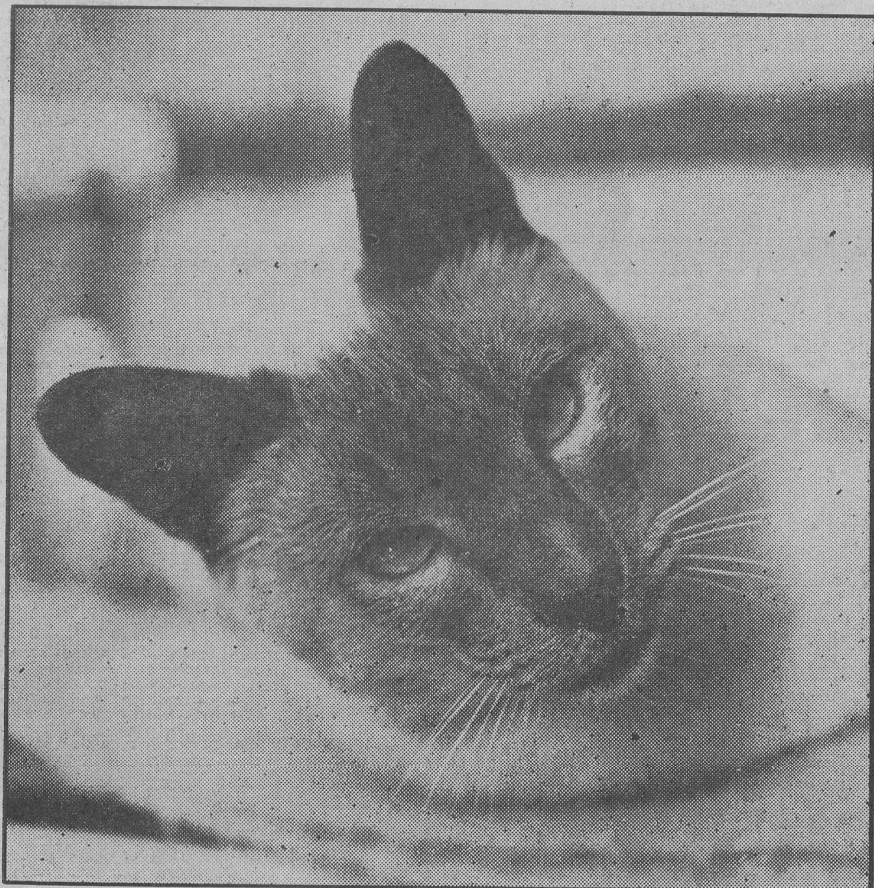

SIAMESE SEAL POINT Male cat 3 : 1 Key's Sukotai Caesar, I have handled this cat on various occasions in the past but I have never seen him look better, he well deserved being first, nice head, good eye colour, attractive profile with strong chin, long body and whip, glossy coat 2 Riddell's Devilish Cheeko, lovely eye colour but eyes rather round and head short, long slim muscular body, tail too thick, beautifully textured coat, fair profile 3 Stevens's Kaloke Sabu, rather difficult to handle, head wants length, good firm chin, lovely eye colour but too round in shape, coat open today. **BLUE POINT** Female cat 4: (abs Murray) 1 Thaw's Rose-angle Katherina, fine wedge and good profile, nice length body, tail rather short and thick, excellent legs and feet, good eye colour, fine boned 2 Richards's Whinburn Blue Mai, nicely placed ears of good size, good length body and tail, lovely eye colour but not oriental in shape. **CHOCOLATE POINT** or **LILAC POINT** Cat 2: 1 Imlach's Physalis Phandah, CP male, long body, good tail, nicely shaped wedge, very slight chin weakness, fairly good profile, point colour coming up slowly which is all to the good in a CP, lovely condition 2 Hough's Merrypaws Scheherazade, LP female, good length body, tail rather short and points a little on the blue side, lovely coat texture, eyes rather round, good profile. **SEAL POINT** Kitten 3-6 mth 4: 1 2 Key's Kaloke Asoka, male, and Kaloke Damayanti, female, two lovely kittens, litter brother and sister, the female much smaller than the male, both with beautiful ears and set, good length bodies and whips for such wee mites, the female had lovely eye colour, very fine boned and promising, the male had very fine wedge and shows promise too 3 r Reid's Fleur Sago, female, and Balbrinie Cheeky Boy, these too again from same litter and very similar, the female had better tail and better eye colour, would have preferred both to have ears set just that little bit lower, good quality coats. **NEUTER SEAL POINT SIAMESE** 11: (abs, Thomas) 1 Macfarlane's Roseangle Pakdee, lovely head with good size, ears perfectly set, excellent eye colour, good coat contrast, small kink in an otherwise good tail, an attractive cat but far from friendly 2 Primrose's Sai-U-Khan, nice length body, attractive profile, good eye colour, good head and quality coat, very friendly 3 Thaw, (no name), lovely profile, well proportioned body, excellent tail, ears rather high r Sharp, (no name), good length tail rather thick at root, fair eye colour but round, good profile. **SIAMESE AC Breeders** cat 3: 1 McKay's Oldhereach Ban-Righ, SP female, lovely type, good tail, lovely size and well set ears, long nose, good profile 2 Alexander's Alexa Blue Laddie, BP male, fairly good eye colour, jowly but bone structure proves this cat to have a lovely head, nice length body and long whip, two nice cats 3 M Scheherazade. **AC Novice** cat 10: (abs, Murray) 1 O Ban-Righ 2 R Katherina 3 Ferguson's Stanmonty Margo, SP female, a great pity this female has such a bad kink, but for this she would have been first for she has lovely type, very good head, lovely set ears, gorgeous eye colour, her coat was rather brindled r D Cheeko. **AC Breeders** kitten 5: 1 Hough's Merrypaws Billyboy, SP male, well grown kitten of attractive type, long body and tail, beautiful coat contrast and good texture, eyes rather pale in colour, good length and even wedge 2 K Asoka 3 K Damayanti. **AC Kitten** not bred by exhibitor 1: 1 Strachan's Oidhereach Twink, nice type LP female, good point colour, ears just a little high, good eye shape and nice profile, lovely coat texture. THE LONG-HAIRED WHITE-

THERE is nothing quite so eye catching as a really beautiful White Longhair. Provided it is in immaculate condition it almost sparkles. This accounts for the tremendous surge of interest in them from newcomers to the cat fancy. It is only fair to put these novices on the right path as to what will be required in breeding, showing, or even owning a White Persian.

Two varieties

There are two varieties, the Blue-eyed, the original white which is sometimes but not always deaf, and the Orange-eyed which is the more popular one, due I think to the much better type which usually goes with the orange eyes. I like the contrast between the deep orange of the eyes and the whiteness of the coat.

Let us assume you have already acquired a good White female (orange-eyed), you must look for a very good stud which is well known for producing top quality kittens. (See the many advertisements which appear weekly in FUR AND FEATHER.) He can be a Blue, a Cream or a Black.

It has been said by some breeders that only blue to white will produce the best. I believe this is not always so. Provided the male is a dominant sire of kittens with excellent type and soft flowing coats, cream or black will breed just as good. After all, the best Creams and Blacks now equal the Blues in quality having been bred to the best Blues for years.

If you have a Blue, Black, Cream, or Blue-Cream female and would like to breed Whites, look for the very best White stud available which is white to colour bred. You can mate White to

White but they must both be as near perfect as possible, and then, you may not get the desired quality kittens. In mating white to white, you must study both pedigrees most carefully before making your decision.

New breeders are often alarmed by White kittens which have black or blue markings on top of their heads. It is quite common and usually disappears by the time they are adults, often before. Blue spots mean they are blue, masked with a white coat or black if the spots are black. Kittens without markings mean that they are red or cream. A White female with blue spots could mean she is Blue-Cream as of course the cream will not show.

Improving type

The type of the Blue-eyed White can be improved by using an Orange-eyed White, or what is more useful, an Odd-eyed White (one blue eye, one orange eye). Unfortunately, it is a very uphill task breeding Blue-eyes, as by using cats with orange eyes, you will most likely lose the correct deep blue eye. However, by very careful and selective breeding, planned over a long term period the good Blue-eyed White can be bred with good type. There are some very good Blue-eyed White studs, and a few good Blue-eyed queens which have been shown during the past show season.

The standard

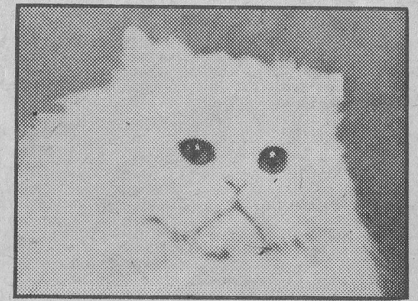
The standard of points is exactly the same for both varieties. The eye colour being deep blue or deep orange.

The purity of colour in the coat is very important, as any cream or yellow

marks or stains are detrimental to the white.

The coat should be very long and flowing on the body, with a very full frill and brush. The frill should frame the head and the brush be as wide as the body. The texture of the coat should not be coarse or woolly but very soft and silky.

The head wants to be round, very wide between small, neat and well tufted ears. A short nose, full cheeks, large round eyes and a good chin are required.

The body of the white wants to be cobby, with good bone and substance but must not look over heavy in appearance. Nice short thick legs should complete the picture.

Show preparation

If you have bred to achieve a White with most of the above mentioned points, you will really have to get down to some hard work grooming and preparing for showing, as you have a potential best in show winner. If you are rearing Whites, the queen must be kept spotless. All bedding should be kept perfectly clean and litter trays changed as soon as used. Kittens must be trained to have their tails and bottoms washed as soon as they require it; if stains are left on the coat they will go deeper in colour.

Eyes and ears should be kept clean at all times as stains will develop here too. In the older kitten or cat tails will soon go oily and a weekly wash of the tail is needed to remove this, otherwise it will go very yellow.

On some cats, feet need attention but I find cats vary as to whether they stain. The cat must be brushed regu-

larly. Its coat must never be allowed to get knotted. Brush rather than comb as too much combing may remove the under coat.

It is best to bathe a few days before a show. Groom through the coat before bathing, and brush until dry afterwards with the help of a hair dryer. All my cats accept the dryer with little protest: they were trained to accept this from kittenhood.

The coat, when dry, should be powdered with talc or baby powder every day, and on the day before the show it should be all brushed out.

At the show

It is advisable to take spare travelling blankets to shows with any cat, but essentially with Whites in case of accidents. At the show allow the cat time to use the tray then take the cat out of the pen, brush all through the coat, lifting the ruff around the head with your brush and also on the chest, brush the tail out to the width of the body, wipe around the eyes as dust and hairs may have settled, settle him in his pen and await judging.

It is advisable not to let a white cat get dirty or stained, as it takes such a long time to get rid of if left. I find that Whites on the whole do not get dirty as quickly as is imagined. The usually have a very delightful temperament and make wonderful companions. They are also very good and clean in their habits, always washing themselves. However, they do need help if they are to look immaculate and attract more newcomers to the White Persian.
