ANIMAL CONTROL/ZONING ORDINANCES

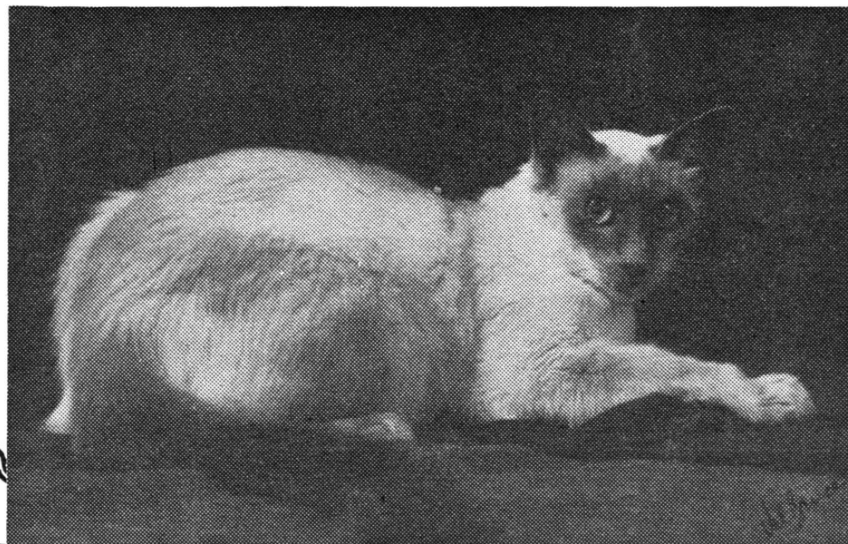
The City of Phoenix recently included a kennel licencing type law in some new zoning laws. Local animal breeders turned out in force, and the addendum was dropped. Our objection to piecemeal passage of ordinances to control animals is that the time for this approach is long past. No municipality should consider restrictive animal policies unless they are coupled with positive measures for **animal welfare** and either direct or cooperative programs for population control through education and low cost neutering and spaying programs. Animal control is no longer sufficient, *we must have animal control and protection*. Kennel licencing ordinances - it has been found - hit the ethical breeders of registered animals who are not the real target. Education and control are needed for the owner who lets animals roam at will and breed suffering. When your city tries to institute a cat, cattery or kennel lincencing law, ask them what they are doing about the overpopulation problem, the misery in the pound, and the general humane treatment of animals in your city.

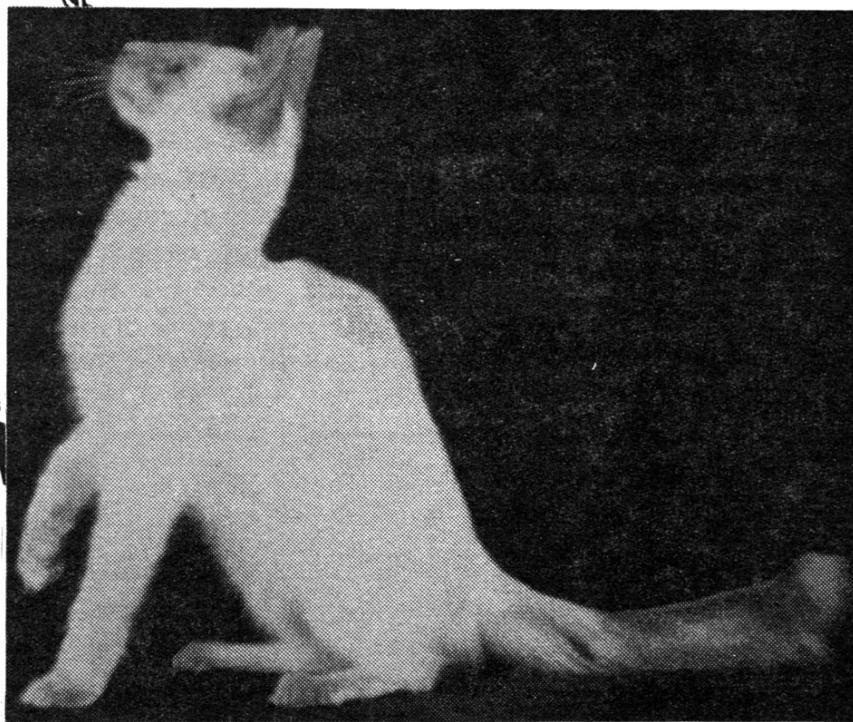

International Cattery & NuFurs Tour

by Susan Nuffer

In our July/August '81 tour we visited Mrs. Jane Hellman's *Tattleberry Manx* indoor/outdoor cattery. We are again visiting a Manx cattery, this time in central California. While the climate can hardly be compared with that of Wales where the *Tattleberry Manx* thrive, William and Susan Nuffer believe in the same kind of indoor/outdoor arrangements to produce their hardy, healthy cats.

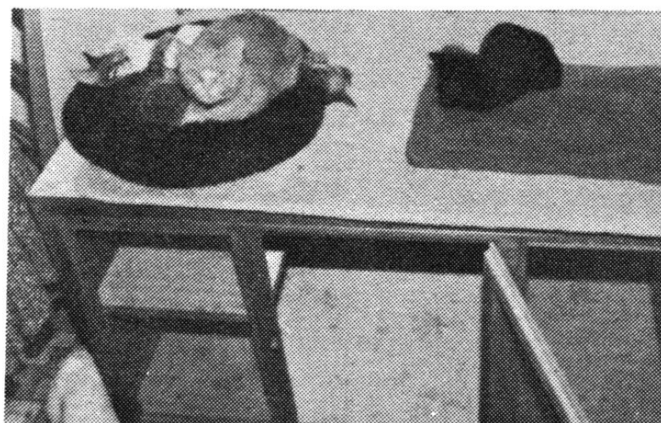
The effort to maintain and breed quality cats while at the same time providing a pleasant lifestyle for both human and feline residents can be difficult. By giving careful thought to where and how we live it seems that both can be attained.

Our home and cattery (the two are the same) are located on three acres in rural Monterey County. Year-round cool temperatures provide an ideal environment for producing Manx that are hardy, healthy, adaptable, and given towards holding their luxuriant double coats to maximum advantage. By using the extent of our house and grounds we have organized the cattery in a manner that fits into the natural life cycle of our animals.

Our bedroom serves as the maternity ward. All our kittens are born there in one of the queening cages next to the sliding glass doors. They spend the first several weeks of life there until their growing adolescent energies finally drive out all our hopes of sleep -- but no sooner than their first series of vaccinations. This insures that a positive people relationship is imprinted on them early and permanently.

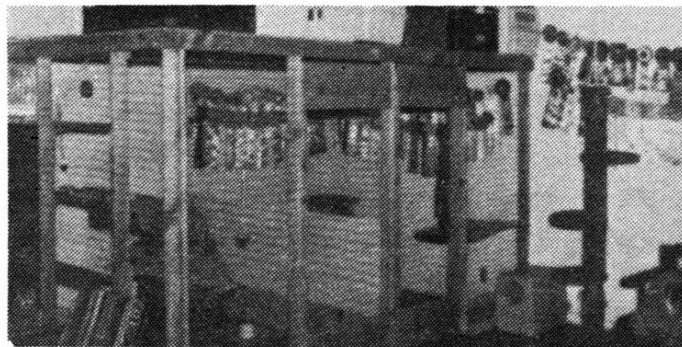
From the bedroom, the kittens and their mother move into the family room/kitchen. There they develop associations with other cats and with a wider variety of people, including children. They also become acquainted with those older cats whose fine sense of the dramatic has earned them a permanent berth at this waypoint.

2. Cattery area — no cages.



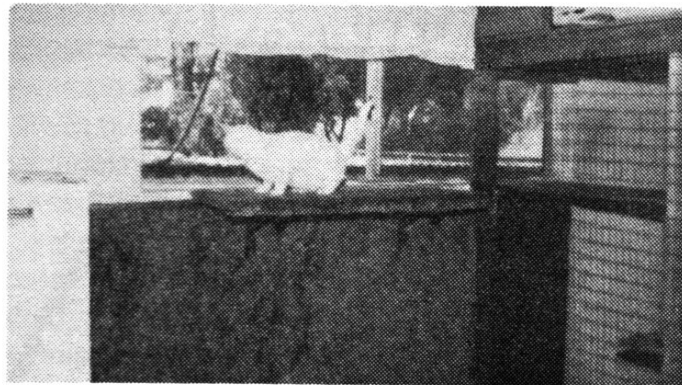
1. Queening cage, 1 of 3 made by Lynn Rogers, local craftsman.

The majority of our cats live in the main cattery. What used to be a 2½ car garage is now dry-walled, partially carpeted, and festooned with shelves, scratching posts and furniture to provide feline-oriented exercise, comfort, and a variety of interests. The cattery also includes two large walk-in cages -- more about these later. Windows and a screen door provide sun, fresh air, bird and lizard watching opportunities.

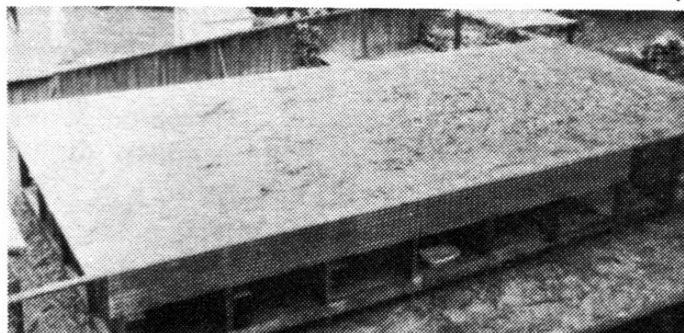


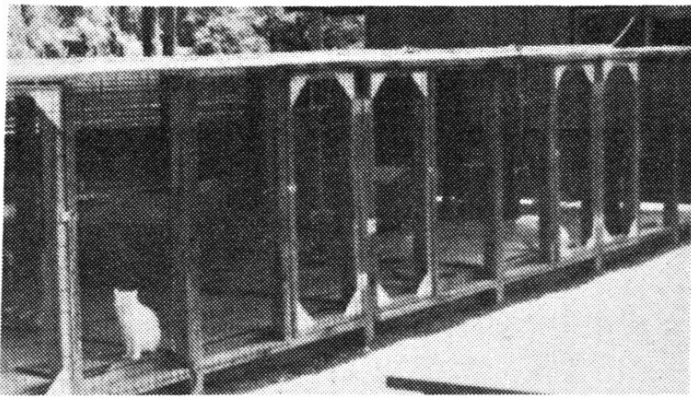
3. Cattery walk-in cages with storage on top and window perch.

Whole males and household pets who insist on being outside (but, like all our cats, are not allowed to run loose), have seven large outside runs at their disposal.





Each roofed run is 400 cubic feet (4' x 5' x 20') and is equipped with shelves, scratching posts, pillows, an assortment of toys, litterpans, automatic waterers, and a cat-size house shelter.

Cages evince strong opinions (or strong opinions are evinced by them). We believe that our cages are a necessary part of our animals' well-being. In keeping with that concept, all our cages are walk-ins (two in the cattery and seven outside and are never less than 350 cubic feet in space. Nothing is sadder than to visit a cattery and see animals who spend their lives in tiny show cages (or confinement of similar size). By providing large walk-in cages our whole males are enabled to get plenty of exercise, comfort and frequent human contact and attention. The number of comfortable and livable cages allows us to keep a sufficient number of breeding animals to provide the genetic diversity and selectivity that, carefully managed, produces healthy, championship Manx.

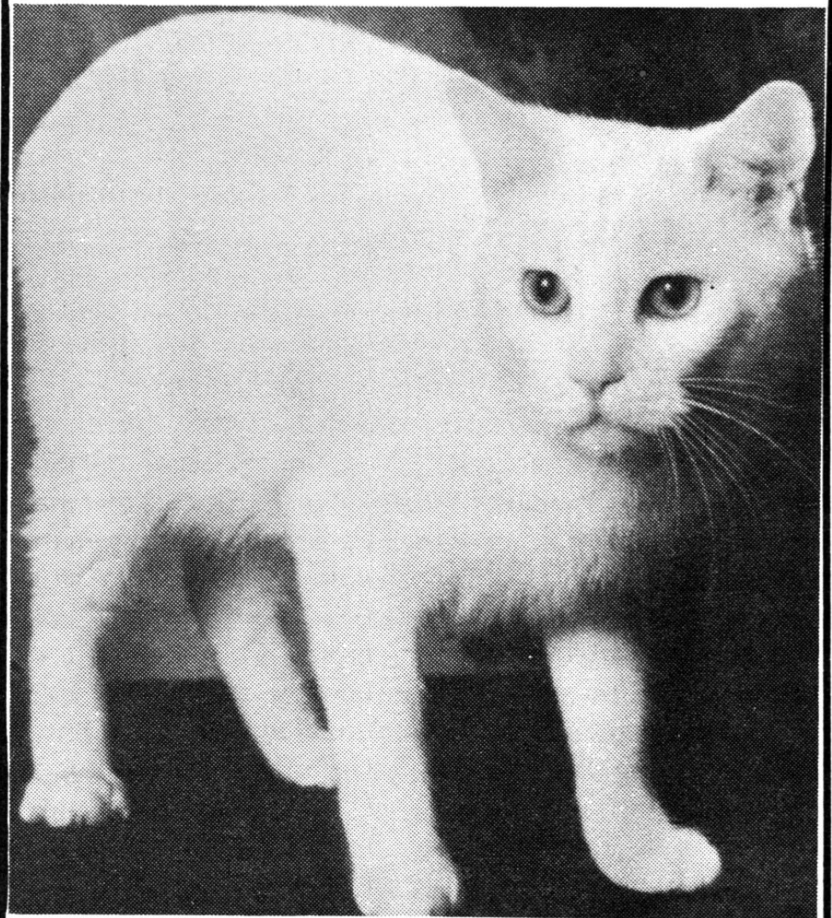
We also provide three queening/isolation cages (2' x 2' x 4', see first photo) that are small enough to provide a sense of security to new mothers and their litters. These cages are also ideal for the care and isolation of sick animals, by virtue of their size and portability.

The year-round mild temperatures and sandy soil of the central California coast provide a flea-paradise; the drought in the mid-'seventies complicated control by creating a strain of "super-flea", resistant to most common flea insecticides.

We have tried every powder, spray, collar, and food additive available -- all helped some -- none was a total panacea. At long last, we have found the way to control fleas -- hard work. About once a month (more often in summer, less often in winter) we bring every cat (that's right -- every cat) into the family room where the linoleum and tile floor provides a relatively inhospitable flea environment. While the exterminator sprays the rest of the house, grounds and outside runs, we bathe every cat (that's right -- every cat). After the cats (and the flea spray) have dried, we powder the cats (with Sevin) and return each to its niche. To date this process has been 100% effective.

All litter boxes are scooped once or twice daily and

changed frequently. We use about 125 pounds of Jonny Cat a week. Once a week we totally disinfect, wash and clean all the cat living areas. As a result, illness is minimized, the cats and their accoutrements are a pleasure to live with, and prospective customers can be shown all the cat living areas, without concern.

ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCES

Of the cat breeders we know, a majority keeps a number of animals in excess of local animal control ordinances and most do so without the benefit of the necessary license or permit. It is amazing that so many cat lovers who would not dream of exposing their animals to FeLV or similar danger would, nonetheless, continue to subject the fate of their felines to whims of neighbors or "friends" who might decide one day to report them to local animal control authorities. The letter of the law can decimate cat populations far faster and far worse than any disease of nature. Shortly after we moved to Prunedale we were reported by a neighbor, angered over our refusal to join him in a well building project. It could as easily have been anyone.

The full story of "becoming legal" is perhaps better covered in another article — suffice it to say that a lot of work and considerable concern did eventually result in the attainment of the coveted Permanent Kennel Use Permit.

OUR SALES CONTRACT

We breed only a small number of litters each year and the demand is usually large. Our customers are screened carefully and not one cat leaves us without a contract that, amongst other things, guarantees that the cat will always be an indoor cat, will never be declawed, and will be returned to us if at any time in the cat's life it can no longer be kept by the new owner. There is also an alter clause for pets, and a breeding clause that gives us partial control over breeding animals and the placement of their offspring. Understandably, a number of potential customers do not meet these requirements; but the welfare of our animals is far more important than loss of a sale.

The distinction between home and cattery has been deliberately blurred. Our lifestyle has blended well with that of our cats and the quality of both human and feline existence has been maintained. □

Interpreting the Birman Standard

Perhaps the most difficult of all longhair breeding programs is that which is faced by the breeder of the Sacred Cat of Burma, or Birman.

Not only are the color pattern, coat and head type unique, but there is also a very small gene pool and there is no other breed to which the breeder may outcross.

The Birman is a unique and beautiful cat, with a complex and varied standard in the many cat associations of the world. Though still somewhat rare in the show halls of North America today, it has been promoted with much success since the original cats were imported in the United States in 1960. Breeders working with this lovely cat find themselves in a difficult position when attempting to produce a cat which conforms to the standards of the three major U.S. associations, CFA, TICA and ACFA. The CFA standard gives much leniency to the judge in determining the physical attributes of the individual cats. The TICA standard is quite specific in its terms of what is and what is not desirable, and plainly states the Disqualify and Penalize factors. The ACFA standard is the strictest, qualifying each part of the cat with detailed descriptions of what is to be considered acceptable.

Both the TICA and the ACFA standards provide an opening statement describing the general overall impression that is desired in the Birman.

GENERAL: TICA Standard. (ACFA standard not provided, Ed.). The Sacred Cat of Burma is a longhaired colorpoint cat with white feet. He is imposing in appearance, medium to large in size, with heavy boning in proportion to size. Males are appreciably larger than females. He carries his tail erect, is healthy, muscular, and in perfect balance.

The unusual feature of the Birman which sets him apart from all the other cats in the show hall, is the perfection of his white markings, showing a symmetry and beauty unlike any other cat. In the CFA standard, it is the

head that carries the most points, emphasizing that it is the head which should be considered the most important attribute. The head and nose are unique and distinguish the cat even when the white gloves are short of perfection. However, "...no single attribute is to be emphasized over the over-all impression of a well-balanced, aesthetically beautiful cat." *ACFA Standard of Perfection, 1980.*

HEAD: TICA	30 points

HEAD: **Skull** - Strong, broad and rounded, slightly longer than wide. Forehead slopes back with a slight flat spot in front of the ears. **Nose** - Roman in shape, medium length, with nostrils set low. **Cheeks** - Full. **Jaws** - Heavy. **Chin** - Well-developed, forming perpendicular lines with upper lip.

HEAD: CFA. (inc. size & shape of eyes, ear shape & set) ... 30
 HEAD: Skull strong, broad, and rounded. Forehead slopes back and is slightly convex. There is a flat spot just in front of the ears.

Noteworthy is that it is the **skull** only that is described as being strong, broad and rounded, not the entire head, which is longer than wide, with the ears set

well to the outside, in a line with the outer corners of the eyes.

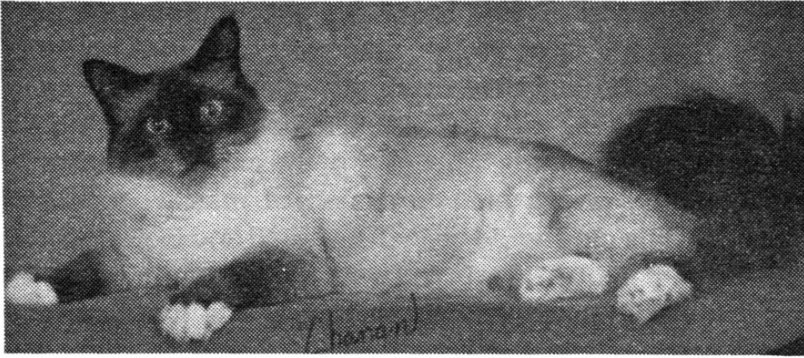
CFA. NOSE: Roman in shape, nostrils set low. Length in proportion to size of head.

Only the nose should be Roman in shape. The nose juts from the flat forehead in a striking profile, creating the effect of a "stop" where the muzzle meets the head; this is only a stop, a break should be severely faulted.

CFA. CHEEKS: Full. The fur is short in appearance about the face, but to the extreme outer area of the cheek, the fur is longer.

JAWS: Heavy

CHIN: Full and well-developed. Lower lip is strong, forming perpendicular lines with upper lip.

The cheeks, jaws and chin are all prominent. The chin is required to be full and well-developed, which adds to the strength of the profile. This is one of the more common faults which breeders are constantly working to overcome. Overall, the Birman should have a long head profile to balance the length of the body and tail. The face must be balanced. A "Dick Tracy" chin throws the entire face and head off balance. The shorter head profile which appears on shorter-muzzled Birmans should be faulted as it gives the cat a coarse, out-of-balance look.

TICA. EARS: Medium in height, set moderately far apart. Almost as wide at the base as tall. Open at the base with heavy furnishings. Rounded at the tip.

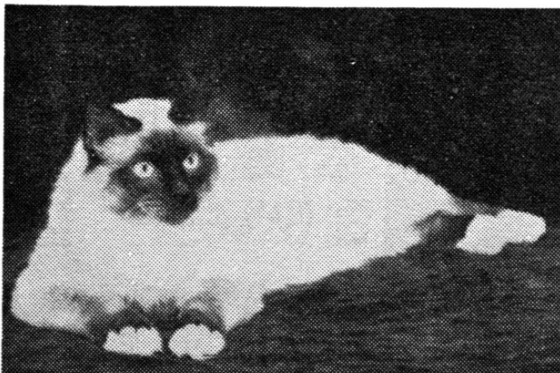
TICA. EYES: Large, almost round; wide-set, giving an alert, intelligent expression.

CFA. EARS: Medium in length. Almost as wide at the base as tall. Modified to a rounded point at the tip; set as much to the side as into the top of the head.

CFA. EYES: Almost round.

EYES: Blue in color. The deeper blue the better. Almost round in shape.

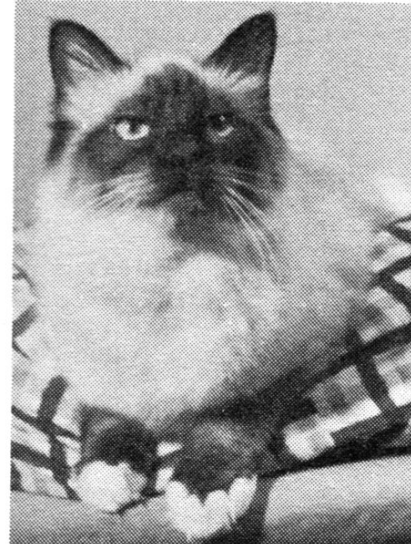

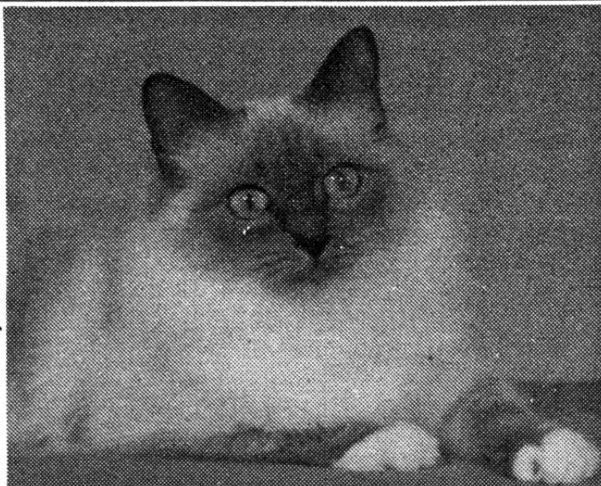

gives the cat its sweet "angelic" look that adds so greatly to its appeal. The desirable look of the eyes is a studied, penetrating gaze of deep blue, the nearer to violet the better, with a slight upward tilt at the outer corner. The eyes should not present an "Oriental" look but, rather, a dignified roundness, giving a pleasing expression to the face.

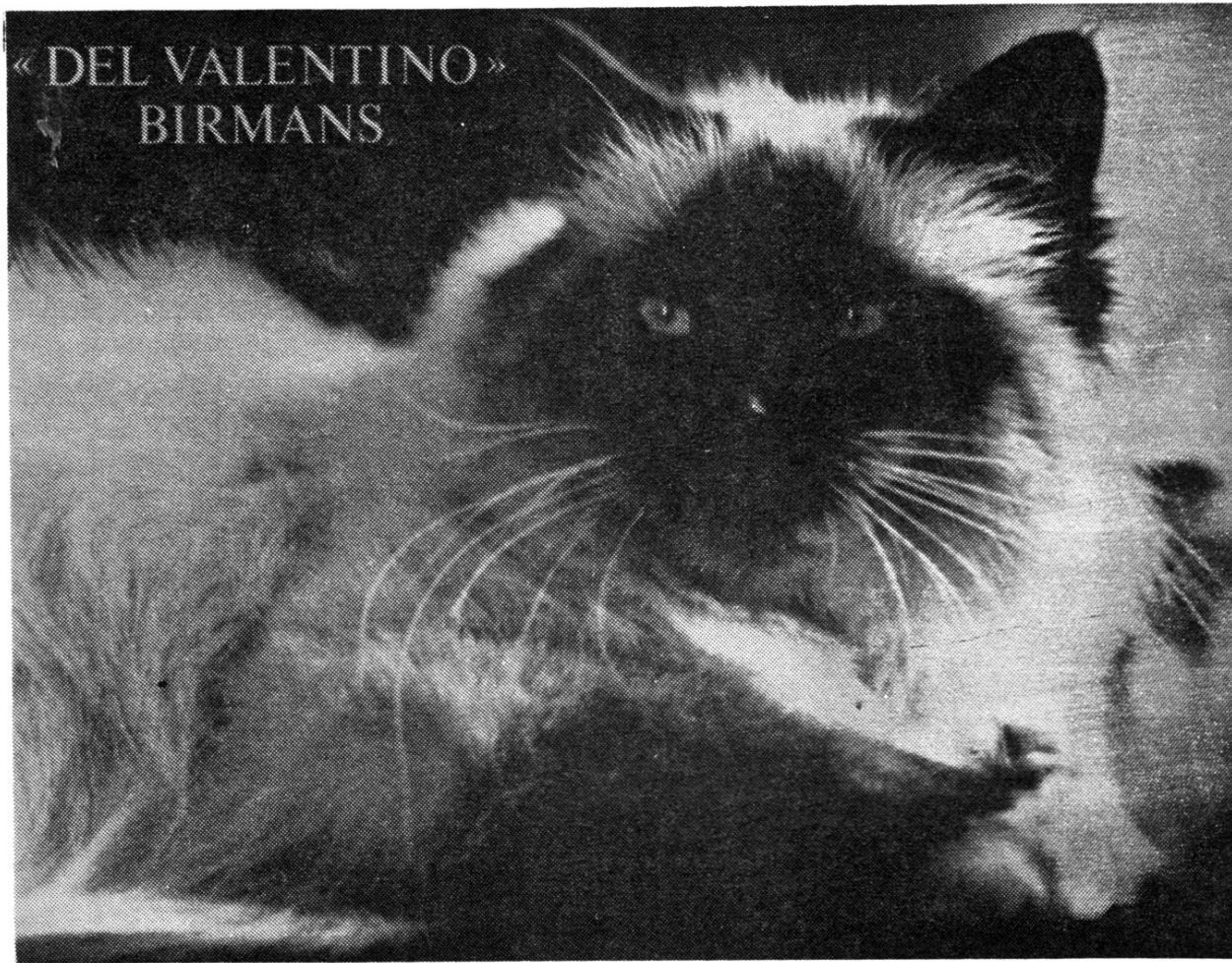

Not appearing to be particularly large (although there are indeed some very large Birmans), most people are very surprised at how much weight a Birman carries. Mature studs often weigh in excess of fifteen pounds. Generally the weight of the adult male ranges from ten to twelve pounds, with the adult female weighing about eight to nine pounds. The body of the cat should be long, not cobby, giving an impression of massiveness and weight. The cat should be well muscled and in good tone, but never flabby or fat. The cat should stand level, with the tail medium in length, balancing the length of the body. The tail is usually carried erect, especially at play, and looks like a great, flowing plume.

TICA. COAT:..... 10 points

COAT: Semi-long to long; silken in texture with no undercoat. Does not mat or tangle. Fur is slightly curly on the stomach. Heavy ruff is desirable, especially in males.

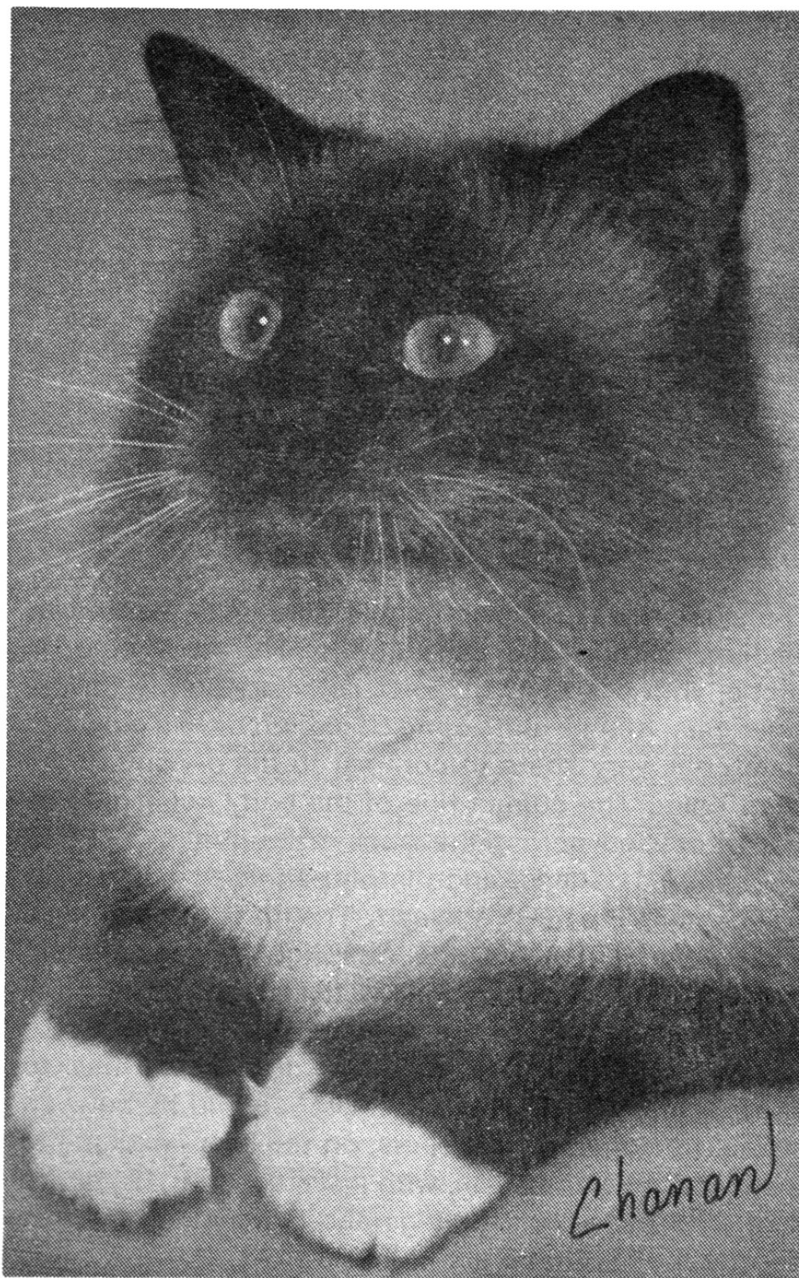

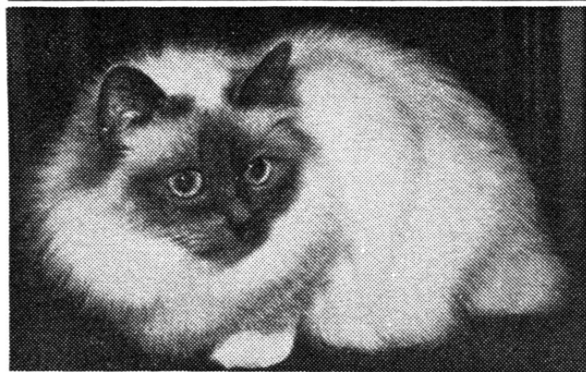

The Birman coat is abundant, velvety in texture, medium long, with a light and airy look, adding to the effect of a large cat. When properly cared for, the coat does not mat and is easy to work with. The Birman may be the original "wash-and-wear" cat of the show world! Grooming is a delight, as the cat seems to enjoy it almost as much as the owner.

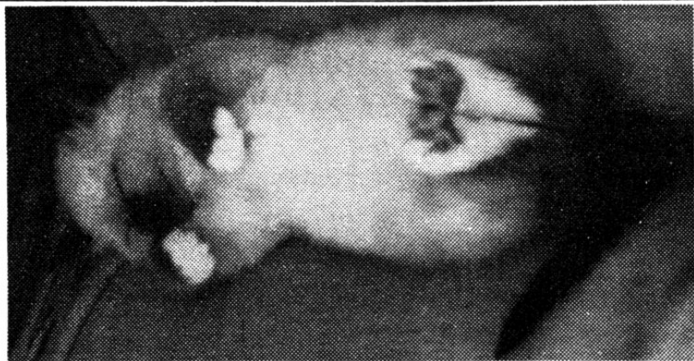

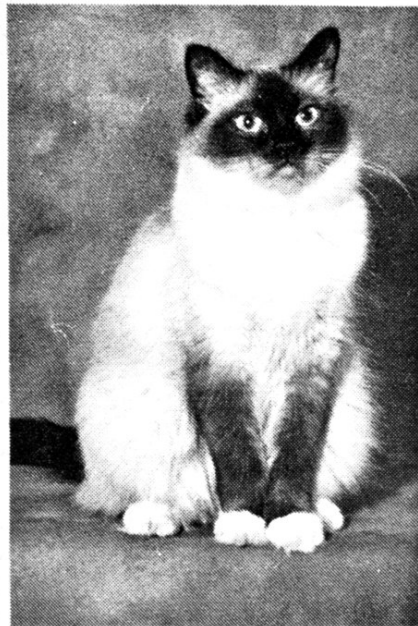
The coat has a golden glow which may darken to medium color as the cat matures. The body color is subtle, with shadings of point color appearing on the older cats. Kittens and young cats often have a glowing, clear coat, very sharp in contrast to the density of the point color. The golden hue of the body color may be gently defined across the back and shoulders. Point color should be dense and sharply patterned with little or no ticking in the mask and ears. The mask often forms a diamond pattern on the face, with slight tracings of point color to the ears. Occasionally ticking in the mask is caused by pregnancy and nursing in the females, and sometimes the use of medications will cause the mask to show some ticking. The point color should be an even shade, free of any white spots, on the legs - except the toes - tail, ears and mask, with mask covering the entire face. The pattern on the legs and tail should match in density the mask and ear coloring.

Front Paws: Front paws have white gloves ending in an even line across the paw at the third joint. **Back Paws:** White glove covers the entire paw and must end in a point, called the laces, that goes up the back of the hock.

PAW PADS: Pink preferred, but dark spot on toe/pad acceptable because of the two colors in pattern.

Although there has been some discussion about the "glove" and where the "third joint" is, it is generally felt

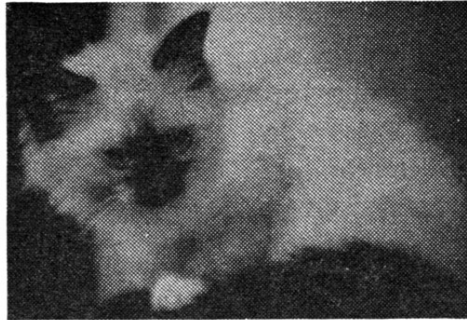

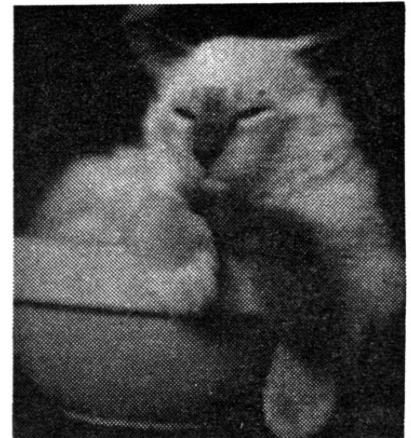

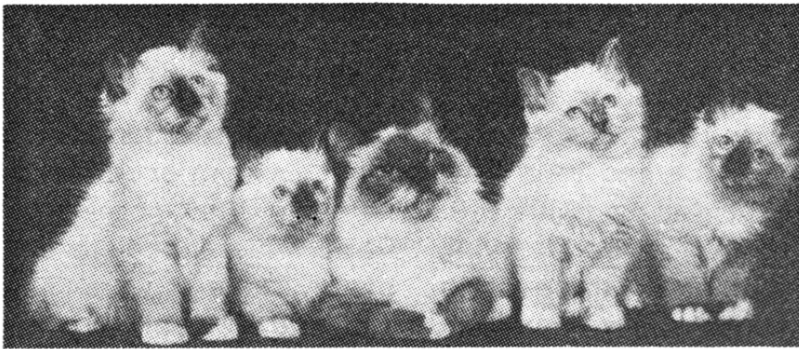

that the ideal location of the delineation of the white on the Birman's front paws should be where the toes meet the paw.

The gloves and laces, sometimes called gauntlets, are specifically described in many standards used worldwide, but nowhere, possibly, as well as in the Australian Standard, as follows:

The specified characteristic of the Birman are its four white paws, called gloves. They must be pure white and may stop at the base of the toes or go up as far as the joint between the foot and the leg, but not beyond this point. Some allowance may be made for gloves slightly longer on the back feet which is a frequent occurrence; the ideal is an even distribution on all four feet. On the back legs, the white should taper off to a point under the hock. Of paramount importance in the gloves is uniformity and

symmetry between both the front legs and the back legs. Absence of these markings precludes the awarding of a Challenge Certificate.

TICA. PENALIZE: White spotting on stomach or chest. Areas of white extending above the level of the dew pad on the front legs. Lack of one or both laces.

TICA. DISQUALIFY: Lack of white on any paw. Free areas of white in the mask, ears or tail.

CFA. PENALIZE: White that does not run across the front paws in an even line. Siamese type head. White shading on stomach and chest.

CFA. DISQUALIFY: Lack of white gloves on any paw. Kinked or abnormal tail. Crossed eyes. Incorrect number of toes. Areas of pure white in the points, except paws.

All standards call for a disqualification on the free white spots, areas of white in the colorpoints. Lack of a white

glove on any foot is also an immediate disqualifying factor, although careful breeding through the years has limited the appearance of this fault. If a lace is missing, the cat should just be penalized.

The appearance of free spots of the colorpoint within the prescribed white markings is becoming an increasing problem. Since the pink paw pads are allowed to contain mottling of the colorpoint color, it may be difficult to eliminate this trait. In any circumstances, however, the use of animals carrying this trait should be limited to a tightly controlled breeding program, and the continued appearance of free color spots should preclude continued use of that cat for breeding purposes. In judging, free color spots must be considered a color fault and penalized accordingly.

The Birman is a very loving cat, with a disposition that is ideal for any age.

A unique attribute is that many Birmans, when handled in a judging ring, will "woof" much as a dog does. This, by itself, is not cause for alarm. Very often, a Birman will woof and purr at the same time. Usually after breeding, this trait becomes less noticeable or disappears entirely.

When you see a Birman with outstanding type, excellent markings and in perfect show condition, you are looking at what we believe to be the most beautiful animal in the cat fancy.

CW International Magazine is highly indebted to the Birman breeders who contributed so much to making this article so comprehensive a presentation. We believe the cooperation of the breed clubs cannot be surpassed when a range of opinions is called for, especially since this feature is so widely studied by judges and breeders as well as students of the breed. 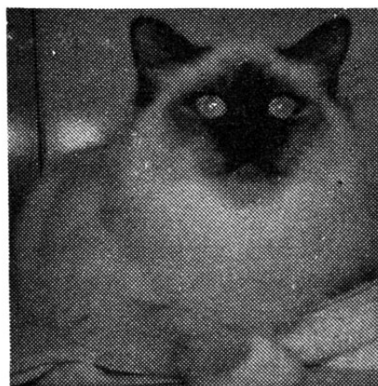
THE FIRST CHOCOLATE POINT BIRMAN KITTENS IN NEW ZEALAND

The kittens, one male, one female, arrived by chance from a Seal to a Seal mating. As a fairly new breeder I had no idea that I could get Chocolate Point kittens from these two cats.

At first, I thought these kittens were Albinos as as they were snow white, with violet blue eyes. Their colouring didn't start to come in until they were nearly 10 weeks old. The nose leather started to come in first a liver brown colour, then gradually the points came in, a lovely warm light milk chocolate shade.

The female, *MADAYA TANSY* is a very nice girl. She has nice body type, and her markings are very good. Her gauntlets are nice and even, her paw pads are all pale pink. Her coat is a beautiful ivory colour and seems to accentuate the milk chocolate colour of her points. The male, *MADAYA PLEASANT SURPRISE*, is not so evenly marked, and lacks long gauntlets. He excels in type,

being a very big, heavy cat with superb body and points colour and an outstanding long, thick coat.

I had a lot of trouble registering these kittens as none to date had been bred in New Zealand or Australia. I spent many hours writing letters to Birman breeders all over the world, trying to trace this chocolate gene. Although three-fourths of my letters were never answered, my pen friend in England eventually found out through hearsay that there had been some Birman interbred with a Seal Siamese who had chocolate in its line. Though these matings took place many, many years ago. It was thought pretty doubtful that the chocolate would come through now after so many years and generations have passed. Both the Sire and the Dam of my Chocolate Points are from very strong English lines and both these cats are closely related to each other. With my newly gathered information and armed with my old pedigree papers, I wrote to some of our NZCF genetic advisors who, after studying my letters, and my very old and vague pedigree papers, registered my lovely CHOCOLATE POINT BIRMANS.

To date, both cats have done extremely well for me on the show bench. As kittens they were both placed high in the honours at each show they attended. This was

from local and overseas judges. *Madaya Tansy* in her first show as a cat by only 4 days received BEST BIRMAN CAT, her first challenge certificate, 10th BEST CAT IN SHOW, and I received the 'Breeder's Award of Merit', which is a great honour here in New Zealand.

I hope in the future to breed more of these splendid Chocolate Point Birman. Hopefully, by breeding back to grandparents and parents (whom I still fortunately own), I will.

I have other Birman breeders and pet owners asking for Chocolate Point kittens already, as they think the colour contrast and the type of these kittens is very beautiful. To perfect these Chocolates is my new found ambition, and I hope to get this chocolate colour established world wide, as it is quite exquisite.

I would like to hear from anybody who breeds or has bred Chocolate Pt. Birman before as I still have a lot of unanswered questions myself.



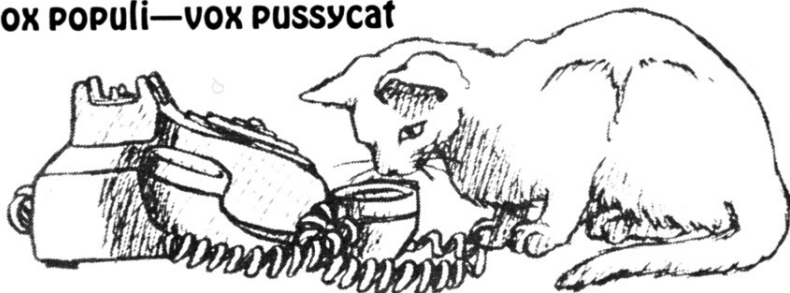

CITIZENS FOR ANIMAL PROTECTION

Dear Friends of Animals

Personally and on behalf of Citizens for Animal Protection, I want to thank you for taking the time to write the FCC, the Pacifica Radio Station, KPFT-FM, in Houston, and me, regarding the "Cat Torture" radio show (CW, March/April '81). Your letters made a lasting impression on KPFT-FM, one they're not likely to forget.

According to what we were told by the management at KPFT-FM, the following changes were put into effect: The *Art Gnuvo* night talk show was discontinued. Mr. Gnuvo was put on suspension for one month and probation for an additional two months. He went back on the air in June, but supposedly he is just playing music. All programming is now being carefully reviewed.

I, along with CAP's attorney, met with Sharon Maeda, Executive Director of Pacifica Foundation (based in Los Angeles) and Ray Hill, Station Manager. Miss Maeda was extremely defensive and uncooperative. She informed us there would be no further action on the matter. She insulted us "Cat People" as a whole and intimated we were all crazy. It would seem our hands are tied on a local level; and since the Federal Communications Commission (the broadcasting governing body) refuses to take any action, we can only hope Pacifica never commits such atrocities again.

Texas has an Anti-Cruelty Law (Sec. 42.11). Torture of an animal is punishable by fine and imprisonment. However, **there is no wording in the law regarding the advocacy of torture to animals.** In other words, to be punished under the present law, it would have to be proved Mr. Gnuvo actually tortured an animal in the studio.

It is my personal opinion the FCC has a responsibility to take some action concerning this deplorable situation and rather than get involved, it chose to hide behind the "Freedom of Speech Act".

It is also my personal opinion the whole Pacifica System is a festering sore on the face of America and should be eradicated. But, apparently under our present laws it is free to continue to advocate anything it wishes, regardless of how objectionable and harmful it might be.

CALICO CAT REGISTRY INTERNATIONAL

"Imagine that!" said the Calico cat,
Now there's a registry for me.'

Through all our years of cat breeding and forming clubs and registry associations there has been little notice taken of the Tortie-Calico cat, other than as a sub-registry for color under Breed. This is a shame as there are a number of rarities within, and only peculiar to, the combined colors of black and orange, and the diluted forms of each.

There are only two true colors in cat genetics. A cat is either black or orange. Black covers all colors from the darkest black, black browns, grays and blues. Orange covers from deep reds through the beiges and creams. White is not actually a color gene. It is a gene that controls 'spotting' (sometimes referred to as a 'masking gene') or the area to be covered with white. Easier to explain as if one put on a white coat with holes in it, the holes would allow the color to show. Thus a cat with no white is genetically the same as one with white. As the white, the tabby (stripes) or more properly called the 'agouti' gene is also separate from the color genes. So the tabby Tortie-Calicos are now eligible for registry as well.

Color classifications, set by the Calico Cat Registry International, are as follows:

- Tortoiseshell
- Black & Orange solid, brindled (striped)
- Blue & Cream solid, brindled
- Tortoiseshell & White (lower third white, i.e. Paws, chest, stomach)
- Black & Orange solid, brindled
- Blue & Cream solid, brindled
- Calico (2/3rds white — colors usually patching)
- Black & Orange solid, brindled
- Blue & Cream solid, brindled
- Color Points
- Black & Orange
- Blue & Cream

The sole purpose of the registry of these colors is to collect and disperse scientific information on these beautiful cats. For the last 20 years genetic scientists have been studying the breeding habits and rarities of these colored cats. Until recent years (1978) there has been no 'pool' to draw from other than scattered reports and comments. In 1978 the Calico Cat Registry came into existence to act as an information pool for both scientists and cat lovers. The registry has assimilated information from leading genetic scientists and noted cat breeders making all information available to the inquiring cat lover. Information compiled includes studies done on the rare males, unusual females, normal breeding expectations, genetic misarrangements, and historical background. It is interesting to note that although the male Tortie-Calico is very rare, it does definitely occur. And, as far as value is concerned, it is a buyer's market. They have been given away, and sold for thousands of dollars. Colleges, at one time, were purchasing them for study, but are not presently doing so, for lack of funded programs.

Officially established January 1978, the Calico Cat Registry International has members all across the United States as well as Canada. All cats with qualifying colors are eligible for registry: male, female, neuter or spay. Registry fee is nominal and a photo must be included with application. Registry of a cat includes membership of the owner, pink slip for the cat, ability to purchase the registry Handbook at a reduced rate, and access to any current and upcoming information on these cats. It is through means of registry that science can gain more information on these unique cats.

There are still great strides to be made for the Tortie-Calico cat and this is only the beginning.

CFA'S REGIONAL AWARD WINNERS 1980-81



The Persian Breed again headed the Regional Breed Composition chart holding 40% or more of all regional wins. Of CFA's 26 recognized breeds, 20 were represented as top Regional Winners. The Balinese, British Shorthair, Egyptian Mau, Havana Brown, Japanese Bobtail and Somali did not hold any Top Ten Cat/Top Five Kitten/or Top Five Cat in Premiership win this year—perhaps next year.

The Regional Awards Banquets take place every year in all 7 of CFA's regions between the end of May and the middle of June. The ceremonies range from afternoon luncheons to evening banquets. Some regions even pattern their awards program after CFA's National Awards presentation, including slide presentations of the winning cats. Regional Winners lists also varied from the practical listing of cats to a full presentation booklet bound and printed for the participants in the Northwest and the Southwest Regions. The Midwest region even put out a post-awards special edition newsletter which included photos of the awards ceremony. Regional awards provided the deserved recognition to many breeders and exhibitors who may not campaign for twelve months of the year, but have beautiful specimens of their breed.

Just got your May/June magazine Loved your reply to the woman who wanted a nonallergenic exotic and rare breed of cat to declaw. Indeed your reply for her to acquire a stuffed cat fit the situation. Less emphasis was placed on one problem I have seen more than once, and this was her desire for an exotic and rare breed, with no particular knowledge of nor attraction for any particular breed.

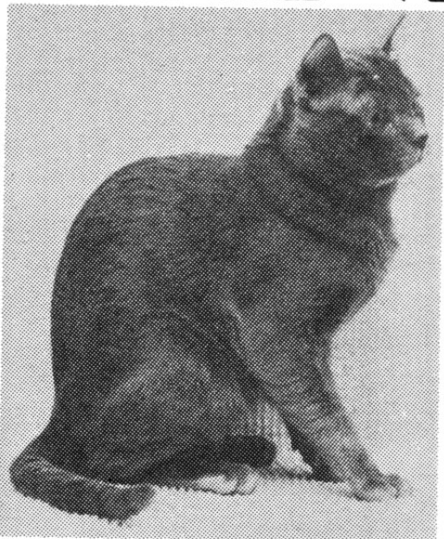
I have seen this situation before where all they want is a rare and expensive object for their home, like a piece of furniture. Preferably one which will cause them not to bother hence the frequent desire of this type of purchaser to want to declaw the animal. I feel it should be emphasized that all breeders should be very wary of any prospective buyer who wants "a rare breed". A prospective buyer should be questioned about why he/she wants this breed of cat. If there is nothing that appeals to the buyer about either the breed's looks, or behavior which has caused the initial interest in **that** breed over others, but merely the rarity of the breed... think seriously about the type of home these people would provide the animal, and how long they will remain allured by the mere rarity of the breed. Will they dump the cat along with the furniture when they remodel? It wouldn't surprise me.

Judging the EXHIBITORS

OR

“LIFE IN THE FOUR-RING CIRCUS”

Nobody gets off scot-free.

We really must rank the exhibitors among some of the more rare and exotic creatures encountered at a cat show. Their appearances and mannerisms are to be expected from beings who get their jollies by PAYING to haul themselves and their animals to shows on weekends. All this normally takes the type of determination, perseverance and organization that has seldom been seen in the Western World since the last Napoleonic Campaign; PLUS an essential broad streak of masochism.

Exhibitors can also be categorized by relative conformance to stereotype. Some types make shows entertaining; some make them a real pleasure. We gratefully draw our friends and long-term acquaintances from them. Some types are the PITS.

Fortunately, the latter are few, though their relative rarity and high visibility tend to make them stick in the mind. We will take the liberty of introducing some of the more annoying ones below.

We all have certain idiosyncracies. Perhaps we can sit back and look at ourselves from time to time; hopefully we will not find any of these categories sounding uncomfortably familiar.

1. **GREEKS BEARING GIFTS.** These people ignore the show rules asking that their animals or catteries be free from infectious viruses, bacteria or larger beasties for a certain time span before a show. They share their contributions with a lavish hand. Three days to one week after being benched in their vicinity, you find your cats coming down with all sorts of strange flora and fauna, and remember the exhibitor who blithely explained, “Oh, yes. I guess she picked it up at ----- two weeks ago,” as her livestock proceeded to sneeze loudly and moistly all over you and yours. Homicide crosses your mind.

2. **OLD SMOKEY.** The cigar/pipe/cigarette this fellow smokes smells like it has passed its 40th birthday — and spent that 40 years in the Chicago Stockyards. You sit there and watch your Siamese develop copper eyes and a

dry, hacking cough. This exhibitor, after smoking this stuff most of his adult life, has become impervious to hints, indignant about requests, and can only occasionally be moved by tears or threats. That sort of attitude makes smoking hazardous to his health. The solution is a frontal attack with a spray bottle of disinfectant if you happen to be 6' 6" and drive trucks, or a request for rebenching if you are the less assertive type.

3. **SOCIABLE SAL.** She takes up your storage space, the area in front of your cage, your chair and, occasionally, your ashtray, dishes or food — for her friends, casual acquaintances, or potential customers. They settle in for the duration. You can go swipe the chairs from aforementioned friends' cages, or bribe a small child to make a scene — a distraction to remove them from your chair. Of course, you will be glared at for taking your chair back, but what kind of consideration did you expect from this crowd? These folks carry on a running conversation in the show ring while you are trying to hear what the judge is saying about your cat. Put three Sals in the front of a ring where Silent Sam is judging, and you may as well stay home for all the information you'll get.

4. **THE SORE LOSER.** You've met him. I don't need to explain him. He can ruin a show for you, the winners, the judges, and himself. This is the original ego-trip exhibitor. The cats don't care about the ribbons. With the attitude the Sore Losers express, it might be better for all concerned if they entered themselves as exhibits and let their cats stay home and rest. A mighty drawing card would be two Sore Losers in a corner slugging it out for a Best Cat award. The only control over a Sore Loser is another Sore Loser, because a Sore Loser is so very often also a Sore Winner that winning is not a cure, but merely a palliative.

5. **GOD'S LITTLE HELPER.** Have you ever watched the Miss America Pageant and wondered at the artificial perfection of the contestants: capped teeth, nose jobs, dyed

hair, body makeup? Well, my dears, reliable rumor has it that the same desire to improve upon Nature beats in the hearts of certain showcat owners. Even shorthair exhibitors must have concluded that "grooming chalk" was not invented for writing on blackboards. Dye has been with us ever since Great Aunt Tillie decided she'd rather show a Self-Red than a Copper-Eyed White. Cosmetic surgery also rears its head — from docking tail tips in newborn kittens to locket removal and dental corrections in older ones. Allegations are difficult to prove, and judges cannot be expected to catch some changes without the use of an X-ray or a chemical spectrophotometer. Since winning is self-reinforcing, there are no obvious solutions. The obvious losers are the buyers into the bloodlines of artificial winners. I would love to see what a really determined meddler could do if properly trained in genetic engineering, since that would be carrying dissatisfaction with Ma Nature's basic product to its logical conclusion.

6. PAUL POLITICS. Judge Peter Politics must of course have his complement among exhibitors, or this peculiar symbiosis could not exist. Exhibitor Paul Politics can easily be spotted by a certain facial characteristic: no, the high color on his nose is not suntan. Paul's cats may grade anywhere from excellent to poor in quality, but he is an insecure cuss who does not have enough faith in them to let them make it on their own, no matter how good they may be. Whether or not his obvious endeavours to curry favor actually do any good is debatable, since almost all judges are well inured to such behavior. However, the nagging suspicion will always be awakened in his fellow-exhibitors that all Paul's animals' wins should be taken lightly. It damages his sales chances with other breeders in the long run, as the word spreads that his cats

may not be making it on merit. A confrontation between two Paul Politics bent on influencing the same judge is almost as much fun to watch as that between two Sore Losers. (for Paul read also Paula Politics).

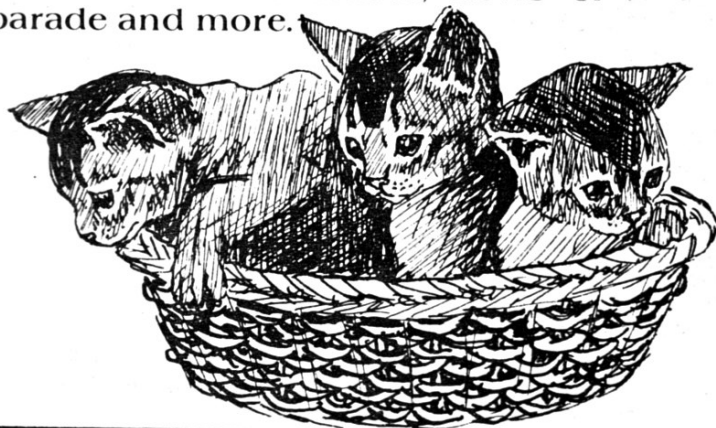
7. LOUDMOUTH LOU. The resident expert, critic and Mouth-About-Town second-guesses the judges, or first-guesses, if the judges are slow. Tells you why your cat is a) winning, or b) losing, usually in a voice that can be heard three rows away. Can switch sides of mouth without losing a beat. Knows all the latest gossip, spreads same. "Facts", real or fancied, are her coins of exchange; Lou figures her info buys acceptance into any circle. Lou is often a novice trying to prove "in the know". Since the data has a better-than-average chance of being wrongly inferred, wrongly or incompletely overhead, or passed on from an actively malicious source, Lou is poison either to listen to or speak with. Maintain a sympathetic, slightly glazed expression, and let the volume wash on through. Use your judgment in hearing, and don't pass on anything. Nothing says you have to pay Lou back in her own coin. But if you fail to respond in at least a diplomatic manner, YOU will be the subject of Lou's tirade at next week-end's show. Solution: disappear when you see Lou coming. If Lou is female, the Men's Lav is usually the safest refuge, but don't count on escaping a determined gossip, even there.

Shows are times of competition and pressure and, as such, can bring out the beast in anyone. But if one of the above behavior patterns is starting to become habitual, do yourself the good of lightening up a little. You are taking the whole thing too seriously, and risking losing your dilettante status. We are here to learn from and enjoy each other; please don't let the learning be negative. And I'll do my best to be positive, too.



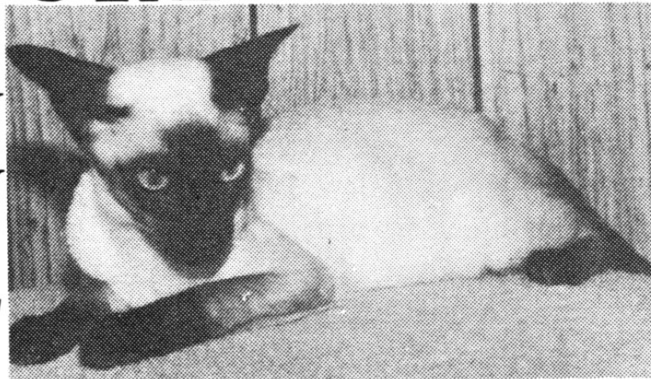
