

### Are cat shows becoming too big?

would like to make one point clear, the show managers. I attend cat shows as the representative of FUR AND FEATHER. I am at the shows to receive comments, praise and complaints from all the members of the cat Fancy. This I try

When Mr Dyson asked me to be FUR AND FEATHER'S representative he said 'All judges automatically write their thanks and congratulations to show managers and these we print. Your job is NOT to say what a nice show it was, but to state members opinions'. So anything I write is never directed personally at any particular person. I hope I have the integrity to fight any private dispute privately.

I can state now that I would far more willingly tackle a ward full of patients with DT's than accept the position of show manager. So all show managers have my utmost admiration for the tasks they undertake. I hope this is clear. But I cannot promise that I shall refrain from writing comments because they concern a personal friend. I am always willing to publish comments providing they are not malicious!

Since last I wrote, brave man, Sir Francis Chichester has died. I think he was more than willing to finally 'cross the bar'. It is sad that, as his wife stated, his last weeks were made unhappy by the unkind remarks of a few people who begrudged him his victories. It is worth thinking of him when we next feel like ventilating our spleen.

### Mammoth event

Having got that off my chest, I must start to comment on the Herts and Middlesex Club's silver jubilee show. What a mammoth event it was. I am sure that Mr and Mrs Shew-bridge must be thankful that it is over. They looked really exhausted by the end of the day and I know just how they felt, as thirty walks up and down the length of the 'Ally Pally' nearly finished me! The club had done its utmost to brighten the hall with floral decorations and draping, but it still remained a cheerless place, and the cats obviously disliked the booming echo of the loudspeaker announcements, though these were delivered

The wide spaces between the pens were a joy to both cats and judges and the overall spectacle was an impressive one. Yet many felt that shows have become too big in spite of the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy fourteen day rule.

Certainly Mr and Mrs Shewbridge to cope. Amongst these were the hour-long waits that some judges had to undergo in order to get lunches. Cafeteria prices were high and many exhibitors preferred to remain dry rather than wait in a queue for thirty minutes for a cup of tea!

Judging did not begin until 11.15 until 11 am. By miraculous good fortune the weather was fine otherwise the half mile long queue awaiting vetting-in would probably all have died of pneumonia. I understand two veterinarians failed to turn up and others were exceptionally all attempts at hygiene had to be veterinary students from the Univerthorough. This was very praiseworthy abandoned, making a nonsense of sity of Bristol to attend the show and

to show more than once in fourteen days by altering the rules about vetting-in, so that the rules will read: 'Any exhibitor who has one cat re-jected for reasons of an infectious or contagious illness shall have to remove all his exhibits'.

This is surely only logical. I was not the only person to be upset to see a number of cats with runny see a number of cats with runny eyes and sniffles still in their pens. The answer to my query was 'The cat did not have a temperature'. We must all see the dilemma of the veterinary surgeon. At present, even if one cat is rejected, the veterinary surgeon must pass its litter-mate if it has no fever and no obvious skinlesion. But it is almost certain that the second cat is already capable of passing on those germs to nearby neighbours. Whatever a veterinary



surgeon may feel, he is risking losing many clients if he insists on what he feels to be right, but has no official backing.

But why do exhibitors insist on showing cats that are off-colour? I have tried to put myself in their position, disregarding any concern over the cats' health. Entry fees have been heavy, certainly. Therefore I can't afford to waste that money, I must show that cat. Fair enough. I get it past the veterinarian and into its show pen. But judges are not fools, and no cat that is obviously feeling below par can win. Therefore perhaps my cat will win a couple of reserves. I have not re-couped my money. I have made a bad impression on the judge and, even more important for myself, my fellow exhibitors now distrust me and will not come to me for kittens. So what have I gained? Perhaps somebody can answer that. I cannot.

#### Valued rosettes

To return to the Herts and Middlesex show. The best of breed rosettes had unprecedented events with which and the open class cards with metal medals attached were much valued by exhibitors. Whilst on the topic of vetting-in I results counted many owners had hope that the GCCF will follow up its already left and few of the arrival brave move in forbidding orbits: BEFORE I report any news items, I but it certainly posed problems for earlier use of disinfectant and water.

Mr and Mrs Shewbridge must be congratulated for the basic idea, but it still seems that the best in show system that is eventually best for both judges and cats is that of judging Long-hairs, Short-hair British, Shorthair Foreign and Siamese on separate panels. Each cat does not have to be handled many times, and the public enjoys the thrill of the finale.

A most unwelcome diversion occurred when two louts made their way into the hall. One went along the row of pens opening the pen-doors the other succeeded in picking the pockets of those judges and stewards who naturally went to the cats aid. Mr Shewbridge bravely offered to tackle the men—but by that time they had disappeared. But let exhibitors be prepared at future shows!

There are still some exhibitors who do not realise that nothing may be placed in cat's pens except white blankets and white feeding dishes. At the Ally Pally I noticed several coloured dishes and two cat's pens were lined with newspaper. The judge for whom I was stewarding asked me to inform the show manager. Mr Shewbridge inspected the pens told the cats they must manage without their morning read, and removed the newspapers! The exhibitors were fortunate-next time they may disqualified.

#### Response to appeal

The response to my appeal for help with stray cats has been very heart-warming. We have had many offers of help, in particular Mrs Lindsay of Dalry, Ayrshire, Scotland (telephone Dalry 2645) and Mrs Dowling of High Halden, near Ashford (telephone High Halden 261) have offered to use spare rooms to house desperate cases. We must all be grateful to these unselfish cat-lovers, who would like me to stress that their own pedigree cats will have no contact with the strays.

One other tribute must be paid to a comparative newcomer to the Fancy, Mr Malcolm Lauder. He was about to send a cat overseas when it came to his notice that some of his cats may have been in contact with a case of haemobartonella or feline infectious anaemia. He consulted his veterinary surgeon who advised that the only way he could be certain that his cats were healthy was to have them all blood-tested and the blood samples examined under highpowered microscopes by specialists at Cambridge School of Veterinary Medicine. Mr Lauder did not hesitate took two and a half hours to collect the samples, and then came the actual examination of the blood. But Mr Lauder feels the cost was not in vain as all his cats were completely free of infection. One lesson Mr Lauder says he has learned is that it is a wise idea to have any export cats blood-tested. I fully agree with him.

It was surely a sign of our times that Mr and Mrs Shewbridge allowed



to take throat-swabs from cats whose owners were willing to submit to this Many cat owners were very test. helpful and one hopes that by tests like these cat 'flu which is still a killer of cats and kittens, may eventually be eradicated. It is not such a dramatic disease as cancer, but causes much suffering to cats and owners. It is a fact that a number of kittens dié after each show-some by indirect contact.

This is my last opportunity to remind all lovers of Long-hair cats that the first-ever Long-hair Cat Club show is to be held on Wednesday, October 11, at Chelsea Old Town Hall, King's Road, Chelsea, London.



### Readers write Withholding CCs

AS MANAGERS of the Three Counties Cat AS MANAGERS of the fiftee Counties Cat Society Show, we welcome constructive criti-cism. In our opinion the letters published in the last issue of FUR AND FEATHER, written by G Turner and F Jackson, can only be described as destructive.

We must defend our Siamese Judges who have the courage of their convictions and sufficient strength of mind to withhold CCs when they consider the exhibits to be unworthy of the award.

Mr Turner asks if judges have forgotten the

Mr Turner asks if judges have forgotten the standard of points and suggest they judge by personal preference. This seems to us to be a stupid remark. If judges have a personal preference it is for a cat which, when judged by the standard of points, would rate 100 out of 100! Unfortunately, good Siamese were in the minority at Southampton this year.

To award CCs to cats which are not even approaching the standard required will not, in the long run, benefit the Fancy as a whole. The title champion in front of a cat's name implies quality and it would be doing the Fancy a disservice to allow this to become otherwise. We are quite sure that judges do not enjoy withholding certificates and consider their job more worth while when they have a good quality class to judge and have difficulty in deciding which is the best.

Mr Turner's remarks about the bannerettes,

We were bitterly disappointed with them when they were delivered the day before the show. They were not as ordered and certainty not of the quality we had intended. Obviously at that time there was nothing we could do about it. As Mr Turner is not a member of the society he might be interested to know that a number of our committee members, including ourselves, were in favour of continuing prize money in open class. However, a questionnaire was sent to all members. From these forms returned it was obvious that most of our members preferred no prize money in open classes and wider classification. Very few were in favour of rosettes for open classes. tion. Very few open classes.

The remark regarding 'expenses paid outings' we consider to be in such bad taste that it does not warrant further comment.

To answer F Jackson's question regarding

To answer F Jackson's question regarding females, we would say that any exhibitor who cofidently expects to make a champion at only three shows is either a complete novice or a super optimist! In any case, a really good female will make her championship after she has produced kittens. If she cannot, she has only the 'bloom of youth' and no real quality. No queen should be kept calling and unmated indefinitely for the sake of showing her.

Incidentally, it is interesting to note that neither of these writers' names appears in the list of exhibitors at the Three Counties show. MARY A WILSON (show manager)

More classes and prize money disappear while new charges upon us come thick and fast.

Some shows manage to provide ample classes and judges—even a fabulous display of flowers—without making dozens of

Experience gained in showing our neuters will stand us in very good stead come the great day when we show our first adult female or kitten.

#### **Cruelty laws**

### Cats at the British Veterinary Association

CATS MADE NEWS at this year's British Veterinary Association Congress at Exeter University. Representatives of most of the animal food manufacturers had assembled especially to hear Dr Oliphant F Jackson, MRCVS. As has been previously reported, Dr Jackson has found, in his observations of laboratory cats, that the incidence of stones in the bladder (urolithiasis) has increased from 1% before 1966 to 10% in the last three years. This ratio in cases among domestic cats is also confirmed by a veterinary practice.

Dr Jackson is led to believe that the increase in this disease coincides with the marketing of certain dried cat foods, to which cats can become very much addicted,

It is known that bladder gravel can be formed in cats, experimentally, within thirty-two days, when they are fed entirely on a diet of minced oxheart, which is low in calcium and rich in magnesium. Some brands of dried cat food are also high in magnesium content and the inference is drawn that there may be a connection between the use of these foods and the more frequent occurrence of bladder stones in the male cat. Of course, some cats are more prone to form stones than others, and at present it is not known why this should be. It is not now thought that the amount a cat drinks can influence the formation of stones.

The gravel in the bladder will obstruct the

The gravel in the bladder will obstruct the passage of urine and, owing to the secretive habits of the cat, the straining may not be noticed until the cat is beyond help, or it may be mistaken for constipation and dosed accordingly. Untreated, the cat could die in five days. A cat who constantly is cleaning his lower regions, adopting what Dr Jackson called the Yoga posture, should be regarded with suspicion, and watched. By no means all the dried foods that are on the market have been used in Dr Jackson's experiments, but all food manufacturers are anxious to have the matter brought out into the open, and possibly some brands completely absolved. To this end the BSAVA Scientific committee has undertaken to investigate the whole problem. Mr R C Povey from Bristol University, and Mr John Baker from Cambridge will take and collate all the evidence. They have been promised the full co-operation of the food manufacturers, and hope to make their report before Christmas.

Professor W M Hutchinson of the University of Strathclyde dropped another bombshell when he told the Congress that the domestic cat has been proved to carry one stage of the parasite Toxoplasma, which may be ingested by humans via cat faeces. At this stage of the parasite can remain active for seventeen months, humans can be infected long after the cat has departed from the scene. In general form, human toxoplasmosis shows an enlargement of the lymph glands and is a reasonably mild affliction, similar to glandular fever. Many of us may have a sub-clinical dose without really noticing it.

Where it does become serious is if a sufferer from chronic and inapparent toxoplasmosis should undergo transplant surgery, such as kidney transplant, or if the parasite should affect a pregnant woman who has not been previous infected and thus has no immune mechanism to protect the unborn child. Abortion can be caused, or the haby may be horn with source brain damage. born child. Abortion can be caused, or the baby may be born with severe brain damage, like encephalitis. Professor Hutchinson advised all pregnant women to board their cats out, which is going to make someone's fortune if it catches on. The avoidance of the cat is all the more necessary if raw meat is fed, or if the cat hunts birds and rodents. rodents.

The final word of advice was to wash all vegetables, particularly roots, that may have been in earth contaminated by cats, and in particular that cat owners must preserve very high standards of personal hygiene.
