

Governing Council of the Cat Fancy seeks permanent headquarters

THE GOVERNING Council of the Cat Fancy is well aware of the unconscionable delay which is currently occurring in the registration and transfer of cats. Members of the Fancy should know that energetic action is being taken by the Council, through its Executive Committee, to bring these delays to a speedy end.

These delays have arisen because of the great growth which is currently occurring in the Fancy. This rate of growth has imposed too high a strain on our system of registration which has been geared to a much lesser activity. The Executive realises that the longterm solution lies in establishing own premises in which a business-like organisation may be built up and maintained.

On behalf of the Council, the Executive is currently looking for a suitable house in the Greater London

area. Any member of the Fancy Basically, the intention is to employ who has such a house, the whole or a part of which he would be willing to sell or lease to the Council should contact the secretary immediately.

Because of the immediate urgency of the problem however, the committee has also decided to provide a short-term solution to our difficulties. This will be achieved by dividing the work of the Registrars between a greater number of people, operating from their homes. The precise method of working is currently being established and members of the Fancy who feel that they have the facilities, the time and the basic ability to undertake a section of the registry should write to Mrs Davis immediately, no matter The address of the secretary is: Mrs where they live.

PRIOR to the meeting on October 18 both the Executive and the Finance Committees were becoming increasingly conscious of the delay which was now occuring in the registration of cats and in the completion of transfers. It was recognised that both Registrars were working long hours; but were failing to keep pace with increasing demands upon their services and hoth appeared upply

Registrars were working long hours; but were failing to keep pace with increasing demands upon their services and both appeared unable to recruit sufficient part-time labour to enable their books to be brought up to date.

At a recent meeting of the Council's Finance Committee it was decided that it was not the overworked registrars, but rather, our system which was seriously at fault. The Fancy had grown rapidly in the last few years; and showed every sign of continuing its rate of growth. The committee felt that the only radical solution to our problem was a complete reorganisation of the Fancy's business structure. The Finance Committee therefore decided to place before the Council a proposal that a house should be bought to serve as headquarters for the Fancy and that all our registration activities and at least a proportion of our secretarial work should be conducted from this house.

The Chairman, Dr I Raleigh, paid a tribute to the memory of Mr Brice-Webb who, he said, had gone through life without making a single enemy. The loss to the Fancy of this gentle man was an incalculable one, and the sympathy of the Delegates went out with deep sincerity to Mrs Brice-Webb in the hour of her great sorrow. The Council stood in respectful silence and later requested that a floral tribute be sent with a note of the Council's sympathy to Mrs Brice-Webb.

A letter from the BSAVA stating the view that the ear formation in lop-eared cats will almost certainly lead to an increased incidence of ear disease on account of the poor natural ventilation of the ear canals and the inherent difficulty in applying medication. This expert opinion confirmed the Council in its decision to prohibit the registration of cats afflicted with this genetic abnormality.

Mrs Calder proposed that we establish a liaison with the BSAVA and it was agreed that a committee should be formed for this purpose. The following delegates were elected to sit on this committee: Mesdames Pond, Dunnill, Towe, Baxter and Mr Shewbridge. These persons were to sit as representatives of the GCCF together with five veterinary surgeons. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman could if necessary, attend ex officio and expert opinion could be co-opted as and when required by the committee. That is to say, a judge judging Seal and Blue Siamese, could still only take out a best adult, one best kitten and one best neuter.

Mrs Pring proposed that in future, changes in Show Rules made during a season would commence to operate at the start of the next show season. This was carried.

The Chairman asked the Council for guidance as he felt that a rule had been passed by Council to the effect that only those cats which were eligible for challenge certificates in the adult grades could be brought out for best in show, but that there did not appear to be a minute of the decision in existence. The Council agreed that the rule had been passed, and confirmed it. It means that no cat, kitten or neuter may go up for best in show unless the variety had a breed number and was eligible for challenge certificates. It was decided however, that this rule should operate from the next season and that meanwhile, Show Rule 30 would remain in force.

GRAND CHAMPION AND GRAND PREMIER

As from June 1, 1973, cats may be entered both in the open class and in the Champion of Champions or Premier of Premiers classes. The winners of Champion of Champions and Premier of Premiers classes may pions and Premiers of Premiers classes may be put up for best in show no matter how the cat may have fared in the open class. Only one award will be given (1st) and one Reserve award in case of disqualification in the Champion of Champions and Premier of Premiers classes. The award of Champion of Champions or of Premier of Premiers may be given without any numerical qualification if, in the opinion of the judge, the winning cat is of high enough quality. This applies even if there is only one cat in the class.

It was proposed and carried that the Council/BSAVA committee should consider the questions raised by the practice of vetting in and should also consider the question of refunding entry fees in the case of sick cats.

An appropriate policy had accordingly been taken out and its cost will be reflected in the cost of Show Licences, the amount being agreed by Council from time to time. This question would be considered in conjunction with the raising of the necessary cash for making payments on the proposed new house. The Chairman pointed out that the Council had certain capital assets which could be applied to this purpose, but that additional monies had to be found for the necessary repayments out of income.
