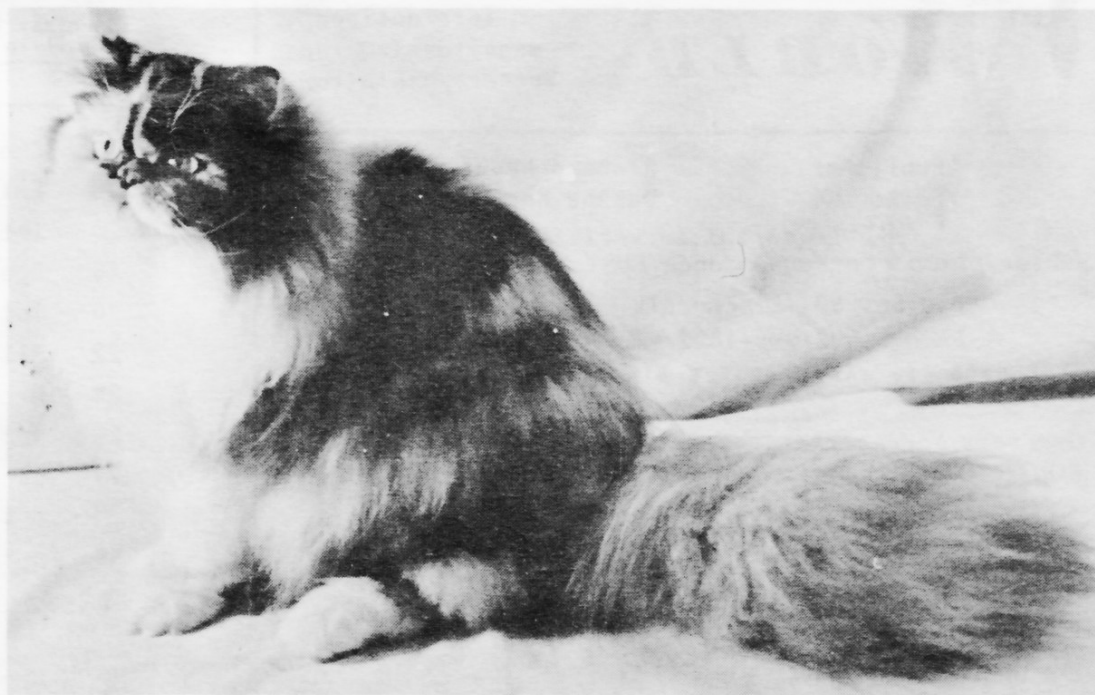

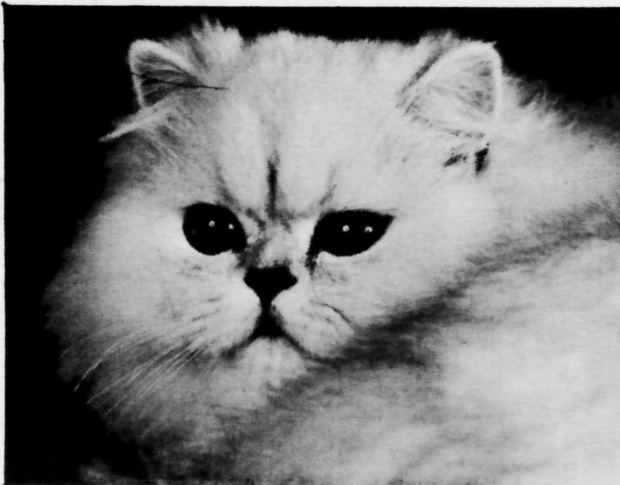

Interpreting the ... M A N X STANDARD

by BARBARA ST. GEORGES

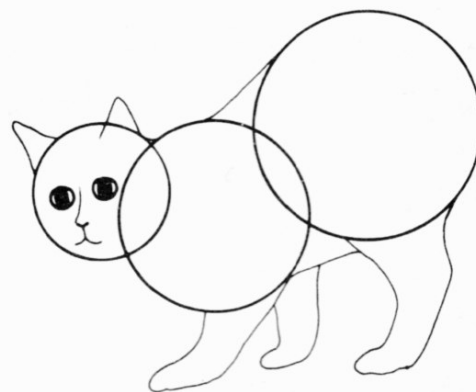
It has been twenty years since I began breeding Manx Cats - and it was five years before that when I became aware of them in the show ring and started to love and admire them - twenty-five years in all. And the same strong, robust, rounded looking cat that I first saw is basically the one that exists today. The CFA Standard has been changed several times over the years, but I don't feel the changes so much affected the Manx Cat as did the terminology or language of the Standard. True, 1979's Manx is not as large or rawboned as the Manx in 1954 was, but "the look of a bear", or, "round as a ball" appearance is still there.

Trying to think of the proper words to describe any breed is difficult at best; but trying to think of words to describe the Manx has taken years, for it is such a unique cat. No tail - or only a slight rise - great depth at flank - high hindquarters - and a double coat are just a few of the unusual qualities known to this breed. Many famous Manx breeders have contributed long hours and helpful ideas over the years; more recently through the CFA Manx Breed Council; but, prior to this, by sending in Standard changes to the CFA Board of Directors. It has been through their efforts and constant up-dating of the wording that we have the excellent Standard with which we are working today. I really feel the refinement that has come to the Manx Cat over the years is due mainly to this better phraseology. For isn't the Standard really a breeder's guide on how to breed as near perfect a specimen as possible? The Standard is written for the perfect cat in all breeds.

Let's look at the CFA Manx Standard. As you can see in the GENERAL DESCRIPTION, and by Drawing 1, the key word in describing the Manx is ROUND, or ROUNDNESS.

50 Points - one half of the total allotted - goes to the HEAD and the BODY. And look at the number of times the word ROUND is used! In fact, this is the key word in the entire Standard. For if the Manx has a long body, long head, long neck, or is too fine boned it cannot appear round.

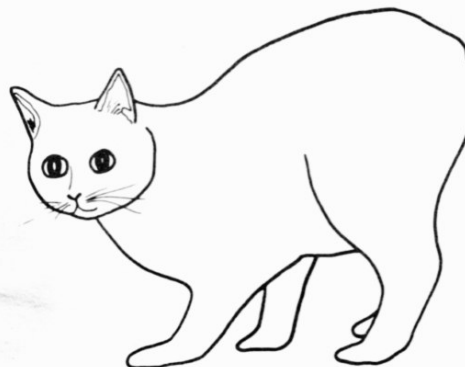

Therefore, it cannot receive enough points to conform to the Standard and should not receive Winners' ribbons because too great a number of points has been lost with these faults.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

I think the GENERAL DESCRIPTION is almost perfect. Even the most uninformed cat person should, on reading this description, know exactly what a Manx looks like. Besides picturing a rounded cat, he should also be easily able to picture a medium size, sturdy, powerful cat, firm and muscular, as so well described in both the GENERAL and BODY sections. (See Drawing 2.)

HEAD

The Manx head is very round and jowly and there is a gentle nose dip. The ears are medium in size in proportion to the head, widely spaced, giving a "cradle" appearance known only to the Manx. The EYES are large, round and full.

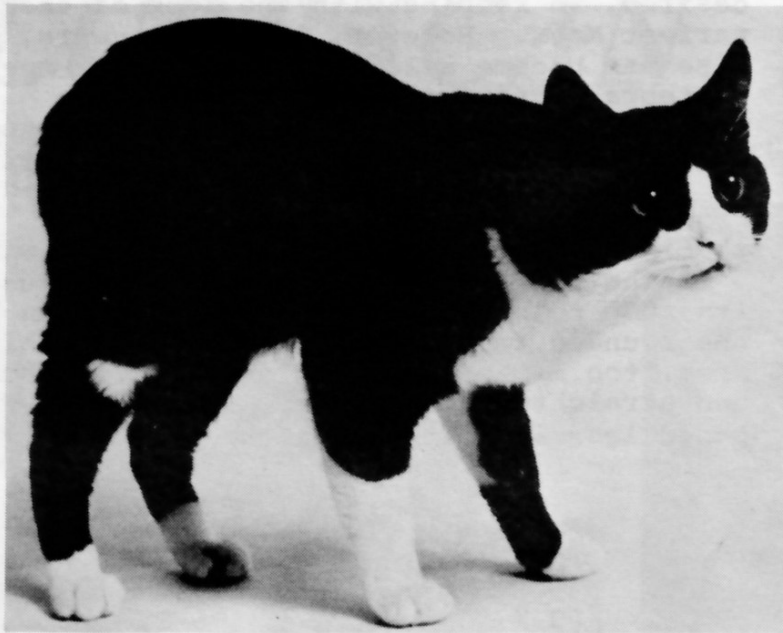

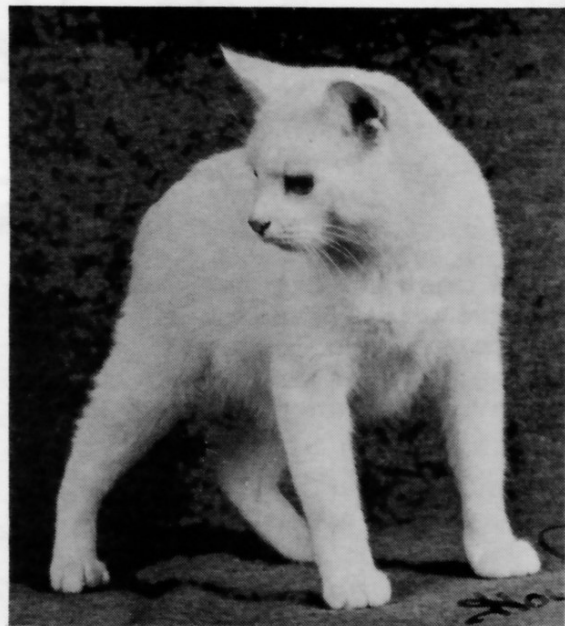

BODY

The body of the Manx is muscled and solid with sturdy bone structure. The Manx is a stout cat with a broad chest. (Drawing 5)
The back should be short but in proportion

to the rest of the cat. The back should arch from shoulders to rump to form the desirable round look. If the Manx is either too long bodied or too short bodied it will not have a balanced appearance.

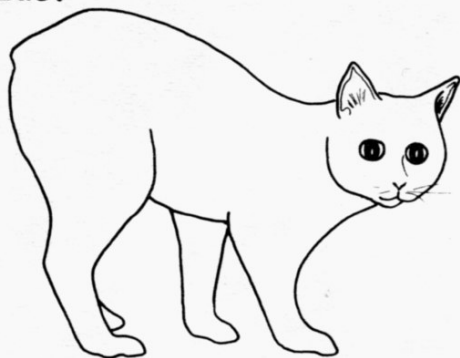
Body too long

Another quality known only to the Manx is depth of flank. The flank is the fleshy area between the ribs and hips. The Manx has greater depth than any other breed, causing considerable depth to the body when viewed from the side.

Poor Depth of Flank

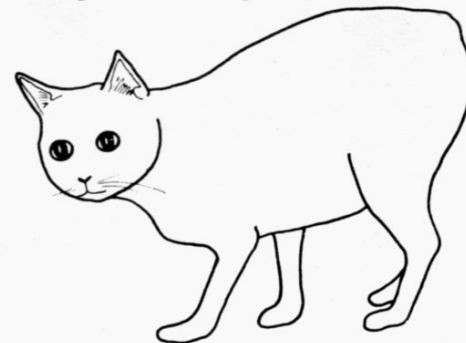
TAILLESSNESS, LEGS, FEET

The next largest amount of points, after BODY and HEAD, goes to TAILLESSNESS, and LEGS AND FEET, each carrying 15 points, and each unique in that they are only Manx characteristics.

Complete taillessness is, of course, desired, in keeping with the look of the perfect Manx. However, in recent years, a rise has become allowable. A rise is one vertebra of tailbone and, should it be more, or enough to stop a judge's hand upon examination, it becomes a penalizing fault. If the overall qualities of the Manx with a rise are better than that of a tailless specimen, the one with the rise should win.

The long, hind legs of the Manx cause its rump to be higher than its shoulders but the rounded, muscular look applies to this area, too. The legs should be heavily boned and straight, not spindly. A Manx with fine boned legs is a strange looking cat.

COAT

The coat of the Manx, worth 10 points, helps to accentuate the round appearance. Not all Manx have a true double coat and, quite often, even those that do completely lose the cottony undercoat in the summer, leaving them with a single, non-showable, coat. Many don't realize that Manx can shed their coat and look just as poorly as a Persian cat without its full coat come Summer.

In perfect coat, one can see the guard, or outer hairs on the Manx actually standing out from the body and, upon examination, one can see and feel the thick but soft undercoat. When in "Top Show" condition, the Manx coat should glisten with cleanliness; and good care and good health will show their rewards.

EYES, COLOR

The least amount of points: 5 each, goes to the EYES and to COLOR.

Copper eye color is desired, of course, but is very difficult to come by. Gold eye color is more realistic, though certainly not perfection. Least desirable are green eyes, except, of course, in the silver color shades.

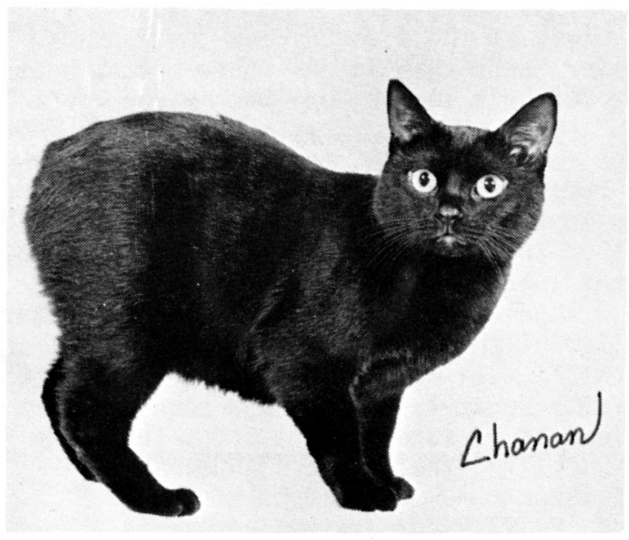
As far as COAT COLORS go, one would hope for as near to the Standard requirements as possible. But, since all the other point requirements add up so high to make the perfect Manx cat, EYE and COAT COLOR can be somewhat overlooked.

However, as one judge recently said when making a Manx Best In Show: "In addition to being a lovely Manx, this cat has true Black Smoke color..difficult to get

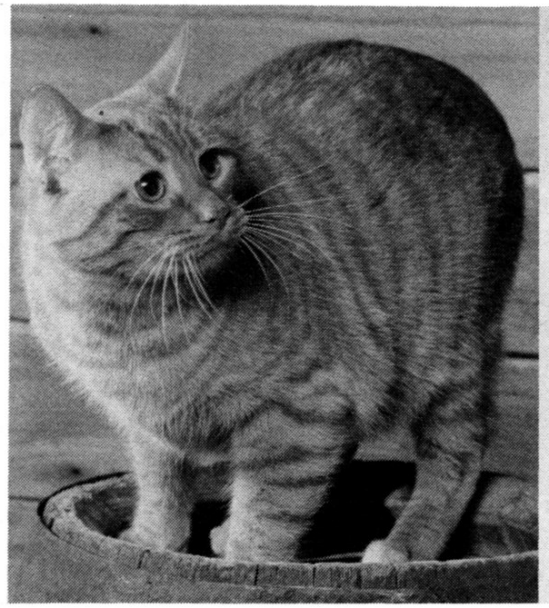

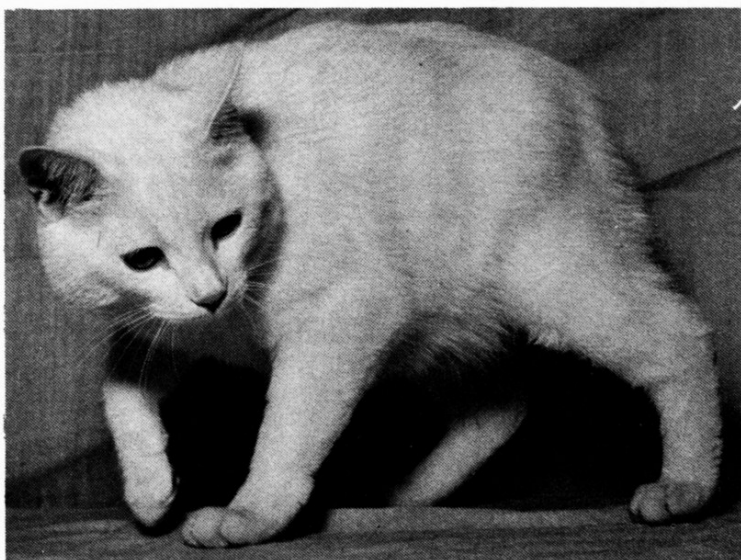

GENERAL:* The overall impression of the Manx cat is that of roundness: round head with firm, round muzzle and prominent cheeks, broad chest, substantial short front legs, short back which arches from shoulders to a round rump, great depth of flank, and rounded muscular thighs. The heavy, glossy double coat accentuates the round appearance. The constant repetition of curves and circles gives the Manx the appearance of great substance and durability, a cat that is powerful without the slightest hint of coarseness. With regard to condition, the Manx presented in the show ring should evidence a healthy physical appearance, feeling firm and muscular, neither too fat nor too lean. The Manx should be alert, clear of eyes, with a glistening, clean coat.

**Revised as of May 1, 1980.*

HEAD AND EARS: Round head with prominent cheeks and a jowly appearance. Head is slightly longer than it is broad. Moderately rounded forehead, pronounced cheekbones and jowliness (jowliness more evident in adult males) enhance the round appearance. Definite whisker break, with large, round whisker pads. In profile there is a gentle nose dip. Well-developed muzzle, slightly longer than broad, with a strong chin. Short thick neck. Ears wide at the base, tapering gradually to a rounded tip, with sparse interior furnishings. Medium in size in proportion to the head, widely spaced and set slightly outward.

In the 1978-'79 show season, her cattery tied for the highest number of Grand Champions (CFA) bred during that season.

EYES: Large, round and full, set at a slight angle toward the nose (outer corners slightly higher than inner corners). Ideal eye color conforms to requirements of coat color.

BODY: Solidly muscled, compact and well-balanced, medium in size with sturdy bone structure. The Manx is stout in appearance, with broad chest and well-sprung ribs; surprisingly heavy when lifted. Males may be somewhat larger than females.

Flank (fleshy area of the side between the ribs and hip) has greater depth than in any other breed, causing considerable depth to the body when viewed from the side.

The short back forms a smooth, continuous arch from shoulders to rump, curving at the rump to form the desirable round look. Shortness of back is unique to the Manx, but is in proportion to the entire cat and may be somewhat longer in the male.

TAILLESSNESS: Absolute in the perfect specimen, with a decided hollow at the end of the backbone where, in the tailed cat, a tail would begin. A rise of bone at the end of the spine is allowed and should not be penalized unless it is such that it stops the judge's hand, thereby spoiling the tailless appearance of the cat. The rump is extremely broad and round.

LEGS AND FEET: Heavily boned, forelegs short and set well apart to emphasize the broad, deep chest. Hind legs much longer than forelegs, with heavy, muscular thighs and substantial lower legs. Longer hind legs cause the rump to be considerably higher than the shoulders. Hind legs are straight when viewed from behind. Paws are neat and round, with five toes in front and four behind.

COAT: Double coat is short and dense, with a well-padded quality due to the longer, open outer coat and the close, cottony undercoat. Texture of outer guard hairs is somewhat hard; appearance is glossy. Coat may be thicker during cooler months of the year.

TRANSFER TO AOV: Definite, visible tail joint; long, silky coat.

DISQUALIFY: Evidence of poor physical condition, incorrect number of toes; evidence of hybridization; weak hindquarters causing inability to stand or walk properly.

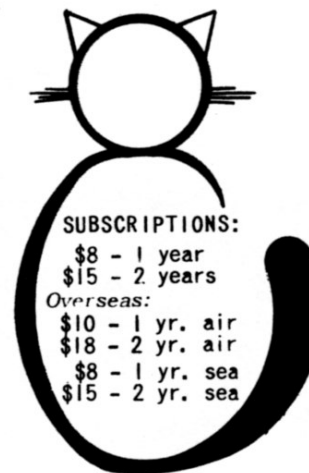

Editor's Note: Any reader who has a question about any phase of cat fancying (or a suggestion for discussion) is invited to write to Mr. Bandy at his home address (see page 6) for response in this column.

THIRTEEN QUESTIONS

Dear Mr. Bandy:

I am a novice breeder and have many questions to ask you:

- (1) How can you tell a female is going into heat, especially a kitten for the first time?
- (2) Will a usually quiet male start yowling when a female starts to go into heat?
- (3) My blue persian kitten (9 months) has a very tiny ring of green around the pupil of otherwise fine copper eyes.
- (4) When breeding kittens, how long should a breeder keep the kittens to determine whether they are of good show quality?
- (5) I am very concerned about health. I bought a black male who was not in the best shape when I got him. Is there any organization that recommends advice on where to buy the healthiest stock and best quality stock?
- (6) When matching a pair for breeding, what characteristics would most likely dominate in these cases? (i) Small, wide set ears to large, close ears; (ii) Short nose with large break to longer nose with less break; (iii) Long tail to short tail.
- (7) Financially how to breeders keep their catteries going? Do you have any money-saving tips?
- (8) Is it possible to breeders to vaccinate their own stock?
- (9) When mating a blue persian (whose dam was white and sire blue) to a black male (whose dam was blue and sire black), is there a chance of getting a white kitten?
- (10) What should the procedure of events be upon the arrival of a female for stud service?
- (11) How much should a person pay for a top show quality cat or kitten and how can you be sure that this is the quality of cat you are receiving?
- (12) Is it more likely you can receive a grand championship by attending more shows?
- (13) Where can I find more information on breeding, especially inbreeding?

Dear Miss MacLean:

Thank you for your letter. I shall answer your questions in order.

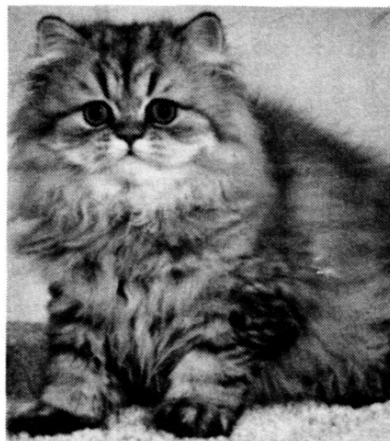
- (1) When a female cat comes into heavy heat, she will generally rub herself on any handy object and roll around. When you stroke the

top of her hindquarters, she will stand and tread her hind feet and push her rear end up against your hand. Behavior varies a great deal and is influenced by many factors. If the cat is friendly then she is more easily observed than a cat that is shy and spends much of her time hiding under various objects. But even the friendliest of cats may be so insecure when she is sent to a strange place to be bred that she will sit in a corner and hiss at anyone or anything that approaches her. This problem, coupled with possible disease transfer, is the reason why some feline breeders are not eager to accept outside queens for stud service. I realize that some breeders are not in a position to keep a stud cat but the ones who do can avoid many headaches connected with sending queens out for breeding. The stud has a much better chance of coaxing the female into a position where she can be bred if they are placed in a large open area. If placed in a small cage, she can back into a corner and hold off any stud, no matter how eager he is.

The first heat of a female kitten can be very light and may often go unnoticed. There are many different ideas about the age at which to breed a young female for the first time. A few females will come in heat at six months of age or so. I find that my Persians cycle initially from 10 to 12 months of age. I personally prefer to breed them from this age on. I find that if the females are bred at this age they generally have troublefree births as compared to older females bred for the first time. I watch them during their first delivery and make sure that the newborn kittens noses are cleaned so that they can breathe. I leave the kitten attached to the placenta and allow the mother to clean her own babies and eat the placenta. If you allow her to do this she will become self-sufficient. If you clean the babies for her, often she will not attend to kittens in future litters and they will suffocate in the sacs.

I like to permit the male to live with several females which I would like to mate him with. Cats are communal animals and will live together well if they have enough room to relax and stay out of the way of each other if they wish to. It is only when you put too many cats in too small an area that problems arise. In this situation, some males even object to certain females and problems occur. If a group of young females are allowed to live with a young male as they are growing up, the male will often mate at eight months or so and the females 8 to 10 months of age.

The heat periods of cats are not predictable like dogs and often occur intermittently. The male is aware of these periods and often I was not even aware that the queens were in heat when I discovered that they had been bred. It is easy to see when they are near delivery so there is no problem.

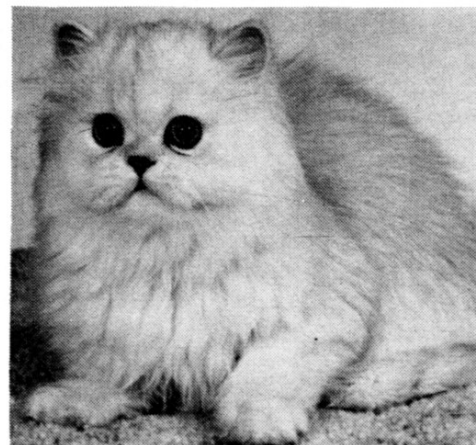

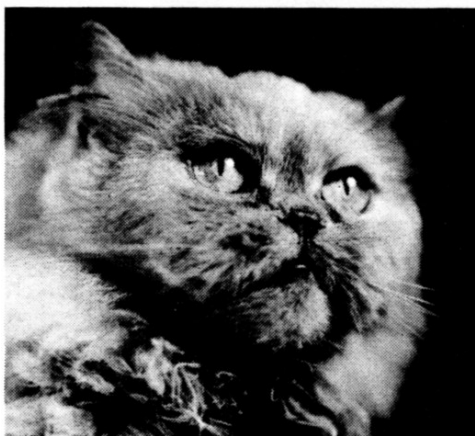

(2) Some males are yowlers and some are quiet but even quiet males will yowl if they are where they can smell a female in heat. The female occasionally does a little yowling herself. The various noises and odors left by the cats spraying urine on the objects around them are all notices to let members of the opposite sex know that they are ready and willing to mate. Males mark their territory by spraying so that any strange male that runs across one of these sign posts knows that he will have to fight the male whose territory he enters if he encounters him.

(3) There is no actual color pigment in the eyeball. The way the tissue is structured reflexes the light to produce the 'color'. A cat without such a green ring would be more desirable than one with it; however, it is no disqualification and a superior cat with only this fault would win over a mediocre specimen without it.

(4) A breeder should keep his litters until he can definitely determine their quality, especially if they have top quality producing stock. Keeping kittens until they are older poses the additional problem of more housing for your stock but I have found this to be the best policy. Generally, when buyers are looking for top quality stock, they realize the older the cat the easier it is to see the quality in the individual. In some lines the stock is beautiful as young stock but at around two years of age they become mediocre specimens. In other lines the stock may not be flashy kittens but as they mature they develop into outstanding specimens. I have found that if the kittens are super extreme then they may be too extreme as adults. I prefer my stock to develop in quality. The older the cat the better it is in quality. I rarely let a cat go before it is 8 months old and often they are over one year. I know what they are but I also want the new owner to be able to see what they are. Older stock can also stand the strain of transfer much better and losses do not occur.

(5) I know of no organization that advises on the healthiest and best quality stock. Such knowledge is acquired with experience which is, all too often, quite expensive. It is best to determine the particular type of Persian you would like to breed. If you look in the CFA Yearbook you can get an idea of the type of stock some breeders produce. Then you set about to obtain the stock you desire. The most difficult part of all is taking the stock you have obtained and producing a line that is of the type you wish to breed. As far as health is concerned, if the cat has a health certificate recently acquired accompanying it, then it should be free of major visible problems. One has to have a good diet and accommodations to maintain the stock in good health.

(6) Unfortunately in breeding Persians many of the desirable characteristics are recessive. The dominant traits are the ones found in stock that has not been selected for qual-

ity. In head type, small ears with a wide set and short nose with a good break are among the hardest characteristics to set in the stock. Most cats have a medium length tail. One has to select to produce a shorter or longer tail.

(7) I think that most breeders use their programs as hobbies and do not expect them to be profitable like a business. Cost cutting can be achieved by seeking out reasonably priced food supplies and programs to keep the cats healthy all the time to keep the medical costs at a minimum.

(8) Many breeders vaccinate their own stock. Vaccine and disposable needles for injection may be obtained from several supply houses. Occasionally these supplies can be obtained from a local veterinarian.

(9) A Blue Persian female mated to a black male will only produce blue or black males or females, irregardless of the color of the ancestors.

(10) I would prefer to have a stud to be used for outside stud service housed away from my own stock to reduce the chance of a visiting queen bringing something to my stock. Have the male in quarters he is familiar with and have a cage separated from the male by a wire fence so the cats can smell each other. Put the female in the cage and open the door to allow them to get together when she has settled down and shows the desire to associate with the male.

(11) Prices of stock vary from area to area. I have heard of very high prices being paid for mediocre quality stock. This is why it is so important for you to know about quality so you can see initially if the cat is really what you want. You will find that some breeders are excellent sales people and will tell you just what you want to hear. Other breeders are not as eager to make sales and require more time to deal with. One must consider the fact that there are many shoppers in any fancy and are merely curious about obtaining some information. Also a fancy is a luxury and when financial situations take a turn for the worse "buying a kitten" is one of the first projects to be abandoned. Therefore, unless someone is persistent, I am inclined to think that they are merely shopping.

(12) A cat earns a grand championship after he has received his six winner's ribbons to make him a champion and then acquires 200 grand championship points in CFA in either Division or Finals Championship competition. The more shows you attend, the more likely you are to earn these points.

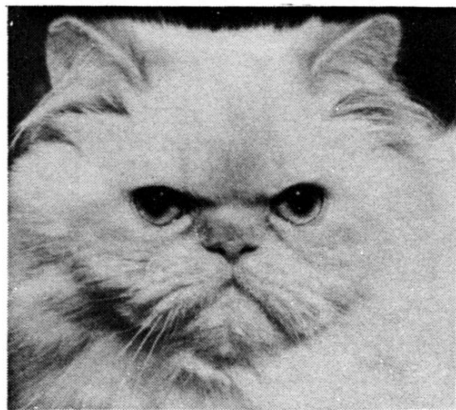
(13) I don't know of any sources of information exclusively devoted to breeding or inbreeding. It is the easiest way to develop and maintain quality in your stock but it also involves certain risks. The one general rule to follow could be never to breed closer than grandfather to granddaughter or grandmother to grandson as a general practise. This allows one generation in between your stock to maintain some vigor.

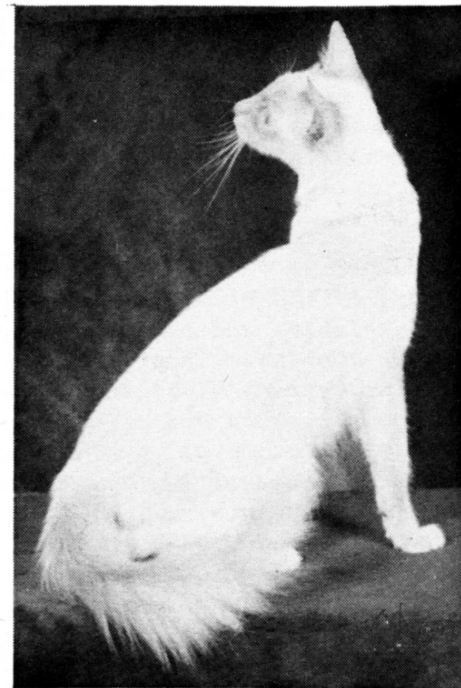

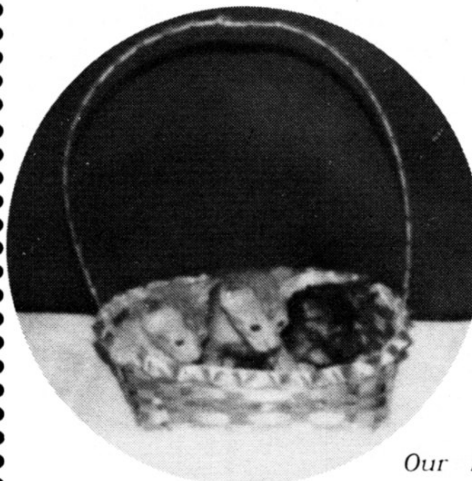

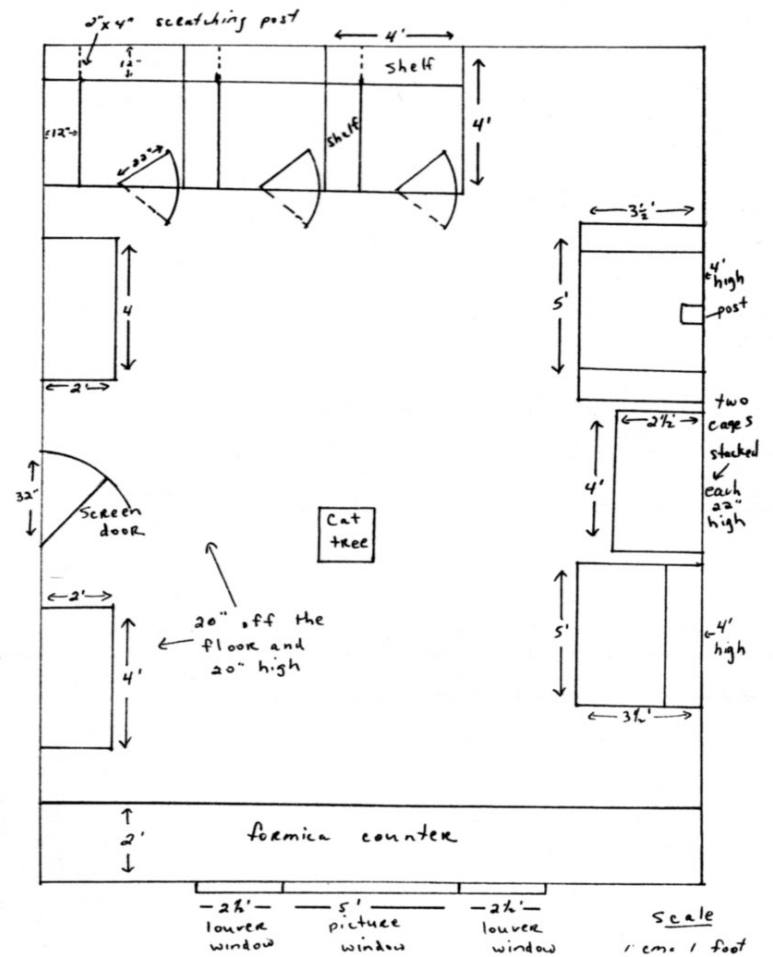
International Cattery Tour

Stop Number 12 on the International Cattery Tour is at the home of the President of United Silver Fanciers, Janice Reichle, and her husband Dr. W. Reichle, a research chemist. They live, with their Diadem Persians, at Warren, N.J. In this article, Janice describes her cattery and offers helpful hints.

For most Diadem cats, our cattery is simply a place to eat and sleep. Females not in season or nursing young kittens have the run of the house. The males also have complete house freedom until they begin to spray and/or piddle and then they are confined to the cattery. Depending upon the time of the year, they may either be kept in separate stud cages or they can have the run of the cattery. The father and son I have now get along very well indeed. From about six weeks of age kittens also have house privileges.

In our former cattery we had stud cages 5' x 5' floor to ceiling, and 4' x 12' same height. We learned that Persians (at least our cats) don't make use of this much floor space but do a lot of traveling up and down so when we built the new cattery we made what we call small cages. These are walk-in, floor to ceiling, 4' x 4'. The shelves are covered in carpeting (indoor-outdoor) and the one across the back is about 27" from the floor. Each of the three stud cages has another shelf running from front to back about 52" from the floor. There is a 2" x 4" post covered in burlap for scratching from bottom shelf to top one on the inside corner. The cages are quite simple in design in that each is just a front and one side. The back of the cattery serves as the back of each cage. Facing the cages, the left wall of the cattery serves as left wall of first cage so each cage consists of a front and a right side. The tiled cattery floor serves as an easily cleaned cage bottom; cattery ceiling is, of course, the cage top.

The wire partitions between the males is 2" x 2½" wire. The wire on the fronts and ends of cages is 1" x 1¼". All the wire on these cages is plastic coated and looks great. Time will tell how it stands up. Each cage section is fastened to the next with a hook and eye (the type with spring safety). They are on casters so it is a simple matter to unhook a section, roll it out and clean. Each cage has a wicker basket, plastic dish pan for litter and crockery water dish.



In the space to the right of the stud cages we could add walk-in cages but, right now, we use that space to set up collapsible (show type) cages if we need extra, temporary caging.

KITTENING CAGES

We have two 'nursery' cages with solid sides and back and removable wire tops. The latter is a necessity for 'deliveries'. Kittens stay here for approximately a month before moving to the big kitten cages. Another advantage of the removable top is that it can be left open for mama to go in and out once front doors have to be fastened. Until kittens can get out of the nest box by themselves, front cage doors can be left open. Once they begin

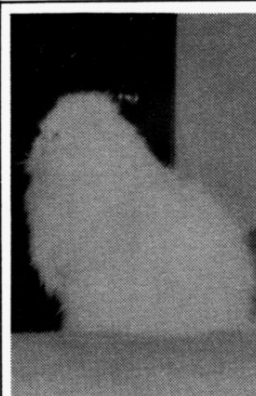

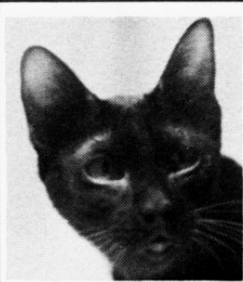

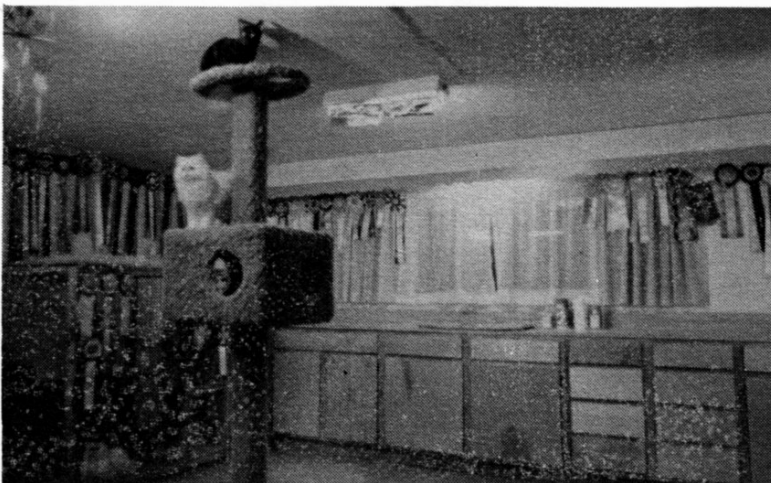
to wander, but before they can climb wire, the top is left off. This is a necessity with my queens since most refuse to use a pan in the cage with their kittens as long as they are cleaning after them. Once the kittens begin to wander, they need a pan in the cage. With the exception of one nursery cage all are varnished, even wicker beds which you will see in many cages. These cages are 4' long, 2' wide and 18" high. They are about 18" off the floor and while this is a bit low for my real comfort, the open tops are a real help in kitting. We rarely have two litters of kittens at one time: our cats are our pets and we enjoy the kittens but two litters are a bit too much of a good thing!

When the babies leave the nursery cage they go to the large kitten cage which has shelves and scratching post. At about six weeks of age they begin to have not only the freedom of the cattery but more time in the house. Coming upstairs with the family is not new to them at this age because they are brought up for very short visits by my children. Unlike many breeders, I do believe in lots of handling for kittens from a very early age. After the first time or two, even the new mother becomes complacent about sparing a baby for a short time. I feel very strongly about the importance of good dispositions in all cats. Ours are, first and foremost, our family pets. That many are also grand champions is great, but secondary in importance.

CATTERY FACILITY

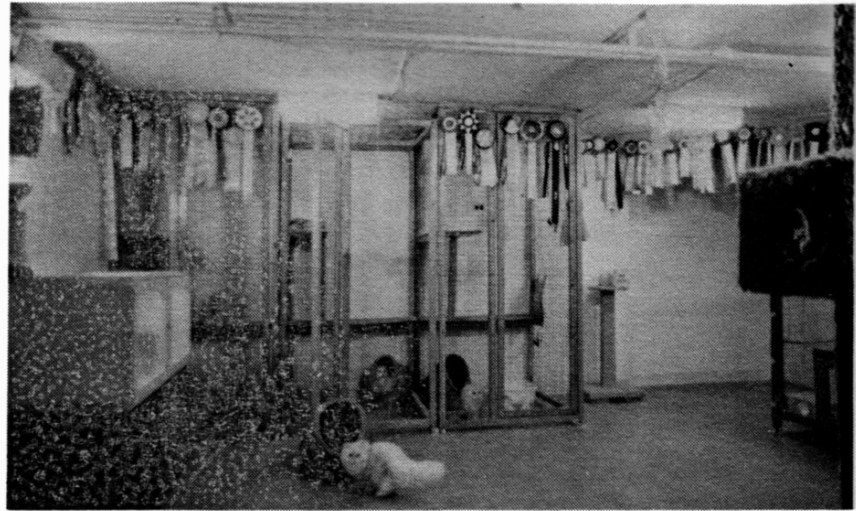
The cattery room was originally a heated two-car garage. We had the front bricked in by a mason who also put in the large picture window flanked by two louvered windows. The floor was done by a professional but, with the exception of these items, Dr. Reichle did all of the cattery and cages himself including putting the cabinets together.

Across the front of the cattery are cabinets with loads of drawer and storage space. The countertop is formica. That wide sill in front of the windows is great for bird-watching! In the center of the cattery is a large cat tree, the type with a house in the center.

Most of the cats love it. A rather 'circusy' effect in the room is achieved by 4" scalloped wood border around the top of the walls which is painted orange. The fake fur beds are orange as are the litter pans and burlap covered posts. The only other decorations are



rosettes hung all over the room.

There are three large fluorescent light fixtures in the ceiling and one small one over the grooming area on the counter. Perhaps the most important feature is the germicidal lamps on each side of the room. We had them for years at our former home and when we moved were without them until we had the cattery finished. For the first time in many years we had a respiratory infection while without the lamps. How many breeders do you know who have had but one respiratory infection in 10 years? Even though most of the cats are out of this room in the daytime, these lights (which burn 24 hours a day) apparently do the trick. The only disadvantages are that the neighbors do tend to wonder about the disco effect of the purple lights and our kittens, never having been in complete dark, are sometimes frightened of the dark in a new home!

We have both a screen door and a solid door on the cattery. Most of the time we keep both open but if I want to let either the studs or females in season out, the screen door is closed. Our home can best be described as a split ranch so we have utility room, play room and a bedroom on the same level as the cattery. Occasionally one of the cats will be so 'fragrant' that I am forced to close the solid door. Fortunately, this doesn't happen often!


Most of the time our cats can be found sleeping or playing all over the house. My husband and I are very opposed to a 'caged cat' cattery situation. Our feelings are such that many nice kittens go into pet homes rather than with breeders who will keep them constantly confined.

The one improvement I would like in the cattery would be to have water in it. However, this is an expensive luxury we can forego because an adjacent room is fitted out as a combination laundry-utility room with

FEBRUARY, 1980 CFA BOARD MEETING

Some of the decisions reached at the Executive Board Meeting in Houston, TX, February 16-18, 1980, excerpted from the Regional newsletters sent in by Marjorie Lomoriello (N. Atlantic Regional Director), James R. Thompson (Gulf Shore Regional Director), and Walter A. Friend, Jr. (Southern Regional Director), are reported below..for the official report, see your next CFA Quarterly.

BREED AND COLOR CHANGES

ASH- Tabbies - divide color points: 10 color, 10 pattern. Add a new color: Tortoiseshell Smoke.

BALINESE-COL.PT.SH- State that males be somewhat larger. Some rewording of point color descriptions.

EXOTICS Add Van pattern for the Bi-Colors.
HIMALAYANS Re-define the Flame Pt. description
KORATS Some rewording in General and Nose sections.

MAINE COONS Add Blue-Cream and White.

MANX The General description is revised.
RUSSIAN BLUES Chin & Color definitions are improved.
SOMALIS Descriptions of Color and male appearance are improved.

SAFARIS - will be 'courtesy-registered' by the Central Office for the purpose of maintaining the breeding records.

TONKINESE - are classified as Hybrids. A request for Provisional Status was again denied.

HIMALAYANS - The Breed Council will be polled on acceptance of the Chocolate & Lilac Selfs into Championship status as a separate Division of the breed.

BRITISH SHORTHAIR - Accepted for Championship as of 1 May, 1980.

NATIONAL SCORING

In the 1980-81 season the scoring procedure will return to the 10% differential. That is, 2B Cat will receive 90% of the Best Cat's points, 3B Cat 80% etc. 2B Cat of Breed or Division will be scored starting May 1, 1980. Jeanie McPhee, Will Thompson and Don Williams are members of a committee appointed to look into the whole system of National Awards

scoring and come up with a system that will yield the best cats not the most campaigned cats.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP DUES

Annual dues for member clubs MUST be received in the Central Office by May 1. Clubs will be dropped from membership if dues are unpaid by June 1; a delinquent club would be required to re-apply. Membership application forms are now required 30 days prior to a Board meeting for a new club to be considered for membership; application forms are available from Central Office.

Club membership lists must be filed by May 1 - lists to be forwarded to Regional Directors for submission to Central Office.

BREEDERS DIRECTORY - available from Central Office - \$2.00 per copy.

SHOW MANUAL - new edition available early Spring.

N. ATLANTIC REGION HONORS JOHN A. CONNAUGHTON
The Region lost a good friend and productive contributor when John Connaughton died 10th February, 1980. Jack was a breeder of fine Siamese, a Shorthair Specialty Judge and also served for a time as Regional Treasurer.

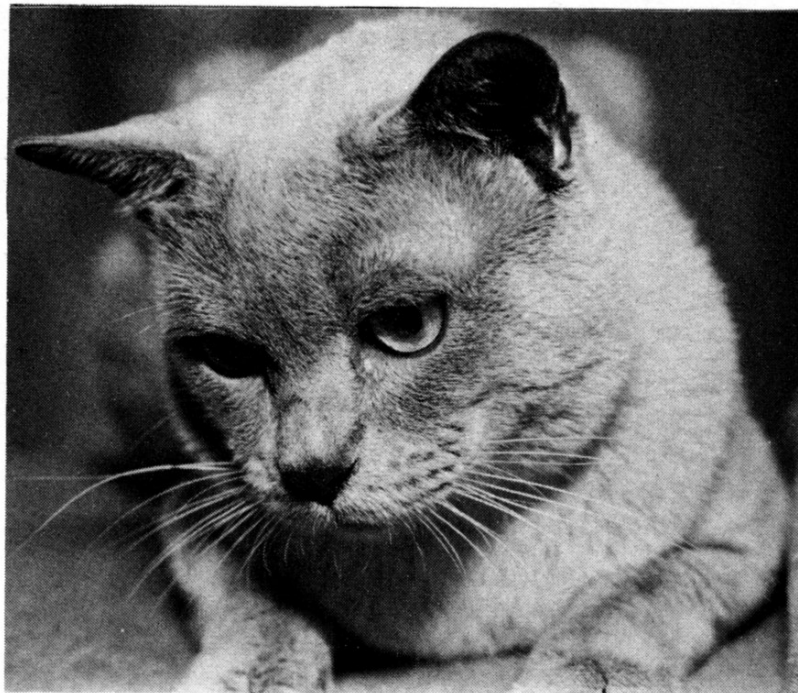

cabinets and stainless steel sinks. It is great for bathing cats, mixing food, water for drinking and washing pans.

DIET

At night I make the rounds of the bedrooms and collect cats who have gone to bed with the children. My feeding schedule may strike you as peculiar but there is a reason for it. My adults are fed twice a day (unless nursing) at about 11 P.M. and 10 A.M. The reason for this is that once they are fed at night they are caged for the night and I don't like to shut them in any earlier than necessary. In the morning I groom, feed and turn loose all those who can be allowed house privileges. This includes all kittens big enough to climb the carpeted stairs, all adult females not in season, and any young males who have not yet begun to leave their mark around the house. My males seldom spray but my females in season do.

The adults are fed a combination of 4 parts raw muscle meat and 1 part raw kidney, all beef. To this I add vitamins, brewers yeast powder, powdered calcium lactate, Linatone, salt and dry food. The kittens are fed 3 or 4 times daily depending upon their age. They get, in addition to the above, such

items as baby meat, canned cat food, Esbilac, cottage cheese and baby rice cereal. The cats get the same raw meat mixture every day--I have found that by offering a variety of food (liver one day, kidney another) they choose favorites and fast the days they don't get what they prefer. Granted, some silvers are excellent eaters but some are pickier and easier to spoil so I have found this system works best for me.

HELPFUL HINTS

Fed in adequate quantities on a regular basis I have found that brewer's yeast powder is definitely a flea deterrent.

Immediately a kitten is born, I weigh it on a postage scale and record its weight. I then weigh each kitten at the same time each day for about two weeks. Any weight loss is much more quickly noticed this way than by just looking or feeling. If I have a kitten who is not gaining as fast as its siblings, I can supplement with feedings.

I learned the hard way by loss of kittens due to navel cord infection to dip the cord of the kitten, at birth, in a bottle of white iodine. I put the cord in neck of the bottle and then put the bottle neck against the abdomen snugly, then invert bottle and kitten.###

NEW ZEALAND, 1979

OUR FOURTH GREAT YEAR OF 'CAT WORLD' AWARDS April 1980 sees the official announcement of the superb 1979 New Zealand 'CAT WORLD' Awards and on April 27 the National '80 Cat Show will be held in Christchurch with three CFA judges: Edna Field, Terry Hiraoka and Mary Kilborn flying in from U.S.A. to judge LH, SH and Siamese cats respectively. An exciting month is in store!

Our Honorary Scorer, for the third year, Hurle Rayner, completed his time-consuming job of checking, cumulating and averaging the points won during the 9-month 1979 show season by a total of 6,352 entries. These included the following:

The 1979 season saw an overall decrease in entries of 1,681 (Siamese by 978 and Longhairs by 713), but Shorthair entries increased by ten. The loss of five shows due to clubs forgetting to apply for their show dates by April 15, 1978, together with the petrol crisis and carless days contributed to this downturn of entries, lower even than 1977 which had a total entry of 7,447.

Largest cat show held in 1979 was the National Cat Show organized by Takapuna Cat Club and held in Auckland. It had 921 entries.

SCORING SYSTEM FAIR TO ALL

The New Zealand 'CAT WORLD' Awards scheme is completely free to clubs and exhibitors and gives worthwhile recognition to those exhibits who have beaten the MOST others during the show season through international presentation in this magazine and later in *N.Z. CATS*. The awards are for the country's BEST cats, not the most exhibited cats and are made on the basis of the highest average points. By this averaging, the cats are protected from being overshadowed and the exhibitor who cannot afford the time or money to travel

to a lot of shows is not penalized. There is also a minimum division number of three used in averaging to exclude the possibility of a cat winning one major award at a show and then being retired, resulting in a large number of points which would provide a misleading overall result.

Some Breeds/Colours do not feature in the winners' lists because, although exhibited often and possibly having numerous BOB/C wins, they never beat another exhibit to gain even one point. Exhibits receive points for their highest placing only.

Cats not featuring in the Top Tens receive points for their Group wins, and cats not in Groups receive points for Breed/Colour wins, all by the same method of one point for each cat present AND competing that they have beaten. The merit in this system is its fairness and simplicity, although anomalies may occur with any scoring system as the 'perfect' system has yet to be devised! This scoring system allows winners at big shows to accrue more points than winners at small shows: e.g. a 10th BIS at a large show may be worth more than BIS at a small show, which is the fairest way possible as the exhibit that beats the most exhibits is entitled to the most points. From time to time exhibitors query the fact that 'their' cat did not come up in the Awards yet had many BIS wins. When checked it is noted that ALL such exhibits had their wins in very, very small shows so, although they had perhaps six BIS wins, they had only beaten a very small number of cats.

As two-thirds of our population (and their cats) live in the North Island, shows held there are usually much larger than those held in the South Island so cats from the latter who feature in the annual Awards have scored exceptionally highly to hold their placings.

While it would give Hurle Rayner much less work if there was a flat rate of points for Best through 10th Best at a show, those cats shown at the smaller shows would then have a greater chance of making these Awards but they would not be the exhibits who had beaten the most competition during the year. Remember, these awards are for the country's BEST cats, not those most exhibited! A vote of thanks goes to Hurle who volunteers such a great deal of time to record all these points. The *CAT WORLD* scoring is done by him quite independently of his work as Honours Officer for the New Zealand Cat Fancy.

Nobody has to subscribe to *CAT WORLD* to have their cat's name published or to receive their awards. However, it is interesting to note that almost all of the annual winners have again participated in the *N.Z. GALLERY*.

NEW ZEALAND SHOW FORMAT

The 1979 show season saw the innovation of three divisions: Longhair, Shorthair and Siamese (including Orientals), with NO competition between Siamese and Other Shorthair ex-

hibits, just as there has always been no competition between Shorthair and Longhair. This was a very progressive step taken by the NZCF Inc. Unfortunately, after only one show season, the NZCF Annual General Meeting last October resolved to re-amalgamate these two Divisions into one Division again. For 1980 the pre-1979 situation exists again--all SH and Siamese judged together but, in larger shows, the SH Division (including Siamese) may be split into two sections leaving the judges to liaise for the major placings, a very time-consuming business.

While cats in U.S.A. compete in an All Breed ring as well as in Specialty rings, and are judged several times by different judges for BIS, cats in N.Z. do not. Each exhibit is judged once only and has just one chance to make BIS or win the coveted Grand Challenge Certificate at each show.

1980 will see the first venture into a 3-ring show. It will be done by the LH Cat Club and will hopefully be the first of many to follow

NEW TITLISTS

There were 17 new Grands during 1979 and most of them are featured in the Awards list. 13 are males and 4 are females (5 LH, 5 SH and 7 Siamese); they include the first Black & White Bi-Colour, Tortie and Shell Cameo Grand Champions in New Zealand's history. During the past five show seasons, a total of 68 cats have become Grand Champions.

Five cats became Grand Premiers in 1979: 4 spays, 1 neuter. They bring the total of Grand Premiers to 29 for the last five years. History was made when the first Oriental N/S cat of any colour making Grand: a Chocolate Tabby spay!

137 cats won Championships in 1979: 62 LH, 37 SH and 38 Siamese.

INTERESTING NOTES

NZCW's 1979 Top Ten winners lists show an almost equal number of male neuters and female spays overall: 46 neuters and 44 spays. Entire cats had 14 male and 16 female winners; entire kittens had 12 males and 18 females; neuter/spays had 20 neuters and 10 spays.

The Top 10 LH cats include one winner from the South Island while the kittens and neuter/spays have three S.I. winners each. The Top 10 SH cats are divided into 5 winners from each island as are the Top 10 neuter/spays but the kitten list includes 4 S.I. winners. The Top 10 Siamese cats and neuter/spays each include 4 S.I. winners but the kittens have just 3.

GR.CH. MATAHARI CASSANOVA, born 3/8/74, is the oldest cat on the Top 10 list and has the distinction of being the ONLY cat of ANY variety to feature in the Top 10 Awards FOUR times! The youngest award-winning cat is CH. CHAKRI KISHKA, Siamese born 24/7/78.

Oldest Neuter/Spay is a LH born 9/10/66, FERVALE MISS MINK; the youngest is a SH born 20/8/78, PR.CHAILAI CREAM SHARDA.

While CASANOVA, a LH, holds the record as being in the Top 10 four consecutive years, six others have been in their respective Top 10's in the NZCW Awards for three consecutive years: PR. OWEENA LAI SHING, CH. AYUDHYA RED IDRISIA, GR.CH. KEYO SPACED OUT, GR.CH. SAZANAMI BROWN SACHA, GR.PR. CHILTON BLUE BENJY and PR. TARSHA PHAROAH PEPI.

A Scottish Fold appeared in the Awards for the first time this year: EXCELDA MR MCGREGOR.

Winning Awards runs in the family! This year's 8th Best SH Cat, CH. CHUNTAO CREAM ELISE, is the daughter of the 1976 Best SH Cat and the 1977 Best SH Cat, respectively: GR.CH. LINLINKYE CREAM CABRO (IMP.ENG.) and GR.CH. NAMPARRA CREAM CAISSA (IMP.ENG.).

The first Oriental Choc. Tabby to feature in NZCW's Top 10, as well as first Oriental Neuter/Spay of any colour to win a Grand Premiership is on the 1979 lists: GR.PR. ARABESQUE CHARISSE. While the Arabesque Cattery still holds the record set in 1978 for the most winners featured in one season in NZCW's Top 10's (six), the 1979 leading breeder is the Keyo Cattery with four winners.

If an Award were offered for "Stud of the Year", it would surely go to CH. KALOKE KADO (IMP.ENG.), Sealpoint Siamese owned by Mrs. Copland. He sired no less than SEVEN of the NZCW Top Ten Siamese winners! Surely a record worth noting.

Parent-progeny achieving Top 10 placings this season include: GR.CH. OPTIMA ISHAQ (IMP.AUST.), Usual (Ruddy) Abyssinian and his daughter, CH. AYUDHYA RED IDRISIA, Red Aby, and GR.CH. KEYO SPACED OUT, Cornish Rex, and her daughter, CH. KEYO LOOKOUT.

As Provisional Registrar for N.Z.C.F. Inc., I am delighted to be able to announce that there are NINE Provisional Register exhibits included in this year's awards: MARYLAND SUNSHINE, GR.CH. KEYO SPACED OUT, CH. KEYO LOOKOUT, PLATYPUSS FUZZPOT, PR. HOOBABA CONTRARY MARY, PR. PLATYPUSS MILKYBAR KID, TERYAKI BLACK JACK, CH. SAYONARA E'ETINCELLE and EXCELDA MR MCGREGOR. These are all Top 10 winners. Very few PR exhibits are shown although approximately 1,000 cats and kittens were registered from February 1974 until May 1976. At that time, the new Litter registration system was implemented and in the 3½ years since, over 1,600 litters (approximately 6,500 kittens) have been registered on the Provisional Register. These cats have the same show status as any other registered exhibit with one exception: they must beat a Full Register exhibit to hold any Challenge Certificate they win. GR.CH. KEYO SPACED OUT was the first PR exhibit to become a Grand.

CH. SAYONARA E'ETINCELLE's name goes down in N.Z. history for being the first Provisional Register exhibit to win BEST CAT in the New Zealand 'CAT WORLD' Awards. A fabulous Chocolate Lynxpoint Siamese, she has an ABYSSINIAN grandfather, FINISTERRE MERIKA-RA, a Red, sure proof that the 'red' Abys are, in fact, chocolate! With this cross of breed

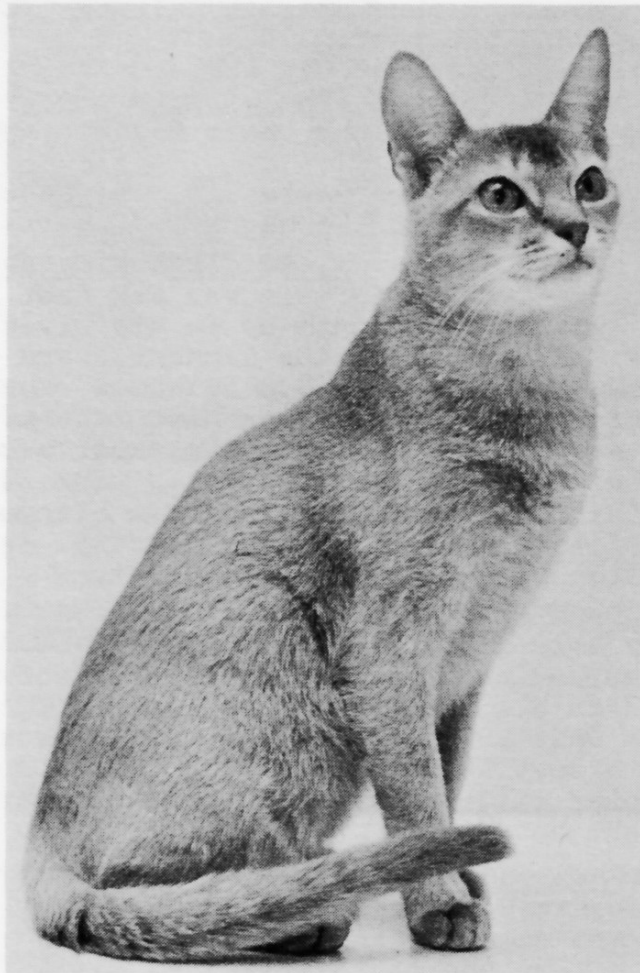

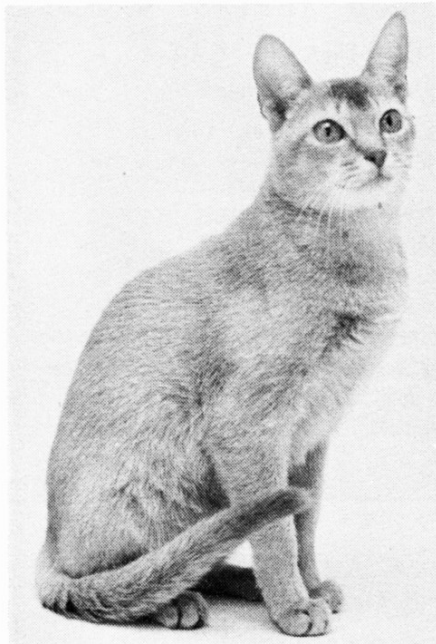

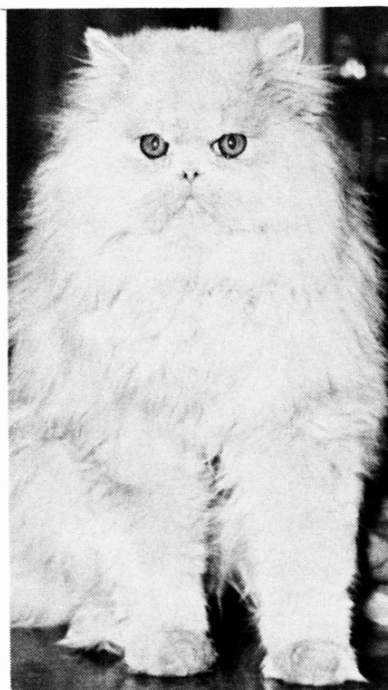

The youngest Siamese neuter/spay in the 1979 Awards won enough points to achieve the sought after "Supreme" title! In the words



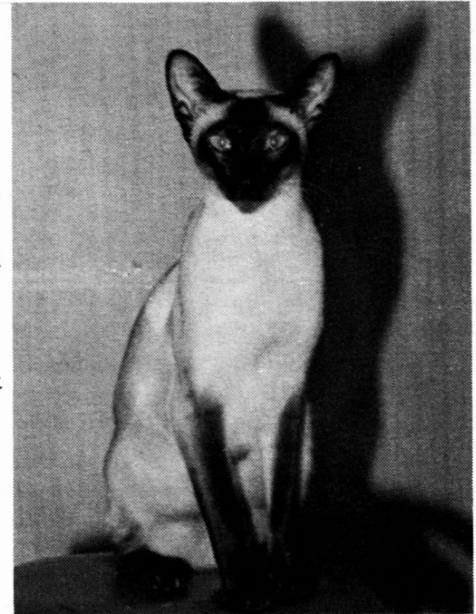

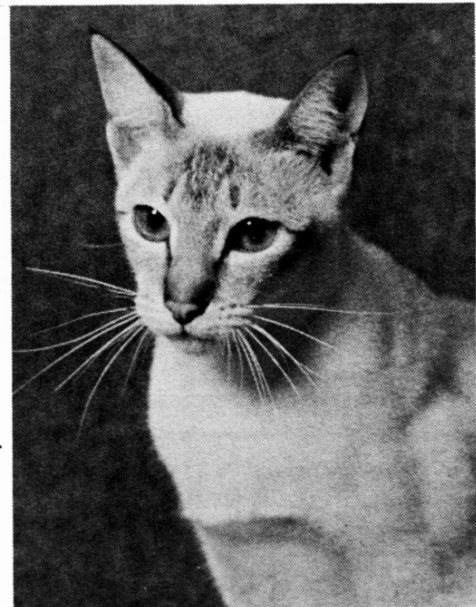
