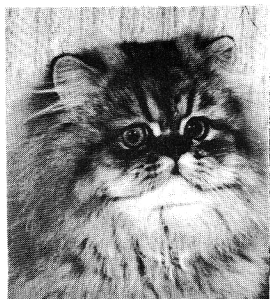

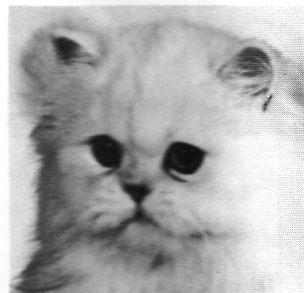

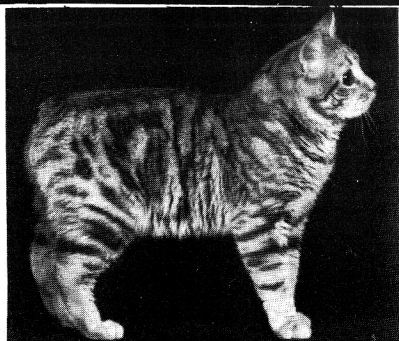

ACFA ANNUAL CONVENTION

The Inn on the Park, Madison, Wisconsin, was the scene for the ACFA Annual Convention from February 15 thru 20, 1983. It was a week of hard work, tremendous results, acceptance of new programs, socializing, a beautiful banquet and topped off by a fantastic 6-ring Championship Show the last two days.

EXECUTIVE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

The Board of Directors met in "open" Executive Sessions for the first two days. Many ACFA Members were in attendance to observe the proceedings and watch the Board at work. The third day the meeting was opened to the Membership for their comments, proposals, or requests for action from the Board.

NEW JUDGING PROGRAM

One of the major accomplishments during the Executive Sessions was the review and revision of the entire ACFA Judging Program. The new program promises to be one of the best in the Cat Fancy today.

This new program has introduced a whole new concept in regards to Judges licensed to train the prospective new Judges. Four different categories of Training Judges will now be licensed.

1. Mechanics Training Judge: Responsible for teaching the Trainee Judges at the first level of their instruction, that of Show Mechanics and the paperwork associated with the duties of a judge.

2. Breed Specialty Training Judge: Will train apprentices in regards to the judging of "specific" breeds of cats for which the judge is qualified and licensed. To be licensed as a Breed Specialty Judge, the applicant must have been *actively* breeding and exhibiting the specific breed for a minimum of five years at time of application.

3. Training Judge: Responsible for training apprentices in *all* breeds of cats in regards to the Standards and procedures for judging. To be licensed in this category, the judge must hold an Allbreed license and have been a licensed Mechanics Judge for a minimum of two years prior to application.

4. Teaching Judge: To be licensed in this category, the judge must have been a Training Judge for a minimum of two years and, as with the Training Judge, still be actively breeding and exhibiting Championship

cats. The Teaching Judge may perform all aspects of training new judges, plus is authorized to conduct Seminars and instruct at Judging Schools.

ACFA TRAINING PROGRAM

In harmony with the new Training Judge program, the Judge "Trainee" program was also revised. An applicant to the program must be a member of ACFA, have actively clerked at ACFA shows—and—served as Master Clerk, and have been actively breeding and exhibiting Championship cats for a minimum of five years prior to being licensed as a Specialty Judge.

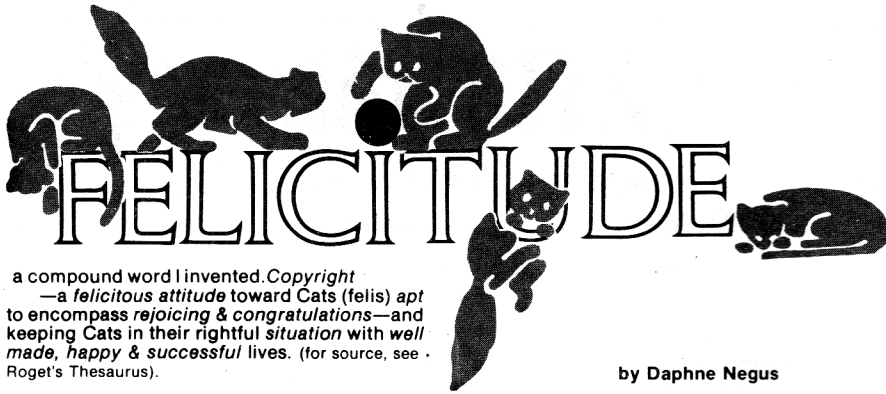
Once applicants are accepted into the program, they enter the Mechanics Training program. During this phase they must successfully complete a minimum number of assignments under the tutorage of a Mechanics Training Judge. When considered to have completed the practical work they are then administered a written exam. on Mechanics and the Rules of the Association as they apply to a Judge.

Upon completion of the Mechanics Training, the Trainee Judge then advances to "Apprentice" Trainee. During this phase of training they get "hands-on" experience judging the cats in accordance with the Breed Standards. This phase of instruction is provided under the guidance of the Breed Specialty Training Judges, Training Judges & Teaching Judges. When the apprentice has successfully completed the required assignments, s/he is then administered a written exam on the Breed Standards of Perfection. Apprentices receiving a passing grade are then advanced to Specialty Judge.

SHOW RULES

Also included on the Board's Agenda were various proposals to amend the ACFA Show Rules. These issues will be referred to the ACFA Membership in April for their acceptance or rejection. Such amendments include: New format for Best in Show Awards — Specialty Shows, Top-5 Cats plus Class Awards, Allbreed shows, Top-10 Cats plus Class Awards; combine the Novice and Open class; a one-year test program for the elimination of the "cut slip"; introduction of a class for Probationary Breeds; requirement for 6 Best in Show Finals, 2 of which must be in the Top-5, to qualify for Grand; and more.

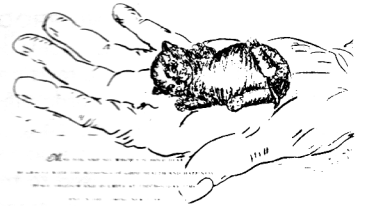
At time of going to press, no response to the letter I

Here, Beverly R. Bragdon tells us about the ethereally lovely Turkish Angora who has shared her life with her since October, 1973. . .

SEXTUPLE GRAND CHAMPION KUKKULA ACRES MYSTIC DREAMS END

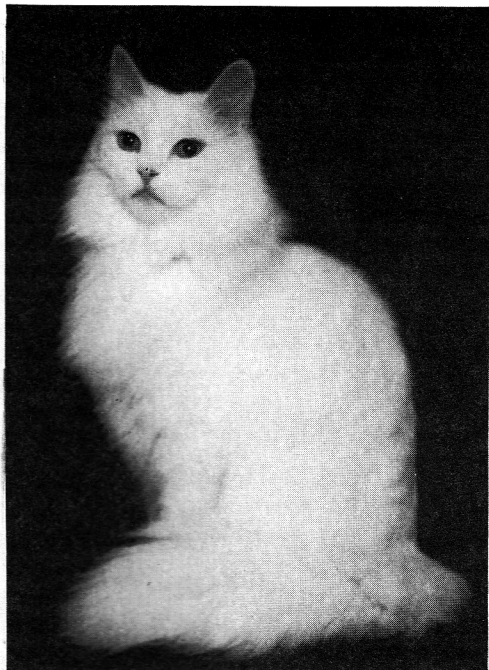
"Mystic" has many "Firsts" to her credit: First Turkish Angora Grand Champion in any association. First CFF Turkish Angora Grand. First & ONLY Quadruple, Quintuple, and Sextuple Turkish Angora Grand Champion.

She also was the first Turkish Angora to earn a "Best of the Best", and the first to earn a Regional award, when she was 5th Best Midwest Cat in 1976. She went on to earn Regional awards again in '77, '80 and '81.

Mystic arrived in my home in October of 1973, at the age of 12 weeks. She immediately endeared herself to all who would come to know her. She was a born lover, "kissing" and rubbing noses.

Mystic attended her first show in November 1973 and made her first of many future finals with a 4th Best Kitten. It should be noted that the Turkish Angora had just been accepted for championship showing on May 1, 11973.

Mystic finalized at almost every show she went to, and defeated a lot of other Turkish Angoras. At 9 months of age, she was Best of Breed across the board at a CFA show, with 6 other T.A.'s present. She completed her first Grand at the age of 15 months in just 2 shows, at one of which she was 2nd Best Allbreed Cat, with over 360 benched. She was never shown a lot. She made 6 to 10 shows a year and has only 46 life time shows to her credit in 9 years. However, she earned 106 finals under 34 judges from 5 associations, including two Best Cats. She



also earned a total of 98 Regional and National Awards, and is the only Turkish Angora ever to earn Best All American of Breed 4 years.


I am proud to say Mystic remained a lady at all times, never blowing or giving the judges a hard time. Because she was the first T.A. that many judges had handled, they formed their opinion of the breed from her. To this day, some judges look for the "Mystic" look on the T.A.'s they judge.

Mystic produced only three litters in her breeding career. Five of her kittens earned Grands and one became a Triple Grand. But, for some reason, none of them could beat Mom. All of them carried her easygoing temperament, including the boy that was kept as a stud.

Mystic is now retired, and resting on her laurels. I feel that, after nine years of showing, she has more than earned a rest. She is still the sweet, loving and playful cat that she always was, and will remain with me for life. I will be bringing out her Great Great Grand-daughter this season, but no cat will ever replace the joy I have known in showing my beloved MYSTIC. I feel certain that she made many friends for the breed in the early days, and influenced many people to get a T.A. in the later years.

She was, and still is, the joy of my life. She is a "Grand" lady and a real credit to her breed — and my ULTIMATE CAT.

Our 1983 Semi-Annual Board meetings and show were held March 2—6, in Las Vegas, Nevada.

RESULTS FROM THE RECENT BALLOT:

Proposition that: — Judges may judge cats of their own breeding after a specified period - *failed 126-204.*

—Judges may show cats in other rings at a show where they are judging— *failed 150-180*

—Members of the Breed Committees be active breeders or own a cat of that breed — *passed, 292-38*

and - Proposition that permits the Board to appoint someone other than a CPA to tabulate results of ballots - *passed, 165-160.*

—Less than 5 rosettes in small classes - *passed, 176-144.* Judges still must name & record top 5 for scoring, championship, grand & multiple grand purposes.

—Change in HHP titles - *passed 244-71.*

New Regional Directors: N.E. - Barbara Washburn. N.C. - Larry Mingus.

UPCOMING BALLOT

The Board, using emergency powers, enacted 2 changes in Show Rules because of current problems. These go into effect, but are subject to ratification by the membership. They are expected to be followed by the clubs as of 5.1.83, but the membership must agree, by vote, to keep them in effect. The first issue deals with shows that have over 200 entries in one day. The second deals with a Breed or Multiple Breed Specialty ring.

Other proposals to be voted upon on a normal basis are: Amend the definition of "kitten" that states it is an unaltered male or female to exclude HHP kittens. Rationale: TICA is committed to altering of HHP's. It is unfair to an owner of a female, who has her altered at 7 months, that she can be excluded from competition. If this is not enacted, TICA would be encouraging delaying spaying/neutering the HHP that may produce an unwanted litter.

A proposal to allow for some staggered terms for Regional Directors will be voted on.

A reminder— filing for President, Vice President,

The following is excerpted from SW Regional Director Mary Haffner's Newsletter, March 1983. Due to illness, the President and Vice-President were absent. The Board selected Ms. Haffner to chair the Meeting.

Regional Director and all Breed Committees opens 4.1.83. Fees are \$10. for Board candidates and \$5. for Breed Committee candidates. A letter of intent, along with the proper fee, must be sent to the Executive Office. Breed Committees, in order to be functional, must have full representation: 5 (7 for Persian & Siamese). At present, announced candidates for Vice President are Jim Becknell (Texas) and Mary Haffner (California).

By Board ballot prior to the meeting, Frances Yow was appointed new *TREND* editor. Roland Lindsey, who resigned because of the increased demands of a new job, remains as the *Yearbook* editor. Show notices and other items of interest for the *Trend* are to be sent to Frances Yow, 5407 Mockingbird Rd., Greensboro, NC 27403.

The 1982-83 show season, for TICA scoring purposes, will include May 1, 1983, a Sunday.

POLICY MATTERS

The uniform format for breed standards has been developed, along with a uniform glossary of terms. Gloria Stephens will be mailing the outline and glossary to all Breed Chairmen.

The Scoring System will remain the same thru 1983-'84. Some judges are not timely in submitting their books to the Office and Scorer.

There is considerable interest in the U.K. in TICA. The Board discussed ways to work with them in adapting TICA to their needs. Specific guidelines were given for a year's trial period.

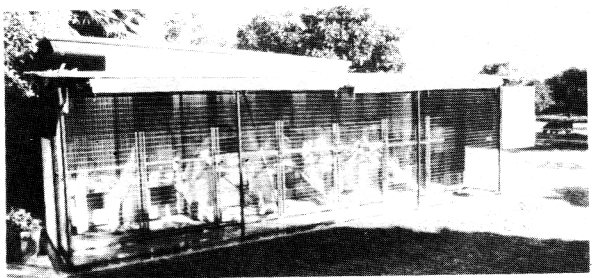

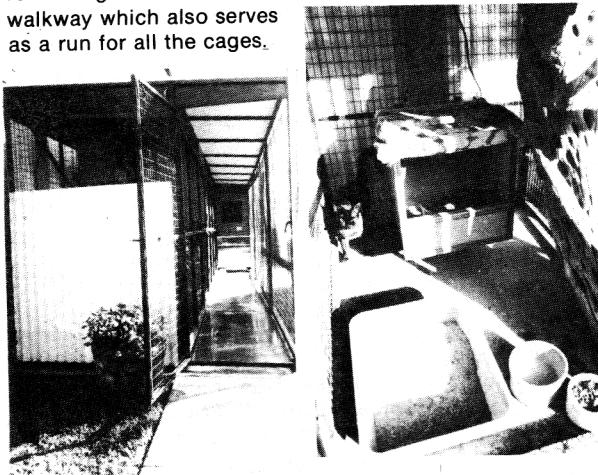
International Cattery Pandit Cattery *Tour* SABLE BURMESE



We now tour a cattery in Paradise Valley, AZ, especially designed to provide a comfortable life style for Sable Burmese cats in Arizona's desert climate, and for easy management during the Flood family's migration out of State for several months each year. *PANDIT Cattery* is the present home of the important Sable Burmese male — *MAHAJAYA TOFFEE OF BOWBELL (Imp.)* — (see *CFA Yearbooks for 1979 and 1981, CWI Mar/Apr. '79, etc.*) one of the famed "Bangkok Burmese", bred by Mme. Ruen A. Rajamaitri.

Pandit Cattery started in 1974 with one cat. It is now a medium-sized facility with anywhere from ten to fifteen cats. Because I leave Arizona during the summer months I had to design a facility that could house the cats comfortably *and* be easy for my cat sitter to care for in my absence. The cattery structure is 7' wide and 21' long, divided into seven walk-in cages each 3' wide x 4' deep x 6' high. Three of these can be divided again (top and bottom) to increase accommodations to ten cages. The remaining 3' of the 7' width is an enclosed "security" walkway which also serves as a run for all the cages.



Three of the four sides of the cattery are enclosed, with the fourth side open. During the winter months this side can be left open to let the cats have some sunshine, but to keep the cattery cool during the summer heat the entire fourth side can be closed. To close off this side I have attached two 1' awnings, the kind usually seen on motor homes and travel trailers. They work very well as they are easily put up and down (*photo top right*).

The whole structure has been placed on a cement pad which has a gutter and splash board. The cattery can be quite easily washed down and disinfected daily. The entire cattery can also be moved, if necessary, except of course for the cement pad. The framework is wrought iron, and the wire is small aviary wire. The entire structure is under a roof which is insulated and painted with reflective paint to protect against our strong summer sun. To cool my cattery I use a swamp cooler which works very well and keeps the temperature right around 80 degrees. The cooler is on a time clock, insuring that the cats will be comfortable during the hot part of the day. For warmth in the winter, I use heat lamps which shine into the sleeping boxes. These boxes also serve as perches, and there are usually two to a cage. The boxes are hung at different levels, attached to a 6' high 2" x 4" post. There are tree limbs in each cage for climbing and scratching.

The cattery is just outside my kitchen door, making access easy. All canned and frozen food is stored inside the house. The cats' meals are served on disposable paper plates. Dry food and litter is stored in large metal trash barrels for protection from rain and rodents.

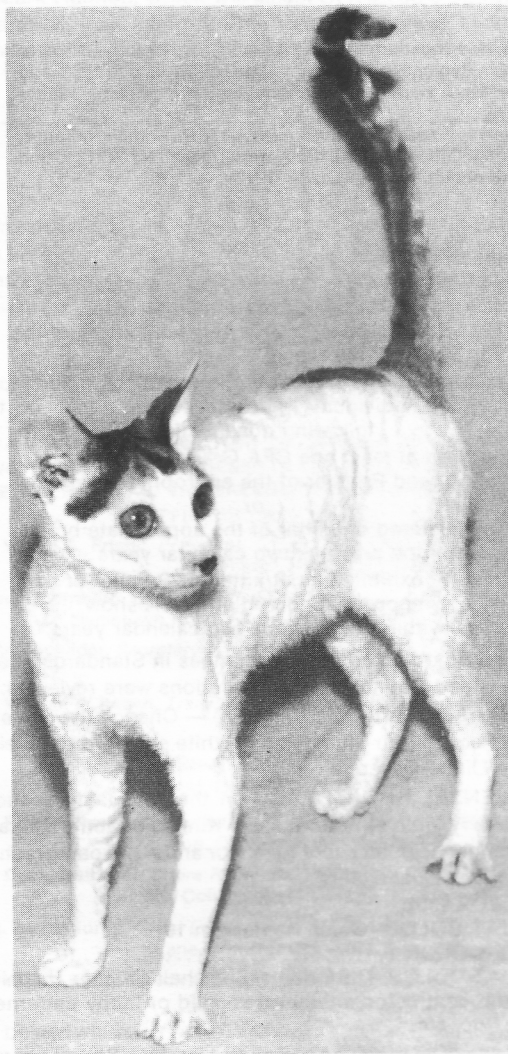
My expectant moms are usually brought into the house several weeks before they are due. This gives them time to re-adjust to the family and to get the general idea where they are supposed to have their babies. The kittens are raised in the house in a family atmosphere until they go into their new homes, usually at three months of age.

Owing to the dry climate, our parasite and bug problems are minimal. We do not generally have fleas in Arizona, which makes keeping a cattery much easier. I usually do spray once a month.

My husband, Richard, is presently building a large storage building in which I will have both a kittening room and a quarantine room for new cattery members or for those present members who are a bit under the weather. As a cattery is a constantly growing affair, I imagine I will keep adding and changing as long as the need arises. For now, this set-up is ideal for my Burmese and me.

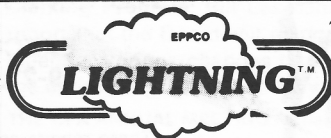

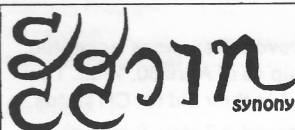

19-21, 1983, Dallas, Texas**

Club Membership: 10 new clubs were accepted into membership, making the total number of clubs in CFA to 555. The Clubs are: Music City Cat Club, Les Amis des Chartreux, Finicky Felines, Chebucto CF, Eyes of Texas CC, Forth Worth CC, Pelican State CC, Lahcwin CC, Canusa CC, and Negoya AB CC.

Judging Program: Advanced: Ricky Carroll (AB), Nick Fisher (SH), Bob Goltzer (LH), Russ Haussman (AB) Craig Rothermel (SH), Leta Williams (SH), Joan Wasthuber (SH)

New Trainees: Betty Denny (SH), Jean Grimm (SH), Bob Goltzer (SH), Marian Johnson (SH), Kim Wheelwright (SH). Board deferred action on Margot Mellies (LH).

Relicensing: All judges were relicensed with the exception of Lynn Beck, Marge Needles and Joe Giannuzzi. All three will have the opportunity for a hearing in June and may continue to judge & accept assignments until that time.

Resigned: Pauline Frankentfield.

Leave of Absence: Bob Smith.

Judging Schools: The Board approved such schools. See the *Quarterly* for details.

New Rule: Trainees may now work at 1-day shows provided it is in an AB ring.

Breeds & Standards: The Devon Rex were accepted unanimously for Championship as of April 30, 1983. The Tonkinese were defeated 11 - 7 in their bid for CH status.

3-Day Show: The Board approved a 3-day, 8-ring show for Labor Day week-end in So. California. Show Rules were set aside so exhibitors may show their cats the next weekend.

Breed Council Membership requirements received a lot of discussion following the October Board meeting when several different proposals were put forth. Diana Doernberg, Chrm. of Breeds & Standards developed the following compromise proposal for Breed Council Membership requirements. It was unanimously adopted by the Board. To take effect beginning the membership year January 1, 1983

Membership in any Breed Committee is limited to indiv-

iduals who:

1. Have a CFA registered cattery name.
2. Are at least 18 years of age or older.
3. Registered with CFA at least 3 litters of the appropriate breed.

In addition to the above requirements, membership is limited to individuals who have met either of the following qualifications:

Bred at least one CFA Grand Champion or Grand Premier of the appropriate breed

or

Registered one litter of the appropriate breed within the previous two calendar years and

Have exhibited a cat/kitten or Premier of the appropriate breed at a CFA show within the previous two calendar years.

The Board voted several changes in Standards after the Breed Council recommendations were reviewed: PERSIAN: (Parti-color Division) — Change the name of the Persian Van Bluecream & White standard to Persian Van Dilute Calico.

ORIENTAL SHORTHAIR: —In the Disqualify section, delete 'Visible kink' and insert 'Kinked or abnormal tail.' Change the point score for Color and add a paragraph to describe Coat Color:

COLOR (30)

COAT COLOR (Color 10; Pattern 10) 20

EYE COLOR 10

COAT COLOR: The Oriental Shorthair's reason for being is the coat color whether it is solid or tabby patterned, etc. etc. etc.

REX: — The breeding of Rex to American Shorthairs will NOT be allowed after January 1, 1984. Add to the standard: "PENALIZE: Sparse coat or bare spots."

RUSSIAN BLUE: The current HEAD description is replaced with a more descriptive paragraph.

The Board passed unanimously the addition at the bottom of each Standard *the breeds allowed in the breeding program for that breed.* This will be printed in the 1983 Standards.

Show-of-the-Year. Beginning with the new show season, CFA will make awards for the Top 3 Shows in each

Region and the top 3 Shows nationally. The Regions will select their own Best Shows and the top 3 will advance to national competition. There will be a committee, headed by Mark Hannon, which will select CFA's Top 3 Shows. Awards will be made for the national winners at the Annual Meeting Awards Banquet, Saturday night June 25. The other 4 members of the committee have not yet been announced.

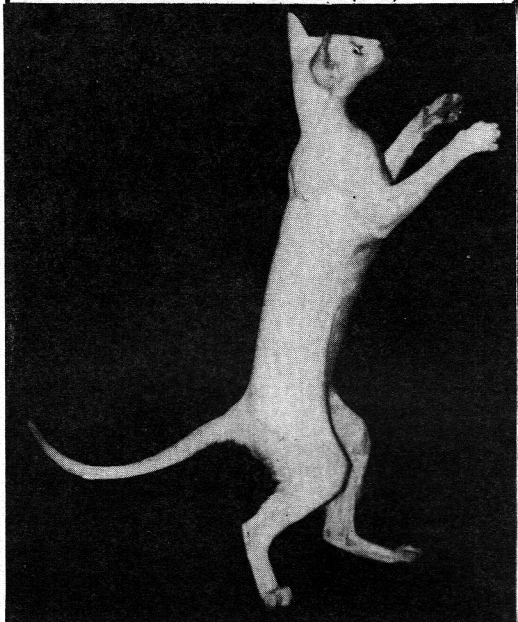

Introduction

My first two articles concerning the development of Oriental Shorthairs are non-controversial and have pretty photographs. After all, the first article was written at the time we were petitioning The Cat Fanciers Association, Inc. (CFA) to accept the Oriental Shorthairs for championship status and the second was published after the Orientals' first CFA season with championship status.*

This article has a different flavor. It is intended to make very clear and succinct the true motives behind the launching of the Orientals in CFA. It is not intended to please or displease any individual or any cat registry.

The story to be told here is specifically concerned with Siamese produced from non-traditional programs. This same story could be written, with very little change, using a different cast of characters such as Burmese, Himalayans, Abyssinians, Balinese-Javanese, Colorpoint Shorthairs, Rex, Exotic Shorthairs, or any breed that is defined as using a limited color spectrum. These breeds have similar problems in terms of what parents are accepted by the registering body. The role played by the registering body will be CFA, the largest registering organization in the United States, but could be any registry which does not use genetics as a basis for breed classification.

To set the scene, CFA is currently one of the last strongholds in the world for a four color limit on the Siamese. Some of its members are very proud of this situation, while others deplore it and see it as the demise of this once prolific and vital breed. This story is about the latter group of breeders and what they had hoped to achieve with the Oriental breed. One must note that the latter group are also Siamese breeders.

Definition of a Siamese according to CFA

*"What's in a name? that which we call a rose

First let us understand which cats qualify as Siamese in CFA: blue points, seal points, chocolate and lilac points are registered

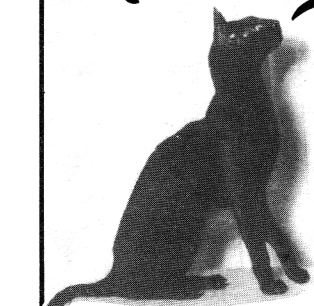

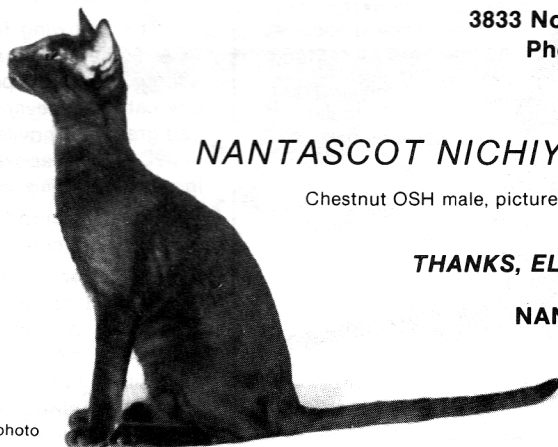

provided their ancestry is also restricted to the above four colors. For example, a seal point Siamese produced from a Colorpoint or from an Oriental program in this country is not allowed on a CFA Siamese pedigree even if such a seal point was produced 100 generations ago. This seal point Siamese is called either an *AOV Colorpoint* or an *AOV Oriental*, with *AOV* standing for *Any Other Variety*.

Now, a Colorpoint in CFA is a Siamese with point color: red, cream, blue-cream, tabby, etc. As we all know, Colorpoints can have a seal point offspring. That seal point is NOT a Siamese in CFA and he can never appear on the pedigree of a CFA Siamese if he has been bred in the U.S. (The rules for registration of imports are described below).

My experience has proven that it is extremely difficult for breeders outside CFA to comprehend such a registry. *By genetic definition, any shorthair cat which has color restriction and blue eyes with Siamese conformation is indeed a Siamese.* I am often asked: "What does your organization think a seal point Siamese is when it does not conform to its registration rules?" The following chart has served to illustrate the current situation in CFA. (*CPSH* and *Other Color Siamese* refers to CFA's Colorpoint Shorthairs; and *Oriental-Siamese* are pointed cats produced from Oriental programs.)


















For the sake of clarity, we will assume that all of the 16 above breedings produced seal points. Of course, other colors can be produced with the matings shown above. The 16 seal points shown in Chart 1. are indistinguishable Siamese either phenotypically (external appearance) or genotypically (what they will transmit to their offspring). Under this classification, only one is a Siamese, 3 are AOV Colorpoint Shorthairs and 12 are AOV Oriental Shorthairs. Only that one Siamese will be allowed to compete for championship awards, or may be bred to produce registrable Siamese. The remaining 15 must be accepted as "waste", (see quotation below).

The most charitable comment heard in response to this registration rule has been: "What a clever idea for eliminating the competition; here many of our top Siamese are what you call AOV's". "Here" being Europe and South America, using the FIFe or Independent registries; U.K., Australia and New Zealand, using the GCCF registry, and the U.S. using TICA (The International Cat Association) registry.

The following fact is the "icing on the cake". The CFA requirement for registering an imported Siamese is a three generation pedigree. That is, an import can have any cat whatsoever in the fourth generation of his/her pedigree. This privilege is denied to the American breeder in CFA! (see above). This inconsistency is disconcerting, discouraging and completely unacceptable.

With this introduction, it is hoped that what follows may be more comprehensible.

Motivation for the Orientals

It was through the Oriental Shorthairs that we, the originators of this breed, had designed to make the necessary improvements to our beloved Siamese. We had hoped that, in time, with greater genetic knowledge and with good examples on hand, CFA would revise their registration rules. (The accuracy of this statement can be verified by the original Oriental Shorthairs breeders

listed in the CFA Yearbook article referenced above.)

In the meantime, the concept of a solid colored breed with Siamese type was exciting to all of us who were Siameseophiles. Furthermore, we were convinced that the Oriental Shorthairs would be a valuable addition for the American cat fancy and for the pet market. The idea that we could use the Orientals to improve our Siamese had been demonstrated convincingly in many other countries. We make no claim to originality on this issue.


Back in 1972, my husband, Peter, and I had occasion to visit England. We were already successful CFA Siamese breeders having had *FRODO*, our blue point, in CFA's Top 20 for two consecutive years and having bred several dozens of Siamese grand champions. In spite of the high quality of our stock, we knew the importance of locating good Siamese outcrosses to import for us and for other breeder friends. The Siamese which had interested us the most, however, were all non-registrable with CFA. Upon returning to the States, we got together with several Siamese breeders who shared our concerns with respect to the shrinking Siamese gene pool. We showed pictures of the beautiful Siamese we had seen in England, along with photographs of their parents which included tabby points or Foreign Shorthairs (now known as Orientals). It was with great sadness that we had to accept the fact that such valuable and beautiful outcrosses could not be introduced into our breeding programs within the current CFA registration rules.

After the sadness came the frustration. We were being denied the most important tool of any animal breeder — that of experimenting with new bloodlines. Without the possibility of a large gene pool there is no way to improve type and to circumvent genetic problems which will surface with any long term inbred program. Without these tools there are no breeding programs at all! The imports were essentially non-

registrable and the CFA Siamese gene pool was very small with only a handful of truly distinct lines, all others being satellites of these few.

Soon our fears and warnings concerning the shrinking gene pool became a fact. CFA published a kitten mortality survey which showed a 50% or more mortality for the Siamese breed. Still, no action was taken to determine the causes and what could be done to improve these deplorable statistics.

Early in the 1970's, my husband and I proposed to incorporate the Colorpoints into the Siamese breed. AT that time, we had not yet owned our first Colorpoint and the proposal was not meant to be self-serving. Nevertheless, this notion met strong resistance from several well established Siamese breeders. Their cats had been good enough twenty years ago, they argued, "We don't need new cats." It was hopeless! Promoting their own lines seemed to be their only interest. No argument based on genetics or sound breeding practices or mortality rates of over 50% could move this strongly entrenched group.

By 1973, several other Siamese breeders in the US had become enchanted with the concept of the Oriental breed. Many fine examples were already being shown overseas. We were fully aware that "AOV Siamese" would be a by-product and very desirable from our point of view. We were also intellectually convinced on two grounds that, in time, these Siamese would gain full

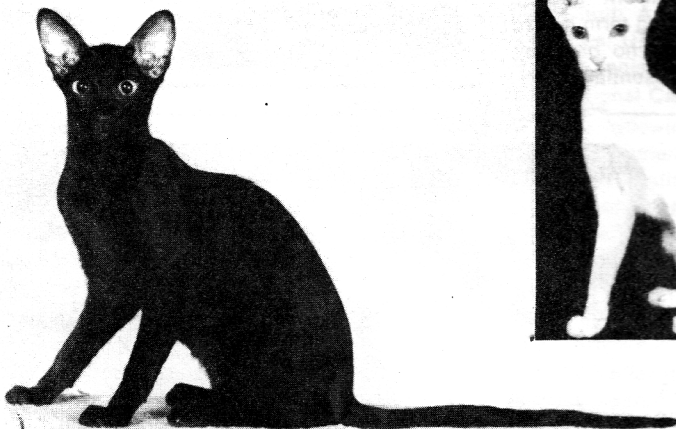
recognition: the Siamese breed badly needed new bloodlines (so-called hybrid vigor), and the cats would be esthetically appealing. Furthermore, these new Siamese would be genetically identical to the Siamese produced by traditional like to like breeding programs.

The Oriental Standard

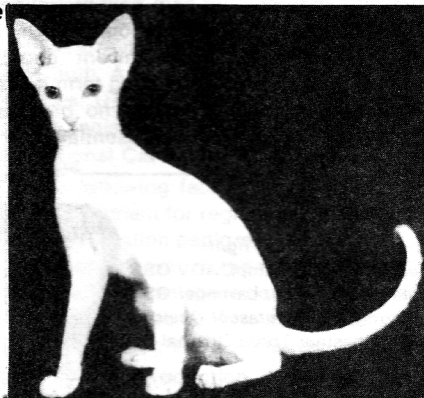
We deliberately designed the Oriental standard to agree with that of the Siamese standard but we made two changes which we felt were long overdue in the Siamese description. This parallel was made with the expectation that Siamese, Oriental Shorthairs and Colorpoints would be recognized as a single breeding group, united by a common type and coat. The Oriental Shorthairs standard tried to give the impression that the Oriental should be a good sized cat by the removal of the greatly misinterpreted word "dainty". It spelled it that "males are larger than females" because many judges and breeders seemed to ignore this fact of Nature! On this one issue, we have had

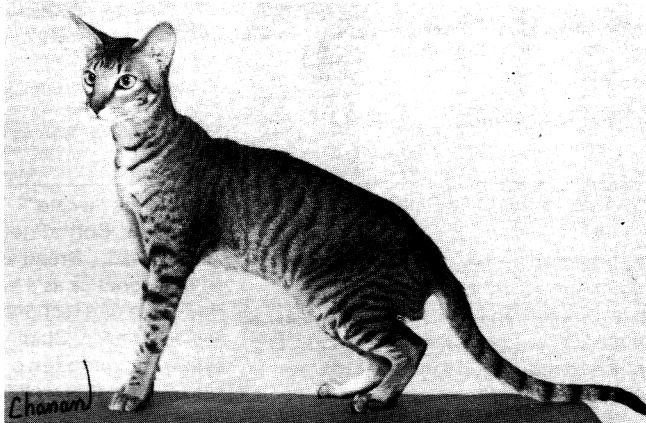

great success. The Siamese standard as of 1983 will have been changed to incorporate the two changes made in the Oriental standard.

We should not, however, allow ourselves to be too complacent over these improvements in the Siamese standard. The established Siamese breeders of the type mentioned earlier will feel personally injured by these changes. They could agitate to have them revoked, even though these modifications have been passed by two-thirds of the Siamese Breed Council. The removal of the word "dainty" from the written Siamese standard has not necessarily removed it from the minds of certain judges. Worse, these same judges have recently started to evaluate the Orientals against the "old" Siamese standard. The Oriental Shorthairs started as an elegant, good sized cat; to change this would be counter to the original breed design, both from the aesthetic point of view and for the sound breeding program we had envisioned.

The Oriental Shorthairs were an immediate success on the American show benches. CFA judges throughout the country expressed their astonishment at how quickly the Oriental Shorthairs had reached such high quality. Never before had a new breed gone so far so fast. Some even arrived at the correct explanation and said it was "hybrid vigor". We hoped that the fancy would conclude that the Siamese offspring from Oriental breedings

would be of the same high quality. The inference was indeed made, but it had a negative effect! Certainly anyone could see that the Siamese brothers and sisters of these spectacular Orientals were of equal quality but their competition on the show bench, for stud services and for the pet market was not welcomed.

Almost from the start, a large number of Siamese breeders joined the Oriental movement. We questioned them on the quality of the Siamese from their Oriental programs. The response was unanimous: "outstanding and sturdy!". However, a few unexpected and impossible answers were also heard. Answers such as: "What Siamese offspring? I never get any of those" set panic into our hearts. How many breeders would deny the existence of the Oriental Siamese? If these cats were being passed off as CFA Siamese, how would we ever prove the point that Siamese from Oriental programs were of high quality?

Yet, how could we condemn the practice of calling a Siamese a Siamese? Was this not precisely what we had set out to do? Yes, with one exception, we believed it would be sanctioned by CFA, who, we were convinced, would recognize the fact that when rules are stupid and intractable they will be broken! There is no possible way for an Oriental Siamese to be distinguished from any other Siamese, either in terms of his appearance or in his ability to produce only Siamese when bred to a Siamese. Could it be that CFA was not aware of these facts? Could

they seriously believe that 15 out of 16 Siamese of high quality would be "wasted"?

Many devoted breeders have been exhibiting Oriental Siamese in CFA shows without the possibility of earning awards. It is difficult to justify the financial expenditure of showing AOV's. The numerous owners of AOV's cannot honestly be encouraged to enter cat shows where they will observe household pets receiving elaborate awards while their AOV's may get a pat on the head. Discouraging such a large group of exhibitors cannot be profitable from anyone's point of view. Show participation is decreasing. Can anyone afford to close the door on so many new fanciers simply because the Siamese breeders do not want the competition? Those of us who have been exhibiting Oriental-Siamese have been gratified by those judges and directors who agreed with our concept of how a modern Siamese could be produced. Of course, there are still many who seem indifferent or unable to comprehend the situation. We were especially dismayed to hear views such as: "Hybrid programs produce waste and you have to accept this fact", or "CFA was nice enough to let you use your Siamese to produce the Oriental Shorthairs. Now you must not embarrass us by showing these AOV's."

The first statement definitely begs the question. Hybridization is never executed to produce "waste". Furthermore, how can anyone decree that we must

accept this "waste"? The second statement merits no comments. Both statements fail to address the issues we have raised. "Breed eligibility in CFA specifically discounts genetics as a basis for breed classification." Help! How does one respond to someone who still believes the earth is flat? "Siamese breeders want to be sure that when they breed two Siamese they will not get a black cat." Since it is well known that the Siamese pattern is recessive to solid color, and that two recessives can never have a dominant offspring, this type of answer can only be categorized as pitiful.

Conclusion

In summary, the Oriental Shorthair program has had tremendous success on the US show benches. Breed interest from both new breeders and pet owners is continuously increasing. Both solid and Oriental-Siamese command higher prices than do the traditionally bred Siamese.

On the other hand, the Siamese part of the Oriental Shorthair breeding program has made slow progress. This is due in part because the traditional Siamese breeders do not welcome the competition and are unwilling to acknowledge the need for new blood. On the other side of the coin, certain Oriental Shorthairs breeders are denying the existence of the AOV's for whatever reasons suit them.

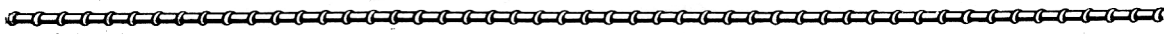
The situation for the traditional Siamese program is *critical*: kitten mortality of over 50%, feline health statistics showing the Siamese as being the most susceptible breed for most diseases, and a drastic decrease in Siamese show entries. (1983 Empire CC Show: under 10 Siamese).

The quality of Oriental-Siamese has been established by those seen at cat shows. Oriental breeders have been propositioned for the use of their Oriental-Siamese studs in order to produce "registrable" Siamese.

A good number of Oriental Shorthairs breeders have started to register their Orientals and Siamese with the recently organized registry, The International Cat Association (TICA). In TICA, all of the 16 Siamese illustrated in Chart 1. will be classified as Siamese and all are invited to compete at their shows where several Oriental-Siamese have already earned the title of Grand Champion. The TICA registry has adopted our philosophy in its entirety. That is, they use a genetic registry and are completely in

line with the overseas registries. Imports will now be registrable. We will follow, with great interest, the development of the Siamese and Oriental breeds in the TICA organization. Other registries, such as CFF, have gone part of the way by uniting the Colorpoints and the Siamese. Several other American registries have had this classification for many years. It is just a matter of time for the enlightened judges and directors to prevail in CFA.

META—MEW:

The Catty Side of Communications

The unspoken word: how often have you heard a statement that seemed perfectly straightforward, but which carried another meaning? The second meaning may have been immediately obvious to you if you were well-acquainted with the speaker's style (for instance, your Mother hinting that you were too full to take the piece of pie intended for a dinner guest). Or it may only have dawned on you later that what you heard wasn't what was meant (your Father telling Aunt Gladys that her new hat was certain to make an impression in Church on Sunday.)

The Cat Fancy has attracted its share of persons skilled in such locutions, as subtle and facile as their beasts. Economy of effort is their byword; two statements are unnecessary when one will say it all.

The rationale behind this peculiar mode of communications varies. Sometimes the motive is politeness -- tact is an essential ingredient in a situation where so many egos square off in such a small arena. Sometimes the second message is not intended for the person addressed, but is more in the nature of an aside to a third person present during the conversation. Sometimes the statement, or request, is a roundabout way of parting you from information the speaker doesn't really want you to know he's interested in getting, or about the importance of which he wishes to mislead you. And sometimes the underlying message is a sort of time bomb -- the meaning will become clear only upon a bit of reflection, allowing the speaker time to make a clean getaway before the stuff hits the proverbial fan. Human nature being what it is (Pollyannas are an endangered species these days), the basest motive is often inferred by the listener, even when it was not the intention of the speaker.

Here are examples gleaned from some of the fancier of the Fanciers. These will help you develop an ear for the loaded statement and allow you to translate correctly such messages of this type as may come your way.

This cat has unbelievable color!
Which do you use — Clairol or L'Oreal?

She has such pretty eyes!
I can't find anything else that even remotely resembles the breed standard.

He throws kittens with coats of an unmistakable texture.
The fur clumps together that way on all of 'em.

His kittens never come together before a year of age.
And if you'll buy that statement, I've got some swamp land in Florida that I might be able to sell you, too.



She should make you a good breeder.
When are you going to stop pretending this is a show cat and embarrassing us all?

It's only an allergy.
What's a little virus among friends?

Who are you going to breed her to?
When are you going to stop showing her? I'm tired of getting beaten.

Don't you have any kittens for sale younger than those?
I'd prefer one with its eyes not open yet.

This cat is well-balanced.
It's too long all over, except the coat -- that's too short, so I guess it evens out.



Your girl has good weight this week-end.

How pregnant is she?

Would I lie to you?
Only if given the chance.

She has a lovely disposition.
She'd make a good pet.

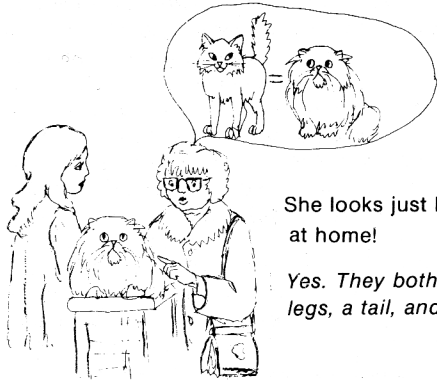
I had a really hard time making a decision.
The cats were uniformly poor.

I'd love to handle your boy, but I'd be doing him a disservice by upsetting him unnecessarily before his next judging.

The last time I got near that beast I had to do a quick inspection to make sure he hadn't removed several of my fingers and large areas of my epidermis!

I see she's in heat again.
When are you going to get her off the show circuit? I'm still tired of getting beaten!

Is she in heat again?
Or is she always that foul-tempered?



She looks just like my Fifi at home!

Yes. They both have four legs, a tail, and fur.

She looks super this week-end! You wouldn't know it was the same cat!
Is it?

He looks like he's been taking it easy lately.
He's really been pigging out at the old feed bowl again.
We've missed you on the circuit lately.
Just like we miss the good old-fashioned bubonic plague
He just needs the right judges.
Preferably deaf, blind, senile, and palsied.

Oh, marvelous! We're all entered for the same show next week-end, too!
Well, chalk off next week-end as a total loss.

She could grand in a minute if she weren't always up against her sister.
I sold the wrong cat.

By the time I get done spreading the rumor, the judges will be practically **killing** themselves trying to find **something** wrong with her!

Is he off his vitamins?
He looks awful! What have you **done** to that poor sucker?

Your cat has very expressive eyes.
Do they always cross that way?

How much did you say you paid for her?
No matter what the price, I'll imply that you were cheated.

This boy is just four months old according to my book...
The body just don't match the date, folks.
My Dear, you **must** come to our local show next month -- and here are entry forms for two more shows in our area. I'll agent for you if you can't make it.

I'll do **anything** to block So-and-so from a Regional win!
Uh-oh. I think I feel something on the tip of your boy's tail.

With a bit of work, I can put you into such a sweat that you'll stop showing him against my cat.

Perhaps the judges will continue to miss your girl's disqualifying fault, Dear -- only a person with years of experience in this breed would be able to find it...

"What do you think of So-and-so?" "She has lovely cats."

And a personality vaguely reminiscent of someone who parks her broom in the garage.

A word of warning: Not every statement someone makes has a second meaning. If you find yourself coming across more than your share of *What-did-he-mean-by-that?*-type comments in everyday conversation, kindly bear in mind that paranoia is curable.

Mme. HELENE PROSE WRITES FROM THE NETHERLANDS

Sorry I am so late to send the show dates of the Independants. . . It happens often that I hear about a show abroad just some weeks before that show. There are so many shows now that I don't manage to check all of them.

As we are now allowed to show in Scandinavia (and they not here) because of the quarantine laws there, I don't know their show dates. But they have many. Perhaps you are able to keep in touch with people there. The same for England with its quarantine, but you know of course their show dates.

A Show in Hungary. For the first time Dutch exhibitors went to a show in Budapest (Hungary). It was the second show of this young Independant club. Two of the judges were well-known English judges. Although the number of cats was small in our eyes (about 250), it was a truly International show with German, Belgian and Dutch exhibitors, and it was efficiently run.

The Dutch breeders went from S.E. Holland and made the trip by travelling by car through Germany and Austria (1½-days). Of course the cats and people had to have visas and health certificates (for the cats) as this country is behind the Iron Curtain. With German, French and English — and hands — it was not too difficult for our breeders to communicate with the Hungarians. Feline language is universal.

In the catalog that I got, I saw 3 American cats. The show attracted a lot of visitors as pedigreed cats seem to be seen very seldom there.

ORIENTAL SHORTHAIRES '82 SHOW

Oriental Shorthairs International was founded in 1974 by a group of ten people who had never seen an Oriental. In just eight years, Oriental Shorthairs have become firmly established in the cat fancy. In May, 1975 OS/ held its first cat show: a one-day shorthair specialty show, at the Bergen Mall, in Paramus, New Jersey.

Members felt that holding a show every year was essential. It would allow Orientals to be publicized, and would subsidize the club's newsletter and breed

activities. The next two years we again held a one-day shorthair show at the Bergen Mall. The 1977 show marked the debut of Orientals accepted for full championship status in The Cat Fanciers Association. That year also marked first award of the silver cat pendants, designed and cast by club member Barbara Levitan, to the top scoring Oriental adult and kitten at the show. One day specialty shows were held in Hartsdale, NY and again at the Bergen Mall in 1978 and 1979. At the latter show there were thirty five Oriental adults entered!

Since almost all of the members of the club who put on the show lived in Westchester County, NY, it was decided to find a permanent home in Westchester. We settled on the Westchester County Center in White Plains, NY, centrally located near to New York City, and spacious. We also decided to hold a one day allbreed show. The show, held on April 5, 1980, was quite successful and spectator response was overwhelming.

Because many spectators indicated they would have liked to come on Sunday also, we changed our format to a two-day, allbreed, 6-ring show, and the date to the week end before Thanksgiving. The 1981 show was again a great success, with even more entries and spectators than ever before.

In 1982, Show Manager Lynn Miller, one of the charter members of the club, coordinated an extensive publicity campaign, which paid off with over 3,000 paid admissions. Although entries started off slowly, they poured in during the two weeks before the closing date, ending up with 420 cats entered, including 53 household pets. The judges were Will Thompson, Donna Jean Thompson and Catherine Hummer for Allbreed; Muriel Slodden for Longhair/Shorthair; Frank Roderick and Margot Mellies for Shorthair/HHP, and Lionel Farminer and Joan O'Hara for Longhair/HHP. There were 41 Oriental Shorthair entered — 23 adults, 14 kittens and 4 in Premiership. The silver pendants for the highest scoring Oriental adult and kitten were awarded to *Gr Ch Perfection's Pacesetter*, Ebony Mackerel Tabby OSH male, owned and bred by Dick and Dottie Olsen of Tucson, AZ; and *Crystaljade Cinzano*, Blue OSH male, owned and bred by Dr. Randall and Deborah Murphy of Monroe, CT. Present were 218 Championship adults.

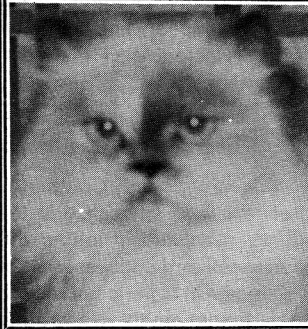

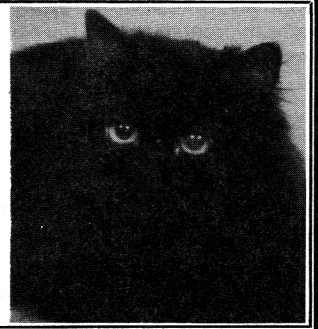

Upon entering the show hall, a spectator would encounter the club information booth, and a children's art competition for "The Cat as Art". After passing through many benching rows of cats, one would arrive at the judging rings, all decorated in black and red, the club's colors, and with an oriental theme. On each side of the show hall, flanking the benching cages, were 22 booths. Besides 4 booths selling cat related items, ranging from scratching posts and carriers to stationery (How-Lin, Haddleigh House, Dorothy Fromer and Summit) there were 3 from cat food companies, two from humane societies (Animal Welfare League and Elmsford Animal Shelter), and others selling antiques, litter, deodorizer, health insurance for pets, engraved plaques, cat related art, a photography booth (Jane Howard), and information booths from the US FDA and the Sloan-Kettering Cancer Institute (on Feline Leukemia). The club also sponsored an information booth with lectures on various topics of cat care and diseases being given by local veterinarians, breeders, researchers from the Sloan-Kettering Institute, and an animal behaviorist.

The Household Pet exhibition was a high point for local pet owners and spectators. Judging by the number of phone calls received by members of the show management the week before the show, we might have easily doubled the number of HHPs if their owners had entered in time. The four judges had many difficult decisions to make among the beautiful household pets. Win or lose, all HHP exhibitors received a small gift of earrings, belt buckles or chains. After fierce competition, the Morris Award for Highest Scoring Household Pet in Show was given to *Josette du Cimetièrè des Chats*, a brown tabby, 4-month old female kitten, owned by Betty-Ann Weiss, of Flushing, NY.

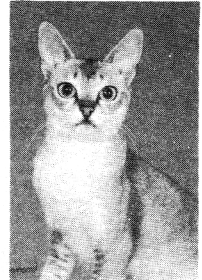
Next year's show will again be held the week-end before Thanksgiving, in the Westchester County Center, and promises to be even bigger and better.

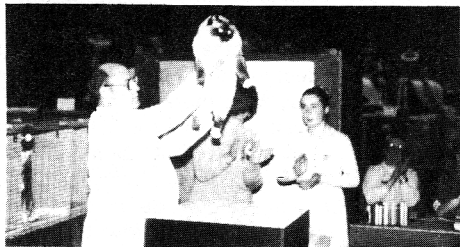

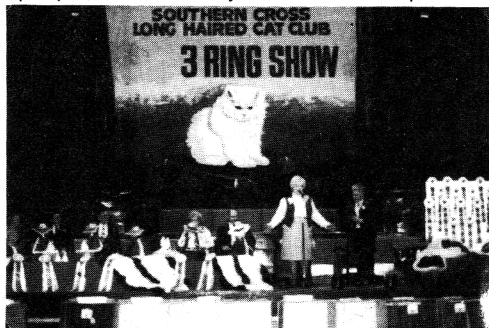

However there are unfortunately judges who ignore the fact that these two are the closest to the latest of the breed to arrive from their native land and 'put them down' because they don't fit their own version of what a Korat should look like! This malady visits all breeds in the show ring but it seems especially incongruous in the case of an imported breed!

NEW ZEALAND — 1982

INTRODUCING OUR SEVENTH GREAT YEAR OF CAT WORLD INTERNATIONAL MAGAZINE'S ANNUAL AWARDS TO THE TOP CATS OF NEW ZEALAND

The following are excerpts from the article which will appear in full at a later date in the official publication of the *NZ CAT FANCY INC.*, together with the winner's lists.

Special thanks to Mrs. Rae Rayner, who helped me compile the information for this article.

A SPECIAL VOTE OF THANKS MUST GO TO MR. HURLE RAYNER, who willingly spends such a tremendous amount of time, and quite voluntarily, recording the points won by EVERY exhibit in EVERY SHOW held under the auspices of the *NZ Cat Fancy Inc.* After the essential results are recorded for the NZCF Inc. using the official NZCF Inc. MARKED CATALOGUES, which all Clubs must forward to the Honours Officers for the Fancy's records, the CWI scoring is done independently.

SOME OF THE MAJOR EVENTS OF 1982

Some of the major events during 1982 were the National Show 1982, organised by the Southland Cat Fanciers Club, and Invercargill LH Cat Club, and held in the far south at Invercargill; the International Show, organised by the LH Cat Club of NZ and Metropolitan SH Cat Club, held in the far north, at Auckland; the N.Z. Siamese Club's show, held in Auckland in April; the Pedigree Persian Cat Fanciers show, held in Wellington in July, and the first two 3-ring shows held in the South Island — Southern Cross LH Cat Fanciers, in Dunedin, and the Shorthair Cat Breeders Association Show, in Christchurch.

NEW ZEALAND SHOW FORMAT

Although 1979 saw shows divided into the three divisions of Longhair, Shorthair, Siamese/Oriental, this was done for just the one show season, and then the NZCF reverted to the previous show divisions of just Longhair and Shorthair. Many of the larger shows, of course, still split the Shorthair divisions into 'SH (Other than Siamese)' and 'Siamese/Oriental' but the judges must then liaise for the overall winners.

The 1981 show season saw the innovation of Clubs being able to allow the exhibitors and public to remain on the premises and watch the judging taking place. Prior to this, the show floor was cleared except for the Judges, stewards and other workers, and no-one was allowed back in until the judging was completed — usually early afternoon. All Clubs now have the option of running the old 'closed' type of show, shows with spectators present, owner-presentation shows, single ring, or multi-ring (up to 3 rings), or any combination of these kinds of shows, which is very progressive, making cat showing much more interesting.

Open class winners gain a Challenge Certificate, if of sufficient merit, and need three of these certificates under three different judges to attain the title of Champion. . . often difficult in very large open classes which are open also to cats already Champions *and* cats already Grand Champions, which makes for hard competition. Judges have the right to withhold CC's should they consider the exhibit not up to standard and this is done quite often, so NZ Champions are never 'cheap'. Neuter/Spay cats may win Challenge Certificates and become Premiers under the same rules, but are never judged against entire exhibits.

Cats are benched in cages, by breed, in each Division, on white towels, and wearing neck tags which are numbered and correspond with the judges book. The judge, his/her steward and handler, go to each cat and judge it individually, or in the case of owner-presentation the owner takes the cat to the judging area and presents it to the judge at the required time.

With the high cost of travelling to shows these days, it is pleasing to note that a number of clubs are now

operating shows of more than one ring. It certainly makes the travelling expenses, etc. worthwhile when one has the opportunity to exhibit in two or three rings rather than one. With more than two-thirds of the population living in the North Island of NZ, naturally many more shows are held in the North Island than in the South Island. . . usually approx. 28 in the North against approx. 12 in the South. With both the time and the money needed to travel far in these expensive times, these multi-ring shows, giving more competition, especially in the South, are bound to prove more and more popular as time goes on.

SCORING SYSTEM

To recap for newcomers not yet familiar with the CWI Awards scheme — It is completely FREE to clubs and exhibitors and gives worthwhile recognition to those exhibits who have beaten the MOST others during the show season, and presents them in *CAT WORLD™ INT—ERNATIONAL MAGAZINE* to be seen worldwide and later in the official publication of the *NZ CAT FANCY, Inc.* This generous programme offered by CWI was first accepted by the NZCF Inc. for the 1976 show season. Prior to this, a NZ cat's ultimate glory was to attain that elusive triumph of Grand Champion/Premier status, but NOW we have this added incentive, and one that is looked forward to tremendously by exhibitors - featuring in NZCWI's Top Cats-Kits-N/S Cats of NZ ANNUALLY.

These awards are for NZ's BEST CATS, NOT THE MOST EXHIBITED cats, therefore the Awards are made on the basis of the highest average points. By averaging points, the cats are protected from being over-shown and the exhibitor who cannot afford the time or money to travel to a lot of shows is not penalised. There is also a minimum division number of three to exclude the possibility of a cat winning one major award only and then being retired, resulting in a large number of points, which would be a misleading overall result.

As in previous years, some Breeds/Colours *do not feature* in the 1982 Winners lists, although exhibited often during the season and possibly having numerous Best of Breed/Colour wins, as they unfortunately never beat another exhibit at any time at any show. Exhibits receive points for their highest placing only, i.e. exhibits placed in the Top 10 at shows automatically drop the points accumulated at lower levels.

Cats not featuring in the Top 10's receive points for their Group wins, and cats not in Groups receive points for Breed/Colour wins — all by the same method of *one point for each cat present and competing* that they have beaten. The MERIT in THIS system is its fairness and simplicity, although naturally anomalies may occur as with any scoring system as the 'perfect' system has yet to be devised! This scoring method allows winners at *big shows* to accrue *more points* than winners at *small*

shows, e.g. a 10th BIS at a large show will often be worth many more points than the BIS itself at a smaller show, which is the fairest way as, obviously, the exhibit that beats the most other exhibits *is entitled* to the most points. Occasionally exhibitors query the fact — and they are perfectly free to do so — that "their" exhibit did not come up in the NZCWI Awards yet had many BIS wins. When checked it is noted that *all* these exhibits had their wins in *very* small shows so although they had perhaps six BIS wins, they had only beaten a very small number of cats overall. On average, North Island shows are much larger than those in the South Island, therefore the S.I. cats featuring in these annual awards have scored exceptionally highly to hold their placings.

Remember *these awards are for NZ's Best Cats, not the most exhibited cats*, therefore points are cumulated, then averaged.

GRAND CHAMPIONS

Grand Champion status (Grand Premier for NZ N/S Cats) is very difficult to attain. Only a very few cats achieve this great honour annually, therefore a NZ Grand Champion or Grand Premier is highly prized indeed!

NZ does not have a points system and during 1982 four Grand Classes were available in each division at each show, i.e. 1 male, 1 female, 1 neuter, 1 spay for the LH Division and the same again for the SH Division (including Siamese). Champions compete against all other Champions in their own Division for the one Grand Challenge. Grand Champions may be entered too. No rule precludes this.

Up to and including the 1980 show season a minimum of 4 exhibits in the class was mandatory, but since 1977 male/female classes were amalgamated if there were sufficient entries (neuter/spay classes likewise). The winner of the amalgamated class could then win the Grand Challenge. As from the 1981 show season, the Fancy resolved that *no* minimum number is necessary, and the judge may award or withhold the Grand Challenge at his/her discretion.

Three Grand Challenge Certificates must be won under three different judges at three different shows to reach the exalted Grand Champion or Grand Premier status!

During 1979 the Siamese/Oriental were a separate Division with an extra Grand to be won. Although many thought a great influx of Grands possible, there were only two more than for the previous year. With the re-amalgamation of the SH and Siamese/Oriental sections into one Division for 1980 again there were just two less Grands than the year before! With the lifting of the restriction of the number of entries in a Grand Class in 1981, again there was concern that there would be a great influx of Grands. Again, not so, there being a total of 19 Grand

Champions and 19 Grand Premiers for 1981, very similar figures to the 15 GR CH and 13 GR PR of 1980.

There was an increase to 25 new GR CH during 1982, inexplicably all in the SH (OTS) breeds. Perhaps the advent of 2- and 3-ring shows during 1982 allowed for more cats to make Grand. New GR PR in 1982 totalled 15.

SEVENTH GREAT YEAR

This seventh great year has proved even more popular, with record response and participation from the owners and breeders of these top winners. In fact, there are very few winner's owners who did not at least send their forms back, indicating their wish to receive their commemorative item. This year, the Top 5 in each section will have a completely innovative emblem. The latest word from Arizona is — delivery delayed, now promised for May, which means I should have them to send out in late May or early June.

Each successive year we see sons and daughters of the Famous appearing in these winners lists, so not only are these annual award winners superb cats themselves, but they are producing quality in successive generations which speaks well for the future of pedigree cats in NZ.

No-one has to subscribe to the magazine to have their cat's name published or to receive their awards, however, it is gratifying to note that almost all of the annual winners have again participated by forwarding their winner/s photo/s for publication in this international magazine, edited by breeder/exhibitors for breeder/exhibitors the world over.

THOUGHTS OF AN NZ BREEDER ON SENDING A KITTEN TO THE U.S.

It was so lovely to read about *GR CH Ayudhya Red Menelik of Nubian* (CWI, Jan/Feb.'83 "Ultimate Cat") I thought your readers might like to know the thoughts of a New Zealand breeder on being asked for a kitten to go to the States.

She looked at him and said: "...his type, colouring and ticking are far superior to what is being shown. His head is a little longer" (the English Aby head) "and he has a necklace which some won't like, but I would send him - he'll do well."

So I sent him. I knew his "purr-sonality" would win friends anywhere. Because of all the unknown problems

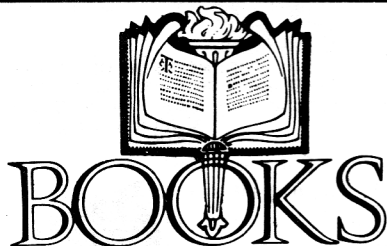
which might await him we set only a nominal sum for his purchase, fulfilled all the official requirements and sent him off. How relieved we were when Meg phoned and told me that he had arrived, fit and purring happily.

As Edna had foretold, he had some judges who would never like his radical differences, but there were many others who could see how he could improve the US red Aby. Letter after letter arrived telling me of his exploits and, in every one, the love that Meg had for this little ambassador shone through. I knew he had a perfect home with love and feline companions, too. When the phone call came telling me of his successes nationally I was on cloud nine, bursting with happiness for Meg and *Menelik*.

When I read Meg's article about *Menelik* I was so moved — in this day of outrageous advertising and extravagant claims, what moved me most was the love and honesty of her words. "*Menelik* was not the perfect Aby," she wrote. I hope not, for then we would have nothing more to strive for.

Rest well, little *Menelik*, in that Feline Happy Hunting Ground, for you have fulfilled your destiny. You have shown other breeders what reds can become, and opened the door for another red Aby to take the next step to perfection.

work in a barn and a hut on the Devon farm of Maurice and Edith Tibbles, the renowned photographer and filmmaker. For one year, Peter Apps, a zoologist, lived like a cat with *Tom, Smudge, Pickle, Domino*, and, later, *Lucky*, the kitten — observing their movements while Tibbles filmed them. When out of "sight range" the cats' whereabouts were relayed back to Peter by a small radio transmitter fitted to a collar.

The Devon study was of short duration, the number of cats involved was very small and, predictably, the results were tantalizingly inconclusive. In the course of the study, we witness most of the events that are important in the life of the cat: mating, birth of kittens, the education of the kittens as they learn to fend for themselves, hunting, feeding, sleeping, sickness, injury, and death.

The film proved highly popular — in this book, as the story is told again, there is expanded material that could not be included in the film. The cats, selected by the RSPCA, had been born on a farm in Oxfordshire and were no longer wanted. The RSPCA had been asked to destroy them, and it was the cat's involvement in this study that ensured their survival, in all but one case, as far as is known, to the present day. This is truly a fascinating account of the day to day living of Tom, Smudge, Pickle, Domino and a very special kitten.

greatest "Cattery Begat-ery" ever written about any breed; Patricia Nell Warren's *Keepers of the Ages - Cats in American Indian Sacred Art*; and *Early Longhairs: Facts and Speculation*, by Mildred Federico and Barbara Haukenberry. Perhaps we have gone the full circle and the erstwhile Chinese Sumxu is indeed the Scottish Fold LH, as bred by Mrs. S MacKay, Birkdale, Auckland, NZ, shown on p.40 CWI this issue! Alice Su's roundup of the many appearances of the Sphinx is attractively illustrated. This reviewer recalls those bred by Mr. and Mrs. Murray of Bellflower, California, in the late 1960's and how they seemed even more defenseless than the little coated ones. Edna Field's *Grooming, Feeding and General Care of the Abyssinian* adds greatly to the value of this Yearbook to anybody anywhere who is interested in this popular breed - and those persons are advised to purchase this Yearbook right now, before it sells out, as anything they will ever wish to know about Abyssinians is presented. The many, many breeders who contributed are to be congratulated. Also to be congratulated are the Havana breeders who aided Norma Placchi and Annette Bittaker in presenting the light and sweet *The Havana Brown—The Felicitous Feline. Breed Acceptance: Summary from Show Rules & Standards*, by Phyllis Friend gives helpful answers to many oft-repeated questions. Many important personages have contributed to making this a mine of knowledge about the fancy of today as well as 25 years ago. Fanciers are informed of CFA's 1982 Business, some of the most exciting shows, and advances in the Veterinary field, and much more. (Loved seeing "our" Deborah Colker DVM!)

The Foundation will be governed by a Board of Trustees who will be invited from distinguished members of the cat fancy, the veterinary world and suppliers to the cat owning public.

The primary aim of the Foundation will be educational. Funds raised will be used to collect, publish and distribute information, both lay and learned, to the interested public. There are many research papers of general interest that, due to lack of funds, have very limited readership. Symposiums and forums and seminars are held but because of lack of money their vital educational messages never go beyond the premises in which they take place. There are matters of legislation and general information that need far wider circulation than is now possible — and last, but most vital, there are books and pamphlets that need to be distributed to our young people, at home and in the schools.

There are many excellent feline organizations now raising money for feline research and it is not intended that the Foundation would encroach upon their efforts but rather report on the activities of these organizations and attempt to give them a wider recognition than they now enjoy.

ROBERT H WINN FOUNDATION REPORT

(Edited from report drafted by Joan Wasthuber, President)

On Friday, February 18, 1983, the Board of Directors of the Robert H Winn Foundation met for an extended meeting and annual review of requests for grants for cat health studies. The treasurer's report indicated cash on hand of \$75,812.71 including \$50,000 invested in certificates of deposit. The Board was of the opinion that \$15,000 could be awarded toward research grants. This year we had received **41** requests from **16** different institutions.

After several hours of review and study the Board determined **3** projects to fund in 1983.

*The first research will be done at the **University of Georgia, Athens, GA.***

The study of an antagonist for the widely used anesthesia *Thiopental (Pentothal)* is considered by the Winn Foundation to be of special importance to veterinarians and cat owners who have suffered the shock of unforeseen and inexplicable death of cats due to anesthesia. Some progress has been made in the development of antagonists for certain depressant drugs, but work is in the experimental stage — none of the experiments have dealt with Pentothal and its relative, Surital, both widely used in feline surgery.

*The second research will take place at the **University of California, Davis CA***

This study is for the development of a new test which would be capable of differentiating between infections of FIP virus and other strains of coronavirus. The indirect fluorescent antibody test and *Elisa* test now used to measure antibodies to feline coronaviruses are not able to determine infection with FIP virus. The objective is to develop tests which #1 *identify cats which have been exposed to FIP* and #2 *by detecting FIP virus in the blood, be able to detect cats actually ill with FIP.*

*The third research study will take place at **Tufts University, Angell Memorial, Boston, MA.***

This study involves the application of monoclonal antibodies as a practical and economical therapy of cats infected with FeLV should this treatment prove effective. We are interested in this study as it presents a whole new principal of therapy which can be applied to the treatment of viruses in general.

Grants for the above projects will be awarded in mid-March. The names of all of the investigators, etc. will be announced in the *CFA SPRING QUARTERLY* (write CFA Central Office re how to get your copy, Ed.)

The Fifth Annual Winn Foundation Feline Symposium and Dinner will be held on Thursday evening, **June 23, 1983**, at the Sheraton-Atlanta Hotel, in Atlanta, GA in conjunction with the CFA Annual Convention. It will be of interest to all cat breeders and is open to the public. Speakers will be:

Carl A Osborne, DVM, PhD, University of Minnesota. His topic is *Feline Urologic Syndrome: Concepts, Questions and Controversies.*

Audrey A Hayes, DVM, Dip.ACVM, Animal Medical Center, New York City. Topic: *Preventive Medicine for the Cattery.*

The cost is \$20. per person for dinner and symposium, which starts with no-host cocktails at 6.00 p.m. For reservations and more information, contact:
