The opening ceremony was performed by Mr Edward Woodward (Callan of ITV fame). He can now add me to his list of fans. He not only opened the Centre with a witty speech but stayed for three-and-a-half hours, signing autographs helping to judge a beauty competition, and finally joining in the bidding for articles donated to the auction sale. He bought a delicate ivory fan in the auction, and was delighted with it as it was of early

The genetics of Silvers and Smokes

Patricia Turner

OVER THE PAST few years I have received numerous letters from breeders working with Smokes, Shaded Silvers and Cameos. I am grateful for the interesting ideas and the breeding records supplied. The outstanding problems are those of the position of silver (giving smoke) in relation to full colour (giving black, etc), the allelism or non-allelism of silver to full colour; Burmese and Siamese and the genetic differences between Chinchilla, Shaded Silver and Silver Tabby and Smoke.

Since 1970 I have been able to work on these problems more closely and one very important fact has emerged. Blacks with one or two silver parents are capable of producing silver progeny when mated to blacks—even when these other blacks free from silver.

The evidence at present is from only four litters but two further test matings are planned for this year and another young "black" will be test mated when she becomes adult. It seems likely that, as predicted by Robinson, there are two types of black (or blue, chocolate, lilac, red, cream, tortie, blue-cream, tabby, etc) cat produced in matings involving silver. For convenience I describe these as "visual blacks" (the silver variety) and standard blacks (the

venience I describe these as "visual blacks" (the silver variety) and standard blacks (the normal variety).

Although the visual and standard blacks may well be indistinguishable by eye the difference will show in breeding performance when the visual blacks will breed as Smokes.

varieties (Chinchilla, Shaded Silver, Silver Tabby) the degree of shading and pale undercoat vary, with Chinchilla being at one extreme and Silver Tabby at the other, then the variation in degrees of shading in Smokes can be readily understood. The palest Smokes can be considered comparable to the Chinchilla, the more heavily shaded Smokes to the Shaded Silver and the "visual blacks" to the Silver Tabby.

If this hypothesis of variation in the expression of shading is accepted then Smoke breeders can expect the following results—

Chinchillas are fragile, delicate and the cream of the cat world

CHINCHILLAS to me, as a breed prizewinning adult. specialist, are the lovliest of all breeds. Their outstanding ethereal broad head with s beauty make them the cream of the cat world. It is many years since I first became attached to this magnificent breed. I extend a tribute of thanks and appreciation to the lady who guided me so thoroughly in my known for the beautiful Chinchillas she has bred. It was from this strain I have my own Chinchillas which are a joy to own, breed and study.

Chinchillas are strong, sturdy cats in spite of their fragile and delicate appearance. It is a fallacy to say they are bad tempered. They are no more bad tempered than any other breed.

Personally I have not found the Chinchilla to be a prolific breeder, usually three kittens, or four at the most, to a litter, although I have heard people state that their cats have had large litters.

Chinchillas are usually dark silvery colour when born. Their coats become lighter as they grow. Their eyes are blue as kittens and turn to a lovely emerald when adult. Chinchillas are always very pretty when beautiful and exotic small, but it is not necessarily the in its colouring and prettiest kitten that becomes the cat' admired by all.

The Chinchilla should have a good broad head, with small neat ears with good breadth between, eyes emerald, large and round, set off with a dark with a dark rim, either black or dark brown, faint pencil tickings under the eyes, with a brick red nose. The coat should be soft to the touch, soft pure undercoat with light tickings on the back. The there should be short and thick and there should be no black markings on the hind legs. The pads should be black or dark brown. The standard of points are: colour 25, head 20, shape 15, eyes 15, coat/condition 15 and tail 10.

Due to breeders past and present who have devoted care in the breeding lines, the Chinchilla has reached a high standard. I consider it a pity that some breeders have produced a 'Blue Chinchilla'. Personally I do not condone the crossing of two very beautiful breeds to produce this cat. However if this is to continue I think the words 'blue' and 'chinchilla' words 'blue' and 'chinchilla' should be obliterated and an entirely new name found.

To me the Chinchilla is a very beautiful and exotic creature, unique in its colouring and is the real 'show

Colourpoints for everybody

TWICE IN recent years FUR AND FEATHER has published articles under this title, with selected photographs illustrating features of type. The second article was in response to public demand by FUR AND FEATHER. These articles were intended to show anyone interested in Colourpoints, pet owners, breeders or judges, some of the main points contributing towards good type. The illustrations were, of necessity, minimal in number. Certain breeders, rightly puzzled by the show bench awards we so often have to put up with, have said that from these articles they have learned just what good type means. But, in spite of the availability of these articles and the publication of a fully illustrated book of reference about Colourpoints. Some two-thirds to three-quarters of our championship shows go by with judging of Colourpoints in the open classes which accords neither with the accepted standard ner with the aims of the breeders implementing this standard.

the aims of the breeders implementing this standard.

We have our simply splendid judges who dispense unfailingly good judgement at all times, but they can only cover a small proportion of the shows. For the rest we endure judgement, sometimes based upon eye colour with little, if any, regard for type, although eye colour, however blue, carried but five eyer cent of the marks. We are shocked by the selection of prize winners with tall upright ears and long straight noses when there have been a number of much better specimens in the pens. So much so that when an occasional Colourpoint with type equal to that of the finest Longhair makes its appearance, the exhibit is considered 'strange', and cast aside with perhaps an hc but not a deserved CC. We are also charged with kinked tails which are not revealed by X-rays or confirmed by a competent veterinary surgeon. We have been informed that a Colourpoint was tinged with red when it was nothing of the kind. Presumably the judging was so ill informed that the incomplete recessiveness of the brown gene was not understood.

Too many certificates are being withheld

AT THE Three Counties Championship show very near future by suitable rosettes? GEOFF held recently at Southampton many exhibitors travelled several miles in order to support the club and to present to the paying public their cats. Not for them an expenses paid

I think I am right in saying that in the Siamese section in no less than nine out of eleven open classes the coveted CCs were withheld. It seems inconceivable that so many should be withheld at one show.

All breeder/exhibitors endeavour to live up All breeder/exhibitors endeavour to live up to the standards laid down for the improvement of the breed (at least one hopes so). Buying the queen(s), joining clubs, travelling to shows, feeding, veterinary surgeon's bills, stud fees all costs money. By no stretch of the imagination can expenditure be reconciled by winnings or sales. This is an accepted fact in what is after all, a very expensive hobby.

At how many shows does a judge meet the perfect Siamese? The perfect cat in any breed is few and far between, although it it obviously the dream of every breeder/

exhibitor.

Have the judges forgotten the standard of points? In their infinite wisdom have they chosen to forego this method of judging? If, for example, six cats in an open class did not come up to the judge's preference but the best was awarded a first, surely the judge should apply the standard of points and, by the simple process of elimination, arrive at a decision whereby a CC could be awarded, unless, of course, all six were hopelessly below par. It is high time that judging was done, not by preference, but by the standard of points.

Whilst on the subject of the Three Counties show may I suggest that the tatty banners on plastic curtain hooks be substituted in the

view.

A new little girl is chosen, a high price is paid as she is sold as being of really good show quality. Her breeding is excellent and both her new owner and her breeder are most ontimistic about her show, caregory.

The kitten fulfils her promise when shown prior to becoming an adult. At nine months the test really starts. Her first adult show and she is second in her open. At the next two shows she wins her open and two CCs. As a loving owner I tell my beautiful girly that after the next show she can retire gracetfully from the limelight and settle down to the job nature intended. The third show arrives. She wins her open but the CC is withheld because the general standard of the cats is so poor. Eight other owners were faced with the same disappointment.

What do we do? Ignore the cat's plaintive calling for a husband and perhaps frustrate ther and go on showing her until she wins her deserved championship or let her breed as nature demands? The owner can then write on her queen's kittens pedigrees—winner of three opens, two CCs.

Please, dear judges, remember when judging the female open class that the young creature before you may never come under your scrutiny again—she's probably at home looking after her babies and telling them of the time when she was almost a star. optimistic about her show career.
