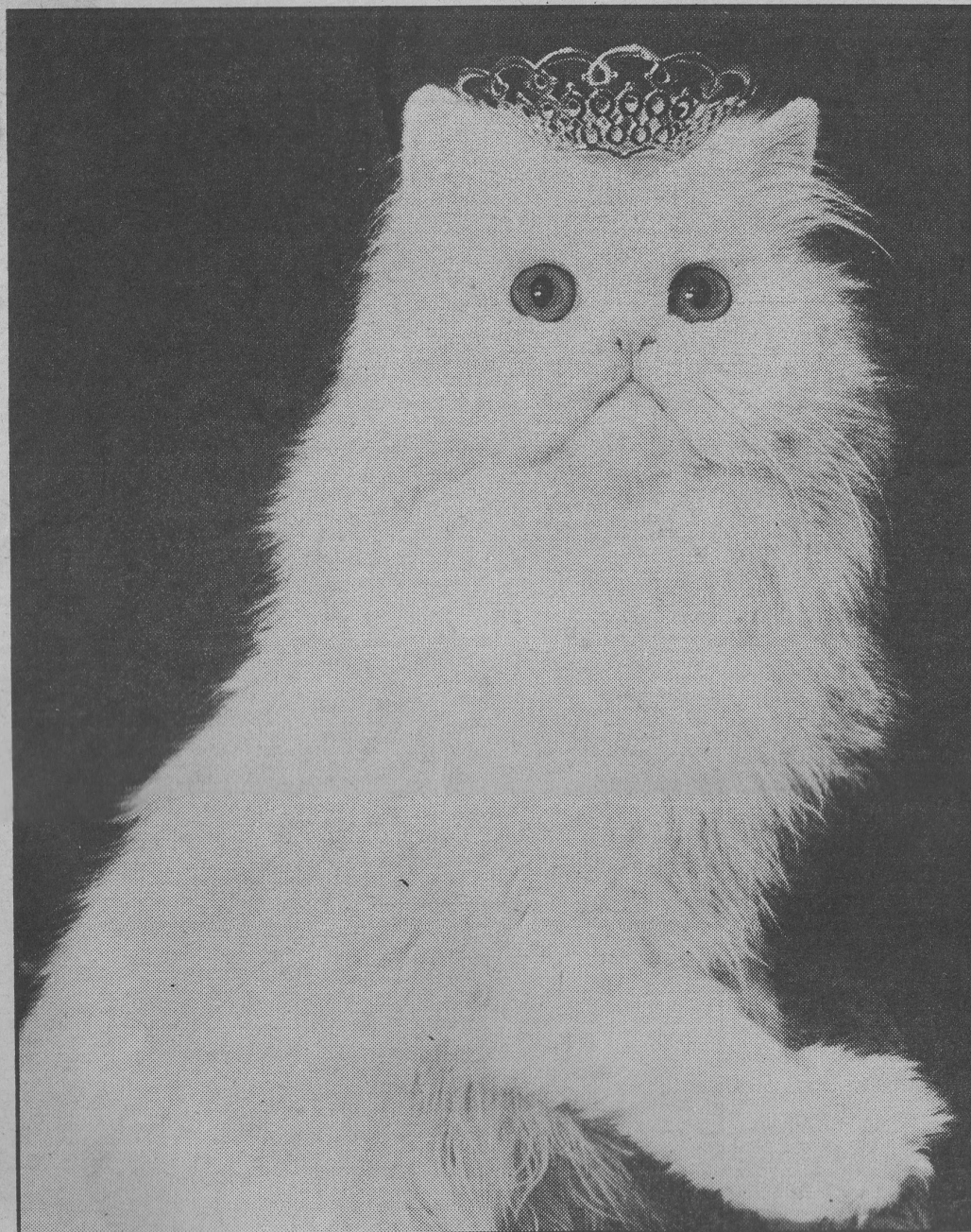

**BURMESE BROWN** Male 3-5 mth 5: 1 Scrubby's Moneypot Yucca, extremely nice kitten, good eye and coat colour 2 Blount's Willowmist Super Star, good type, nice tail except for tiny kink, eyes a little too green 3 Howard's Fosseway Demerara, good profile, head could be more rounded on top, tail too whip for Burmese, eyes green r vhc Windrow's Anandwin Puchan and Vandoori, coats very brindled today and a few white hairs on chest, both nice type but their heads are rather pointed giving them a slightly Siamese look 5-9 mth 9: 1 Laurent's Dinham George, lovely coat for colour and texture, good head and profile, good eye colour 2 Horne's Tapawingo Tsinshian, promising boy of good type, I found it difficult to decide which to place first of these two kittens, good head and profile break, superb eye colour, coat not up to standard of winner today, with his Canadian blood he may do much in helping to eliminate the Siamese type in this country 3 Mack's Belcanto La Rondine, another very nice male of good type, nice coat but a few white hairs, good eye colour r Vogt Chapman's Procul Rafael, promising kitten with good head and eye colour, tiny kink but otherwise good tail, coat a little brindled today Female 3-5 mth 6: 1 Dwyer's Honeypot Yma, a very promising kitten of good type, lovely coat texture, nice eye colour, tiny kink 2 Griffiths's Tapawingo Oneida, beautiful eye colour 3 Warren Hurlock's Linlinkye Tocrá, good type, nice head

and ear set, could have better profile break, very tiny kink, eyes rather green r Hudson's Ravus Sheba, promising youngster of nice type, a little young to say how her eye colour will develop 5-9 mth 13: 1 Smith's Maqamba Venus, outstanding kitten with lovely eye and coat colour, youngest in class and my nomination for best in show—she did not win this award, but better luck next time 2 Davis's Lochibank Tania, another promising one, hard to fault, good eye colour, not up to standard of winner 3 Every's Sealias Georgie Brown, good type, correct rounded top to head, fair eye colour, coat a little patchy today 4 Hones's Linlinkye Katyayani, quite good type, nice head and tail, good coat for colour and texture 5 Warren-Hurlock's Linlinkye Sarasvati, similar to previous one, I see they are litter sisters, tail a little short and thick, promising eye colour r Dell's Tapawingo Minominee, nice rounded top to head, lovely profile, a little short in muzzle, good eye colour, coat a bit light. Some of the Canadian bred kittens appear to take longer to darken than most of ours **AV** Novice male kitten: 1 Housego's Masambula, Cornish Rex of very high quality, lovely coat 2 H Yucca 3 Stewart's Sweet-hope Playboy, nice type British Blue, good coat texture and colour, lovely eye colour 4 Warde's Sherada Silver Alban, promising Silver Tabby, well marked r Booth's Bonaventura Gulliver, British Blue **AV SH** Kitten: 1 L Tania 2 Murray's Sireli Silver Trefoil, good Spotted, well marked 3 Taylor's Sireli Silver Trinket, another promising Spotted, litter sister of Trefoil 4 Kilby's Pya Fawziah, Blue Burmese of nice type, coat a bit on fawn side, green eyes r Patrick's Peerless Thumbelina, Silver Tabby of nice type, markings could be more distinct. **ROBINE M POCOCK**

### Mrs A E Ashford

Once again my boundless admiration goes to Mrs Pond, Mrs Philpot and Mrs Wilson for their superb management of this terrific show, and for the correctly made-out judges books.

I was especially thrilled by the gift of a Cat Lovers' Diary to each judge. This was something I had wanted but which was unobtainable at local book stalls.

My warmest thanks to Fionagh, who handled the cats so gently and who remained patient in spite of the sometimes thoughtless crowds.

This year I felt the standard of Devon Rex was higher than that of the Cornish. The Devons have improved greatly in both type and coat. The Cornish, whilst mostly having good coats, are showing a tendency to rounded heads. It would be very sad if we lost the lovely aristocratic foreign type which is correct and which was so noticeable in the very first Cornish Rex, Kallibunker. Once again I would urge Rex breeders to make sensible foreign out-crosses, as the new blood is still needed.

**DEVON REX** Ad male 5: 1 ch Fisher's Sunbronzee Danny Boy, my idea of the perfect Devon Rex, a beautiful black with perfect head, wide cheek-bones, pronounced whisker-break, very definite 'stop', wonderful wide, low-set ears, lovely coat with perfect even ripple waves, my nomination for best in show 2 De Foore's Cosmic White Knight, very fine white, beautiful coat with deep waves, good long body and legs, typical head, but stop not sufficiently pronounced 3 Clarke's Amharic Tuckerbox, nice smoke, generally good type but a little too heavy, well-set ears and good stop, head slightly too long coat, patchy in places r Thurman and Hefferman's Romid Canasta, I have always admired this cat, but today his head appeared slightly too long, very good ear-set and correct eyes, good even waves on back but sides still patchy Female 10: I found it extremely difficult to choose between the first two winners, both of which were quite lovely, my final decision 1 ch Blount's Serendipity Amaryllys, lovely fine boned black, excellent head with good 'stop' and wide cheek-bones, beautiful even waves over entire body, she seemed a little irritable—possibly she needs mating! 2 Barsfield's Berrileon Princess Pixie, beautiful fine toned white, lovely coat, in excellent condition with deep, even waves extending over entire body and tail, good

head and well-defined 'stop', but head a shade longer than winner's, I see this cat is only 9 months old on the show day, no doubt she will be unbeatable when older 3 Horan's Hassan Snowgirl, I have seen this lovely little queen looking better, today her coat, though evenly waved, seemed a little coarse, good head with well-defined 'stop' r Bond's Cosmic Tiger Flower, most attractive spotted tabby, lovely head with very wide cheek-bones and good 'stop', but ears a little small, coat patchy on sides, vhc Gautey's Singlow Mitzi, attractive little black, head slightly too narrow and ears set rather high, good, evenly-waved coat hc Blount's Serendipity Araminta, I see this is a little sister to the winner, good head with wide cheek-bones, ears bare of fur, coat patchy and she seemed a little thin, possibly she needs worming—something which I feel needs to be done regularly every four months Kitten 3-6 mths 13: a wonderful class, in less distinguished company any of the first four could be first prize winners 1 Clarke's Sahreen Lolita, a faultless tiny white, lovely thick, evenly-waved coat, perfect head with well-set ears, well-defined 'stop', wide cheek-bones, I shall follow her progress with interest 2 Muzio's Corndolly Jeanette, a spotted tabby with a really fabulous coat—thick and evenly waved, beautifully set ears and really wide cheek-bones with good whisker break 3 Worthy's Sayonara Lilac Warrior, I spent a long time deciding between Jeanette and this kitten, but finally decided that this kitten's head was slightly narrower with the eyes too oriental, wonderful evenly-waved coat of lovely pale lilac colour, should do very well r Gough's Helder Skelter, nice little white, good head with well-set ears, but could have more 'stop', evenly-waved coat vhc Finnegan's Marisarni Twink, one of the best-type Si-Rex I have seen, would have gone higher except for the fact that she had very little wave in her short coat, beautiful head with large, well-set ears and well-defined 'stop', eyes too pale a blue vhc Fisher's Hephæstos Copelius, another lovely white, excellent coat evenly waved, head a trifle too long hc Fisher's Hephæstos Arabesque, very nice little blue queen, good head with beautifully set ears, but head slightly too long, good coat, this queen would probably produce superb kittens if mated with a good blue male hc Fisher's Hephæstos Romeo, another good white with superb coat, but head too 'Cornish' c Muzio's Corncrake James, yet another good white, excellent coat, but tummy bare, this kitten had dirt ears, probably due to ear-mite, which is all too prevalent these days 6-9 mths 8: 1 Hough's Hephæstos Polaris, a really gorgeous white with beautiful coat, really thick with even waves, lovely head with good ear-set, wide cheek-bones and well-defined 'stop', excellent long body and legs 2 Rennison's Serendipity Maude, another lovely white type, generally good with correct head and lovely eyes, excellent, evenly-waved coat 3 Gough's Sable Bubbles, this is the first Havana-brown Rex I have seen, and I hope there will be many more, lovely evenly waved coat of rich brown, good ear-set, but profile a little too straight, if mated with a stud carrying the correct colours she should produce more Havanas r Gough's Helder Skelter, nice little black, but head too long, and profile too straight, coat not sufficiently waved vhc Gough's Christmas Cracker, pretty white, with beautifully waved coat that needed more preparation, profile too straight vhc Rennison's Serendipity Albert, very nice smoke, but coat too short and straight, lovely type head and beautiful ears hc Dennison's Sahreen Box Otricks, another smoke but coat again insufficiently waved, head slightly too long **AV** limit kitten male 11: 1 H Polaris 2 Doone's Monax Red Smarty, lovely red and white Manx, completely tail-less, very good head and correct stance, coat a little open 3 S Lilac Warrior r Westmorland's Sarita Gideon, very nice Blue Burmese, good top of head and ear-set, coat in beautiful condition vhc Hunt's Bonaventura Barrabas, very good British Blue, good head but ears could be smaller, excellent eyes and good coat colour hc King's Brynbbubo Tom Bombadil, another nice British Blue, good coat, excellent eye-colour c S Box Otricks **AV SH** novice exhibitors 19: an excellent class 1 S Bubbles 2 White's Loe Dun Tamara, very nice Russian blue, head of correct shape, coat good colour, but not sufficiently 'double' 3 Davis's Lochibank Tania, brown Burmese with very good head

and good coat, eye colour fair 4 Aherne's Melerin Blue Crystal, lovely blue Burmese, good top of head and well-set ears, good eye colour, coat too fawn 5 M Twink r Booth's Bonaventura Gulliver, nice little British blue, good head and eye colour, lovely even coat colour, ears could be smaller vhc White's Loe Dun Irina, another nice Russian blue, good head but eyes too yellow and coat too thin vhc Hellman's Rosental Yvonne, sweet tortie and white Manx, very slight hump at tail base, good head, coat colours bright but patches indistinct hc Ward's Coppelstone Cholita, brown Burmese lovely coat, ears set too close **KENTISH CAT SOCIETY AV SH NEUTER** 10: I must report on this excellent class as my first prize winner was my nomination for best in show—an honour which he later won 1 Hilleard's Premier Eian Lysander, beautiful black Cornish Rex which I could not fault, lovely long body lines, perfect head with straight profile, the most wonderful evenly-waved coat I have seen for a long time 2 Lyon's Berrileon Augustus, superb white Devon Rex, excellent head with large ears and well-defined 'stop', perfect evenly-waved thick coat 3 Moon's Premier Jezzeel Jokyl, a very lovely British blue, very good head with tiny ears which were well-set, good eye colour, lovely cobby body r Lewin's Cosmic Stupid Cupid, another good white Devon Rex, good head with well-defined 'stop', evenly waved coat, rather nervous vhc Colville's ch. Rosental Dishy Dolly, very nice blue-cream and white Manx, lovely head, correct stance, excellent coat hc Harrington's Buskins Chantek, Brown Burmese of very good type, good top of head, coat little open c Southernland's ch. Kitas Dandelion, lovely little tortie, though colours not sufficiently clearly patched. The class for the Colourspoint ad Rex Coated Club's Cornish Rex cat or kitten was a class of superb cats and I felt it unfair to have to judge cats against kittens. Outstanding exhibits were Hamilton's Be'haven Topaz, a cream Cornish kitten with lovely type and perfect coat; Goodwin's Quintella Lalectryon, a gorgeous black kitten; and Dixon's lovely smoke male cat, with excellent foreign-type head. **A E ASHFORD**

Mrs Pond and the four show managers must be completely exhausted after the terrific amount of work which was necessary to make the world's largest show run so smoothly all in one day. Judging in the afternoon can be a little trying at any show, but I do feel judges should be able to deal with their own classes before the public is admitted. I do not think any visitors would have been lost if the opening time had been one hour later. **SIAMESE SEAL POINT**, female (3-5 mths): This was a disappointing class and I felt I could not award a first prize 2 Lennox's Denlyn Kiki, reasonably good head, slight pinch, fair eye shape and colour, coat rather open, excellent whip tail 3 French's Frenchelle Belle Celine, good texture coat, fair tail, well set ears, slight pinch, short head, fair eye shape and colour r Howard's Hilmir Miracle Star, well set ears, eyes rather round, good coat, fair tail 5-7 mths: 1 Stroud's Fair Miss Dilly, good wedge with excellent ear placement, nice eye colour and shape, good tail, a lovely kitten to handle 2 Greville's Ra Kesh-Ta, lovely head but slight pinch, excellent eye colour and shape, very good coat and tail 3 Smith's Kaymenh Abigail, good head, eye shape and colour, nice long body and good tail, rather dark in coat for age r Farnworth's Saturn Solitaire, good wedge and well set ears, eyes round of fairly good colour, nice tail 7-9 mths: 1 McColm's Bernina Ninette, excellent head, very well set ears, good length body and excellent tail to balance, nice eye shape and colour 2 Chinery's Shushilla Kristina, good head and nice long body, well set ears, nice eye shape and colour, excellent tail, very easy to handle 3 Austin's Sakhil Alexia, good head but pinch, well set ears and good eye shape and colour, reasonably long body and tail r Denney's Kittwood Minerva, good ear placement but head a little short, good eye colour and shape, well built kitten, but too heavy—eating too well? **SEAL POINT** and **BLUE POINT** breeders male 5-9 mths: 1 Shewbridge's Tamrat Blue Diamond, excellent kitten in all respects, lovely to handle 2 Chandler's Twinhoe Aquarius, good head, eye shape and colour, smooth close lying coat, excellent tail 3 Beach's Seadog Ajax, good pale coat, good length body and tail, nice eye shape and colour r Imlach's Chalmi Cabrach, good wedge and excellent eye colour and shape, very good points colour, excellent tail AC Breeders male (ex-SP and BP) 5-9 mths: 1 Humphris's Patrician Peregrine, a lovely kitten with an excellent wedge, well set ears, lovely coat, good long body and nice tail 2 Strawford's Marshbrook Lilac Lorenzo, another good kitten with a good wedge, nice eye colour, lovely coat texture and colour, excellent tail 3 Mee's Sumora Barbaree Wong, good head and wedge, nice eye shape and colour, good length tail which matched the colour of the mask, ears and legs perfectly ex-3 Messen-

one place these different coloured Persians without giving them all top honours? 6 Rosell's Ch Bruton Snokat, big and beautiful Blue-Eyed White male with a marvellous head, short broad nose, glorious blue eyes, chin could perhaps be a bit stronger, pure unsullied coat and really short bushy tail. r Brooker's Charlotte, such an attractive Blue-Cream with glorious eyes, lovely short nose and strong muzzle and chin, soft pastel shaded coat, well mingled on head and body, a delight to handle and did very well amongst so many almost faultless exhibits **AC LH Neuter novice:** 1 De-Ath's Fernbank Figaro, well developed Blue of very good type, round head, neat ears and lovely eyes for shape and colour, profuse unshaded coat, rather on the dark side 2 Peters's Evernden Brandy, massive Cream with a nice short nose, good muzzle and chin, bold eyes of good colour, ears just a bit pricked, rather short of coat, although it was fairly even 3 Cox's Altinkaya Kandill, the only Turkish I handled today; a bit tricky as he was very loath to come out of his pen, nice short wedge head, round amber eyes and really upright ears, chalk white coat, but not quite enough auburn markings on head, full tail of good colour, but auburn rings very faint indeed r York's Durlston Blue Rocket, another big Blue with a good broad head but not such good type generally as the winner, soft full coat, fairly sound. **EDWARD BRICE-WEBB**

**Mrs I Hancox**

I am still almost breathless from the marvellous experience of seeing five wonderful colourpoints of Red and Tortie colour but shown in the AOC class because these beautiful colours are not yet recognised in the standard for Colourpoints.

Had these kittens of excellent type, colouring, and coat been competing in the open class, the open awards with one or two exceptions would have been very different. This is not only my opinion, but that of many judges who really were astounded at their beauty.

Of seven awards—five cash, one reserve and one vhc in this AOC class of twenty-one kittens, five went to these stupendous kittens.

I was kept busy trying to explain to the public why they were not competing in the open class. I have never seen such wonderful coats in any breed I have judged. All had lovely type, some quite superb, and all had lovely sound blue eyes.

That I shall be accused of favouritism I suppose goes without saying but ask any judge who handled them and they will tell you how beautiful they were.

To my hard working steward, Jeanette, my ever grateful thanks—we were both exhausted at the end of the day, with 120 cats to handle and only four repeats and a few absentees, this is not surprising, especially as this involved judging more than twenty-five different long haired varieties, all with different standard of points, and some with none!

I congratulate Mrs Amphlett's and Mr Suck-smith and Mr Barraclough, who bred these exquisite new colourpoints.

**AOC (Breed 13a)** kitten 21: 1 Amphlett's Denmaur Duncan, how rightly named, a king among colourpoints. This cat has a superb head with a lovely short broad nose, good muzzle and chin, excellent top of head and ear set. Beautiful blue eyes, the finest coat I have ever judged on any breed of cat or kitten, he was seven months old and looked like a fully grown male, his coat was completely without shade, massive in length and of wonderful texture. His points are a pale red, still needing more red shading on his legs. He may even be a Cream Point, but I think not, immaculately shown. My nomination for best in show 2 Sucksmith and Barraclough's Petite Point Patchwork, an equally beautiful Seal tortie colourpoint, her patching on face, ears, legs feet and even tail has to be seen to be believed, not quite so bold in head as the male, but still very lovely and feminine, her lovely full coat was not quite the exceptional length of Duncan's, but it was soft and very long, just a little shading on back, beautiful short nose and lovely blue eyes, perfectly shown 3 Amphlett's Denmaur Delight, another exquisite Seal tortiepoint with superb head and type, not patched in so much detail as Patchwork, but still very good. Delight has a similar coat to Duncan's, quite wonderful, they are litter brother and sister; she was also perfectly groomed and presented, has lovely blue eyes 4 Sucksmith and Barraclough's Petite Point Pathfinder, a Red Colourpoint, not quite so round in head, or short in nose, but still quite remarkable, beautiful deep red coloured ears and full red unbarred brush, colour coming in well on mask and legs, lovely sound blue eyes, good top of head and muzzle, pure coat, shaded a little on back, not quite the length of the previous three. a big kitten in excellent condition and beautifully shown 5 Skinner's Doriwood Pansy, a superb headed blue cream tortie and white,

this lovely kitten I judged to the standard of the recognised tortie and white as this is the dilute colour of that breed, beautifully patched on face, legs and flanks, some long long white hairs in her back, blue patches, immaculately presented r Sellar's Coylum Julia, the first real Cameo Tortie I have seen. She has a lovely pale pure undercoat, all the fur is tipped to form patches of red, cream and black, forming the top tortoiseshell pattern. As she moves her silvery coat shows through, good head and type, most attractive and in perfect condition vhc Amphlett's Denmaur Dream, a Red Point female, quite an achievement to have produced Red Colourpoint male and female, the first I had seen, very good head and type, lovely blue eyes, Dream has deep red points and an exquisite soft full coat. There were many other beautiful kittens in this class deserving prizes, so I went no further than vhc, this vhc kitten in usual circumstances would have been a first prize winner herself. Cat 12: This also was a lovely class and very difficult to judge r Faris's Trymccote Andorra, an exquisite type shaded silver female. This cat was evenly and perfectly shaded, not a trace of tabby markings, very little darker than a Chinchilla, just a lovely silvery top coat with palest silver undercoat. Her ears and top of head are perfect, her short nose, chin and muzzle, all beautifully balanced, lovely orange eyes. My best cat of the day and my nomination for best in show, which she didn't win, because I expect the panel thought she was a chinchilla and would fault her for her orange eyes 2 Britton's Barrose Honey Bear, from a Cameo breeding programme. Her pale cream coat is delicately tipped with creamy pink, giving a true Cameo effect, for perfection her undercoat could be a little paler, very good head and type, short nose, well balanced muzzle and chin, well shaped orange eyes, one a little wet 3 Gow's Gowlaren Tinkerbelle, another very lovely shaded silver of beautiful head and type, coat shaded in such a way to suggest that this cat may be part of a Cameo programme, lovely coat and condition 4 Gow's Gowlaren Calister, litter sister to Tinkerbelle, and again, quite beautiful. This kitten looks like a pale Silver Smoke, perfectly shaded on mask, back and legs, with silver tipped flanks r Theed's Tomrose Dearime, another lovely headed cat, so very pretty and again I think Cameo programme bred. Her colour is a warm rich sable, almost red in places, but she is tipped all over with slightly darker tipping, immaculately shown vhc Woodfield's Pathfinders Blue Bouquet Blue Cream Tortie and White, judged to the Tortie and White standard, beautiful head and type, very attractively patched with blue, cream and white. She had a lovely full brush which had a slight bend at tip, this I think must be an injury as I judged this cat when she was a kitten, her tail was quite straight then **TURKISH** Cat male: 1 Lushington's Van Yildirim, good head and type, correctly set white ears, good auburn markings on face, well set amber eyes, good coat, it looked rather cream in colour but this could have been the overhead lighting which made colour assessment very difficult, tail thin, auburn in colour, but the almost red shade extended quite a long way from the base of his tail across the bottom of his back, needed a little more show preparation on his stomach Female 3: 1 Lushington's Van Alanya, this lovely female was very difficult to handle and bit both my steward and me. I would advise Miss Lushington not to show her again as she obviously was very upset by the noise and the crowds, which even at that early time of the morning were pressing around the pens. Alanya has a very good head and is excellent type, good auburn markings, well set ears, she has a well ringed tail of correct shade of auburn, well set eyes, amber in colour, correct texture coat of good length, one very small auburn patch on her back but this was not sufficient to detract from her overall quality 2 Russell's Gelidonya Karides, a little cat I liked very much with excellent head and type lovely, pure white ears, even auburn markings on face, soft long chalk white coat, very well prepared, small auburn spot on back, full medium length tail, well ringed in two shades of auburn, lovely eyes for shape, but alas, they are almost green, which spoiled her chances of winning Kitten 3: 1 Jarman's Nazilla, very good head and well set ears, even auburn markings on face, white ears, almost shell-like, well set eyes, correct straight nose, appeared to have rubbed the end of it on the pen, soft silky pure white coat, good auburn, ringed brush in lovely condition 2 Jarman's Yayla, litter sister to winner, head a little short, good auburn markings on face, just a little uneven, her eyes appeared to be still changing colour and could be rounder, coat of good texture 3 Tidmarsh's Van Actimis, a much bigger male kitten, eight months old, good head and type, even markings on face, but he also had auburn patches on back of front legs, and one on back leg, small auburn patching on nose and on ear, eyes still changing colour but lovely shape, good auburn ringed brush extends just a little on to body, coat thick, just a little woolly in texture, excellent condition **AC LH Breeders** (ex Blue) cat 12: 1 Hoyle's Ch Hardendale Nicholas, too well known to need description from me, looking

SIAMESE RED POINT Cat male 5: None of these conformed strictly to the standards but the winner was so good in other respects that I did not have the heart to withhold 1 ch White's Ilona Firefly, beautiful type and excellent profile, well-set ears of very fine shape and excellent eye shape and colour, good even points except on front paws, light close coat and fine tail 2 Greenland's Ch Pipatip Otawi, another fine cat of high overall quality but unmarked on front paws, tail could be a little longer 3 Jones's Springheels Cherokee, nice head and well-set ears, good eyes and good light coat and points colour, good tail but paws unmarked r Bower's Kernow Red Rudhyk, chin could be firmer and coat rather open today, otherwise generally a good cat Female 4: 1 Thomas's Lorelei Russet, very fair type and good general build, nice coat colour and points but no markings on paws, tail rather thick at root 2 Bower's Ch Senelac Sunshine, nice little cat looking slightly immature, coat very open today but of good colour, very good general type and good tail Kitten 12: 1 Silson's Southview Viva, kitten of very good type with beautifully set ears and fine eye shape and colour, slight pinch but a strong profile, light coat and excellent tail 2 Kirk's Yoho Yefira, very nice type, good profile, coat of good colour and close lying, excellent tail, rash or injury on fact 3 Bartlett's Lylainya Halcyon, very fair type and generally a nice cat, muzzle rather pinched, good tail r Lyon's Heatherall Golden Haze, exceptionally good type and fine eyes, points colour rather pale but since I saw him last the colour has extended over the whole of the back, this cannot be permitted in a kitten. Note to Red Point breeders: You are showing some lovely cats and kittens but, in the case of the adults, the generally common absence of markings on the front paws is contrary to the standards laid down for Siamese cats. Judges have some right of discretion, particularly where a cat is otherwise of exceptional quality, but I speak for most Siamese judges when I say that you would be well advised to consider your position carefully, both at club and at Joint Committee level. If judging is to be conducted at a high level of integrity, few if any Red Points should get championship certificates until they conform to Siamese standards or until the standards currently published are changed.
