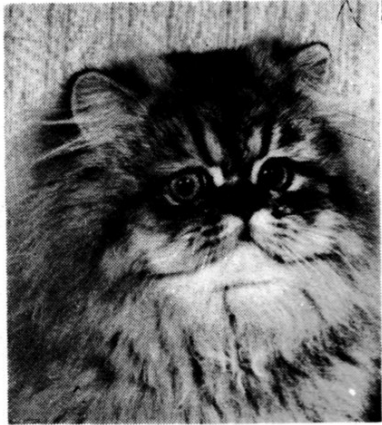

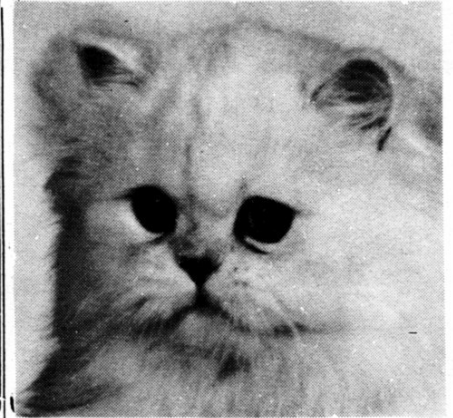

holdouts may be attracted by banners or marquee signs telling about the show. If your show hall has a marquee, arrange to have your show advertised as soon as you book the show hall. Get a commitment in writing if you can. Then, check to make sure the information gets on the marquee at the agreed time. You can also check with local motels near the show hall and ask them if they will advertise the show. Your club may even want to make a street banner to display over a main thoroughfare during the week before the show.

If your club holds its show regularly at the same place and approximately the same date each year, you can develop quite a group of "regulars" who come to see the show every year.

If you can manage even half the publicity schemes above, you will attract a gate to your show. Added publicity makes that gate bigger and bigger. One thing is certain: you simply cannot depend on word of mouth and a few small posters to advertise your show. If you want better income from admissions, more public awareness of the cat fancy, more kitten sales, and more satisfied exhibitors who will return to your show next year, plan now to publicize your show as widely as you can.

have to be their owners — round up the people first, then settle on the most unusual or famous cats. If you have a national award-winning household pet in your club, try to get it on the air.

Keep in touch with your TV contact. He or she will tell you what to expect and what kinds of information you should be able to provide. Try to schedule your TV appearances for the week prior to the show.



- Clubs have been provided with a 30% discount on Trophies and Rosettes and a "volunteer" Liability Insurance program.
- Members are provided special rates at Ramada Inns, and discounts on Hertz Rent-A-Cars.
- And last, *but not least*, the ACFA Staff processes most work and has it in the return mail within 24-72 hours after receipt.

## COULD THIS HAPPEN IN YOUR TOWN?

A truly tragic story appeared in and on the media. An 84-year old woman was found dead in her home. What should concern cat people is that although she was a longtime resident of Stoneham, MA, living alone, it was not until a week had passed that a neighbor reported to the police that she had not seen Hilda Diggdon for a week. Living with this elderly person were 32 cats. The media made great play of the fact that these animals had tried to save themselves from starvation by feeding on the corpse. The poor cats were made the villains and were taken away and destroyed. There is a lesson for us all. *What provision have you made for the care of your cats?* The Stoneham Police Chief was quoted as saying everybody knew her as a cat lover and that she had died from natural causes. Apparently her cats were her only companions in her old age and, with her gone, there was no-one to come in and take care of them. *Do you have someone to take care of your cats?* This is a matter none of us can put aside.

Thankfully there is a worldwide, energetic movement to foster programs for companion animals for the elderly. An adjunct would no doubt be careful concern for neighbors with companion animals — dogs, cats, birds and the like, to ensure the animals are fed should any harm come to the owner. This kind of concern fits into any age group. It is not only the frail owner whose animals are in jeopardy; those who rely for care on sound and hearty owners are also at risk. What if the owner suffers an accident? Or moves out and abandons their pets? There are many neighborhoods like Stoneham, but we hope our cats' chances are better than those of Hilda Diggdon's. Let's see to it.

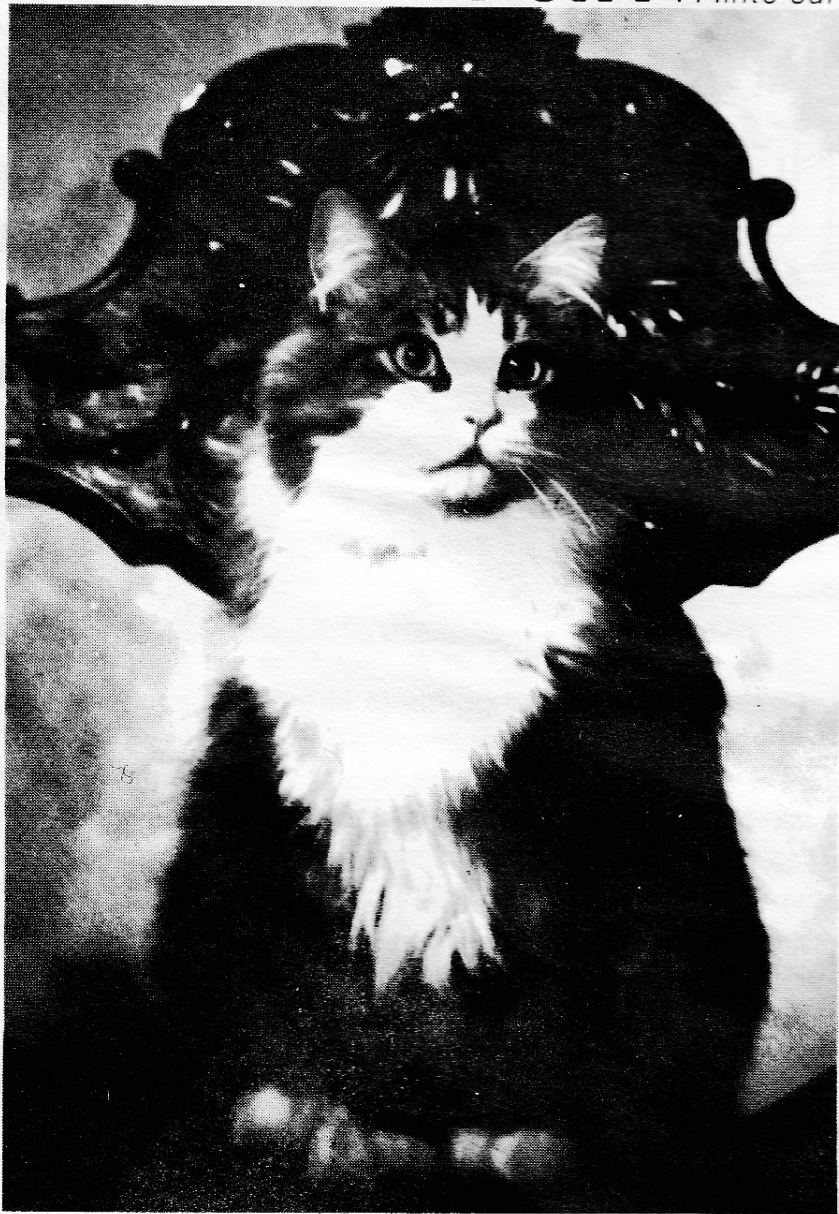

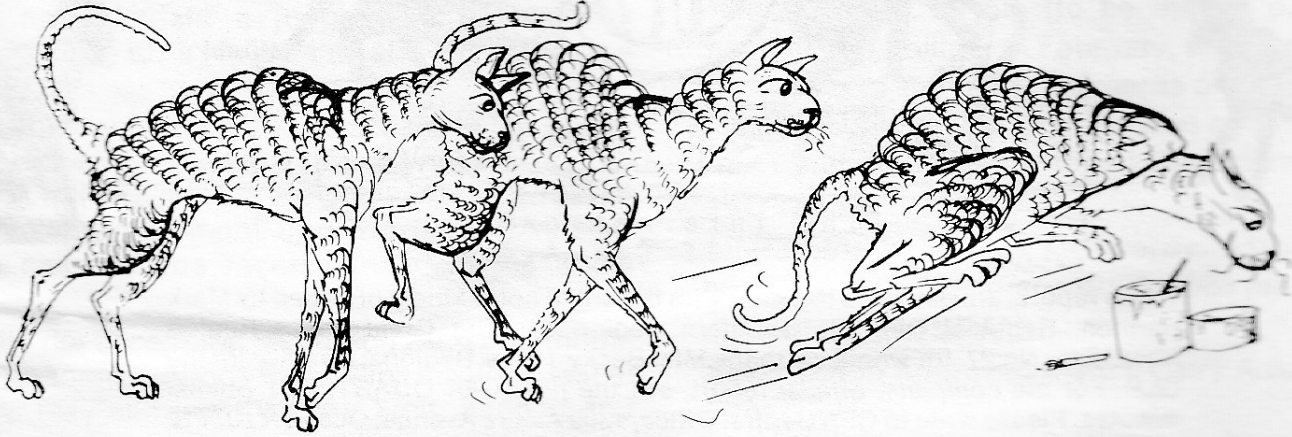

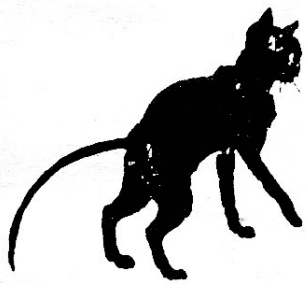

**CFA EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING, October 23—24, 1982, Hyatt Regency Hotel, Dearborn, Michigan.**

**Club Membership:** Five new clubs were accepted into membership. Total number of CFA clubs is now 546.

**Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Bill Reach stated: "The financial status of the Association remains excellent. Almost every area of income production and expense control is meeting or exceeding budget expectations. Total expenses for the first five months, including the Yearbook, were \$287,000 against a budget of \$278,000; a variance of just 3%. While slightly over budget on expenses, income has exceeded our projection by about the same amount. Total income through 5 months was \$395,950, about 4% above our projection. Yearbook sales are running slightly ahead as are registrations and interest income. Compared to the same five months of 1981, our income is up a very healthy 17% for both ordinary income and yearbook. Registrations are up 11% and interest now accounts for 5% to 6% of net income. Net income for 1982-83 was projected to be \$83,690 compared with last year's record \$94,000. Based on the first five months, we should meet or exceed that projection." (October 23, 1982).

**SHOW RULES:**

The Show Rules will have a new look May 1, 1983 as it was decided to renumber the complete package. Each Article will be numbered separately. Each paragraph in Article I will be numbered 1.01, 1.02, 1.03, etc.; each paragraph in Article II will be numbered 2.01, 2.02, 2.03 etc. so that when Show Rules are added or deleted only the affected Article will have to be renumbered.

**Show Rule Changes:**

18b) Add the word 'sexwise' following 'coatwise' (to allow for a class for calico, tortoiseshell, etc. males in AOV).

114) Replace current rule with: "Exhibitors must not make any comments on exhibits within the Judge's

hearing or challenge the Judge's decision. Any decision based on the judgment of a Judge acting under these rules shall be final."

Add the rule: "Unsportsmanlike conduct will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with Article XIV of the CFA Constitution."

129c) Change the first sentence: "The CFA licensed Certified or Master Clerk performing the function of Master Clerk shall be compensated at the rate of four (4) cents per catalog entry per judging ring." (A Best of the Bests ring is not considered as an additional ring requiring compensation).

137a) Replace '200' cat limit for a one (1) day show with '225'. Add: "All one-day Sunday shows **must** start at 9:00 AM or earlier if over 200 entries are entered."

154 The order of judging may be changed **ONLY** at the discretion of the Show Manager in an emergency. Etc.... The rule prohibiting Abyssinians and Burmese from being judged consecutively has been eliminated.

176 Change to read: "The Show Entry Clerk must acknowledge receipt of all entries within 15 days of receipt." etc.....

269 Change to read: "Withholding of Awards by the Judge: A Judge must withhold **all** awards when in his opinion ANY entry lacks sufficient merit or is, apparently, suffering from emaciation, malnutrition or showing evidence of neglect."

Entries must be in the catalog in the correct competitive category. Flagrant disregard will be subject to disciplinary action. (This refers to accepting late entries after catalog typing has begun and deliberately placing the entry in Premiership.)

ALL cats and kittens in the show hall should be inoculated (not just those entered in the show.)

Dues and insurances must be paid before a show can be licensed.

No cage may be placed so that a cat in one ring can see out the back of its cage into another cage in the ring behind it.

When a judge withholds awards, a ribbon will no longer be hung (e.g. "1/NFA").

Judges must mark the breed wins on the judge's color class sheets.

**Clubs may not stipulate** a judge's attire (such as requiring a costume for a Hallowe'en show or perhaps a tuxedo.)

The proposal to announce the breed as well as the number of a cat being called to a ring did not pass for the Show Rules. It will be placed in the Show Manual to assist clubs. Also, the requirement that the Show Manager identify fire exits will be recommended in the Show Manual."

The Board did not accept the resolution from the Annual to permit Permanent Ribbons for all wins through Best of Breed. Clubs may still use them for First, Second and Third.

**Show Calendar:** In 1980 the Board voted that the week-end of April 30-May 1, 1983 would be scored for the next show season. There was a request to move this week-end to this show season. The Board voted to uphold its 1980 decision this season, however, week-end with May 1 on a Sunday will be scored for the following show season in the future.

### SHOW SCORING

Good news for all *Best of the Bests* shows held since May 1, 1982! The Board voted to divide each exhibitor's total score by four (4) and allow the Best of the Bests ring to be "icing on the cake" for those fortunate enough to score in the fifth ring.

The Board also considered the status of the cat being shown that is barred from being judged in a ring because the judge is also the breeder of that cat. No change was made in the current situation of a barred cat. The cat's total score will be divided by the number of rings in the show.

### BREEDS & STANDARDS:

While the acceptance &/or advancement of new breeds and colors will have priority on the February CFA Board Meeting agenda, the Breed Council structure, Breed Council Sec'y, compensation and Board feeling in regard to Breed Council Secy's. was discussed at this meeting. The following statement of policy was unanimously passed:

"Breed Council Secretaries *should not* feel pressured to initiate capricious standard changes. The CFA Board feels that discussion is meaningful between Breed Council memberships but that a stable standard should be the overriding goal of any Breed Council."

Breed Council Secretaries will be compensated by the CFA Central Office upon receipt of verification of expenditures (limited to copying and postage costs) for communications between them and their individual

Breed Council memberships.

Two proposals were presented to the Board for discussion in regard to basic Breed Council membership requirements. These proposals will be placed on all Breed Council ballots (to be mailed out shortly) for membership polling. In February, the Board will discuss the results of the polls, the merits of each proposal and possibly combine the best features of both to make up a structured guideline for Breed Council membership.

### PROTESTS:

After reviewing all files, the Board cited three protests for hearings at the February 19/20, 1983 meeting in Dallas.

### JUDGING PROGRAM:

**Advanced to Approved Status:** Larry Ackison, SH; Betty Denny, LH.

**Advanced to Approval Pending status:** Wain Harding, SH.

**Accepted as a Trainee:** Leta Williams, SH.

Anne Bright and Earl Sandefur were dropped from the Judging Program.

The Board voted to restrict future letters on applicants to pertinent information; any negative comments must be substantiated; and the applicants will be given the opportunity to respond to any negative comments that are submitted.

Mike Hague was granted a leave-of-absence of up to one year.

### CENTRAL OFFICE REPORT:

Tom Dent reported that new lighting and a suspended ceiling have been installed. The computer room has been completed with CFA's newly leased (soon to be purchased) computer installed. He is delighted with the increased efficiency provided by having our own computer within the office. A small conference/meeting room is yet to be completed. Registrations are holding firm, with 45,000 individual and 30,000 litter registrations anticipated for 1982.

### DISTINGUISHED MERIT AWARDS

Twelve **Certificates of Distinguished Merit** have been issued by the Central Office. In order to qualify, a cat must be the sire of 15 CFA Grands or the dam of 5 CFA Grands. (If you have a cat that qualifies, contact the Central Office with the pertinent data.)

### THE 1983 CFA ANNUAL MEETING — ATLANTA, GA.

# International Cattery Tour

Kitjim Cattery SCOTTISH FOLDS

Our tour is hosted by Kitty Angell, who tells us: I live in the Texas Hill Country. This is the land of huge Texas ranches where herds of goats scale the rugged hills and prize cattle graze in peaceful pastures. This is also the area famous for its exotic game ranches, and where one of Texas' most scenic rivers, The Guadalupe, winds through the heart of the hills.

I would like to be able to say that I am married to a wealthy "Land Baron" and operate an expansive "Cat Ranch". . . it would make such a nice story! But the truth is that my husband owns a small chain of drug stores and we live on a three-quarter acre lot in the small town of Kerrville.

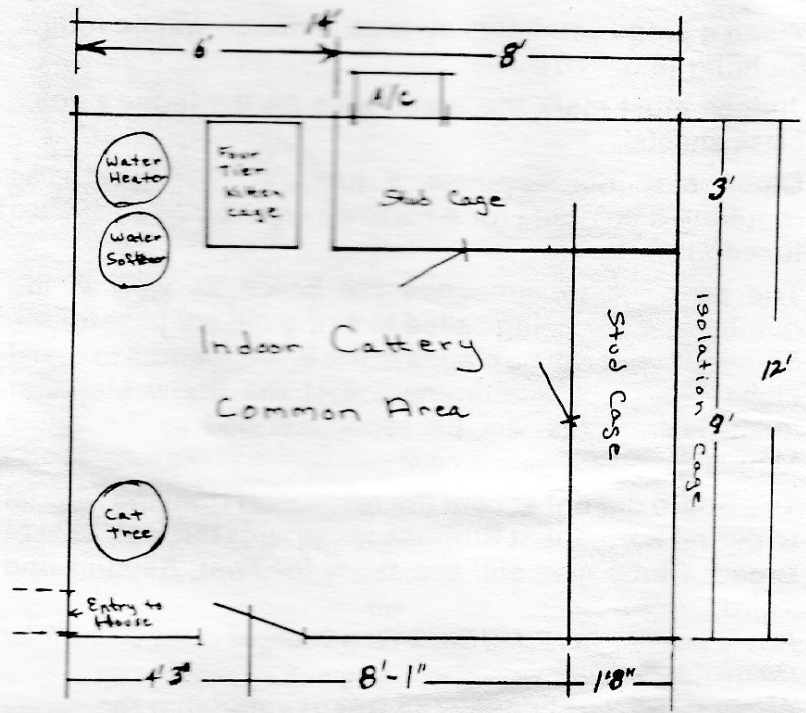
When we built our house, I had not become involved in the Cat Fancy and so our cattery, rather than being intricately planned, it seems, like 'Topsy', "just grew".

Having fallen in love with Scottish Folds, I decided to breed them exclusively. Like most novice breeders, I thought I could function well with one male and several females. However, it didn't take me long to realize that for every fold-ear male I would need straight-eared females, and for every fold-ear female I would need a straight-ear male!

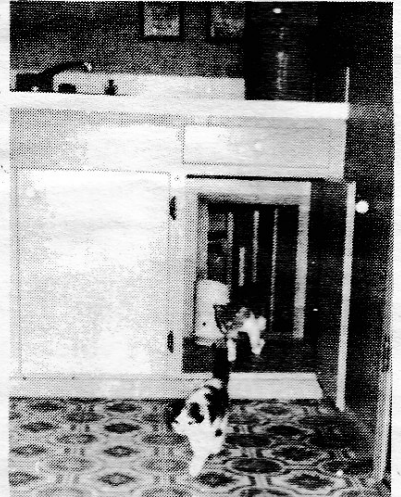
Then I started to think about color! Scottish Folds come in any and all colors. I started out with a Silver Patched Tabby and White Fold, a Silver Classic Tabby female Fold, and a Black straight-ear male. I have always loved Calicos and Bi-colors, so this meant enlarging my stock to produce these colors. Finally, after six years, I have produced my first Calico, and am becoming firmly established with Bi-colors and Tabbies & Whites. Believe me, this does not happen overnight!

But let's get back to the cattery. . . . I began with a room in my house that is behind the utility room and next to the garage. For 'normal' people it would be a workshop or hobby room. I live in a two-story house and this room is, vertically, almost two stories high. It is not a large room but, in the beginning, was more than sufficient.

We built two large, floor-to-ceiling, stud cages and a movable kitten cage that could be broken down from four small cages to one large cage. The rest of the room was used as a 'common area' for queens and older kittens. There was also an isolation cage, located above one of the stud cages. . . and high enough to be private. . . for visitors or those under the weather. My favorite feature was a trap-door that went from the cattery into my utility

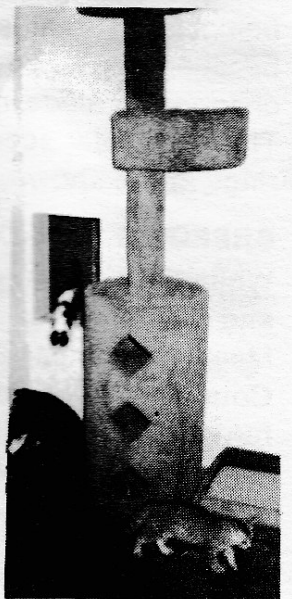
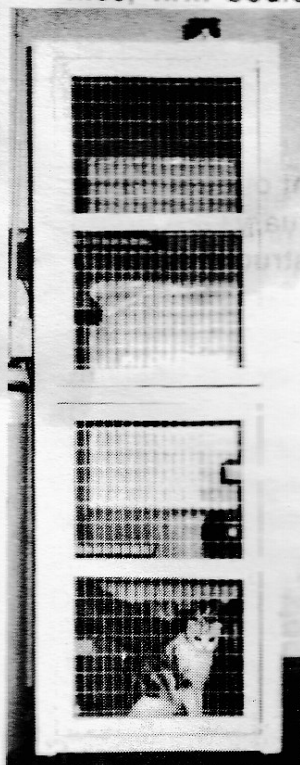


room. Since we like to enjoy having our cats in the house with us, I can open the door and let the girls and older kittens out to roam the house and have 'play period' during the day. A favorite spot for afternoon naps is on the window box in my big bay window located in our breakfast room. I have several cat trees and other climbing devices in different areas of the house and cattery, because I like for my Scottish Folds to have nice, firm bodies that come from running and climbing.

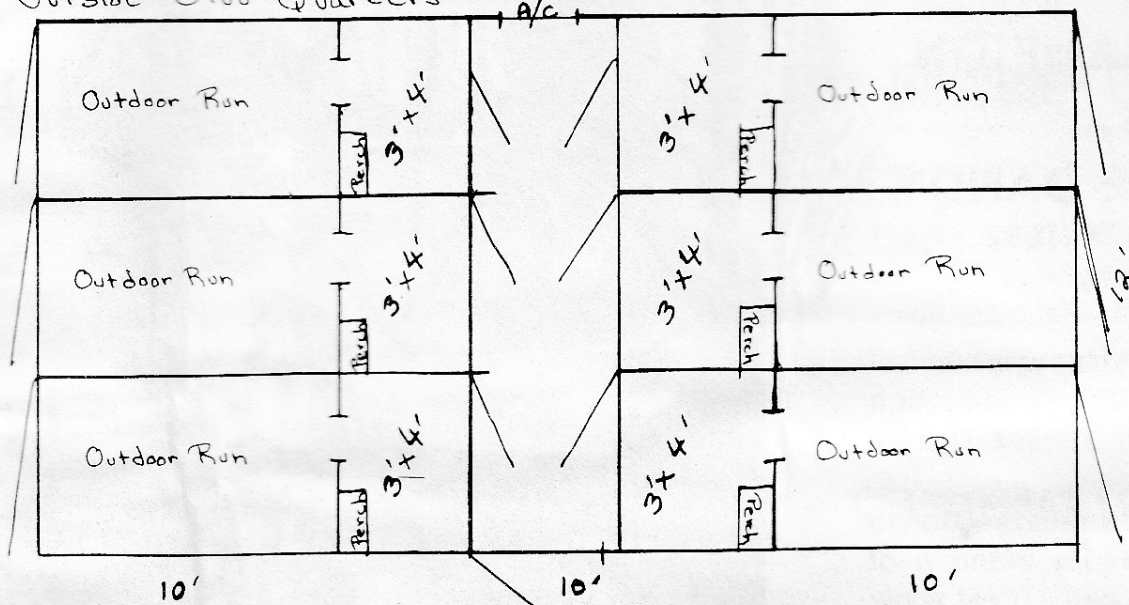


Right— Cats coming into inside cattery through trap-door

My 'newborn' nursery is on the second story of the house and doubles as an office and spare bedroom. When a queen delivers she has the privacy of her own room and stays there until the kittens are five to six weeks old. At this time, they are introduced to the rest of the cattery via the four-tiered cage, which is covered on three sides to insure protection and security.



## Outside Stud Quarters

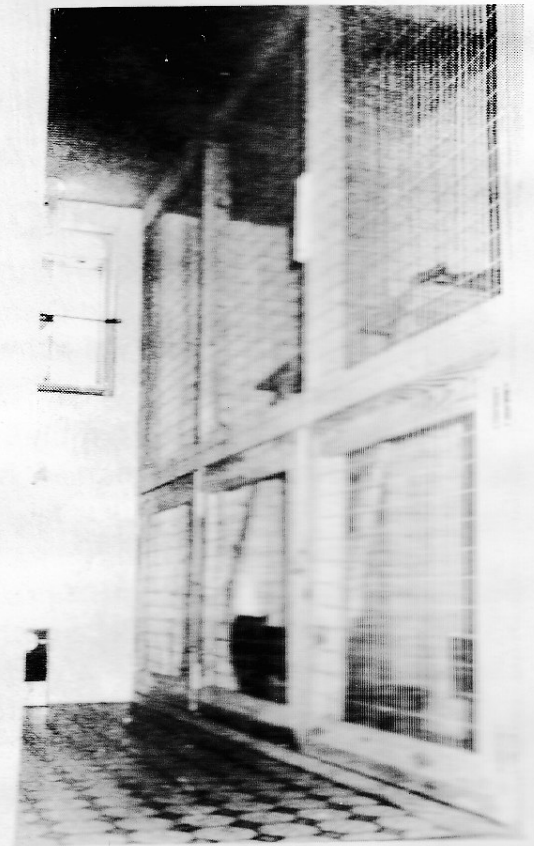


With the passing of time and my desire to increase my color selection, it became evident that the two stud cages were insufficient. We decided to build separate stud quarters in our backyard, with outdoor runs. We built a wooden house, approximately 10' x 12'. It has six indoor cages that are 3' x 4' x 7' high, each with its concrete outdoor run measuring 4' x 10'. Because of our mild climate in Texas, my males can now enjoy the outdoors most of the year. Because of the heat, however, the stud house had to be airconditioned as well as heated.

Each cage has its own sleeping platform with a climbing ladder, and the outdoor runs have tree limbs for climbing, scratching, and perching. The inside walls are made of Marlite (a plastic-coated or laminated board) that can be washed down weekly. The floor is linoleum, which is also easy to clean.

Since we live in a heavily wooded part of Texas we are also quite "buggy". I keep this under control, however, with weekly spraying of liquid 'Sevin' on the outdoor runs, and occasional vapor treatments of both the indoor and outdoor catteries with bombs that kill both adult fleas and pre-adult larvae.

As soon as the males moved to their new quarters, I painted the inside cattery (which now belongs solely to kittens, adolescents, and queens.) I used a high gloss, industrial strength enamel, which is also easy to wash down frequently. Linoleum lining the sides and bottoms of the cages makes the cleaning job simple. To clean cages, walls and floors, I use a combination of 'Clorox' and 'Airkem A-33' (disinfectant, detergent, virucide, with odor-counteractants). I also have an 'Airkem Cavalier III' electric air ecologizer in constant use. It uses a 'Solidair' deodorant similar to those used in veterinary clinics and hospitals. My husband has an "X-ray nose", and this 'Airkem' product serves as a buffer zone between the cattery and the rest of the house.

Cat trees are not the only devices you can use for exercise. My husband and I painted a couple of old step ladders and then padded the rungs with carpet remnants. We also made a 'Wall Tree' by nailing old pieces of lumber to the wall and placing perches at different levels. Each perch was then carpeted so that the cats have something to hook into when jumping from level to level.

SOMEDAY... as it goes in the story books... I hope to have my expansive 'Cat Ranch', with special grooming, medicating and kitting areas, as well as office space and larger outdoor runs. But, right now, due to a very loving and supportive family, the *KITJIM* cats and I are quite happy in our "Mini Cattery" in the Texas Hills!

# CFA GRAND CHAMPION YORCAT YANKEE DOODLE DANDY



July 6, 1981 — July 24, 1982

He was special from the beginning - and his very survival was a miracle. He was born on July 6, 1981, close enough to the "Fourth" that we named him *Yankee Doodle Dandy*.

He was delivered by emergency caesarian section to Seal Lynxpoint GR CH Hu-Man's Happy Hannah of Yorcat, another very special cat who had a great show career and a beautiful, sweet nature but was at her best as a mother. Hannah died ten days after this last litter was born - never having nursed or cared for her babies. The litter of 7 proved to be too much for her damaged kidneys. Hannah was poisoned in November, 1978 at the show where she granded. We managed to pull her through the initial episode. I attribute her survival entirely to the expert skills of my Veterinarian husband, Ron.

We hand-raised Dandy and his 6 litter-mates. He grew into a handsome youngster, all ears and legs. He had a very winning kitten career and went on to become a Grand Champion in 3 shows at the age of 9 months. He was CFA's first Lavender Ticked Tabby Oriental Shorthair Grand, and our first Oriental Grand. We had great hopes toward a National Award. He was the highest scoring cat in his last 3 shows and, at the time of his death, CFA's National Best Oriental Shorthair.

His untimely death on July 25, 1982 leaves a space in our lives that can never be filled. He was loved and admired by many - as much for his special personality as for his elegance. Judges often commented on his "show presence" and style, and his love of the ring was obvious to all. CFA Judge Bob Bryan called *Dandy* his "lavender ticker" and that's what this wonderful cat was to us - all heart.

We were quite diligent about guarding our cats following Hannah's death, but let up after time went by. We always had a friend watching Dandy's cage when he was in it but, as he began to final more and more his cage was frequently left empty while we were watching the finals. Somehow, he, like his mother, was poisoned. Ron and I have been working very closely with Bill and Gayle Lee and the CFA Committee on Poisoning and we want to be very careful about speculating about how and with what our cats were poisoned. It could give someone else ideas. Besides, Dandy, another beautiful cat died as a result of being poisoned at the same show — *Tihan Satin*, an Ebony Oriental Shorthair female kitten, owned by



Elizabeth Tichansky, was the highest scoring kitten at that show and she also died about 2 weeks later. We did not know at the time that both of us were going through the same terrible experience and only learned of both poisonings at a later show. Two other top cats have died since ours — a Siamese on the west coast and a Persian in Texas — so this is by no means ended.

I was overwhelmed by everyone's reactions the first time I was at a show after Dandy's death. Fellow exhibitors and friends were at once shocked and appalled that this could happen to our and possibly their cats. People I had never met expressed their sympathies because they had heard of Dandy's special beauty and personality. But the hardest to handle was the condolences of the judges: perhaps the most avid cat-lovers of us all. Those who had handled and usually finaled Dandy were genuinely sad that he was gone and those who had not met Dandy were equally sorry of the opportunity they had missed. We could hardly speak to one another without crying. Now, after the months have gone by and we have heard from so many people we can accept the kind words of sympathy more easily but at first I was not sure I could ever go to another show. It is hard to accept the fact that perhaps an exhibitor standing next to you could have been the one to administer the lethal dose of poison to such a gentle, loving animal.

If by writing this just one more cat can be saved from dying such an agonizing death, Ron and I will feel a little better.

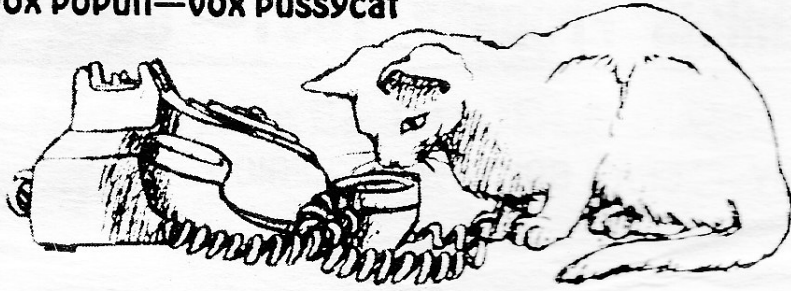

## THE BOMBAY BREED OF 1982

In 1976, The Cat Fanciers' Association, Inc. accepted the Bombay for Championship status. Many breeders can't understand how the breed achieved this status when one is rarely seen at a show. When there is a bombay at a show, many exhibitors don't know what breed it is. There are probably about a dozen serious breeders of bombays. In the six years of championship status, why hasn't this beautiful breed gained more interest? Hopefully, the following will explain.

My interpretation of the current CFA bombay standard is that it is a very difficult standard to attain unless one gets lucky on a first generation cross. In

breeding for bombays there are several methods of approach: bombay to burmese, black American Shorthair to burmese, or bombay to bombay. At present I feel that the best method is black ASH to burmese because there aren't enough quality bombays to use in a breeding program. In selecting the burmese component I would use the one with the most extreme head type that was available. The black ASH used should have good boning, good eye color and respectable ASH type. The ASH may be the more difficult one to find. With this formula it may be possible to get a bombay that resembles a burmese, but not as extreme as today's show winning burmese. If the bombay out of this breeding is fortunate to have a close lying coat and large copper eyes, and the medium body length, a national winner may have been born.

The obvious question is, what is so difficult about breeding top quality bombays?

We are exhibiting a first generation top show bombay named *GR CH Road to Fame's Mabel Black Label*. My immediate concern, once this current show season ends, is — to whom do I breed her? I do not feel the breed has been established enough to breed bombay to bombay. The only other choice is a Burmese, which brings up another problem: which type of Burmese, the traditional, classic, or the more extreme ones that are being exhibited all over the show circuit? If I choose the classic Burmese it may set my breeding program back several generations on the head type I'm striving for. If I choose to use the more extreme Burmese, the possibility exists that I will get more extreme bombays than the standard allows for. I feel, since the Burmese (the major component of the bombay) has changed in style and in standard, so should the bombay follow the same path.

The most critical objective for the bombay breeders is to write a standard that describes the ultimate cat that we want, bearing in mind the pitfalls that the burmese are going through with their standard. I don't believe there is any bombay breeder who wouldn't mind owning a black copper-eyed cat with the body and head type of *GR CH Kashmirian's Lord Lovatt* or *GR CH Good Fortune Fortunatas*. I think the bombay standard could be written around either of these two magnificent burmese.

The standard should be written in such a way that it does not leave a wide spectrum of head types that exist in the burmese standard. When we start seeing bombays at shows with the more extreme head type, I feel that will be the time that this breed will become more popular.

Editor's Notes: Author is breeder of Burmese for 12 years and has bred many CFA Burmese Grand Champions. Mr. Zwecker has bred Bombays since 1976, including two CFA Bombay Grand Champions.

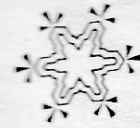
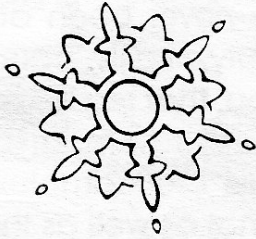


# THE CHRISTMAS KITTENS

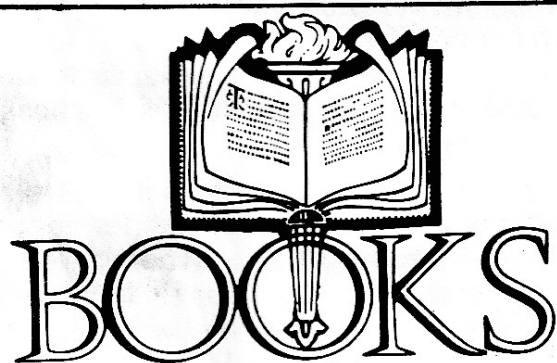
Simeon knocked at the silver gate, and St. Francis, who had been waiting for them, opened it. The kittens, all purring loudly and joyfully, flew home.

# MY TWENTY GENETIC RULES for BREEDING SILVERS

by Pieter J. Prose

The Silvers are *not* formed by the action of one gene (the gene I or SI). A complex of cooperating genes is responsible. These genes are: —

**a. The gene for agouti.** This is the central and most important gene. It is dominant, so we can have: homozygote for agouti (2 genes for agouti), and heterozygote for agouti (1 gene for agouti). The gene for agouti produces the bands in the growing hair.

**b. The real gene for silver.** This gene works *only* in the presence of the gene for agouti and, connected with the gene for agouti, it is dominant. So we can have: homozygote for silver (2 genes for silver), and heterozygote for silver (1 gene for silver). If the gene for agouti is lacking, the gene for silver is there, but it does not work. The task for the gene for silver is to stop the action of the agouti gene immediately it starts working.

**c. The genes for the different tipping.** These genes are responsible for the length of the tipping, working only in the presence of the gene for agouti (the Golden), or the genes for agouti + the genes for silver (the Silvers). The genes for tipping are incomplete dominant. Through their action we can divide the Silvers into:

- Chinchillas or Shells (narrow tipping)
- Shaded (medium tipping)
- Smokes (wide tipping)

We can also divide the Silvers into green-eyed and copper-eyed Silvers. Both exist in the following forms:

1. Silvers, homozygote for agouti (2 genes for agouti), homozygote for silver (2 genes for silver).
2. Silvers, homozygote for agouti (2 genes for agouti) heterozygote for silver (1 gene for silver).
3. Silvers, heterozygote for agouti (1 gene for agouti), homozygote for silver (2 genes for silver).
4. Silvers, heterozygote for agouti (1 gene for agouti), heterozygote for silver (1 gene for silver).

All are silvers; we see almost no differences. Sometimes we see that the heterozygotes for agouti have some solid colored hairs in the coat and that the heterozygotes for silvers have a golden glow.

## BREEDING SILVERS WITH SILVERS

### Rule 1

If we get from a mating of 2 silvers *only* silver kittens, then at least one of the parents is homozygote for agouti and homozygote for silver.

### Rule 2.

If we get silver *and* Golden (Dutch Agouti) kittens, then *both* parents are heterozygote for silver and at least one of the parents is homozygote for agouti.

NOTE: If both parents are green-eyed we will get Golden kittens. If both parents have copper eyes we get "Golden" with copper eyes. We cannot call them Golden; we call them Dutch Agouti kittens as they are Golden with copper eyes. We have named them Dutch Agouti kittens to honor the Dutch breeders who were the first in the world to breed these cats systematically.

### Rule 3.

If we get silvers and solid color kittens in a silver/silver breeding *both* parents are heterozygote for agouti and one of them is homozygote for silver. If *both* parents have green eyes we can expect solid color kittens with *green* eyes.

### Rule 4.

If we get silver, Golden (Dutch Agouti) and solid color kittens from a silver/silver breeding *both* parents are heterozygote for both agouti and silver. If both parents have green eyes all the kittens will have green eyes, so we can expect real Golden and solid color kittens with green eyes. If *both* parents have copper eyes all the kittens will have copper eyes, so we can expect Dutch Agouti and solid color kittens with copper eyes.

## BREEDING SILVERS WITH SOLID COLORS

### Rule 5.

If we get silvers *only* from mating a silver with a solid color partner, the silver parent is homozygote for agouti and homozygote for silver. All the kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The silver parent can be heterozygote for silver, but then the solid color partner *must* have genes for silver.

### Rule 6

If we get silver *and* Golden (Dutch Agouti) kittens from a silver/solid color mating then the silver parent is

homozygote for agouti and heterozygote for silver. The silver kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The Golden (Dutch Agouti) kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and *cannot* have a gene for silver.

#### **Rule 7.**

If silver *and* solid color kittens result from mating silver/solid color, the silver parent is heterozygote for agouti and homozygote for silver. The silver kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The solid color kittens will have one gene for silver.

#### **Rule 8.**

If we get silver, Golden (Dutch Agouti) and solid color kittens, then the silver parent is heterozygote for both agouti and silver. The silver kittens will be heterozygote for both also. The Golden (Dutch Agouti) kittens will be heterozygote for agouti. Some of the solid color kittens will have 1 gene for silver.

#### **Rule 9.**

The silver and Golden (Dutch Agouti) kittens from a mating of a silver with a solid color partner will have wider tipping than the silver parent, unless the solid color partner carries genes for tipping.

*For example:* A chinchilla (shell) with a solid color mate will normally give shaded silver kittens. If we get chinchilla (shell) kittens *and* shaded silver kittens, the solid color partner has 1 gene for chinchilla tipping. If we get only chinchilla (shell) kittens, then the solid color partner has 2 genes for chinchilla tipping. This occurs if the solid color partner has chinchilla, chinchilla Golden or tabbies in his ancestry.

### **BREEDING SILVERS WITH HIMALAYANS**

#### **Rule 10.**

If we get silver kittens only from a silver/Himalayan mating, the silver parent is homozygote for agouti and for silver and has *no* gene for Siamese markings. All the kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver and have 1 gene for Siamese markings.

#### **Rule 11.**

If from a silver/Himalayan mating we get silver and silverpoint Himalayan kittens, then the silver parent is homozygote for agouti and for silver and has 1 gene for Siamese markings. All the non-Himalayan kittens will have 1 gene for Siamese markings, and all will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver.

#### **Rule 12.**

If the kittens from a silver/Himalayan mating are silver and Golden (Dutch Agouti) the silver parent is homozygote for agouti, heterozygote for silver and has *no* gene for Siamese markings. All the kittens will have 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver ones will be heterozygote for both agouti and silver. The Golden (Dutch Agoutis) are heterozygote for agouti. When the silver parent has green eyes, we can expect Golden kittens with green eyes. When the silver parent has copper eyes we can expect Dutch Agouti kittens with copper eyes.

#### **Rule 13.**

If silver, silverpoint Himalayan, Golden (Dutch Agouti) and Goldenpoint Himalayan kittens come from a silver/Himalayan breeding, the silver parent is homozygote for agouti, heterozygote for silver and has 1 gene for Siamese markings. All the non-Himalayan kittens will have 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver and silverpoint Himalayan kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The Golden (Dutch Agouti) and Goldenpoint Himalayan kittens will be heterozygote for agouti. When the silver parent has green eyes we can expect Golden and Goldenpoint Himalayan kittens. When the silver parent has copper eyes we can expect Dutch Agouti and Goldenpoint Himalayan kittens. With a copper-eyed silver parent, we can expect Dutch Agouti and Goldenpoint Himalayan kittens.

#### **Rule 14.**

If we get silver and solid color kittens from a silver/Himalayan mating, then the silver parent is heterozygote for agouti, homozygote for silver and has *no* gene for Siamese markings. All the kittens have 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The solid colored kittens will have 1 gene for silver. When the silver parent has green eyes some of the solid color kittens will have green eyes.

#### **Rule 15.**

If the kittens from a silver/Himalayan breeding are silver, silverpoint Himalayan, solid color and Himalayan with a solid color in the points, the silver parent is heterozygote for agouti, homozygote for silver and has 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver and solid color kittens will have 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver and silverpoint Himalayan kittens are heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The solid color and solid colorpoint Himalayan kittens will have 1 gene for silver. When the silver parent has green eyes some of the solid color offspring can be green-eyed.

#### **Rule 16.**

If a silver/Himalayan breeding produces silver, Golden (Dutch Agouti) and solid color kittens, the silver parent is heterozygote for agouti and for silver and has *no* gene for Siamese markings. All the kittens will have 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver kittens will be heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The Golden (Dutch Agouti) kittens will be heterozygote for agouti. Some of the solid color kittens will have 1 gene for silver.

#### **Rule 17.**

If the kittens from a silver/Himalayan breeding are silver, silverpoint Himalayan, Golden (Dutch Agouti), Goldenpoint Himalayan, solid color, and solid colorpoint Himalayan, the silver parent is heterozygote for agouti and for silver and has 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver, Golden (Dutch Agouti) and solid color kittens have 1 gene for Siamese markings. The silver and silverpoint Himalayan kittens are heterozygote for agouti and for silver. The Golden (Dutch Agouti) and Goldenpoint Himalayan kittens are heterozygote for agouti. Some of the solid color and solid colorpoint

Himalayan kittens can have 1 gene for silver.

**Rule 18.**

In a mating of a silver Himalayan normally the silver, silverpoint Himalayan, Golden (Dutch Agouti) and Goldenpoint Himalayan kittens will have wider tipping than the silver parent, unless the Himalayan partner carries the genes for tipping. (*Compare Rule 9*).

**Rule 19.**

If we get Himalayan kittens from mating two silvers, *both* parents have 1 gene for Siamese markings.

**Rule 20.**


The silvers carry genes for Golden color (gene G). As long as the cats are silvers, these genes *do not* work. They remain dormant. As soon as the real silver gene is gone and the gene for agouti remains, the gene G starts working and changes the tawny sable color (like the agouti color of the brown tabby) into apricot. The gene G is incomplete dominant and works only in the presence of agouti. Agouti cats with tawny sable color have *no* gene G. Agouti cats with warm tawny sable color, a color between apricot and tawny sable, have 1 gene G. This you find in the brown tabbies, coming from silvers. Agouti cats with apricot color have 2 genes G.

Mr. Prose, a renowned Dutch geneticist, says the above rules are also very useful for the breeding of Cameos and related colors. Mr. Prose's Twenty Genetic Rules for Color Breeding appeared in *CWI* Jan/Feb. '82, available thru *Shop-by-Mail*. ## RENAL AMYLOIDOSIS IN ABYSSINIAN CATS

Report from The Ohio State University,  
Department of Veterinary Hospital

In the past few years, investigation of kidney failure in young Abyssinian cats has led to the finding of renal amyloidosis suggestive of a hereditary disorder. Pathologic studies on the kidneys from cats and kittens in both Ohio and California have shown the presence of amyloid deposits in 17 affected Abyssinians, with others yet to be confirmed. A report, entitled "Renal Amyloidosis in Related Abyssinian Cats", prepared by research veterinarians at the Ohio State University, has been published in the *Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association*, July 15, 1982.

Amyloidosis is an incompletely understood disease process characterized by the accumulation of insoluble, inert by-products of protein breakdown which infiltrate various organs of the body. Antigenic stimulus, or perhaps genetic abnormality, can lead to amyloid deposition in one or more organs. Renal amyloidosis is common in the dog and mink and has been observed in other animals. It has been considered rare in the cat. The reactive type of amyloidosis may occur secondary to chronic inflammation, whereas primary, or immunoglobulin-associated amyloidosis may occur without chronic inflammation.

When the kidneys are affected by amyloid accumulation, progressive scarring can occur and eventually lead to uremia and death of the affected cat. The clinical course of the disease is insidious with poor haircoats and weight loss being the most obvious external findings. Laboratory tests show the blood urea nitrogen (BUN) and creatinine levels elevated, dilute urine, protein in the urine, sometimes anemia, and elevations of certain serum proteins. Establishing a diagnosis requires a kidney biopsy but, even with this procedure, there may be difficulties in interpretation. Special stains are required to demonstrate amyloid in the kidneys and in cats the deposits are most prominent in the medulla or deepest region of the kidney. Superficial biopsies of the kidney may miss the deposits. The severe scarring of the

kidneys may lead to a diagnosis of chronic interstitial nephritis and the amyloid deposits may be overlooked. In some cases, the presence of oxalate crystals in the kidney specimens has led to an erroneous diagnosis of kidney failure due to anti-freeze (ethylene glycol) poisoning.

Initial investigations into this disorder indicate that the problem may be widespread in the Abyssinian breed. Researchers at the Ohio State University (Drs. S.P. DiBartola, D.J. Chew, and J.T. Boyce) and at the University of California (Dr. L.D. Cowgill) are interested in studying this disease but need the support of breeders. When a young Abyssinian is showing signs of kidney failure, breeders may assist by having their veterinarians contact either Dr. Larry Cowgill or Dr. Steve DiBartola. Kidney tissue may be sent to these veterinarians for examination specifically for amyloidosis.

Breeders and veterinarians concerned about the future of the Abyssinian breed hope it will be possible to secure funds to investigate this disease further and answer questions such as the following:

1. What type of amyloid is present in the Abyssinian cat: Is it reactive or immunoglobulin-associated?
2. How is the disease inherited? This is a necessary first step in the elimination of the disease from the breed.
3. At what age does amyloid first appear in the kidney?
4. Are there any non-invasive tests that could be used to diagnose the disease early (e.g. a blood test)?
5. Can the disease process be halted or reversed by specific treatment?

## FIRST COMPUTERIZED LISTING & REFERRAL SERVICE FOR BREEDERS

For some months now, U.S. breeders have been offered a unique, computerized referral service at shows and in publications, including CWI. *THE PUREBRED REGISTRY* offers listings and referrals (NOT registrations) to breeders of cats, dogs and horses. When breeders choose to list with TPR, information about their services is entered into the computer. It is then forwarded to other breeders or members of the public who may be interested in purchasing a specific animal, in obtaining stud service, or in many other services. Breeders and the public can also be matched by geographic location, anywhere in the country.

**Advantages:** The Purebred Registry is beneficial to both breeders and the public because it offers nationwide referrals; provides opportunities for breeder advertising; updates information and listings immediately; allows the public to have an alternative to pet stores or leads from trade publications, and offers fast, easy access through a toll-free number.

**Fees:** Fees for TPR are paid solely by the breeders at the time of listing. The service is free to the public who are seeking information. Fees begin at \$25. for a one-month listing and vary according to the number of breeds and length of the listing. A yearly listing is just \$150.

**How to List:** Listings are taken by mail or phone, or in person at cat, dog and horse shows.

**Owners** are Beverly and Boyd Young who own, breed and show Bloodhounds (since the early 1970's). Mr. and Mrs. Young, after months of research, took the first listing in May, 1982, in Scottsdale, Arizona.

William Ross lived in Stonehaven, Kincardineshire, in Scotland. He discovered the first known folded-ear cat, a female named *Susie*, in a Mr. McCrae's farmyard. Two years later, in 1963, *Susie* had two folded-ear kittens, one of which went to Mr. and Mrs. Ross. (see CWI, May/June '76) They named this white female *Snooks*. There was a lot of publicity about these kittens. They were first called 'Lops' (there are lop-eared rabbits) but it was not until American breeders took the breed up that it really flourished. There are now several Scottish Fold breed



clubs. One of them, the *International Scottish Fold Association*, has William and Mary Ross as International Presidents. It was through no lack of devotion and effort on the part of the Rosses that the breed's career was restricted in Great Britain. There will be great sadness at the loss of this caring man. On the day of his death, one can imagine all the little Folds, who will bear the name of their founders' native land for ever, sat down, folded their ears ever tighter, closed their eyes, and said a cat prayer as he made his transition.

Kitty Angell, Secretary of the International Scottish Fold Association, 442 Coronado Dr., Kerrville, TX 78028, writes that her spectacular *GRC Kitjim's Briarpatch* has a brown and white kitten in her litter that she is very excited about. In a recently published article in another publication, a statement appeared that there is a 'lethal gene' in the breed. This is not so. Please consult the above-mentioned article, and others written for CWI, listed in the 'Back Issues' list in this magazine, for clear explanations of the gene that produces the folded ear. Join your breed clubs and read the articles about your breed in the newsletters, written, as are our articles, *by the breeders*.

### THE TRICKS THEY GET UP TO. . .!

Judges will tell you some exhibitors go to any lengths to let them know just *whose* cat they are judging. . .they'll douse the cat and themselves in the same cologne, then engage the judge in conversation before the class is started. They will address their exhibit by name in a loud whisper calculated to reach the judge's ears as they place the cat in its appointed cage in the ring. . .And then there's the wife of the wellknown judge who slips cosily into the empty chair next to the clerk and marks her catalog while her cat is being judged. What will they think of next!!

### DRUG MAY COMBAT FATAL DISEASE

Attention cat lovers! Medical science has found a chemical compound that successfully treats the second most deadly cat disease known. Unfortunately, the drug may never make it to the market.

Richard Olson, professor of veterinary pathobiology has found a drug that puts feline infectious peritonitis, a viral infection of the abdominal and thoracic cavities, into remission. Olson says the drug "looks promising" but, because of the high costs of testing the man-made drug to obtain Food & Drug Administration or U.S. Department of Agriculture approval, he feels it might not be marketed by a pharmaceutical company.

FIP, as the disease is called, is contagious and nearly always fatal, he says. Once cats show symptoms, they usually die within a few days. When a cat has FIP it becomes listless and loses its appetite. After the drug is given, however, the animal becomes energetic and

regains its desire to eat.

Olson says he found the compound, which previously has been reported as an anti-cancer drug, while searching for a cure for feline leukemia. The drug didn't work on that type of cancer but it did work on FIP. The drug cannot be used as a vaccine, however. It only works when a cat already has FIP.

Any cat exposed to the outside would probably have a chance of getting the disease, Olson says, adding that it is common for a veterinarian to see 10 to 20 cases of FIP per year.

Never before had so many Russian Blues been seen together in this country, which gave an added air of excitement to the day, but the most impressive feature was the quality of the exhibits themselves which were commented on both by judges and spectators alike.

The classes were large — 9 male adults, 16 female adults, 20 kittens and 26 neuters. Although the kitten and neuter classes were split, one had to feel some sympathy with the judges for the task they had before them.

# GREAT CATS OF GREAT BRITAIN

## 1981-1982

by Julia M. May

The past year has seen a change in the British show scene: whereas over the last few years Show Managers have entreated exhibitors to send their entries in quickly to avoid the disappointment of having them returned, this year many have been chasing entries right up to, and even after, the closing date. The reduction in entries seems to have hit shows harder in the Midlands and North of England, many shows in London and the South still having to return entries, but the number of cats shown seems to have fallen generally.

This reduction in entries is probably due to a combination of factors. Nearly every year sees an increase in the number of Championship shows in the calendar, plus numerous sanction and exemption shows where certificates are not awarded, so that almost every Saturday has a show somewhere and many have two or three, thus more shows compete for exhibits and even the keenest exhibitor may only enter cats once a fortnight. In addition the recession has had multiple effects: Many "breeders" who misguidedly thought they could make a profit have found it difficult to sell kittens, especially at the prices they wanted, and have faded from the scene. The members of the Fancy who have always believed that the only reason for breeding cats was for the pleasure it gives have had to look carefully at the cost of their hobby: cats must be fed, at ever-increasing expense, but need not be shown — so show entries are often the first to go in an effort to save money.

Showing a cat is an expensive game when you consider not only the cost of the entry but the travelling expenses, eating out and even hotel bills for the further shows. The show entry charges have to rise as the costs of running a show are always increasing: penning, printing, judges expenses and many other items must be taken into account as well as the hire of the hall itself, the last often being a very major item as suitable show halls become more and more difficult to find. With a further increase in the number of Championship shows planned for future seasons it remains to be seen whether entries

fall further or have already reached their lowest level, but much will depend on the economic climate.

However, in spite of the foregoing, many excellent cats have been shown this season and appear in the following pages. The scoring system I used is as follows:

The work was easier this year as I was prepared for it and marked up my catalogue fully at all the shows I attended. Where I did not have a catalogue I found it far simpler to score results from the new CATS than it was from the old *Fur & Feather*. Ruby McCutcheon scored the longhairs again this year and made my task so much easier. The longhair sections are now the biggest at nearly all the shows and I do not think I could have coped with all their classes in addition to the British, Foreign, Burmese and Siamese.

I gave much thought to the scoring system but decided to continue with the one I had used the previous year as it was relatively easy to work and seemed as fair as any other. Many alternative systems, in order to be completely fair, rely on having fully marked catalogues and to obtain these for nearly 50 shows would be a heavy financial burden on CWI, myself or the shows; to divide a cat's score by the number of times it is shown you must know the occasions when it is unplaced and to score by the number of cats beaten you need to know the numbers present in each class. Some scoring systems claim that a

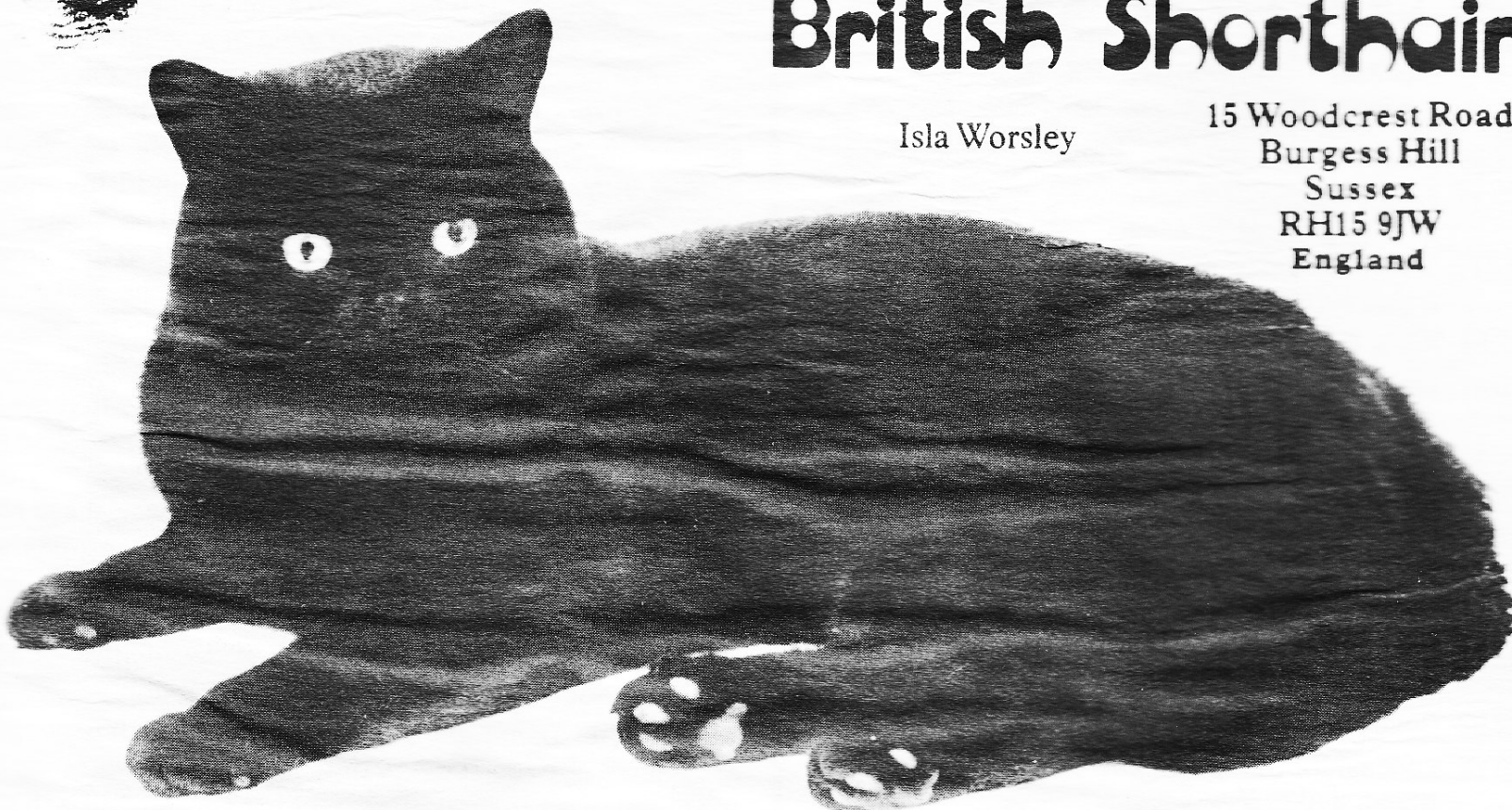

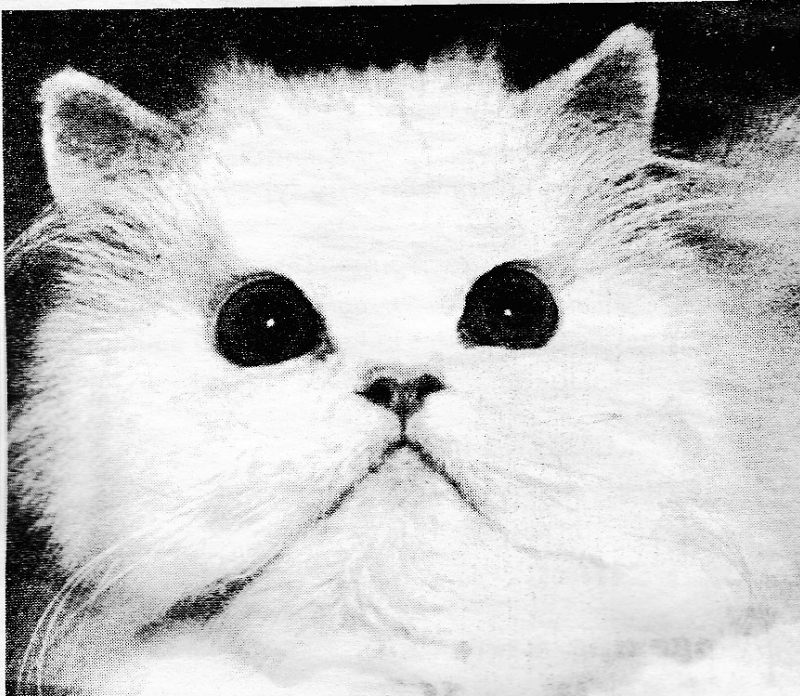

cat can win by attending a single show but I feel that, as judges' interpretations of standards vary, this cannot truly be fair; certificates are often withheld if cats are not deemed to be up to standard and a cat's appearance does not depend on whether he is at a big or a small show, so I have given equal weight to all shows with the exception of the Supreme. The GCCF Supreme Show I have treated somewhat differently as cats must qualify elsewhere before they may enter and the entry should therefore consist of the best cats in the country. The Best and Supreme wins have a significance they lack at any other show in that certificates are awarded here as well as in the Open classes, so these wins too are scored.

I have heard it said that the CWI awards encourage the over-showing of cats but, although I agree that over-showing is wrong, I feel that CWI has little to do with it; the majority of clubs offer points trophies which rely on scoring throughout the year and in any case there are exhibitors who simply like to collect as many certificates as possible. Sensible owners will not over-show their cats and, to them, a CWI award is a pleasant bonus. The "pot-hunters" will continue to over-show whether or not they can add a CWI award to their collection.

Another comment sometimes is made that people are encouraged to show their Champions and Grands in the Open class since both classes are scored, but is this a bad thing? The presence of Champions and Grands in the Open class increases the competition and lessens the risk of "cheap" certificates; if a cat is good enough it will make up and it is surely more satisfying to win the certificate by beating that Grand Champion who is always entered in the Open than to win because the better cat is only entered in the Grand.

The system seems to be acceptable to the majority of exhibitors, but I would welcome any sensible suggestions regarding improvements. Judging by the thank-you letters I have received the winners are certainly happy!

As readers will see, some breeds have not been listed as the leading cats of these particular breeds did not score sufficient points to merit an award. We also had a rather strange situation with the kittens! As I worked the points out, section by section, I found my best Siamese, Burmese and Foreign Shorthair kittens *all scored the same*; I awaited Ruby's Longhair results with fingers crossed - to receive not one but two kittens with points equal to the others! The only fair way to deal with this was to award only Highest Scoring Adult and Neuter awards this year, but it will be very interesting to see how those kittens progress during the coming season: will they produce next year's adult or neuter winner?

It may be a fantasy, but every year the cats seem to grow more beautiful - don't you think so? - and *here they are!*
