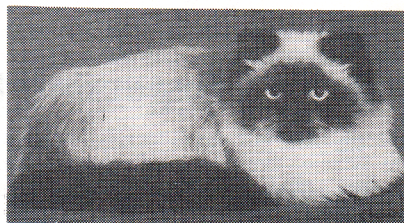

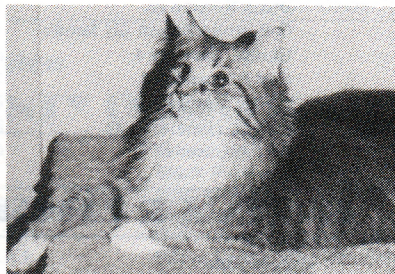

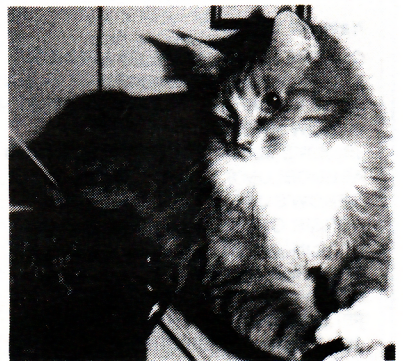

Our first year in the Cat Fancy was spent largely behind a steering wheel. We drove to over twenty shows, from Jacksonville, Florida to Phoenix, Arizona to Janesville, Wisconsin and back on home to Texas. The "Korat" (our metallic blue Volvo with **KORAT** personalized license plates) carried us over 85,000 miles. One look at the parking lot told other arriving exhibitors that the "Pickle Twins" had arrived. That title, bestowed by Alta Summerville, and *Brown Bear's* mother, Toni Woolard, referred to a seemingly endless supply of homemade dill pickles and peppers, sandwiches, Wisconsin cheese and sausage which flowed from our battered and widely traveled cooler. Whenever possible we tried to arrange benching requests so that a whole aisle became a rather complete and varied buffet — "Ah, folks... who brought the salad?"

We found that show preparations began for the following weekend's show as soon as we arrived home. Show curtains and clothes had to be washed in A33, and a turkey was pulled from the freezer to thaw. It was roasted on Wednesday (can Cat People survive without a microwave oven?), assembled into sandwiches on Thursday, and thrown into the cooler for our quick departure on Friday evening. Two sets of clothing and personal items were assembled — one for home and a complete additional set perpetually packed for the weekend. For nearly a year people saw us in the same Saturday clothing and the same Sunday clothing. If anyone momentarily forgot the day, a quick glance at us quickly straightened them out. That was Season '82 fashion.

All this is certainly a very large part of our first year in the Cat Fancy. The hours are long and tiring — it's *work!* But the most important elements are Korats, people and cats. They all mix together as cats and exhibitors compete, yet exhibitors become friends and a special few become really close and dear. We feel privileged and lucky to know these special people we have met nationwide. This does not mean we like our \$200. a month phone bill!

We smile now, thinking how ignorant and naive we were. And we think warmly of those "old pros" who, for no reason of self-gain, gave us some of their time and advice and concern. There was the exhibitor who told us that some people hoped we would quickly grand Tuffy and pull him, before he massacred a judge or ten. Puzzled and troubled, we just could not imagine Tuffy blowing; no one had come right out and told us whole male Korats simply cannot be shown! And we asked this veteran exhibitor/breeder what she would do, show or pull Tuffy. She thought a while and thoughtfully replied: "You'll feel terrible when he blows, but you pay money to have your cat judged and judges are paid to handle your cat." She, too, knew that Tuffy wasn't going to blow. Now we smile at the thought of that prejudice. With time and repeated showing, people learned that it was unfounded

prejudice, and that Tuffy was a tuffly in name only. More and more he learned what a show cat must do, and how to "strut his stuff". He learned by watching us as we watched him in the ring, and playing for our approval. He'd mouth off a bit (Korats have particularly strong senses of smell and hearing, and react vocally), but soon the judges knew his number. However, there were some electric moments: once when a judge, not known for his love for Korats, removed Tuffy from his ring cage and casually tossed him onto the table. Tuffy stood there, each muscle glistening under his silvery, shimmering, "painted on" coat. Eyes large and blazing green, he posed and strutted. Eat your heart out, Mr. Schwankenneker! The admiration and appreciation grew in the judge's eyes and, possibly a first for that judge, Tuffy finished!

Tuffy is a grumbler. He doesn't like shows, the noise and crowds, and he doesn't like being caged and he says so! He also knows that cats, like humans, must earn their kidney and that showing was his lot. In another respect, however, Tuffy very much enjoyed the show trail and looked forward to the weekends when he would have us all to himself. Tuffy is a lover and desperately needs "his people". Hours upon hours were spent in the car, going to and from the shows, Tuffy curled up upon our laps. A true politician, he slept a while in one lap then meandered to the other. Feathers and straws were massacred by the dozen as we played and he had us *all to himself*. So, Tuffy also loved shows.

The Cat Fancy has been wondrous: beautiful cats to meet and hold and behold. To hold such sculptured beauty and feel such affection is unsurpassable. The people we have continued to see and get to know better and better are, too, a highlight of the Fancy. The love of travel, the love of just going down the Interstate into the night, that, too, is a wonderful, tranquilizing aspect of the Fancy. We may even publish a book about it — "A Motorist's Guide to Cat Shows". For example: if going north to Kansas City on Highway 17, exit off I44 at #7, not #1. It is 7 miles shorter and the gas is cheaper. And here's a scoop for all of us over-eaters. When approaching St. Louis from the south on I55, sleep at the rest stop 120 miles outside St. Louis until 6 a.m. Then drive to the Nickerson Farms restaurant 60 miles down the road and order the *CB Special* — 4 eggs, 4 pancakes, 4 pieces of toast, 4 strips of bacon, and all the coffee you can drink. Arrive at St. Louis with plenty of time to set up, or is that fall over?

A very important part of our education in the Fancy has been the care and feeding of the Korat. Caring for and grooming our Korats reconfirms our dedication to the breed. We are so very lazy and they are so very easily cared for! Preparation for a show consists of a quick bath

the night before. . . no special or exotic shampoos, rinses, driers or prayers are needed. Let the cat dry, pet it a lot, and you will have a sleek, shimmering beast by show time. Generally, feeding is no complex matter either, since the Korat seems to be a naturally hardy animal. Tamiami, Iams and Crave brand dry cat foods are the staple of their diet. The first two have sufficient fat to assure a naturally glossy coat. Only one dietary supplement is faithfully used — Vital Nutrition. We swear by it. We also feed a vitamin fortified raw meat processed by Western Plateau, which comes in sealed plastic bags in a size handy for feeding and is *all* USDA inspected meat. . . not scraps or rejects.

We have come upon certain techniques for saving breech born kittens which have really worked for us. We searched for techniques after losing four out of five kittens in our first litter. The "Midwife Kit" consists of a 6-cc. syringe filled with KY lubricant to which a tom cat catheter has been attached. When the kitten is stuck just behind the head and front legs, the catheter is gently inserted between the kitten and Mom and KY is injected at four or five places around the kitten. The KY should be diluted a little bit if it is too thick to pass through the catheter. This makes the tugging a lot easier on Mom and the kitten and can save precious moments. The other half of the Kit is a 1 cc. syringe and needle used to put 2 - 4 drops of "Dopram" under the kitten's tongue after fluids have been shaken from its lungs. Dopram is a very powerful respiratory stimulant which rapidly gets the kitten up and breathing. Kittens with no muscle tone left at all have been saved by Dopram. It is a fairly safe drug, stimulating breathing within seconds and lasting only 10 to 15 minutes. It is not a strong heart stimulant, however. Dopram is also very handy in your emergency first aid kit.

¼ to ½ cc. injected DM often revives an adult cat from respiratory arrest before one gets to the emergency room. Of course, consult your own veterinarian about these techniques.

Now, the Cat Fancy is not the Garden of Eden — at least, if it is, it is ante-apple. The Fancy, like so many human endeavours, has a goodly streak of pettiness in it. At first, for example, we were rather stiff and formal with judges — what is proper? We didn't want people to think that. . . . We continued to think like this until we met a rather popular judge at a smaller show and he was a coexhibitor. We had a grand time talking, cutting up, and exchanging ideas. The next time we met him he was judging and we had to decide if we were to treat him as something other than human. And then we learned the obvious. Ignore the pettiness. Good, reputable judges will not final a cat based upon "friendship". Their reputations would quickly reflect that. Being friendly and accepting people at face value is not "politics", at least not in that bad sense. The latter type of politics is trying to change the rules of the game in the bottom of the ninth inning because you can't cut it.

So, after a whole year in the Fancy, listen to these "experts" — us! Sit back, enjoy, show those cats, compete with all your heart and with everything you have, try for the top, say "Hi" to anyone who will listen, and forget about the rest. And, oh yes,

THEORIES

ARE THE SAME DRUGS SAFE FOR EVERY CAT?

"Albinism is an inherited disorder of melanin metabolism in which the melanocytes of the eye (ocular), skin (cutaneous), or both (oculocutaneous) fail to produce the normal amount of melanin via a series of biochemical steps requiring oxidative enzyme." So says Kirk N Gielatt *et cie* in **Spontaneous Animal Models of Human Disease**, Vol. 1, 1979. If we accept that the Siamese factor is a form of albinism and that the albino factor is caused by the lack of tyrosine, then a recent report by Drs. David Prieur and Donnell Creel (Comp. Path. Bull. 1982; 14/3: 1-4) must give us pause for thought. The good doctors point out that toxicity test results and experimental data in several areas may be inaccurate if albino animals are used. The authors further suggest that researchers should routinely consider pigmentary status of the animal when choosing a model for experimentation and warn that data obtained by using albino animals may be

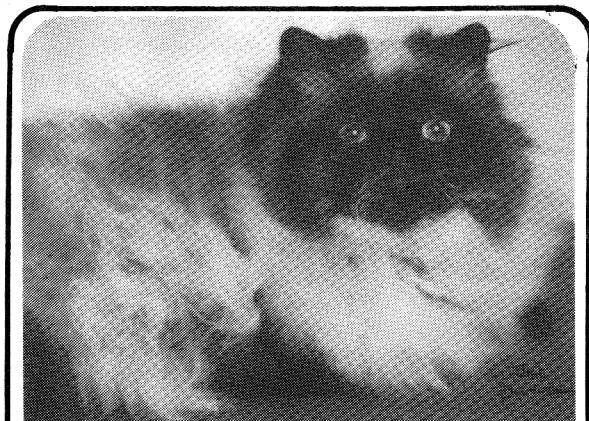
inaccurate when extrapolated to normally-pigmented animals, or basic biological phenomena.

If they are correct, then we must also assume the reverse. Where non-albino (pigmented) animals are used in drug (etc.) research, can these products be claimed effective or safe when used in albino animals (Siamese, Himalayans, etc.). Or, since the Siamese is the progenitor of many other breeds, does carrying the gene for the Siamese factor change the metabolism of these secondary breeds? Potentially the question can be a large one, since many of our breeds can be affected. Can we still accept veterinary opinions based on the theory that a cat is a cat is a cat?

Drs. Prieur and Creel note that as albino animals are deficient in tyrosinase, an enzyme necessary to synthesize melanin (pigment), the pertinent metabolic pathways are abnormal. (Siamese cats are homozygous for an allele of the albino series.) They point out that a number of drugs and chemicals, including nicotine, streptomycin and dopamine bind to the melanin pigment. When such substances are tested for toxicity in a melanin-free (albino) animal, the drugs' distribution pattern would be altered and might not cause the deleterious effects that would be found in pigmented animals. As well, they say, the metabolism of many drugs differs between albino and pigmented animals. The report also notes the well-known differences of visual and auditory defects and behavioral differences resulting from the former, in albino animals. Such behavioral differences are sometimes critical in drug research and usage.

THE MALE TORTOISESHELL — ABNORMAL?

Klinefelter's syndrome was first described in 1942. (K. Benirschke in **Spontaneous Animal Models of Human Disease**, Vol.1, 1979). The syndrome consists of over enlarged breasts (in men), small testes without spermatogenesis, increased follicle stimulating hormone secretion, and normal or decreased excretion of urinary ketosteroid. (I will let you find that in the dictionary yourself!) This disorder is recognized as being due to the presence of an additional X chromosome (plus, presumably, other anomalies.) We have heard Klinefelter's syndrome described in the male calico cat. A cat can only express black and orange simultaneously when it possesses two X chromosomes and, therefore a male tortoiseshell cat is automatically chromosomally abnormal. The syndrome has also been described in tortoiseshell Burmese in Australia and, in this case, it was suggested that it could be hereditary since the two male tortoiseshell Burmese described in the study had in common an English import, *Kupro Cream Kirsch*, (the first cream Burmese imported into Australia.) The authors of this latter study do point out that *Kupro Cream Kirsch* was used extensively and is, therefore, not surprisingly in many Australian Burmese pedigrees. His

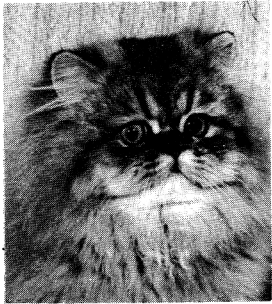

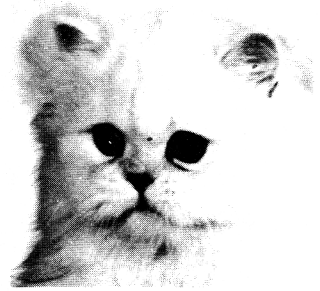

appearance in the pedigrees of the two male tortoiseshells may, therefore, be due to chance and are not necessarily an indication of inherited anomalies. Nicholas, F.W. *et cie.* 'An XXY male Burmese, *Jnl. Her.* 71: 52-54, 1980.)

As the experts look over CFA's registration data, they are inclined to tut and point a suspicious finger at the breeders. (Bad, bad people — you must be trying to cheat on your pedigrees — a male tortoiseshell, indeed!) But, we know that these cats exist. I have handled some and there is, for instance, a male tortoiseshell amongst ACFA's national winners this year. A staff member at ACFA commented that male tortie point Himalayans are commonplace. We know that CFA has to date registered at least 400 of these cats, 48 of them in the 1981/82 show season alone. They appear in any breed in which red and black can be bred: Persians, Himalayans, Manx, Cymric (longhaired Manx), Maine Coon, American Shorthair, Rex (Cornish and Devon), Turkish Angora, Javanese (or colorpointed Balinese), Colorpoint Shorthairs, Oriental Shorthairs, British Shorthairs, Japanese Bobtail (Mi-Ke tricolor), Exotic Shorthairs and Scottish Folds. CFA registered its first bluecream male in 1958 and its first tortoiseshell male in 1975. Are these cats on the increase, or are we just seeing the results of increased activity in registrations?

We know that these cats are not always infertile since Dr. Darwin Norby maintains a breeding colony of calico cats and uses calico males. The pictures he shows of the resulting births will make anybody sick. Every birth defect known is presented. However, Dorothy Nelson, who has been with CFA forever, says she cannot recall ever seeing one of such registered cats becoming parents. Undoubtedly a thorough search will turn up a small percentage.

Most anomalies reported in scientific literature are for unregistered cats and information about parentage is unavailable. In the cat fancy we have pedigrees available which will aid us in researching whether or not this syndrome is inherited. Do male bluecreams and tortoise-

shells have a common ancestor? Is it ethical to register these cats and thus make them available to the general breeding population (presuming they are fertile) and thus pass on this trait, knowing that enormous birth defects are associated with this syndrome? Should owners registering such cats be warned of the possible dangers involved? Should female relatives be culled? I believe it could be a slow time bomb just ticking away.

Klinefelter's syndrome is found in approximately 2 of every 1,000 newborn males, while 9 of every 1,000 male patients in mental institutions are so affected. In cats, it is said to be 1 in 3,000, but CFA's registration figures make this estimate suspect.

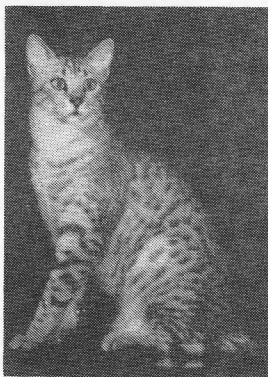

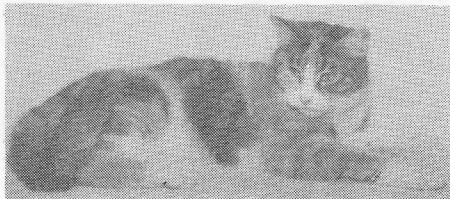

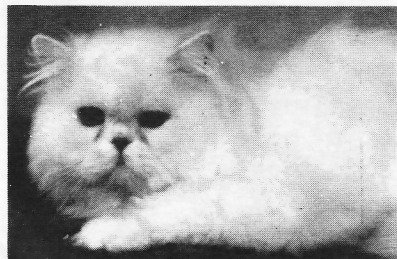

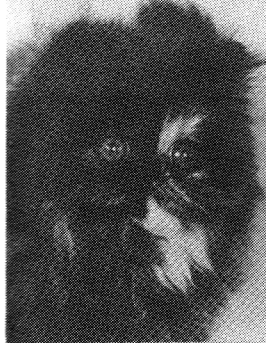


BOOKS

Even if you do not presently do embroidery, buy this book for two reasons: one is you will love the art work, fine 'feligraphy' (that's Cat Graphics), and the second reason you should have this book is that it will motivate you to start this fascinating hobby. The instructions are concise and thoroughly understandable for the neophyte, so you can while away your time at the next cat show by doing something creative and beautiful instead of indulging in the latest gossip.

Creature Comforts: The True Adventures of a City Vet by Stephen Kritsick and Patti Goldstein, pub: Howard-McCann, Inc., The Putnam Publishing Group, 200 Madison Ave., New York, NY 10016. Price: \$14.95. Everyone who loves *All Creatures Great & Small* (and that is everyone I know) will love this account of the life with cats and other animals of a young veterinarian in New

England and New York. This book will give much reading pleasure and will no doubt be an inspiration to many a young person whose heart's desire is to be a vet.

CATS: A Guide to Breeding and Showing, by Angela Sayer, pub: Arco Publishing, Inc., 215 Park Avenue South, New York NY 10003. Hardbound. Price: \$16.95. Angela Sayer is Managing Editor of a cat magazine in England. Angela is a fine photographer and has produced some nice photo cat books. This book has fewer photos and more text than her previous offerings. It might be a book for the English market; it is not a book I would buy. The US Cat Fancy is given a paragraph or two. The standards and show descriptions are British. I would expect to see this book in my local Gemco in a few months marked down to \$4.95

Cat Couples, Joan Baron, pub: Harper and Row at \$8.95 has super photography, cute small text, a book produced with one idea in mind: put it on the sale table in a discount bookstore so someone will buy it. This book does not belong on my bookshelf. You're on your own. I'll sell you my review copy for a \$5. donation to your favorite cat charity. A great argument for "Don't litter. Neuter & Spay".

Big Sur Cats, by Judith Goodman, photos by Linda Alaniz, pub: Johansen Bookworks, Ltd., PO Box 143, Big Sur, CA 93920. Paperback, \$5.95. I found this book repugnant. If you feel having cats running loose in wild boar territory and breeding them for no good reason in this day and age of feline overpopulation is a commendable basis for a cat book, you might find something likeable about this one and might even shed a tear with the author over the (predictable) loss of the cats. Poor cats — they deserved better care.

OTHER
COLORS

AND

THE ABYSSINIAN BREED

Do we like them; do they challenge the essence of the breed; will they open the door to an endless array of colors in the future; will they harm the existing colors; must they be accepted because they are part of the Abyssinian gene pool; should they be rejected as hybrids in a natural breed; do we want them? The Abyssinian Breed Council must first decide these questions in order to expect the CFA Board to act in an informed way on Abyssinian color issues.

The Current Dilemma

We are now in an awkward and probably unprecedented situation for any breed. The blue color was accepted as an AOV color by The Cat Fanciers Association, Inc. (CFA) for registration in the early '50s. No breed council was in existence, so no breeder opinion was asked. It just happened and, because only a few were registered each year, most of us were unaware of the color's existence or uninterested. Within the last 5 or 6 years, however, several breeders have become very interested in this color and the number of cats and breeders involved has recently rapidly escalated. Now, these people want Championship (and/or Provisional) advancement for blues.

In 1979, The Rules Governing Acceptance and Advancement of New Breeds and Colors were adopted by CFA. Now the time when the Breed Council addresses the question of a new color is *before* registration as AOV. CFA feels breeder approval is necessary before the color becomes spread throughout the gene pool. In the case of the blues, it is too late for this approval unless breeders now want to request CFA to reconsider the blue AOV registration or ask for Breed Council opinion before further advancement is considered for blues.

The even greater part of this problem surrounds the color without an agreed upon name — cream/fawn/lilac.

Those who are aware of the color genetics of Abyssinians know that, with the introduction of the dilution gene on the ruddy color, blue Aby will result. We have for some time accepted the "red" Aby, which is now known to be the result of the mutant light brown gene, designated b¹, and called "cinnamon" by geneticists. The gene was unique to the Aby breed until the Oriental Shorthair breeders decided to incorporate it. The action of the dilution gene on the red/cinnamon color will bring forth the new color, cream etc. Once the dilution gene is in the breed we *must* have *both blues and creams*. There is no way genetically to have one without the other.

Whether or not the dilution gene has been continuously around for a long time, or was the result of hybrid introduction, or was eliminated through selective breeding and more recently reintroduced, is really not the most important issue today. The fact that CFA currently registers one dilute color (blue), because it was presented at a time when this was automatically done and before Breed Council advice was solicited, but does not register the partner dilute color (cream), because now the Rules require Breed Council approval for new color registration, is the main problem at hand. With people working with blues, thereby spreading the dilution gene throughout the genepool, the automatic creams will increase in number whenever the dilution is mixed with red Abys. Out of fairness to the breed, as well as to the people interested in the dilute colors, CFA must decide what to do, without delay.

Some would say it is no problem or even a Breed Council concern, just an administrative matter. With blues already registered, the creams, which inevitably come, must also be registered. However, others feel these creams don't even look like Abyssinians. An Abyssinian, according to the first line in the CFA Standard,

must have a "distinctly ticked coat". Are we to suggest registering cats as Abyssinians which don't seem to have discernible ticking? Most of us have seen only a few creams at best. Can they in the future, through selective breeding, eventually have facial markings, tail tip and ticking that can be easily seen without the use of a microscope? With most breeds there is little justification not to accept almost any color genetically possible. Should this be the case with Abyssinians? To explore this question requires consideration of the very nature of what determines a breed.

The Relationship between Genetics and Breeding

Compare the case of a building designed by an engineer with everything structurally correct as opposed to a building created by an architect where structure is sound but the spaces are manipulated beyond program requirements and calculations to excite the senses. The science of genetics and the art of breeding are not one and the same, nor should they be. A cat is a combination of genes; a breed is a combination of qualities as determined by breeders. There must be genetic basis for these determinations, just as there is structural basis for Architecture, but much of what makes up our breeds has been arrived at for years through arbitrary aesthetic choices. We have created our breeds through selection, both preserving and eliminating genes and manipulation of polygenes. When you consider two ticked breeds, genetically both tabbies — the Singapura is to have inner leg marks and knee spotting but the belly and tail are to be clear of marks, whereas the Abyssinian is to be all clear. The breeders created these different visions, not a geneticist.

Unlike the situation with some animals bred for food producing qualities or speed, etc., our whole purpose for establishing cat breeds is to enhance the natural beauty of these animals by assuring strong distinction and character separate from all others. Personality traits are also considered important in cat breeding and further add to the differences in the various breeds and their value as companion pets. We use a knowledge of genetics as a tool to help in breed classification and to assure that cats will breed true to given expectation and plan. But it is foolish to think that the science of genetics, which continues to evolve and change as more is known about cats, will ever alone solve all of our problems or eliminate all inconsistencies in our breeds and their classifications. When we consider any new breed or any change within a breed it must be done with extreme care so the characteristics of the other breeds or the uniqueness of the existing breed is not jeopardized just for the sake of allowing a place for everything that looks pretty or interesting. Our breeds exist above all to elevate the status of the cat in the eyes of the public and to perpetuate the hobby of cat showing. If we were merely content

with strong healthy beautiful cats then mixbreeds would suffice. To maintain definite breed identity is critical to the survival of the Cat Fancy hobby.

Color and the Abyssinian

Whether or not adding any new colors to the Abyssinian Breed represents a major change or a possible threat to the uniqueness of the breed depends on one's interpretation of the essence of the breed. Most breeds are established mainly by type — body and head. Some, in addition, rely heavily on coat quality, i.e. Rex, American Wirehair, or on pattern, e.g. Siamese, Birman, Egyptian Mau. History and origin play a major part in some. Only a few breeds could be considered to have color as an integral part of their very essence — the Korat, Russian Blue, Havana Brown, Burmese, Bombay and Abyssinian. Not everyone will agree on any of these. In some parts of the world "white" and "black" Russians are accepted. Lavender/lilac Havanas have been recognized by two American Associations and many in the world would consider Malaysians to be Burmese and feel this should be a "type" breed.

It is up to CFA and the breeders, especially of the "color" breeds, to decide on whether colors that "pop up" in these breeds do or do not belong there. Just because the development of any breed enables a color to be genetically possible does not necessarily mean it *must* be acceptable. Even the *FIFe*, which is proud of now having a completely "genetically based" classification system, has some inconsistencies and omitted colors. As an example, red point and cream point Siamese are allowed but not red tabby points or cream tabby points. Perhaps the *FIFe* doesn't feel the striping shows up well enough in these colors? Or that they look too similar to red points?

Part of the color description of an Abyssinian is its ticking. Combined with a "medium" length coat, which allows strong contrast and space between bands, this ticking creates a color effect seen on no other breed, even those which include ticked cats. There is an iridescence or radiance possible in the best colored and ticked Abys, both ruddy and red, giving the sensation of a warm glowing light from within. To preserve this very special quality, many feel, is critical to the character of the breed and requires, as the standard states, a "colorful cat with a distinctly ticked coat". Ticking, coat color, and coat quality comprise 40 points in the CFA standard. Can a cream/fawn cat, no matter how elegant the color, ever achieve this radiant quality? The depth and brightness of today's show quality ruddy and red Abys has been achieved through many years of hard work selecting for the elusive rufus polygenes. Color descriptions for the dilute colors now call for the paler color tones and eliminate rufus polygenes. Words such as pale cream, oatmeal, mushroom, pinkish buff, etc. have been

suggested. Whether or not this contradiction in selection for polygenes will, several generations later, begin to damage the ruddy and red Abyss is a legitimate concern.

At one time Abyssinians had a tendency for grey tones in the coat. The standard was changed and any "coldness or grey tones" have for some time been penalized in the show ring. Can a blue color ever be considered other than cold? A few blue breeders feel it might and are working toward this. Rather than the cream or oatmeal color called for in existing descriptions they are selecting for a more apricot or peach tone, with blue ticking which has a warm patina rather than a dark steel blue tone. It certainly would be some time before evidence of this possibility could be seen.

Not all Abyssinian breeders feel that color or distinct ticking is essential to the breed. They feel the wild cat look, personality and type are enough to make the cat. At least one breeder of dilute colors has stated that even a green Aby would be instantly recognizable as an Abyssinian. Some want the allowed colors limited only to four — ruddy, red and the two dilute colors. However, a breed based mainly on type will eventually have problems with the rationale of restricting the colors allowed. In other parts of the world, silvers, chocolates and the sex-linked gene spectrum are acceptable, and many feel some of these genes may already be in American Abyssinians. Hybridization with other breeds may have taken place for these colors to occur, but that is the case with the dilute gene also, which is acknowledged by most breeders of dilute colors to have taken place after World War II, in England, and may have happened later in America as well. Silver Abyssinians were known to have existed as early as the late 1800's in England. Will some in the future feel modern hybridization is justified to "recapture" this old dominant gene? Would the breed based mainly on type create a tendency in time for accentuation of that type through extreme bone refinement in order to achieve flashiness? Now, the breed is slim and graceful but more moderate in conformation, depending as much on bright striking color and strong even ticking as it does on body and head type for its special attraction.

The blue and cream/fawn dilute colors are most definitely interesting, subtle tones. They are undoubtedly an exciting challenge for those working on them. They do, however, represent a crossroad in the future direction of the Abyssinian breed. The decision on whether they will expand or destroy the distinctiveness of the breed should not be taken lightly and is the primary question which must be carefully considered by the Breed Council and the CFA Board of Directors.

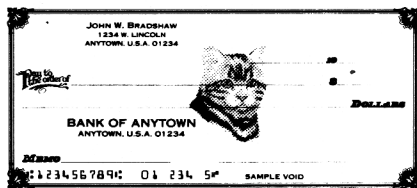

THE SUCCESSFUL TREATMENT OF A CASE OF

Feline Infectious Peritonitis

as reported by Sarah Timewell of San Francisco, CA

In July, 1982 we got our cats, Ellie Mae and Scarlett, out of a 'free' box on the street in San Francisco, where we live. They were pretty creamy pink and grey tortoiseshells, and they had earmites, worms and fleas. We cleared those up. The kittens were given all their shots, and they grew large, lively and healthy.

On January 26th of this year (1983) we took them to be spayed at the SPCA clinic (2500 16th St., San Francisco CA 94103). The next morning we brought them home; Scarlett seemed fine but Ellie Mae was listless. That evening she refused food which, for the greediest cat in the world, made it clear that she was not well. The following day, Friday 28th, she hadn't moved from her cushion all day, nor had she eaten or drunk anything. Scarlett was fully recovered. We rushed back to the SPCA with the worsening Ellie in tow.

An examination revealed a temperature of 103.5, two degrees above normal, and a swollen abdomen. The vet, Dr. Daryl Wolf, recommended keeping her in the animal hospital over the weekend, on routine supportive care. This consisted of B-complex vitamins and an antibiotic twice daily — 3/4-cc. penicillin & 3/10-cc. kanamycin, plus force feeding with baby food, and giving 100-cc. of fluids subcutaneously for the dehydration. Despite this treatment, her temperature continued to rise over the weekend and, by Monday morning, it was 105.2°. She was still having to be force fed. Dr. Wolf took a blood sample and tested for FeLV and FIP. The tests showed positive FIP.

FIP is usually present in about 70% of all cats. Nothing need ever happen to them, but sometimes a stressful event, such as surgery, can trigger it off. It occurs in two forms, 'dry' and 'wet'. In the 'dry' form there is no fluid accumulation, and the disease usually limits itself to one organ. In the 'wet' form, fluid accumulates in the abdominal and chest cavities and there is swelling. The wet form is usually fatal. The dry form can respond to intensive treatment, although much depends on the individual animals. If they recover, they will always be at risk

later. There is no 'cure' for FIP — the disease goes into remission where it need not recur if the cat is kept healthy and relatively stress free.

Ellie Mae was showing the dry form of the disease as, despite the abdominal swelling, there seemed to be no accumulation of fluid. This seemed to be slightly less awful, but I confess I didn't think there was much hope.

Once the diagnosis was made, Dr. Wolf decided to continue with the B vitamins, force feeding and fluids, and to change the antibiotic to 3/10-cc. ampicillin and 2/10-cc. gentamycin, twice daily. He also added an anti-inflammatory steroid to the regimen — 1-cc. prednisone daily. This was to slow down the reaction of the immune system as, with FIP, the antibodies it produces tend to combine with the virus, and this contributed to the inflammation, thereby making things generally worse.

On Monday evening, when at the peak of illness, Ellie somewhat surprisingly started to eat a little by herself. On Tuesday evening she vomited and was given Centrine to counteract that. Steroids were given from this point on, to help bring down the fever which remained high. By Wednesday morning this had reduced to 102.4° and she was eating just enough to make force feeding no longer necessary. Dr. Wolf continued the treatment and her temperature continued to decrease, until Friday (February 4) when it was just about normal and I was allowed to take her home. She had spent a week in the hospital. She was to have antibiotics and B vitamins twice daily for two weeks, and to eat baby food for 5 days, after that gradually assuming a normal diet. She was very cranky and somewhat listless for about a week. In general, it took her a long time to get better. It was not for another month that we felt she was fully recovered. These days, she is a healthy and affectionate cat who likes to spend her days chasing flies. She's very good at it.

I want to say how extremely supportive and helpful the SPCA and Dr. Daryl Wolf were. They allowed me to take up one of their examination rooms for 'visiting hours' during Ellie's week in the animal hospital, which I appreciated, as she is very attached to her humans, and was naturally very disoriented as a result of the illness and the strange surroundings. And we had great confidence in Dr. Wolf. It was due to his knowledge and the quality of care and attention Ellie Mae received

3 in the clinic that she was able to recover from what is often a fatal illness.

Dr. Wolf told me it's often a difficult disease to diagnose, as the antibody level needn't mean much, as many cats have been exposed already with no ill effects. So you have to match the test with the clinical appearance of the cat to make a diagnosis. e.g. 1/1600 or more means wet form. Less than that can be open to interpretation. Apparently, outdoor cats MUST be slightly more at risk, though not much evidence shows this. Multiple cat households are, as cats, subject to stress easily.

USE OF TOXIC, POSSIBLY LETHAL, PREPARATIONS IN KITTENS.

As a cat lover and neonatal intensive care nurse, I have been concerned about the use of preparations in kittens that are contraindicated in our newborns due to toxic, and possibly lethal, effects. One such item is *benzyl alcohol*.

In May, 1982 the Food & Drug Administration issued a warning related to the use of "bacteriostatic" sodium chloride and "bacteriostatic" water used for flushing intravenous catheters and diluting powdered medication for intra-muscular and intravenous administration. These bacteriostatic preparations were preserved for lengthened shelf life, and multiple use, by benzyl alcohol. Several neonatal deaths were reported due to benzyl alcohol toxicity. Symptoms of toxicity included renal failure, hypotension, metabolic acidosis, gasping respirations, seizures, and hemorrhages within the brain. Elevated levels of benzyl alcohol and its metabolized components were found in both blood and urine of these premature infants.

It is postulated that the immature liver of premature newborns is unable to metabolize benzyl alcohol effectively. Our neonatal center no longer uses bacteriostatic preparations. The policy is to utilize small, single dose vials of non-preserved sodium chloride and sterile water for flushing intravenous catheters. Similarly, powdered antibiotic preparations intended for multiple use are diluted with the non-preserved preparations, and kept refrigerated to retard bacterial growth for a maximum of twenty-four hours. There are two exceptions to this: one is ampicillin sodium, the potency of which becomes unstable after one hour, and the other antibiotic, tetracycline, is not used in pediatrics due to the interference of calcium formation in teeth and bones. In addition, several injectable medications from different manufacturers have been found to contain varying amounts of benzyl alcohol. These include folic acid, heparin, phenobarbital and the steroid, dexamethasone. It would seem to be prudent practice to check any preparations for this component, *benzyl alcohol*, before use, as a safeguard for our animals' health.

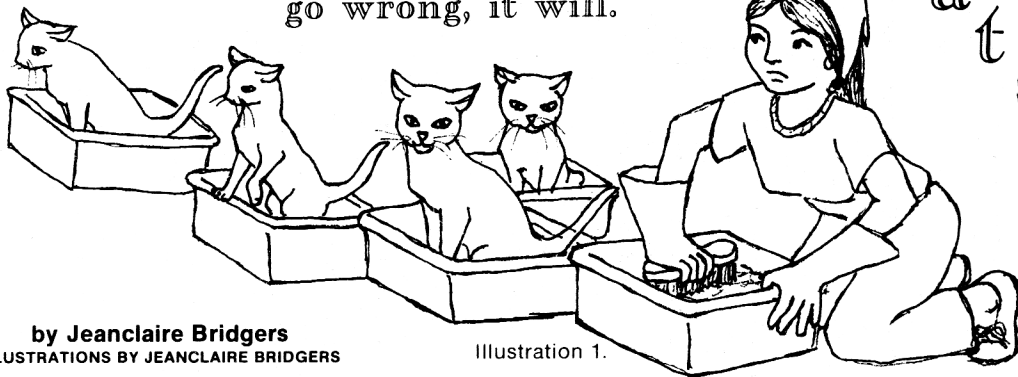

Murphy's Law, and various other descriptive laws, have long been known in business, research, and the applied sciences — anywhere that mankind is at the whim of the laws of probability and Nature.

Each time the least-desired alternative asserts itself, you see Murphy's Law in action. And Murphy's Law appears to be universal.

The ubiquity of application has forced me to posit the existence of Murphy as an entity. I envision him as a minor demon, an underling and petty bureaucrat in the large Demonic Division in charge of Planet Earth, thwarted in his dreams of promotion to higher positions with larger responsibilities. He vents his spleen by picking on those weaker than he is, but lacking in real power, he's limited pretty much to frustrating human expectations. His last major project, and the one he is most proud of, was design input in the formulation of many living creatures. I bear strong suspicions that the cat was foremost among these.

The following laws of cat dynamics will show you what I mean. . . .

IF you breed two excellent cats, one outstanding except for coat, the other perfect except for color intensity, the offspring will uniformly lack both coat and color.

THE QUALITIES you wish to incorporate back into your breeding program will always show up in the kitten of the wrong sex.

THE MAJOR FAULT of each parent will turn out to be prepotent.

IF YOU GET AN OUTSTANDING KITTEN out of a first litter of a particular cross, all subsequent repeat breedings will fail to produce anything even remotely approaching that quality.

THE UGLY DUCKLING will turn into a swan about 3 days after you have the dam spayed or the sire altered; or both.

THE PET of the litter will grow up to consistently beat the litter mate you sold as the pick.

THE CAT that chooses to be affectionate at any given moment will always be the one whose hair contrasts best with whatever color clothes you happen to be wearing. Corollary: Ticked cat hair shows up on all colors. Therefore, ticked cats are always affectionate.

THE MOST stylish fabric will be the one most susceptible to cat claws.

HERCULON upholstery fabric was designed to mimic the type of carpet used to cover scratching posts.

CAT PEE is attracted to non-*Scotchgard*-treated fabric. A CAT chooses the worst possible places to kitten, like your visiting Mother-in-Law's coat. . . or your lingerie drawer.

A CAT gives every indication of wanting to drink from the water tap until you turn it on for her.

A CAT prefers to drink from the toilet in front of visitors. . . preferably visitors who wish to use that facility.

AN OPEN ANYTHING attracts cats.

A PLATE of cat food, like a piece of jelly bread, always falls face-down.

A CAT prefers to drop coat a few days before the show where all her best judges will be.

CATS apparently love the food samples handed out at the shows, but not the 50 lbs. of it you buy and bring

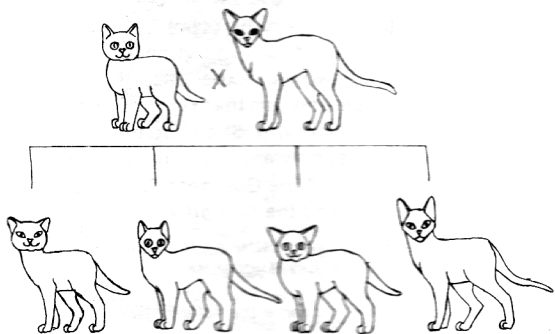
home.

A FEMALE never goes into heat until the male you would least like to breed her to is running loose with her.

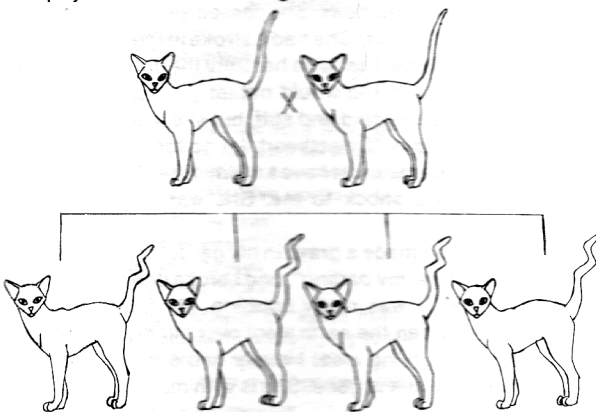
IN THE CASE of an accidental and unwitnessed mating by either of two males of widely divergent appearance, all the kittens will look exactly like the mother to complicate ascribing paternity.

A CAT prefers to throw up in the show ring. . . or on the judge's table.

A KITTEN prefers to sneeze or have gummy eyes when a prospective buyer is in the house.

THE CAT that someone at a show pleads with you to hand-carry back to your area — on the grounds that it will be exposed to noxious diseases if handled by a commercial airline — will give fungus or URI to every cat in your care.

THE TWO CATS you flew all the way across the country to avoid will both be entered in the show you are attending.

WHEN you are trying to champion a very good cat, the open class will consist of ten very good cats. When you bring a mediocre cat merely to help a show's entries, it will take six uncontested winner's ribbons.

Corollary: It can take more shows to champion a cat than to grand it.

THE ONLY "hot" shot from a batch of ostensibly killed-virus vaccine will be administered to the cat that would be most unfavorably affected, e.g. a stressed kitten or a pregnant female.

THERE is always one cat in each group which does not like whatever food you are feeding.

Corollary: You will never find a food that pleases all your cats at the same time.

THE DELIVERY MAN will insist on holding the door open while you sign for a package. The cat that gets out the door will be a) in heat, or b) imminently due to kitten.

YOUR CATS arrange their heat cycles so that they are most receptive to breeding precisely 64 days before a show you would mortgage your body and soul to attend.

THE KITTEN that a breeder raves about but seems eager to sell will probably not live up to its advance publicity.

THE EXHIBITORS of light-colored cats are assigned to the dirtiest rooms in the show motel.

A WHITE CAT attracts grease and grime. A black cat attracts lint and dandruff.

Corollary: The longer you groom a black cat, the more static he will have; the more static he has, the more bits of dust he attracts. Therefore, the longer you groom him,

the messier he gets.

CHILD-PROOF LATCHES are not cat-proof.

CHILD-PROOF GATES, ditto.

THERE is no shelf inaccessible to a determined cat.

A HOT burner attracts paws.

A FIREPLACE SCREEN

is not spray-proof.

CATS insist on being aggressively affectionate to the visitor who can't stand cats. Illustration 4

A CAT never shows off when you want him to — he waits until everyone's back is turned.

ANY FLEAS in the showhall will be attracted to those cats most likely to develop dermatitis from the bites.

THE KITTEN PROSPECTS that would provide the best homes for your babies have the least money to spend. The ones who can easily meet your price give the impression that they are not to be counted on to give proper care to a pet rock.

THERE is no showhall temperature at which all breeds of cats are comfortable.

IF, in the first ring, your girl is caged next to a male she absolutely cannot stand, the odds are 10:1 that she will be put next to him in every other ring. Illustration 5.

Corollary: That same male will attend every show your girl is in for the remainder of the season.

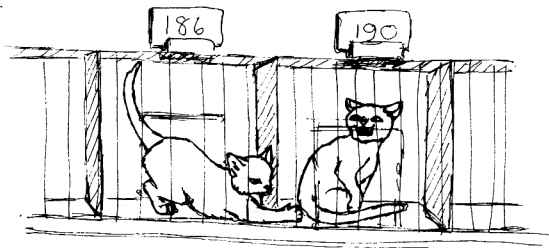

There you have it. Circumstances conspiring against you appears to be the norm. And if by chance you beat one of Murphy's Laws, you are entitled to a quiet gloat — but not too long or too openly. Murphy is watching, and he always gets even in the end.

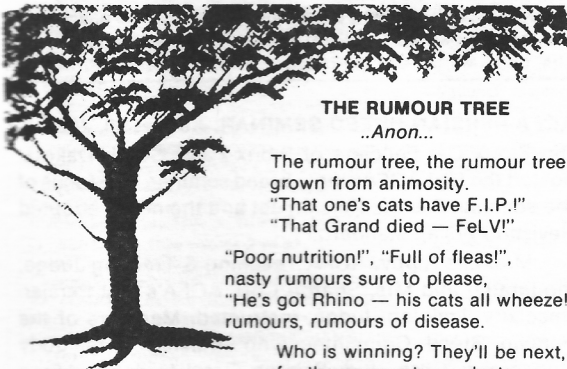

ACFA PERSIAN BREED SEMINAR, August 26, 1983

Big Sioux Cat Fanciers of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, hosted the first ACFA single breed seminar. The focus of the seminar was the Persian cat and the newly adopted Revised Persian standard.

Mrs. Lila Rippey, ACFA Teaching & Training Judge, moderated and Mrs. Sharon Carl, ACFA's first Persian Specialty Training Judge, instructed. Members of the Persian Breed Committee who assisted were: Jody Rugenstein, *Chrp.*, Judy Schaap, Carol Jordan and Fran Manco. Nearly 50 judges and breeders attended. The ACFA Revised Standard for Persians places 60 points upon the permanent features of a cat, i.e. head type, body type, boning, etc. and 40 points upon the temporary features of the cat, i.e. coat, condition, color. Mrs. Carl demonstrated the appropriate method to examine all the features of the Persian cat.

Seminar attendees critiqued a series of 80 color slides designed to focus attention on the permanent features of Persians. In the course of discussion, many terms were clarified, such as insufficient merit, qualities of a true peke-face, and bite deformity. Five felines present assisted by giving seminar participants practice in handling, critiquing and scoring. Several of the felines were former ACFA Cats-of-the-Year. All but one cat's coat had been clipped so that attendees could see and feel the basic structure of a Persian cat.

The overall reaction to the Seminar was positive and enthusiastic. Plans are now being made to clarify the colors and divisions in the standard so that an even more comprehensive Seminar can be developed.

FELINE HYPERTHYROIDISM — Morris Animal Foundation Report, May 20, 1983.

CHICAGO — Feline specialists are seeing an increasing problem with feline hyperthyroidism. One clinic reported as many as three cats per week diagnosed as having the problem, according to Dayle Marsh, feline vice president of the Morris Animal Foundation.

Though diagnosis is tricky, the symptoms have been seen mainly in older cats who develop thyrotoxicosis, or

excessive quantities of endogenous or exogenous thyroid hormone, Mrs. Marsh said.

Present treatment is with radioactive iodine, as in humans, but on a trial-and-error basis until more information on the condition has been obtained.

Too many are using the show ring as a means to sell their wares. I have been showing and breeding Persians since 1968. I got into it because of the love of it "not to 1968. I got into it because of the love of it "not to capitalize or exploit them for the money that might be involved — or the glory of having a 'Best Cat'". I find that is happening today mostly among the "new breeders" out for the kill. It does not matter who they walk on or how much they cheat and lie — they will get there over your dead body if necessary. I could write a book on this subject as I've had plenty of experience. I've been used and reused time and time again. I keep hoping there are some decent people out there that aren't out to use you for that 'step up to fame' they all seem to have in common. I won't get into it but I recently had an experience with a Himalayan-Persian breeder that really shook my foundation, which has taught me not to trust *anyone*, certainly not to lend any of them the use of my studs. It's a 'Dog eat Dog' world in the Cat Fancy or I should say 'Cat eat Cat'. How many lovely show cats have been poisoned at cat shows because they might be a threat to the competition.

I say we should reevaluate our values. The cat has been exploited -- Bred to death -- put down -- and used as a means to pull their owners up the ladder of fame. What has happened to the word 'love'? With many of them it is a business and not a hobby, which is what the Cat Fancy is all about.

Mr. Park really is right on the regional wins comment. It's so true. It would be great if we really had regional competition within the region. C.F.A. is getting so large with their national competition. I really believe some changes are in order. There is a way this could be done (which of course would change the system) but it would be much better all around. I'm glad to see someone open the door on this subject.

I wish to thank Wayne Park for his very wonderful article which I hope will shed some light on people in the Cat Fancy.

SIAMESE/ORIENTAL CONTROVERSY

This is in response to the Siamese-Oriental Article in the March/April '83 CWI. There is so much that I agree with, mainly about CFA's refusal to consider genetic principles in determining their breed classifications.

There is absolutely no reason, genetically, to have a separate "Colorpoint Shorthair" breed. More about this later.

However, I must agree at this time with the classification of Oriental Shorthairs within the Siamese-Colorpoint breed. I am an Oriental breeder, myself. I am working on the 3rd generation of developing my own Silver Oriental line. I started out with a Siamese-American Shorthair cross to bring in the Shaded Silver color. Most of the 2nd generation crosses were with other Siamese or non-silver Orientals. I have just bred my first silver-to-silver mating and expect the results in 5-6 weeks. The point of all of this is that I have had Siamese-patterned AOV kittens. However, it would be unwise to breed these into Siamese lines because they are second-generation removed from American Shorthair; although they have the Siamese coat pattern, they have other qualities of Americans, plushy coats, shorter heads and bodies, etc., plus, some of the AOV's have the silver gene; this is fine for silver Orientals, but plays havoc with Siamese-Colorpoint colors. If you accept Oriental AOV's as Siamese, you are bringing in these second and third generation cats, along with the ones that may have superb Siamese type. This is really taking a chance on serious setbacks for the Siamese-Colorpoint breed. Maybe we can combine them in 10 or 20 years when we are far removed from the introduction of American Shorthair into the Orientals. In the meantime, the Orientals are a breed in their own right. Besides, there is the breed definition that Siamese have *points*, they are not solid-colored.

As far as a separate "Colorpoint Shorthair" breed, a little research into Siamese pedigrees as they exist among CFA Siamese reveals that, perhaps, the entire CFA Siamese registry should be shifted over to Colorpoints, or to household pets. You see, a few years back, in England, the British breeders felt the need to develop a new bluepoint Siamese line. As carefully and proudly explained in the *British Book Siamese Cat Owner's Encyclopedia*, by Mary Dunnill, (Howell Book House, Inc., 1974, p.64), a Siamese queen, *Laurentide Ludo* was bred to *Silvershoen Blue Peter*, a champion Russian Blue. Out of the two hybrid cats produced, *Laurentide Ephone Ebony* and *Laurentide Ephone Jet*, were produced, by breeding to sealpoints, various "Siamese" from which, finally, some bluepoints were produced — *Laurentide Ephree Amethyst*, and a cat of a mysterious "lilac" color, *Laurentide Mercury*. According to the book, *This Is The Siamese Cat*, by Marge Naples, *Mercury* and *Ephree Amethyst* were bred and produced *Laurentide Thio*, a lilac-point who was imported to the U.S., registered as a "pure" CFA Siamese, and granded in that Association. His bloodlines were spread throughout the U.S. CFA Siamese fancy. Another descendant of *Mercury* and *Ephree Amethyst*, *Veja's Sakda of Sand N' Sea* was also

imported and granded in CFA as a "pure" Siamese. Many distinguished lines carry the name of *Gr Ch Sia-Mew's Blue Cavalier*, a grandson of *Sakda*, including *Singa*, *Ophir*, the *Felitan-Petmark Frodo* line among others. These are all lovely cats and, genetically, far removed from the Russian Blue cross. But the "Colorpoint Shorthairs" are equally removed from their original outcross that brought in the red and tabby colors. If "pure" Siamese breeders are going to regard the "Colorpoint" as a "hybrid" breed, then, to be consistent, they will have to regard all of *Thio's* and *Sakda's* descendants as "Colorpoints" too (or as "household pets" because Russian Blues are not allowed to be used in CFA Colorpoint Shorthair breeding). Should CFA purge its Siamese registry of all these cats? I would be curious as to the suggestions as to what to do about this problem?

I show in CFA exclusively because, despite my disagreements with certain breeders, CFA is the largest US association with the greatest variety of cats. And they have been good to my chosen breed, the Oriental Shorthair. I plan to work within CFA to work towards a more genetic conception of breed classifications.

VETERAN CAT FANCIER VIEWS ORIENTAL/SIAMESE CONTROVERSY

I have read Vicki Markstein's article (March/April '83) on the Siamese/Colourpoint/Oriental controversy, and subsequent correspondence, with interest and, as this is a subject that has been dear to my heart for some years, perhaps the following may be of interest.

I have always regarded the Seal Point Siamese as one of the 'great' cats of the world and would not support any move which might interfere with the breeding of the highest quality specimens. At the same time, having studied the science of genetic inheritance and watched the application of these principles in the cat world, I must support those who believe in the introduction of new colours and patterns into any breed of cat providing well documented breeding practices are used.

About 17 years ago, when active in the British Cat Fancy, I witnessed the emergence of top quality Red and Tabby (Lynx) Point Siamese to the stage where cats of both varieties were awarded 'Best Siamese in Show' in competition with very large Siamese entries. These successes were only achieved after breeding methods, based on sound genetic principles, were put into practice. This involved the back crossing of progeny from developmental programmes for four or five generations with good quality Siamese of traditional patterns. Top quality Red Point and Lynx Point studs have been an asset to the Siamese breed ever since.

Later, towards the end of the 1960's, on visits to the

U.S.A., it was noticeable that Siamese, in the shows I attended, only accounted for about 15% of entries, compared with the 50% we were used to in England. The Red, Torti and Lynx Point cats were, of course, excluded from the Siamese group in CFA. I have seen some very fine Siamese in U.S.A. but usually smaller than the Siamese I was brought up with in England and, from remarks I have heard, they seem to be less popular with your general public. Whilst I agree with the comments of Linda Smith that the major reason for the falling off in popularity is probably due to the development of new breeds, I believe it is also due to a reduction in size and a tendency (Dare I say it?) to over long and snipey heads.

Comparison of the CFA and UK standards showed that CFA had introduced the following words, which do not appear in the UK standards. . . "dainty"; "fine boned". I am glad to learn that the word "dainty" has been dropped as I regard the image of the Siamese to be elegant, yet sturdy.

When I came to live in Australia I was surprised to find that, although the majority of registering associations regarded Red, Torti and Lynx Points as Siamese, the largest council outlawed these varieties to a separate breed. Up to a point, their rules are similar to those of CFA. One has the confusing (to the uninitiated) situation of seeing two Seal Point Siamese in cages side by side and learning from the catalogue that one is described as a 'Seal Point Siamese' and the other as a 'Seal Point Colourpoint'.

Five or six years ago cat fanciers in South Australia became interested in Orientals and we devised a developmental programme, based on genetic principles, which was then submitted to the London geneticist, Roy Robinson. This was discussed in some detail in sub-committee and Executive Committee and then written up in the Association's journal before it was introduced. Before a cat could be registered as an Oriental, at least five generations of succeeding progeny had to be back crossed to Siamese of good type to ensure that the Orientals also had good Siamese type. Additional safeguards, which proved to be necessary in practice, were introduced where a white cat (Foreign White) was involved because of the white spotting danger. Siamese kittens born from Siamese and *fully registered* Orientals were allowed to be shown as Siamese and, of course, it was not long before one such kitten was made 'Best Siamese Kitten in Show'. A separate section of the register was kept for these kittens to satisfy the sceptics and, for a time, these Oriental/Siamese kittens were only allowed to be used for breeding on condition that their progress was monitored by the Association's sub-committee.

A few months ago, at a rather special show in Queensland — a 25th Silver Jubilee Anniversary Show — at which many cats of excellent quality were exhibited, a

litter consisting of 2 Foreign White Orientals and 3 Seal Point Siamese stole the show. All these kittens, 13 weeks old, had excellent type and one of the Foreign Whites was unanimously voted 'Best Exhibit in Show' (adults and kittens) by a panel of three experienced judges. The breeders in this Association, many of whom were initially strongly opposed to recognising Siamese from Oriental breeding, are now using Orientals as a means of improving type in Siamese.

TERM 'SELF SIAMESE' OFFENSIVE

I believe a major reason for the resistance to the linking of Siamese and Orientals has been the use, in some quarters of the words 'Self (or Solid Colour) *Siamese* for Orientals. To many Siamese breeders, and this includes myself, the word *Siamese* denotes a cat with a softly shaded coat contrasting with solid colour dramatically confined to the points. This is the most important, basic characteristic of the Siamese cat. The term 'Self Siamese' has offended many genuine Siamese lovers.

A MEETING OF THE MINDS ON BREED GROUPING

The controversy we are discussing really revolves around one point — namely, whether the cat fancy is prepared to be consistent and allow the development of new colours and/or patterns in any breed or whether it decides to bow to pressure groups and declare that certain varieties of certain breeds are to be declared sacrosanct in the interest of so called 'purity' This is a matter of principle which requires an over all decision if future controversy is to be avoided.

There is plenty of written material on animal breeding going back over 50 years describing the theory and practice of developmental breeding, based on genetic principles, and plenty of evidence to show that, if established methods are followed, success will be achieved.

Developmental breeding and upgrading of stock is a slow process and cannot be hurried. At the same time, most humans are conservative and resist change and therefore, if general support for change is to be gained, time and effort must be devoted to explaining the reasons for, and the benefits that will result from, changes, properly introduced.

In conclusion, the more I see of the cat world in different countries the more I am convinced of the need for cooperation with the objective of ironing out the many differences — differences which are growing wider year by year — in nomenclature and breed grouping.

I am glad we have a journal such as *CAT WORLD™ INTERNATIONAL* which provides a world wide forum for the exposure and discussion of such problems.

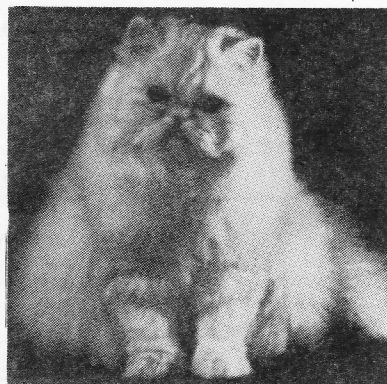
