowly to treatment and seriously detract from the appearance of the cat. Two main types of gland are found in dermis or skin of the cat - the sweat glands and the sebaceous glands.

Contrary to popular belief the sweat glands are found over virtually the whole body surface of the cat (Strickland and Calhoun, 1963) although most of these are small and non-functional. Only the glands of the foot pads produce sweat and wet, sweaty paw marks will often be noticed on the consulting table when a cat is under the stress of a visit to the veterinary surgeon. Most of the sebaceous glands are associated with hair follicles and produce an oily secretion, sebum, which waterproofs the hairs and maintains the suppleness of the skin. In addition, a collection of much larger sebaceous glands are found on the chin, the lips, the sparsely haired temporal area (between the eye and ear,) and the dorsal (top) surface of the base of the tail. The collection of glands under the chin is sometimes referred to as the submental organ and the glands around the base of the tail are known as the supracaudal organ.

The oily secretion of these larger sebaceous glands appears to have a role in territorial marking (Prescott, 1974) and cats will repeatedly rub their chin, lips, temporal area and base of the tail over certain objects. In time the secretions build up on favourite marking objects and may be seen as black, greasy patches. Cat owners may have noticed that they are assiduously "marked" by their pets on returning home. Cats will also often mark certain objects at feeding time. The reason for this behaviour is not known.

Overactivity of the submental and supracaudal organs is relatively common finding and is seen as excessive greasiness of the overlying fur and skin. This is particularly noticeable in the supracaudal region of white cats and appears as a yellow, greasy discolour-

ation. There may also be flecks of black greasy material on the chin which may be mistaken for flea dirt.

This overactivity of the sebaceous glands predisposes to feline acne and stud tail which are seen in varying grades of severity. In mild cases the associated hair follicles become plugged with the black sebaceous material forming comedones. This is similar to acne in man. Secondary infection may result leading to folliculitis (inflammation of the hair follicles) and formation of papules and pustules from which beads of pus may be expressed. In severe cases of multiples folliculitis pyoderma develops with a mass of discharging tract or sinuses. Cats with mild feline acne or stud tail show no associated clinical signs but in severe cases there may be severe inflammation and irritation of the overlying skin. The point of the chin may become grossly swollen and there may be enlargement of the draining lymph nodes of the head and neck.

Feline acne is seen in cats of all ages and sexes. It has been suggested that activity of the supracaudal organ depends on testosterone (the male hormone) (Doering, 1978). Stud tail is most common in stud toms, but, despite its name, is also seen in neutered toms and female cats.

Treatment of cases of feline acne and stud tail involves removal of excess sebum and hence prevention of comedone formation and secondary infection. An antibacterial, surgical scrub such as chlorhexidine can be used for this purpose two or three times daily. In mild cases no further treatment is necessary but in cases showing extensive secondary infection antibiotic therapy, preferably selected on the basis of sensitivity tests, will be required. Topical preparations are of very limited value since they are soon removed by the patient and antibiotics should be given either orally or by injection.

Most cases respond satisfactorily but some cases with serious secondary infection may require prolonged treatment. There may be recurrence and in some cases the only method of controlling the excessive sebum secretion is to continue daily cleansing indefinitely.

## MALAYAN CATS - A BATTLE TO BE FOUGHT & WON!

At the Cat Fanciers' Association's quarterly meeting in Chicago, October 20-22, 1979, the Board of Directors voted on - and passed - an issue to rename non-sable Burmese (i.e. champagne, blue and platinum) "Malayans". Presumably, it will go into effect May, 1980.

It appears a group of breeders could wait no longer to have champagne, blue and platinum compete with sables for championships and have resorted to calling these lovely cats by another name to achieve CFA titles. As many breeders know, CFA presently grants championships to only the sable color.

A number of so-called reasons or justifications are being cited by this group. Among them are: (1) Blue, champagne and platinum are still Burmese but a rose by any other name will still smell as sweet. (2) Sable-only breeders do not want the additional competition in shows (even though they admit non-sables are still Burmese). (3) The number of serious breeders (of non-sables) could "double or triple." (4) CFA will take another 10 to 20 years to give non-sables full status under the breed name of Burmese. (5) "They" want CFA championships and grands on their non-sables.

My husband, Paul, and I (and many other Burmese breeders) adamantly oppose this plot. Burmese is a breed - not a color - and we firmly believe it is genetically possible for these three colors to have evolved from the early Burmese breedings from Wong Mau and her chosen mates.

We were aware (about two years ago) there was a campaign to attain full recognition for non-sables but did not dream someone would resort to calling champagne, blue and platinum other than Burmese - which is what they are! Because a rose is yellow doesn't make it a daffodil. Those who are afraid of the additional competition are not true cat fanciers nor will those people do the breed justice in the long run.

All of us working with the colors are striving for full recognition with all associations but we will not stoop to deceit to achieve that end. Are we going to deny the Burmese heritage? As a friend points out, we breed generations of Burmese to generations of Burmese (sable carrying recessive color genes) and we get Malayan?! Our non-sables descend from the same accepted foundation as sables.

Sable is indeed a very beautiful color (note, please, I said "color"). Without sables we would not have blues, champagnes and platinum which are also very beautiful colors.

But please don't confuse color with breed.

Many of our top-winning sables (past and present) produced (and continue to do so) non-sable progeny. Out of the past, one cat comes to mind: *GRAND CHAMPION MIZPAH'S FERDINAND OF BRIERWOOD* who was Best Cat in Show at least 119 times during his career and All-American Cat of the Year in 1967. *FERDINAND* carried the champagne gene.

There are numerous questions I have to raise. Was this issue presented to CFA Breed Council members for vote or (at least) consideration? Not to my knowledge and I am a Breed Council member. Some years down the road, will CFA rescind the registrations - as Burmese - to our champagnes, blues and platinum if we refuse to re-register them as Malayan? Can it legally do so?

Are we going to have champagne, blue, platinum and sable Burmese in all associations except CFA and in CFA have Burmese (only acceptable color will be sable) and three colors of Malayans? What will we call sable kittens whose parents are non-sable? What about non-sable kittens who are the product of sable-to-sable breedings? And what will we tag those kittens should there be one of each of the four colors in the same litter? Will all of them be hybrids? Some of them? Hybrid what? Are sables from non-sable parents going to be classified as AOV in show rings? Will we have champagne, blue and platinum in the Malayan class and champagne, blue and platinum AOV Burmese? The questions are endless and implications complex.

The answer to full acceptance of non-sable Burmese definitely lies in education. Whether you wish to refer to these colors as dilutes or recessives is irrelevant at this point. The fact is: the colors in Burmese do exist.

We're not trying to force the staunch sable-only breeders to use our colors in their breeding programs (we couldn't anyway). They certainly have the freedom of choice as we do.

If someone were to initiate a scheme to rename sable Burmese, we would oppose that with equal vigor - in the defense of the breed.

It is erroneously thought that tragedy befalls someone else. If color makes such a difference as to make a new breed, then let's get new names for all the "breeds" of Persians! What about Siamese, Chinchilla, Maine Coon, Japanese Bobtail, Egyptian Mau, Abyssinian, American Shorthair, Rex? The list is just about as long as the number of different breeds we have. Is it not apparent just how ludicrous "Malayan" really is?

If it takes a lifetime, there is just no way we will ever register, re-register or even refer to our champagnes, blues and platinum (or sables, for that matter) as anything other than what they are. And that, cat fanciers, is Burmese.

This is a battle which must be fought and won. Remember - breeders of what-ever



breed - it COULD happen to YOU!

### KEEP THE ORIENTAL REFINED & SVELTE

When I received my Breed Ballot from CFA and found the question "should miniature be capitalized in the Standard under the disqualify section", I sent letters to all Breed Council members and interested parties about the use of the word and its meanings. The response has been overwhelming from such a small Council and I am delighted to see that Oriental breeders are really thinking about their Standard. I suggested the word "dwarfism" as a replacement for "miniature" because I was and am afraid that "miniature", while really and truly meaning an abnormally small cat, will be used as a catch-all for any small or dainty cat, while "dwarfism" at least had a connotation of something abnormal. After gathering together the letters that I received I am writing to express a "refined" opinion (perfected- as per Webster's dictionary). My own personal desire is to see the Oriental Standard be changed to coincide exactly with that of the Siamese. One of the things I was told was that a judge was being criticized for preferring a "dainty" female to a larger male. Once again the section on "miniature" was being used as reference - wrongfully in my mind. While "dainty" is not required of an Oriental - nowhere in the Standard does it say that an Oriental may not be dainty. The Standard also says that males may be "somewhat" larger than females - somewhat not greatly. There really is no size specified for an Oriental - just that males may be somewhat larger than females and miniaturization is to be disqualified.

The Standard still says svelte. We would not use that word to describe a large person neither do I think it fits a large cat. I have heard from several breeders that they are afraid that their small females will be disqualified! I think this is certainly a misuse of the word "miniature". I have received several suggestions that it be replaced by "stunted growth". The broadest one being that perhaps there ought to be a "general" disqualify class for all breeds. Many list the same faults to be disqualified. Mouth-breathing due to mal-occlusion is one of them. Perhaps "stunted growth" or dwarfism could be another and we could delete them from the individual Standard and thereby remove disqualifications for health problems from the whim of the Breed Council. I could go even farther and suggest that "well-balanced" be a required characteristic of all breeds, but the Oriental Shorthair in particular. I deliberately took a photo of a small Oriental female (6 months) against a plain unmarked background so that her size could not be determined. I then circulated the photo amongst several people and asked them what they thought of her. The response was good. I then asked if they would like to tell me how large she was. No one

could, and yet they had all previously agreed that she was a good cat! So proportions are important. I would enjoy hearing comments from more breeders about the size of Orientals. We certainly are not alone in this controversy. Manx breeders as well are having a similar discussion of their breed. In the meantime, I urge all to consider what it is in their Standard that makes the essence of the cat and those things above all else, the positive qualities, should be stressed.

### NEW IN THE JUDGING RING: A WEIGHT SCALE

My husband and I were early fanciers of the Oriental Shorthair. We saw these wonderful cats in England in 1968 and, in 1971, brought *SOLITAIRE TONGAN PRINCESS*, bred by Mrs. Angela Sayer, to U.S.A. She was a cat of medium-size, fine-boned, dainty and svelte, a typical representative of the best of English Foreign Shorthairs. Later, *TONGAN PRINCESS* went to live on the East Coast and became a founding queen in the American Oriental SH breeding program.

Three years ago, we imported a Lavender OSH female from Holland, *CARBEN CUBA'S IRIOSA OF BODANTE*. She was very similar in size and appearance to our first queen. The first season that CFA offered Championship classes for Orientals, *IRIOSA* won her Grand Championship and Best National Solid Color Oriental. This dainty, exquisite female has been Best In Show many times.


The breed ballot that Mrs. Balavage refers to above states: "*Many OSH breeders have been concerned about the small size of certain OSH's which have been given final awards. The OSH standard is quite specific on that issue and has deliberately stated that miniaturization must be disqualified. The undersized cat was to be disallowed from the OSH breed in order to insure good health and beauty.*" I am not aware who composed this verbiage but the first sentence tends to indicate that owners of large losing competitors do not appreciate refinement but that CFA judges, to their credit, can be relied upon to recognize quality when it appears in their judging rings.

The bone of contention is: dainty, well-balanced, svelte cats vs. oversized cats. Would the advocates of the large cats have us believe that the word "large" is synonymous with "health"? Is an exquisite, well-balanced Arabian horse less healthy than a huge cart-horse?

I looked up definitions of the word 'miniature' in the Britannica World Language Dictionary and found: "A portrayal of anything on a small scale, hence reduced dimensions or extent." "Much smaller than reality --on a very small scale." This conjures up a picture of an adult cat who is about the size of an average 3-month old kitten, certainly not a beautiful, healthy, full-grown female cat of 5 to 7 lbs. Precisely what weight do the proponents of the word 'miniature' have in mind for the Oriental? Do they want the
