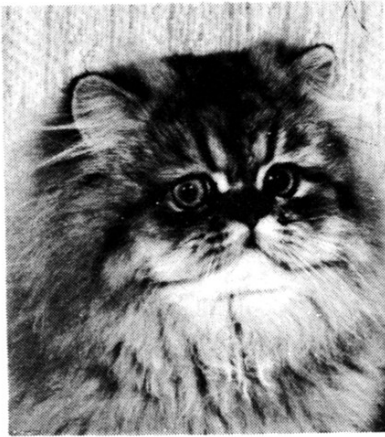

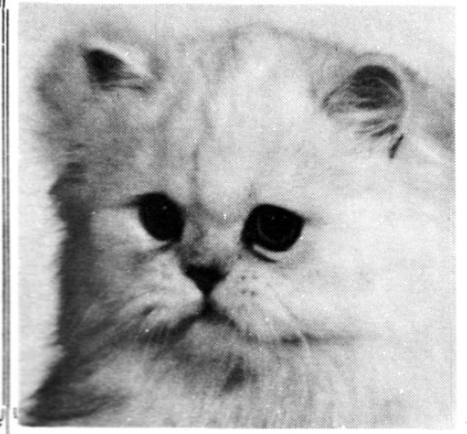

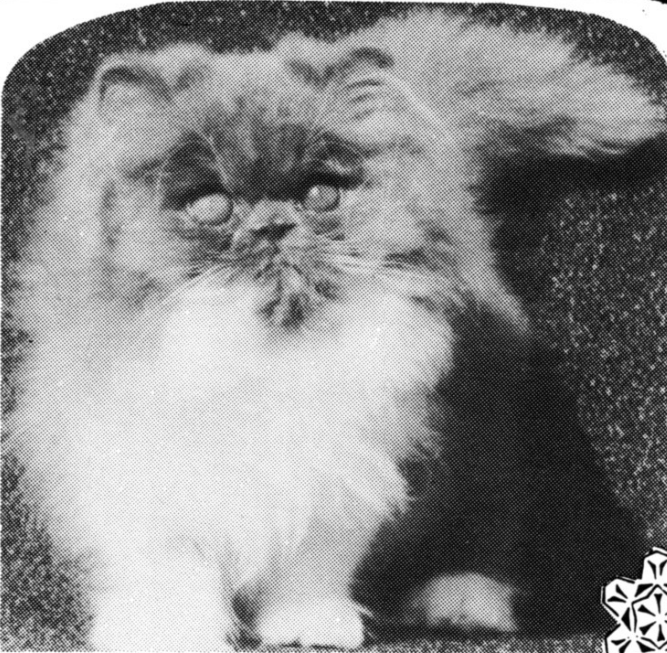

February was a busy month for ACFA with all eyes on Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada — the site of the 1982 Annual Board of Directors Meeting, Open Membership Meeting and the Annual Banquet and Championship Show. A most successful week was enjoyed by all in attendance. The location for this year's affair was the Downtown Winnipeg Convention Centre and adjoining Holiday Inn. One could not ask for a better setting, with fine accommodations, excellent food and a most congenial atmosphere.

PRICE FREEZE DECLARED !

For the second consecutive year, one of the first orders of business by the Board was to review the previous year's financial Audit and the proposed budget for 1982. The Financial Report reflected a 21.6% increase in gross income with an overall 30—35% increase in business for 1981. The end result was over a \$3,600. profit for the year. Based on these figures the Board once again placed a "Price Freeze" on all Service Fees charged by ACFA. Members and customers will now enjoy 1980 prices throughout the entire calendar year of 1982. This action has truly lived up to the name that ACFA is the "Inflation Fighter" of the Cat Fancy.

SCOTTISH FOLD ACCEPTED

An excellent presentation was given by Mr. John Bodner, Western Canada Regional Director, on behalf of the Scottish Fold breeders. It was requested the Board accept this breed for Championship competition in ACFA. After a brief discussion and a review of the standards presented, the Scottish Fold was accepted *effective immediately!* This now brings the total of accepted breeds in ACFA to 27.

NEW BOARD POSITION PROPOSED

The General Manager, Ed Rugenstein, submitted a proposal he be removed as a voting member of the Board of Directors and replaced by a 2nd Vice President. The Board position of 2nd Vice President would be filled by a general election of the membership at large, the same as the President and 1st Vice President. Duties of the Vice Presidents would be: 1st Vice President, advisor to the President on Association affairs in North America; and, 2nd Vice President, advisor to the President on

Association affairs involving the International Division. The General Manager would still serve as the Secretary/Treasurer of the Corporation, attend all ACFA Board meetings and act as an advisor to the Board on the business affairs of the Association. The proposal was accepted by the Board and has been referred to the membership for their approval on the April 1982 Ballot.

PARADE OF ROYALTY SOLD ?


Since the inception of ACFA, the Association has provided its Year Book of Award Winners, The Parade of Royalty, in a soft bound format. This publication has been provided free to the members as part of their ACFA Annual Membership dues. However, by the request of many members and clubs, it has been requested the Board consider a hard bound edition, to be sold to those desiring this publication. A feasibility study was presented to the Board by the General Manager defining costs, publication and a sales program. The tentative program reflected that should such a decision be made by the members, the publication would be sold to members at a reduced price as compared to the regular purchase price established for non-members, free copies would be provided advertisers, and the Annual Membership dues be reduced from the present \$10/year. The Board has referred this issue to the membership vote in April for their decision.

MEMBERSHIP DECISIONS

The ACFA Members will have many important decisions to make in regards to the future of their Association on the April 1982 Ballot. Such Amendments to the Rules of the Association will include: Changing the date of the Annual Convention to late Summer to include an Annual Awards Banquet; providing a greater voice for the Breed Sections in establishing specific registration rules, in addition to Standard changes, as pertains to their specific breed; revision of the ACFA Judging program; and, a total revision and update of the Registration Rules as pertains to Hybrid and Natural breeds.

Last but not least, the Abyssinian Breed Section will be voting on the acceptance of the "Blue" Abyssinian for Championship competition.

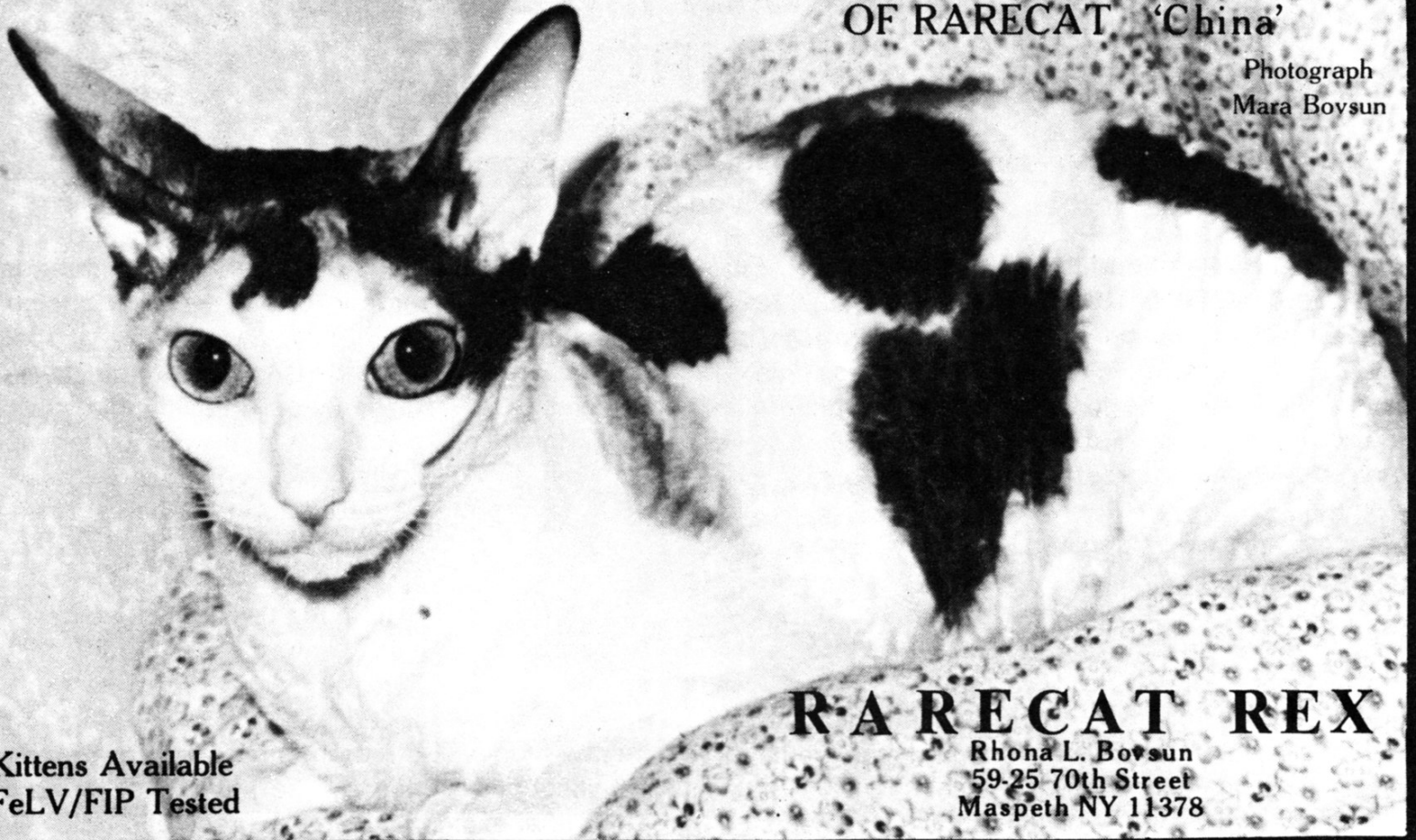

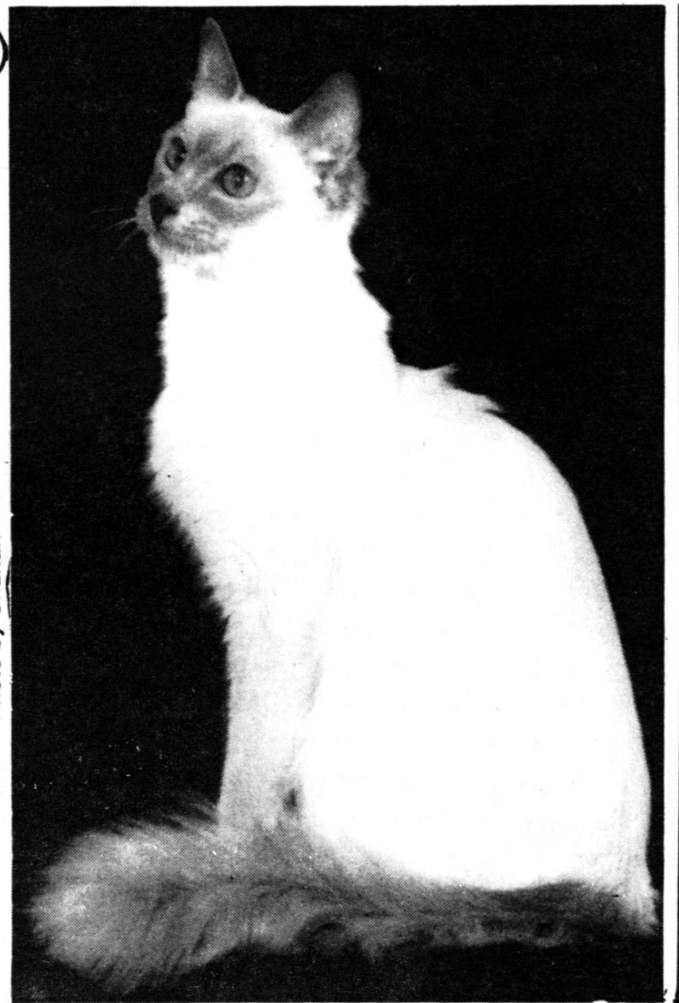

THE "INDEPENDENTS" IN EUROPE

In his article "Federation Internationale Feline (F.I.Fe)" CAT WORLD INTERNATIONAL MAGAZINE Vol.9 No.6, Mr. Barrie C. Jimmieson describes the European cat fancy. Being president of F.I.Fe and also of the affiliated German association he logically painted a picture in F.I.Fe colours which for foreigners might give a completely wrong impression and, therefore, needs correction.

F.I.Fe, no doubt, is a strong organisation which has very much influenced the history of the European cat fancy. But the so called independents ("dissidents" in F.I.Fe terminology) have done this as well. In ten European countries (not counting the U.K. with GCCF) there are nearly 50 associations with nearly as many members as in F.I.Fe: in some countries the independents are by far stronger than F.I.Fe.

All these associations have mutual agreements for reciprocal recognition, i.e. a cat registered in one of these associations can be shown in all the others and all its wins are fully recognized by the registration body. For example to become a Champion in Europe a cat must win 3 challenges for championship at 3 different shows. These wins might be made in 3 different associations but still the registering association will recognize the Champion status. If an American stays for 1—2 years in Europe he might become a member of one association without re-registration of his cat(s) (until offspring are born) and show in all associations fully competing for Champion, International Champion, etc.

For sure, some of these associations, but not the major part, have split off from F.I.Fe - especially during the last couple of years, mainly caused by cost reasons. To manage a multi-thousands organisation like F.I.Fe requires paid workers which reflects in high membership and pedigree fees and also in show entries. Independent officials running associations with each 200 up to 2,000 members work voluntarily without being paid. The result is fees which are only about half those of F.I.Fe!

No wonder that within the last 18 months about 2,000 F.I.Fe members became Independents in Germany and Switzerland alone.

All independent associations have their own registration bodies, stud books, etc., some computerized. There are no other but certified pedigrees with a minimum of 5 generations.


The Independents organize about 70 international shows per year thereby offering a wide choice to all exhibitors. The judging is always international, with judges from independent associations and Great Britain's GCCF. Currently our official judges list shows 101 judges. The judges have to fill out a written report for each cat giving detailed comments on coat, head, eyes, body, tail, condition and additional remarks. The reports, including a qualification certificate, are handed to the exhibitors.

The judges are trained thoroughly for several years. Aside from their theory and genetics studies they must go through a 2-step training program, first working many times as stewards and second even more often as trainee-judges. Both steps must be proven by written qualifications signed by the judge they worked with. Their final exam. is taken per breed and colour in both theory and practise by a committee of at least two judges during a show and/or a special examination day.

As a result of our strict breeding rules and thorough genetic planning the quality of cats is high and easily withstands any comparison. Certainly, overseas judges, including Americans, will confirm this.

Knowing all these facts, to qualify us as local clubs is speaking a bit too lightly of us Independents. We have reason to be proud of the job we have done and of our successes.

TICA's Third Semi-Annual Meeting was graciously hosted by the *Triad Tar Paws* in Greensboro, N. Carolina, March 10-14. Held at the Airport Hilton Inn, it was another successful event resulting in additional innovative features for our Association.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MEETING:

A genetically based, Uniform Description of Colors, presented by Solveig M. Pflueger, was approved to become a part of the standards. Each Breed Section, *except those which are currently recognized in only one color or only one pattern*, will select a group or groups of colors and a pattern or patterns for the breed. Ballots for membership vote by Breed Section will be mailed during the month of June. The proposal makes little substantive change, with the exception of some name changes: —

Caramel will be known as *cinnamon*

Chestnut will be known as *chocolate*

Any Color & White Division will be known as the *Particolor Division*

The Red Aby will be known as the *Cinnamon Aby* and the *Bluecream* will be known as the *Blue Tortie*. The proposal does provide for a *Frost Havana* (Lavender), *Odd Eyes* or *Blue Eyes* in *Calico* cats, *Silver Tabbies* in the *Shaded Division*, and *Goldens* in the *Tabby Division*.

There will be separate divisions in breeds which recognize both a pointed and a non-pointed cat.

Copies of the standardized color description will be available shortly by contacting your Regional Director. Pursuant to a vote of the respective breed sections, *Blue* and *Frost Abyssinians* have been recognized for championship competition, and the *Kashmir* breed is abolished.

"Outstanding Sire" and "Outstanding Dam"—two new TICA titles — Any female that has produced five Grand Champions, or any male that has sired ten Grand Champions is eligible. The offspring must have become Grands in TICA as *whole* cats.

TICA's participation in AA Scoring was tabled until the Annual Meeting.

The proposal to transfer credible examples of a breed from HHP to Alter Section failed.

In towns and cities, where the life expectancy of the free roaming cat is *maybe* 2½ years, this safe balcony offers a happy solution for not only the apartment dweller, but the house owner also.

We live in a second floor garden apartment. Outside of our bedroom is a balcony 7½' long - 3½' wide. The balcony was not used because it was too small for people and not safe for the cats.

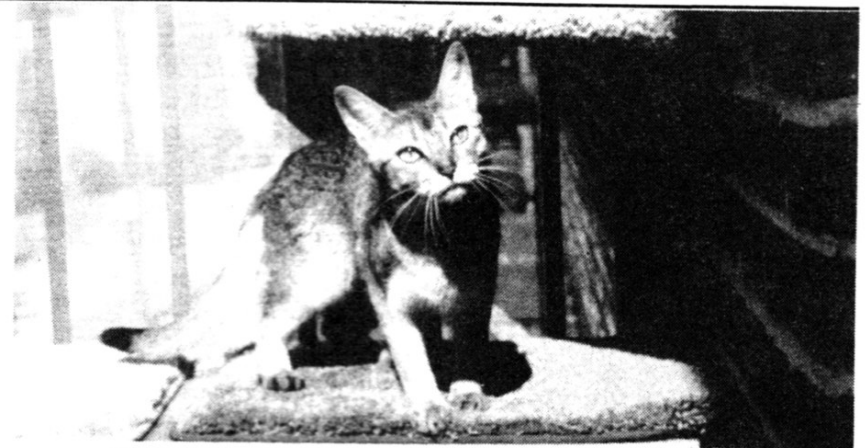
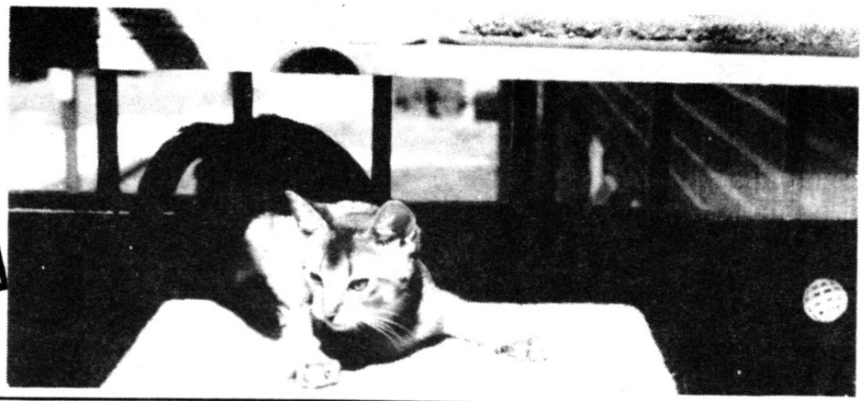
A friend, Jacqueline Curry, *Pooka Abyssinians*, was visiting one day and started to ask questions about the balcony. One thing led to another and she decided to enclose the balcony for our cats. I checked with the Resident Manager telling her of our plans and was told that whatever was done had to be unobtrusive.

And so it began. The plan called for two side panels, a front panel and a top panel. The frames of each panel are Philippine Mahogany painted black — the color of the balcony. The screening used for each panel is aluminum. The edges of the screening were stapled to the frames, then covered with beading all of which faces out against the balcony rail. The cats cannot possibly get claws into the staples.

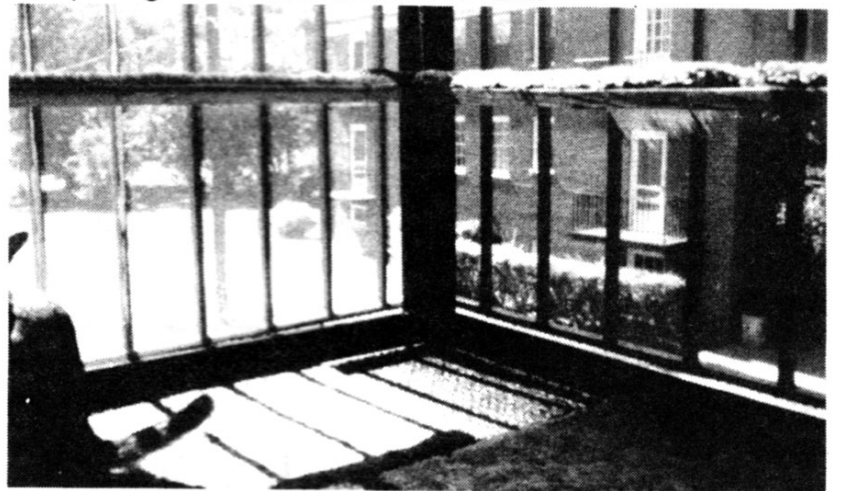
The front panel was the first to be put into place. The side panels were then slipped into place; each secured with a U-bolt which faces out. Again, nothing protrudes inside of the enclosure that could possibly hurt the cats.

The top panel fits securely over the top of the balcony rail, each corner secured to the front and sides with hooks and eyes. In addition, the top is bolted to the wood panel on the screen door. The bottom half of the screen door was sawed off, the rough edges sanded and painted so that the cats can go out or come in at will.

There is pine shelving along the left side and across the front, L-shaped, that is suspended securely by chains. On this right side is a lower shelf suspended by chain and above this shelf is a triangle - the type used in cages at cat shows.



The pine shelves are 12" wide. Each was coated three times with polyurethane making the shelves weatherproof. The floor and shelves are carpeted — the carpeting removable if there is rain.



The balcony is in the back of the building and overlooks large grassy areas with huge trees. The cats watch the birds and squirrels, people walking dogs, and children playing. They are totally enclosed and safe. Best of all, they get lots of fresh air and sunshine.

The enclosure is indeed unobtrusive. Only when very close to the building can one see screening and a bit of shelving. Since the cats enjoy the enclosure so much, the next project is to winterize with the addition of removable plexiglass panels.

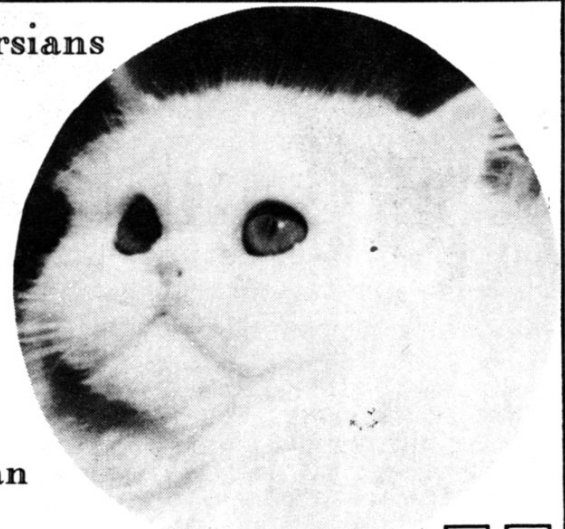

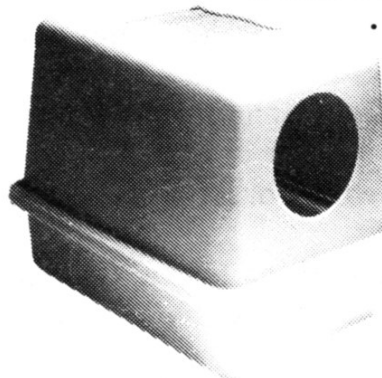

CFA EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING, February 13—15, 1982, ATLANTA, GEORGIA.

Club Membership: 593 clubs complete the membership of CFA.

Breeds and Standards:

Devon Rex — A Provisional breed in CFA since May 1, 1981. Request for Championship status as of May 1, 1982 denied. The Devons, as of the Board meeting, had not been shown in all seven CFA Regions. A list of CFA breeders and registered CFA catteries was requested. Some fine examples of Devon Rex were examined by the Board.

Chartreux — Excellent examples of this breed were presented for Board examination. The Chartreux is currently a Miscellaneous breed in CFA.

Breed Standards affected by Board action in consideration of Breed Committee poll results: —

Abyssinian — The requested 'General' description change was accepted.

Bombay — The requested 'General' description change was accepted.

British SH — Changes and additions to the 'General' description, 'Head', 'Muzzle', 'Legs', 'Tail' & 'Disqualify' sections accepted.

Burmese — All requested Standard changes were accepted except those affecting 'Body', 'Legs & Feet', and 'Tail'.

Devon Rex — Changes in points allocation and 'Coat' description were accepted.

Egyptian Mau— Proposed standard change Point 2 was accepted.

Havana Brown— New standard was accepted.

Himalayan— Point 7, the request for championship for Seal Lynx Pt. and Blue Lynx Pt. was passed, to be one

color class. No change in the CH status of the Solid Lilac/Chocolate Himalayans.

Japanese Bobtail— Changes in 'General' description and 'Tail' were accepted.

Maine Coon— Points 1 & 2 were accepted closing the registry of the Maine Coon as of January 1, 1983. Kittens and cats born after 1/1/83 must be litter registered.

Manx— Point 5 passed changing from Disqualify to Severely Penalize if the Judge is unable to make the cat stand or walk properly.

Oriental SH— Requested deletion (Show Rule 277) of particolor smoke from the particolor class was accepted.

Persian— (General) Points 1 & 2 were accepted which adds the following sentences to the 'Disqualify' section of the Standard: "Any apparent weakness of the hind quarters. Any apparent deformity of the spine. Deformity of the skull resulting in an asymmetrical face and/or head.

Shaded Division — Point 1 passed.

Smoke Division — Point 1 passed recognising the Blue-Cream Smoke.

Rex— Addition to 'Head' description and realignment of Bicolor and Calico classes were accepted.

Siamese— 'General' description changes were accepted.

Turkish Angora— Changes to 'Ears', 'Eyes' & 'Disqualify', (kinks) were accepted.

The new Judging Program rules adopted June 25, 1981 were discussed in regard to Apprentice & Approval Pending judges. It has been suggested that Section VII is

too severe in regard to the number and location of shows that must be judged for advancement. It was moved and passed that these factors will be at the *discretion* of the Judging Program Chair in the future. *Trainees will continue* to train at two 'out of Region' shows.

All judges were recertified with the exception of: Helen McFadden, Ted Napolski, Nancy Nash, John Royal and Earl Sandefur. The status of these judges remains unchanged pending a hearing, if they so wish, at the June Board Meeting preceding the 1982 Annual Meeting.

Alternate Multi-Ring Show Format — Contact CFA Central Office or Regional Director.

The expanded format shows (six or eight judgments per cat) are an alternate format for license, *effective immediately*. Permission from the CFA Board is no longer required prior to license. The Board has recommended the following for the 6/8 ring format shows:—

- a) Twelve judging cages in every judging ring - a MUST for an 8 ring show.
- b) Two stewards and two clerks in every ring.
- c) Two Master Clerks for an 8 ring show.
- d) Two Announcers for an 8 ring show.
- e) Catalog Format — Standard format now in use with 6/8 lines to the right.
- f) 9:00 AM Sunday starting time for the 6/8 ring shows.

Show Scoring for All Shows as of May 1, 1982. Presented by Bill Lee. Contact CFA Central Office or Bill Lee, 1620 Old Town Drive S.E., Grand Rapids MI 49508.

CFA will retain the present scoring system as has been the practice of the past with the following additions or changes, effective May 1, 1982: —

- A. Total points scored for each show will be maintained as well as the number of rings in the show.
- B. At the completion of the show season the total show points for each show will be divided by the number of rings for that particular show and an equivalent show ring value (ESRV) for the corresponding number of rings will be credited.
- C. A numerically sorted tabulation will be constructed in descending order for each cat of all the equivalent show ring values.
- D. Total accrued points will be the sum of the highest 100 ESRV's for each cat.

All **Best of the Bests** shows will have a 5-ring divisor. (Requested by CFA Central office).

Show Scheduling — Two proposals were approved for presentation to the delegates at the 1982 Annual Meeting. Les Buryrn and Diana Doernberg compiled these. For full details see the CFA Spring Quarterly.

In response to a resolution enacted by the delegates to the 1981 Annual Meeting of the Association, President

Friend appointed a Board committee to investigate methods for eliminating or lessening the impact of "paper clubs" on CFA elections. The committee report was discussed by the Executive Board at its October 1981 and February 1982 meetings, and was adopted for presentation as a proposed Constitutional Amendment at the 1982 Annual Meeting. The committee report is reprinted in full (Pp 26—28) of the 1981 Winter Quarterly. Minutes of the Board meetings appearing therein and in the 1982 Spring Quarterly should be consulted for discussions and changes.

Show Insurance — for clubs producing shows AFTER July 1, 1982 will cost \$20.00 instead of \$30.00. If a club has already licensed its show and paid the \$30.00 insurance charge, Central Office will credit that club. This is for all shows held after the anniversary date of the policy, July 1.

Insurance — Definition of our Coverage — presented by Rich Jones —

The CFA insurance policy as it applies to CFA member clubs is a liability policy. It is in force to protect CFA member clubs and CFA in the event either or both are legally responsible for injury to people or damage to property.

Until July 1, 1981, individual clubs purchased policies limited to legal liability. As the result of delegate action in June 1981, CFA now has a policy which provides much broader coverage for the individual club at high limits of liability.

Included in the coverages, we note Premises Medical Payments for \$500.00 each person; \$10,000.00 each accident. This extends to the CFA club's operations and provides coverage for the *moral obligation* a club might have for the payment of medical bills for people injured at a club function. Medical Payments Insurance is intended to answer the public relations need to pay bills incurred by members of the public injured at shows. We have been able to cover medical bills incurred by a judge, an exhibitor and a club member. It must be emphasized, however, that our policy is not an Accident and Health or a Hospitalization contract, it is a \$1,000,000. Liability Policy.

The Hartford Insurance Co. has projected a premium due July 1, 1982 of some \$2,000. less than that paid July 1, 1981. This, even with the addition of the Accident Policy for the Judges Panel, Officers and Directors, plus an updating of values on property at the Central Office. The Accident Insurance for the Judges, Officers and Directors provides: \$25,000. Accidental Death & Dismemberment, \$2,000. Accident Medical. Coverage is in force now for when a Judges leaves his/her home until he/she returns following a show. (For complete report, see Spring Quarterly).

HEGIRA SIAMESE

Almost from the moment of birth 'Jacko' appeared to be destined to glory. His proud head with 'fly away' ears was always held higher than his littermates', his long elegant neck matched a long, slim body, and a super whip tail. He had the air of someone very special.

My wife and I had an understanding — we shared the work, but all our cats belonged to her. However, should a quality male Seal-Point Siamese kitten appear on the scene, he was mine. I had his name ready and waiting — I'd held it in reserve for an extra special fella.

When somewhat younger, and a compulsive and very superstitious card-player, I had an affinity with the Jack of Hearts. Bob Dylan, the American folk singer, of whom I am a big fan, wrote a song whose central character was a card-playing Scarlet Pimpernel. His name, the Jack of Hearts. The card became, for me, a lucky talisman, a mystical, enigmatic guardian.

HEGIRA JACKO HEARTS certainly proved to be a very lucky name. 'Jacko's first year on the Show Bench was a 'magic-carpet-ride'. He won 6 out of 7 shows as a kitten, including Best of Breed at the National and Best in Show at the Scottish. His truly outstanding career as a kitten was crowned by the **BRITISH CAT WORLD AWARD of BEST SIAMESE KITTEN, 1980.**

At his first adult show, the Preston & Blackpool, he won his first Challenge Certificate and was nominated for Best in Show. Two weeks later, at the Northern Siamese Show, he was awarded his second C.C., and had us 'walking on air' when he was voted Best Exhibit in Show. This show is the Siamese 'Mecca', North of London area, and a thrilling experience for us all. One month on, and he gathered the vital third C.C. and became our very first Siamese Champion. We were most proud.

'Jacko' was slow to mature, but was fortunate enough to collect 2 Reserve Grands early in the season. At the Cheshire Area show he won all his classes, including the elusive Grand.

He's difficult to define, certainly not a 'flashy' cat, but extremely well balanced. Beautiful, large, well-set ears, and a magnificent tail — pretty good in-between bits, too. His most outstanding feature, however, has to be his temperament. Born to be shown, he loved to be handled and admired.

'Jacko's return to the Scottish Show, this time as an adult, brought his second Grand Challenge and a repeat Best in Show win, a rather unique double. Many feel that U.K. Best in Show procedures are too distressing for the cats, and they are gradually being phased out. 'Jacko' always played his cards right, with the calm of an old campaigner, and loved it.

One month later, at the Lancashire Show, he received the accolade we always felt he richly deserved — he became a Grand Champion. The judge, Mr. John Shewbridge, wrote the shortest report 'Jacko' ever received, "*Far too well known for me to sing his praises, congratulations to his owner for a wonderful cat.*" Succinct, but speaking volumes. We were naturally very elated but the over-riding feeling was one of quiet relief — *he'd made it.*

Convention in the U.K. is for a Grand Champion to retire soon after gaining his title. Compare the quality of the exhibits and the numbers being shown with the number who make Grand and the reasons become obvious. However, to complete the shows entered prior to gaining the title is forgivable and 'Jacko' had been booked into three more shows.

The first of these involved sailing over to Northern Ireland. It was the wildest night of the year and the trip was decidedly rough. 'Jacko' proved to be the better sailor, as I was very pale at the gills as we entered Larne harbour. At the Ulster Siamese Show he won the Grand

and became Best Siamese Exhibit in Show. Here, in a country so beset with strife, was the friendliest show we'd ever been to — a very tragic irony.

'Jacko's last show was the Nor' East of Scotland, where, a year earlier, he'd become a Champion. The judge, Miss Anne Rickson, was a lady we had, rather skillfully, avoided for some time. . . . 'Jacko' was just not her type of cat, or so we had long assumed. After much deliberation, we decided to go. His Challenge, his Grand and later, his Best in Show, made it a finale of the storybook kind. The judge's report read as follows: *"I have never seen him looking so good, he has matured since I last saw him into just the sort of boy I like, beautiful head with strong straight wedge, large widely set ears, straight profile and firm chin, dark blue eyes with lovely wicked expression, long body and whip, coat a little dark but short and shining, lovely nature and shown in perfect condition."* That just about says it all about 'Jacko'.

His show career over now, we're left with the same sweet-natured boy he's always been; as likely to be found by the fireside as in his stud house. . . as gentle with tiny kittens as a queen, as affectionate with us as any neuter, but very much the proud, male Siamese he is.

'Jacko' once again features in the British CAT WORLD Awards. He is Second Best Siamese Adult & Best Seal Point Siamese 1980-81, a fitting and rewarding

tribute to mark his retirement from the show scene.

There's more to any cat than merely winning at shows. There's more to 'Jacko' than this article could ever do justice. As with all cats, he's special but he is very, very special — *My Ultimate Cat — GRAND CHAMPION HEGIRA JACKO HEARTS*. My good luck charm incarnate.

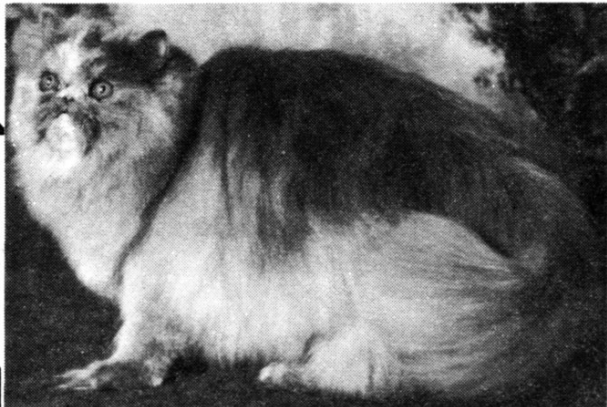
He strolled across the wooden stage, proud as if he owned it.

Scottish Folds

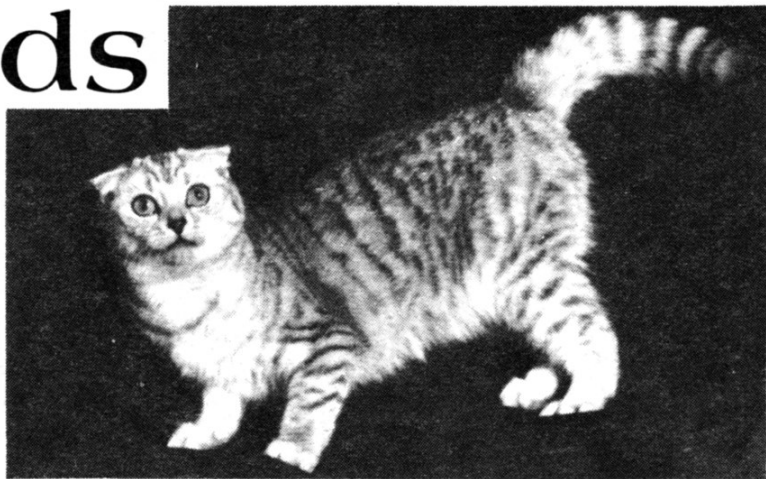
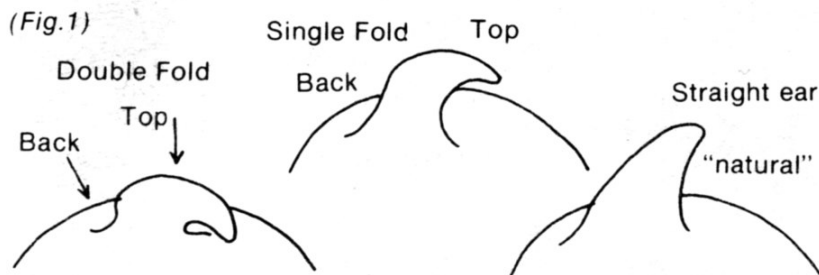
Revisited

The Scottish Fold is a unique, charming cat, set apart from all other breeds by a genetic mutation that causes their ears to fold forward and downward on to their heads. The resulting look gives the impression of a "pixie", "owl", or "teddy bear" that has captured the hearts of many American breeders and judges.

The gene that causes the folded ears is an autosomal dominant gene, thereby showing its effect in both the heterozygous (Fd/+) (inherited from one parent) and the homozygous (Fd/Fd) (inherited from both parents) states. The gene is code Fd, with the "natural" or straight ear code fd. All folded eared Scottish Folds are either Fd/fd or Fd/Fd. The straight eared cats that occur in fold litters are most probably not carrying the Fd and are fdfd.

In addition to being a dominant, the gene also shows variable repression. Some cats have single folded ears, where just the top portion of the ears bend over, while others have double folded ears, where the ear is first curled back at the base and then the top portion bends over and forms a flap. There have even been some cases where one ear folds and one does not. These are the result of variation of expression of the gene. (Fig.1).

In photo ears were slightly up, typical of many young folds. She was about 7 months old.

From the studies that have been done, it appears that the mutation affects the structure of the cartilage in the late embryonic stage of development. This has also presented some problems for the breed. Early breeding in Scotland and England unfortunately resulted in the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy closing the registration of the Folds (first known as "Lops") after DENISLA MORAG. This particular study combined two procedures that are now avoided by most Fold breeders: close line breedings and folded ear to folded ear breedings. The problems that appeared were no doubt compounded because the breed, which was still very new, had all come from one cat — SUSIE — a white female seen by Mr. William Ross in a farmyard in Perthshire, Scotland, in 1961. Mr. Ross acquired one of the two folded eared kittens produced by Susie two years later, a white daughter named SNOOKS and bred her with a Red Tabby.

Subsequent to immigration to the U.S., where breeders were captivated by the expression of the cats, further "experiments" were conducted. Breedings with several breeds, including Exotic Shorthairs, Persians

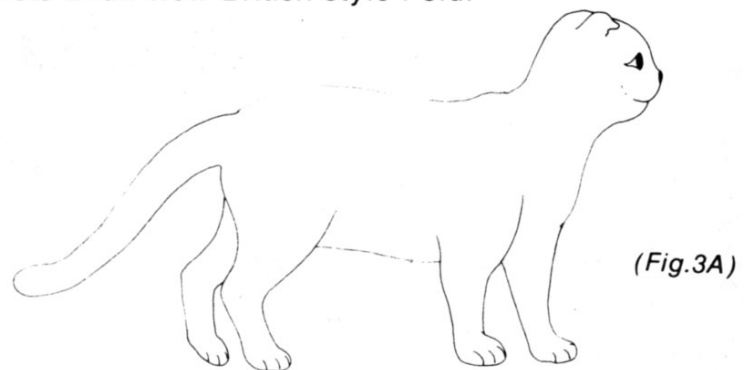


and American Shorthairs were made in order to increase the gene pool. Use of outcrosses reduced the occurrence of problems but it also reduced the number of folded eared kittens. Breeders attempting to discover if Folds could be bred true and to increase the number of folded eared kittens also did some fold to fold breeding. These breedings produced some offspring with problems of shortened, stiff tails, heavy, clubbed, stiff hind legs, and deformed or perforated bones in the legs. It appeared that the homozygous situation of Fd/Fd was one to be avoided. Most breeders now use American Shorthairs, British Shorthairs, or straight eared Folds to breed with their Folds. Expression of the gene in other body parts has not been eliminated by outbreeding, but it certainly has been reduced. The breed is for the most part healthy and easy to breed. Care was taken to select and import only the healthiest Folds by the early U.S. breeders. Now, only a moderate amount of care is necessary to eliminate or avoid the negative aspects of the gene and some carefully planned fold to fold breedings have proved to be clear.

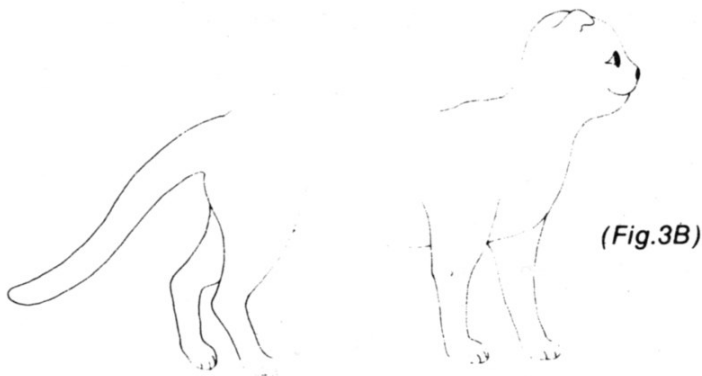
In attempting to avoid the deformity problem, the standard for the tail on the breed is somewhat difficult to attain. In Fig.2., the long taper, which is most desirable, and the regular length "medium" taper are shown with several of the problem tails: blunt, foreshortened, or kinked. The long whip, Siamese type tail, is not often seen in the breed, but provides comparison. Tail length will tend to be subject to the type of breeding which has been chosen. If shorter, heavier bodied British type cats are used, tails will resemble their parents — shorter and in proportion. On the other hand, if longer, American Shorthair type cats are used, the tails will tend to be longer and finer. Of course, the "style" differences do not stop with the tails.



British style Scottish Folds will have broad, massive heads, quite heavy boning in the limbs, wide deep chests, and thick bodies. Head type in profile and shortness of muzzle will also be fairly extreme. The coats on the British cats will also be slightly more raised. Fig.3A depicts a full view British style Fold.



American style Folds will be finer, longer, and in most cases smaller cats than the British style. Tails, limbs, and heads will tend to be longer. The coat may be tighter also. Fig.3B depicts a full view American style Fold.

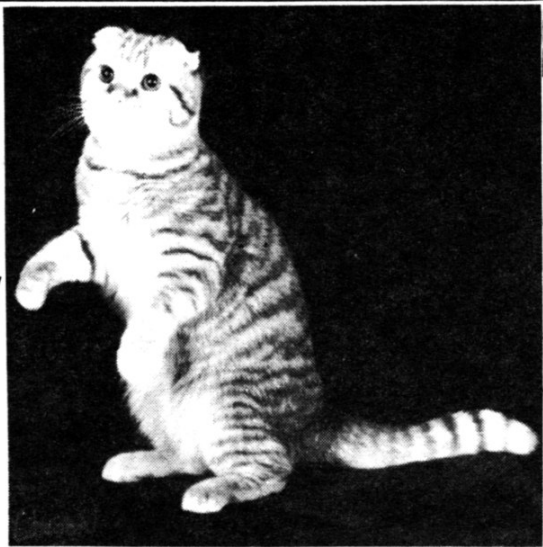

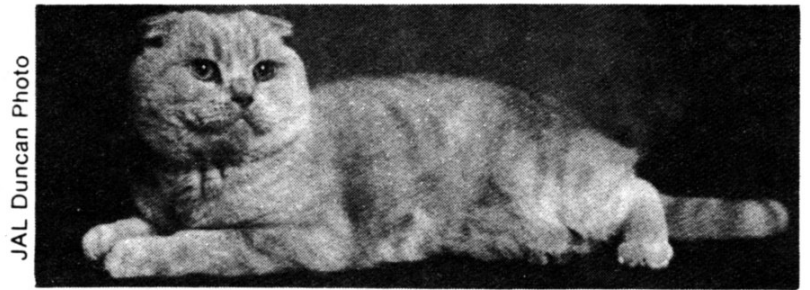
Both styles are fully acceptable. Breeders and exhibitors should keep in mind that the most important aspect of any style is balance. Small fine heads do not fit large massive bodies. Large massive bodies need to maintain weight and breadth in the loin and hip; one difficulty with the British style is maintaining that mass. Females do tend to be smaller and have smaller heads. This creates some esthetic preference for the males of the breed. Breeding a female sometimes will change her head shape and size but it can also cause changes in the ears

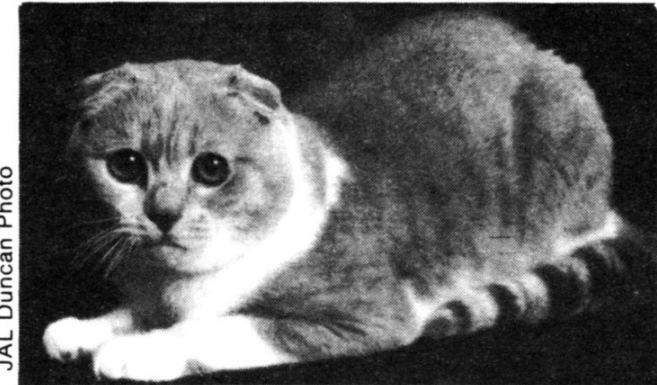

The ears of the fold constitute almost one third of the entire points of the standard. Single folded ears (Fig.4. 2s, & 4s) are seldom seen in the show ring because they tend to detract from the curvature of the skull. Ear folds do vary, however, and also change throughout the life of the cat. It is the fortunate breeder whose kittens start and maintain tightly folded ears. Most kittens start with a loose fold and tighten with age. Even double folded cats can lift their ears somewhat and turn them to listen, express interest or anger. Some females have been known to lift their ears more permanently as the result of kitting.

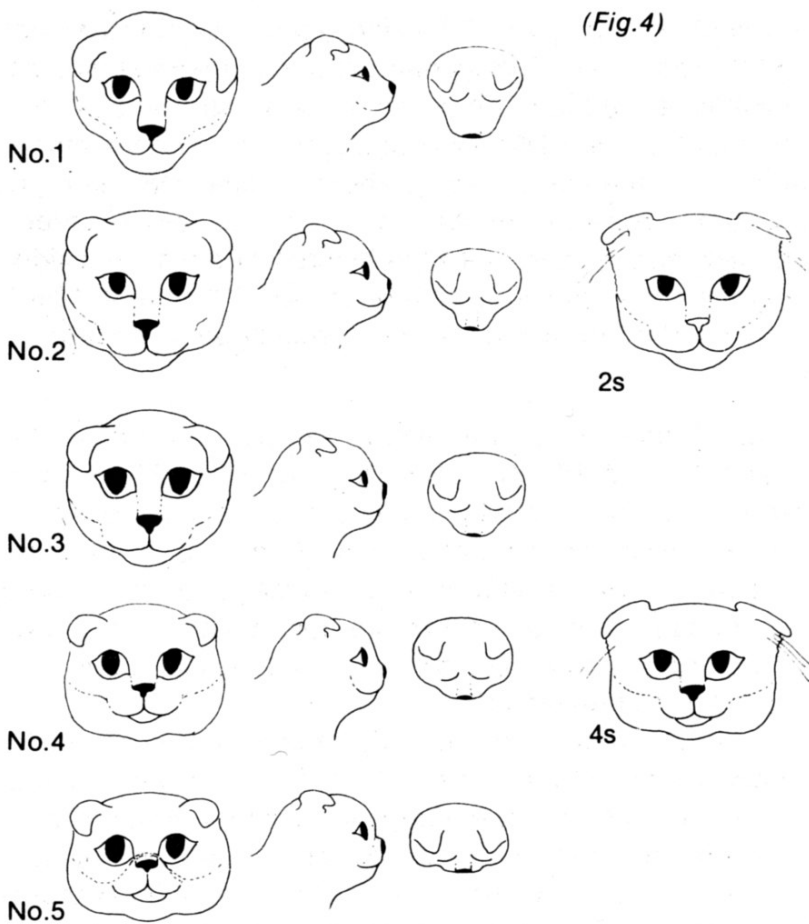

A wide spectrum of head styles has appeared throughout the development of the breed. Early breedings with Persians and Exotic Shorthairs produced the large round heads which the breeders sought, but also occasionally resulted in medium long to long haired cats. Restriction of the breed outcross to the American Shorthair resulted in nearly exclusively short coats but the type was being lost. The greatest contribution the ASH breeding made was to add to the gene pool and add tail length. Subsequent allowance of the British Shorthairs in the breeding program is again shortening bodies and heads. The full range of head styles, from American Shorthair through British Shorthair is allowed. Fig.4 depicts five head styles. A too long and rangy head No.1 and a too short, exotic, extreme, No.5 have been included to indicate the undesirability to both ends of the spectrum. No.1 is too long and narrow in the muzzle and the head is considerably longer than wide and gives a triangular appearance. No.2 is a modified American style. Skull and head are quite rounded with a fairly short muzzled placed on the front of the head, slightly below halfway, squarely. No.3 is a halfway point between the American and the British styles. The head and skull are still rounded, the muzzle is shorter, nose length shorter and positioned slightly higher on the face. Emphasis of the eye is spread at the nose to the fullness of the cheeks. No.4 is the British style head. It is the most extreme of the approved styles. The muzzle is even shorter and nose higher. The head itself may show some shortening from fore to aft, but begins to approach the too "Exotic" look

quickly as this happens. A very "cheeky" expression is seen in this style, particularly in jowly males. No.5 is too exotic. The nose has been raised and muzzle pushed back, creating a substantial break which is not allowed in the standard. Considerable shortening of the entire head and development of "dome" top heads will also be indicative of this degree of extremity.

The Folds are generally fairly well tempered animals with sweet dispositions. Breeding is generally straight forward and few problems have been noted. Some of the males are a little bit too well tempered and will not breed. The females make good mothers and the kittens are rapid developers. Some females have been noted to be too narrow in the hip saddle to birth easily and care should be taken in not using such females in a breeding program. Fold litters are average in size, 4 or 5 kittens are typical. Of course, only about half will fold in a fold to straight ear breeding, so not a large number of folds are produced per litter. The wait to see if the kittens' ears will really fold is one of the real trials of breeding these cats!

THEORIES

by Thea de Vos

A local veterinarian tells the story of an older colleague who is in the habit of entering an examination room, making an instant diagnosis without consulting the client as to the reason why the animal has been brought in and then exiting, equally hurriedly, to the next consultation. This particular day a cat was in for earmites. Not stopping to ask questions he spotted the start of an upper respiratory disease and prescribed Amoxi-drops. Imagine the surprise of another colleague when the cat came back two weeks later -- with brightly painted pink ears!

FELINE BLADDER WORMS:

A 2½-year old cat was presented to Dr. Lloyd T. Harris of Jacksonville, NC with chronic recurring cystitis. The cat had been repeatedly treated with antibiotics and urinary acidifiers, both of which provided only temporary relief.

By tapping the bladder, Dr. Harris obtained 10 c.c. of urine which was then examined under the microscope. The urine yielded 15-20 *Capillaria feliscati*, a bladder worm rarely diagnosed in cats. The cat was treated subcutaneously with two 45 mg. injections of levamisole, given one week apart. The levamisole was an experimental procedure but Methylridine is also mentioned as a possible treatment. A complete urinalysis was done seven days after the initial injection, and two to four months after the second injection. No further bladder worm eggs were found. One week after the second injection the owner reported that the cat was urinating normally.

The above appeared in *Veterinary Medicine/Small Animal Clinician*, June, 1981 and demonstrates excellent detective work on the part of the veterinarian. It does leave one wondering, however, why such microscopic examinations are not more routinely carried out on problematic cats!

An oldie but goodie. . . in chapter 23 of *The UFAW Handbook on the Care of Laboratory Animals*, edited by the Staff of UFAW, the following appears: "Always approach a cat quietly, speaking to it and observing its reactions. Stroke the head behind the ears and along the length of the back, but take care when you pass your hand over the lumbar region. A female which is not in oestrus or cats suffering from calcium deficiency may bite when

touched in this region." This chapter on cats was written by Dr. Patricia P. Scott, considered by many to be one of the world's leading authorities on cats and cat nutrition. Incidentally, this sixty-two page chapter is choc-a-block full of fascinating facts about feline physiology, behavior, nutrition, etc. A trip to your local library's inter-library loans (armed with a hefty check book for xeroxing charges) will aid in obtaining a copy. Written in 1967, much of the information is still amazingly up to date.

Dear Thea: — I was interested in the item you had in *CAT WORLD INTERNATIONAL* Jan/Feb.'82 about meconium. I too have wondered about this. However, I drew my own conclusions a long time ago. I think the meconium being retained does cause problems, leading perhaps to kitten deaths. I do remove it within a few hours after birth. Sometimes the most industrious queen has problems achieving this.

I have had one kitten in particular that was weaker and slower to thrive the first 24-hrs. or so. After removing an extremely large hard plug (from the rectum) the kitten was immediately improved. Since then I check each kitten several times the first 24 hours. I use a little vaseline or warm water to dislodge the plug. Sometimes it comes out in several sections rather than in one.

I have never seen one word about this in print until you wrote about it. And I have a good cat book library including several medical books. There are so many things never written about that breeders wonder about and usually the vet isn't sure either about the answer. So many things we learn about by trial and error and sometimes the errors are costly. If only we could share more with each other about our problems both major and minor.

A few years ago I had a series of uterine infections in post partum queens. You will never know what I had to go through to acquire information on this subject. I knew some vets used vaginal infusion - but none in this area had ever tried it - So what do you do - Do you give up and lose 3 or 4 queens and never breed them again or do you try to treat them using every technique available? After several long distance phone calls to several people, including some vets, we got some answers. Now my vet routinely infuses vaginally after queening - Result - no more infections.

I know I got off the subject but my point is — there is so little help available when we need it. Not all of us live close to a large city or a vet-teaching hospital. I wish we had some sort of trouble line - a pooling of information. You can't imagine how much treatment can differ on the same disorder from vet to vet. I will get off my soap box now and close — much luck during 1982.

Information wanted, please: One of the resolutions most frequently voted on (and defeated) at the CFA Annual is: ". . . an adult male must have both testicles descended to be eligible for entry". The sponsors of this resolution often imply that monorchidism is 1) a genetic defect, 2) inheritable through the sire. Even ignoring the information cited in "Nutrient Requirements of the Cat" (1978), i.e. that nutritional deficiencies cause testicular damage, or that other factors may be involved in monorchidism, i.e. physiological damage to the testicles prior to descent, we assume that cryptorchidism is inherited and passed on by the dam of the litter. That is, her sons will appear as crypt- or monorchids, while her daughters will pass on this defect to their offspring. Pondering the sense of denying competitive status to a male for a trait which he more than likely does not pass on, while allowing such competition for his sisters and brothers, I would like to present some information on records recently made available to me.

These records show the breeding potential of two littermates: one a monorchid, the other an amply endowed "whole" (entire) male. The monorchid has sired approximately 150 kittens, several of which were from breedings to his own dam (presumed to be the carrier of the monorchidism), his daughters and granddaughters, plus a variety of interrelated females, including the offspring of his "whole" littermate. Amongst these 150 kittens appeared only one monorchid, in a breeding to an "outcross" female. It should be noted, however, that the majority of kittens produced by the monorchid were female. Thus far the offspring of the monorchid have not produced crypt- or monorchids despite close inbreeding.

The "whole" littermate, on the other hand, has sired approximately 65 kittens. Out of 23 males born, 16 were mon- or cryptorchid at the time of altering. For 3 there are no records available, while the rest have not as yet produced offspring. Their breeding habits can at best be described as "hilarious" as is that of their sire. There appears to be no consistent pattern of relatedness in the breedings that throw these "defective" kittens. That is, the "whole" male does not throw a larger proportion of cryptorchids when bred to his daughters or other related females, than he does when bred to complete "outcross" females.

Based on these records, I certainly question denying competition for monorchids while allowing their littermates to be shown. Cryptorchids as a rule are unable to impregnate females, so for them the argument of inheritance is a moot question.

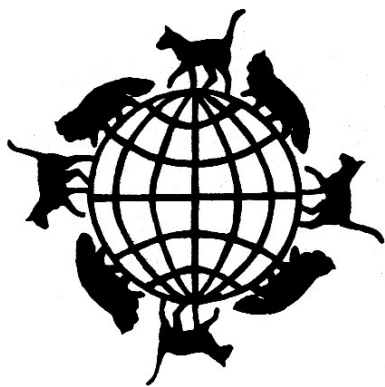

CAT WORLD CIRCUIT

16-YEAR-OLD DREAM COME TRUE

by John M. Bodner

Cat overpopulation is one of the serious problems that confronts almost every city in North America and probably the world.

In the late summer of 1962, five concerned cat owners — Kay Evans, Dellis Cleland, Dianne Henderson, Jessica Coulter and Laura Bodner — met to discuss what could be done to improve the lot of cats and reduce the number of strays in the City of Winnipeg, in the Province of Manitoba, Canada.

The meeting bore fruit. The group decided that the best approach was to form a cat club, where interested parties could meet and discuss the ways and means of tackling the problem. This was the birth of Manitoba Cat Club. It became affiliated with the American Cat Fanciers Association in October, 1962. Six years later, the club was incorporated as a non-profit organization and granted Letters Patent by the Province of Manitoba on April 10, 1968.

Much was accomplished in the better care and welfare of pets by the club through cat shows, cat exhibitions and household pet shows, but the unwanted cat population seemed to be increasing. According to figures released by the Winnipeg Humane Society, the number of animals handled during 1969 was 4,767; during 1977 the number had increased to 15,653: 7,676 were cats and kittens, homes were found for 958, 102 were returned to their owners and 6,616 had to be put down.

Since its inception, Manitoba Cat Club Inc. has been very concerned with animal population control and responsible pet ownership. To alleviate the problem of thousands of stray cats, the wanton destruction of the unfortunate creatures in the city, the club approached the City of Winnipeg with a request for a serviced space, gratis, to establish a low-cost neutering and spaying clinic. It was pointed out to the City Fathers that this type of service would be beneficial to the city, was badly needed and long overdue, and once space was made available

How the united efforts of The Manitoba Cat Club established a Neuter/Spay Clinic, in the face of seemingly insurmountable opposition from City officials and some local veterinarians. The Manitoba Cat Club is a club that extends real efforts outside the show hall and the cattery, and demonstrates what can be accomplished to aid in the struggle to ease the surplus cat population problem.

the project could be fully operational, self-supporting and with no additional expense to the City. Once it became a reality, the service would be available to all citizens as a community service and would reduce the burden in the already crowded facilities at the Winnipeg Humane Society shelter.

The request was favourably received by the City finance committee and the City of Winnipeg agreed in principle to look for a suitable place. For some reason it did not materialize. In the meantime the club kept busy raising funds by selling sweepstake tickets, sponsoring cat exhibitions, holding garage sales, for the Spay and Neuter project.

The letdown by the City of Winnipeg was a terrible setback. Downhearted but not discouraged, the club approached the Winnipeg Academy of Veterinary Medicine, in the hope of working with their veterinarians, with the following proposals:

1. Manitoba Cat Club would do all administrative work, process all applications for neutering or spaying.
2. Club would furnish vets with completed applications and arrange appointments.
3. Proposed maximum fee to be - neutering \$12.50, spaying \$22.50; the club would pay a subsidy of \$5.00 over and above the fee. The fees to be paid by the owner directly to the vet performing the service.
4. The service would be available to any owner by applying for it to the Manitoba Cat Club Inc.

Unfortunately, the club's proposals were not acceptable to the Winnipeg Academy of Veterinary Medicine. The conditions and restrictions set by the academy could not be met by the club.

There were no other avenues but to do it alone. On February 21, 1978, at the general meeting of the MCC, members present approved unanimously the establishment of the Spay and Neuter Clinic for cats, professionally staffed, adhering to the standards set by the Manitoba Veterinary Medical Association and offering service at a rate of \$12.50 for neutering and \$22.50 for spaying, including a distemper shot. Next morning, the press, radio and TV broadcast the strong campaign launched by the Winnipeg AVM expressing their disfavour. The attack proved to have the opposite effect. It drew public support for our efforts.

The opposition voiced by the vets to the clinic was soon countered by the public. Congratulatory letters kept pouring in, phone calls and even cash donations in

support of the clinic. The club was swamped with appointments.

On April 1, 1978, the club's dream came true when the clinic, located at 10-D Keenleyside Street, was officially opened by Councilor Skowron. A feeling of accomplishment was there - a feeling of satisfaction - knowing that, at last, something would be done to control the unwanted kitten population in the community; and at the same time hoping that spaying and neutering of cats would lower the numbers destroyed each year.

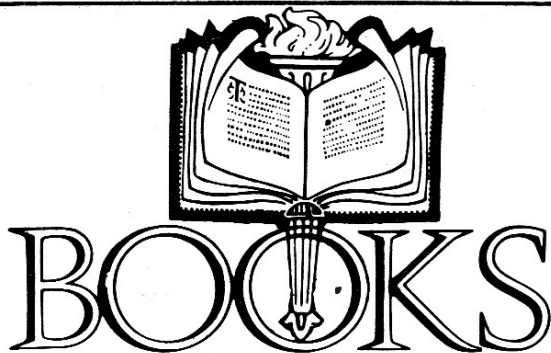
On April 3, 1978, the clinic went into operation, with Dr. Albert van der Meulen in charge. The first cat to undergo surgery was a six month old domestic, red tabby male called Leo, followed by his litter mate, Max, a black domestic male - both owned by Mr. and Mrs. Eric Clark.

It took 2 months to clear up the backlog of appointments. The club was very fortunate to have found four veterinarians who believed in what we were doing and offered their services. No one was hurt in the process, the city's veterinarians are just as busy as ever, and we are providing a service that was badly needed. We are reaching owners who would never have had their pets altered or given vaccinations. To date we have altered 10,000 animals, a proof in itself that the service was badly needed.

As Mr. Clark, the first owner to have his pets altered, put it "The best thing that ever happened in the city to cat lovers is the establishment of the clinic. Each pet owner should be encouraged to have his/her cat altered. This makes for a much happier pet."

"NEW LOOK" BURMESE

I'm writing in reference to the article in your Jan/Feb. 82 'Forum' by Dr. Myra Hinman.

INTRODUCING OUR SIXTH GREAT YEAR OF CAT WORLD INTERNATIONAL MAGAZINE'S ANNUAL AWARDS TO THE TOP CATS OF NEW ZEALAND

This year, you will be disappointed to learn that, although I mailed it plenty of time, Jill's article did not reach these offices in time to be included. Therefore, for those who are enjoying the spectacular display of New Zealand's Top Cats for the first time, the Scoring Methods are explained. All of us at CWI feel most privileged to have this opportunity to present such lovely cats — an opportunity that would not exist but for the tremendous amount of work put in by Jill, our Representative in New Zealand, and Hurle Rayner, our Awards Honorary Scorer. For the fifth year in succession, Hurle has completed this painstaking job — after the nine months long NZ show season ending in November — of checking, cumulating and averaging the points won by several thousand cats during 1981.

The following is based on information provided by Jill about the CWI AWARDS TO THE TOP CATS OF NEW ZEALAND SCORING SYSTEM —

SCORING SYSTEM (Excerpted from previous articles by Jill Dawson)

"It is completely *free* to clubs and exhibitors and gives worthwhile recognition to those exhibits who have beaten the MOST others during the show season, and presents them in CWI to be seen internationally. This generous programme offered by CWI was first accepted by the NZ Cat Fancy Inc. for the 1976 show season. Prior to this, NZ's ultimate glory was to attain that elusive triumph of Grand Champion status, but *now* we have this added incentive, one that is looked forward to tremendously by exhibitors — featuring in CWI's Awards to the BEST Cats/Kits/Neuters & Spays *ANNUALLY*.

These Awards are for NZ's BEST cats, NOT the most exhibited cats, therefore the Awards are made on the basis of the highest average points. By averaging points, the cats are protected from being overshadowed and the exhibitor who cannot afford the time or money to travel to a lot of shows is not penalised. There is also a minimum division number of three to exclude the possibility of a cat winning one major award only and then being retired, resulting in a large number of points which would be a misleading overall result.

As in previous years some Breeds/Colours do NOT feature in the 1981 Lists, although exhibited often during the season and possibly having numerous Best of Breed/Colour wins, as they unfortunately never beat another

exhibit at any time at any show.

Exhibits receive points for their highest placing only, i.e. exhibits placed in the Top 10 at shows automatically drop the points accumulated at lower levels. Cats not featuring in the Top 10's receive points for their Group wins and cats not in Groups receive points for Breed/Colour wins, all by the same method of *one* point for each cat, present *and* competing, that they have beaten. The MERIT for this system is its fairness and simplicity although, naturally, anomalies may occur as with any scoring system as the 'perfect' system has yet to be devised!

This scoring method allows winners at BIG shows to accrue more points than winners at small shows, e.g. a 10th Best in Show at a large show will often be worth many more points than BIS itself at a smaller show, which is the fairest way as, obviously, the exhibit that beats the most other exhibits *is entitled to the most points*. Occasionally exhibitors query the fact — and they are perfectly free to do so — that 'their exhibit' did not come up in the CWINZ Awards, yet had as many BIS wins. When checked it is noted that *all* these exhibits had their wins in very, very small shows, so although they had perhaps six BIS wins they had beaten only a very *small* number of cats overall. On average, the North Island shows are much larger than the South Island shows, therefore, the South Island cats featuring in these Awards have scored exceptionally highly to hold their placings.

A vote of thanks must go to Hurle Rayner who willingly spends such a tremendous amount of time — and entirely voluntarily — recording the points won by *every* exhibit in *every* show held under the auspices of the NEW ZEALAND CAT FANCY, INC. After the essential results are recorded for the NZCF, Inc., using their official MARKED catalogs, which all clubs must forward to their Honours Officers for the Fancy's records, the CAT WORLD INTERNATIONAL scoring is done independently.

As for all other years, these Awards are for the BEST CATS — NOT THE MOST EXHIBITED CATS — therefore points are cumulated, then averaged."

We add our thanks to Jill's, and we know the owners of the winners will wish to join us in thanking Jill and Hurle whose work make the Awards possible.

QUESTIONS FROM '81/82 MINI-POLL

1. *Fleabite allergies* — I hope to do an article on flea control in some future column but for now I will mention a material called *Spot-on* that seems to be one of the better methods of flea control currently available. It is a systemic insecticide used to control bots fly larvae in cattle. It can be applied to cats over 6 months of age that are not pregnant or nursing kittens. Treated adults may be allowed to live with or near kittens or brood females. Eventually the fleas that jump on the treated cats will feed and be killed by the insecticide. I have used it and am satisfied with the results. It appears to be more frequently used on dogs but I have seen it used also on cats. Your vet may be able to give you more information.

2. *Would like to see colors on Persians that meet CFA approval. . . example "Cream & White" —*

I think there is much variation of how the standard is interpreted on Bicolors. I have seen very extreme beautifully typed bicolors that have very little white in their coats. My personal opinion is that they should have about 1/3 white on preferably the under side of their body with an inverted V of white extending up over the nose for the regular patterned bicolors. But now there are more patterns in bicolors that involve further interpretations. I feel that bicolor breeders should realize the importance of markings so I judge them accordingly. I have seen beautifully typed cats that would win on their type but lose on their markings. It would be helpful if the marking standards were more clear-cut. □

Letter from a breeder —

I am a bicolor and calico breeder for about 5 years now and although I have done quite well for myself (last year my dilute calico was TICA's best calico and Cats Magazine's highest scoring calico) I am still having trouble achieving my goal in two specific areas.

All my cats have what is generally referred to as a nice open look, but I keep coming up with noses that are too long for my taste. No matter who I breed to, I seem to get the same results. Last year I even bred my girl to TICA's Cat of the Year, *Zorro*, but I still ended up with fairly long noses. I even have a very extreme *Zoda* cat in my recent breeding (the look that features the very short nose between the

eyes) but alas, I've still got long noses. Can you tell me what I might be doing wrong. The rest of the cat seems close to perfect.

My second question involves coat. I have recently purchased a Van who unfortunately has a very short coat, for a Persian. The female I intend to breed him to carries a long, silky coat. Am I likely to have a problem with the short coat cropping up in the new litter? Incidentally, the Van was shipped to me as a kitten, and when we received him he was very ill. He has long since recovered, but could his short coat have come as the result of an illness and thus not genetic?

I really hope that you can make some suggestions as I have been heretofore unable to get these questions answered

There is more than one type of head in Persians. One has to determine the one you wish to breed and then try to produce it in your stock. Generally speaking, the features in an extreme Persian head are controlled by recessive genes that must be present in a homozygous state if the animal is to show them. Therefore you stand a better chance of producing extreme kittens if you have the extreme stock on both sides of the pedigree. But this does not insure success. Over the years a breeder can recognize where his best type originates. I would much rather use breeder quality animals from a cattery that has produced the type of Persian I prefer to top quality stock from outcross (unrelated) matings.

There has been a lot of work done to improve the head type in bicolors. In some shows the quality of the bicolor head type is very good. Obviously some extreme cats have been crossed into the bicolors. One of the easier and less hazardous methods of putting quality into your stock is to obtain an outstanding male and breed your queens to him. Breed the resulting females to another outstanding male. (It helps to have both males related). The basic breeding plan would be to take the granddaughters back to the original male. If you have incorporated the genes into your stock, they have

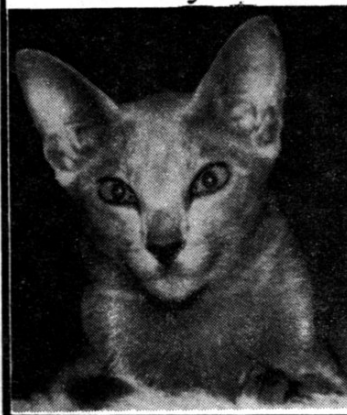
the easiest means of producing quality with this plan.

Coat is a complicated matter also. The old English breeders have told me that occasionally one must introduce a bicolor into their stock to maintain their longer coats. Since long hair is recessive to short hair, 2 shorthaired cats could produce longhaired kittens, but 2 longhaired cats cannot produce shorthaired kittens. But coat consists of both the length of hair and the number of hairs per follicle, so one has to experiment until one finds the combination that suits one's needs. The guard hairs are easier to maintain in the coat, but they are often of a darker color than the undercoat. The coat that is high in guard hairs is desirable in Blacks, Reds, and Torties, but often make a Blue, Cream or Bluecream appear dark. The short coat could be due to an illness but this would likely be of a temporary nature and should correct itself in time. I have seen extremely long, heavy coats on Persians in Europe. But these cats are often shown only a few times while their coat is in prime condition. One can win with a heavy coat on a Persian that is 3"-4" long as well as with a coat 7"-8" long but the shorter, yet adequate, coat is much easier to maintain. Coat length, if the cat has the genetic potential for a long coat, is influenced by shorter daylight periods. But if one is attempting to control the day length, the period of darkness must be absolutely dark for the best result. Unfortunately shorter day length also brings a female cat into season. I think many of us would be greatly surprised if we truly realized the great influence that light and dark periods have on the lives of all animals.

Well, this has gone on much longer than I anticipated. I hope it will be of benefit to some. Please remember to *send your questions to me* so that I may have material for future columns.

founder of a low-cost animal clinic in New York, gives her outspoken views on such controversial issues as declawing and neutering, and claims a successful cure for cystitis and feline leukemia. She advocates wholesale declawing, a procedure abhorrent to most breeders/exhibitors/cat lovers. There are effective ways to combat the problem of scratching on furniture — sometimes taking much time and patience. Her advice on a feeding regimen is indeed unusual, recommending a once-daily feeding of 1/3 cup of dry food (don't change brands) for all cats; if dieting, one tablespoon only, per day, please!

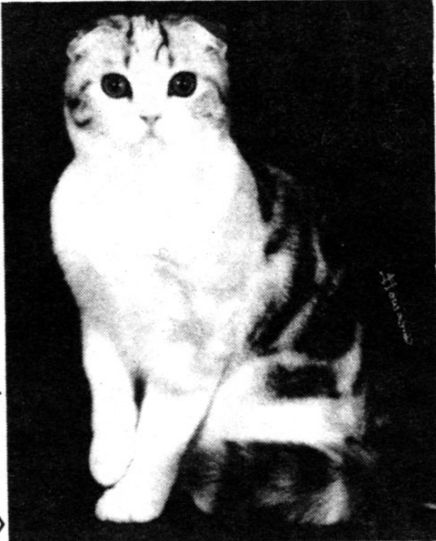
She claims her clinic has achieved a break-through on treating cystitis and feline leukemia with mega-vitamin doses. This reviewer (a dietitian and nutrition consultant) can only comment that nutritionists generally view mega-vitamin therapy as "quackery", whether in animals or humans.

We are assured that the "aggressive" cat can be controlled by declawing all cats, all four feet, and neutering them. And, finally, when kitty is about to misbehave, "grab him by the scruff of the neck, shake him while yelling at him, and toss him away from you. If you are effective, he will appear to be in shock"! Ms. Widmer makes earthy reading, certainly provocative, and rather bizarre in certain areas. Not recommended for cat lovers.

It was lovely to visit Doreen and Murv Walker after the show in their home and see their fine Korats who are so silvery — something that especially pleases me because I regret the tendency seen all too often nowadays of some breeders and judges to overlook the essential attribute — the shimmering silvering - of this little Thai breed. The tendency to breed dark, sparsely silvered cats should be avoided.

CHEERFUL COURTESY COMPENSATES

By sharp contrast, at a show I attended the succeeding weekend as an exhibitor, some members of the Firebird Cat Club demonstrated how — while no doubt problems prevailed — lack of cheerful courtesy can ruin a show and cause distress to exhibits and owners. Had just a few shreds of cheerful courtesy been mustered, the early

arrivals would not have minded the wait to get into the show hall at the advertised time nor the wait to find out where their cats were benched. When I arrived a half hour after the official opening time and asked where I was benched, the show manager ignored me and a committee member told me: "We can't answer questions now" !! Had the exhibitor in a wheelchair had any misunderstanding about her benching request politely handled, the loud shouting between her irate husband (who had jumped into his car and driven over 100 miles to aid his distraught wife) and this same member of the show committee could have been avoided as could the trauma suffered by the hapless cats caged closest to the scene. It was a poor day for the cats. One finalist's owner, Mrs. 'Ken' Schwartz, told me her cat was so upset it vomited in one ring. Fortunately, she said, Paul Raine, a veteran judge, knew the difference between a sick cat and one suffering from distress, or *Kensmere's Kava* (WorldWideWinners Jan/Feb. '82) would have lost his win,

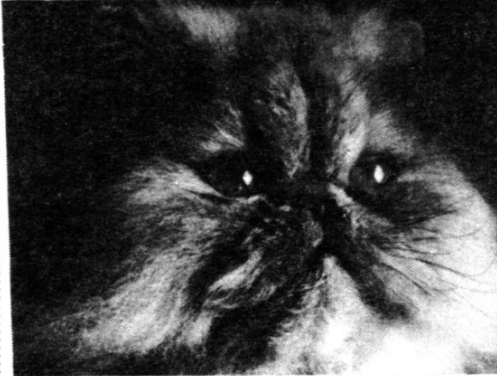

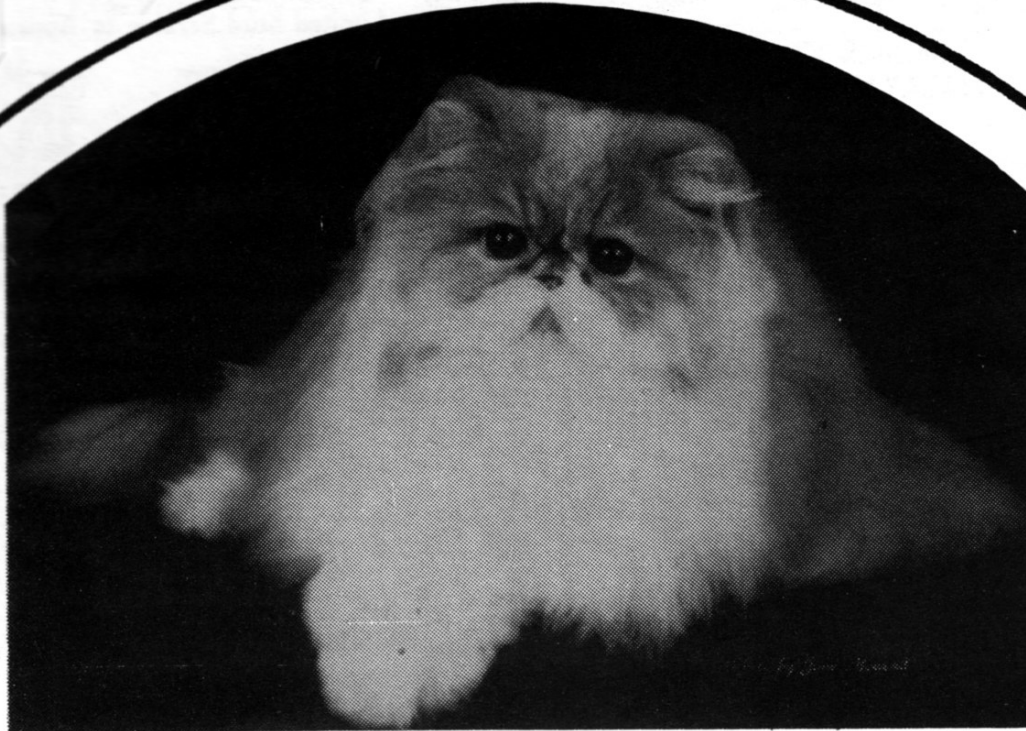
